

I want to spend more time strengthen Cong in Assam, says Jorhat MP Triumphant Gaurav eyes 2026 Assam polls

NEW DELHI, June 13: Congress leader Gaurav Gogoi, who fought and won a remarkable battle in Jorhat in the just-concluded Lok Sabha polls, has said his duty towards Assam is only half done and his immediate priority is to strengthen the party in the state for the 2026 assembly elections.

He also said that it was the responsibility of the Congress, not only in Assam but across India, to remove the "feeling of threat, insecurity, intimidation, oppression or suffocation prevailing now'

'We want the people of India to live freely, follow any religion, support any party and political ideology of their choice and create a sense of freedom. I have already made up my mind that irrespective of the results in Jorhat, even if it is a victory, there are many people in Assam feel that there is an atmosphere of fear and my

job is to make them free from fear," Gogoi told PTI editors in an interaction at the news agency's headquarters.

Asked whether he was ready for a leadership role in Assam, the three-time Lok Sabha member said he was not asking for in 2026 and do (CONTD. ON PAGE-9)

any position or role from the Congress leadership but time so that he can spend more time in Assam to strengthen the party and win the state assembly elections. "My immediate priority will be to

strengthen the Congress in Assam. I said my election is not over. My duty is half finished. My duty to my party is not to just win the seat of Jorhat but to win the state of Assam. And as I said, like in Jorhat, it was a people's campaign, it was a people's victory and that is going to be in 2026 (assembly polls)," he said.

Election to the 126-member Assam assembly is due in early 2026.

"I am looking for spending more time in Assam to strengthen the party. Because we have elections in two years from now. I think it is necessary that we look at the states going to election this year. in 2025.

Guwahati schools asked not to conduct any exams during Ambubachi Mela

HT Bureau GUWAHATI, June 13: In the wake of upcoming Ambubachi Mela, the Inspector of Schools in Kamrup (Metro) district has directed schools not to conduct any examinations during this period to avoid any inconveniences to the students that may arise due to the heavy flow of devotees to Guwahati .

In an official letter addressed to authorities at all schools in the district, the Inspector of Schools said, "Schools are requested not to schedule any examination during 22nd June to 26th June, 2024 on account of Ambubachi. Further, if any schools have already scheduled (CONTD. ON PAGE-9)

Rammohan Naidu takes charge GST Council to meet on June 22 of Civil Aviation Ministry

Chances to take up review of online gaming taxation

NEW DELHI, June 13: The GST Council, chaired by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, will meet after a gap of eight months on June 22, and is likely to review the implementation of 28 per cent GST on the online gaming sector.

"The 53rd meeting of the GST Council will be held on 22nd June, 2024 at New Delhi," the GST Council Secretariat said in a post on X. The 52nd meeting of the GST Council, which comprises finance ministers of all states and UTs, was held on October 7, 2023. The agenda for the 53rd meet-

ing is yet to be circulated amongst the Council members.

This would be the first Council meeting after Lok Sabha elections. Results of the elections were declared on June 4, and Sitharaman was sworn in as a Cabinet minister in the new Modi Government on June 9.

The GST Council is likely to review the decision to levy 28 per cent GST on full value of bets for online gaming companies which came into effect from October 1, 2023. In its meetings in July and August, the GST Council had approved amendments to the law to include online gaming, casinos and horse racing as taxable actionable claims, and clarified that such supplies would attract 28 per cent tax on full bet value.



At that time it was said that a review of the implementation would be carried out after six months, which is April 2024.

Since no GST Council meeting has taken place since April, the June 22 meeting of the Council is expected to review the taxation of the online gaming sector.

NEW DELHI, June 13: Deeptech startup Ethereal Machines on Thursday said it has raised USD 13 million (about ₹ 108.6 crore) in a funding round led by Peak XV Partners and Steadview Capital.

The company plans to deploy the capital for Research & Development and set up its facility in Bengaluru.

The Series A funding round also saw participation from existing investors Blume Ventures, Enam Investments, and Sandeep Singhal.

The homegrown startup builds proprietary multi-axis computer numerical control (CNC) machines in India and utilises them to manufacture precision parts for the aerospace, healthcare, and consumer electronics industries.

