# 10 years under Modi govt have been golden era for Northeast: Amit Shah

SHILLONG, Jan 19: The last 10 years under the Modi government have been a golden era for the Northeast with an unprecedented focus on infrastructure development and conflict resolution, Union home minister Amit Shah said on Friday.

The Northeast is today shifting away from its history of blockades and unrest and is pacing towards peace and development, he said.

Addressing the 71st plenary session of the North Eastern Council (NEC) here, Shah also said that under the leadership of PM Modi, not only the distance from the Northeast to Delhi and the rest of India has reduced due to the creation of infrastructure, but the difference of hearts has also come

"The last 10 years under the government of Prime Minister Narendra Modi has been the most significant decade for the Northeast as it has seen most development in the 75 years since

independence," he said. He said the Northeast, which was struggling with various prob-



lem caused by ethnic, linguistic, border and extremist groups, also got the beginning of a fresh and durable era of peace in these 10

The home minister said if these 10 years for the Northeast are compared with the 75 years after the country's independence, then this decade will definitely be considered as the golden period for the

He said the Modi government has always considered the Northeast as an important part of India. Shah said that between 2004 and 2014, a total of 11,121 violent incidents took place in the Northeast and it has declined by 73 percent to 3,114 between 2014 and 2023.

Deaths among security forces dropped by 71 per cent from 458 to 132, while civilian deaths declined by 86 per cent, he said.

He said the incidents of insurgency have come down because in the last five years more than 8,900 members of militant groups have surrendered and joined the mainstream. This has given a message to the entire country that peace and

velop, he said.

The home minister said that to bring peace and stability in the Northeast, the Modi government has signed nine agreements and many pending law and order issues have been successfully resolved through these.

He said that except some parts of Assam and Manipur, 75 per cent of the areas covered under the Armed Forces Special Powers Act (AFSPA) in 2018 are no longer under it.

The home minister said that priority was accorded to the development of the Northeast during the time of former prime minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee when a separate ministry was created for the region. And today, the three mantras of 'Act East, Act Fast and Act First' are being implemented under the leadership of PM Modi, he said.

# Gold jumps ₹250; silver rallies ₹400

NEW DELHI, Jan 19: Gold prices jumped by ₹250 to ₹63,000 per 10 grams in the national capital on Friday amid a global rally in the precious metal, according to HDFC Securities.

The yellow metal had closed at ₹ 62,750 per 10 grams in the previous trade

Silver also rallied ₹ 400 to ₹ 76,000 per kg from ₹ 75,600 per kg in the previous close.

Snapping its three-day losing streak, spot gold prices (24 carats) in the Delhi markets are trading at ₹ 63,000 per 10 grams, up by ₹ 250, amid recovery in the overseas markets, Saumil Gandhi, senior analyst of commodities at HDFC Securities, said.

In the overseas markets, gold was trading higher at USD 2,027 per ounce, while it had finished at USD 2,010 per ounce in the previous trade.

Silver was also marginally higher at USD 22.81 per ounce.

Uncertainty surrounding the Middle East conflict is contributing to the safe-haven demand for gold prices. Additionally, investors are closely monitoring the Federal Reserve's stance on interest rates following positive US economic data, Navneet Damani, Senior VP of commodity research at Motilal Oswal Financial Services, said. (PTI)

Speaking at an annual convention organised by a lobby grouping of investment bankers here, Buch said the Sebi also has data and evidence on "mule accounts", wherein the credentials of an innocent person are used to typically front-run on stocks by those wanting to not leave a trace of trades.

There is also a tendency of "inflating the initial public offering (IPO) application numbers to give an impression of high amount of subscriptions", Buch said, adding that Sebi has data and evidence on



"We are also seeing practices where there is a pattern of which kind of merchant bankers tend to be ... frequent names occurring in such malpractices. Therefore, in the interest of the investors, we will be required to both review policy as well as (start) enforcement actions," Buch said

It can be noted that the comments come amid a huge surge in IPO activity, wherein many companies have witnessed very high investor demand in the run-up to the listing

## Sensex rebounds 496 pts on value buying in oil, metal shares

MUMBAI, Jan 19: Benchmark Sensex rebounded 496 points while Nifty closed above the 21,600 level on Friday as value buying in heavyweight stocks and a firm trend in global markets helped indices cut short three days of losses.

The 30-share BSE Sensex jumped 496.37 points or 0.70 per cent to settle at 71,683.23. During the day, it zoomed 708.78 points or 0.99 per cent to 71,895.64.

The Nifty climbed 160.15 points or 0.75 per cent to close at 21,622.40 with 43 of its shares closing in the green and seven in the red.

In the past three days, the BSE benchmark fell by 2.91 per cent, and the Nifty declined 2.87 per cent. "A 'buy on dips' and encouraging global cues propelled the market's recovery," said Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Financial Services.

"Today's rebound was broad based; however, investors are disappointed and expect moderation in the rally. FIIs persist with risk-off sparked by the likelihood that interest rates may not moderate and domestic earnings growth can slow down as per the initial Q3 results announced," Nair said.

Among the Sensex firms, Bharti Airtel rose the most by 3.52 per cent. NTPC rose by 3.04 per cent and Tech Mahindra by 2.56 per cent. Mahindra & Mahindra, Tata Steel, ÜltraTech Cement, Titan, Axis Bank, JSW Steel ICICI Bank and Larsen & Toubro were the major gainers.

IndusInd Bank, Kotak Mahindra Bank and State

Bank of India were the laggards. HDFC Bank extended its losses for the fourth straight day, falling by 1.08 per cent. The stock de-

clined around 10 per cent in the four sessions after the release of its third quarter financial results. "Firm global cues triggered a gap-up start in Nifty, followed by range bound movement till the end," Ajit

# Wheat production likely to be good this year: Agriculture minister Arjun Munda

Total acreage under wheat crop remained high at 336.96 lakh hectares till last week of current rabi season

NEW DELHI, Jan 19: The country's wheat production is expected to be good this year amid higher coverage, according to Union agriculture minister Arjun Munda.

The sowing of wheat, the main rabi (winter) crop, that began in October has been completed. Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, and Punjab are the top three states having the maximum area under wheat coverage.

"As per the sowing data, wheat has been covered in more area and we expect good production this year," Munda told PTI.

As per the ministry's data, the total acreage under the wheat crop remained higher at 336.96 lakh hectares till the last week of the current rabi season of the 2023-24 crop year (July-June), as against 335.67 lakh hectares in the yearago period.

On January 3, Food Corporation of India Chairman and Managing Director Ashok K Meena indicated that the country could achieve a new record in wheat production at 114 million tonnes in the ongoing 2023-24 crop year provided weather conditions remain normal.

Wheat production stood at a

record 110.55 million tonnes in

the 2022-23 crop year, compared to 107.7 million tonnes achieved in the preceding year

Sharing about wheat crop prospects this year, a senior agriculture ministry official said the crop is in good condition and there are no reports of any damage to the crop till date.

"The current cold weather condition is good for the growth of wheat and other rabi crops," he Climate-resistant seeds have

been sown in more than 70 per cent of the total wheat area covered in both Punjab and Haryana

this year, he said. The two states have sown wheat in a total area of around 59 lakh hectares this year,

Meanwhile, the agriculture ministry has started issuing regular advisories to help farmers take care of the wheat crop after the completion of sowing

the data showed

As per the latest advisory for the period covering January 16-30, the ministry has asked farmers to complete the application of nitrogen fertilizer up to 40-45 days after sowing. Farmers have been asked to apply urea just before irrigation for better results.

In case of late sown, if farmers

notice both narrow and broad leaf weeds in their wheat field, they have been advised to spray herbicide Sulfosulfuron 75WG of about 13.5 grams per acre or Sulfosulfuron plus Metsulfuron of 16 grams per acre in 120-150 litres of water before the first irrigation or 10-15 days after irrigation.

Keeping in view favourable humid weather for yellow rust disease, farmers are advised to visit their crops regularly to observe 'stripe rust' (vellow rust) incidence.

To tackle lodging in early sown wheat crops, farmers have been asked to provide 'growth regulators' in high fertility irrigated conditions. For frost management, light irrigation should be applied to wheat crops taking due care of the Met Department forecast.

The Met Department has forecast rain in northeast and central areas of India during January 16-30 and the temperature is expected to drop below normal in the forthcoming week.

The government is taking proactive steps to help farmers prepare to save the wheat crop in the events of extreme weather conditions. (PTI)

#### BTR's 100 Days 150 Targets program summary & reports unveiled

HT Correspondent KOKRAJHAR, Jan 19: The chief executive member of

Bodoland Territorial Region (BTR), Pramod Boro, along with Madhav Pai, chief executive officer of the World Resource Institute, New Delhi, released the summary and analysis report of the 100 Days 150 Targets program at a ceremony held in Central Institute of Technology, Kokrajhar.

The program was launched alongside the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the BTC government and WRI, aiming to establish a new paradigm of urban sustainable development in the five districts of the Bodoland region.

