NEW DELHI, Dec 29: The ULFA's protalks faction on Friday signed a peace accord with the Central and the Assam governments, agreeing to shun violence, surrender all arms, disband the organisation and join the democratic process.

Union home minister Amit Shah, who was present along with Assam chief minister Himanta Biswa Sarma at the signing of the accord in the national capital, called it a golden day for the people of Assam.

"Assam has suffered for a long due to the violence of the ULFA and 10,000 people have lost their lives in this violence since 1979," he said.

Shah said the United Liberation Front of Asom (ULFA) -- the oldest insurgent group of Assam -- agreed to abjure violence, surrender arms, disband the organisation, vacate their camps and join the democratic process.

A big development package will be given to Assam as part of the accord. Every clause of the pact will be fully implemented, he

"The agreement is a significant milestone to fulfil Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of a peaceful, prosperous and insurgency-free Northeast and bringing everlasting peace, prosperity and all-round development of Assam," he said and added that the accord will be implemented in a



Shah said the home ministry, under the prime minister's guidance, worked with the vision of a Northeast that is free from extremism, violence and conflict.

In the last five years, nine peace- and border-related agreements have been signed with several insurgent groups and among different states in the Northeast, establishing peace in large parts of the region, he said.

More than 9,000 cadres have surrendered and the Armed Forces Special Powers Act (AFSPA) has been lifted from 85 per cent area of Assam, he said.

Shah said that after the formation of the Modi government in 2014, violent incidents in Assam decreased by 87 per cent, deaths by 90 per cent and kidnappings by 84 per cent.

So far, 7,500 cadres have surrendered in Assam alone, which will have additional 750 after the accord's signing. Thus, the surrender of a total 8,200 cadres in Assam alone will be completed and it will be the beginning of a new era of peace, he said.

The home minister said the Modi government signed an agreement with the Tripurabased insurgent group NLFT in 2019, groups belonging to the Bru and the Bodo communities in 2020, a group of the Karbi tribals of Assam in 2021 and with an Adivasi group in

The Assam-Meghalaya and the Assam-Arunachal border agreements and the agree-

ment with the Manipur-based insurgent group UNLF were signed in 2023, he added. With this agreement with the ULFA, a new era of peace is going to begin for the entire Northeast, and especially Assam, Shah said.

A time-bound programme will be made by the home ministry to fulfil the ULFA's demands and a committee will be formed for its monitoring, the home minister added.

He said in all the agreements signed after 2019, the Modi government is ahead of time and efforts have been made to fulfil all the conditions. This would not have been possible without Prime Minister Modi's broader vision of an insurgency-free Northeast.

Chief Minister Sarma termed the accord "historic" and said it fructified due to the guidance and leadership of Modi and Shah. Sarma said among the 10,000 people killed in ULFA violence, around 400 to 500 were security personnel while the rest were native people of Assam.

According to the accord, about Rs 1.5 lakh crore will be invested in Assam in various development projects. Besides, in future delimitation exercises, the existing principle will be applied in Assam so that the interests of the indigenous people of the state are protected, he said.

NEW DELHI, Dec 29: A day after a Qatari court dropped the death sentences given to eight former Indian Navy personnel, India on Friday said it will explore the next possible steps in the case after studying the verdict and holding discussions with their legal team and family members.

The Court of Appeal in Qatar commuted the death penalty handed down to the Indians and sentenced them to prison for varying durations on Thursday, weeks after their family members filed an appeal against the earlier order by another court.

The Navy veterans were sentenced to death by Qatar's Court of First Instance on October 26.

"For the moment, I do not have any additional information to share till we see the judgment," Ministry of External Affairs (MEA)

"The latest generous gesture by India will help the Agency continue its lifesaving services towards Palestine Refugees," she

Amid the raging war in Gaza between Israel and Hamas, India's Elizabeth Rodrigues, handed over the second tranche of USD 2.5 million to UNRWA to fulfil India's annual commitment of 5 million US dollars for the year 2023-24

UNRWA is funded almost entirely by voluntary contributions from UN member states.

The Government of India had released the first tranche of its annual commitment in November, about a month ago.

The agency is struggling to keep up its functioning in the middle of the Israel-Hamas war in Gaza and had appreciated and welcomed India's "generous contribution" last month as well because of the difficult situation in the region, particularly in Gaza.

Spot gold at Comex was trading at USD 2,070 per ounce, down by USD 10 from the previous close in the international markets.

Comex gold dropped as traders locked profit after the precious metal prices hit a three-week high in the previous session, HDFC Securities' Senior Analyst of Com-

modities Saumil Gandhi said. Following a recovery in the dollar and rising US Treasury yields are also additional factors that weighed down on the yellow metal, Gandhi added. (PTI)

RBI gives 3 more months to banks, **NBFCs** to implement modified norms

MUMBAI, Dec 29: The Reserve Bank (RBI) on Friday granted three more months up till April 1, 2024 to banks and NBFCs to implement the modified norms for levying penal charges in loan accounts, as part of fair lending practice.

In August, the central bank issued a circular on 'Fair Lending Practice - Penal Charges in Loan Accounts' and it was to come into effect from January 1, 2024.

"However, considering that certain clarifications and additional time has been sought by some regulated entities (REs) to reconfigure their internal systems and operationalize the circular, it has been decided to extend the timeline for implementation of the instructions by three months," the RBI

Accordingly, regulated entities, which include banks and NBFCs, have been asked to ensure that the instructions are implemented in respect of all the fresh loans availed from April 1, 2024 onwards.

In the case of existing loans, the RBI said the switchover to new penal charges regime should be ensured on the next review/ renewal date falling on or after April 1, 2024, but not later than June 30, 2024.

The banks and other lending institutions will not be allowed to levy penal interest with effect from January 1, 2024, it had said.

'Penalty, if charged, for non-compliance of material terms and conditions of loan contract by the borrower shall be treated as penal charges' and shall not be levied in the form of

'penal interest' that is added to the rate of interest charged on the advances," the August circular said. It further said the quan-

tum of penal charges "shall be reasonable and commensurate with the noncompliance" of material terms and conditions of loan contract without being discriminatory within a particular loan/product

Also, there should be no capitalisation of penal charges and no further interest computed on such charges. The instructions do not apply to credit cards, external commercial borrowings, trade credits and structured obligations which are covered

Indian steel demand to surge this fiscal, moderation expected in FY'25



KOLKATA, Dec 29: The Indian steel sector has enjoyed a multiyear demand surge which will continue in the current FY'24, but it is expected to moderate in the coming fiscal, global analytics company Crisil said.

The sector has witnessed double digit demand growth rate of 11 to 13 per cent during three consecutive years and is likely to moderate to 3 to 5 per cent in FY'25, Miren Lodha, Director Research, Crisil Market Intelligence and Analytics said on Friday.

"We are clearly in the midst of a demand supercycle," Lodha told

The moderation is likely in the long steel segment in FY'25 ahead of the general election. The only other instance of such

a demand surge in the last two decades was between 2006 to 2008, he said. Lodha said the infrastructure

sector, a key driver of the steel demand, is expected to maintain its momentum fuelled by ongoing government projects.

The infrastructure segment has been driving a lot of momentum in the steel demand and is expected to continue in the coming years. However, government Awas Yojana are nearing conclusion, which could slow down the demand momentum in the steel sector, he said.

Lodha said the recent surge in steel imports, which has been prompted by lower Chinese prices and strong Indian demand, has raised concern among the domestic manufacturers.

"The disparity between import and domestic prices has triggered significant imports," he elaborated. But it will self correct in the long run with the ongoing capacity ad-

"New steelmaking capacity of 12-13 million tonnes is expected to come online in the second half of fiscal 25, aligning production with demand and reducing import dependence," Lodha said.

Additionally, the potential demand improvement in China after the Lunar New Year coupled with expected production cuts, could further curb Chinese exports to

Overall the Indian steel sector's outlook remains positive, albeit with a projected dip in demand next year. The industry's focus will be on ramping up domestic production and tackling import concerns to maintain a robust long-term growth, he added. (PTI)

C molasses is a byproduct of sugar factories and its utilisation for ethanol production is an effective way to promote green economy, it said. Oil firms are mixing 12 per cent ethanol in petrol as part of a government programme to cut consumption of fossil fuel and import dependence.

