BJP finished our democracy: Assam Oppn

GUWAHATI/ NEW DELHI, March 24 (PTI): Former Congress president Rahul Gandhi was on Friday disqualified from Lok Sabha following his conviction by a Surat court in a 2019 criminal defamation case, an action the party termed an attempt to "silence" his voice as it vowed to fight the battle legally and politically.

Following Rahul's disqualification from Lok Sabha, opposition parties in Assam on Friday slammed the ruling BJP and alleged the saffron brigade has "finished the democracy".

The Congress, the principal opposition party in Assam, asserted that Gandhi has been consistently fighting for people's rights and to protect Indian democracy, both within and outside the Parliament.

"He will continue to do so. Truth shall, must and will prevail. Appropriate legal action will be taken," the Assam Pradesh Congress Committee (APCC) tweeted. APCC president Bhupen Kumar Borah claimed that the conviction and subsequent disqualification from Parliament is the outcome of speaking for the people of the country.

"BJP has finished our democracy. BJP's conspiracy to silence @RahulGandhi," he said on the micro-blog-

Assam MLA Akhil Gogoi termed the disqualification of the Congress MP from the Lok Sabha following the judgement in the 'Modi Surname Case' an aberration for democracy.

"Defamation suit becomes a tool for political vendetta. It's the start of the ruin of the 'Modi Regime'. A repetition of the Emergency era 1975-77,"

President of another opposition party, Assam Jatiya Parishad, Lurinjyoti Gogoi, said Gandhi's disqualification from Parliament shows the BJP-led government's desperation and lays bare its attempt to muzzle opposition voices. Criticising the action on the former Congress president, Assam Trinamool Congress leader Dilip Kumar Sarma said the success of India's democracy depends on the independence of executive, legislature and judiciary.

When everything runs on the instructions of the executive, then the destruction of democracy starts. The Lok Sabha secretariat has done such an act today.



Lok Sabha, which works to uphold democracy, today in a way killed democracy," he added.

The disqualification, which will bar 52-year-old

Gandhi from contesting polls for eight years unless stayed by a higher court, saw a shift in the dynamics of opposition ranks with Trinamool Congress and Aam Aadmi Party also expressing strong support for the embattled leader, along with several other opposition parties.

Announcing his disqualification, the Lok Sabha Secretariat in a notification said that it was effective from March 23, the day of his conviction.

"Consequent upon his conviction by the Court of Chief Judicial Magistrate, Surat...Rahul Gandhi, Member of Lok Sabha representing the Wayanad Parliamentary Constituency of Kerala stands disqualified from the membership of Lok Sabha from the date of his conviction i.e. 23 March, 2023," the notification read. This was Gandhi's fourth Lok Sabha term. First elected to Lok Sabha in 2004 from Amethi, he represented that constituency for two more terms. In 2019, he lost the Amethi seat to Smriti Irani but managed to win from Wayanad.

The court in Surat sentenced on Thursday Gandhi to two years in jail in a defamation case, filed on a complaint by BJP MLA Purnesh Modi for his alleged remark, "How come all thieves have Modi as the common surname?" (CONTD ON PAGE-9)

LOK SABHA PASSES FINANCE BILL

NEW DELHI, March 24 (PTI): The Lok Sabha on Friday approved The Finance Bill 2023 with 64 official amendments including providing tax relief to some taxpayers opting for new tax regime, and removing longterm tax benefit for debt mutual funds to bring them at par with other interest earning instruments.

In a relief to taxpayers opting for deductions and exemption-free new tax regime, individuals earning marginally higher income than no-tax ceiling of ₹ 7 lakh will continue to pay nil tax.

Under the new tax regime with effect from April 1, if a taxpayer has an annual income of ₹ 7 lakh s/he pays no tax. But if s/he has income of ₹ 7,00,100 s/he pays tax of ₹ 25,010. Thus an additional income of ₹ 100 leads to tax of ₹25,010.

The amendment provides that the tax payable should not be more than the income that exceeds ₹7 lakh. This means, an individual having income up to ₹7,27,700 could stand to benefit from this marginal relief. Other amendments include raising the tax rate on royalty and fee for technical services from 10 percent to 20 percent.

The Finance Bill, which includes tax proposals for the fiscal year beginning April 1, was passed without a discussion as parliament continued to remain stalled over demands for a probe into allegations against the Adani group. Lok Sabha, which had on Thursday approved ₹45 lakh-crore Budget for 2023-24 fiscal in just 9 minutes, passed the Finance Bill amid placards holding opposition MPs shouting slogans from the well of the House. ED raids multiple locations in Arunachal in APPSC, APSSB scams

ITANAGAR, March 24 (PTI): The Enforcement Directorate (ED) conducted multiple raids in Papum Pare district as part of investigation into the Arunachal Pradesh Staff Selection Board (APSSB) scam and APPSC paper leak case, official sources said on Friday

The raids were conducted by ED under the provisions of Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) 2002 while investigating the APSSB scam and Arunachal Pradesh Public Service Commission (APPSC) paper leak cases.

"The ED initiated investigations under PMLA, 2002 based on FIR registered by the Special Investigation Cell (SIC) under various sections of Prevention of Corruption (PC) Act, 1988 and IPC1860 in the case of APPSB scam and FIR registered by SIC and CBI under various sections of PC Act, 1988 in APPSC paper leak case," the ED said in a tweet.

The agency claimed that, during the search operation on Tuesday, it recovered incriminating documents and ₹ 1.41 crore which has been frozen.

According to sources, the ED raided the house of Taket Jerang, the main accused in the APPSC paper leak scam. Jerang is the main accused in all the scams related to the APPSC since 2014.

The ED officials reportedly recovered some important documents from his residence and are planning a follow-up action based on the documents, the sources said.

In another case, the ED reportedly froze and attached the accounts of Kapter Ringu and her relatives, in regard to the APSSB cash-for-job scam.

The SIC investigating the APSSB cash-for-job scam, had charge sheeted 19 persons in November 2020 for their alleged involvement in the case. So far two cases have been registered by the SIC in the APPSC paper leak issue and the cases have already been handed over to the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI).

The premier investigating agency filed a chargesheet on December 9 last year against eight individuals and another on January 30 this year against one person.

As many as 46 government officials and 13 private individuals have been arrested in connection with the malpractices conducted in the recruitment examinations.

The irregularities came to light after one Gyamar Padung, who appeared in the examination, filed a complaint at the Itanagar police station on August 29, claiming that he suspected that the question paper was leaked. More than 400 candidates appeared in the examination held on August 26 and 27 last year. The CBI had taken over the investigation on October 27 after the state government recommended it. The case was initially investigated by the Capital Police, and later transferred to the Special Investigation Cell (SIC) of the HT Correspondent

BJP's Biswabandhu elected Tripura speaker



AGARTALA, March 24 (PTI): Amidst a walkout by the Tipra Motha, the second largest party in the Tripura assembly, the BJP's Biswabandhu Sen was elected the speaker of the state's legislature on Friday.

Tipra Motha supremo Pradyot Kishore Debbarma in a tweet earlier in the day revealed that after a telephonic conversation with Union home minister Amit Shah, he had held a meeting with Assam chief minister and the BJP's main pointsman in the northeast Himanta Biswa Sarma on the issue of appointment of an

interlocutor to discuss the issues raised by the tribal party. In the speaker election, Sen received 32 votes, while the opposition CPI (M)-Congress candidate Gopal Chandra Roy got 14 votes.

In the Tripura assembly, the BJP-IPFT alliance now has 32 MLAs at present as one legislator, Pratima Bhowmick, who is also a Union minister, had resigned. Sen, a four-time MLA from Dharmanagar in North Tripura district, was the deputy speaker in the previous assembly.

The Tipra Motha, which has 13 members in the assembly, staged a walkout before the speaker election to protest against "improper seat arrangements" and did not take part in the voting.

Immediately after the assembly session started, the leader of the party, Animesh Debbarma, raised objections to seat arrangements and staged a walkout.

Later, Debbarma told reporters that his party would play the role of a "constructive Opposition" in the assembly by raising questions in people's interest. After the Protem Speaker, Binoy Bhushan Das announced the name of Sen as the winning candidate, he thanked all members of the House. (CONTD ON PAGE-9)

NEW YORK, March 24 (PTI): Starbucks' said he will always be a "fierce advocate" for the company's partners and its culture.

"With you, I've experienced every aspect of the business to learn what it truly means to wear the green apron. You've welcomed me into our stores, trained me in how to be a barista ... all to help me deeply understand what we do, how we do it, and the challenges and opportunities facing us," he wrote.

Barista is a person who serves in a coffee bar. "To keep us close to the culture and our customers, as well as to our challenges and opportunities, I intend to continue working in stores for a half day each month," he was quoted as saying by CNN. "I thought it was very important for me to put myself in the shoes of the partners and really understand what they do and how they do it. There were things I learned through experience in all of this. It taught me a lot," he said in a statement.

He also discussed how he plans to continue the reinvention plan laid out by Schultz over the summer. Prior to that, he held various leadership roles at PepsiCo, including as global chief commercial officer.

He also served as CEO of the company's Latin America, Europe and Sub-Saharan Africa operations. He takes over a company with significant strengths. Starbucks reported record demand in the April-June period as strong US sales made up for continuing closures in China, the company's second-largest market. But Starbucks also has challenges. It tries to fight off a wave of unionisation. That effort has been ugly at times, casting a shadow over Starbucks' reputation as a progressive company.

Unionised workers are hoping that Narasimhan will be more open to the union than Schultz, who led the company's efforts against the union since becoming interim CEO last year, the report said. "We are hopeful that Laxman Narasimhan will chart a new path with the union and work with us to make Starbucks the company we know it can be," Michelle Eisen, a Starbucks worker and union organiser, said in a statement this week

Markets fall nearly 1 pc amid weak trend in global equities; Nifty slips below 17k MUMBAI, March 24 (PTI): Equity benchmark indices Sensex and

Nifty buckled under selling pressure for the second straight session to settle nearly 1 per cent lower on Friday as investors pared exposure to the metal, energy and realty stocks amid a bearish trend in Asian and European markets.