The 100 Days 150 Targets program focused on specific development targets aligned with the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals 2030 (UN SDGs 2030) framework. Fortytwo departments of BTC implemented their respective targets, achieving a cumulative completion rate of 57.3%. Out of the allotted 150 targets, 86 were completed, 60 are in progress, and 4 were discarded due to technical difficulties.

While releasing the report, CEM Pramod Boro mentioned that the remaining 47% of the targets are in progress with the support of central and state agencies and are expected to be completed shortly. The program aimed to fast-track priority development areas and

align with the SDG goals. It was implemented through a comprehensive framework, increasing departmental capacity, engaging expertise in multiple sectors, and encouraging collaboration.

Boro highlighted the commitment of the BTR government to sustainable development despite limited resources, following an Antyodaya approach of Leaving No One Behind (LNOB). The program was launched last year by the state Education minister, Ranoj

The report's analysis showcased the success of eight departments that achieved 100% of their assigned targets, including Education, Agriculture, Sericulture, Women & Child Development, and Flagship Missions like Bodoland Sericulture Mission. Four other departments, including Forest and Environment and Water Resources, completed more than 75% of the allotted targets, while 23 others achieved more than 50% of the targets.

The report also outlined the need for viability gap funding from different agencies to boost activities in the handloom and sericulture sector, which is a significant source of subsistence, especially for women in the BTR region. Notable achievements highlighted in the report included mapping the fish and fish seed potential in BTR and registering 75% of the livestock population in a comprehensive database.



Additionally, 24 stations in West Bengal, 11 stations in Bihar, 16 stations in Tripura, and 02 stations in Nagaland, along with 01 station in Meghalaya, have been fitted with solar roof-top panels, collectively generating 554.20 kWp, 390 kWp, 335 kWp, 120



kWp, and 10 kWp, respectively. Furthermore, 192.033 kWp of solar roof-top systems have been commissioned at 388 level crossing gates in Assam, Bihar, and West Bengal.

In the last quarter of the current financial year, NFR plans to commission an additional 1871 kWp capacity of solar roof-top systems. This includes 892 kWp in various locations of Rangiya Division, 384 kWp in Northeast Frontier Railway Sports Complex, Maligaon, 495 kWp in Lumding division, and 100 kWp in Alipurduar division.

NFR remains committed to harnessing solar energy to meet its power needs, resulting in substantial cost savings for the railways and the country while promoting environmental sustainability.

#### **RaGa Yatra Sparks Political Turmoil in NE**

he inaugural week of Bharat Jodo Nyay Yatra, spearheaded by former Congress President Rahul Gandhi, has ignited political fervor in Northeast India. The journey, launched on January 14 from Toubal in Manipur, has set off alarms among BJP leaders, notably Himanta Biswa Sarma, chief minister of Assam, who appears visibly concerned about the potential ramifications. The Northeast, a stronghold with 20 out of 25 Lok Sabha seats belonging to the NDA, including 15 held by the BJP, is crucial for the party's success in the upcoming 2024 Lok Sabha Election. Himanta Biswa Sarma's political fate hangs in the balance, given his leadership role in the BJP and NDA in the region. Rahul Gandhi's Nyay Yatra has traversed Manipur and Nagaland, drawing attention to the prevailing issues. In Manipur, where BJP won one of the two Lok Sabha seats in 2019, the Yatra gained substantial local support, reflecting growing discontent with the BJP-led government's handling of violence since May 2023. Similarly, in Nagaland, the Nyay Yatra strengthened the Congress, posing a potential threat to the political landscape dominated by the NDA. The swing in favor of Congress in 2019 and positive responses from the public indicate a shifting dynamic.

As the Yatra entered Assam on January 18, Himanta Biswa Sarma witnessed its successful progression. With 14 Lok Sabha seats at stake in Assam, where BJP secured nine seats in 2019 with a narrow vote margin, Himanta has much to worry about. The Nyay Yatra is slated to cover 833 km in Assam over 8 days, addressing concerns in 17 districts, including key places like Jorhat, Dispur, and Guwahati. AIUDF and Congress have already settled seat-sharing in Assam, with AIUDF contesting on 3 seats and Congress on 11. This alliance poses a substantial challenge for the BJP, as the combined vote share is expected to surpass the BJP's in the upcoming election, intensifying Himanta's concerns. The Nyay Yatra is proving instrumental in reviving Congress's presence in the Northeast, appealing to diverse ethnic groups disillusioned by violence, discrimination, and neglect from the central and state governments. The Yatra sheds light on unresolved issues like peace talks, the Citizenship Amendment Act, and the Inner Line Permit System, fostering resentment and unrest in the region.

Despite facing legal disruptions and criticism, particularly from Assam's CM Himanta Biswa Sarma, the Yatra continues to gain traction. Allegations of the Congress being anti-national and corrupt, countered by Rahul Gandhi's claims against Assam and its chief minister, add to the political heat. However, the Yatra grapples with organizational weaknesses and factionalism, demanding better coordination within the party and its INDIA alliance partners. The narrative for the Lok Sabha Election 2024 needs refinement to truly challenge the BJP's dominance in the Northeast. In the coming days, the Nyay Yatra will traverse Arunachal Pradesh and Meghalaya, covering one district each. With its initial success, it appears poised to impact the political outcome in favor of the Congress and its allies in the INDIA alliance. The BJP faces not only the challenge posed by the Yatra but also the potential desertion by its allies in Northeast India. Bharat Jodo Nyay Yatra, led by Rahul Gandhi, is reshaping Northeast politics, amplifying concerns for the BJP, particularly in Assam. The Yatra's success raises stakes for the upcoming Lok Sabha Election 2024.

Half of the verses in the book are based on war-stories. Guru Govind Singh wanted to inspire people against the Mughals' atrocities, and he found the way to it through reminding them the war tradition of their great Hindu ancestors. And most suitable of them in the given condition could be the character of Rama, the very embodiment of organization- valor-prowess. And he choose to write 'Ramavtar' to

fulfill the cause of inspiring national selfhood among the common-mass, there-

Initially who drew towards Sikhism of Guru Nanakdev [its exponent] by instinct were peace-loving, and religiously devotional. But latter the way with

heart rending cruelty Guru Ariundeva-one who did great historic work of compilation of Guru Granth Sahib-was killed by Jahangir; and then Guru Tegbahadur by Aurangzeb that the course of Sikhism underwent transformation.

It was no longer untenable to those at the helm of the affair of Sikhism to have learnt that bhajans [devotional songs], keertan [prayers] and fast may bring spiritual peace to mind. But as far as security of community is concerned that can't be achieved without arousing the spirit of organisation, fearlessness and martialism among the people, as Rama once did against demonic tendency then ruling the roost in his time. Thus came into being Khalsa-Panth initiated by Guru Govind Singh. First five who came forward to fulfil the resolutions of Khalsa were venerably known as 'Pani-Pvare'.

One among them was from Dhobi-community; second, Bhisti; third, Darji; fourth, khatri; fifth from Jat community. As also Beedar, Dwarkapuri and Jaggantwo from Punjab. Having been initiated in Khalsa, it was mandatory keeping kesh [long hair], kataar [dagger] and kanghi [comb]; and wearing kachha [small-piece of loin-cloth] and kada [bracelet], which are popularly known as five 'Kakaar'.

Based on Veer rasa (the verses that triggers brevity), the latter part of the composition is predominantly refer to the victories of Rama in the wars he fought. Guru Govind Singh wanted to see country free of bondage of Mughal-rule. Fighting against Auranzeb and his sons and their hard core cunning followers he and his four sons sacrificed their



lives. However the eternal ideals laid by Shri Ram and the motivation gained from the life of Guru Govind Singh never let fighting spirit among his followers die out a bit. Following the path shown by him, his descendent, great Maharaja Ranjit Singh later fulfilled his dream.

Though Marathas liberated Punjab in 1755-56 from Mughals but credit for strengthening of Indian sovereignty in the region actually goes to subsequent Sikh rule there. Not only this, breaking the Muslim dominance, invading army of Mahahraja led by Harisingh Nalwa even entered deep inside Afghanistan up to Kabul and earned the glory of bringing back after centuries the jewel studded Gate of Somnath temple back to India, establishing it to its original place. Likewise Hari Mandir Sahib Gurudwara of Amritsar that was once burnt down by Ahmad Shah Abdali was renovated and as well as embedded with the gold, giving it the form of 'Swaran Mandir'. With the next Lok Sabha election looming just months after the inauguration, Modi aims to loudly beat the drums about the temple and closely associate himself with every aspect. He appointed confidante Nripendra Misra to head the temple committee rather than leaving it to another group, ensuring the credit for construc-



tion goes to the Prime Minister. The nominal temple trust acts as Modi's proxy until the grand opening, when he and trusted aides will orchestrate the triumphant ceremony. Modi outshines even Lord Ram as he spearheads preparations for this momentous event.