Will 2024 be a year of reckoning for trade unions?

he trade union movement in India may be heading for a year of reckoning in 2024. The first half of the year will see much intensified, aggressive, and confrontational protests against the Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led ruling establishment, especially till the Lok Sabha General elections conclude by May-end. The course of the movement in the second half of the year would depend on the decision of the elected government on implementation of the four controversial labour codes, hitherto deferred by the Centre due to stiff resistance from the workers' unions. The joint platform of 10 Central Trade Unions (CTUs) and SKM, an umbrella organisation of hundreds of farmers' union in the country have decided jointly to continue their decisive protest action right from the beginning of the year in January against the PM Narendra Modi's anti-worker, anti-farmer, and pro-corporate policies. It is just a continuation of the long struggle of the farmers and workers against Modi's controversial three farm laws and four labour codes since 2020, that continued through 2021, 2022, and 2023. Though the three farm laws were withdrawn by PM Narendra Modi in November 2021, farmers are feeling cheated on account of the unfulfilled promises.

However, the Modi government is bent upon four controversial labour laws, which have just been deferred due to stiff resistance by CTUs, who feel that if Modi would come to power again, these codes would be rolled out in the second half of the year 2024. They allege that the four labour codes would make the workers just "economic slaves." Therefore, CTUs and SKM led workers' and farmers' movements are bound to intensify during the election campaigns. As the country is heading towards a more informalisation of workers, both in the informal and formal sectors, the trade union movement will have many other challenges ahead. Unemployment rate in the country is very high and real-time wages have been on the decline due to price rise. Organised sectors have been given rights to hire workers on contracts and many jobs are being outsourced. Trade unionism has been considerably weakened ever since the Modi government came to power. Trade unions would not face greater challenges in protecting workers rights but also themselves, in the fast changing world of work. Trade unions would need even widening their membership among informal sector workers to remain relevant in the present circumstances for which they would have to work

Larger coalition of workers can only be a solution to protect the labour force and the gains achieved by the glorious labour movement of the country, especially at a time of political uncertainty in the election year. 2024 would therefore be a year of reckoning for the trade union movement, irrespective of whether PM Modi returns to power or not, on account of the fast changing world of work at a time when the majority of the workforce are without any social security coverage.

2023 going on 2024, the great battles against injustice ahead

The year 2023 ends with the dark shadow of the genocidal massacre of Palestinians in Gaza by the Israeli war-machine. Nearly three months of Israel's brutal aggression has led to (till December 26) 20,915 people killed in Gaza, of which more than 8,000 are children; another 53,918 have been wounded and an unaccounted number of people are still buried in the debris of bombed buildings.

Israel's war on the Palestinians is fully backed by the USA which has sent more lethal arms and equipment to Israel since the start of the conflict on October 7. The US has been blocking any call for an immediate ceasefire by vetoing such resolutions in the United Nations Security Council.

While the US administration's staunch support for Israel is not a surprise, what is new, as far as India is concerned, is the Modi government's big shift in favour of Israel declaring full support for Israel's actions. India went to the extent of refusing to sup-

port a resolution in the UN General Assembly in October calling for a ceasefire. It is only at the second General Assembly vote in December on a resolution calling for ceasefire that India voted for it reluctantly. Not doing so would have isolated India, as every other country in Asia voted for the

2023 marked the final year of the Modi government's second term in office. It has been yet another year which has seen the closing in of the walls for Indian democracy, secularism and federalism. The shifting of parliament to a new building has symbolised its new denigrated status. The last session of Parliament this year saw 146 Opposition MPs, underlining the Modi government's intent to hollow out the essence of parliamentary democracy.

The desecularisation of the Indian State has proceeded apace. With judicial connivance, the question of original religious sites at Kashi and Mathura are being reopened and examined. The New Year will begin with the consecration of the Ram

temple at Ayodhya which has been made into a State-sponsored spectacle.

In BJP-ruled states, the minorities are being consigned to the status of second class citizens with restrictions on their livelihood like the meat-trade and periodic attacks and lynchings of those accused of transporting cows or beef. The bulldozer has become a symbol of vigilante action against Muslims.

Manipur witnessed the worst ethnic clashes from the month of May. Even after seven months, the ethnic divide between the Meitis and Kukis continues with security forces manning the buffer zone between the Valley and hill areas. The BJP chief minister is singularly responsible for this conflagration because of his partisan politics. The Centre has failed to bring about a political settlement through negotiations with all sides. Manipur is a standing testimony to the havoc majoritarian politics can play in a sensitive

ethnic region. Federalism came under severe attack in 2023. Governors of opposition-ruled states became more aggressive in interfering in the affairs of the state governments and in denying the rights of state legislatures to pass laws. The Supreme Court judgment on the abrogation of Article 370 and the court's refusal to adjudicate on the use of Article 3 of the constitution to dismantle the state of Jammu and Kashmir and create two union territories has given the stamp of judicial legitimacy to this gross violation of the federal principle.

The Modi government goes on claiming that India is the fastest growing economy in the world citing the GDP growth

figures. But, in terms of GDP per capita, India was ranked the lowest among the G20 countries with 2600 dollars in 2023. Further, whatever growth was registered has not translated into increased employment. As per the latest CMIE data, the unemployment rate in October this year was 10.05, the highest level in the past 21 months, while youth unemployment was 23.22 percent.

Prices of essential commodities, particularly food items, continue to rise imposing a big burden on the poorest sections of the people. With real wages on the decline, rising prices and soaring unemployment, India's ranking in the global hunger index plummeted down to 111 out of 125 countries.

corporate-communal nexus was prominently exemplified in 2023. The Hindenburg Research company's exposure of the Adani group's corporate fraud and stock manipulation became international news. But the Modi government stubbornly shielded Gautam Adani and refused to carry out a serious investigation of its favourite capitalist. An attack on Adani was seen as an attack on India under the Hindutva dispensation. As a result of the Modi government's benevolence to the big capitalists, income and wealth inequalities reached new heights. As per the Oxfam Report released in January 2023. the richest 1 per cent own more than 40 per cent of the wealth of the country, while the bottom half of the population together share just 3 per cent of wealth.

2023 also saw the sharpening of the instruments of repression and the widespread use of central agencies to target the opposition. The raids and arrests by

the Enforcement Directorate, Central Bureau of Investigation and Income Tax Department have become cynical weapons in the hands of the ruling party.

At the fag-end of the winter session of parliament, without the opposition being present, three new criminal law bills were adopted. This was supposed to be doing away with the legacy of colonialism whereas, in fact, it was a form of re-colonialisation. There are many provisions in the new criminal laws which do away with basic safeguards of citizens and usher in a police state.

The working class and peasantry have been struggling against the communal-corporate regime. For the first time, the Central Trade Unions and the Samyukta Kisan Morcha representing the working class and kisan movements held a joint convention in September and gave a united call for a three-day mahapadav in November. This joint protest action was preceded by a number of struggles of different sections of workers and peasants in various parts of the country. The year saw more sections of the working people coming out against the neo-liberal policies of the BJP government.

The latter half of 2023 saw the opposition parties coming together to form the INDIA grouping consisting of 28 parties. The aim of the opposition combine is to put up a united fight against the BJP in the general elections to be held in April-May, 2024. This will be a fight to defend democracy, secularism and federalism - all basic features of the Constitution. New Year 2024 will witness this great battle which will determine India's future. Russiaia fires 122 missiles and 36 drones in what Ukraine calls the biggest aerial barrage of the war

missiles and 36 drones against Ukrainian targets, officials said Friday, killing at least 18 civilians across the country in what an air force official said was the biggest aerial barrage of the 22-month war.

The Ukrainian air force intercepted 87 of the missiles and 27 of the Shahed-type drones overnight, Ukraine's military chief Valerii Zaluzhnyi said.

Air Force commander Mykola Oleshchuk wrote on his official Telegram channel: "The most massive aerial attack" since Russia's fullscale invasion in February 2022.

According to the Ukrainian air force, the previous biggest assault was in November 2022 when Russia launched 96 missiles against Ukraine. This year, the biggest was 81 missiles on March 9, air force records show.

Fighting along the front line is largely bogged down by winter weather after Ukraine's summer counteroffensive failed to make a significant breakthrough along the roughly 1,000-kilometer (620-mile) line of contact.

Ukrainian officials have urged the

with more air defenses to protect itself against aerial attacks like Friday's one. Their appeals have come as signs of war fatigue strain efforts to keep support in place.

Western officials and analysts have warned that Russia had limited its cruise missile strikes in recent months in an apparent effort to build up stockpiles for massive strikes during the winter, hoping to break the Ukrainians' spirit.

At least 86 people were injured and an unknown number were buried under rubble during the roughly 18hour onslaught, Ukrainian officials said. Among the buildings reported to be damaged across Ukraine were country's Western allies to provide it a maternity hospital, apartment blocks and schools

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said the Kremlin's forces used a wide variety of weapons, including ballistic and cruise missiles.

