State flood scene grim, Kejriwal to remain in jail after HC bail stay

over 2.5 lakh people hit Priyanka urges Assam govt to intensify flood relief efforts

GUWAHATI, June 21: Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi appealed to the Assam government on Friday to expedite relief and rescue operations for the flood-affected people in the state and provide compensation to the families of the deceased.

Her statement follows the devastating flood situation in Assam, which has affected over four lakh

people across multiple districts. Taking to the micro-blogging site X, Gandhi expressed concern over reports of floods severely disrupting normal life in Assam.

"The news of 36 people losing their lives in this disaster so far is heart-wrenching. Several lakh people in 19 districts of the state are grappling with the aftermath of floods. I appeal to the state government to accelerate relief and rescue operations and ensure compensation for the families of the deceased," said the Congress general

Gandhi also called upon Con-



tend all possible assistance to the affected people.

Meanwhile, reports indicate that several major rivers, including the Kopili, Barak, and Kushiyara, have been flowing above the danger level since Thursday evening.

Additional Solicitor General (ASG) S V Raju, representing the ED, contended that the trial court's order was "perverse", "one-sided" and "wrong-sided" and that the findings were based on irrelevant facts. The relevant facts, he

claimed, were not considered by the special judge.

"Material were not considered by the trial court. There cannot be a better case for cancellation of bail than this one. There cannot be greater perversity

than this," he argued. Seeking a stay on the trial

court's order, he contended that the ED was not given adequate opportunity to argue its case.

The application for stay was vehemently opposed by senior advocates Abhishek Singhvi and Vikram Chaudhari, representing Kejriwal. They said Article 21 (protection of life and personal liberty) of the Constitution does not exist for the ED for which the liberty (CONTD. ON PAGE-2)

#### ABC DOCUMENTARY It contains blatant untruths: India

NEW DELHI, June 21: India on Friday described as "blatant untruths" the content of a documentary made by ABC News that claimed to uncover alleged attempts of Indian intelligence agents to interfere in Australia's "national security"

External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said the documentary appeared to serve a particular agenda to "malign" India.

"The documentary contains blatant untruths, is biased and reflects unprofessional reporting. It appears to serve a particular agenda to malign India," he said at his weekly media briefing.

"We obviously oppose any such attempts to condone, justify and even glorify terrorism," he said.

In the documentary, the ABC (Australian Broadcasting Corporation) News claimed to "uncover the long arm of the Indian state" in Australia and even accused Indian intelligence agents of targeting the Indian diaspora in that country.

The documentary, titled "Infiltrating Australia -? India's Secret War", also alleged that Indian intelligence agents tried to gain access to sensitive defence technology and airport security protocols.

In April, Australian media reported that Canberra expelled two Indian spies in 2020 for allegedly trying to "steal secrets" about sensitive (CONTD. ON PAGE-2)



NEW DELHI, June 21: India ranks third in the growth rate of women researchers, according to a report from scientific information disseminator Elsevier, which also underlined that gender equality in the domain remains "unacceptably far away" globally. At two per cent, India's yearly

growth rate of women's share of active researchers over the last decade was the third highest, behind Egypt and The Netherlands only, the report titled 'Progress Towards Gender Equality in Research and Innovation - 2024 Review'

Analysing inclusion and diversity across disciplines and geographies over 20 years, the report found that in India, women now make up 33 per cent of active researchers, compared to 22 per cent in Japan and 30 per cent in Egypt. India is now the world's third largest research producing country,

gender equity efforts and are truly encouraging," said Prof Sandeep Sancheti, vice president of Research Relations & Academic Affairs at Elsevier India.

## Zepto valued at USD 3.6 bn in latest fund raise; eyes IPO

**NEW DELHI, June 21:** Grocery delivery startup Zepto on Friday said it has raised USD 665 million in an investment round that valued the firm at USD 3.6 billion, almost triple of what it was worth a year back, and is preparing to list soon.

The fund raise will help Zepto compete with e-commerce giant Amazon, Zomato-owned Blinkit, and homegrown firms such as Swiggy's Instamart and Tata Group's BigBasket in the hypercompetitive grocery delivery space that is marred by high investments and low margins.

The three-year-old startup raised USD 665 million from new investors, including New York-based private equity firm Avenir Growth Capital, venture firm Lightspeed, and Avra Capital, a new fund started by former Y Combinator Continuity head Anu Hariharan and Andreessen Horowitz. Existing investors including Glade Brook, Nexus, and StepStone Group also participated, the Mumbai-based firm said in a statement.

Aadit Palicha, 21, who cofounded Zepto with childhood friend Kaivalya Vohra in 2021 after dropping out of Stanford's computer science programme and returning to India, said the company's gross merchandise value, or the value of total transactions through the platform, has "multiplied year-on-year to a base of USD 1 billion", and over 75 per cent of its 341 dark stores are profitable at a core operating level. Zepto is "pretty close" to be-

### State flood scene grim, over

Meteorological forecasts predict light to moderate rain across most parts of Assam in the coming days, with isolated areas expected to experience thunderstorms, lightning, and heavy downpours. Karimganj remains the worst affected, with over 2.5 lakh people impacted, followed by Darrang and Tamulpur, officials reported.

The death toll from this year's floods, landslides, and storms has risen to 36. To accommodate the affected population, more than 100 relief camps have been set up, providing shelter to over 14,000 individuals. Officials also noted significant damage to embankments, roads, and bridges in the affected districts due to floodwaters. (With PTI inputs)

of a person figured low in priority. Singhvi said the ED argued for 3 hours and 45 minutes before the trial judge. "This matter lasted for five hours (before the trial court). Nearly 3 hours 45 minutes were taken by Mr. Raju and then trial judge is faulted because she does not repeat every comma and full stop," he said.

During the arguments, Raju said after the order was passed, when the ED lawyers urged the trial court to keep its order in abeyance for 48 hours to enable them to approach superior courts, the prayer was not consid-

"I was not allowed to argue fully. I was not given proper time of 2-3 days to file written submissions. This is not done. On merits, I have an excellent case. The trial court said finish off in half an hour as it wanted to deliver the judgment. It did not give us full opportunity to argue the case," he contended, adding, "I am making the allegations with full seriousness.

Section 45 of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) says an opportunity must be granted to the public prosecutor to present his case but that opportunity was not granted to me, he contended.

He said the trial court did not even look at his reply on the ground that it was bulky and claimed that the trial court came to a conclusion that there was malafide on ED's part after considering wrong facts and wrong dates. Raju contended that the trial court has given findings which are contrary to those of the high court while upholding Kejriwal's arrest.

"If irrelevant facts are considered, that itself is a reason for cancellation of bail. There is evidence that Kejriwal demanded ₹ 100 crore but it was not considered by trial court," he argued.

"End to end money trail was given by us," he asserted, adding that proceeds of crime were utilised in the Goa assembly poll campaign by the AAP.

"We have made AAP an accused in the money laundering case and the offences thus are covered by section 70 of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), which deals with companies. The ED had likened AAP to a company and Kejriwal its director," Raju argued.

Singhvi urged the court not to stay Kejriwal's bail order and said it may send him back to jail later if it finds overwhelming and cogent circumstances.

He also questioned the probe agency's "unfortunate" attempt to malign the judge (by claiming she did not give the ED enough time to argue and did not consider material evidence).

There is misconception about what a bail hearing should be like. Just because there is a political antagonism involved and that if all the commas etc are not dealt with by the judge, it gives Mr. Raju the right to malign the judge. This whole approach is deplorable and sad. It should never have come from a government authority," Singhyi argued. Chaudhari submitted that Kejriwal had surrendered to the jail authorities on expiry of the in-

terim bail period which showed his bonafide conduct. "If he is out with conditions imposed by the court, what is the prejudice. He is not a terrorist that he will harm the society if he is let out. What will happen if the chief minister of the state comes out on bail?" he argued. The trial court, in its bail order, held that prima facie Kejriwal's guilt was yet to be established and that the ED failed to furnish direct evidence linking him to the proceeds of crime in the money laundering case.

### Sensex falls 269 points as L&T, RIL weigh

Markets halt record-breaking rally



MUMBAI, June 21: Halting their record-breaking rally, equity benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty buckled under selling pressure on Friday as investors pared exposure to oil & gas, capital goods and FMCG stocks amid a bearish trend in global mar-

However, recent foreign capital inflows and buying in index majors Bharti Airtel, Infosys and TCS helped indices restrict the losses, traders said.