Besides, a depreciating rupee against the US dollar and fresh foreign fund outflows also hit investor sentiments, traders said.

In a volatile trade, the 30-share BSE Sensex declined 398.18 points or 0.69 per cent to finish at 57,527.10, with 24 of its constituents posting losses. During the day, the index witnessed a high of 58,066.40 and a low of 57,422.98.

The broader NSE Nifty fell 131.85 points or 0.77 per cent to slip below the psychological level of 17,000. The index settled at 16,945.05, with 41 of its scrips ending in the red.

On a weekly basis, the BSE benchmark fell 462.8 points or 0.79 per cent, while the Nifty slipped 155 points or 0.90 per cent.

'Markets inched further lower and lost over half a per cent, in absence of any favourable cues. The first half was dull, however, pressure in the index majors changed the tone and pushed the Nifty index below the 17,000 mark. The fall was widespread wherein metal, realty and energy majors felt the maximum heat," said Ajit Mishra,

Broking Ltd. Bajaj Finserv was the biggest loser among the Sensex constituents, sliding 3.81 per cent, followed by Bajaj Finance, Tata Steel, RIL, HCL Tech, SBI, Larsen & Toubro and Mahindra & Mahindra, Axis Bank and Titan.

Falling for the second day in a row, index major Reliance Industries witnessed an intense sell-off and declined 1.96 per cent.

The Jorhat Medical College and Hospital superintendent professor Purnima Barua and BDO, central, Jorhat block, Suman Das On Friday jointly gave away an appreciation letter to the Number 28 Meleng Balichapori Panchayat, on behalf of the district administration, to GP President Durlay Chetia for the GP's "efforts to make the entire GP completely TB-free and requested to continue the efforts for sustainability of the TB-free

achievements.' The World TB Day was observed here with a day-long programme organised by the Jorhat District Health Society under the National Tuberculosis Elimination Programme (NTEP) at Number 28 Meleng Balichapori Panchayat, on the outskirts here, on Friday.

District TB officer Dr Bhaktimay Bhattacharyya informed that an awareness meeting, anchored by social worker Jagannath Agniborah, was held in the said GP area covering people from 27 villages.

Dr Bhaktimay Bhattacharyya, in his address, spoke about the significance of observing World TB Day, the disease (TB), its causes and treatment available under Government health services, and ways to prevent the spread of the disease.

Dr Bhattacharyya stated that efforts initiated by the health department, involving the GP, Zilla Parishad and villagers since 2016 to make the entire GP completely TB-free and tobacco-free, was moving in right direction with the GP reaching the final stage of officially becoming TB-free GP, which was



likely to be first in the state. WHO consultant Dr Diganta Thakuria, JMCH superintendent professor Purnima Barua among others also addressed the gathering.

The Sivasagar health department on Friday observed World TB Day along with the rest of the world. In the forenoon session, a massive procession was flagged off by Dr Bhupendranath Das, JT director of health; Sivasagar Dr Das said that since Robert Cox formally announced the discovery of the bacteria on March 24, 1882, and since then the world health community has been observing the day.

Manoj Kumar Borthakur, journalist, and a member of the District TB Eradication Committee said that a commitment to fight the disease collectively can yield the result and the Panchayats can play a vital role.

District nodal officer, Dr Udayaditya Raikonwar said that not just a handful of people from the health department but the whole people of the society need to support the TB ernment for total eradication by 2025. Rajkonwar said 6000 people are affected every day in India and 40 pc people carry the germ normally but due to immunity, it cannot infect all. He said that the TB eradication programme has improved over the years and the sputum examination centres have been opened in the rural health centres as well.

He also explained the symptoms of the disease. More than 40 pc HIV-positive people die from TB. A total of 188 people per 1 lakh are TB patients. In India, over 24 lakh TB cases have been identified in 2021 and over a million remain unidentified.

Dr Makhan Kalita, superintendent, Sivasagar Civil Hospital, said that every five minutes, three people die from TB in India now but in 2014, one person died every minute. A total of 1223 patients have been identified in Sivasagar and 7 pc TB patients died during the COVID-19 people. Parag Goswami, president SHAPE, a leading NGO working in the health sector said 38 pc TB



Rahul gets disqualified from Lok Sabha

ongress leader Rahul Gandhi is no longer a Member of Parliament. Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla took the decision to disqualify the Gandhi family scion following his conviction in a case of criminal defamation, with two-year jail sentence. Less than two years of jail and he wouldn't have ended up in this mess. But, irony of irony, it was Rahul Gandhi who tore up an ordinance to amend the law drafted by the Manmohan Singh government. The disqualification came the day after a Surat court convicted Rahul Gandhi. The Gandhi family scion was given the option to "apologise", but he refused. The Congress had called the verdict "infirm, erroneous and unsustainable". The defamation case dates back to 2019. The verdict wasn't unexpected, it was on its way coming. Truly, there couldn't have been a better way to tame Rahul Gandhi than by reading him the riot act with a criminal defamation charge.

Rahul Gandhi was asked by the Surat court if he wanted to "apologise", but he refused. Today, Wayanad in Kerala has lost its MP to a court verdict. And Rahul Gandhi might not be able to contest elections for six years, unless a higher court overturns the verdict. The fact that the judge in the case suspended the 2-year jail sentence, the maximum jail-time in a criminal defamation case. for 30 days did not make a difference. There was no margin of error, so to speak. Earlier, the Congress was debating the MP status of Rahul Gandhi. One group, dominated by legal-eagles, was advising Rahul not to go to Parliament, and the second group was urging Rahul Gandhi to head for Parliament and be done with it! For now, Rahul Gandhi is on bail, till a higher court reversed the verdict. Rahul Gandhi has 30 days to appeal in a higher court. Erstwhile Congress leader Kapil Sibal said, "His disqualification is automatic. Legal processes are used far too often for political ends!" He called the verdict "bizarre." Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge called the disqualification was primarily to help Modi-Adani to help get out of the hole the two were in.

On Friday, talks also proliferated that the conviction of Rahul Gandhi has strengthened chances of opposition unity, which had been eluding the opposition parties for months if not years. NCP chief Sharad Pawar was said to be leading the "Allies" against the "Evil Axis". Meanwhile, the BJP did not stop attacking Rahul Gandhi with statements like "cannot blame all Gandhi surnames just because Rahul insulted Indian democracy". Rahul Gandhi was present in the Surat court when the verdict convicting him was read out. To a question from the judge, Rahul said he had nothing to say. Later, he tweeted, "My religion is based on truth and nonviolence. Truth is my God, non-violence is the means to get it --Mahatma Gandhi." He also paid tributes to freedom fighters Bhagat Singh, Sukhdev and Rajguru in another tweet. For the Congress rank and file, Rahul Gandhi was the epitome of Bhagat Singh, no less. That said, Rahul Gandhi has learned an important lesson. After all the success of Bharat Jodo Yatra, a new period of political struggle has begun. Irrespective of what finally happens, Rahul Gandhi's process of full conversion into a political animal has begun. That is good for the Congress party.

Annual income of poorest 20% of India continuing with its decline

India has entered one of its darkest phases of deprivation when the annual income of the poorest 20 percent has fallen by 53 percent and still continues to fall from the level of 2015-16. Since last three decades, economy was evolving at the rate of seven percent a year and was going up constantly till the advent of the pandemic years. Per capita income before the Pandemic days had arrived at 2100 dollars a year. It was in the same years that the richest twenty percent were reaping an income growth of 39 percent. It was the result of the Covid days that had impacted the economy splitting the population in a perfect contrast of Haves and Have Nots.

The survey conducted by People's Research on India's Consumer Economy, between April and October 2021, had taken up 200,000 households in the first round and 42,000 households in the second round, spreading it over 120 towns and 800 villages across 100 districts. As the economic activity has been declining to almost zero level, especially in the months of 2020-2021, and caused GDP to contract up to 7.3 percent, the urban poor was also affected hugely as their household income was receding steeply. With erosion, there was also the sharp categorisation, though with very little difference among them except with the top twenty percent. Among the poorest 20 percent, it was the most brutal erosion of 53 percent, for the second lowest, usually called lower middle category, the decline in their household income came down to 32percent.

In the middleincome category, the decline was found to be of nine percent, while for the upper middle category, it was a rise of seven percent. It also faced decline but it was only nine percent, and then the rise. It was the richest twenty percent that registered the highest rise among the entire population. It rose to 39 percent, when the famine and joblessness had caused big masses to migrate towards their roots. The survey also brought out the fact that the richest twenty percent had earned more in the post liberalisation years including the days of pandemic. In contrast to it, for the most impoverished twenty percent households, especially during and after 2021, their income saw a sharp fall of more than half of what they were getting in 2016. In the last eleven years before pre Covid days, between 2005-2016, the household income for the top rich went up from 20 percent to 34 percent, for the poorest 20 percent, it also saw a hike in the average income growth rate of 9.9 percent. Now in 2021, the share of the poorest 20 percent has dropped to 3.3 percent in the same period.

The survey showed that in contrast to those poorest, the richest 20 percent accounted for a jump of 56.3 percent in 2021. As with pandemic, economy was getting more formalised, and big companies in the top twenty percent benefitted at the cost of smaller ones. The survey brought in the light the fact that while job losses were almost all pervading among small and medium enterprises in the casual labour segment, large companies did not suffer much on this account. It is also noted that there has been a difference in impact between urban and rural regions. Those poorest 20 per cent in urban areas got more impacted than their rural counterparts since Covid and the lockdown. They have been facing a worsening curb in economic activities in urban areas. This resulted in job losses and loss of income for the casual labour, petty traders and household workers. The miseries of people in the country caused by the economic policies that have been supportive to the highest twenty, were not thought of worthy to be taken into account. The ruling regime, joining hands with the rule of finance capital, has been reluctant to even list the disastrous consequences of such policies that have brought decline in per capita income of the major section of people, who already suffer from rise in malnutrition, that causes stunting and wasting among children, slipping down to

the rank of 94 out of 116countries in the Global Hunger Index.