Prime Minister Modi is known for his grandiose style, preferring the spectacular over the subdued. He embraces bold, flashy gestures undeterred by concerns of excessiveness or vulgarity. The Prime Minister excels as a master of political spectacle, outshining even the most lavish Indian weddings and Bollywood productions.

With the construction and inauguration of the Ram Mandir in Ayodhya, Modi aims to capitalize on this achievement as an impactful campaign theme. The fanfare surrounding Ayodhya is crafted to maximize political advantage in the upcoming Lok Sabha polls. For over 20 years, the BJP has

capitalized on the Ram temple issue in Uttar Pradesh to gain votes. Now that the temple has finally been built, it remains to be seen whether it will continue to deliver electoral dividends.

The BJP has turned Uttar Pradesh into an almost impregnable stronghold for Hindu nationalism. It is unclear how much more the Ram temple will bolster the party's position. That Prime Minister Modi is orchestrating a grand inauguration for the temple indicates the BJP still seeks to tap into the emotional resonance of the temple for voters, as the party is uncertain about touting its economic and

The BJP's return to the Ayodhya temple issue after 10 years in power should come as a disappointment. It indicates that Modi has failed to establish a compelling record of governance and must resort to divisive religious themes to win elections. This tactic of exploiting religious divides for political gain also extends to other Hindi heartland states, with the exception of Bihar

However, Modi seems unconcerned with such ethical qualms. His sole focus is victory, regardless of the means. For him, any issue that proves politically use-

ful, like the temple, is fair game. Modi and the BJP are traveling a dangerous path of rightwing nationalism by seeking to revive Hindu glory in Ayodhya. Their plan to transform Ayodhya into an internationally renowned Hindu pilgrimage site marks a concerning shift from realism to

While aiming to spotlight India's past achievements, this backward-looking contradicts the modernization and progress promised by technology. A country led by those focused on recreating an unrecoverable past cannot truly embrace the future.

The BJP remains firmly entrenched in an imagined version of India's history yet lacks nuance in how they invoke the past. Their fervent push to reconstruct the Ram temple is an attempt to bring to life a utopian myth rather than engage thoughtfully with ancient texts.

Building a theme park version of Ayodhya dishonors its complex history as a Buddhist, Jain and Hindu center of significance. If India is to ride the twin horses of innovation and tradition into the future, leaders must look forward with clear eyes, not backward with blind nostal-

The inability to separate past and present, dreams and reality reveals flaws in the national psyche. This confusion leads to turmoil in daily life. For centuries, Indians held myths in mind vet lived in the present. keeping myth and emotion apart from daily challenges.

Now the RSS, BJP, and Modi lead India down a slippery path, seeking to revive past glories artificially, and disrupting normal life. # Why ISRO's collaboration with Russia for Gaganyaan mission is crucial?

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) is considering sending its astronauts on the highly ambitious Gaganyaan mission with spacesuits made in Russia, according to document reviewed by Hindustan Times. There are signs that Russian spacesuits will be used for the Gaganyaan mission, although Vikram Sarabhai Space's locally produced Intra-Vehicular Activity (IVA) suits are almost finished and being tested.

The initial plan was for Indian astronauts to wear the IVA suits made in India. Recent mission planning, however, indicates that Russian spacesuits are preferred due to programmatic needs and an extra degree of assurance for crew safety. "Considering the programmatic requirements and to doubly ensure crew safety, it is planned to induct Russian space suits for the (Gaganyaan) mission," an official document sent to the English daily said.

The year, 2024, is marked as 'The Year of Gaganyaan' by the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) chief, S Somanath, who emphasised its importance in the Gaganyaan timeline. At this critical juncture in the planning and implementation of this historic space project, ISRO has scheduled important mission-related tests and demonstrations throughout the entire year.

ISRO Gaganyaan Mission: is aimed at showcasing India's capacity to carry out its first human spaceflight programme, ISRO is gearing up for a momentous milestone with its ambitious Gaganyaan mission. The goal of the project is to safely return a crew of three people to Earth by putting them into orbit at a height of 400 kilometres for a three-day

To ensure the programme's complete success, ISRO is concentrating on several tests and programmes in advance of the historic human mission. The production of a human-rated launch vehicle that can safely carry the crew into space is at the forefront of this endeavour, alongside the development of crucial technologies. Furthermore, construction is being done on a life-support system that will give the crew an Earth-like environment while they are in space. Developing a thorough framework for crew management that addresses such issues as training, recuperation and rehabilitation is another priority

ISRO is scheduled to carry out some critical preparatory missions before the Gaganyaan spacecraft is launched. Test Vehicle (TV) flights, the Pad Abort Test (PAT) and the Integrated Air Drop Test (IADT) are a few of these. These test flights are essential for evaluating and improving different systems to ensure they are safe and reliable in the harsh environment of space. Before commencing manned operations, unmanned missions will also be carried out to confirm and improve the overall robustness of the sys-

A major step forward for India in the field of human space exploration, ISRO's devotion to meticulous testing, technological developments and exhaustive preparations demonstrates its dedication towards accomplishing a successful Gaganyaan mission.

Since it was first introduced in 1973, the Sokol space suit—also referred to as the Sokol IVA suit, or just the Sokol (Russian: Сокол, lit. 'Falcon') - has been a mainstay of Soviet and Russian space missions. As of 2023, it is still in use and was intended to be worn by every Soyuz spaceship occupant. To differentiate it from suits meant for extravehicular activities or spacewalks, the Sokol is officially categorized as a rescue suit.

The Sokol is essential in the event of an unexpected spaceship depressurization, unlike suits made for spacewalks. The major goal of the Sokol is to guarantee the wearer's survival in an emergency by preserving a life-sustaining environment within the suit, despite certain parallels with NASA's Advanced Crew Escape Suit (ACES), which is worn during space shuttle launches and landings.

The Sokol has been a life-support system under dire circumstances for a long time, which is proof of its dependability and efficiency in space exploration. Although it is not designed for extravehicular operations, its vital function in protecting astronauts in space highlights how important it is to the general safety of human missions.

Specifications and variants: Since its debut in 1973 with the Sokol-K model, the Sokol space suit - a crucial part of intra-vehicular activity (IVA) - has experienced multiple revisions. With a weight of 10 kg (22 lb) and an operating pressure of 400 hPa (5.8 psi), the Sokol-K was first deployed on the Soyuz-12 mission in September 1973. It was used on missions from Soyuz-12 to Soyuz-40 (1981) and was based on the Sokol aircraft fullpressure suit.

The Sokol-KR version was created particularly for the Almaz programme and the TKS spacecraft. Different from its counterparts, the Sokol-KR had a regen-

erative life support system, although the TKS spacecraft never flew with a crew.

The Sokol-KM and KV were intermediate variants that included several advancements after the Sokol-K. These included a liquid-cooled undergarment, a two-piece design secured with zip fasteners, and improvements to the joint fabric for better mobility. Yet, the Sokol-KM and KV were not successful in reaching

An upgraded model, the Sokol-KV, weighed 12 kg (26 lb) and operated at 400 hPa (5.8 psi). It had the liquid-cooled undergarment, which effectively removed body heat to maximize wearer comfort, although it was never used on a space mission.

Sokol& Mercury comparisons: emergency scenarios, astronaut survivability is given priority by both the American Mercury spacesuit and the Russian Sokol spacesuit. However, the Sokol is unique given that it is dependable across many years of space flights, acting as a life-support system in the event of unplanned spaceship depressurizations. As a result of its proven ability to maintain a life-sustaining environment within the suit—an essential feature for guaranteeing astronaut safety in space exploration emergencies - the Sokol has a strong reputation as a rescue suit.

The Sokol spacesuit shows improvements in design, while the Mercury spacesuit was revolutionary for its day, with features including an aluminium coated nylon shell for thermal regulation. To effectively control body temperature and improve wearer comfort, the Sokol-KV version, for instance, incorporates a liquid-cooled undergarment. The Russian spacesuit temperature regulation is a vital component for astronaut well-being on long-duration missions and this invention demonstrates their dedication to enhanc-

ing this aspect of their suits. Better joint fabric, a two-piece design fastened with zips and a liquid-cooled undergarment are all features of the Sokol spacesuit's progression, which enhances wearer comfort and mobility. Examples of these models are the Sokol-KM and KV. On the other hand, astronauts in the Mercury spacesuit expressed dissatisfaction with the suit due to inadequate temperature regulation and restricted head mobility. To improve mission efficiency as a whole, Sokol's design improvements are centred on resolving astronaut con-

With its simple zips and airtight seals, the Sokol spacesuit's design places strong emphasis on user-friendliness. Making sure every member of the Soyuz crew gets a custom-fit suit is important for the suit's operation during launch and reentry. On the contrary, despite being functional in its intended capacity, the Mercury spacesuit needed to be specially tailored for every astronaut and, during missions, astronauts complained of pain. The Sokol's applicability in real-world space mission conditions is attributed to its user-friendly features and attention to fit customization.