Snapping its six-day rally, the 30share BSE Sensex declined 269.03 points or 0.35 per cent to settle at 77,209.90. During the day, it tanked 676.93 points or 0.87 per cent to

The Nifty rose 100.1 points to hit a record intraday peak of 23,667.10 earlier in the day. However, it failed to maintain the momentum and slipped 65.90 points or 0.28 per cent to end at 23,501.10.

On the weekly front, the BSE benchmark climbed 217.13 points or 0.28 per cent, while the Nifty went up

of those active, with a strong representation in health sciences. They added that while women have made gains in the last two decades, the progress has not been uniform across fields. For example, in physical sciences women made up only 33 per cent of the active researchers.

At the current rate, the authors of the report noted that globally, gender equality in research remains "unacceptably far away". They projected that although numbers of women researchers in mathematics, engineering and computer science are increasing, gender parity overall is not expected until 2052.

Women also filed "vastly fewer" patent applications than men, the authors said.

"As of 2022, three-quarters of patent applications came are filed either by men alone or by teams consisting only of men. Nearly, all patent filing teams (97 per cent) have at least one man in them. In contrast, just three per cent of patent applications as of 2022 are filed by teams consisting only of women," the authors wrote. Regionally too, women's participation in the research workforce was found to differ with those in countries

including Portugal and Brazil making up about half of the active researchers, and those in the US and the UK making up 40 per cent of the active researchers. The report said that among active researchers working on the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals, women formed the majority. There were also slightly more women than men engaging in multidisciplinary research, considered important for solving complex challenges at the global level, it said. (PTI)

"In Delhi markets, spot gold prices (24 carats) are trading at ₹ 73,350 per 10 grams, up by ₹ 800 from the previous close," Saumil Gandhi, Research Analyst at HDFC Securities, said. In the global markets, spot gold at Comex was trading at USD 2,360 per ounce, up USD 28

from the previous close. Gold climbed on Friday, boosted by weaker-than-expected US macro data, which raised the possibility that the US Federal Reserve will cut interest rates at least twice in 2024, Gandhi added. (PTI)

### Kejriwal's fight against political vendetta

The ongoing legal and political turmoil surrounding Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal has taken another dramatic turn. At the heart of this saga is Sunitha Kejriwal, his steadfast wife, who has become the face of the resistance against what she claims to be a politically motivated conspiracy led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. The accusations from the AAP are serious. Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Singh, also embroiled in legal troubles, blamed the BJP for exacerbating Delhi's water crisis, claiming political sabotage. This narrative feeds into the broader perception of a vindictive federal administration leveraging state mechanisms to undermine opposition

The implications of these events are profound. If the High Court overturns the lower court's decision and denies bail, Arvind Kejriwal could face an extended period of incarceration, plunging the AAP into deeper crisis. Conversely, a favorable ruling would bolster the party's morale and lend credence to their claims of political persecution. Sunitha Kejriwal's prominence in this battle reflects the extraordinary circumstances. Her role is not merely supportive but pivotal, as she navigates the complex interplay of legal strategies and public relations. Her involvement ensures that Kejriwal's leadership remains symbolically intact, even as he faces unprecedented challenges. As the legal and political drama unfolds, the resilience of Arvind and Sunitha Kejriwal will be tested. The outcome of this high-stakes confrontation will not only determine Keiriwal's immediate future but also shape the contours of opposition politics in India. For now, Sunitha Kejriwal remains a symbol of defiance and an embodiment of the fight against what many in the AAP see as an unjust and politically motivated assault on their leader.

### Modi's geopolitical gambit: Renaming Tibetan territories

n a striking geopolitical maneuver, the Indian government has announced plans to rename approximately thirty locations within China's Tibet Autonomous Region. This assertive of Modi's electoral appeal. Benu response follows China's recurrent practice of renaming places in Arunachal Pradesh, India, with Chinese characters, a move widely seen as part of Beijing's strategy to bolster its territorial claims.

The initiative, spearheaded by the Indian Army's Information Warfare Division, is poised to be unveiled shortly, marking a significant statement by the newly re-elected government of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. The renaming exercise has been meticulously planned, with extensive research into the historical significance of the targeted locations. The selected names reflect ancient Indian nomenclature and have garnered support from the local Tibetan population, who have long dismissed the Chinese-imposed names.

This action comes on the heels of Beijing's recent renaming of thirty locations in Arunachal

Pradesh, encompassing residential settlements. mountains rivers, and other

graphical features. China's tactic, which began in 2017, has seen successive lists released in 2021 and 2023, with the latest list in March 2024 provoking a diplo-

matic outcry from New Delhi. External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar's response was unequivocal: "This is not a new issue. China has laid claim, it has expanded its claim. The claims are ludicrous to begin with and remain ludicrous today." His remarks underscore India's steadfast rejection of Beijing's naming policies, framing them as part of a broader strategy to challenge China's territorial assertions.

The backdrop to this renaming saga includes Prime Minister Modi's visit to Arunachal Pradesh in March 2024, during which he inaugurated the Sela Tunnel, a strategic infrastructure project at an altitude of 13,000 feet. Beijing's diplomatic protest against this visit, amplified through international media, further strained Sino-Indian rela-

As the Modi administration embarks on this renaming campaign, it seeks to reinforce its strongman image, a cornerstone Ghosh, a former Intelligence Bureau officer, noted that "PM Modi sought to win these polls on the strength of his strongman image. It is natural he will authorize the renaming of Tibetan places to live up to that image."

The Indian Army's Information Warfare Division has been pivotal in this endeavor, working with top Indian institutes to validate the historical and cultural basis of the new names. This effort aims to craft a robust counter-narrative to China's claims, bolstered by both scholarly research and the testimonies of local residents affirming their allegiance to India.

Media tours organized in the disputed regions have spotlighted local support for India's stance, with residents expressing their rejection of Chinese names. An Indian military officer emphasized the strategic goal: "The ultimate target is to push through

The impending release of the new names is expected to provoke a sharp reaction from Beijing, potentially escalating tensions along the already contentious Line of Actual Control (LAC). Defense experts caution that this bold move by New Delhi is likely to revive the Tibetan dispute, further complicating Sino-Indian relations.

However, the true significance of this challenge lies in the realms of both traditional and cutting-edge scientific endeavors. Seasoned industry analysts sound the alarm bell, cautioning that Chinese legacy chip manufacturers could replicate this playbook, rendering the rest of the world alarmingly reliant on China for these indispensable compo-

The Indian fabs will be entering an already oversaturated market, flooded with an abundance of inexpensive Chinese chips. As utilization rates for legacy fabs plummet and profit margins shrink, the newly constructed Indian facilities will find it exceedingly arduous to remain competitive, even with governmental support. China's current and projected production capacity for legacy chips dwarfs that of India, with major facilities expected to commence operations by 2025-2026. The sheer scale of China's integrated circuit (IC) output is staggering, having surged by an astonishing 40 percent, reaching an unprecedented 98.1 billion units. When the numbers are scrutinized, it becomes evident that India faces an uphill battle in its endeavor to establish a formidable presence in the legacy chip market, given

unrelenting commitment to dominating this crucial sector.

The infiltration of Chinesemanufactured microchips into critical Indian infrastructure systems raises alarming national security concerns. Investigative reports have uncovered a disconcerting practice whereby more than a dozen Indian companies have been illicitly supplying the government with Chinese-origin microchips, in contravention of established procurement regulations. The potential presence of these undisclosed Chinese components in automobiles, computdevices, and essential infrastructure networks represents a grave vulnerability that could potentially be exploited for nefarious purposes, such as unlawful surveillance or malicious sabotage operations. This apprehension is exemplified by the 2020 Mumbai blackout incident, which has been attributed to a security breach involving Chinesebuilt components integrated into the power grid's systems.