In addition, demonetisation has pushed the country to the brinks. Millions of people have been pushed into a state of acute impoverishment. Then there are the MSME who have hardly any support from the system. With chaotic management of the pandemic, there is also refusal to transfer cash to the poor. Then there is growing unemployment, coming down to 7.2 percent, with urban 8.4 and rural 6.4 percent. Also high inflation rate, CPI 5.6 percent, high indirect taxes, indulgent direct taxes; poorly designed GST; profiteering in sale of petrol, diesel and LPG; return of the licence-permit regime; concentration of capital and wealth and finally strengthening of the monopolies; crony capitalism. In these grim days, masses are going through little less than famine times. They are paying back the prices for all decisions that the system is taking. But soon it would be the system that would be made to bear the prices for everything. (IPA Service)

ICC's arrest warrant against Putin has little impact on Russian actions

n what can be termed a historic move, the International Crimi-Inal Court (ICC) issued an arrest warrant against the Russian President, Vladimir Putin and the Russian Presidential Commissioner for Children's Rights, Maria Lvova-Belova. This is the first time that an arrest warrant against a head of the State of a permanent member of the United Nations (UN) Security Council has ever been issued, and only the third time that a serving president of a country has been the target of such an arrest warrant. The earlier cases were against Omar al-Bashir (Sudan) and Muammar Gaddafi (Libya). Staying true to the character it has adopted towards international law since the Russian invasion of Ukraine began last year, the Kremlin has refused to acknowledge the ICC arrest warrant. It terms the warrant as "void" since Russia is not a party to the Rome Statute that established the ICC, and does not submit to the jurisdiction of the ICC. Ukraine, on the other hand, has hailed the warrant as a historic decision for Ukraine. It is also pertinent to note that the arrest warrant has been issued for the alleged war crimes of unlawful deportation and transfer of population (specifically children) from occupied areas of Ukraine to the Russian Federation.

16,000 children have been illegally deported and transferred to Russia or even Russian-occupied territories in Ukraine. The UN Commission of Inquiry on Ukraine has taken note of this transfer process. While Russia does not refute the claims of transfer of children, it masks them as a "humanitarian campaign to protect orphans and children abandoned in the conflict zone". Hence, the fact remains that there is a transfer of Ukrainian children across de facto and de jure borders, even though both sides present their own understandings of one of the most heinous alleged

Ukraine claims that more than

ber II of the ICC has based this warrant against both the individuals on having reasonable ground to believe that they have committed the war crime directly/jointly/ through others and even for their failure to exercise control over such people who were under their effective control, considering their superior responsibility. The threshold for command/ superior responsibility exists within the Rome Statute for a reason; however, it has been a rarity that a sitting head of State has actually been prosecuted and also convicted of any of the crimes under this principle.

This problem is compounded by Russia's abject disregard for ICC's jurisdiction and failure to comply with any of the proceedings that have taken place thus far. It will also be impossible to carry out the arrest against Putin or Lvova-Belova, let alone on Russian soil, seeing the command that they both seem to have within their nation.

So what remains to be evaluated is the repercussions of this arrest warrant, considering the powers of the ICC, and what such warrants have reaped in the past. It also becomes equally important to evaluate the selective jurisdiction exercised by ICC and how it can be used by the Russian Federation as a valid defence. But the most important question that remains to be answered is whether this arrest warrant can be enforced, or it is simply a measure of empty promise, considering the prolonged war.

The case of al-Bashir, against whom the ICC issued an arrest warrant in 2009 and 2010, is instructive. The case remains in the pre-trial stage, and he has still not been prosecuted due to the lack of arrest and subsequent transfer to the ICC at The Hague in Netherlands. He remains "at large".

The ICC does not try individuals unless they can be present in the courtroom and defend themselves to adhere to basic principles of natural justice — al-Bashir has been in custody since April 2019 (within

Sudan). In a recent development, the Sudanese transitional government agreed to hand over the exruler of the country to the ICC. However, as of date, the ICC has not received his custody, and the prosecution remains in abeyance.

In another instance, after the ICC issued an arrest warrant against Gaddafi in 2011, it had to terminate the proceedings due to his death. Multiple concerns have been raised about the circumstances surrounding the death of the ex-Libyan president; however, no serious steps have been taken to investigate the matter. There have been instances where such proceedings have yielded positive results — such as in the case of former Liberian President Charles Taylor, who was successfully convicted and sentenced to 50 years imprisonment by the ICC in 2012 for his crimes in Sierra Leone's civil war. Even in the case of Slobodan Milošević, the ex-president of Serbia who was arrested and transferred to the detention unit in The Hague for his alleged crimes in Kosovo. However, before the conviction, he was found dead in his prison cell in 2006.

Both these cases were heard by special tribunals set up in the wake of civil wars, and were specific in their jurisdiction in terms of the crimes committed as well as the territory where the crime took place. This jurisdiction was given by the UN in tacit compliance with the respective governments. Apart from the Russian Federations' absolute dismissal of ICC's jurisdiction — under the Rome Statute (Articles 12–14), other factors also stack up against the enforceability of these arrest warrants against Putin and Lvova-Belova.

Firstly, it has been rare for the ICC to be able to exercise jurisdiction over individuals, especially in the absence of ratification of the Rome Statute (both Ukraine and Russia are not parties to the Rome Statute — while Ukraine has previously invoked its jurisdiction twice). Secondly, since the begin-

ning of its operation, the ICC has only managed to issue ten convictions, none of which have pertained to heads of States or individuals who yield considerable influence in their respective countries. Thirdly, even if arrest warrants have been issued against heads of States, the ICC has never been able to commence prosecution and yield a conviction. Fourthly, an arrest warrant has never been initiated against a head of a permanent member of the Security Council — who holds veto power at the UN and at the Security Council. Fifthly — which is the biggest and most important criticism of the ICC — the proceedings have disproportionately prosecuted crimes in the African continent and have been issued disproportionately against citizens of African nations. War crimes in the territories of Afghanistan and Syria (both non-signatories to the Rome Statute) obviously highlight the hypocrisy of ICC. There has been a lack of willingness to proceed in these cases. Investigations have been underway for the war crimes and crimes against humanity in Afghanistan; however, nothing conclusive has come out of the investigation yet. The situation is much worse in the case of Syria, where even investigations have not taken place yet. The ICC's persistent involvement in Africa has been the source of its criticism, especially with a lack of holistic operation in all nations and any crimes within the scope of its jurisdiction. With 123 signatories, the ICC seems to yield considerable international legal influence, yet it falls short at each stage. This is also due to the fact that many notable countries that command political influence — such as China, Russia, the United States and India — have still refused to sign the Rome Statute, claiming an infringement of their sovereignty by their ability to prosecute its citizens under a

separate legal regime.
In fact, the President of the ICC himself stated that the arrest war-

rants are "not magic wands", but can provide a "deterrence effect" by acting as a "sanction" against such individuals. Hence, the question begs to be asked at this stage — what is even the point of issuing such an arrest warrant?

Considering the lack of ICC's own enforcement mechanism, the answer seems to stem from member State cooperation. It depends on member states (123 nations) to fully cooperate with the court – which pertains to their obligation to execute arrest warrants issued by the ICC if the arrestee is found on their soil. After the execution of such arrest warrants, the member States are also obligated to extradite the person(s) to The Hague to await trial. Apart from providing a personal restriction on Putin's movement, it seems like this arrest warrant would not actually result in any substantial outcome, especially pertaining to the war in question. Also, it seems highly unlikely that even these 123 nations would proceed, based on this arrest warrant, and detain and extradite the Russian head of State.

Russia's allies — especially China and India — have not signed the Rome Statute and hence. Putin will be free to travel to these countries apart from the United States as well. At this stage, full-scale prosecution against either of the parties seems highly unlikely. Even if the investigation reveals more crimes committed by either of the parties — the tool of ICC arrest warrant and proceedings overarchingly remains a futile exercise, only to attract international condemnation against the Russian invasion of Ukraine, which has officially surpassed a year.

Considering precedents, it seems impossible to execute this arrest warrant against Putin or Lvova-Belova. It truly seems that this exercise has been a futile attempt to hold them responsible — especially at the cost of resources that could have been directed to similar war crimes elsewhere. (IPA

India-Japan must act quickly to counter China in Indo-Pacific

n the time of Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida's recent visit to India, Ltwo significant developments took place. Firstly, India and Japan made a commitment to intensify their cooperation in security, trade, and technology. Secondly, the Japanese premier introduced a new plan for a free and open Indo-Pacific, which highlights India's importance as a crucial partner in maintaining a rules-based order and preventing coercion. It is evident that this Indo-Pacific plan, which will be carried out jointly by India and Japan with the support of other regional partners, aims to counter China's expansionist and aggressive behavior. The implementation and effectiveness of this plan in countering China will be closely observed in the future. It is evident that both India and Japan face a significant challenge in countering China's aggressive actions, with Japan concerned about China's territorial claims over the entire South China Sea and India worried about China's assertive activities in the eastern Ladakh sector along the Line of Actual Control.