In case of an emergency, both suits have pressure relief valves, with the Sokol enabling modifications to various pressure levels. As the Mercury spacesuit was made to withstand a maximum pressure of 3.7 pounds per square inch, it was not flexible enough to change pressure levels in an emergency. By allowing astronauts to balance movement and survival, the Sokol's capacity to modify pressure settings - albeit under dire circumstances - illustrates a more flexible approach to managing emergencies.

The upcoming missions of ISRO apart from the Gaganyaan mission are: NASA-ISRO SAR (NISAR) Mission: Jointly developed by NASA and ISRO, the NASA-ISRO SAR (NISAR) is intended to be a Low-Earth Orbit (LEO) observatory. NISAR's main goal is to map the whole planet every 12 days. By doing this, it provides reliable spatial and temporal data that can be used to track changes in the planet's ecosystems, ice mass, biomass of flora, sea levels, groundwater and natural hazards, such as landslides, tsunamis and earthquakes.

The Synthetic Aperture Radar (SAR) equipment operating in L and S bands is dual-band and is used by the observatory. High-resolution data across a broad swath is made possible by the novel Sweep SAR technology. With the use of repeat-pass InSAR techniques, NISAR seeks to serve both national interests and the scientific community worldwide in its study of surface deformations.

NASA's contribution entails delivering the L-Band SAR payload system, engineering payloads and key equipment, such as the Payload Data Subsystem, High-rate Science Downlink System, GPS receivers, and a Solid State Recorder. In the interim, ISRO provides the S-Band SAR payload and the two agencies work together on a sizeable shared unfillable reflector antenna.

The capacity for high-resolution, highrepeat-cycle data collection has been improved by this ground-breaking project, which is the first dual-frequency radar imaging mission in the L- and S-bands. Encompassing a broad spectrum of phenomena from plant changes to ice sheet collapse and natural disasters, NISAR focuses on three primary disciplines: ecosystems, deformation studies and cryosphere sciences.

A 12-m wide deployable mesh reflector designed by JPL is installed on a 9-m boom at the observatory. The Integrated Radar Instrument Structure (IRIS) contains the SAR payloads and associated electronics, while the spacecraft incorporates attitude and orbit control elements, power systems and thermal management.

Three phases make up the development of NISAR: SIT-2, which is for the independent development of SAR payloads and engineering systems; SIT-3, which is for integration and testing at JPL; and the ongoing SIT-4 phase, which is for performance evaluation of the observatory as a whole. The mission will be launched in the first quarter of 2024 from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre (SDSC) SHAR, Sriharikota, utilizing the GSLV expendable launch vehicle provided by

After launch, a 90-day commissioning phase will include an in-orbit checkout to get the observatory ready for science operations. The ultimate aim is to accomplish the Level-1 research goals and give the scientific community useful data. (IPA Service)

# Netanyahu says he told the US that he opposes a Palestinian state in any postwar scenario

Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on Thursday rejected calls from the United States to scale back Israel's military offensive in the Gaza Strip or take steps toward the establishment of a Palestinian state after the war, drawing an immediate scolding from the White House.

The tense back and forth reflected what has become a wide rift between the two allies over the scope of Israel's war and its plans for the future of the beleaguered territory. "We obviously see it differently," White House national security spokesperson John Kirby

Netanyahu spoke just a day after U.S. Secretary of State Antony Blinken said Israel would never have "genuine security" without a pathway toward Palestinian independence. Earlier this week, the White House also announced that it was the "right time" for Israel to lower the intensity of its devastating military offensive in Gaza.

Chaotic wave of attacks and reprisals in Middle East fuel worries of a broader regional war

In a nationally televised news conference, Netanyahu struck a defiant tone, repeatedly saying that Israel would not halt its offensive until it realizes its goals of destroying Gaza's Hamas militant group and bringing home all remaining hostages held by Hamas.

He rejected claims by a growing chorus of Israeli critics that those goals are not achievable, vowing to press ahead for many months. "We will not settle for anything short of an absolute victory," Netanyahu said. Israel launched the offensive after an unprecedented cross-border attack by Hamas on Oct. 7 that killed 1,200 people and took some 250 others hostage. Roughly 130 hostages are believed by Israel to remain in Hamas captivity. The war

Israel's assault, one of the deadliest and most destructive military campaigns in recent history, has killed nearly 25,000 Palestinians, according to Gaza health authorities, caused widespread destruction and uprooted over 80% of the territory's 2.3 million people from their homes.

The staggering cost of the war has led to increasing calls from the international community to halt the offensive. After initially giving Israel wall-to-wall support in the early days of the war, the United States, Israel's closest ally, has begun to express misgivings and urged Netanyahu to spell out his vision for postwar Gaza.

The United States has said the internationally recognized Palestinian Authority, which governs semiautonomous zones in the Israeli-occupied West Bank, should be "revitalized" and return to Gaza. Hamas ousted the authority from Gaza in 2007. The U.S. has also called for steps toward the establishment of a Palestinian state. The Palestinians seek Gaza, the West Bank and east Jerusalem for their state. Those areas were captured by Israel in 1967.

Speaking Wednesday at the

Switzerland, Blinken said the twostate solution was the best way to protect Israel, unify moderate Arab countries and isolate Israel's arch-

enemy, Iran. Without a "pathway to

a Palestinian state," he said, Israel

would not "get genuine security." At the same conference, Saudi Arabia's foreign minister said the kingdom is ready to establish full relations with Israel as part of a larger political agreement. "But that can only happen through peace for the Palestinians, through a

Palestinian state," he said. Netanyahu, who leads a far-right government opposed to Palestinian statehood, repeated his longstanding opposition to a two-state solution. He said a Palestinian state would become a launching pad for attacks on Israel.

He said Israel "must have security control over the entire territory west of the Jordan River," adding: "That collides with the idea of sovereignty. What can we do?"

This truth I tell to our American friends, and I put the brakes on the attempt to coerce us to a reality that would endanger the state of Israel," he said. The comments prompted an immediate rebuke from the White House. Kirby said that President Joe Biden would "not stop working" toward a two-state solution. Before Oct. 7, Israeli society was

## After Taiwan's election, its new envoy to the US offers assurances to Washington and Beijing

WASHINGTON, Jan 19: Taiwan's top diplomat in Washington has a message for both the island's Chinese adversaries and its American friends: Don't worry that Taiwan's new president-elect will worsen relations with Beijing and possibly draw the U.S. into a conflict.

President-elect Lai Ching-te plans to keep the status quo in the Taiwan Strait, Alexander Tah-Ray Yui told The Associated Press on Thursday in his first interview with an international news organization since he arrived in the U.S. in December.

The Chinese government has called Lai a troublemaker who will push Taiwan toward independence. But Yui said Lai is willing to engage with Beijing, even as the island seeks to strengthen its unofficial ties with Washington for stability in the re-

"We want the status quo. We want the way it is — neither unification, neither independence. The way it is is the way we want to live right now," said Yui, Taiwan's de-facto ambassador to the U.S., noting the stance is largely supported at home and will guide the new administration.

Yui spoke to the AP five days after Lai won the presidential election with more than 40% of the vote in a three-way race. Lai will succeed Tsai Ing-wen when he is inaugurated in May. His victory, which gives the independence-leaning Democratic Progressive Party an unprecedented third presidential term, was not welcomed by Beijing, which claims Taiwan as its own, to be taken by force if necessary. Military action in the Taiwan Strait could draw in the United States, which has a security pact with Taiwan to deter any armed invasion from the mainland

Beijing refused to have any dialogue with Tsai because her party rejects China's claim of sovereignty over the island, and before the election had suggested to voters that they could be choosing between war and peace. It remains unclear if Beijing will be willing to engage with Lai, who in the past described himself as



around the world that recognize its statehood. However, China has not launched massive military exercises around the island, as it has in past times of increased tensions. Yui said Lai intends to follow the same line as his predecessor "but also to offer an olive branch to mainland

China by saying that he's also willing to engage with mainland China." At the same time, Taiwan will work with the U.S. to boost its defense and deepen economic and cultural ties, Yui said, calling relations with Washington "one of the most

important aspects in our foreign af-

The United States does not have a formal relationship with Taiwan, but it has stepped up its support in the past several years, angering China, which has urged the U.S. to "exercise extreme prudence in handling Taiwan-related issues." President Xi Jinping told President Joe Biden that Taiwan is the most sensitive issue in U.S.-China relations.

Shortly after Taiwan's election, Biden told reporters that his administration does not support Taiwan's independence. Scott Kennedy, senior adviser and trustee chair in Chinese business and economics at the Center for Strategic and International Studies, a Washington-based think tank, said he expected tensions to remain largely the same under Lai.

"Beijing will continue to develop

its military capabilities and push the boundaries of military threats and economic coercion," he said. "The U.S. will continue to assist Taiwan with its defensive preparedness and push Taiwan to move more assertively on the various elements needed for effective self-defense."