"The funds from this round will be utilised for research and development, building India's first multi-axis CNC controller and to commence construction of its second 'Smart Factory' within the next 12 months.

MUMBAI, June 13: The rupee consolidated in a narrow range and settled for the day lower by 7 paise at 83.55 (provisional) against the US dollar on Thursday even as both the domestic equity benchmark indices touched all-time high levels.

Forex traders said rupee was seen resilient against the dollar, even after volatility witnessed in the dollar index, due to CPI data and US Fed's policy decision.

At the interbank foreign exchange, the local unit opened at 83.52 and finally settled for the day lower by 7 paise at 83.55 (provisional) against the American currency. On Wednesday, the rupee appreciated 11 paise to close at 83.48 against the US dollar.

Gogoi also said important elections will be held this year in Jammu and Kashmir, Jharkhand, Maharashtra and Haryana and early next year in Delhi.

"In 2026 we have elections in states like Tamil Nadu, Kerala, West Bengal, Assam etc. So it is necessary for all of us to take the momentum, the positivity that has generated and take that across the country and be mindful of the states going for the elections," he said. (PTI)

Nokia, Ericsson to get shares worth ₹ 2,458 crore in Vodafone Idea in lieu of dues

NEW DELHI, June 13: Debt-ridden telecom operator Vodafone Idea will allocate shares worth ₹ 2,458 crore to vendors Nokia India and Ericsson India to clear their partial dues, a regulatory filing said on Thursday.

The board of Vodafone Idea Ltd (VIL) has cleared allotment of shares on preferential basis at about 35 per cent higher price compared to the follow-on offer price of the company, and comes with a lock-in of 6 months.

"The Board of Directors of Vodafone Idea Limited today approved preferential allotment of about 166 crore equity shares of face value of ₹ 10 each, at an issue price of ₹ 14.80 per share, for an aggregate consideration of up to ₹ 2,458 crore, to two of its key vendors, Nokia Solutions and Networks India Private Limited and Ericsson India Private Limited," the filing said.

Nokia and Ericsson will participate for up to Rs 1,520 crore and Rs 938 crore respectively, subject to approval by VIL shareholders at the EGM to be held on July 10, 2024, the telco said in a release.



"Nokia and Ericsson both have a long-term partnership with VIL, as key suppliers of network equipment, and this preferential allotment will enable VIL to clear part of their outstanding dues," the filing said.

Post this preferential issuance, the shareholding of Nokia and Ericsson in the company will be 1.5 per cent and 0.9 per cent, respectively

The shareholding of VIL promoters -- Aditya Birla Group and Vodafone -- will stand at 37.3 per

cent while government's shareholding will come down to 23.2 per cent and the balance 37.1 per cent will be public shareholding. Earlier, VIL has issued ₹ 1,600 crore worth optionally convertible debentures (OCDs) to mobile tower vendor ATC, out of which the tower vendor has picked stake worth ₹ 1,440 crore in the debt-ridden telecom operator.



NAGAON, June 13: Due to the alleged misuse of construction materials, such as low-quality bitumen, by the construction agencies, the under-construction NH 37 four-lane road from Uriagaon Chariali, Nagaon, towards Sonitpur - Biswanath Chariali under NHIDCL, Tezpur office, has developed cracks and large potholes in various places within months of its completion. The section from Amoni to Kaliabor Tiniali has been particularly affected.

The locals, however, claimed that as per the norms of the National Highway, if any part of an under-construction road cracks or gets damaged due to technical or other reasons, construction agencies should clear the entire damaged area and reconstruct it accordingly. Instead of clearing the damaged areas on the road, the construction agencies simply repaired all those potholes and are trying to clear their remaining dues from NHIDCL, the locals alleged.

Therefore, they urged the authority concerned of NHIDCL not to pay the dues until the damaged areas of the under-construction NH four-lane road are properly reconstructed. Besides, the locals also sought a high-level official probe into this matter.