As China continues to pursue its expansionist agenda in the Indo-Pacific region, India and Japan must act swiftly to implement their Indo-Pacific plan aimed at maintaining a free and open region and addressing the challenges posed by China. Japan's Free and Open Indo-Pacific (FOIP)



plan, worth \$75 billion, includes measures to prevent debt traps, build infrastructure, and enhance maritime and air security in collaboration with other countries in the region. These steps will involve several partners and contribute significantly to countering China's efforts to trap smaller countries in debt. India and Japan, as presidents of the G20 and G7 respectively, can effectively address the challenge from China in the Indo-Pacific and garner global consensus on the Indo-Pacific plan. India and

Japan are also members of the Quadrilateral Security Dialogue (Quad) with the US and Australia, and the Japanese premier is expected to coordinate closely with these partners to execute the Indo-Pacific plan. Tokyo seeks greater cooperation from New Delhi, Canberra, and Washington to check China's growing influence in the region.

Japan's strategy to counter China's expan-

sionist agenda in the Indo-Pacific region involves strengthening partnerships with smaller countries in the region by providing

economic infrastructure and military assistance. This approach can broaden India and Japan's efforts to address the challenge posed by China in the region. To achieve this, India and Japan must strengthen their cooperation and leverage their presidencies of the G20 and G7, respectively, to garner greater global support against expansionist activities, regardless of their source. It is crucial that India and Japan accelerate their efforts to ensure the success of the Indo-Pacific plan announced by Prime Minister Kishida during his visit to India. Notably, the concept of the Indo-Pacific region was first proposed in 2007 by former Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe in Delhi, calling for greater cooperation between democracies in Asia and unity between the Indian and Pacific Oceans. Kishida has now identified India as an essential partner in Japan's new Indo-Pacific plan aimed at countering China's unlawful activities in the region. Norivuki Shikata, cabinet secretary for public affairs in Japan's PMO, emphasized the significance of the two countries' agreement on the importance of maintaining and strengthening the international order based on the rule of law and their shared responsibilities in this context at the G7 and G20. 

North Korea claims 'radioactive tsunami' weapon test at sea

on Friday to have tested a nuclear-capable underwater drone designed to generate a gigantic "radioactive tsunami" that would destroy naval strike groups and ports.

Analysts were skeptical that the device presents a major new threat, but the test underlines the North's commitment to raising nuclear threats. The test this week came as the United States reportedly planned to deploy aircraft carrier strike groups and other advanced assets to waters off the Korean Peninsula.

Military tensions are at a high point as the pace of both North Korean weapons tests and US-South Korea joint military exercises has accelerated in the past year in a cycle of tit-for-tat responses. Pyongyang's official Korean Central News Agency said the new weapon, which can be deployed from the coast or towed by surface ships, is built to "stealthily infiltrate into operational waters and make a super-scale radioactive tsunami through an underwater explosion" to destroy enemy naval strike groups and ports.

The report came hours before South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol pledged to make North Korea pay for its "reckless provocations" as he attended a remembrance service honouring 55 South Korean troops killed during major clashes with the North near their western sea border in past years. The testing of the purported "nuclear underwater attack drone" was part of a three-day exercise that simulated nuclear attacks on unspecified South Korean targets, which also included cruise missile launches on Wednesday, KCNA



said the North's latest tests were aimed at alerting the United States and South Korea of a brewing "nuclear crisis" as they continue with their "intentional, persistent and provocative war drills." It said the tests were supervised by North Korean leader Kim Jong Un, who vowed to make his rivals "plunge into despair."

The US and South Korea completed an 11-day exercise on Thursday that included their biggest field training in years, and are preparing another round of joint naval drills that will reportedly involve a US aircraft carrier.

Hours after the North Korean report, South Korea's air force released details of a five-day joint aerial drill with the United States that began Monday and concluded on Friday above waters off South Korea's western coast, which included live-fire demonstrations of air-to-air and air-to-

various South Korean fighter jets and at least one US A-10 attack plane, was aimed at verifying precision strike capabilities and reaffirming the credibility of Seoul's "three-axis" strategy against North Korean nuclear threats — preemptively striking sources of attacks, intercepting incoming missiles and neutralizing the North's leadership and key military facilities.

The North Korean drone is named "Haeil," a Korean word meaning tidal waves or tsunamis.

The North's Rodong Sinmun newspaper published photos of Kim smiling next to a large, torpedo-shaped object at an unspecified indoor facility, but didn't identify it. Other photos published with the same article showed sea-surface tracks supposedly caused by the drone's underwater trajectory and a pillar of water exploding up into the air, possibly caused by what state media described as an underwater detonation of a mock nuclear weapon carried by the drone. KCNA said the drone was deployed on Tuesday off the North's eastern coast, traveled underwater for nearly 60 hours, and detonated a test warhead at a target standing for an enemy port. It said the test verified the operational reliability of the drone, which it said the North has been developing since 2012 and tested more than 50 times in the past two years, although the weapon was never mentioned before in state media until Friday.

Kim Dong-yub, a professor at Seoul's University of North Korean Studies, said that it's impossible to verify North Korea's claims about the drone's capabilities or that it had tested the system

Russian strikes in Ukraine kill 10 civilians, wound 20 more



KYIV, March 24 (AP): Russian long-range strikes killed at least 10 civilians and wounded 20 others in several areas of Ukraine on Friday, Ukraine's presidential office said, as a senior Moscow official warned that the Kremlin's forces were prepared for an expected Ukrainian counteroffensive in the coming weeks. Five people died in Kostiantynivka, a town in eastern Ukraine's Donetsk province, when a Russian missile hit an aid station. Ukrainian authorities last year established hundreds of so-called "points of invincibility", where residents hard-pressed by the war could warm up, charge their cell phones and get snacks. Local prosecutors said the Russians attacked Kostyantynivka with S-300 anti-aircraft missiles. The civilians who died were refugees, according to Donetsk Gov. Pavlo Kyrylenko.

As the mostly artillery war of the recent winter months stretched into its second spring, Russian forces also used air-launched missiles, exploding drones and gliding bombs in their attacks on several regions early on Friday, Ukrainian air force

Two civilians were killed and nine were wounded in the Sumy province town of Bilopillia by a nighttime rocket and artillery barrage and air strikes, the administration of the northeast region said.

In the southern Kherson region, which Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy visited on Thursday, Russian shelling killed one person in the main city, also called Kherson, and killed another person and wounded four others in the town of Bilozerska.

On Wednesday, a Russian drone attack struck a high school and dormitories south of Kyiv, killing at least nine people. Kyiv's forces are poised to use the improved spring weather and the arrival of modern weapons supplied by its Western allies, including tanks, to launch a counteroffensive aimed at dislodging Russian troops from occupied areas of Ukraine.

But Dmitry Medvedev, Russia's former president and now the deputy head of Russia's Security Council chaired by President Vladimir Putin, said the Russian military was ready to repel a counterattack.

"Our General Staff is assessing all that," Medvedev said. He also said that a Ukrainian attempt to seize Crimea, which Russia annexed in 2014, could trigger a nuclear response from Moscow.

"An attempt to split part of the state away means an encroachment at the very existence of the state," he said. "Quite obviously, it warrants the use of any weapons. I hope our friends' across the ocean realise that." Though known for his bombastic pronouncements, Medvedev's warning stems from the Russian security doctrine envisaging the use of nuclear weapons in response to a nuclear attack or an attack with conventional weapons that threatens "the very existence of the Russian state".

Pak receives USD 2 billion rollover deposits from China to get IMF bailout: Report



ISLAMABAD, March 24 (PTI): Cash-strapped Pakistan has received a rollover of USD 2 billion in deposits for a period of one year from its all-weather ally China to help Islamabad get a much-required bailout from the IMF to stabilise its economy, a media report said on Friday.

The rollover, which basically is not a loan but a financial deposit to be kept at Pakistan's central bank for a period of one year, is one of the requirements of the International Monetary Fund (IMF) in meeting its external financing needs in order to move towards inking the staff-level agreement, The News International reported.

Minister for Finance Ishaq Dar confirmed the development.

"Yes," Dar was quoted as saying in a brief response when asked about getting a rollover of USD 2 billion SAFE (State Administration of Foreign Exchange) deposits from China.

Pakistan and the IMF have been negotiating the release of a USD 1.1 billion loan since February but so far without any success due to the tough conditions by the donor which Pakistan is slow to fulfil.

Pakistan is scrambling to increase its forex reserves which are estimated to be at USD 4.8 billion after China refinanced USD 500 million last week. Earlier, a Chinese bank provided USD 700 million to Pakistan.

Despite a slight improvement in the reserves, the situation is still grim as the country needs to pay USD 7 billion till June this year, making further borrowing neces-

Efforts to secure a loan from the IMF have been unsuccessful so far, which is expected to open avenues for further borrowing from the international market or getting loans from friendly countries.

There are nine tables under the Memorandum of Economic and Financial Policies (MEFP) that are required to be filled, the report

Separately, Geo News reported on March 7 that Pakistan communicated to the IMF that it requested China to roll over USD 2 billion SAFE deposits by a year.

The total Chinese SAFE deposits stood at USD 4 billion and the remaining maturity would become due in a few months.

According to the report, the Ministry of Finance and State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) shared their external financing plan during virtual parleys with the Washington-based IMF, saying that it plans on raising its dwindling foreign exchange reserves to the USD 10 billion mark by end of June.

US launches airstrikes in Syria after drone kills US worker

BEIRUT, March 24 (AP): A strike on Thursday by a suspected Iranian-made drone killed a US contractor and wounded five American troops and another contractor in northeast Syria, the Pentagon said.

American forces said they retaliated soon after with "precision airstrikes" in Syria targeting facilities used by groups affiliated with Iran's Revolutionary Guard, with activist groups saying they killed at least four people.

The attack and the US response threaten to upend recent efforts to de escalate tensions across the wider Middle East, whose rival powers have made steps toward détente in recent days after years of turmoil.

US Defence Secretary Lloyd Austin said in a statement that the American intelligence community had determined the drone was of Iranian origin, but offered no other immediate evidence to support the claim. "The airstrikes were conducted in response to today's attack as well as a series of recent attacks against coalition forces in Syria" by groups affiliated with the Revolutionary Guard, Austin said.