India possesses certain crucial strengths that it can capitalize on in the quest to establish itself as a player in the legacy chip industry. The nation harbors a thriving ecosystem dedicated to chip design, which could be tapped into to engineer specialized semiconductors - a realm where China has encountered hurdles. These include analog chips and microcontrollers, intricate devices that have proven challenging for Chinese firms to manufacture effectively. Although these companies have managed to double their stake in the analog chip market since 2019, their progress has been hindered by the inherent complexities involved in the de-

sign of such components. While large-scale manufacturing of commodity chips may seem like an alluring prospect, India's true potential lies elsewhere. The nation should concentrate its efforts on the high-value design aspects of semiconductor technology, an area that could set it apart from the likes of China. Regrettably, the current approach appears to be misguided, exemplified by the Tata Group's \$11 billion fab project, which will primarily focus on assembly, testing, and packaging rather than the innovative design work that could truly differentiate India in the global semiconductor landscape. By prioritizing cutting-edge design capabilities, India could carve out a niche for itself, leveraging its intellectual capital to establish a unique foothold in this crucial industry.

To effectively mitigate the risks posed by Chinese dominance in the semiconductor industry and safeguard its supply chain, India must adopt a comprehensive and proactive approach. Foremost, a stringent ban on the use of Chinese-manufactured chips in critical infrastructure and government systems should be implemented, extending to contractors as well. Furthermore, a robust monitoring regime must be established to trace the origin of every chip entering the country, encompassing details such as the product, company, and manufacturing location. This is crucial for customs authorities to gain visibility into the chip's provenance, including the fabrication facility, ownership, and design origin, thereby enabling effective enforcement of restrictions. Currently, the government lacks insight into the source of chips in imported goods, a concerning blind spot hat necessitates immediate atten-

Moreover, targeted export controls on chip design software and manufacturing equipment should be implemented in close coordination with the US and EU, with the aim of slowing China's progress in this domain. Concurrently, the Indian government should augment its support for domestic chip design and specialized manufacturing, focusing on areas where the country enjoys a competitive edge and China has faced challenges, such as analog chips and microcontrollers. Additionally, a long-term plan should be formulated to develop local suppliers for semiconductorgrade materials, equipment, and components, as these upstream chokepoints are equally essential as the fabrication facilities them-

The significance of maintaining control over the legacy chip market cannot be overstated While these chips employ older technologies, they form the indispensable bedrock upon which the contemporary world is built. Surrendering this market to China would deal a catastrophic blow to both economic competitiveness and national security interests. However, should India navigate this situation adroitly, an opportunity presents itself for the nation to forge a lasting legacy of its own within this crucial domain. ### US policy makers are refusing to see global diffusion of production

There has been a significant diffusion of production occurring in the world economy. Many call this phenomenon a shift from a US-led world economy to a "multipolar world economy", but no matter what one thinks of this description, the fact of diffusion is indubitable. In 1994 for instance the G-7 countries (US UK Germany, France, Japan, Italy and Canada) produced 45.3 per cent of world output while the BRICS countries (Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa, together with new members Iran, the UAE, Egypt and Ethiopia) produced 18.9 per cent; by 2022 however the ratios had become 29.3 and 35.2 respectively. (These are World Bank figures quoted by economist Jeffrey

Even if we take a somewhat larger grouping, namely, the US, UK, Canada, EU, Japan, South Korea, Australia and New Zealand, its share in world output has fallen from 56 per cent in 1994 to 39.5 per cent in 2022. The refusal on the part of the US to recognise the ramifications of this diffusion, and its attempt to retain the power it enjoyed over the world in the old days, makes it extremely aggressive vis-àvis Russia, China, Iran and others; indeed its aggressiveness is pushing the world into dangerous military confrontations.

This diffusion of production has no doubt been vastly aided by the emergence of socialism. Not only was the fact of decolonisation itself aided by the existence of socialism, but the building up of domestic skills, technological ability, infrastructure and productive capacity in post-colonial societies occurred initially under the aegis of dirigiste regimes that sustained themselves against western hostility only through significant Soviet assistance; later of course, after the collapse of socialism in the Soviet Union and Eastern Europe, and the end of third world dirigisme, this process of diffusion was carried forward by international flows of capital-in-production that were facilitated by the neoliberal global order, but the prerequisites for such flows had in many major instances been created by the dirigiste regimes. The diffusion of production that is occurring at present to countries outside of the US-led bloc is occurring under the aegis of capitalism (China of course is a separate case).

The question that this arises is: in what

present context? The term imperialism has been associated with a dichotomy in the world economy, between a developed metropolis and an underdeveloped periphery; if this dichotomy is getting obliterated, if countries that belonged to the periphery are now witnessing rates of output growth even faster than the metropolitan countries themselves, then how can we still talk of imperialism?

The reality seems on the contrary to point towards a "convergence" among countries, where countries that belonged to the global south are now catching up with those of the global north, and, what is more, doing so (again excepting China) under the capitalist mode of production itself. Capitalism is no longer the culprit that is perpetuating a division of the world into a developed and an underdeveloped segment; it can no longer therefore be accused of imperialism. The question arises: is this

correct? First of all, while diffusion is unmistakable, any talk of "convergence" is farfetched. This is so partly because the phenomenon of diffusion itself should not be exaggerated: the countries that have witnessed such diffusion are still few in number, and many of them may well experience reversals of fortune in the days to come; this would happen because the crisis of neoliberalism is catching them in debttraps that would entail "fiscal austerity", domestic deflation, and hence economic stagnation and recession.

History bears ample testimony to such reversals, which have been particularly pervasive for mineral-rich countries. Myanmar is a classic example of a country that was once considered to be on the threshold of prosperity but is now listed among the "least developed countries". In our own neighbourhood we see countries retrogressing because of the burden of external debt.

The second reason why "convergence" is out of the question lies precisely in imperialism. To see this we have to note a second phenomenon that characterizes the world economy but which, instead of getting the attention it so obviously deserves, is sought to be camouflaged by organisations like the World Bank that emphasize only the fact of diffusion. This consists of the fact that during the neoliberal era when there has been a diffusion of activities from

the global north to the global south under the aegis of capitalism, and the latter has on average shown a higher growth-rate of GDP compared to the former, there has simultaneously been an increase in the extent of nutritional deprivation in the latter; and if nutritional deprivation is taken to be reflective of overall deprivation, for which at the levels of income of the global south there is plenty of evidence, then there has been an increase in the extent of absolute poverty. No doubt the people of the south have benefited from the better roads, electricity and other infrastructure that has been built up; but their private consumption has suffered precisely during the pewhen socialism

socialism-supported relatively autonomous dirigiste regimes have collapsed and the hegemony of neoliberal capitalism established over the world economy.

Postulating "convergence" therefore is a misreading of the situation; all that one can say is that the dividing line that existed in the capitalist world between the metropolis and the periphery has now shifted geographically to within the periphery itself; the big bourgeoisie and the elite in the global south now finds itself on the same side of the dividing line as metropolitan capital. It is no longer on the same side as the people of the global south, as was generally the case during the anti-colonial struggle.

The term imperialism however was never meant to refer to a geographical divide; it referred to the coercion exercised by the capitalist mode of production on its surroundings. Its point of departure in other words was always political economy not geographical boundaries. It is worth recapitulating some points of this political economy. The capitalist mode of production came of age with the industrial revolution which occurred in the cotton textile industry in Britain. But Britain can grow no raw cotton at all. The very coming of age of the capitalist mode therefore was predicated upon its having access to a whole range of primary commodities which cannot be grown within its home base, either at all, or in sufficient quantities, or all the year around; they are typically grown instead by millions of peasants and petty producers in tropical and semitropical regions of the world that are. and

have historically been, densely populated. These regions are broadly co-terminus with the periphery; and even when capitalism spreads to these regions, both this local capitalism and the capitalism of the metropolis are still dependent on obtaining a growing supply of a range of primary commodities from these millions of non-capitalist producers at prices which are not merely non-increasing, but which have actually shown absolute decline in unit dollar terms for decades.

Even though the exchange value of these commodities is relatively low, which is a legacy of the drastic squeeze that has been imposed on the petty producers of these commodities over the years and which creates the totally false impression that these commodities are quite unimportant for the system, capitalism simply cannot do without them as use-values. Now, obtaining the requisite supplies of such commodities, especially of tropical and semi-tropical agricultural goods from a land-mass that is more or less fully utilised already, would require little coercion if the petty producers located there undertook "land-augmenting" (that is, land-yield-raising) practices and innovations. But such innovations and practices, whether irrigation, or research into and popularisation of high-yielding seed varieties, typically require substantial State effort, which capitalism, especially neoliberal capitalism, frowns upon.