Cong prepares for RS battle

he Indian National Congress (INC) is gearing up for a crit-ical political contest in the Rajya Sabha, following a narrow escape from losing the post of Leader of Opposition (LoP) in the Upper House. With two members recently elected to the Lok Sabha, the INC's strength in the Rajya Sabha has dipped to 26, just one above the required number to hold the LoP position. Currently, Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge holds the LoP position in the Rajya Sabha. In the Lok Sabha, the INC, having secured 99 seats in the 18th Lok Sabha, is set to reclaim the LoP post it lost in 2014. The party's previous attempts in 2014 and 2019 were thwarted by insufficient seats. With this crucial role in both Houses, Congress will significantly influence key decisions and proceedings, particularly as the leading party in the opposition INDIA bloc against the NDA led by the BJP. The upcoming Rajya Sabha elections, scheduled for July or August, will fill 10 vacant seats, with fierce contests expected in Haryana and Maharashtra. The stakes are high, as out of the 10 vacancies, two each are from Assam, Bihar, and Maharashtra, and one each from Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Haryana, and Tripura. Currently, seven of these seats are held by the BJP, two by the Congress, and one by the RJD. The BJP, with 90 members in the Rajya Sabha, aims to retain its seats and potentially capture those held by Congress and the RJD, especially as it faces reduced influence in the Lok Sabha after the recent elections.

The BJP's internal dynamics add complexity to the upcoming elections. Key leaders like Piyush Goyal, Biplab Kumar Deb, Jyotiraditya Scindia, Vivek Thakur, Sarbananda Sonowal, Kamakhya Prasad Tasa, and Udayanraje Bhonsale are exiting the Rajya Sabha, necessitating a new leader for the BJP in the House. The party's aggressive strategies, such as engineering defections and cross-voting, have previously disrupted Congress's plans, as seen in Himachal Pradesh where BJP's Harsh Mahajan won against Congress's Abhishek Manu Singhvi. In the upcoming elections, the BJP is well-positioned in Assam, Tripura, Madhya Pradesh, and Rajasthan, barring any cross-voting in favor of INDIA bloc candidates. In Bihar, the BJP and RJD are expected to secure one seat each. However, Harvana and Maharashtra present significant challenges for the BJP. In Haryana's 90-member assembly, where three seats are vacant, the BJP holds 41 seats, supported by one independent and one HLP MLA, bringing their tally to 43. The opposition INDIA bloc has 44 MLAs, including Congress's 29 and JJP's 10. The Congress hopes to secure a win if there's no cross-voting, but internal dissent within the JJP, with six out of 19 MLAs disgruntled with Dushyant Choutala, complicates matters. In Maharashtra, the BJP's situation is precarious due to tensions with allies Eknath Shinde-led Shiv Sena and Ajit Pawar-led NCP over cabinet allocations. This rift could impact BJP's electoral prospects.

In the 90-member Haryana assembly, 3 seats are vacant. Out of 87 current members, BJP has 41, Congress has 29, JJP has 10, INLD has 1, HLP has 1, and 5 are independent MLAs. One independent and one HLP MLA have declared their support for BJP and hence BJP's tally goes up to 43 while INDIA bloc has 44 MLAs. Congress hopes that their candidate would win if there would not be any cross-voting against their candidate. However, it would be difficult for the Congress since 6 out of 19 JJP MLAs are angry with Dushyant Choutala, and two of them have announced support for BJP. In Maharashtra, BJP's problem is likely to become serious on account of its angry allies, the Eknath Shinde-led Shiv Sena and the Ajit Pawar-led NCP, over perceived injustice done to them by PM Narendra Modi while allotting ministries in his cabinet. This may cast a shadow on the BJP's electoral fortunes. Opposition INDIA bloc parties - Congress, NCP(SP), and Shiv Sena (UBT) - are trying to fish in troubled waters. The Rajya Sabha elections are a litmus test for both the Congress and BJP. For Congress, maintaining its LoP position is crucial for asserting its influence in the Upper House. For the BJP, retaining or expanding its Rajya Sabha presence is vital for legislative strength amidst a reduced majority in the Lok Sabha. As both parties brace for this high-stakes battle, the political landscape promises intense and strategic manoeuvres in

From customary law to constitutional rights: Eastern Naga people's unified pursuit of Frontier Nagaland Territory

n the annals of political theory, the agency of individual choice and collective conscience is often highlighted as a pivotal force in shaping the actions and orientations of larger social entities. This dynamic interplay is vividly illustrated in the decision of the Eastern Nagaland Peoples' Organisation (ENPO) to abstain from all centre and state elections. This decision reflects a profound embodiment of "bottom-up" decision-making that aligns with Eastern Naga customary traditions and is safeguarded under Article 371A of the Indian Constitution. This abstention underscores the importance of the voice of the local, grassroots populace, showcasing how genuine demands and aspirations of individuals, reflected in community conscience, can influence and steer political participation and collective action on a national stage.