Iran relies on a network of proxy forces through the Mideast to counter the US and Israel, its arch regional enemy. The Pentagon said treated on-site, while three others and the injured contractor were transported to medical facilities in Iraq. Overnight, videos on social media purported to show explosions in Syria's Deir el-Zour, a strategic province that borders Iraq and contains oil fields.

Iran-backed militia groups and Syrian forces control the area, which also has seen suspected airstrikes by Israel in recent months allegedly targeting Iranian supply routes.

Iran and Syria did not immediately acknowledge the strikes, nor did their officials at the United Nations in New York respond to requests for comment from The Associated Press.

The activist group Deir Ezzor 24 put the death toll from the American strikes at four people. Deir Ezzor 24, which covers news in Deir el-Zour province, said the strikes hit the city of Deir el-Zour as well as militiamen posts near Mayadeen and Boukamal.

It said the strikes also wounded people, including Iraqis.

The Syrian Observatory for Human Rights, an opposition war monitor, reported that the American strikes killed six Iranian-backed fighters at an arms depot in the Harabesh neighborhood in the city of Deir el-Zour.

In recent months, Russia has begun using Iranian drones in its attacks on sites across Ukraine as part of its war on Kyiv.

Iran has issued a series of conflicting denials about its drones being used in the war, though Western nations and experts have tied components in the drones back to Tehran.

The exchange of strikes came as Saudi Arabia and Iran have been working toward reopening embassies in each other's countries.

The kingdom also acknowledged efforts to reopen a Saudi embassy in Syria, whose embattled President Bashar Assad has been backed by

UK demonstrators protest Israeli leader's visit to London

LONDON, March 24 (AP): British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak welcomed Benjamin Netanyahu at his official residence in London on Friday as protesters shouted "Shame!" In Hebrew demonstrated against the Israeli leader's rightwing policies and his plans to overhaul the country's judiciary.

Netanyahu had to pass by hundreds of protesters waving Israeli flags and waving signs calling for the defense of Israeli democracy as he arrived for talks that are expected to focus on concerns about Iran's nuclear programme. "We are Israelis and Jews living in the UK demonstrating against Prime Minister Netanyahu, who is leading a judicial coup turning Israel into a dictatorship," one placard read.

Netanyahu arrived in London as protesters in Israel blocked roads and clashed with police over his rightwing government's plans to overhaul the judicial system. The proposals have ignited the biggest protests in self-determination.

Biden's Canada agenda stacked: NORAD, migration deals likely

OTTAWA, March 24 (AP): President Joe Biden arrived in Canada on Thursday for talks with Prime Minister Justin Trudeau on several of the world's most difficult challenges: the war in Ukraine, climate change, trade, mass migration and an increasingly assertive China.

Two important agreements appeared to be in hand before Biden even departed Washington. Canada will escalate its timeline for military upgrades to the North American Aerospace Defense Command and the two nations have reached an agreement to update rules for migrants seeking asylum, according to U.S. and Canadian officials. The officials were not authorized to comment publicly and requested anonymity.

The migration deal eliminates a loophole under existing rules that will allow both countries to turn away asylum seekers at the countries' borders. The loophole resulted in thousands of migrants annually crossing into Canada from the U.S. at a non-official checkpoint, enabling them to stay in the country as they seek asylum instead of letting the process play out while staying in the U.S. As part of the agreement, Canada is expected to announce that 15,000 migrants from the West-



ern Hemisphere will be given slots to apply to enter the country, according to a Canadian official. The new policy applies to people without U.S. or Canadian citizenship who are caught within 14 days of crossing the border between the two countries. The White House declined to comment on the agreement, which is expected to be formally announced Friday.

The visit comes as the Biden administration has made strengthening its relationship with Canada a priority over the past two years. Both sides see the meetings in the capital of Ottawa as an opportunity to set plans for the future.

National security and air defenses are top of mind after a Chinese spy balloon last month traversed North America. Canada plans to update its radar systems and has agreed to an accelerated timeline for spending billions more on military upgrades for NORAD, which monitors the skies above the continent, according to the senior Canadian government official.

Canada announced last year it is investing \$3.8 billion (Canadian \$4.9 billion) over the next six years to modernize NORAD radar systems and billions more years later, but David Cohen, the U.S. ambassador to Canada, has said the current threat climate calls for quicker investment. King Charles III's triumphal state visit hits French hurdle

Charles III's first state visit as monarch was scaled back on Friday, dashing hopes for a triumphal tour to win hearts and minds abroad just as his mother did so successfully during her 70 years on the throne.

The visit by Charles and his wife, Camilla, to France was postponed amid mass protests in the country over President Emmanuel Macron's plans to reform the pension system. The German leg of

the trip will take place as planned. Charles' initial plan to visit France and Germany, the two biggest countries in the European Union, was meant to rebuild ties with Britain's closest neighbours after six years of squabbling over Brexit. But French domestic troubles put paid to that.

"The king and queen consort's State Visit to France has been postponed," the British prime minister's Downing Street office said in a statement.

"This decision was taken with the consent of all parties, after the president of France asked the refugees and military.

"Their Majesties greatly look forward to the opportunity to visit France as soon as dates can be found," the palace said in a state-



He said the state government requires support, cooperation and assistance of each and every member of all political parties in the interest of the Naga people for an early solution to the Naga Political Issue and various other issues confronting the state. Rio also informed the House that he has already met the BJP central leaders and informed them about the acceptance of the support extended by other political parties and they have also accepted it. "The support extended by other political parties cannot be refused." he said.

Heartily accepting the support of other parties, Rio expressed confidence that "the coming together of all political parties in support will help the state in reaching even higher levels of development, progress and for early solution of Naga Political Issue which is what we aspire and look forward to".

The episode raised fears over the possibility of the return of Khalistani militancy to Punjab that borders Pakistan.

NEW DELHI, March 24 (PTI): The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Friday filed a fresh charge sheet against jailed gangster Lawrence Bishnoi and Goldy Brar, the alleged masterminds in the murder of Punjabi singer Sidhu Moosewala, and a dozen others, charging them with criminal conspiracy to unleash a wave of terror and carry out targeted killings of highprofile people. The prosecution complaint has been filed against these gangsters who, the federal anti-terror agency said, had "links" with the proscribed Babbar Khalsa International (BKI) and several other pro-Khalistan terrorist outfits. The charge sheet came in the second of the three terror-gangster nexus cases that are being investigated by the NIA.

"All the 14 accused have been charged with criminal conspiracy to unleash a wave of terror and carry out targeted killings of well-known social and religious leaders, movie stars, singers and businessmen."

"Besides having links with conspirators in Pakistan, the accused were also in contact with pro-Khalistan elements based in Canada, Nepal and other countries," the NIA said. Apart from Bishnoi and Brar (alias Satwinderjeet Singh), the other accused who were charge-sheeted were Jagdeep Singh alias Jaggu Bhagwanpuriya, Sachin Thapan alias Sachin Bishnoi, Anmol Bishnoi alias Bhanu, Vikramjeet Singh alias Vikram Brar, Sandeep Jhanjariya alias Kala Jatheri, Virender Pratap Singh alias Kala Rana, Joginder Singh, Rajesh Kumar alias Raju Mota, Raj Kumar alias Raju/Raju Basodi, Anil alias Chippi, Naresh Yadav alias Seth, and Shahbaaz Ansari alias Shahbaaz. Bishnoi, who continues to remain in jail after his arrest in 2015, has been operating his terror-crime syndicate from prisons in different states, along with



Canada-based Goldy Brar, who is an accused in the killing of 'Dera Sacha Sauda' follower Pradeep Kumar at Faridkot (Punjab) in November, 2022. "The Lawrence Bishnoi terror-crime-extortion syn-

dicate was also responsible for providing killers for the RPG attack case on Punjab state intelligence headquarters at Mohali, which was carried out on directions of Harwinder Singh alias Rinda, a Pakistan-based BKI terrorist," the NIA said. Brar was found to have "direct links" with Lakhbir Singh alias Landa, another BKI operative working closely with Rinda, it said. Landa is also an accused in the Mohali RPG attack, as well as the December, 2022 RPG attack on police station Sirhali in the Tarn Taran district of Punjab. The NIA has earlier carried out raids in this case and seized a huge cache of nine illegal and sophisticated weapons, 14 magazines, 298 rounds of ammunition and 183 digital devices and other "incriminating" material at 74 locations in Puniah. SC to hear on plea by 14 oppn parties



NEW DELHI, March 24 (PTI): The Supreme Court on Friday agreed to list for hearing on April 5 a plea by 14 opposition parties, led by the Congress, alleging arbitrary use of central probe agencies against political opponents. A bench headed by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud took note of the submissions of senior advocate AM Singhvi, appearing for the opposition parties such as the DMK, RJD, Bharat Rashtra Samiti, Trinamool Congress, NCP, Jharkhand Mukti Morcha, JD(U), CPI(M), Communist Party of India, Samajwadi Party and J&K National Conference, and said the plea would be taken up for hearing on April 5. "I am asking for the guidelines for the future. This is a remarkable convergence of 14 parties against the misuse of the agencies, both CBI and ED. Ninety five per cent cases of the CBI and ED are against the leaders of opposition." Singhyi said. The senior lawyer referred to the rise in the number of cases filed by CBI and ED after the NDA government came to power. "Second statistics, pre-2014 and post-2014. Tere is a humongous jump in cases. The rate of conviction is four to five percent. We are asking for pre-arrest guidelines and post-arrest bail guidelines," Singhvi said.

Corrupt Cong wants to make K'taka its ATM, says Shah

BENGALURU, March 24 (PTI): Union home and cooperation minister Amit Shah on Friday said the Congress is degenerating across the country, and has now set its eyes on Karnataka to make the state its ATM and fill its coffers at the national level.