It does not want the State to be engaged in any activity that promotes the interests of anyone other than international capital and its local allies, the corporate-financial oligarchy of the global south itself. It certainly does not wish the State to promote the interests of the peasants and petty producers, which is why "land-augmenting" measures are eschewed and the requisite supplies of primary commodities are obtained through compressing local incomes, and hence local demand of such commodities, within the global south. Such compression is impossible without, at the very least, implicit coercion.

The decline in per capita foodgrain production in the global south, and the even sharper decline in per capita foodgrain availability (owing to the diversion in recent years of foodgrains towards bio-fuels) are a consequence of this coercion, of which the observed nutritional deprivation is a manifestation. The diffusion of production to the global south therefore in no way obviates the phenomenon of imperialism. (IPA Service)

### South Korea summons Russian ambassador as tensions rise with North Korea

SEOUL, June 21: South Korea summoned the Russian ambassador to protest the country's new defense pact with North Korea on Friday, as border tensions continued to rise with vague threats and brief, seemingly accidental incursions by North Korean troops.

Earlier on Friday, the powerful sister of North Korean leader Kim Jong Un issued a vague threat of retaliation after South Korean activists flew balloons carrying anti-Pyongyang propaganda leaflets across the border, and South Korea's military said it had fired warning shots the previous day to repel North Korean soldiers who briefly crossed the rivals' land border for the third time this

That came two days after Moscow and Pyongyang reached a pact vowing mutual defense assistance if either is attacked, and a day after Seoul responded by saying it would consider providing arms to Ukraine to fight Russia's invasion.

South Korean Vice Foreign Minister Kim Hong Kyun sum-Russian Ambassador Georgy Zinoviev to convey Seoul's stance on the deal between Putin and Kim and on alleged military cooperation between Russia and North Korea. Seoul's Foreign Ministry didn't immediately confirm what was said during the

Leafletting campaigns by South



Korean civilian activists in recent weeks have prompted a resumption of Cold War-style psychologwarfare along inter-Korean border.

The South Korean civilian activists, led by North Korean defector Park Sang-hak, said it sent 20 balloons carrying 300,000 propaganda leaflets, 5,000 USB sticks with South Korean pop songs and TV dramas, and 3,000 US dollar bills from the South Korean border town of Paju on

Pyongyang resents such material and fears it could demoralize front-line troops and residents and eventually weaken Kim Jong Un's grip on power, analysts say.

In a statement carried by North Korea's official Korean Central News Agency, Kim Yo Jong, one of her brother's top foreign policy officials, called the activists "defector scum" and issued what appeared to be a threat of retaliation. "When you do something you were clearly warned not to do, it's only natural that you will find yourself dealing with something

you didn't have to," she said,

without specifying what the North

After previous leafletting by South Korean activists, North Korea launched more than 1,000 balloons that dropped tons of trash in South Korea, smashing roof tiles and windows and causing other property damage.

Kim Yo Jong previously hinted that balloons could become the North's standard response to leafletting, saying that the North would respond by "scattering dozens of times more rubbish than is being scattered on us."

In response, South Korea resumed anti-North Korea propaganda broadcasts with military loudspeakers installed at the border for the first time in years, to which Kim Yo Jong, in another state media statement, warned that Seoul was "creating a prelude

Tensions between the Koreas are at their highest in years as Kim Jong Un accelerates his nuclear weapons and missile development and attempts to strengthen his regional footing by aligning with Russian President Vladimir Putin in a standoff against the US-

South Korea, a growing arms exporter with a well-equipped military backed by the United States, says it is considering upping support for Ukraine in re-

Seoul has already provided humanitarian aid and other support while joining US-led economic sanctions against Moscow. But it has not directly provided arms, citing a long-standing policy of not supplying weapons to countries actively engaged in conflict.

Putin told reporters in Hanoi, Vietnam, on Thursday that supplying weapons to Ukraine would be "a very big mistake," and said South Korea "shouldn't worry" about the agreement if it isn't planning aggression against Pyongyang. North Korea is extremely sensitive to criticism of Kim's authoritarian rule and efforts to reach its people with for-

eign news and other media. In 2015, when South Korea restarted loudspeaker broadcasts for the first time in 11 years, North Korea fired artillery rounds across the border, prompting

South Korea to return fire, according to South Korean officials. No casualties were reported.

South Korea's military said there are signs that North Korea was installing its own speakers at the border, although they weren't yet working.

In the latest border incident, South Korea's Joint Chiefs of Staff said several North Korean soldiers engaged in unspecified construction work briefly crossed the military demarcation line that divides the two countries at around 11 am on Thursday. The South Korean military

broadcast a warning and fired warning shots, after which the North Korean soldiers retreated. The joint chiefs didn't immediately release more details, including why it was releasing the information a day late.

South Korea's military says believes recent border intrusions were not intentional, as the North Korean soldiers have not returned fire and retreated after the warning shots.

The South's military has observed the North deploying large numbers of soldiers in frontline areas to build suspected anti-tank barriers, reinforce roads and plant mines in an apparent attempt to fortify their side of the border.

Seoul believes the efforts are likely aimed at preventing North Korean civilians and soldiers from escaping to the South.(AP)

### Armenia recognizes a Palestinian state, and Israel summons its ambassador



GAZA STRIP, June 21: Armenia said it would recognize a Palestinian state on Friday, prompting Israel to summon its ambassador for what the Foreign Ministry described as a "severe reprimand."

Dozens of countries have recognized a Palestinian state, though none of the major Western powers has done so. Palestinians believe the recognitions confer international legitimacy on their struggle, especially amid international outrage over the humanitarian crisis in Gaza.

Last month, Spain, Ireland and Norway said they had decided to recognize a Palestinian state, and since then Slovenia and the Caribbean nation of Antigua and Barbuda have followed suit. On Thursday, a U.S.-built pier in Gaza began unloading humanitarian aid again after being removed for a second time last week because of rough seas, the U.S. military said.

Aid groups have sharply criticized the plan to bring aid by sea into Gaza, saying it's a distraction that took pressure off Israel to open more land border crossings that are far more productive. Palestinians face widespread hunger as the war has largely cut off the flow of food, medicine and basic goods to Gaza, which is now totally dependent on aid.

Meanwhile, Israel's pledge to guard a new aid route into southern Gaza has fallen flat, as the U.N. and international aid organizations say a breakdown in law and order has made that route unusable.

Israel's war against Hamas, now in its ninth month, faces growing international criticism over the U.S.-backed campaign of systematic destruction in Gaza, at a huge cost in civilian lives.

Israeli ground offensives and bombardments have killed more than 37,100 people, according to Gaza's Health Ministry, which does not distinguish between combatants and civilians in its count.

Israel launched the war after Hamas' Oct. 7 attack, in which militants stormed into southern Israel, killed some 1,200 people — mostly civilians — and abducted about 250. (AP)

### Russia-North Korea pact could dent China's influence, but Beijing still holds sway over both



BEIJING, June 21: With no obvious options, China appears to be keeping its distance as Russia and North Korea move closer to each other with a new defense pact that could tilt the balance of power among the three authoritarian states.

Experts say China's leaders are likely fretting over potential loss of influence over North Korea after its leader Kim Jong Un and Russian President Vladimir Putin signed the deal this week, and how that could increase instability on the Korean Peninsula. But Beijing may also be struggling to come up with a response because of its conflicting goals: keeping peace in the Koreas while countering the U.S. and its Western allies on the global stage.

Beijing so far has not commented on the deal -which requires both countries to provide defense assistance if the other is attacked - and only reiterated boilerplate statements that it seeks to uphold peace and stability on the Korean Peninsula and advance a political settlement of the North-South divide.

The Chinese response has been "very weak," said Victor Cha, senior vice president for Asia and Korea chair at the Center for Strategic and International Studies, adding that it could be a sign that Beijing doesn't yet know what to do.

"Every option is a bad option," he said. "You're either unable to make a decision because of very strongly held competing views or ... you're just incapable of making a decision because you just don't know how to evaluate the situation.'