Coalition dynamics adds new compulsion to Sitharaman's budget-making

Taving been confirmed as the finance minister in the Modi 3:0 cabinet, Nirmala Sitharaman is more pressed for time compared to her other colleagues as the budget of the new government is hardly a month away. And her budget-making this time is more complex as she has to accommodate the compulsions of coalition politics as well. Overall, she faces a complex landscape of economic challenges.

After Prime Minister Narendra Modi failed to win a clear majority for the BJP, his government has been forced to secure the support of coalition partners - Chandrababu Naidu's TDP and Bihar strongman Nitish Kumar's JD-U, both prone to switching loyalties at the drop of a hat. The implications for Modi 3:0 need no elucidation. Nirmala Sitharaman has to navigate diverse interests, manage expectations and build consensus on economic policies, none of which is an easy task.

Coalition dynamics will constantly demand her attention. Satisfying alliance partners' demands without compromising economic stability is a delicate task, marked by intricate challenges. She must find common ground while safeguarding the nation's financial health and this will call for a rare ability to balance fiscal conservatism, coalition realities, and growth imperatives.

Nirmala Sitharaman has been at the helm of India's finance ministry for five years, presenting six consecutive budgets. Her appointment as the first woman to hold this position for a full term marked a significant personal milestone. During her tenure, she implemented key reforms, including reducing the base corporate tax rate from 30 percent to 22 percent and announcing a Rs 20 lakh crore special economic package to combat the pandemic-induced economic challenges.

Sitharaman is seen likely to adhere to her previous policies, aiming for fiscal consolidation. Her past efforts reduced the fiscal deficit from 5.8 percent to 5.6 percent and the commitment to prudent fiscal management will be crucial in the



current context. As the Indian economy operates in a dynamic global environment, she also has to steer it through geopolitical tensions, trade disruptions and economic shifts worldwide. Managing these uncertainties while safeguarding India's interests is no small feat.

The pandemic-induced economic slowdown continues to strain government finances. The finance minister has to, therefore, strike a delicate balance between stimulating growth and maintaining fiscal discipline. Ensuring prudent spending while addressing pressing needs will be a tightrope act. The middle class eagerly awaits relief from inflation, tax burdens, and rising costs and the budget decisions will directly impact their lives. Meeting their expectations while maintaining fiscal prudence is a formidable challenge.

The election results have given the ruling party a crude shock that the real issues that determine voter behaviour go beyond the routine rhetoric of identity politics, which Modi has been trying to exploit throughout the 2024 election campaign. He hopped from one divisive issue to another through the various phases of campaigning, little realising that people at the grassroots level were more worried about their daily lives than issues of faith or identities.

This has put an additional burden on the new government, which means adequate resources have to be found to pursue employment creation, a low priority for the Modi government ever since it came to power in 2014, despite tall

claims to the contrary from time to time. The government has been trying to counter the lapse through dubious attempts to re-interpret statistics and definitions of employment.

There has been talk about a national employment policy, which, however, remained at the academic level. With 90 percent of employment accounted for by the informal sector, the employment generation schemes of the government have largely bypassed this most important section of the army of unemployed. It has been proved beyond doubt that "pakora economics" does not work and rural vouth need real and paying jobs. This will mean Nirmala Sitharaman has to concentrate more on this vital section of the population.

Modi has been promising to double farmers' income, but the situation on the ground has been quite different. The farmers have been agitating against the policies of the central government and the ruling party has had to pay a heavy price for the approach of dismissal towards these problems. It is now time to atone and Nirmala Sitharaman has to allocate adequate resources for this in her budget. This has never been an overriding consideration for her previous budgets

Additionally, as the country aspires to become a \$5 trillion economy, the finance minister has to drive growth by encouraging investment and innovation alongside job creation. Balancing shortterm measures with long-term structural reforms is crucial. (IPA Service)

Whenever a prominent figure introduces a new concept, many people tend to follow suit. This isn't inherently problematic; it simply reflects human nature and highlights the power of words in a given era. It's crucial to analyze these trends objectively, without passing judgment. For instance, today's focus on 'skill' in the national discourse has made it a central theme in education and training.