But Kennedy said Beijing may also open up some channels for the two sides to convey messages and reduce misunderstanding. Yui said it is incumbent upon both Beijing and Taipei to keep the Taiwan Strait

"I have to stress, we're not the aggressors. We're not the ones, you know, making waves in the Taiwan Strait, making things nervous and tense," he said, alluding to Beijing's increased military activities near the island in the past several years.

Yui said Taiwan is determined to safeguard its homeland, noting that the island is increasing its defense budget and has extended the mandatory military service from four months to one year.

He said Beijing's luring away of Nauru was an attempt to punish the Taiwanese people for choosing the leader they wanted and will only

"They were just trying to find an appropriate time and excuse to slowly pluck all of our allies," Yui said. But, as a technological powerhouse and a democracy, Taiwan has "become a common word in the international community" and countries around the world have become more willing to engage with it, he

ISLAMABAD, Jan 19: Pakistan's caretaker Prime Minister Anwaarul Hag Kakar has constituted a seven-member committee mandated with ensuring the smooth conduct of the February 8 general elections already impaired by allegations of "pre-poll rigging", according to a media report.

According to a notification issued by the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) on Thursday, interim Minister for Communications, Railways, and Maritime Affairs Shahid Ashraf Tarar has been named as the head of the committee, the Dawn newspaper reported.

The other members include the interior secretary, four provincial chief

As per the PMO notification, the committee will have the mandate to oversee the security arrangements for polls; review and resolve matters regarding administrative arrangements and coordination for the smooth conduct of elections; issue directions for urgent requirements of additional security where law and order situation requires, and implement directions of the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) regarding smooth and orderly conduct of polls. The notification added the National Crisis Management Cell of the Ministry of Interior will serve as the committee

Kakar, who is required to ensure transparency and fairness in the upcoming elections, is being consistently accused of working in favour of pro-military political parties.

The elections are already marred by allegations of pre-poll rigging, with former prime minister Imran Khan jailed and barred from running. Khan, 71, has been languishing in jail in connection with multiple cases. His party has been denied the cricket bat symbol that had become syn-

### NKorea says it tested underwater nuclear attack drone in response to rivals' naval drills

SEOUL, Jan 19: North Korea said on Friday it had tested a purported underwater nuclear attack drone in response to a combined naval exercise between South Korea and the United States and Japan this week, as it continues to blame its rivals for raising

tensions in the region. The alleged drone test came days un declared he would scrap his country's long-standing goal of a peaceful unification with South Korea and that his country would rewrite its constitution to define South Korea as its most hostile foreign adversary.

Gang members have raided a key community in Haiti's capital that is home to numerous police officers and has been under siege for four days in an ongoing attack, with residents fearful of the violence spreading throughout Port-au-

The pop of automatic weapons echoed throughout Solino on

Thursday thick columns of black smoke rose above the once peaceful neighborhood where frantic residents kept calling radio stations asking for help.

"If police don" come, we are dying today!'

said one unidentified caller. Lita Saintil, a 52-year-old street vendor, told The Associated Press that she fled Solino on Thursday with her teenage nephew after being trapped in her house for hours by incessant gunfire.

The homes around hers were torched by gangs, and she recalled seeing at least six bodies as she fled. "It's very scary now," she said. "I don't know where I'm going."

Another resident, Nenel Volme, told the AP that he was chatting with a friend near his house on Sunday when gunfire erupted and a bullet struck a bone in his right hand. "I don't have the means to go

wrapped in gauze. It wasn't immediately clear who organized and was participating in the attack on Solino. The community, which is home to thousands of people, was once infested by gangs before a U.N. peacekeeping mission drove them out in the mid-2000s. The attack could mark a turning

point for gangs, which are now estimated to control up to 80% of Port-au-Prince and have been suspected killing nearly 4,000 people and kidnapping another 3,000 last year, overwhelm-

ing police in the country of nearly 12 million people. If Solino falls, gangs would have easy access to neighborhoods such as Canape Vert that have so far remained peaceful and largely

"Life in Port-au-Prince has become extremely crazy," Saintil said. "I never thought Port-au-Prince would turn out the way it is now." On Thursday evening, Haiti's National Police released a statement saying officers were deployed to Solino "with the aim of tracking down and arresting armed individuals seeking to sow panic among the civilian population." Pocers on a rooftop in Solino exchanging fire with unidentified gunmen who did not appear on

Nearby communities spooked by the ongoing violence in Solino began erecting barricades on Thursday using rocks, trucks, tires and even banana trees to prevent gangs from entering. One man near a barricade in Canape Vert said that he had been following the protests organized earlier this week by supporters of former rebel leader Guy Philippe, who has pledged a revolution to drive out gangs.

"It's more misery," the man, who declined to identify himself, said of Haiti's ongoing crisis. "We are suffering. The country is gangsterized." Amid concerns that the violence in Solino could spill over into other neighborhoods, parents rushed to schools across Port-au-Prince to pick up their children.

"I don't know if we're going to be able to make it back home," said one mother who declined to provide her name out of fear. "There is no public transportation, and tires are burning everywhere. We don't know what we're going to do."

Haiti is awaiting the deployment of a foreign armed force led by Kenya to help quell gang violence that was approved by the U.N. Security Council in October. A judge in Kenya is expected to issue a ruling on Jan 26 regarding an order currently blocking the deployment.

## NATO holds its biggest exercises in decades next week, involving around 90,000 personnel



BRUSSELS, Jan 19: NATO will launch its biggest military exercises in decades next week with around 90,000 personnel set to take part in months of drills aimed at showing the alliance can defend all of its territory up to its border with Russia, top officers said on Thursday.

The exercises come as Russia's war on Ukraine bogs down. NATO as an organization is not directly involved in the conflict, except to supply Kviv with non-lethal support, although many member countries send weapons and ammunition individually or in groups, and provide military training. In the months before President Vladimir Putin ordered Russian troops into Ukraine in February 2022, NATO began beefing up security on its eastern flank with Russia and Ukraine. It's the alliance's biggest buildup since the Cold War. The war games are meant to deter Russia from targeting a member country.

The exercises - dubbed Steadfast Defender 24 – "will show that NATO can conduct and sustain complex multi-domain operations over several months, across thousands of kilometers (miles), from the High North to Central and Eastern Europe, and in any condition," the 31-nation organization said.

Troops will be moving to and through Europe until the end of May in what NATO describes as "a simulated emerging conflict scenario with a near-peer adversary." Under NATO's new defense plans, its chief adversaries are Russia

"The alliance will demonstrate its ability to reinforce the Euro-Atlantic area via transatlantic movement of forces from North America," NATO's Supreme Allied Commander, U.S. General Christopher Cavoli, told reporters.

Cavoli said it will demonstrate "our unity, our strength, and our determination to protect each other.'

The chair of the NATO Military Committee, Admiral Rob Bauer, said that it's "a record number of troops that we can bring to bear and have an exercise within that size, across the alliance, across the ocean from the U.S. to Europe.'

Bauer described it as "a big change" compared to troop numbers exercising just a year ago. Sweden, which is expected to join NATO this year, will also take part.

U.K. Defense Secretary Grant Shapps has said that the government in London would send 20,000 troops backed by advanced fighter jets, surveillance planes, warships and submarines, with many being deployed in eastern Europe from February to June. (AP)

#### 10 dead after a landslide buries a house in the southern Philippines

DAVAO, Jan 19: A landslide set off by days of heavy rain buried a house where people were holding Christian prayers in the southern Philippines, killing at least 10 people, including five children, officials said on Friday.

Two people were injured, and at least one more villager remained unaccounted for following the landslide in a remote mountain village in the gold-mining town of Monkayo in Davao de Oro province, Ednar Dayanghirang, the regional chief of the government's Office of Civil Defence, said.

Three more bodies were found on Friday, after the search was paused mid-afternoon Thursday due to the risk of another landslide. "They were praying in the house when the landslide hit," Dayanghirang told The Associated Press by telephone Thursday night. "It's sad but it's the reality on the ground."

People living near the village were ordered to evacuate due to fears of more land- and mudslides due to intermittent downpours, Monkayo Mayor Manuel Zamora said. Days of heavy rains also flooded low-lying villages and displaced more than 36,000 people in Davao de Oro and three other provinces, the Office of Civil Defense said. The weather began to clear on Friday in some areas.

The rains were sparked by what local forecasters call a shear line, a point where warm and cold air meet. At least 20 storms and typhoons lash the Philippine archipelago each year, especially during the rainy season that starts in June.

mains of a Long Island man killed at the World Trade Center on 9/11 have been identified more than two decades after the 2001 attacks, the New York City medical examiner's office announced on Thursday.

John Ballantine Niven, 44, of Oyster Bay, was an executive at Aon Risk Services, an insurance firm on the 105th floor of tower two of the trade center complex, according to obituaries at the time. He left a wife and a son who was 18 months old at the time. Niven is the 1,650th victim identified from

American soil, when hijackers crashed airplanes into the Twin Towers, killing 2,753 people. "While the pain from the enor-

mous losses on September 11th never leaves us, the possibility of new identifications can offer solace to the families of victims," New York City Mayor Eric Adams said in a statement. "I'm grateful for the ongoing work from the Office of Chief Medical Examiner that honors the memory of John Ballantine Niven and all those we

The medical examiner's office has been using advanced DNA analysis to identify victim remains in recent years. Ahead of the anniversary of the attacks last September, the office said it had identified remains of a man and a woman, though their names were not made public at the request of their families.