Some in Beijing may welcome the Russia-North Korea partnership as a way of pushing back at America's dominance in world affairs, but Cha said that "there is also a great deal of discomfort" in China, which doesn't want to lose its sway over its neighbor to Russia, doesn't want to see a destabilizing nuclear power on its doorstep, and doesn't want to bring the conflict in Europe to Asia.

But China isn't raising these concerns publicly. "They don't want to push Kim Jong Un further into the arms of Vladimir Putin," Cha said, referring to the leaders of the two countries.

Lin Jian, a spokesperson for the Chinese Foreign Ministry, declined to comment on the new agreement. "The cooperation between Russia and the DPRK is a matter between two sovereign states. We do not have information on the relevant matter," he said, referring to North Korea by the initials for its official name, the Democratic People's Republic of Korea.

John Kirby, the White House national security spokesman, told reporters that the pact between Russia and North Korea "should be of concern to any country that believes that the U.N. Security Council resolutions ought to be abided by." The Security Council has imposed sanctions on North Korea to try to stop its development of nuclear weapons.

Kirby also said the agreement "should be of concern to anybody who thinks that supporting the people of Ukraine is an important thing to do. And we would think that that concern would be shared by the People's Republic of China."

One area that China could be concerned about is whether Russia will help North Korea's weapons program by sharing advanced technology, said Alexander Gabuev, director of the Carnegie Russia Eurasia Cen-

"If China is indeed concerned, it has leverage in both Russia and North Korea and it could probably try to put some limitations to that relationship," he said.

The meeting between Putin and Kim this week was the latest chapter in decades of complicated political and military relationships in East Asia, where the Chinese Communist Party, once an underdog, has emerged as a leading power that wields influence over both North Korea and Russia.

That and other developments have raised alarms in the U.S. that Beijing, now the world's second-largest economy, could challenge the U.S.-led world order by aligning itself with countries such as Russia, North Korea and Iran. Beijing has rejected that allegation.

Sun Yun, director of the China program at the Stimson Center, said Beijing doesn't want to form a threeway alliance with North Korea and Russia, because it "needs to keep its options open."

Such a coalition could mean a new Cold War, something Beijing says it is determined to avoid, and locking itself to Pyongyang and Moscow would be contrary to China's goals of maintaining relationships with Europe and improving ties with Japan and South Korea, she said.

Sun added that the rapprochement between North Korea and Moscow "opens up possibilities and potentials of uncertainty, but based on what has happened so far, I don't think that China's national interests have been undercut by this."

Closer ties between Putin and Kim could weaken Beijing's sway and leave it as the "biggest loser," said Danny Russel, who was the top U.S. diplomat for Asia in the Obama administration. (AP)

Abbasi, who served as the prime minister from August 2017 to May 2018, was joined by former finance minister Miftah Ismail who also parted ways with the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) led by former

### Tourist killed by mob for allegedly desecrating Quran in Pakistan's tourist town

PESHAWAR, June 21: An enraged mob in the picturesque Pakistani town of Swat has gunned down a tourist, dragged him through the town and later hanged him in full public view for allegedly committing desecration of the Quran. The incident happened on Thursday night when Muhammad Ismail, a resident of Sialkot in Punjab province, was visiting the northwestern Pakistan hill resort town of Swat and was accused of having burnt the pages of Islam's holy book in Madyan tehsil of Swat district in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province.

District Police Officer (DPO), Swat, Zahidullah said that initially the police had taken Ismail in custody and locked him up in the police station when the alleged desecration incident was reported. However, the incident was announced from mosques through loudspeakers

in the market, prompting thousands of people to gather outside the police station. Soon after, the angry mob demanded that the police hand over the suspect to them. On refusal, a fierce exchange of fire took place between the local people and the police in which eight persons were injured, The Express Tribune newspaper reported.

After that the mob torched the police station, forcing the cops on duty to flee for their lives. "After that, the people entered the police station and shot and killed the suspect and dragged his body to the Madyan Ada, where they hanged him. The people also set the police station and police vehicles on fire, while the policemen on duty fled. Meanwhile, more police force was called to control the mob," the officer was quoted as saying.

According to the police officials, the incident has caused a law and order situation in the hill town. More police force was called to restore order in the popular tourist destination. Chief Minister of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province Ali Amin Gandapur has sought a report from the provincial police chief.

He has directed the Inspector General of Police to take emergency steps to control the situation and urged people to remain calm. (PTI)



101-year-old Frenchwoman Charlotte Chopin who was awarded a Padma Shri for her services in popularising yoga in her country.

Modi said the spread of yoga globally has led to a change in perception about it as more people are travelling to India to get authentic knowledge

"We are now seeing yoga tourism in states like Uttarakhand and Kerala.

"People are now hiring personal yoga trainers for fitness, and companies are including yoga in mind and body (fitness) programmes for their employees. It has opened new avenues of liveli-

The prime minister said yoga provides solutions to several problems.

"In this era of information revolution, there is a flood of information sources and it is a chal-

lenge for the human mind to focus on one subject. "A solution for this is also in yoga as it helps the mind to focus. That is why from army to sports, yoga has been included in their routine,"

The prime minister said astronauts and people working on space projects are trained in yoga as t increases "productivity as well as tolerance" Modi also focused on the potential impact of

yoga on Jammu and Kashmir. "I have been seeing since yesterday that yoga is becoming popular with the people of Srinagar

and (rest of) Jammu and Kashmir. It is a big thing that 50,000 to 60,000 people are associated with yoga. This will attract more tourists here," he said. He said yoga could help the union territory attract more tourists, which in turn would provide

new livelihood opportunities to locals.

In his address, the prime minister referred to Egypt where yoga was used to promote tourism. "I recently saw a video from Egypt. They organised a competition and awarded the best yoga photographs and videos from iconic tourist places in the country. In the pictures and videos, I saw girls from Egypt standing in front of the iconic Pyramids doing yoga, it was so attractive.

"For Kashmir, yoga can become such a big source of livelihood. It can become a centre of attraction for tourists," Modi said.

The PM lauded the determination of the practitioners to stay back even in adverse weather. "Our daughters used their yoga mats to protect themselves from rain but they did not leave. It is

heartening to see," he said. He said yoga, once made a part of daily life, gives uninterrupted benefits for a long time.

#### NEW DELHI, June 21: West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee has urged Prime Minister Narendra Modi to defer the implementation of the three "hurriedly passed" criminal laws that are set to be rolled out on July 1.

Banerjee stressed having a fresh review of the laws by Parliament.

In a letter to Prime Minister Modi, the Trinamool Congress (TMC) chief expressed "grave concern" over the impending implementation of the three laws -- Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) 2023, Bharatiya Sakhsya Adhiniyam (BSA) 2023 and Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS) 2023.

According to sources, the TMC chief also met senior Congress leader P Chidambaram on Thursday, who was also a part of the parliamentary standing committee that examined the bills, and discussed the

TMC leader Derk O'Brien, DMK's N R Elango and Chidambaram had given dissent notes to the reports on the three bills.

Banerjee, in her letter, noted that the three bills were passed in Lok Sabha at a time when 146 MPs

'The outgoing government of yours had passed these three critical bills unilaterally, and with absolutely no debate. That day, almost 100 members of the Lok Sabha had been suspended and a total 146 MPs of the both Houses were thrown out of Parlia-

ment," Banerjee said. She said the three bills were passed in an "authoritarian manner" in that "dark hour of democracy". The matter deserves review now, she added.

"I urge your esteemed office now to consider at least a deferment of the implementation date. Reasons are two-fold -- ethical and practical," she said. Banerjee said significant legislative changes should be placed before the newly elected Parliament

for fresh deliberation and scrutiny. "Given the wide-ranging reservations expressed in the public domain regarding the hurriedly passed new laws, fresh parliamentary review of these attempts would demonstrate a commitment to democratic principles... This approach would afford the newly elected people's representatives an opportu-

nity to thoroughly examine the proposed," she said. Banerjee said the request for postponement also stems from a pragmatic assessment of the challenges and preparatory work required for a smooth transition, particularly concerning the training of law enforcement personnel and judicial officers.

Any far-reaching legal change requires meticulous groundwork beforehand to ensure effective enforcement and administration, and there is no reason to avert such homework, she said.