"Today, Russia used nearly every type of weapon in its arsenal," Zelenskyy said on social media platform X, formerly Twitter. Ukrainian Air Force spokesman

Yurii Ihnat said Russia "apparently launched everything they have," except for submarine-launched Kalibr missiles, in the attack.

The aerial attack that began Thursday and continued through the night hit six cities, including the capital, Kyiv, and other areas from east to

deaths and damage came in from across the country. In Odesa, on the southern coast, falling drone wreckage started a fire at a multi-story residential building, according to the regional head, Oleh Kiper. Two people were killed and 15, including two children, were injured in the course

of the Odesa attack, he said. The mayor of the western city of Lviv, Andrii Sadovyi, said one person was killed and eight injured and three schools and a kindergarten were damaged in a drone attack in the region.

Several dozen missiles were launched towards Kyiv during the night, with more than 30 of them intercepted, said Serhii Poplo, head of the Kyiv military administration. The attack started a fire at a warehouse in the capital's Podil district where five people reportedly were pulled from the rubble.

In northeastern Ukraine, Kharkiv Mayor Ihor Terekhov said the city was subjected to at least three waves of aerial attacks overnight that included S-300 and Kh-21 missile launches. One person was killed and at least nine injured, officials said.

Maine bars Trump from ballot as US SC weighs states' authority to block former president

PORTLAND (US), Dec 29: Maine's Democratic secretary of state on Thursday removed former President Donald Trump from the state's presidential primary ballot under the Constitution's insurrection clause, becoming the first election official to take action unilaterally as the US Supreme Court is poised to decide whether Trump remains eligible to return to the White House

The decision by Secretary of State Shenna Bellows follows a ruling earlier this month by the Col-

orado Supreme Court that booted Trump from the ballot there under Section 3 of the 14th Amendment. That decision has been stayed until the US Supreme Court decides whether Trump is barred by the Civil War-era provision, which prohibits those who "engaged in insurrection" from holding

The Trump campaign said it would appeal Bellows' decision to Maine's state courts, and Bellows suspended her ruling until that court system rules on the case. In the end, it is likely that the nation's highest court will have the final say on whether Trump appears on the ballot in Maine and in the other states.

Bellows found that Trump could no longer run for his prior job because his role in the Jan. 6, 2021, attack on the U.S. Capitol violated Section 3, which bans from office those who "engaged in insurrection." Bellows made the ruling after some state residents, including a bipartisan group of former lawmakers, challenged Trump's position on the bal-

"I do not reach this conclusion lightly," Bellows wrote in her 34-page decision. "I am mindful that no

Secretary of State has ever deprived a presidential candidate of ballot access based on Section 3 of the Fourteenth Amendment. I am also mindful, however, that no presidential candidate has ever before engaged in insurrection."

The Trump campaign immediately slammed the ruling. "We are witnessing, in real-time, the attempted theft of an election and the disenfranchisement of the American voter," campaign spokesman Steven Cheung said in a statement.

> "It is clear that these decisions are going to keep popping up, and inconsistent decisions reached (like the many states keeping

Trump on the ballot over challenges) until there is final and decisive guidance from the U.S. Supreme Court," Rick Hasen, a law professor at the University of California-Los Angeles, wrote in response to the Maine decision. "It seems a certainty that SCO-TUS will have to address the merits sooner or later."

While Maine has just four electoral votes, it's one of two states to split them. Trump won one of Maine's electors in 2020, so having him off the ballot there, should he emerge as the Republican general election candidate, could have outsized implications in a race that is expected to be narrowly decided.

That's in contrast to Colorado, which Trump lost by 13 percentage points in 2020 and where he wasn't expected to compete in November if he wins the Republican presidential nomination. (AP)

NKorea's new reactor at nuke site likely to be formally operational next summer, Seoul says

SEOUL, Dec 29: A light-water reactor at North Korea's main nuclear complex will likely be formally operational by next summer, South Korea's defense minister said, amid suspicions that the North may use it as a new source of fissile materials for nuclear weapons. Concerns about North Korea's nu-

clear program deepened recently as the UN atomic agency and foreign experts said they've detected signs indicating that North Korea had begun operating its light-water reactor at the Yongbyon nuclear com-

IAEA Director General Rafael Grossi said last week that his agency had observed increased levels of activity at and near the reactor and since mid-October, a strong water outflow from its cooling sys-

He said the reactor is "a cause for concern" because it can produce plutonium — one of the two key ingredients used to manufacture nuclear weapons, along with highly enriched uranium.

The South Korean Defense Ministry said Friday that Defense Minister Shin Wonsik told local reporters a day before that his country had also spotted similar adapt one at Yongbyon to produce tility. (AP)

North Korea has long produced weapons-grade plutonium from its widely known 5-megawatt reactor at Yongbyon. The light-water reactor would be an additional source of bomb fuels. Yongbyon has a uranium enrichment facility as well. There are questions about the reactor's reported operation, as lightwater reactors are best-suited for electricity generation.

Shin noted there has been no country which has used light-water reactors to produce weapons-grade plutonium. However, many observers say North Korea could

"(North Korea)'s commissioning of a new light water nuclear power plant raises serious concerns, including safety," the US Mission to the UN in Vienna said Saturday in a message posted on X, formerly known as Twitter. "(North Korea's) unlawful nuclear, ballistic missile programs continue to pose a grave threat to international peace & security." Grossi also noted the North's operation of the light-water reactor violates UN Security Council resolutions.

The IAEA and foreign governments have no access to Yongbyon and other suspected nuclear sites in North Korea, and they typically rely on satellite imagery to monitor the North's nuclear activities. North Korea kicked out IAEA inspectors from the country in 2009.

Outside estimates on the size of North Korea's nuclear arsenal vary. ranging from 20-60 to more than 100. Since his diplomacy with the US collapsed in 2019, North Korean leader Kim Jong Un has repeatedly vowed to build more nuclear weapons and introduce high-tech weapons to cope with what he calls intensifying US hos-

Iran executes four people for alleged links with Israel's Mossad

TEHRAN, Dec 29: Iran executed on Friday four people and sentenced several others to prison for having alleged links with Israel's Mossad security service, local media reported.

Mizan, the news website affiliated with the country's judiciary, said three men and one woman were executed Friday morning. It identified the men as Vafa

Hanareh, Aram Omari, Rahman Parhazo and the woman as Nasim Namazi. The report didn't say how the deaths were carried out, but Iran usually applies hanging.

The four were charged with kidnapping several Iranian security forces to extract intelligence information, Mizan reported. They were also accused of setting fire to cars and apartments of some of Iran's intelligence agents.

The report also said several others working with the same group were each sentenced to 10 years in jail, without giving further details.

This came less than a week after an alleged Israeli airstrike killed a high-ranking Iranian general in

1,151 BGB platoons on patrol across Bangladesh ahead of Jan 7 polls

DHAKA, Dec 29: Bangladesh on Friday deployed a total of 1,151 platoons of paramilitary border guards across the country to ensure that the January 7 general election can be held in a free, fair and peaceful manner amid a boycott by the main Opposition BNP and its allies.

Border Bangladesh (BGB) personnel will work in tandem with the police, the Rapid Action Battalion (RAB), and armed forces for 13 days surrounding the January 7 polls, starting on Friday. Typically, each platoon consists of around 30 BGB troopers. From December 29 to January 10, the BGB will operate as a mobile and striking force to ensure security in constituencies across the country, including Dhaka, the paramilitary force said.

Army personnel will be deployed across the country from January 3 to January 10 to help maintain law and order before, during, and after the upcoming national polls.

Ailing former Khaleda Zia's Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) is carrying out an anti-election street campaign, calling for intermittent strikes and transport blockades, saying no election under the incumbent government led by Prime Minister Sheikh

Hasina would be fair or neutral. The BNP has also called for civil disobedience against the Awami Party-led dispensation, urging people not to pay taxes and utility bills to press its demand for a non-party interim government for election oversight by amending the country's Constitution.

The BNP is boycotting the election after its demand for an interim non-party neutral government to organise the voting was rejected by the government. The party had boycotted the 2014 election but took part in 2018 polls, which party leaders later said was a mistake alleging that the voting was marred with widespread rigging and intimidation.

Since October 29, the BNP has been holding intermittent nationwide strikes and transport blockades. According to a media tally,

11 people died, 386 vehicles were torched, and four trains were derailed from tracks in the past two months in political violence. Police arrested thousands of opposition activists and figures, including de-facto BNP leader and party secretary general Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir, over charges of violence. Hasina, 76, also the President of the Awami Party, alleged that BNP is hatching conspiracies from abroad, in an apparent reference to the party's acting chairman and Zia's son Tarique Rahman who has taken refuge in the UK to evade jail terms. Several Bangladeshi courts

declared Rahman a "fugitive" as he took refuge in the UK to evade jail terms for several criminal charges, including a grenade attack on a rally of the then-opposition Awami League in 2004 in which 24 people were killed. Hasina narrowly escaped the attack, which also wounded some 500 of her party leaders, activists and sup-

Zia,78, was also convicted and jailed on two graft charges with a 17-year jail term. However, she is now in a hospital with multiple health issues.