"We will forever remember our

the deadliest act of terrorism on heroes who perished on 9/11 and we appreciate the continuous efforts of forensic experts to help identify victims," Oyster Bay Supervisor Joseph Saladino said in a separate statement. "We're hopeful that this amazing advance in technology helps bring peace to Mr. Niven's family and allows him to eternally rest in peace." Roughly 40 percent of victims

of the World Trade Center attack have vet to have their remains identified, as few full bodies were recovered when the giant towers collapsed.But as DNA testing has evolved, so has the costly, painstaking effort to connect more than 21,900 bits of remains to individual victims. In some cases, scientists have gone back to the same bone fragment 10 or more times, hoping new technology will provide answers. The 9/11 attacks killed nearly 3,000 people in New York, at the Pentagon and near Shanksville, Pennsylvania. (AP)

Numerous recruitments are currently in progress, as indicated by the most recent government notification.'

"This situation is disheartening for individuals who took part in recruitment exams, but are still awaiting their results. The delay in announcing results is causing uncertainty and concerns amongst the candidates which tantamount depriving of the fundamental rights," the student body said. (NNN)

ITANAGAR, Jan 19: The National Council of Science Museums (NCSM) on Friday signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with the Arunachal Pradesh government for setting up a science centre and digital planetarium at Dirang in West Kameng district.

The centre and the planetarium will be set up by NCSM at an estimated cost of ₹ 26.70 crore and ₹15.60 crore, respectively, under the Scheme for Promotion of Culture of Science (SPoCS) of the Union culture ministry, an official communiqué said.

The Arunachal Pradesh State Council for Science and Technology (APSCS&T), under the state department of science and technology, inked the pact with the NCSM in New Delhi. The science centre and the digital planetarium would be of category II.

"This will be the third science

Itanagar and Namsai. While the centre in Itanagar is already functional, a MoU was signed for setting up a centre and planetarium at Namsai on December 18 last year. The people of the eastern and western parts of the state will benefit from these centres and planestate science and technology secretary R Ronya said after the pact.

NCSM deputy director general Samarendra Kumar said it has so far developed 23 science centres and handed them over to different state and UT governments.

## UNC urges Union home minister to reinstate FMR

SENAPATI, Jan 19: The United Naga Council (UNC) has urged Union home minister, Amit Shah to re-instate the Free Movement Regime (FMR) at Tusom-Somrah Sector along the Indo Myanmar border in Ukhrul district of Manipur and other impacted Naga areas vis-à-vis halting the approved proposal for construction of Indo-Myanmar border fencing/wall along the borders in Naga areas.

In a memorandum submitted to the Union home minister on Friday through the Senapati district deputy commissioner, the UNC said the Indo-Myanmar borders were delimited and demarcated by two bilateral Agreement between India and Myanmar on March 10, 1967, by dividing many ethnic tribal communities along the artificial/imaginary line drawn without the informed consent of the villagers and thus relegated to the status of ethnic minorities on both sides of the borders.

To address their concerns and enable close interaction amongst these ethnic minorities, India and Myanmar Government established the Free Movement Regime which had been in place since 1970s, with periodic revision, the last being in January 2018 as part of the Narendra Modi Government's Act East Policy to safeguard the traditional rights of the largely tribal communities residing along the borders keeping in mind the traditional social relations. It also aimed to facilitate trade relations between the kindred tribes on both sides that permit those residing along the border to travel 16 km on either side of the unfenced boundary without visa restrictions for 72 hours with valid permits issued by the designated authorities on either



sides, the UNC memorandum pointed out. The Naga body also said the scrapping of

FMR in recent times at Tusom-Somrah sectors along the Indo-Myanmar border in Ukhrul district (Naga ancestral domains) and other Naga districts stretching from the north of Moreh town to Nagaland state has severed social and cultural ties during this festive season. There have been incidents of emergency health issues, educational tour, seasonal livelihood activities, marriages, funerals, cultivation and economic activities, it added

The UNC further said the Tangkhul Naga, Anal Naga, Moyon Naga and Lamkang Naga who are scattered in few districts of Manipur state have a sizeable Naga population in Myanmar's Sagaing region.

"However, historical border delineations influenced more by political considerations than ethnic bonding during the British colonial era

resulted in the dispersion of Naga people across the international boundaries," the Naga body

The UNC then said Nagas are not convinced that ending Free Movement Regime will serve any purpose due to the fact that there is neither a case of smuggling of arms and drugs nor influx of illegal immigrants in Naga areas on both

The memorandum of the UNC to the Union home minister also said the approved Indo Myanmar border fencing supposedly framed to be constructed in 'Naga dominated areas' measuring about 80 km stretch in Tengnoupal and Chandel districts is an apparent violation of international environmental laws such as convention on migratory species, which requires migratory routes to be protected. These border fences not only affect people, but can also have unintended but important consequences for wild life, inter alia by curtailing migrations and other movements by fragmenting populations and by causing direct mortality to large carnivores and herbivores, the UNC further said.

According to the UNC, the "lop-sided narrative" of the Union government and the Manipur government for ending the FMR and the approved proposals for construction of Indo-Myanmar border fencing/wall along the border in "Naga dominated areas" has displeased many frontier communities. While attempting to address the influx of illegal immigrants through the porous borders, state and union Government many find other mechanism to curb the menace instead of scrapping FMR and construction of wall and fencing, the UNC stated. In a letter to the secretary of the committee on one nation, one election, he requested former president Ram Nath Kovind, who heads the panel, "not to allow his persona and the office of the former president of India to be abused by the Union government to subvert the constitution and parliamentary democ-

racy in this country" "The Indian National Congress is strongly opposed to the very idea of 'One Nation, One Election'. For the sake of maintaining a thriving and a robust democracy, it is imperative that the entire idea must be abandoned and the high-powered committee dissolved," Kharge said in his letter to Niten Chandra, the secretary of the committee.

His letter came in response to



Chandra's letter on October 18 whereby he had invited suggestions for consideration of the committee.

He said the committee seems to have "already made up its mind and seeking a consultation seems to be an eye wash".

"The government, parliament and ECI should work together to ensure people's mandate is respected rather than divert people's attention by talking about undemocratic ideas like simultaneous elections," Kharge said.

He said the composition of the committee is "biased" as it was formed without giving substantial representation to the Opposition parties that head various state governments that would be affected by the recommendations of this comby no less than the former President of India, it is distressing when even common voters feel the consultations of the committee are likely to be a pretence since minds have already been made up. Firm views in support of the proposal have already been expressed in public and a dispassionate analysis of pros and cons is not being attempted in a serious and systematic manner," the Congress chief said in

his response. He said that in the last 10 years the only instances where the chief ministers have lost the confidence of the house have been when one particular party has abused the government machinery at its disposal and subverted the anti-defection law to "steal" people's mandate.

"There is no place for the concept of simultaneous elections in a country that has adopted a Parliamentary system of government. Such forms of simultaneous elections that are being floated by the government go against the guarantees of federalism contained in the Constitution," Kharge asserted.

"The holding of simultaneous elections would require the dissolution of several legislative assemblies which are still halfway (or less) through their terms. This would be a betrayal of the electorate in those states," the Congress chief claimed

He said the chief minister or the prime minister holds office for as long as he or she enjoys the confidence of the house and if a chief minister loses confidence of the house and no other party is able to form a government.

But the Niti Aayog report says the state should be put under President's Rule till fresh elections can be synchronized, according to Kharge. "This would be a travesty of democracy'

Kharge said he was amused to hear the argument that holding simultaneous elections will result in financial savings. "The argument that cost of conducting elections are extremely high seems baseare less than 0.02 per cent of the total Union budget for the preceding five years. Noting that expenses for assembly elections may also be similar percentage of their state budgets, he said, "We feel the people will be willing to consider this small amount as the cost of free and fair elections to uphold democracy." He said expenditure on 2014 elections was Rs 3.870 crores which the committee claims is

"If the committee, the government and ECI are serious about the expenditure made on elections, it would be more appropriate if they could make the funding process more transparent, especially in the matter of electoral bonds. This would truly empower the voter and increase voter awareness," he said.

He also said that the committee is relying on the Niti Aayog report, which is neither a constitutional nor a statutory body and the high level committee should not have referred to it. Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Maan, Rajya Sabha member Sandeep Pathak, AAP's Goa unit chief Amit Palekar, MLA Venzy Viegas were also present on the occasion. Kejriwal further said that AAP has been doing "kam ki raineeti" (politics of work).

"No one did politics of work in the past because their intention was only to make money for themselves," he said. Adding that the Delhi government successfully runs 550 mohalla clinics.