Efforts are being made to offer degrees in various skill-based disciplines. A few decades ago, the term 'skill' was not viewed positively. No university vice-chancellor would have considered offering a degree in 'skills'. Education was seen as a grand, lofty concept, which it still is. The concern was that focusing on skills might diminish the perceived grandeur of the educational process.

Delving into that debate may not

be productive at this point.

The ascendancy of skills in education

The reality is that times have changed, and skills are now regarded as a prestigious pursuit. As previously mentioned, there are initiatives to offer degrees specifically focused on skill development. This shift likely reflects a growing appreciation for practical learning. Skills that can be applied in realworld situations are increasingly being valued.

Whether this is positive or negative is debatable, but it does highlight a trend towards prioritizing practical application over theoretical understanding. Consequently, concepts and ideas may be neglected.

While the merits of this shift can be discussed separately, it is clear that this focus on skills prompts reflection. Skills are undeniably important, perhaps even more so than their everyday recognition suggests.

Skills form the foundation of all relationships. Attraction to another person is based on their abilities, whether it's singing, cooking, speaking, dancing, or countless other skills. The truth is, without skills, no one would be drawn to another. Even a parent is captivated by their child through the child's actions, such as a simple smile. This illustrates the importance of skills. Without a smile, a child wouldn't attract attention.

When adults interact with a child, they seek to establish communication, and the child's response becomes the focal point of this attention. This early interaction lays the groundwork for learning communication and other skills.

The crucial role of skill in human relationships is rarely acknowledged, whether through detailed analysis or poetic celebration. If it had been, we would better understand that even emotional bonds are built on a foundation of skills. Nevertheless, skills add depth to playfulness, friendship, and relationships, and from there, extend to earning a liv-

Today, skill development is being integrated into formal education, leading to degrees. For example, bricklaying in construction can now be recognized with a degree. Essentially, a degree benchmarks standards of proficiency. Similarly, there are proposals for degrees in fields like acting and beyond.

In simpler terms, just like any traditional degree, a skill-based degree opens doors to earning a livelihood. This is a relatively new development, offering more earning potential and avenues than ever before. It has broadened and enriched the concept of learning, commonly referred to as 'education' in everyday conversation.

The educational industry encompasses various components, although they are not always categorized in operational terms. Therefore, it may be time to classify different types of learning and skills. This aspect of education warrants deeper thought and analysis than it has received thus far, particularly in the context of earnng a degree.

It might be a valid proposition to suggest that to fully comprehend the role of 'skills' within the realm of learning, one must first reconsider the structure of traditional education degrees. This could entail starting with a review of the curriculum for B.Ed. and M.Ed. degrees. It's widely acknowledged that translating philosophical reflections into practical reality necessitates a focal point for intervention. In the preceding text, the philosophical contemplation on skills has been intertwined with practical action and research. Why the militant attack on pilgrims is a India voted out worrying turn for the Jammu region

n Sunday evening, as Narendra Modi was about to take oath as prime minister for his third term, a bus carrying pilgrims from a Hindu religious shrine was attacked by suspected militants in the Reasi district of Jammu and Kashmir.

At least nine passengers were killed and more than 40 injured. The victims included the driver, the conductor of the bus as well as a two-yearold child.

This is the most lethal militant strike on civilians in Jammu and Kashmir this year. What is more concerning is that the attack has taken place in an area which is widely considered militancy-free, suggesting that the growing militancy activities in neighbouring Rajouri and Poonch districts have spilled over to Reasi.

Given its proximity to Jammu district, important religious shrines and hydroelectricity projects, Reasi is relatively better developed in terms of infrastructure and road connectivity than Rajouri and Poonch.