"I humbly request you to consider our appeal for

a deferment of the implementation of The Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) 2023, The Bharatiya Sakhsya Adhiniyam (BSA) 2023, and The Bhartiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS) 2023," she said. "We believe this postponement will enable a re-

newed parliamentary review/mandate, reinforce public trust in the legal system and uphold the rule of law in our beloved country," Banerjee added.

Sources said the issue will be raised by the opposition parties in the upcoming Parliament session. Several INDIA bloc parties have backed the demand for deferring the implementation of the new laws.

Asked why he needs to demand a high-level probe when BJP is the ruling party in Bihar and only a recommendation by the state government is required for such an investigation, Sinha said, "I am repeating that it is the prerogative of the CM. We will apprise him (CM) and request for a high-level probe, including CBI. The deputy CM said he had shared with the media pieces of evidence regarding the "involvement" of officials close to Yadav in the row.

"I hope that the Economic Offences Unit (EOU) of Bihar Police, which is probing the alleged NEET paper leak case, will probe this aspect," he said.

The EOU of Bihar Police had last month arrested 13 people in connection with the NEET-UG 2024 row. The arrested accused included examinees, their parents and the "mastermind" Sikander Prasad Yadvendu. Sinha had on Thursday alleged that the

official associated with Yadav used to arrange accommodation for Sikandar at guest houses in Patna and other places. The BJP leader had also claimed that

he had details of messages which the official sent to the persons concerned for arranging accommodation for Sikandar.

Reports also suggested that the accused was associated with RJD supremo Lalu Prasad when he was in judicial custody in Ranchi, the deputy chief minister had alleged. Responding to the allegations of Sinha, Yadav said the investigating agencies are under the BJP governments at the Centre and in the state and they are free to order a highlevel probe. The former deputy chief minister said, "They should call and question my officials, about whom they are talking. Why are they hesitating to order a probe into the matter?"

#### **India criticises Canadian parl observing** 'one minute silence' in memory of Nijjar

NEW DELHI, June 21: India on Friday was critical of the Canadian parliament observing "one minute silence" in the memory of Khalistan extremist Hardeep Singh Nijjar, who was gunned down in Surrey, British Columbia, in June last year. "We naturally oppose any moves giving political space to extremism and advocacy of violence," External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said. In an unusual move, the Canadian parliament observed "one minute silence" two days ago in memory of Nijjar. The relations between the two countries came under severe strain following Trudeau's allegations in September last year of a "potential" involvement of Indian agents in Nijjar's killing. New Delhi rejected Trudeau's charges as "absurd". India has been maintaining that the main issue between the two countries is that of Canada giving space to pro-Khalistan elements operating from Canadian soil with impunity. (PTI)

### When a speech translation led to war of words between Nehru, Harivansh Rai Bachchan

NEW DELHI, June 21: Hindu, Urdu or something in between. That was the kernel of an argument between first prime minister Jawaharlal Nehru and Hindi poet Harivansh Rai Bachchan over the translation of a presidential address from English to Hindi that was to be read by vice president Zakir Hu-

Nehru thought that Bachchan's translation of president Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan's speech was too complex and the Hindi poet was adamant it was not, says the book 'Nehru's First Recruits" by journalist Kallol Bhattacherjee. Both were unwilling to re-

Recounting what had happened, the book says Nehru lost his cool with Bachchan, whom he had recruited as an officer on special duty for Hindi at the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA). Bachchan, who authored the landmark

"Madhushala", joined the Indian Foreign Service (IFS) in 1955 on a monthly salary of Rs 1,000, a good Rs 250 hike from his previous job as a producer in the All India Radio (AIR), according to the book. The major part of his responsibility in the MEA included translating speeches of the

president and the vice president -- the com-

monly used Hindi name 'Videsh

Mantralaya' for 'External Affairs Ministry' was, in fact, coined by Bachchan. The argument with Nehru happened when Bachchan translated the president's speech in English into Hindi, which in accordance with regular practice was to be de-

speech? Dr Zakir Husain— and he won't even be able to pronounce some of the words you have used," the book quotes Nehru as saying.

"Panditji, language cannot be changed to suit the convenience of some individual's pronunciation; why don't you have the speech translated into Urdu?" Bachchan had

The clash of egos between two men, held in high esteem in their respective domains of governance and literature, led to a full blown verbal spat and Nehru ran out of patience. The book quotes in detail the conversation between the two luminaries.

"There is enough trouble in this country. Even if we get it translated into Urdu, we'd have to call it Hindi -- and what's the difference between the two, anyway?" Nehru

According to the book, Bachchan, in his endeavour, had forgotten the realities of India and was about to get the vice president of India into a difficult situation.

"The vice president stumbling over difficult Hindi words while reading a speech in the Parliament would not have gone down well before the media and the critics of the Nehru government. "And Nehru was also right to some extent

in his own way because the speech could not possibly have been translated into Urdu, as the Indian Constitution only allowed for the use of Hindi speeches in such sessions,

and a Hindi speech with many Urdu words, therefore, would have to be called a 'speech in Hindi' and not an Urdu speech," the book

Ultimately, Nehru regained his composure and convinced Bachchan to produce a text that Zakir Husain would not find difficult to read. And Bachchan duly obliged. Husain, who held the office of vice president from 1962-67, under the presidency of

Radhakrishnan, later succeeded him as the third president of India. Nehru knew Bachchan, both hailing from Allahabad, way before he recruited him in

the IFS, says the book. In fact, he had helped Bachchan receive a scholarship after he got admission in Cambridge and Oxford in the early 1950s. Bachchan had faced a series of rejections from then education secretary Humayun Kabir and education minister Maulana

### Atishi begins fast for more water from Haryana

**NEW DELHI, June 21:** Delhi Water Minister Atishi began her indefinite hunger strike in south Delhi's Bhogal on Friday to get more water from Haryana, in the presence of Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's wife Sunita Kejriwal and other AAP leaders. Sunita Kejriwal read out a message from the chief minister, who is currently lodged in Tihar jail, in which he expressed hope that Atishi's 'tapasya' would be successful.

The chief minister said he was immensely pained by seeing on TV the plight of the people facing water shortage amid the ongoing intense heatwave, he said.

"It's our culture to provide water to the thirsty. Delhi gets water from neighbouring states. We hoped support of neighbouring states in such intense heat. But, Haryana reduced Delhi's water share.

"Although there are governments of different parties in the two states but is this time for politics over water," he said, referring to the BJP that is in power in Haryana.

Earlier, Atishi, accompanied by Sunita Kejriwal, AAP MP Sanjay Singh, Delhi minister Saurabh Bharadwaj and other leaders paid tributes to Mahatma Gandhi at Rajghat before heading to Bhogal.

In the morning, the minister said she would begin her indefinite hunger strike in Bhogal as, despite all efforts, the Haryana government was not releasing the full share of Delhi's water.

"I will start 'Pani Satyagraha' from today... I will start an indefinite fast at Bhogal, Jangpura from 12 o'clock until the people of Delhi get their rightful share of water from Haryana," she said on X earlier in the day," she said on X. (PTI)

### Rajkot fire tragedy: SIT submits report, finds lapses; suggests changes in Gujarat Police Act



AHMEDABAD, June 21: A Special Investigation Team (SIT) appointed by the Gujarat government to probe the May 25 Rajkot game zone fire incident, which claimed 27 lives, submitted its interim report on Friday to Minister of State for Home Harsh Sanghavi in Gandhinagar.

In its 100-page interim report, the SIT, headed by senior IPS officer Subhash Trivedi, has suggested some changes to Section 33 of Gujarat Police Act (GPAct), which empowers local police to give various licenses to such game zones.

"We submitted an interim report to the government today. We found lapses on the part of the police, fire department, town planning and Road and Building department. We have collected relevant evidence about their negligence and drawn the government's attention towards it through our report,"

"The SIT has suggested some changes to section 33 of the Gujarat Police Act, under which local police gives premises license and ticket license to such recreation facilities. We will not spare the guilty. The SIT probe is still on. We are currently investigating the roles played by senior police as well as civic officials," he told reporters.