The US and other major Western countries called for dialogue between the ruling Awami League and particularly with the BNP to ensure an inclusive and credible election, which, however, saw no headway due to reluctance from both sides. (PTI)

However, the offences do not appear to be hate crimes or motivated by hate, Durham Regional Police said in a press release on Thursday. The police identified the man as Jagdish Pandher from Brampton city. According to the press release, in the early hours of October 8, police responded to a break-and-enter at a Hindu temple in the area of Bayly Street and Krosno Boulevard in Pickering.

Pandher was seen on security surveillance breaking into the temple and taking a large quantity of cash from the donation boxes. He fled the area before police arrival, it said. He was "seen on surveillance footage later that morning committing additional break-and-enters at Hindu temples in Pickering and Ajax," the release said.

Police say the suspect has been linked to numerous other break-and-enters at Hindu temples throughout the year. (PTI)

highlighted that it was the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) and the government's duty to ensure that the public was facilitated in expressing its will through a "genuine election", adding that it was also bound to ensure that there was no perception of oppression or repression against one political party while others were treated favourably. Mentioning these re-

marks, Justice Aurangzeb said the AGP and advocate general were representing the caretaker government and should therefore be impartial. (PTI)

Russian poet receives 7-year prison sentence for reciting verses against war in Ukraine

MOSCOW, Dec 29: A Russian poet was given a 7-year prison sentence on Thursday for reciting verses against Russia's war in Ukraine, a tough punishment that comes during a relentless Kremlin

crackdown on dissent. Moscow's Tverskoi District Court convicted Artyom Kamardin on charges of making calls undermining national security and inciting hatred, which related to him reading his anti-war poems during a street performance in downtown

Moscow in September 2022. Yegor Shtovba, who participated in the event and recited Kamardin's verses, was sentenced to 5 1/2 years

on the same charges. The gathering next to the monument to poet Vladimir Mayakovsky was held days after President Vladimir Putin ordered a mobilization of 300,000 reservists amid Moscow's military setbacks in Ukraine. The widely unpopular move prompted hundreds of thousands to flee Russia to avoid being recruited into the military.

Police swiftly dispersed the performance and soon arrested Kamardin and several other participants.

Russian media quoted Kamardin's friends and his lawyer as saying that police beat and raped him during the arrest. Soon after, he was shown apologizing for his action in a police video released by pro-Kremlin media, his face bruised. Authorities have taken no action to investigate the alleged abuse by police.

During Thursday's hearing, Kamardin's wife, Alexandra Popova, was escorted out of the courtroom by bailiffs after she shouted "Shame!" following the verdict. Popova, who spoke to journalists after the hearing, and several other people were later detained on charges of holding an unsanctioned "rally" outside the court building.

KATHMANDU, Dec 29: Despite concerns about rising temperatures, melting glaciers and snow and increasing extreme weather events, the mountaineering community celebrated the 70th anniversary of scaling Mount Everest with around 500 climbers, including

four Indians, making it to the summit in 2023. Ever since New Zealander Edmund Hillary and Nepal's Sherpa Tenzing Norgay summited the 8,848.86 metres (29,032 feet) high Mt Everest, a.k.a. Sagarmatha in Nepali, on May 29, 1953, thousands of climbers from across the globe, including India and Nepal, have been attracted to the highest peak in the world, scores of them reached the summit while many lost their lives.

Official data showed that since 1953's Hillary-Norgay summit, around 7,000 mountaineers have successfully scaled Mt Everest while over 300 have lost their lives.

The year 2023 was no exception. A total of 478 climbers, including 103 females, summited Everest in the Spring of 2023, the only narrow window available to climb the extremely high altitudes.



Four Indian nationals stood atop Mt Everest and one died in the high mountains this year. Yashi Jain, Mithil Raju, Sunil Kumar and Pinkhi Haris Chhed successfully scaled the highest peak in the world on May 17.

Suzanne Leopoldina Jesus, an Indian mountaineer with a pacemaker, died near the Everest Base Camp while attempting to climb the peak on May 18. Officials said 11 climbers, including four

while eight went missing during their respective expeditions to Mt Everest. Nepal's Kami Rita Sherpa, 53, set a new

Nepalese, one Indian and one Chinese, died

in the 70th anniversary year of the first successful summit world record of climbing Mt Everest 28 times with two summits this season on May 17 and May 23. Kami Rita's record till 2022 was equalled by compatriot, Sherpa Pasang Dawa, 46, who made it to the highest peak for the 26th time this year on May 14 and the 27th time on May 17. But it is not just the Sherpa community that continued to break records and test human endurance in the rarified air of the high-altitude Himalayas in Nepal.

Hari Budhamagar, 43, a double amputee ex-British Gurkha soldier scaled Mt Everest, scripted history by becoming the first in the category to scale the world's highest peak

with artificial legs, on May 19. On the same day, May 19, Shrinivas Sainis Dattatraya, 39, an Indian-origin Singaporean climber went missing while returning from

the summit of Mount Everest. No expedition in the high-altitude Himalayas is complete without the help of the Sherpa community that lives around the foothills of the snow-clad mountains. That also makes them the most vulnerable in the dangerous treks to the world's highest moun-

Three Nepalese Sherpa guides – Themwa Tenzing Sherpa, Lakpa Rita Sherpa and Badure Sherpa – went missing on April 12 after a massive ice sheet of more than 50 metres tumbled down the mountain and buried them deep under five to six metres of snow on the most dangerous section of Mt Everest amidst an avalanche, making it the season's

first accident at the world's tallest peak. Nepal granted a record 466 climbing permits, including 40 from India, for Mt Everest this spring, from climbers from 65 different countries. This broke the previous record of 2021, which was 409. In 2022, the number was 323. Mountaineering is a good revenue stream for the tiny Himalayan nation of Nepal with a large mountain community dependent on mountaineering and related tourism in the

And, therefore, the depleting glaciers, rising temperatures and increasing extreme rainfall events are a cause of worry for the large number of people whose livelihoods are at

stake in the changing climate. (AP)

SHILLONG, Dec 29: The Centre is eyeing at expansion of saffron cultivation in the northeastern states of Sikkim, Arunachal Pradesh and Meghalaya in collaboration with state governments to improve farm income, an official

Saffron is a costly spice fetching a minimum of Rs 3.5 lakh per kilogramme and is rich in bioactive compounds with therapeutic prop-

The North East Center for Technology Application and Reach (NECTAR), an autonomous body under the Department of Science and Technology of the central government brought good quantity of saffron seeds for the pilot project

"I am happy with the results of the saffron project because although we do not get snow in most places in the Northeast except in Arunachal Pradesh, the yield is good," he said.

fron corms. At Mairang, Sister Reshmi, who is director of Foster Care home of the Well Springs Social Service Society said she planted about 100 kg of saffron seeds out of which over 2,200 flowers were harvested.

Mairang is one of the coldest places in Meghalaya with a dry arid environment from September till about March.

"We planted in the first week of October this year and within a few weeks, we harvested the flowers.' she said, adding that NECTAR buys back all the harvest.

She believes that saffron could become a cash crop for families in the Mairang area considering that the plant whose leaves are similar to that of garlic is not affected by heavy frosting during winter

"While all other plants have died, including vegetables, saffron plants are all green, alive and thriving," she said. At Thangsning, 25 km South of here and located under Mawkynrew Community and Rural Development Block, Pdianghun Kharumnuid reported similar yields.

"We are grateful to NECTAR and Bah Collin for having chosen us. We are the only saffron farmer in the area. We were given about 40 kg of corms. We harvested more than 2,000 flowers," Kharumnuid

GUWAHATI, Dec 29: The Northeast Frontier Railways' (NFR) Bhairabi - Sairang New Line Railway Project will mark the dawn of a new era in terms of communication and commerce in the northastern region of the country, especially in Mizoram.

The project is at an advance stage of completion. The Bhairabi Sairang project aims to create an additional 51.38 km of railway track in the Mizoram. The project has already achieved physical progress of 91 per cent.

Construction of the Bhairabi -Sairang railway project involves multiple tunnels and bridges in tough terrains. The total length of tunnels in this project is 12853 meters out of which 12710 meters tunneling works has already been completed. The project will have total 55 major bridges and 87 minor bridges, out of which work for 12 major bridges and 85 minor bridges have been completed so far. The work of construction of the tallest pier of the project i.e Pier P - 4 of bridge number 196 in the approach of Sairang station has also been completed. Height



of this pier is 104 meter which is 42 meter taller than the Qutub Minar. The project also includes seven road over bridges and nine road under bridges.