This is the second attack on pilgrims in Jammu's Reasi district since 2022. In May that year, four pilgrims were killed and 24-odd injured when a bus returning from the Mata Vaishno Devi shrine caught fire. While the incident was initially categorised as an accident, subsequent investigations found that militants had attached bombs to the bus.

The attack on Hindu pilgrims in Reasi is likely to put the Bharatiya Janata Party-led Union government in a spot, as the party has claimed that its decision to scrap Article 370 and downgrade Jammu and Kashmir into a Union territory has brought peace in the strife-torn region.

The party has also argued that the surge in the number of tourists to the Union territory

is more proof of normalcy since 2019. On Monday, the Congress slammed the Modi government for the worrying security situation in Jammu and Kashmir.

The attack has evoked widespread condemnations from local Opposition parties in Jammu and Kashmir too.

"It is unfortunate to see areas that had previously been cleared of all militants see a Act. return of militancy," former Jammu and Kashmir chief minister and National Confer-

ence vice president Omar Abdullah said in a post on social media platform X on Sunday. The attack Hub of religious tourism

When it comes to religious tourism in the Hindu-majority Jammu region, Reasi district tops the chart.

According to the 2011 census, Muslims comprise 50% of the population of the district, while Hindus are 49%. Every year, more than 1 crore pilgrims from across the country pay obeisance at the shrine of Mata Vaishno Devi in Katra. The entire Katra town is dotted with hundreds of hotels, dhabas and guest

It is common for pilgrims visiting Vaishno Devi to plan a trip to the Shiv Khori cave. The common base camp for sailants such pilgrims is usually Katra town. The annual footfall at the Shiv Khori shrine in Ransoo – where the victims of Sunday's attack had gone to

pray – is nearly 20 lakh. Popular legend has it that forces. The militants have

the cave which houses the shrine was discovered by a Muslim shepherd while he was looking for his lost goats.

While it is one of the most revered Shiva shrines in Jammu region, its management and functioning was institutionalised only in 2008 when the state government passed The Jammu & Kashmir Shri Shiv Khori Shrine

The act, meant for "better management, administration and governance of Shri Shiv Khori Shrine", came into force in April 2010.

According to the police, the bus came under attack around 6.10 pm on Sunday when it was returning from the Shiv Khori shrine to Katra town, some 72 km away.

Evewitnesses told Daily Excelsior that a group of two to three masked militants opened fire on the bus near Kanda village of Taryath area.

The road on which the attack took place connects Reasi with the neighbouring Rajouri district. Much like the rest of Pir Panjal region, the terrain of the area is mountainous and treacherous, with dense forest cover usually working in favour of the as-

Since 2021, Rajouri and Poonch districts of Jammu's Pir Panjal region have witnessed multiple precision strikes by militants resulting in huge losses to security

> At least 50 people were on board when the incident took place. While the driver and the conductor of the bus were local residents of Jammu, all the passengers were from different states of the country including Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan. Among the deceased pilgrims, four were from Rajasthan while three were from Uttar Pradesh.

Following the attack, pictures of empty bullet cartridges collected by the police provided some sense of the sophisticated weapons used by the militants.

So far, the police have not officially blamed any particular militant group. However, given the scale and nature of the attack, it is likely that foreign militants active in the Pir Panjal region are behind the

attack "The idea [behind the attack] is to instill fear among people, particularly pilgrims,' said a former police officer, who requested not to be identified. "But the larger message seems that terrorists operating in the belt are feeling a bit emboldened. Security agencies need to do more.

Last month, militants had targeted a convoy of the Indian Air Force in Surankote area of Poonch district, resulting in the death of one airman and injuries to four others. While the security forces had launched a massive search operation in the belt that contin-

ued for days, there was no trace of militants.

On May 31, a brief exchange of fire between militants and security forces had taken place in Poonch's Marha Buffliaz after security forces had launched a night search operation in the area. Once again, militants managed to give slip to security forces by taking advantage of darkness.

A new challenge

Sunday's attack has emerged as a fresh challenge for the security forces in the Pir Panjal region. The fact that militants have been able to strike in Reasi is worrying given the more than twodecade-long peace in the region

The last time Reasi had experienced the horrors of militancy were in the mid-1990s and early 2000s, when militants carried out several massacres of Hindus in the region. In that period, as security forces carried out a brutal and sweeping crackdown on militancy in Kashmir Valley, the armed insurgency spilled over to Jammu region of the erst-

A similar pattern has been evident since the scrapping of Jammu and Kashmir's special status under Article 370 and the end of its statehood.