Speaking in the poll-bound State, he appealed to people of Karnataka not to give a "half and incomplete government", and to form a BJP government with full majority and thereby strengthen the hands of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and chief minister Basavaraj Bommai.

"Congress party is degenerating across the country, the Congress people don't have any state with them that can fill the Congress' central treasury, and they want an ATM..... They want Karnataka to become Congress' ATM, and the corrupt Congress' eyes are now set on Karnataka." Shah said.

Addressing a beneficiaries' meet organised by Karnataka Cooperative department and other departments, he asked people whether they will form a BJP government under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership in Karnataka or a Congress government with Rahul Gandhi at the

"Wherever the Congress has formed the government, their history is corruption, humiliation of Dalits, OBCs and Adivasis, and strengthenng anti-national forces," he alleged.

Bommai, veteran BJP leader B S Yedivurappa, Karnataka Co-Operation Minister S T Somashekar among others were present at the

Highlighting that the Modi government banned Popular Font of India (PFI), Shah said. "Siddaramaiah's Congress government (earlier), used to withdraw cases against PFI, but Narendra Modi government by banning PFI has secured the entire South India, and also the entire country."

Claiming credit for the construction of Ram Mandir in Ayodhya, he said, the Congress party was 'delaying, obstructing and misleading' for 70 years, but Modi has laid the foundation for the temple and it will be ready very soon.

'Country is working to eliminate tuberculosis by 2025 as against the global target of 2030'

VARANASI, March 24 (PTI): India's ideology of "Vasudhaiva Kutumbkam" is giving the modern world an integrated vision and solutions, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on Friday, as he launched a series of initiatives to eliminate tuberculosis.

Addressing the 'One World TB Summit' on World TB Day, Modi said the country is working to eliminate tuberculosis by 2025 as against the global target of 2030.

"India's image reflects in its ideology of 'Vasudev Kutumbkam' (whole world, one family). This old thought is giving the modern world an integrated vision and solutions," he said. As G20 president, India chose the theme of 'One Family, One World, One Future' based on such beliefs, Modi said. India is forwarding the vision of 'One Earth, One Health' in the world, he said while underlining that India is realising the resolutions of global good with the 'One World TB Summit'.

The Prime Minister asserted that the thought and approach with which India worked against tuberculosis after 2014 is



"incredible". "This effort of India should be known to the whole world today because this is a new model in the global fight against TB. "In nine years, India has united in this fight against TB on many fronts such as public participation, special campaigns for nutrition, new strategies for treatment. intensive use of technology and promoting good health though campaigns like Khelo India and Yoga," he said.

Another major resolution of India is to eliminate tuberculosis by 2025 as against the global target of 2030, Modi said. Referring to the capacity and health infrastructure enhancement during the Covid friends for TB patients has reached above pandemic, Modi underlined the high use of trace, test, track, treat and technology in the fight against the disease.

There is massive global potential in this local approach of India, said the Prime Minister. Noting that 80 per cent of tuberculosis medicines are made in India, he said, "I would like that more and more countries get the benefit of all such campaigns, innovations and modern technology of India."


Modi said the country launched a unique

campaign to fight the disease. "We had called upon the people of the country to make 'Ni-kshay Mitra' to join the campaign of TB-free India. After the campaign, 10 lakh TB patients have been adopted by the common citizens. You would be surprised to know that in our country even 10-12 year old children are taking forward the fight against TB by becoming Nikshay Mitra," he said.

"There are many such children who broke their piggy banks and adopted TB patients. The financial support of these Ni-kshay one thousand crore rupees," he said, adding Indians living abroad have also become a part of this effort.

The Prime Minister said since 2018, about ₹ 2,000 crore has been sent directly to the bank accounts of tuberculosis patients and about 75 lakh patients have benefited from it. "It is difficult to get new results by following the old approach. Started working on a new strategy to ensure that no TB patient is left out of treatment. For testing TB patients, the number of labs has been increased and special plans are made for those where TB patients are more," he said.

The Prime Minister said it is a matter of pride that the summit is being organised in Varanasi, which he represents in the Lok Sabha. No matter the obstacle, Kashi has always proved that new ways are created with 'Sabka Prayas (everyone's effort)', he said while expressing confidence that Kashi will usher new energy towards global resolutions in the fight against a disease like tuberculosis.

'Conman' posed as PMO official faces 4 FIRs in Gujarat

Ahmedabad crime branch lodged a case under IPC section 420, 406, 120-b, and 170 against the alleged conman

AHMEDABAD, March 24 (PTI): Alleged conman from Gujarat Kiran Patel, held in Jammu and Kashmir for posing as a top official of the Prime Minister Office (PMO), has been booked by the Ahmedabad cops on cheating and criminal conspiracy charges for trying to usurp a senior citizen's bungalow here using the same tactic, an official has said. Patel, a resident of the Ghodasar area of the city, was arrested by the Jammu and Kashmir police earlier this month from a five-star hotel in Srinagar after the authorities grew suspicious about his activities. On Wednesday, the Ahmedabad city crime branch lodged a case of cheating (Indian Penal Code section 420), criminal breach of trust (406), criminal conspiracy (120-b) and personating a public servant (170) against the alleged conman, said Deputy Commissioner of Police, Crime, Chaitanya Mandlik, on Thursday.

Patel's wife Malini Patel has been shown as a co-accused in the FIR (first information report), he said.

"As per our information, four FIRs related to cheating have been registered against Kiran Patel in different police stations of Gujarat in the past. Since he is in judicial custody, we will try to bring him here through a transfer warrant," Mandlik said. In the latest FIR, it is al-



leged that Patel tried to grab a bungalow in a posh locality in Ahmedabad by winning the trust of its owner through false claims of being a "Class I officer in the PMO" and having close relations with politicians The complainant, 63-year-old Jagdish Chavda, owns a bungalow in the Shilaj area but wanted to sell it because of personal reasons. Patel approached Chavda in February 2022, claiming to be a real estate agent, and told the owner his property would fetch a good price if it was renovated.

To win Chavda's trust, Patel then identified himself as a "Class-1 officer in the PMO" as well as a partner in a cafe chain. When Chavda agreed for the bungalow's renovation, Patel, his wife Malini and an interior designer started the work and took Rs 35 lakh in instalments from him, the FIR said. As renovation was underway, Chavda shifted to his friend's residence in the Shela area. After some time, Chavda learnt that

Patel and his wife had put their own name plate outside the bungalow and also did a housewarming ritual as if they were the owners.

When confronted, the Patel couple left the bungalow without finishing the renovation work, following which Chavda and his family moved back into the house, according to the police. In August 2022, Chavda learnt through a court notice that Patel had filed a civil suit claiming ownership of the property, said the FIR. In August 2019, a city-based decorator had lodged a complaint in Vadodara against Patel and two others for allegedly duping him of ₹ 1 crore. As per the FIR registered at the Raopura police station in 2019, Patel along with two event organisers - Dipesh Sheth and Dhara Sheth - had approached the complainant, Paritosh Shah, to decorate Navlakhi ground in Vadodara for a

Navratri event held in October 2018.

While the trio paid nearly ₹ 50 lakh to Shah in various instalments for the work done, they started giving excuses to clear the remaining bill of Rs 1 crore, as per the FIR. At one point, Patel even threatened Shah with dire consequences claiming he was politically well-connected. When the trio refused to pay the pending money, Shah lodged a complaint with the Raopura police in August 2019.

BBC Documentary: Several DU students manhandled, over varsity action

NEW DELHI, March 24 (PTI): Nearly a dozen students protesting against the debarment of two students for allegedly participating in a screening of the BBC documentary on Delhi University campus were detained on Friday from the Arts Faculty.

The students have alleged that they were manhandled by the police and university security inside the North Campus premises.

According to police, 11 students demonstrating near the Vivekananda statute were removed to maintain peace and tranquillity in DU North Campus. Meanwhile, the university has said that the students did not seek permission before the protest and added that such indiscipline will not be tolerated.

The students were sitting on an indefinite strike to protest against the "draconian" action by the university authorities. There was no immediate reaction from the varsity authority and the police. The students have claimed that heavy police and paramilitary forces were deployed inside the Arts Faculty ahead of the protest. "Students who gathered for the indefinite strike against debarring of two students from DU have been beaten and detained by Delhi Police and DU Guards. As many as 25 students have been detained," All India Students' Association (AISA) Delhi president Abhigyan told PTI.

According to sources, several students have been taken to Burari police station. "Students gathered at Arts Faculty against the arbitary notice debarring two students have been brutally beaten, manhandled and detained. This exposes the Nexus of the police, BJP-RSS backed college administration. We will not be si-



lenced by such measures, protest to protect our campus democracy, dissent will continue untill this notice is withdrawn!" AISA DU Secretary Anjali said.

In a video shared by the AISA activists, security forces of the university were seen dragging, removing and pushing students from the spot.

DU proctor Rajni Abbi claimed that many of these protestors are not even from Delhi University.

"They have started protesting inside the Arts Faculty. They did not even inform the police. We have asked them to at least inform the police before such gatherings. And now they have started protesting under the Vivekananda statue just to prevent the wrath of the police. This will not be tolerated. Many of these people are not even DU students," DU Proctor Rajni Abbi told PTI.

Delhi court reserves order on bail plea of former Dy-CM Sisodia

NEW DELHI, March 24 (PTI): A Delhi court on Friday said it will pronounce its order on former deputy chief minister Manish Sisodia's bail plea on March 31 in the excise policy case lodged by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI).

Special Judge M K Nagpal reserved his order on the Aam Aadmi Party leader's plea seeking regular bail in the case after the CBI handed over a short note regarding its contention in the case.