Arms, ammunition recovered Manipur

IMPHAL, Dec 29: Caches of arms and ammunition were recovered as the police continued joint operations with the security forces in fringe and vulnerable areas of violent affected districts of Manipur. Police sources said that a cache of arms and ammunition was recovered by Churachandpur police in a joint operation with the troops of 46 Assam Rifles in the surrounding forest area of L Kanan village under the Behiang Police station of the district on Thursday morning.

The operation that started from 5 am and lasted till 10 am, was conducted based on reliable input regarding caching of arms and ammunition in the area, the police said. During the operation, the combined team came across a cache of arms and ammunition wrapped in polythene which was concealed in a

bush. The recovered items were two 9mm pistols with magazines, one loaded with five rounds and another two rounds, and an empty magazine of a 9mm pistol, the police also said.

Arms and ammunition was also recovered in another operation in the foothill villages of Pungdongbam, Sekta and Lousangkhong under the Lamlai Police Station of Imphal East district bordering Kangpokpi district, the police added. One M16 rifle marked as M16A1 with a maga-

zine loaded with four rounds and one M21 sniper rifle marked nil with an empty magazine and three 36 HE grenades without detonators were found in the cache, the police further said. A combined team of police commandos, 22

Assam Rifles and a platoon of 12 battalion of CRPF

conducted the operation based on reliable input. The operation started around 8.15 am and lasted till 10 am. The recovered arms and ammunition were handed over to Lamlai Police Station for further legal procedures.

The police along with the security forces have been conducting search operations in the fringe and vulnerable areas across the violent affected districts of the state since the middle week of September last to recover arms and ammunition in the possessions of the miscreants.

After the outbreak of ethnic violence on May 3 last, a total of 5,669 different types of sophisticated arms and around 500,000 rounds of ammunition were looted from different police stations and armouries by mobs and individuals. (NNN)

NEW DELHI, Dec 29: Bihar chief minister Nitish Kumar was elected Janata Dal (United) president on Friday at the meeting of the party's national executive which lauded his role in bringing together opposition parties and spearheading the demand for caste census.

Party's chief spokesperson K C Tyagi said Kumar has agreed to take over the mantle from Lalan Singh.

Singh stepped down at the closeddoor meeting and proposed Kumar's name, saying his leadership will be needed at this crucial juncture in the run up to the 2024 Lok Sabha polls while he will be busy fighting his own election. He currently represents Munger constituency in Lok

The national council meeting of the party, scheduled to be held later in the day, will ratify decisions, including on his presidency, taken in the executive meeting.

Sources said most key leaders within the party were of the view that Kumar being its most prominent face should take charge of the organisation at this crucial time

The party is part of the opposition INDIA bloc.

Singh's leadership style was also criticised by several leaders within the party in their recent interactions with Kumar, the sources said



Amid reports of rift within the party, the chief minister has worked o project a picture of unity by keeping him by his side. Sources within the party have been dismissive of reports that Singh's perceived proximity to the RJD was a reason behind his ouster, noting that he has been a

close ally of Kumar for decades. Kumar said in the executive meeting that he was not personally keen to take over as the party's president but will abide by the decision of national executive members who heartily endorsed the development,

Many enthusiastic members of the party raised slogans at the venue, projecting their leader as a prime ministerial candidate

Among several proposals discussed in the meeting was the Kumar's leadership in pushing for caste census and getting a "caste survey" done in Bihar, leading to the state government enhancing the reservation from the existing 60 per cent to 75 per cent.

Every party is supporting it now,

Amid the JD(U)'s perceived unhappiness with leading members of the INDIA bloc for not giving its most preeminent leader a formal role in the alliance, one of the proposals has cited his role in reaching out to different opposition parties to bring them together after he snapped ties

Its general secretary Dhananjay Singh noted that it was Kumar who made it clear that there cannot be an opposition alliance without the Congress when some regional satraps, including BRS leader K Chandrashekar Rao, had floated the idea of a front of different non-BJP parties minus the Congress.

Kumar said in the meeting that he will ensure that senior members of the party are given different roles.

Soren made the announcement while addressing a function on Ranchi's Morabadi ground organised to mark the completion of four years of the JMM-led government in the state. "The government has decided to provide pension benefits to tribals and Dalits on reaching the age of 50 years. The death rate among them is high and they do not

get jobs after 60 years," he reasoned. Soren claimed that only 16 lakh people had received pension benefits in the 20 years after the formation of Jharkhand in 2000 but his government has provided pension to 36 lakh people, mostly those aged above 60 years.

"In four years of our government, we have given pension benefits to 36 lakh people above 60 years of age, widows above 18 years of age and also physically challenged persons..." he said. Soren asserted that his government was relentlessly working for the welfare of the people and a large number of schemes were being implemented for the first time, including his government's outreach programme Aapki Yojna, Aapki Sarkar, Aaapke Dwar' delivering benefits of the government schemes to villagers at their doorsteps. The chief election commissioner and other election commissioners (Appointment, Conditions of Service and Term of Office) Bill, 2023, has provisions to set up a search committee chaired by the law minister and two other persons not below the rank of secretary, to prepare a panel of five persons for consideration of the selection committee for appointment as CEC or ECs.

The bill also has provisions for a Selection Committee, chaired by the prime minister, leader of the opposition and a Union minister, to make recommendations to the President for appointment of CEC and other ECs.

Measures being put in place to deal with fog impacting flight operations, says Scindia

NEW DELHI, Dec 29: Amid dense fog disrupting flight operations at the Delhi airport in the last few days, Civil Aviation Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia on Friday said the ministry is coordinating with the airport and airlines, and putting in place measures to deal with the

Terming the fog issue as a "transitory phenomenon", the minister in an interview to PTI also said this year the situation has been slightly unprecedented in terms of the density of fog.

Many flights were diverted and scores were delayed at the Delhi airport due to dense fog.

"Fog issue is an issue that we encounter 15-20 days every year... this year, there has been unprecedented fog for the last three or four days. We are coordinating with all the airlines to make sure that they have CAT II and CAT III-trained pilots during fog hours, thereby easing congestion," Scindia said.

CAT II and III requirement pertains to operating flights in low visibility conditions. The civil aviation ministry is monitoring the fog situation on a daily basis.

He also said measures are being put in place, including to monitor congestion at a landing airport so that take off is not allowed if there is no direct routing as that will ensure there is no congestion.

"We are putting in place all those measures between airports and airlines.. it is slightly unprecedented in terms of density of the fog but it is a transitory phenomenon," he added

On Thursday, airport sources said a total of 58 flights, the majority of them operated by domestic carriers, were diverted due to bad weather between 0000 hours of December 25 to 0600 hours of December 28. (PTI)

The NCP won four seats in Maharashtra in the 2019 Lok Sabha polls and the Congress only one. The Congress's lone MP from Chandrapur, Balu Dhanorkar, died earlier this

They noted that Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, seen as the most visible opposition leader, has 6.8 million followers on Facebook, 5.1 million on Instagram and 24.7 million on X. Party leaders said Shah's following has seen a consistent rise after he became the BJP president in 2014 following its massive victory as it for the first time won a majority in Lok Sabha on its own with Modi as the prime ministerial face. NTA has hiked fee of 2024 CUET-PG application forms, alleges SFI

NEW DELHI, Dec 29: The Students' Federation of India (SFI) on Friday alleged that the National Testing Agency has increased the fee of 2024 CUET-PG application forms. In a letter to NTA Director Subodh Kumar Singh, the student body's Delhi state committee said the fee hike is a "blatant attack" on higher eduction opportunities for students in the country. It is "anti-student" and a step towards "privatisation" of education, it said. There was no immediate response from the agency to the letter or the allegation of the students' wing of the CPI(M), even as an SFI delegation met senior advisor, National Testing Agency (NTA), HC Gupta, on the issue and demanded the rollback of the "fee hike".

The Common University Entrance Test (CUET)-PG for admission to

postgraduate programmes in universities across the country is conducted by the NTA. In a statement, the SFI alleged that the NTA has hiked the fee for CUET-PG application forms by ₹ 200 for all categories "due to lack of funds" and it will impact especially those belonging to marginalised communities and from backward regions.

"The NTA highlighted that enough funds are not being released...which is leading to such hikes," it said. The agency, the SFI claimed, has increased the fee by ₹ 200 for all categories. The current fee for general category students is ₹ 1,200, for students from economically weaker sections and other backward classes ₹1,000, for those from scheduled castes and tribes ₹900, and ₹800 for persons with disabilities, it claimed.