With New Delhi cracking down on the support system of militancy and separatist politics in the region, the armed violence in Kashmir Valley has come down heavily. At the same time, there has been a resurgence of militant attacks in the mountainous Pir Panial belt of Jammu region.

On Monday, Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha said culprits behind the attack won't be speared. "The attack is part of a nefarious design to somehow spread turmoil to the Jammu region but we are determined to thwart such an attempt," Sinha told reporters in Jammu. (Courtesy: Scroll.in)

However, divergent interests within the group and threat perception of other Ouad members sometime overshadow that concern conceptually. Besides, the China question in India's national discourse continues to grow starker. India has not only increased footprints in the South China Sea but has openly backed the Philippines's rights to operate freely against Chinese harassment and counter-claims of sovereignty which is at odds with the 2016 decision of the Permanent Court of Arbitration.

India's reluctance to embrace a militarised Quad is rooted in its pursuit of strategic autonomy as the appropriate foreign policy approach. This deeprooted origins of the suspicion of alliance politics among India's strategic elites perhaps dates back to the nationalist opinion in interwar years which saw imperial competition, alliance chain-ganging, and arms race as responsible for the misery of World War I. The consequent pursuit of a nonaligned foreign policy paid reasonable dividends in the post-independence years as India mostly faced a relaxed geopolitical environment as a preponderant power in its immediate neighbourhood, safely tucked away from the frontlines of the Cold War superpower conflict.

Even so, in cases of urgent national security threats, Indian policymakers were prudent enough to quickly put to

rest the shibboleths of non-alignment, with Nehru asking Kennedy for military aid in the 1962 border war, Shastri's pursuit of extended nuclear umbrella from both superpowers in the mid-1960s, and Indira Gandhi's de facto mutual defence treaty with the Soviet Union in 1971. While security alignments do come with the risks of entrapment and might serve to generate spirals of mistrust with an adversary, the upsides of reliance on external powers to augment own capabilities in the face of a threatening polar power warrant a serious consideration on part of India to shed its inertia and hesitancy.

Altered realities

The locations of the Chinese incursion and its disengagement pattern in the Ladakh crisis point to its intent of asserting the maximalist 1959 claim lines. Based on its actions in Ladakh and elsewhere, China can reasonably be construed as a rational security-driven actor with revisionist intentions adopting a strategy of salami slicing to present its opponents with a fait accompli.

On Beijing's part, the use of fait accompli tactic relies on the hope of preventing the adversarial response in terms of a counterbalancing coalition or an escalation of dispute into an outright war- measures entailing too high a cost for China.

Further, for the most part, China has historically seen India through the prism of its relation with other great powers, refusing to treat New Delhi on equal terms. On its part, India sought a modus vivendi with China on the border in the post-Cold War years and later shifted to the strategy of evasive balancing which mixed India's pursuit of security partnerships and ramping up of own capabilities with a reassurance policy of sending signals of its benign intentions to China.

China's incursions in Ladakh in 2020 and its use of grey-zone coercion tactics with the Philippines, Australia,

and Taiwan, however, has warranted a shift in the Indo-Pacific countries' geopolitics. The rise of a criss-crossing web of minilaterals in the region stemmed from the need to respond to the Chinese aggression.

including a resuscitated Quad in 2017, so far have failed to deter China from instigating territorial disputes in both the continental and maritime theatres. As a rational, revisionist actor that responds to external geopolitical conditions, China can be deterred by concerted efforts from the US, its allies, and like-minded partners. The Quad's failure in deterring the Chinese ingress in Ladakh in 2020 can precisely be attributed to Beijing's perception of India's unwillingness to impose intolerable costs in retaliation. To put it clearly, India's fear of stoking a spiral of mistrust with China led it to only reluctantly embrace the Quad and its Indo-Pacific partners which, in turn, emboldened China enough to launch the aggression in the hope that it won't face punishment from the US and other nations.