"These clinics have become a facility of neighbourhood clinic for the people to treat their basic ailments like cold, fever, etc. These are air-conditioned clinics and you get a good facility there," the Delhi CM said. Kejriwal also expressed surprise over Benaulim MLA Viegas starting three mohalla clinics in his constituency despite the AAP being in the opposition.

"We can understand that we could do it in Delhi and Punjab as we are in power there. But in Goa, despite being in opposition, Venzy opened these clinics. I enquired with him and he told me that these clinics work on donation basis," the AAP leader said.

It is the duty of the state government to provide basic health facilities, he said. (PTI)

# UDF rejects joint strike call against central govt; CPI(M) hits back

**19:** The first image of the Ram Lalla idol became public on Friday, three days before the 'pran pratishtha' ceremony here on January 22.

The statue carved in black stone has its eyes covered with a vellow cloth and is adorned with a garland of roses, Sharad Sharma, an office-bearer of the Vishva Hindu Parishad told PTI.

In the picture released by VHP, Ram Lalla is in a standing posture.

On Thursday afternoon, the new idol of Lord Ram was placed in the sanctum sanctorum of the Ram Janmabhoomi temple, ahead of the consecration ceremony.

The 51-inch idol of Lord Ram as a child, sculpted by Mysuru-based sculptor Arun Yogiraj, was brought to the temple on Wednesday night. This was done amid chanting of prayers, according to the Shri Ram Janmbhoomi Teerth Kshetra

Dixit said the 'pradhan sankalp' was performed by Anil Mishra, a member of the trust.

"The idea behind the 'pradhan sankalp' is that the 'pratishtha' of Lord Ram is being done for the



welfare of all, for the welfare of the nation, for the welfare of humanity and also for those who contributed to this work (re-

lated to the temple).

"Apart from this, other rituals were also performed, 'Vastras' were also given to Brahmins and work has been assigned to everyone," he said.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will attend the January 22 consecration ceremony at the Ram temple, which is expected to be opened to the public the next day. Temple trust general

secretary Champat Rai had told reporters here on Monday that the consecration ceremony will begin at 12:20 pm and is expected to be completed by 1 pm on January 22. Rituals leading to the

temple. Meanwhile, deputy chief minister Brajesh Pathak said Ram Lalla has been installed in the temple and the entire country is awaiting the consecration ceremony.

"Ramlalla has been installed in the temple. All arrangements, including that of infrastructure, medical facilities and medicines have been made," Pathak told PTI.

Anticipating a huge influx of devotees, the Health Department has intensified its preparations. Dr Sanjay Jain, Chief

Medical Officer (CMO) of Ayodhya, said the department is collaborating with the Shri Ram Mandir Teerth Kshetra trust to establish first aid units at 16 key locations within the event area.

He said the first aid units will have a doctor, pharmacist and a ward boy. They are strategically planned for crowded locations such as the Saket Petrol Pump, Kanak Bhawan and Hanuman

Each unit will be equipped with necessary medical supplie, including medicines, a nebulizer, oxygen facilities and the capability to conduct blood sugar tests. Additionally, the Health Department is establishing two hospitals with capacities of 10 and 20 beds respectively, where doctors will be available to attend patients.

Besides, arrangements for 40 ambulances are also being made, which will be stationed at various important locations in Ayodhya.

The Health Department has reserved 190 beds for emergency situations in the district's medical college, Shri Ram Chikitsalaya Ayodhya, District Hospital Ayodhya, Mahila District Hospital and Kumarganj Hospital.

During the consecration ceremony, if anyone faces a medical emergency, they will be initially taken to the two hospitals set up in the event area for treatment. If their condition does not improve, they will be referred to the Shri Ram Hospital. (PTI)

## 75<sup>th</sup> Republic Day parade to be women-centric

NEW DELHI, Jan 19: The 75th Republic Day celebrations at the majestic Kartavya Path on January 26 will largely be "women-centric" with the central theme of India's democracy and its resolve to become a developed nation. In a first, the parade will be heralded by 100 women artists with Indian musical instruments, Defence Secretary Giridhar Aramane said on Friday.

The parade will also witness an allwomen tri-services contingent marching down the ceremonial boulevard for the first time, and the central armed police forces contingents will also consist of women per-

"The best representation of women will be seen in this year's Republic Day parade," the defence secretary told reporters.

A 95-member marching team and 33-member band contingent from France will also take part in the parade. Along with the aircraft of the Indian Air Force, one Multi Role Tanker Transport (MRTT) aircraft and two Rafale fighter jets of the French Air Force will participate in the fly-past, Aramane said.

French President Emmanuel Macron will be the chief guest at the Republic Day celebrations.

"With the themes of 'Viksit Bharat' and 'Bharat -- Loktantra ki Matruka', the 75th Republic Day Parade at Kartavva Path on January 26 will be women-centric," he said.

Aramane said women marching contingents will form the major chunk of the parade, with most of the tableaux of states and Union Territories (UTs) and Central ministries showcasing the country's rich cultural diversity, unity and progress.

The themes have been selected in line with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's views that 'India is truly a mother of democracy', he said.

In another unique initiative, the Ministry of Culture will be showcasing 'Anant Sutra -- The Endless Thread' textile installation at Kartavva Path.

It will be installed behind the spectators seated in the enclosures. Anant Sutra is a visually-stunning tribute to the saree, India's timeless gift to the world of fashion.

This unique installation will showcase nearly 1,900 sarees and drapes from every corner of the country, mounted at a height with wooden frames, Aramane said.

It will have QR codes which can be scanned to know the details about weaving and embroidery arts used in it. Around 13,000 "special guests" have also been invited to witness the parade this year.

The defence secretary said the objective is to provide an opportunity to the people from all walks of life to take part in the national festival, in line with the government's vision of 'Jan Bhagidari'.

These 'special guests' will include best performers in various fields and those who made best use of various schemes of the government such as Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana, PM Ujiwala Yojana, PM Street Vendor's Aatmanirbhar Nidhi (PM SVANidhi), PM Krishi Sinchayee Yojana, PM Fasal Bima Yojana and PM Vishwakarma Yojana among others.

Women space scientists of ISRO, yoga teachers (Ayushman Bharat), winners of international sports events and paralympic medalists will also attend the parade as special guests.

Aramane said that given their tough livelihood, special emphasis was laid to include people from 'vibrant villages' in the border areas in

the list of special guests. A total 16 tableaux from states and Union Territories and from central ministries and departments will roll down the Kartavya Path during the

The states and Union Territories are: Arunachal Pradesh, Haryana, Manipur, Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan, Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh, Ladakh, Tamil Nadu, Gujarat, Meghalaya, Jharkhand, Uttar Pradesh and Telangana.

Like each year, the tableaux have been selected by an expert committee comprising eminent persons in the fields of art, culture, painting, sculpture, music, architecture, choreogra-

Aramane said to address the concerns of some states and Union Territories over the non-inclusion of their tableaux, the defence ministry has devised a unique three-year roll-over

The plan ensures equitable participation of the states and the Union Territories on a rotational basis over

a period of three years. The total seating capacity at the celebrations will be 77,000 out of which 42,000 seats are being reserved

for the general public. The parade will start at 1030 hours and run for a duration of approximately 90 minutes.

## 'We miss them': Muslim neighbours yearn for return of Kashmiri Pandits

SRINAGAR, Jan 19: A garden looks beautiful with colourful flowers. Would it look as nice if we plant only white flowers?" A fraillooking old man poses the question as he goes for Friday prayers at a mosque in Srinagar's Habba Kadal locality.

For Mohammad Yousuf Khan, Kashmiri Pandits are the flowers that brought colour and life to the garden he calls home: Habba Kadal in Shahar e Khaas. Khan and other residents of Habba Kadal believe the idea of

Kashmiriyat is incomplete without

the neighbours they lost three

decades ago but still long for. "We

used to eat from one plate. We will

be more than happy if they return.


We miss them," says Shafeeqa, a resident. Habba Kadal is where Khan grew up and still lives there in his mid-sixties. The locality was an example in communal harmony and brotherhood for decades. It was a place where Bhajans and hymns in temples and sermons and Azaans in Masjids would rent the

However, in early nineties, the soothing music of devotional songs was replaced by gunshots as terror activities picked up.

January 19 marks the day of the exodus of the Kashmiri Pandit community from the region, driven out of their homeland following the outbreak of terrorism in the

"We used to live together, eat together. In fact, we still are living here with our Pandit brothers. There's no difference. We are living happily. On one side of this lane, there's a temple and on the other side, there's a mosque. We are all humans. Anyone who hurts a person hurts the entire humanity," says Khan.

Recalling the proverbial good old times, he says that the KPs and



Muslims shared a strong bond of

love and respect for each other. "In earlier times, we would be carefree. We used to visit temples on festivals. They used to come to greet us. We really miss them," he

The exodus day is a significant day that commemorates the forced displacement of the Kashmiri Pandit community from the Kashmir Valley. It serves as a reminder of the hardships and challenges faced by the community during that

Among a handful of KPs living in Srinagar is Sunil who stayed back on the reassurance of his Muslim neighbours. He refuses to give in to terror threats.