"The SFI strongly opposes this logic and calls it out for being another step that the government at large is taking towards the complete privatisation of education," the SFI said in its letter to NTA Director Singh. The delegation that met Gupta at the NTA office comprised SFI members Mehina (Delhi University), Nadia (Jamia Millia Islamia), Sagar (Jawaharlal Nehru University) and Vibhu (Ambedkar University).

In a related development, students outfits AISA and ABVP highlighted the non-inclusion of the Jawaharlal Nehru University in the list of colleges taking CUET-PG 2024 application forms on the CUET website.

The university has now notified that it is a technical glitch and it will be rectified within a couple of days, the students' outfits said. (PTI)

Cooperatives should open accounts in co-op banks, says Shah; asks GSC Bank to create system

AHMEDABAD, Dec 29: Union minister Amit Shah on Friday urged the Gujarat State Cooperative Bank to develop a system so that all cooperative entities in the state can open accounts in cooperative banks.

He made the suggestion while virtually inaugurating a building of Surendranagar District Cooperative

As part of a pilot project launched by GSC Bank recently, all cooperative societies in two districts have opened their accounts with cooperative banks, said Shah, who holds the Home and Cooperation portfolios in the Narendra Modi government.

"At present, cooperative entities open their accounts in other banks. Thus, cooperative banks do not have cash when they need it. The GSC Bank launched a pilot project to open bank accounts of all cooperative entities of two districts in cooperative banks. As a result, such banks in these two districts received deposits of ₹800 crore," said Shah in his virtual address. The Ahmedabad-headquartered GSC Bank is an apex bank that serves the credit and financial needs of nearly 28 lakh farmers through 18 District Central Co-

"Since Ajay Patel (chief of GSC Bank) is here, I urge him to replicate this pilot project across Gujarat and open bank accounts of various cooperative entities, such as dairies and APMCs, in cooperative banks," said Shah.

Shah informed the audience the Narendra Modi government has approved a plan to establish two lakh new multipurpose Primary Agricultural Credit Societies (PACS) across the country, for which a budget of ₹ 2,500 crore has been earmarked.

The new National Cooperative Policy will be launched soon, the Union minister added.

On the occasion, he hailed the management of the Surendranagar District Cooperative Bank for turning it into a profit-making entity in just 14 years

"In 2009, the bank had incurred a loss of ₹71 crore. Today, the bank's annual profit is Rs 7 crore. Moreover, it has deposits worth ₹ 400 crore and it has given loans to nearly 28,000 farmers of this arid region," said Shah.

The new building, spread across 1,500 square meter area, was constructed at a cost of ₹ 10 crore and now has 1,000 lockers, said Shah. (PTI)

Ram temple inauguration by PM, a 'gross misuse of religious sentiments', says Yechury

KANNUR, Dec 29: CPI(M) general secretary Sitaram Yechury on Friday said the inauguration of Ram temple in Ayodhya by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in the presence of other Constitutional functionaries was a "gross misuse of religious sentiments" for BJP's political gain. Addressing the media. Yechurv said that the Constitution clearly defines secularism as the separation of religion from politics and the state.

He said that the inauguration of the temple represents an overt politicisation of religion, which contradicts the principles of the Constitution

"Here, this function, the inauguration is going to be done by the Prime Minister of India in the presence of the UP chief minister and those who hold other Constitutional positions. We feel this is a gross misuse of the religious sentiments of the people for their (BJP) political purposes. This is the open politicisation of religion which is not in consonance with the Constitution or the Supreme Court rulings," Yechury said.

He said the strategy to counter

this politicisation was to strictly adhere to secularism. "You cannot combat this sort of

religious fundamentalism of all these Hindutva offences by being a soft Hindutva or a soft saffron approach," the senior Left leader said.

The Ram temple will be inaugurated on January 22, where PM Modi, Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath and more than 6,000 people are expected to attend the grand "Pran Pratistha" ceremony. Yechury also attacked the BJP-led NDA government on various aspects, including the issue of surveillance and the alleged failure

Referring to the recent issue of Apple phone notifications in connection with intrusion or monitoring of handsets, he said, "this is a surveillance state that has been put in place" and it was not merely an intrusion into our privacy, which it is, but it is much more than that.

"It is a surveillance state where everything is being monitored. Even conversations," he added. The Left leader rubbished the BJP's claim of a "vibrant econ-

omy" and termed it as propaganda.

"As far as people are concerned, the last 10 years is the worst as far as their livelihood is concerned. Unemployment is at the highest. This government has been doing a lot of data fudging. Manipulation of data. And now they have added a new category to the employment of unpaid labour," Yechury said.

He claimed that there is an inability for the industry to grow in the country due to lack of domestic "As far as the industry is con-

cerned, its inability to grow is because of the lack of domestic demand. People don't have the money or purchasing power. For the bulk of the Indian people, their actual purchasing power is declining. And when there is no demand, there are no future investments," he said. Yechury said that as per the government's own projection for this fiscal year, the proposals for new investments have come down by more than 70 per cent, both in the private and governmental sectors. The Left leader also pointed out that in terms of per capita income, India is at 142nd position out of the 180 countries. (PTI)

NJAC never given chance to work, led to friction in functioning of collegium: Justice S K Kaul

NEW DELHI, Dec 29: Former Supreme Court judge Sanjay Kishan Kaul said on Friday the National Judicial Appointments Commission was never given a chance to work, leading to angst in political circles and friction in the working of the collegium system of judges appointing judges to higher judiciary.

The Narendra Modi government, after coming to power in 2014, got enacted the National Judicial Appointments Commission (NJAC) Act. The NJAC, tasked with the responsibility of making judicial appointments, comprised the Chief Justice of India, two senior Supreme Court judges, the union law minister and two other eminent persons nominated by the CJI, the prime minister and the Leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha

However, in October 2015, the Supreme Court had struck down the NJAC Act holding it unconstitutional. In an interview with PTI, Justice Kaul, who demitted office on December 25, said one has to accept there is a problem with the collegium system and it will be "unrealistic" to say that it is working smoothly.

Justice Kaul, who was part of the top court bench which refused to accord marriage rights to samesex couples under the existing laws, said the case was not strictly legal but involved social issues, and the government may introduce



On the issue of judges taking up post-retirement assignments, Justice Kaul said he was not interested in securing one, and the issue should be best left to the discretion of retired judges.

During his tenure of over six years and 10 months as a judge of the apex court, Justice Kaul was part of several landmark judgements including those that held the right to privacy a fundamental right and upheld the Centre's decision to abrogate Article 370 of the Constitution that bestowed special status on the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir. Besides the 16-member delegation led by ULFA 'Chairman' Arabinda Rajkhowa, representatives from 13 civil society organisations were also present on the occasion. The accord came after 12 years of unconditional negotiations between the Rajkhowa-led ULFA faction and the government, the officials said.

The peace pact is expected to end the decades-old insurgency in Assam. However, the ULFA's hardline faction headed by Paresh Baruah is not a part of the agreement. Baruah is believed to be residing at a place along the China-Myanmar border.

Sarma said Baruah is likely to join the peace process now and that state government representatives are in touch with him.

NEW DELHI, Dec 29: In a major move, the Centre has decided to give the benefit of reservation in promotions to its employees with benchmark disabilities (divyangjans), according to an order issued by the personnel ministry.

The eligible staffers would be considered for the promotions on "notional basis" with effect from June 30, 2016, the order said.

"PwD (person with disabilities) employees in posts and services of the central government will be considered for grant of the benefit of reservation in promotion up to the lowest rung of Group 'A' on notional basis with effect from 30.6.2016, subject to their fulfilment of the eligibility conditions...," the order issued to the secretaries of all central government departments read.

Any such promotion during the period from June 30, 2016 till the PwD employee actually assumes the charge of the post will only be on notional basis and the actual financial benefit of promotion will be effective from the date he or she actually assumes the charge of the promoted

It means no financial arrear will be admissible to them for the period between the date on which they get the benefit of notional promotion and the date on which they actually



assume or have already assumed the charge of the promoted post, the order explained

The personnel ministry has also suggested the creation of supernumerary posts (permanent posts created under special circumstances for a specific period) so that the inter-se seniority of the officials in various grades is not affected and to avoid 'administrative inconvenience".

"Extending the benefit of reservation in promotion to the PwD employees on notional basis between 30.6.2016 and actual assumption of the charge of the post may affect the inter-se seniority of the officials in various grades. Due to this, there

may be cases in which some officials may have to be placed in a select list or seniority list, subsequent to the year of their existing or present seniority list or select list," it said.