JAIPUR, March 24 (PTI): Rajasthan chief minister Ashok Gehlot hit out at the BJP following the disqualification of Rahul Gandhi as an MP on Friday, saying that the Congress leader is the voice of the nation and

he will come out stronger against "dictatorship".

"The disqualification of Rahul Gandhi from Lok Sabha is another example of dictatorship. BJP should not forget that they had adopted the same method against India Gandhi also and had to face the conse-

quences," Gehlot said in a tweet.

"Rahul Gandhi is the voice of the country which will now be stronger against this dictatorship, "he added. The chief minister said during the Bharat Jodo Yatra, Gandhi raised the issue of price rise, unemployment, corruption and violence. Instead of paying at-

tention to them, the BJP government is taking repressive steps against him.

Former Congress president Rahul Gandhi was disqualified from Lok Sabha on Friday, a day after he was convicted by a Surat court in a 2019 criminal defamation case. Announcing his disqualification, the Lok Sabha Secretariat in a notification said that it was effective from March 23, the day of his conviction.

"Consequent upon his conviction by the Court of Chief Judicial Magistrate, Surat...Rahul Gandhi, Member of Lok Sabha representing the Wayanad Parliamentary Constituency of Kerala stands disqualified from the membership of Lok Sabha from the date of his conviction i.e. 23 March, 2023," the notification read.

Amruta case: Court sends designer Aniksha to 14-day judicial custody

MUMBAI, March 24 (PTI): A court here on Friday sent Aniksha Jaisinghani, arrested for allegedly offering a bribe to Maharashtra deputy chief minister Devendra Fadnavis's wife Amruta and also threatening her, to 14-day judicial custody, turning down the cops' plea to extend her police remand.

Aniksha was arrested by the city police on March 16 based on a case filed at Malabar Hill police station on February 20 on the complaint of Amruta Fadnavis. She is also accused of demanding extortion of ₹ 10 crore from the latter.

The police produced Aniksha before sessions court judge DD Almale at the end of her previous remand. The police, represented by special public prosecutor Ajay Misar, sought her custody for three more days to confront her with a witness. Aniksha's lawyer Manan Sanghai submitted that no new ground was made out for extending the police remand. The court, after hearing both sides, rejected the investigators' plea

and remanded the accused in judicial custody. Police have also arrested her father and suspected bookie Anil Jaisinghani and their relative Nirmal Jaisinghani in connection with the case. The duo is in police custody till Monday. They have been booked under Indian Penal Code (IPC) sections for conspiracy and extortion and provisions of the Prevention of Corruption Act. As per the FIR, Aniksha was in touch with Amruta for the past 16 months and also visited her residence.

Tax benefits for debt

Finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman moved the Bill and the 64 amendments which were all approved by voice vote. These will now go to Rajya Sabha and will become law once the President gives assent. From April 1, investments in debt mutual funds will be taxed as short-term capital gains, stripping investors of the long-term tax benefits that made such investments popular.

Currently, investors in debt funds pay income tax on capital gains according to the income tax slab for a holding period of three years. After three years these funds pay either 20 percent with indexation benefits or 10 percent without indexation. After the amendment, such gains from transfer of units of specified mutual funds will be treated as short term and taxed at slab rates. This is in addition to taxation of market linked debenture proposed in the original bill.

Specified mutual funds have been defined to include funds where not more than 35 percent of proceeds are invested in shares of domestic companies. This may include debt mutual funds and gold ETFs where investment in domestic companies is less than 35 percent of proceeds of the fund.

The move will bring taxation of such mutual funds on par with bank deposits which are taxed at slab rates. Finance secretary T V Somanathan said the move was aimed at bringing parity with instruments which are of a similar nature. The government in 2014 had changed the taxation of debt mutual funds (period of holding for short term gains was increased to 3 years and tax rates were increased to 20 percent). Also, credit card payments for foreign travel will be brought under the purview of the Liberalised Remittance Scheme (LRS) of the Reserve Bank to ensure that such expenses do not escape TCS (Tax Collection at Source).

The Union Budget 2023 proposed a TCS for foreign outward remittance under LRS other than for education and medical purposes of 20 percent applicable from July 1, 2023. Before this proposal, the TCS of 5 percent was applicable on foreign outward remittances above ₹ 7 lakh. Tax Collected at Source (TCS) is an income tax, collected by the seller of specified goods, from the buyer. TCS is a concept where a person selling specific items is liable to collect tax from a buyer at a prescribed rate and deposit the same with the government. The LRS, introduced in 2004, initially permitted outflow of USD 25,000. The LRS limit has been revised in stages consistent with prevailing macro and micro economic conditions.

LRS permits Indians to freely remit up to USD 250,000 (about ₹ 2.05 crore) per financial year for current or capital account transactions or a combination of both. Any remittance exceeding this limit requires prior permission from the RBI. Moving the Bill, Sitharaman also announced a committee under the finance secretary to look into pension issues of government employees. "I propose to set up a committee under the finance secretary to look into the issue of pensions and evolve an approach which addresses the needs of employees while maintaining fiscal prudence to protect common citizens," she said. "The approach will be designed for adoption by both the central government and state governments."

The move comes in the backdrop of several non-BJP states deciding to revert to the DA-linked Old Pension Scheme (OPS) and also employee organisations in some other states raising demand for the same.

The state governments of Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Punjab and Himachal Pradesh have informed the Centre about their decision to revert to the Old Pension Scheme and have requested a refund of corpus accumulated under the NPS. With the increase in tax rate on royalty and fee for technical services, foreign companies will be required to avail tax treaty shelter to reduce the withholding tax rate. The proposal to tax the income other than interest, dividend, rent and capital gains, by unit holders of REIT/InVIT has been further amended in the latest round of changes in the Finance Bill. The government has allowed the benefit of cost against the return of capital component for the unit holders and the tax exemption has been extended to other income arising for sovereign wealth funds/pension funds as unit holders of business trusts.

Also, an amendment approved provides for setting up of the GST Tribunal, which is expected to help streamline pending litigations. As of December 31, 2022, assets under management for debt oriented products stood at ₹ 12.42 lakh crore. MUDRA loans for

micro units/enterprises set up under Joint Liability Group (JLG) framework (individually or jointly) are now eligible for guarantee coverage under Credit Guarantee Fund for Micro Units (CGFMU) as per the amended Finance Bill.

Finance Bill proposed to tax distribution from business trust which has income from other sources at applicable rate. This is now proposed to be treated as return of capital i.e., reduction from cost of acquisition, till the cost at which the unit was issued.

However, any amount in excess of the issue price would be taxable as income. Thus, the change would benefit the unitholders vis a vis the earlier proposal.

The amended Finance Bill also deferred the angel tax to April 1, 2024. Exclusions, as already provided to domestic venture capital funds etc, shall also be considered for similar overseas entities. Two other key changes proposed in the Finance Bill are in relation to taxation of Business Trusts. The government has allowed the benefit of cost against the return of capital component for the unitholders and the tax exemption has been extended to other income arising for sovereign wealth funds/pension funds as unitholders of business trusts, Naveen Aggarwal, Partner, Tax, KPMG in India, said.

As per the Budget proposals, capital gains earned on redemption of market linked debentures (MLDs) would be deemed to be treated as short-term capital gains taxable at slab rates without any indexation benefit, irrespective of the holding period. As the Finance Act, specified mutual funds where at least 65 percent investment are in equity shares of domestic companies are also included in the scope of the above deeming provision (along with MLDs), Alok Agrawal, partner, Deloitte India.

Sitharaman said one amendment is for the GST Council which is establishing the Tribunal. The amendments proposed in Section 109 of the CGST Act would not merely help the government in setting up of GST tribunals in a time-bound manner but would also enable the Principle Bench to take certain important decisions such as distribution of cases amongst the state benches, referring of case to other members in case of difference in views within the same bench or otherwise, etc.

This would help in streamlining the litigation process, Saurabh Agarwal, Tax Partner, EY said. Also, Securities Transaction Tax (STT) on options sale has been hiked to ₹ 2,100 on a turnover of ₹ 1 crore from ₹ 1,700 earlier.

Now, therefore, Dimapur, Niuland, Chumoukedima, Mon, Kiphire, Noklak, Phek and Peren districts in Nagaland and the areas in Nagaland falling within the jurisdiction of i) Khuzama, Kohima North, Kohima South, Zubza and Kezocha police stations in Kohima District; ii) Mangkolemba, Mokokchung-I, Longtho, Tuli, Longchem and Anaki 'C' police stations in Mokokchung District; iii) Yanglok police station in Longleng District; iv) Bhandari, Champang and Ralan police stations in Wokha District; and v) Ghatashi, Pughoboto, Satakha, Suruhuto, Zunheboto and Aghunato police stations in Zunheboto District, are declared as 'disturbed area' under Section 3 of the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act, 1958 for a period of six months with effect from April 1, 2023, unless withdrawn earlier," the notification said.

Following his disqualification, Gandhi would not be able to contest elections for eight years unless a higher court stays his conviction and sentence. Hours before the notification was issued, Gandhi attended Lok Sabha proceedings in the morning session. Before the proceedings commenced, he also participated in a meeting of party MPs in the Parliament complex. Incidentally, the Congress-led United Progressive Alliance government, in 2013, had attempted to circumvent a Supreme Court ruling to set aside an RP Act provision under which a person sentenced to imprisonment of two years or more shall be disqualified "from the date of such conviction" and remain disqualified for another six years after serving time. Gandhi himself had opposed the ordinance at that time and tore the ordinance in a press conference as a token of protest.

Reacting to Gandhi's disqualification, the Congress said it was "a black day for Indian democracy" and asserted that the battle will be fought both "legally and politi-

Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge said the BJP made all efforts to get him disqualified as he was speaking the truth. "He has been removed from the House for speaking the truth, fighting for the Constitution and for people's rights," Kharge alleged. "This was not a question of backward class, Lalit Modi and Nirav Modi are not of backward class. They are trying to build a perception that Rahul Gandhi spoke against the backward class. Gandhi was putting forward the truth before the country so they were not liking it," he said in an apparent reference to BJP chief J P Nadda's remarks that Gandhi had compared OBC communities to thieves.