During a hearing on a suo motu PIL taken up by the Gujarat High Court over the game zone fire, senior advocate Amit Panchal on June 13, citing photos available on social media, informed the bench that the then Superintendent of Police of Rajkot, district collector, municipal commissioner of Rajkot and District Development Officer had attended the in-

augural ceremony of TRP Game Zone. Chief Justice Sunita Agarwal had then slammed the government and asked why no action was taken against these senior officials who had attended the

opening ceremony of TRP Game Zone. Asked about the allegations, Trivedi said these officers went there nearly one year after it was opened

"We have already questioned four IAS and one IPS officer who had visited the game zone in the past and got themselves clicked there. These officers told the SIT they went there with their family members in March 2022 to celebrate the birthday of one of the officers. It was not the opening event of the game zone as is being claimed," said Trivedi.

The SIT will interrogate other IAS and IPS officers if needed before concluding the probe, the of-

As many as 27 persons, including children, were charred to death in a massive fire which gutted the entire facility on May 25. A subsequent investigation by police revealed the game zone was running without a no objection certificate (NOC) from the fire department of the Rajkot Municipal Corporation.

Following the incident, the state government formed an SIT under Trivedi to find out the causes of fire, loopholes in the system and to suggest steps to be taken to prevent such incidents in the future.

The state government recently informed the Gujarat High Court that the SIT will submit its final report by June 20 and further action will be taken accordingly. So far, police have arrested five owners of the game zone and six government officials in connection with the fire. (PTI)

### Rain brings relief from intense heat in Delhi; waterlogging, fallen trees reported

**NEW DELHI, June 21:** A splash of rain in parts of Delhi on Friday brought some relief from the battering heatwave conditions with the maximum temperature settling at 40.4 degrees Celsius, two notches above the season's normal.

However, the light downpour accompanied by gusty winds with speeds of 30-40 kmph caused water logging in many areas that led to traffic and incidents of uprooting of trees, according to civic body offi-

The city and its adjoining NCR area witnessed light to moderate-intensity rains in several parts during the evening

The India Meteorological Department has predicted relief from the searing heatwave in Delhi over the weekend, as well as the sky is likely to remain partly cloudy on Saturday and Sunday

As per the Municipal Corporation of Delhi, at least 13 areas across the national capital reported waterlogging till 6 pm.

There were nine complaints of uprooting of trees received by the civic body's control room till that time due to the gusty winds, it said.

The areas where waterlogging and incidents of fallen trees were reported include Karol Bhagh zone, South zone, Shahdara North and South zone, and Narela, among others.

According to PWD officials, waterlogging calls were received from two areas -- Azadpur underpass and Kashmere Gate. The waterlogging issue at Azadpur underpass was

resolved within 10 to 15 minutes while at Kashmere Gate, the issue was resolved within 30 to 35 minutes, Meanwhile, the soaring temperatures in Delhi that

kept officials on their toes to roll relief measures, dipped on Friday. The city recorded a minimum temperature of 28.4 degrees Celsius, normal for this time of the season, the Met Office said. The relative humidity oscillated between 70 per

cent and 71 per cent during the day. The IMD on Thursday said that heatwave condi-

tions have abated from Delhi under the influence of western disturbance and lower-level easterlies from the Bay of Bengal.

Delhi has been reeling under an intense heatwave and a severe water crisis.

According to a senior police official, bodies of more than 50 people were recovered from in and around Delhi in the last five days. Police, however, have not confirmed if they died of heat-related

### **Brutal heatwave: Death toll climbs** to 143, actual numbers could be high

NEW DELHI, June 21: The prolonged heatwave sweeping large parts of the country has claimed more lives, with 143 recorded deaths and 41,789 people suffering from suspected heatstroke between March 1 and June 20 this year, Health ministry sources said on Friday.

However, the heatwave toll is expected to be higher than this as the data compiled under the National Heat-Related Illness and Death Surveillance by the National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC) does not have updated submissions from states.

Several health facilities are also yet to upload data on number of heatwave casu-According to the official data, on June 20 itself there have been 14 confirmed deaths due to heatstroke and nine deaths

due to suspected heatstroke, taking the

death toll in the March-June period to 143 Uttar Pradesh is the worst-affected, having reported 35 deaths followed by Delhi (21) and Bihar and Rajasthan (17 each), according to the data

sponse," the ministry said. The advisory asked state nodal officers under the National Programme for Climate Change and Human Health (NPC-CHH) to start submitting daily the data on heatstroke cases and deaths and total deaths from March 1 besides reporting under Heat-Related Illness and Death Sur-

It called for maintenance of digital line list of heatstroke cases and deaths (suspected/confirmed) at health facility/hospital level in given formats and undertaking

They have been asked to ensure dissemination of National Action Plan on Heat Related Illnesses (HRI) to all districts and strengthening of health systems preparedness for HRI.

It stressed on dissemination of early warning of heatwaves issued by the India Meteorological Department (IMD) and said forecast for the next four days should be disseminated to health facilities and vulnerable populations.

The advisory also directed for health facility preparedness for prevention and management of severe HRI and procurement and supply of adequate quantities of ORS packs, essential medicines, IV fluids, ice packs, and equipments to support management of volume depletion and electrolyte imbalance etc.

It also called for ensuring availability of sufficient drinking water at all health facilities, general cooling appliances in waiting and patient treatment area and their functioning and stressed that cases with suspected heatstroke should be rapidly assessed and actively cooled using standard treatment protocols.

"Coordinate with electricity distribution company/corporation for uninterrupted electricity supply to hospitals for constant functioning of cooling appliances. Adopt measures to reduce indoor heat and energy conservation in health facilities like cool roof/green roof, window shading, rainwater harvesting, solarization etc. Provide shade outside the health facilities in heat-prone regions," the advisory added. (PTI)

### ₹15-25 lakh bribe taken from candidates for jobs at BCB: CBI

NEW DELHI, June 21: Candidates applying for jobs as 'mazdoor'. 'dai', 'coolie' and 'chowkidar' at the Belgaum Cantonment Board allegedly paid bribes to the tune of ₹ 15-25 lakh, the CBI has said in its FIR related to the alleged recruitment scam.

In its FIR, which was made public on Friday, the agency has booked five officials of the Belgaum Cantonment Board and 14 candidates who allegedly paid the bribes.

The CBI begun its probe last year with a preliminary enquiry on the basis of complaint from a board member alleging corruption and illegalities in the recruitment process

which was undertaken in 2022-23. The findings of the enquiry suggested that during 2022-23, 31 candidates for the post of mechanic, assistant sanitary inspector, coolie, mali, peon, dai, etc were recruited,

officials said.

Officer Superintendent Mahalingeshwar Y Talukdar, Computer Programmer Basavaraj S Gudodagi, Data Entry Operator Prakash C Head Master Parasharam S Birje and Assistant Teacher Uday S Patil -- who have been booked -- worked in various caper orders issues by then CEO, they said. The CBI has alleged that the then CEO of the Cantonment Board Anand K (now deceased) was the controlling and appointing authority for the recruitment process who was involved in setting the question paper and answer keys for the examination, they said.

In conspiracy with the five officials, Anand K demanded and accepted illegal gratification in the range of ₹ 15-25 lakh from the aspirants to influence the selection process, the CBI has alleged.

"Their illegal intention and overt actions consequent thereof caused selection of candidates favourable to them in the recruitment process by dishonest and illegal means," the CBI has alleged in the FIR. The CBI enquiry findings showed

that the question paper was set only in English but most of the candidates could not read and understand it.

"It is further alleged that eligible candidates were either rejected or not qualified as they could not pay the illegal gratification to the above named public servants. It is further alleged that while candidates from all over the country appeared for the examination, all the selected candidates were from either Belgaum or nearby places only. (PTI)



Set to be released in theatres on Friday, the movie is directed by Kamal Chandra. It is produced by Radhika G Film & Newtech Media Entertainment. Ravi S Gupta, Birender Bhagat, Sanjay Nagpal, and Sheo Balak Singh are credited as producers, with Triloki Prasad set as co-producer.