This may have a chain effect as it may result in a revision of the seniority lists in the subsequent years in many cases, which may cause administrative inconvenience, the order added.

"In order to avoid such a situation. supernumerary posts may be created to adjust the lien of such PwD employees with effect from the date on or after 30.6.2016, when they become eligible to get the benefit of reservation in promotion, till the

the promotion is to be made or till they vacate the post on their retirement, further promotion etc., whichever is earlier," it said.

The creation of such supernumerary posts will be personal to the PwD employee who is given the benefit of reservation in promotion on notional basis. This post will stand abolished on the date when such a PwD employee is adjusted against the available vacancy in the grade in which the promotion is given or when the PwD employee vacates the post on his or her retirement, further promotion etc., the order said

All ministries and departments have been advised to undertake an exercise to ascertain the requirement of supernumerary posts and submit the proposal for the creation of the posts to the Department of Expenditure through the Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT), it

"It is clarified that the benefit of notional promotion, as proposed above, shall not adversely affect those PwD candidates who have already been granted the benefit of reservation in promotion in personam (made against a specific person) in pursuance of the orders and judgments of various courts of law,' the order said. (PTI)



From multiplex mogul to singer: Life comes full circle for PVR INOX chief Ajay Bijli

NEW DELHI, Dec 29: He had a college band and a love for music he says he left behind to handle the family business but when life gave him a chance to pursue his teen passion he grasped it eagerly - and today Ajay Bijli, PVR INOX managing director, can be

heard crooning a song in "Dunki". Bijli started with covers of the songs that he likes in English and Hindi during the COVID-19 pandemic. He then decided to take things to the next level by singing an original track and it resulted in "Waheguru, Ik Onkar", a spiritual number that features prominently in Shah Rukh Khan's new release "Dunki" and is also available on T-series as a music video.

"It is a passion project and I hope that when people listen to the song, it helps them. I am not a religious guru or anything. I am just singing a song that resonated with me. It's a prayer and has different meanings and interpretations for different people. I hope it touches people's hearts," Bijli told PTI in an interview.

Shot in the scenic Pathar Sahib Gurudwara near Leh, Ladakh, the video is directed by Rakeysh Omprakash Mehra with Sheykhar Ravjiani attached as the composer and Ravi Verman as the cinematographer.

Bijli, who is a regular with his 'riyaz' (practice) and has been taking music lessons from a guru, said he always had a love for singing.

"I have been very fond of music right from the beginning. I had a band in college called Modus Operandi but in 1988 when I finished college, the band also finished because I started work in my transport company and then my love for cinema started in 1990," he said.

His family had a transport business and owned Vasant Vihar's Priya Cinema, which Bijli later expanded into a multiplex chain called PVR. The company recently completed its merger with INOX and is now known as PVR INOX.

Bijli, who now has a new band called Random Order, said the spiritual song is his first official release. He wanted to begin his musical journey by remembering god through a track that also connects him to his roots as a Punjabi.

"My mother really likes the song and I also wanted to give a tribute to her through this," he added. Once he decided to record the song, Bijli approached Ravjiani as he had liked the composer's rendition of "Hanuman Chalisa".

"I reached out to him and said, 'Shekhar, can you do a favour for me. Can you do an original rendition of 'Ik Onkar'. And he said, 'Okay, I will do it for you'. He did it for free without charging. I love the music he created, the loop of 'Waheguru'.'

Bijli thought he will shoot the music video at the iconic Golden Temple in Amritsar or Delhi's Bangla Sahib Gurudwara. But Mehra suggested that they shoot the video at Pathar Sahib Gurudwara near Leh, Ladakh.

It was just a coincidence that the song became a part of "Dunki", directed by Rajkumar

Shah Rukh Khan, his friend from school days, was discussing the film with him when Bijli realised that the song could find a place in

the movie that's set in Punjab. "I spoke to Raju and said, 'Listen, I have sung this rendition of 'Ik Onkar' and I believe the movie is set in Punjab and there is some gurudwara scene'.' He said, 'Yes, we have such scenes'. I said, 'Can I just send you my song'. He said, 'Yes, send it and I will see if I can fit it anywhere. But I have to like it and it has to resonate and go with the overall theme'. I said,

'Yes of course, I am just taking a chance'." Luckily, Hirani liked the song and decided to include it in the film's background and also

Premier League: Arsenal beaten 2-0 by West Ham for 1st home loss

in this season LONDON, Dec 29: Arsenal lost at home for the first time since May as a 2-0 defeat to West Ham cost Mikel Arteta's team the chance to return to the top of the Premier League on Thursday.

Goals by Tomas Soucek in the 13th minute and former Arsenal player Konstantinos Mavropanos in the 55th — combined with a stout defensive display — gave West Ham a surprising win at Emirates Stadium and continued a midseason blip by the Gunners.

That's just one win in its last four league matches for Arsenal, which was in first place for Christmas and needs to beat Fulham away on Sunday to be in that position heading into 2024. Arsenal is currently in second place and two points behind Liverpool, which doesn't play again until New Year's Day.

It could have been an even bigger win for West Ham but Said Benrahma had a penalty saved by Arsenal goalkeeper David Raya in the sixth minute of stoppage time.

There was some controversy over the first goal, with cameras not showing definitively if the ball was out of play when Jarrod Bowen turned it back into the area for Soucek to force home. Bowen's leg blocked the best sight of whether any of the ball was in play and the referee staved with the onfield decision of giving the goal.

A similar situation occurred with Arsenal at Newcastle, which scored the only goal of their game at St. James' Park on Nov. 4 amid debate over whether the ball was in play as a cross came in for Anthony Gordon's strike. West Ham lost Lucas Paqueta to an apparent left hamstring injury just after the half-hour mark — the Brazilian had been a doubt at the start of the game — but losing one of their key players didn't put the visitors out of their

Tottenham outplayed in 4-2 loss at Brighton

BRIGHTON, ENGLAND, Dec 29: Tottenham's top-four credentials were damaged by a miserable performance in a 4-2 loss at Brighton in the Premier League on Thursday.

Late goals for Tottenham by Alejo Véliz and Ben Davies gave the score a respectable look but the visitors were outplayed at Amex Stadium by a Brighton team missing up to 10 players through injury. Jack Hinshelwood powered a shot into the roof of the net in the 11th minute and Joao Pedro converted a penalty in the 23rd after Dejan Kulusevski pulled back Danny Welbeck in the area. James Milner also struck the post for Brighton in a first half that saw Tottenham's defense - missing injured center backs Cristian Romero and Micky van de Ven -get sliced open time and again. Richarlison also hit the post and had a goal ruled out for offside for Tottenham before halftime substitute Pervis Estupinan made it 3-0 with a shot from 25 yards (meters) that flew into the top corner in the 63rd. Joao Pedro scored his second again from the penalty spot – in the 75th after Evan Ferguson was fouled by Giovani Lo Celso, but Tottenham then rallied late. Veliz netted his first Premier League goal after Kulusevski blocked Lewis Dunk's clearance straight to Son, who set up the Argentine forward in the 81st. When Davies headed in Pedro Porro's cross four minutes later, a sensational comeback was potentially on but Brighton held on despite more chances for Tottenham, which would have jumped back into the top four with a victory. (AP)

they earned. Eventually, India lost that game 0-4.

India nearly botched up the bronze medal match against Japan too as they could score

only once from 11 penalty corners. However, they managed a 2-1 win over the Asian rivals.

Deepika, who regularly takes the penalty corner, said Rupinder shared the nuances about drag flicking such as the angle to take the shot and how to tackle the first-rushers from the opposition defence.

"He shared insights on the first rushers, how they have become fearless and close down on the ball faster than before. To counter this, he advised us to pick up the

"We also picked his brain on how to beat the first rusher, determining the line the rusher follows, where to get the ball stopped, which angle to take the shot in, and how to deal with mis-trapped balls," Deepika.

Rupinder, who had scored a whopping 234 goals in 223 appearances before his retirement in 2021, said he was satisfied by the lesson-intake ability of his

"Gurjit and Deepika are exceptional drag flickers. They quickly understand and implement my pointers. This crash course will be a fantastic way to brush up their skills before heading to Ranchi," said the towering fullback, who played a stellar role in India's bronze-winning effort in the Tokyo Olympics 2020.

Final line will be drawn by players' strength of character: Stimac on Asian Cup squad

NEW DELHI, Dec 29: Lined up to face strong sides like Australia and Uzbekistan in the AFC Asian Cup football in Doha next month, India head coach Igor Stimac on Friday said "strength of character" will be the parameter to decide who will be included in the final squad.