"I have been living here since my birth. We did not leave our motherland or migrate outside. I lived here, studied here, got married and have kids now," says

Sunil, with a smile on his face. However, the glow from his face gradually disappears when he recalls the times of mass exodus to the plains of Jammu and other

parts of the country. "God's best gift to mankind is life and if you feel there's a threat,

you try to run for your life. Those who were affected, they did the same. But we stayed back," says Sunil

"We had the support of our local Muslim brothers. Even today, we celebrate festivals, weddings together. Recently, we had a wedding outside Kashmir which was attended by our Muslim neighbours as well. We are for them in our tough times and they are for us," he says.

Sunil is optimistic that with the changing situation in the Valley, the time is not far when the displaced members of his community will return and live happily with their Muslim brethren. "We miss those who left us here.

We feel alone because we don't have any relatives here. Our community got scattered throughout the world. A day will come when these empty houses will be full of life again. Our Kashmiri Pandits will return and life will be normal again," he adds.

The loss and longing of the KP community members also bothers the members of the majority community. The Muslims in Habba Kadal locality yearn to see their

neighbours return to their abandoned houses and bring back the golden times

Khursheed Ahmed Bhat, a local, lives next to an abandoned Kashmiri Pandit house "I shifted here 20 years ago and since then, it's deserted. Sometimes, the family members come to see their house Once I met a family member and I suggested to him that they return but he said they are already settled out of Kashmir now and don't see returning as an option," he told

"It is their wish. But I would appreciate it if they return. We already have two-three Pandit families living here and it would be nice if they return to their homes. We will feel happy. As per the family, this house has twentyfive rooms. It's a big one. They can renovate it and live peacefully here," he added.

The residents of Habba Kadal believe that the idea of Kashmiriyat is incomplete without the presence of Kashmiri Pandits and they want them to return soon. The government has also taken steps to rehabilitate these displaced community members.

"If Kashmiri Pandits return here, we will welcome them with open arms. It's our moral duty to stand shoulder-to-shoulder with them. We will help them renovate their spaces. We had such great relationships. We used to eat from one plate. We will be more than happy if they return. We miss them," says Shafeeqa.

According to official data, 90,000-100,000 Pandits of an estimated population of 120,000-140,000 fled the Valley between January and March 1990. The government has launched a major crackdown to retrieve the properties of KPs encroached upon by people over the last three decades.

# WANT TO COLLABORATE WHO VALUE ME: VIVEK OBEROI



MUMBAI, Jan 19: Sometimes it is frustrating to wait for good projects but Vivek Oberoi says he is confident about his craft and wants to collaborate only with people who value his contribution.

The actor, known for movies such as "Company", "Saathiya", "Yuva", "Omkara", "Shootout at Lokhandwala", "Krrish 3" and OTT series "Inside Edge", will next be seen in Rohit Shetty's streaming debut, "The Indian Police Force". Oberoi said since he is not dependent on acting to pay his bills, he wants to do projects that challenge him.

"It's frustrating to wait, and it's like, 'Somebody get me something exciting to do'... I don't think you get work by networking, lobbying, and going to parties. That's not the way want to work. I want work like how Rohit called me, valued me and said, 'Give it your best'. That respect is essential for me. I'm not somebody jo katora leke jayega aur bolega kaam dedo, mere paas kaam nahi hai' (I am not someone who will go begging for work)," Oberoi told PTI in an interview.

The actor said he has made "some wrong and good choices" along the way in his journey as a performer, but going forward, he wants to be "authentic" in what he does. "If I don't have work, I'll sit at home, I'll do something creative. It is not out of ego, it is out of respect for my art. If somebody needs me, they will reach out. I've good relations with many people, they are always a phone call away, and when they call me, 'I say, okay' (if I like it)," he said.

The 47-year-old actor plays the role of a cop named Vikram Bakshi in Shetty's series that also features Sidharth Malhotra and Shilpa Shetty. He describes his character as an aggressive, passionate and caring man. Billed as an ode to the police force, the

Prime Video series has started streaming on Prime Video. Oberoi said Shetty wrote the role keeping

him in mind, which motivated him to give his best. "It's the most beautiful form of praise an actor can receive," Oberoi said, adding, it also challenged him, "I was like, 'I better perform on every single scene.'

He said he thoroughly enjoyed working

with Shetty, who he said is very "focused". "He doesn't dwell, on sets he is quick, if he gets what he wants, he moves to the next. He is very focused. On the second or third day, there was an important scene, which required performance, I did it and asked if he needed one more take, but he didn't', rather he praised me. I felt so appreciated and loved. In the end he said, 'Aapka ration card bann gaya. This means you are part of Rohit Shetty Picturez.'

Oberoi also praised directors like Rakesh Roshan and Shaad Ali for writing characters keeping him in mind whether it was the antagonist's role in "Krrish 3" or the lover boy in "Saathiya". "'Saathiya' was contrary to my previous film, 'Company'. It was a different character and Shaad kept telling me, 'I see you in it'. 'Munnabhai MBBS", Saif Ali Khan-starrer "Hum Tum", "Bunty or Babli", featuring Abhishek Bachchan and Shah Rukh Khanfronted "Om Shanti Om", for various reasons.

"With Raju Hirani it was not a rejection on the level of script but it was because of dates. "It aimed to mirror life's journey, where we learn that obstacles can be overcome with sheer willpower... In our sincere attempt to share a positive message. we may have inadvertently caused hurt," Nayanthara wrote.

"Annapoorani" featured the 39year-old actor star as a young woman who aims to become the best chef in the country but in order to realise her dream, she has to cook non-vegetarian food.

Directed by Nilesh Krishnaa, the movie was released in theatres in December last year, before it

started streaming on Netflix four weeks later. Last week, the movie kicked up a row after two complaints were filed against Nayanthara and the makers over allegations that certain scenes in the film hurt the religious sentiments of Hindus.

The complaints alleged that the film makes controversial remarks about Lord Ram and also promotes 'love jihad'. Amid the controversy, the film was removed from Netflix by the makers.

In her post, Nayanthara said the team wanted to share a positive message and never expected that the movie, which was showcased in theatres, would be removed


from a streaming platform. "My team and I never intended

# Uncertain future awaits coach Schopman after India's failure to qualify for Olympics

RANCHI, Jan 19: Indian women's hockey team coach Janneke Schopman's future was thrown into uncertainty after the side's failure to qualify for the 2024 Paris Olympics here on Friday. The Indian team's Olympic qualification dream came crashing down with a 0-1 loss to Japan in the third-place match of FIH Qualifiers. Kana Urata's sixth minute penalty corner strike turned out to be the winner for Japan. "I think we were mentally ready after yesterday's loss against Germany. We didn't start well defensively and that sometimes can happen. Again, as a team we fought back, we dominated the entire game after the opening goal,"

Schopman said after the match.

We needed to score goals but we didn't. If I would know the answer why we didn't, then I won't be standing here, I would have given them the answer during the game,"

The top three sides from this tournament qualified for the Olympics. By finishing third, Japan sealed their place and will join Germany and USA in Paris.

Asked about her future with the Indian team, Schopman said: That I don't know." The Dutch coach's contract was till Paris Olympics and it remains to be seen whether Hockey India extends her stint after the disappointing result.



Schopman was Sioerd Mariine's assistant at the Tokyo Olympics, where the Indian women finished a creditable fourth. Schopman said contrary to the final result, India were by far the dominant side against Japan. The Indians wasted chances galore, including nine penalty corners. The coach praised the fighting spirit of her side. "They were trying, they were fighting. We were dominant against Japan in the last three games we played against them. This time, we didn't score and in the past games, we scored.

"Japan goalkeeper made two mistakes yesterday. Germany got 15 penalty corners but didn't score. Their penalty corner defence is

good. We didn't execute perfectly." Schopman was also critical of a few umpiring decisions on Friday.

"The umpires were also giving a little bit mixed signals. We were pushed off the ball. They got penalty corners outside the circle and the same stuff happened with us in the third quarter, and we didn't get it. The girls are trying, but it's ife," she said.

She said the failure to qualify for the quadrennial extravaganza will hurt them for a long time.

"Now it's so fresh after the game. This tournament has been a rollercoaster. This is our fifth match in seven days. But I think we showed up and tried. This is going to hurt for a long time.

"We have to watch the Olympics on the TV. We know we wanted to be there and, to be completely honest, we have the quality to be there. We should have been there, but we are not, so that hurts," Schopman said. India captain Savita said the failure to take their chances cost them a place in the Games.

"We got many, many chances and penalty corners, but we failed. We didn't give up, we kept on trying. It really hurts. We now can't compensate that," a teary-eyed Savita said.

"I have nothing to say, I am short of words. We deserved to go to the Olympics but...Japan also deserved and they are going. (PTI)