The BJP would be thinking that their problem is solved by ousting him from Lok Sabha but it is not so as the demand for Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) would continue to be raised, he said. Opposition leaders have been demanding a JPC probe into the Adani issue. "We will keep fighting to protect democracy and even if we have to go to jail, we will do so. Our people are ready to fight," Kharge said. Congress general secretary in-charge communications Jairam Ramesh said in a tweet, "We will fight this battle both legally and politically. We will not be intimidated or silenced. Instead of a JPC into the PM-linked Adani Maha Mega Scam, Rahul Gandhi stands disqualified. Indian Democracy Om Shanti." Congress general secretary in-charge organisation K C Venugopal also lashed out at the government and said the day Gandhi raised questions about the Adani issue against Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the BJP planned a "conspiracy" to silence the voice of Gandhi. "This is a clear case of anti-democratic, dictatorial attitude of the BJP government," Venugopal said in a video statement.

'Parineeta' director Pradeep Sarkar dies at 67

MUMBAI, March 24 (PTI): Filmmaker Pradeep Sarkar, best known for his movies "Parineeta" and "Mardaani", passed away at a hospital early on Friday, his wife Panchali said. He was 67.

The director was admitted to the intensive care unit (ICU) of Lilavati hospital in suburban Bandra following a fever. "He passed away between 3.10 am and 3.30 am at Lilavati hospital," his wife told PTI. The filmmaker had viral fever on March 22. After administering some medicines his fever subsided but not

completely. So he was rushed to the hospital, she said.

"By the time we reached the hospital, his vitals started dropping. He was put on a ventilator in the ICU and was diagnosed with pneumonia. The infection attacked his lungs.

"According to doctors, he had many comorbidities which weakened his immunity. His blood pressure was fluctuating. Since COVID-19 hit him in July 2022, he was quite weak," Panchali said.



Sarkar's last rites will be held at Santacruz Hindu Crematorium at 4 pm.

The filmmaker initially began as ad-film maker, directing several advertisements for prominent brands across the country. He also directed music videos, which included Shubha Mudgal's "Ab Ke Saawan", Euphoria's "Dhoom Pichak Dhoom" and Sultan Khan's "Piva Basanti".

He turned to direction with 2005's period drama "Parineeta", adapted from author Sarat Chandra Chattopadhyay's 1914 Bengali novella of the same name. The filmmaker won the National Award for best debut film of a director for the Vidya Balan-Saif Ali Khan starrer.

Some of his other directorial ventures were "Laaga Chunari Mein Daag" (2007), "Lafangey Parindey" (2010), "Mardaani" (2014), and "Helicopter Eela" (2018).

The news of Sarkar's death shocked his col-

leagues in the film industry.

Rani Mukerji on Pradeep Sarkar's death: It's like losing a member of family



MUMBAI, March 24 (PTI): Bollywood star Rani Mukerji, who had collaborated with filmmaker Pradeep Sarkar on "Laaga Chunari Mein Daag" and "Mardaani", said the director's death this morning came as a shock as they had planned to meet soon.

Sarkar, best known for directing 2005 feature film "Parineeta", died at Lilavati hospital in suburban Bandra here, his wife Panchali told PTI. He was 67. Mukerji, who worked with the director on "Laaga Chunari Mein Daag" and "Mardaani", said she interacted with Sarkar a few days ago when he called to congratulate the actor for her latest movie "Mrs Chatterjee vs Norway"

"I'm very very shocked by the news of Dada's passing away. I, in fact, spoke to him just the other day when I had gone to Amritsar, to the Golden Temple where he had called me telling

me about my film so we had a long chat, he was insisting to do a facetime call but that day the network was not good so I was unable to video call with him.

"We were planning to meet this week when I got back but it is just so unexpected. His wife (Panchali boudi) called me at 4 am when this happened, it is really sad and shocking that dada has passed away like this," the 45-year-old actor said in a statement. Mukerji said Sarkar's death is a great loss to his family as well as the film industry.

"He was also shooting these last few days so I don't know how it all transpired in just a matter of a few hours. I'm sure everybody who knows Dada will feel his loss deeply the way I'm feeling it. I had a great connection with him, we've done a lot of work together over the years, so it's literally like losing a family member.

Messi mania grips Argentina in 1st match as WC champs

BUENOS AIRES, March 24 (AP): Messi mania gripped Buenos Aires as the Argentina national team led by Lionel Messi beat Panama 2-0 in a friendly match that was essentially a celebration of their World Cup victory last December. Although the world champions dominated the game, they didn't get a goal until the 78th minute of the second half, when Thiago Almada scored after a free kick by

Messi hit the goal post. Ten minutes later, it was Messi's turn and he scored the 800th goal of his professional career with a perfectly executed free-kick. He is now one short of the 100-goal mark for the national squad.

After the match, the celebratears streamed down his face and tions got into full swing and Messi took center stage, smiling from ear to ear as he received awards and accolades.

"I want to thank you for all the love we've been receiving . . . We told you we were going to do everything possible to win this," a visibly emotional Messi said as he was handed the microphone.

"Let's enjoy this because we went a long time without winning it, and we don't know when we'll win it again."

When it was coach Lionel Scaloni's turn to speak, the first thing he did was lead the packed stadium on a chant praising Messi. "Eternally grateful to this group of players," Scaloni said as

he thanked fans for their support. The players' families later

joined them in the pitch and each of the players proceeded to lift a replica of the World Cup trophy in celebration. The players then walked around the pitch waving to fans as fireworks lit the night

Earlier in the day, news channels carried live images of the players travelling to the stadium with a police escort as excited fans waited to see the team's first game since it beat France in a thrilling final in Qatar.

Outside the Monumental Stadium there was a party-like atmosphere from early in the afternoon as somebody imper-

World Cup replica, children almost universally donned Messi's No. 10 jersey and street sellers hawked Messi dolls.

Amid the celebrations there were also recriminations as many fans lamented they'd bought tickets for several times their face value from resellers that ended up being fake.

Ronaldo, Kane break records in wins for Portugal, England

was a record-breaking night for Cristiano Ronaldo and Harry Kane as qualifying for the European Championship in 2024 got underway. Already the leading scorer in men's international soccer, the 38year-old Ronaldo now has more international appearances than any other male player after racking up No. 197 in Portugal's 4-0 win over Liechtenstein

The former Real Madrid and Manchester United striker marked the occasion by converting a penalty and adding another secondhalf goal to move onto 120 in inter-

national matches. Kane, meanwhile, became England's outright leading scorer of all time by netting a first-half penalty in a 2-1 win at Italy. It lifted Kane to 54 goals for his country, one more than Wayne Rooney.

Qualifying for Euro 2024, which will take place in Germany, started three months after the World Cup finished. Call it belated revenge for England. The meeting with Italy in Naples was a repeat of the Euro 2020 final won by the Azzurri at Wembley Stadium. The teams have met since then — twice, in fact,



in Nations League qualifying last year. This time, England held on after first-half goals by Declan Rice and Kane, who tucked away a spot kick awarded following a VAR review after it was determined that Italy defender Giovanni Di Lorenzo touched the ball with his hand while attempting to prevent Kane from reaching a corner.

Argentina-born forward Mateo Retegui, who has Italian citizenship through his maternal grandmother, pulled a goal back on his debut and England played with 10 men from the 80th after left back Luke Shaw collected two yellow cards in the space of 54 seconds.

North Macedonia beat Malta 2-1 in the other match in Group C, which also contains Ukraine.

Roberto Martinez enjoyed a comfortable start to his tenure as Portugal coach after handing Ronaldo a start against Liechtenstein. The striker was left out of Portugal's last matches at the World Cup but was selected up front alongside Joao Felix — and repaid the faith shown in him by Martinez, who left his role as Belgium after the tourna-

scored before Ronaldo's double in Lisbon, Also in Group J, Bosnia-Herzegovina beat Iceland 3-0, while Slovakia and Luxembourg drew 0-0. There was a sense of poignancy when Denmark and Finland met for their opening Group H qualifier at Parken Stadium.

The last time the teams met was at Euro 2020 and it was the game and same venue — when Denmark playmaker Christian Eriksen collapsed with cardiac arrest.

Nearly two years later, Denmark won 3-1 thanks to a hat trick from striker Rasmus Hojlund in his first start for his country.

Slovenia beat Kazakhstan 2-1 and Northern Ireland defeated San Marino 2-0.

For the first time since the country's invasion of Ukraine, Russia played a soccer match against a nation from outside the borders of the old Soviet Union. A 1-1 draw with Iran in Tehran was played in front of 78,000 spectators and comes after months of Russia seeking closer ties with the Asian Football Confederation. Russia is banned by UEFA from competing in qualify-

Ghana finds late winner vs. Angola in African Cup qualifying



CAPE TOWN, March 24 (AP): Antoine Semenyo scored the winning goal in the sixth minute of injury time to see Ghana edge Angola 1-0 in African Cup of Nations qualifying and stay atop its group.

Ghana remained unbeaten in the final qualifying stage with two wins and a draw and on course to qualify for next year's African Cup in Ivory

The result at the Baba Yara Sports Stadium in Kumasi also gave Chris Hughton a wining start as coach. Hughton, the former Newcastle and Brighton manager, was a technical advisor with the Ghana team before succeeding Otto Addo as head coach last month.

Semenyo struck right at the end against Angola when he smashed a loose ball high into the net from close range after a Ghana free kick wasn't cleared.

"Yes, there are a lot of left-arm spinners in India and this (IPL) is a very good opportunity but I would like to be here now in the present and play well for Gujarat. In the last five years, my skill-set