India are clubbed with formidable Australia, strong central Asian side Uzbekistan and tricky Syria -- all above Stimac's team in the FIFA rankings -- in the group stage of the Asian Cup from January 13 on-

"All the boys in the (probable) list are similar in their football qualities. What we are looking for the final list of 26 is definitely experience, physical strength, and the final line will be drawn by the strength of their character," Stimac said on the All India Football Federation's social media handles.

"This is very important for us as a team, because no matter the talent, if there is no character nothing can be achieved," he added.

Stimac will announce his final 26 players before the team's departure on Saturday. Regarding areas which the team needs improvement, he said, "I am looking for defensive compactness, offensive transition. and the set pieces mostly.

"It's also very important to work on man marking inside the box, because I was not happy with that part of our game, in the last few games. We started leaking some unnecessary goals inside the box because marking was not properly done."

India will face Australia on January 13, before playing against Uzbekistan (January 18) and Syria

India Women face stern challenge in 2nd ODI against Australia

MUMBAI, Dec 29: A test of character awaits Harmanpreet Kaur's India Women here in the second ODI against Australia on Saturday if they are to end their losing streak at home against the rampant visitors and keep the three-

India were outplayed thoroughly in the first ODI on Thursday at the Wankhede Stadium despite the hosts notching up their highest-ever total against Australia — 282/8 — riding on the brilliance of Jemimah Rodrigues (82) and Pooja Vastrakar (62 not out).

When it came to defending the total, India used seven different bowlers including Harmanpreet (3-0-32-0) but to no avail, as Australia romped home with more than three overs and six wickets to spare.

India's crushing defeat was not only their eighth consecutive at home but the manner in which the hosts went

down would create some concerns in the dressing room. After Sneh Rana flew to her left to take a diving catch to get rid of Alyssa Healy in the first over off Renuka Singh, India's fielding dropped and plenty of errors in the field assisted the Australian pair of Phoebe Litchfield and Ellyse Perry as they piled up a 148-run stand for the sec-

India's new ball bowlers, particularly Vastrakar, could not impose themselves and the fate was same for the senior spinners Deepti Sharma (1/55) and Rana, who had created a lot of trouble for the visiting batters during the one-off Test at this venue last week.

As it was the case on her T20I debut, Saika Ishaque (6-0-48-0) faced troubles settling down as a bowler and plenty of mistakes in the field only added to the team's

Before Rodrigues and Vastrakar rescued India with their 68-run stand for the eighth wicket, India were struggling with the bat with most of the batters not able to con-

But the ask will be tough for India to put this loss behind and recover quickly in a day's time for the second ODI, their seventh match across formats in the last 23 days in this packed home season. Playing top-flight cricket consistently could take its toll

and India Women will have to find their ways around it as they play an overall 11 matches across formats in a mere 35 days. It also remains to be seen if vice-captain and key open-

ing batter Smriti Mandhana, who missed the first ODI for being unwell, would be available for the second

Similarly, there were no further updates on Rodrigues than that she struggled with hydration issues. The righthanded batter, at one stage during her innings, ran towards the team dugout to throw up as she battled intense heat and humidity while producing one of her finest innings at the biggest stage.

The biggest challenge, however, for the think tank as well as those on the field, would be to find ways to stop this long and daunting Australian batting line-up.

The Indians will also have to find a way to stop the Australian vice-captain Tahlia McGrath, who has struck three fifties on this tour already and looks in prime form.

The pitch for the first ODI was a batting-friendly surface and is not expected to be a lot different for the remaining two matches at this venue, which implies bowling would be India's biggest concern going into this contest. For Australia, it was a near-perfect outing with the team putting up a fine show in the field even though they leaked runs in the death overs.

India scored 56 off the final six overs in one final push which made Australia's task only tougher, but death overs bowling and batting is one area that the visitors want to

Rahul Gandhi shows Jiu-Jitsu skills during meeting with Bajrang, other wrestlers

NEW DELHI, Dec 29: Congress leader Rahul Gandhi had demonstrated his Jiu-Jitsu skills while engaging in a martial art bout with wrestler Bajrang Punia during his visit to the Virendra Akhara in Haryana's Jhajjar district amid the row over Wrestling Federation of India elections. Gandhi had a practice session with the wrestlers and displayed the Japanese martial art skills to them during the early morning visit on Wednesday.

In a video uploaded by Bajrang on 'X' on Thursday, Gandhi can be seen showing the 'locks' and 'chokes' technique in Jiu-Jitsu as he pinned Olympic Games bronze medallist Bajrang down on the mat. Jiu jutsu is a Japanese martial art form and a close combat sport. The former Congress president also learnt some of the wrestling moves such as 'dhobi pachaad' and 'dhak' with Bajrang explaining him the difference between wrestling on the mud and on mat.

Gandhi is known to have an inclination towards combat sports and is also trained in Aikido, a modern Japanese martial art form.

According to Rahul's aikido coach Sensei Paritos Kar, the Congress MP appeared for a test in 2013 which he passed and was subsequently awarded the black belt. Gandhi had breakfast with the wrestlers during his meeting with them. He had milk, 'bajre ki roti' and 'saag' and was also offered some locally-grown vegetables which he took along with him.

"Today Rahul ji came to our akhada and we felt really good, he

came to see how the wrestlers live and train and everyone was very happy," Bajrang said in the video. "He (Gandhi) said he practices Jiu-Jitsu, he was telling us the moves and how it starts and I

showed the basics of our game like

'dhobi pachaad' and 'dhak'.

Dhobi pachaad is a famous move in which a wrestler lifts his opponent on the shoulders and then slams him to the mat, and in dhak, the wrestler holds his opponent in a headlock before throwing him to the ground.

Gandhi's visit to the wrestling academy came days after Punia, who has been at the forefront of the protests against former WFI president Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh, returned his Padma Shri to Prime Minister Narendra Modi.



Punia took the decision following the election of Brij Bhushan's close aide Sanjay Singh as the president of the WFI. The government suspended the new committee last Sunday

"If we don't raise the voice of our daughters and such people continue to curb them, then no daughter or sister will be able to raise their concerns in future in our country," Bajrang said.

"I didn't wan't to leave it (Padma Shri).. if our sisters and daughters are not safe then what I will do with these laurels. They are our pride, if they are safe then we will get our pride on its own.'

On December 21, Sanjay was elected as the WFI president as the panel led by the close aide of Brij Bhushan won 13 of the 15 posts. The wrestlers had demanded that no close associate of Brij Bhushan should enter the WFI administration. Following the election, Rio Olympics bronze medallist Sakshi Malik announced that she would quit the sport, while World Championship medallist Vinesh Phogat returned her Khel Ratna and Arjuna Award to the government in protest against Sanjay's election. 
Ishant and Umesh are unofficially done with their Test careers and Shami is nearer to end rather than start.

They say it takes two to tango and Bumrah without Shami is incomplete and the vice versa is equally true.

Shardul Thakur's long rope as bits and pieces cricketer also might come to an end as he is neither looking menacing with the ball nor dependable with the bat. Had Hardik Pandya been interested in playing red ball cricket, Shardul wouldn't have been in the horizon of Tests but with lack of good multi-skilled cricketers in domestic set-up, he is considered to be the best among whatever talent is available in

India might still handle this WTC cycle but possessing a bowling attack with an ability to take 20 sticks is a distant





India fined for slow over-rate, docked two WTC points after 1st Test against South Africa

DUBAI, **Dec 29:** India's heaviest defeat in South Africa in the first Test at Centurion came along with a fine of 10 per cent of their match fees and Rohit Sharma's team being docked two crucial points in the World Test Championship (WTC).

India lost inside three days in an abject surrender to the South African side, suffering the heaviest defeat in the African nation by an innings and 32 runs in the first of the two Tests.

'Chris Broad of the Emirates ICC Elite Panel of Match Referees imposed the sanction after India were ruled to be two overs short of the target after time allowances were taken into consideration," the ICC said in a release on Friday.

As per the Article 2.22 of the ICC Code of Conduct for Players and Player Support Personnel, which is in context to minimum over-rate offences, players are fined five per cent of their match fee for every over their side fails to bowl in the stipulated time. Additionally, one point per over short is docked by the ICC for its WTC, which means India lost two points.

"India captain Rohit Sharma pleaded guilty to the offence and accepted the proposed sanction, so there was no need for a for-

mal hearing," the ICC added. The charges were levelled by on-field umpires Paul Reiffel and Langton Rusere, third umpire Ahsan Raza and fourth umpire

Before the penalty India were placed fifth in the points table with 16 points and a PCT of 44.44.

After the penalty, they've dropped below Australia to sixth spot with a PCT of 38.39. India play one more Test in South Africa before returning home. (PTI)