Kapoor described "Hamare Baraah", previously titled "Hum Do Humare Baraah", as the story of a Muslim family led by his character Mansoor Ali Khan Sanjari. "I don't have any relationship with any religion. I am an atheist. I don't participate in religious discussions because I don't have that intellect," the actor told reporters here at a press conference ahead of the film's release. The Bombay High Court on Wednesday allowed the release of the film after its makers agreed to delete certain objectionable portions. It was originally slated for release on June 7 and then on June 14. "Hamare Baarah" got embroiled in a legal battle after a bunch of petitions were filed in the high court claiming that it distorted the Quran and was derogatory towards the Islamic faith and the Muslim community. The plea sought a ban on the release of the movie. Asked why films such as "The Kashmir Files" and "The Kerala Files" appear to target a particular community, one of the producers urged the media to "not make it a communal issue". (PTI)





# ALWAYS WANTED TO KIND OF SINK IN SLOW MOTION AND DANCE: ROHIT SARAF ON 'ISHQ VISHQ REBOUND'

MUMBAI, June 21: Rohit Saraf always wanted to do a film that gave him a chance to showcase his dance moves and he's happy that he got the opportunity in "Ishq Vishq Rebound".

The young adult drama, which is a follow-up of the 2003 "Ishq Vishq", starring Shahid Kapoor, Amrita Rao and Shehnaz Treasury, revolves around four friends and their complicated love lives.

Saraf, who made a name for himself as an actor with "The Sky is Pink", "Ludo" and Netflix series "Mismatched", said the film helped him fulfil his dream of dancing on screen.

"I feel, no matter how serious an actor you are, I think one would always want to have an opportunity in life where they can kind of sink in slow motion and dance... This was the first time I ever got to do that in a

film... I was very excited by it.

"It was on my bucket list. And what's even more exciting is that it really helps you connect with the audiences. Like, there were so many people who came up to us and said, 'When we saw the song, it felt like you were singing to us.' To me, that is such a big

I would have to direct it, produce it, act in all parts and then call it my film. "It is a lot of people's hard work. All four characters in the film are important. You take one character out of the film and I don't think the film is complete.. It is everybody's film, more than the actors."

The actor believes there is a strong appetite for romantic comedy films among the audiences, something that was proved by the success of the last few films in the genre. "We were missing it,

"The sooner Kalyan Chaubey leaves AIFF, the better it is for Indian football," Stimac said. "Football is the most popular

sport in the world, but India is the only place where football is not growing," he added.

Stimac was appointed as the head coach following the departure of his predecessor Stephen Constantine in March 2019. A few days after India suffered a defeat against Qatar in the final second round match of World Cup Qualifiers earlier this month, the AIFF sacked Stimac.

### Messi creates both goals as Argentina opens Copa America title defense by beating Canada 2-0

ATLANTA, June 21: Lionel Messi's through ball led to Julián Álvarez's goal in the 49th minute, then he assisted on Lautaro Martínez's goal in the 88th as Argentina began the defense of its Copa America title with a 2-0 victory over Canada.

Argentina is seeking its third straight major title after winning the 2021 Copa America and the 2022 World Cup.

"It's been a long time since we've done this," Messi said through a translator, "but we had patience to retain possession of the ball and it was hard to find the good open spaces.'

With South America's championship moved to the United States for the second time, Messi set a Copa America record with his 35th match, one more than Chile's Sergio Livingstone from 1941-53. Messi extended his own record with his 18th assist.

Messi, who turns 37 on Monday, created the first goal when following a throw-in, he headed a pass through the defense for Alexis MacAllister. The midfielder side-footed a pass to Alvarez while crashing into an onrushing goalkeeper Maxime Crépeau about 8 yards out. Álvarez had a virtually empty net and kicked the ball in over a sliding defender for his eighth goal in

32 international appearances. Messi extended his Copa America record when he ran through the Martínez, who had entered in the 76th minute and slotted it past Crépeau for his 25th international

Argentina had a 12-3 shots advantage in the second half and Messi failed to convert on a pair of excellent chances. Crépeau made a diving stop in the 65th minute and Messi's attempt off the rebound was blocked by the head of defender Derek Cornelius. Messi put a chip wide after he came in alone on Crépeau in the 79th.

He was shaken up by a sliding tackle from defender Moïse Bombito in the 82nd minute, but remained in the game.

"It was physically intense." Messi said.

Spain totally dominated defending champion Italy, with 16-yearold winger Lamine Yamal further enhancing his reputation as one of soccer's most exciting young stars.

Teeing off in the afternoon on the dried out Sahalee Country Club, Thompson started hot with three straight birdies.

The 29-year-old Thompson shot a bogey-free 32 on the front nine. After a bogey at No. 10, she rebounded with birdies at No. 12 and 14 before another bogey at the 16th.

She won the last of her 11 LPGA Tour titles at the ShopRite LPGA Classic in June 2019. The top-ranked Korda, who missed the cut at the U.S. Women's Open and the Meijer LPGA Classic in her last two starts after winning six out of seven events, made four birdies on her first six holes. She had a total of six birdies, a bogey and a double on the par-4 fourth hole, which dropped her back to 2-under. (PTI)

## India to push its 2036 Olympic bid case in Paris; will seek inclusion of indigenous disciplines

**NEW DELHI, June 21:** India's sports administrators would be 'lobbying" hard during the upcoming Paris Olympics to brighten the country's chances of hosting the 2036 Games where they will push for the inclusion of indigenous disciplines like yoga, kho kho and kabaddi if their ambitious bid is successful.

The Sports Authority of India's Mission Olympic Cell (MOC) presented its detailed report on the measures needed for a successful bid to new sports minister Mansukh Mandaviya on Thursday.

In this document, MOC has identified six disciplines, including yoga, kho kho, kabaddi, chess, T20 cricket and squash for inclusion in the 2036 Olympics if the country gets to host the quadrennial extravaganza.

"We met the new Sports Minister yesterday and handed him the report. The minister said he will need a few days to go through it. But he asked us to prepare another report on how sports can be a career option in the country, how to build interest among youth, how to bring private players into MOC told PTI on conditions of anonymity

"We are way ahead in preparing for the Olympic bid which will take place after Paris. But we will have to do a lot of lobbying with IOC during the Paris Games and we are completely prepared," the member added.

Inclusion of host country preferences will be discussion for much later as the hosting rights of the Games have not been finalised. The decision is likely only after the International Olympic Committee has a new President after elections next year.

If at all, India's bid is successful, the proposed events will first have to be introduced as demonstration events in the 2032 Brisbane Games before getting a final go

During the International Olympic Committee (IOC's) Congress in Mumbai last year, Prime Minister Narendra Modi revealed India's ambition to host the Games in 2036, stating that the administration would "leave no stone unturned" in bringing the showpiece



The MOC member said that while the inclusion of these sports would help in enhancing India's medals tally in 2036 Olympics, but the road ahead is not easy as the country will have to extend all possible support in building the base for these disciplines in a minimum number of participating na-

"The sports ministry asked the MOC to prepare a detailed report about our readiness for 2036 Olympics, including identifying new sporting disciplines which a host nation can pitch for, how to control doping menace, bringing more accountability in the working of the national federations and identifying private entities who are interested in investing in

sports," the member told PTI. 'We researched in detail and identified six sports in which are strong. We are masters in yoga, chess, cricket, and kho kho is our traditional sport. So these sports will enhance our medal chances," the member said.

'We have already submitted our report to the ministry which will

take it up with the PMO in due course of time.'

As per the IOC rules, the host Organising Committee of an Olympics can propose for the inclusion of one or more sports, which are popular in the region but that particular event has to be played in all five continents of the

Also taken into account is the history of the sport and the ease with which broadcasters can tele-

The MOC member said it won't be easy to win the Games hosting rights as India will have to fight it out against countries like Qatar, Saudi Arabia, China, Hungary, Germany. Denmark. Canada, Spain United Kingdom, Poland, Mexico, South Korea, Egypt, Chile, Turkey and Indone-

"But these indigenous sports will have to be introduced as demonstration events in 2032 Olympics. Besides India will have to extend support and ensure that a minimum number of countries, which is around 70 plus, have federations in place there. (PTI)

Top of that list would be the opening pair of Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma, both of whom have got starts but have not been able to turn them into defining knocks. They have made a conscious effort



to force the pace but have ended with minimal returns.

Another under-pressure team member is left-hander Shivam Dube, who was picked in the World Cup squad to hammer sixes in the middle and death overs.

However, the IPL form that helped him seal a World Cup berth has deserted him and he is yet to come to the party.

The southpaw did make an unbeaten 31 against the USA in a group league game but it was Suryakumar Yadav's effort that made the difference ultimately.

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