A Group of Seven summit has opened in Italy G7 summit opens with deal to use Russian assets for Ukraine



BORGO EGNAZIA, June 13: A Group of Seven summit opened on Thursday with agreement reached on a U.S. proposal to back a \$50 billion loan to Ukraine using frozen Russian assets as collateral. giving Kyiv a strong show of support even as Europe's political chessboard shifts to the right

Italian Premier Giorgia Meloni welcomed the G7 heads of state to the summit at a luxury resort in southern Italy, saying she wanted the message of this meeting to be one of dialogue with the global south and unity. She likened the G7 to the ancient olive trees that are a symbol of the Puglia region, "with their solid roots, and branches projected toward the future.'

Beyond the the war in Ukraine, Pope Francis will become the first pope to address a G7 summit, adding a dash of celebrity and moral authority to the annual gathering. He'll be speaking Friday about the promises and perils of artificial intelligence, but is expected to also renew his appeal for a peaceful end to Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine and the Israel-Hamas war in Gaza.

The G7 includes Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, the United Kingdom and the United States. Italy, which is hosting the summit, has invited several African leaders - Algerian President Abdelmadjid Tebboune, Kenyan President William Ruto and Tunisian President Kais Saied - to press Italy's development and migration initiatives on the continent.

Other guests include Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy, Brazilian President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva, Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi, fresh off his own election, and Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan

With Biden, U.K. Prime Minister Rishi Sunak and now French President Emmanuel Macron facing elections in the coming months, pressure was on the G7 to get done what it can while the status quo lasts.

The U.S. proposal involves engineering a \$50 billion loan to help Ukraine in its fight against Russia that would use interest earned on profits from Russia's frozen central bank assets, most of them held in the European Union, as collateral.

A French official, briefing reporters Wednesday, said a political decision by the leaders had been reached but that technical and legal details of the mechanism to tap into the assets still had to be worked out. The issue is complicated because if the Russian assets one day are unfrozen — say if the war ends — then the windfall profits will no longer be able to be used to pay off the loan, requiring a burdensharing arrangement with other countries.

In addition to the deal, Sunak announced up to 242 million pounds (286 million euros or \$310 million) in nonmilitary aid to Ukraine for humanitarian, energy and stabilization needs. Washington also sent strong signals of support, with widened sanctions against Russia to target Chinese companies that are helping its war machine.

The reason behind her sudden decision is not yet known.



GANGTOK, June 13: At least one person was killed and five others went missing as massive landslides triggered by incessant rainfall caused devastation in Sikkim's Mangan district, officials said on Thursday

Landslides blocked stretches of roads and several houses were inundated or damaged, while electricity poles were swept away, they said. The body of a person was found in Pakshep area of Mangan, while three persons went missing from Ambithang near Rangrang and two others from Pakshep.

Three houses were damaged in Geythang, while several houses were damaged and roads blocked at Nampathang near Pentok, they said.

The Bringbong police outpost was shifted to another nearby location due to a landslide while the foundation of a bridge at Sankalan was damaged. Mobile network services were affected in North Sikkim even as a request was made



and officials of other departments to ensure a swift response to the devastation.

"Efforts are underway to provide every possible support to the victims and affected families, including recovery assistance, temporary settlement, and the provision of basic needs," Tamang said in a statement.

"The state government stands firmly with the victims of this unfortunate incident, pledging the utmost support to the bereaved families and all those affected and displaced by the landslides," he said. (PTI)

Anger in country over NEET exam will 'reverberate inside Parliament': Cong

NEW DELHI, June 13: The Congress on Thursday again demanded a Supreme Court-monitored probe into the NEET exam issue, and asserted that the anger in the country over the matter will "reverberate inside Parliament as well". The opposition party also sought the removal of the National Testing Agency (NTA) Director General and claimed that the BJP government's attitude towards the ongoing demand for an inquiry into the NEET examination is "irresponsible and insensitive".

Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge said that in the last 10 years, the Modi government has ruined the future of crores of youth through paper leaks and rigging.

'Grace Marks was not the only problem in NEET exam. There has been rigging, papers have been leaked, corruption has taken place. The future of 24 lakh students appearing in the NEET examination is at stake due to the actions of the Modi government," the Congress president said. A nexus of exam centre and coaching centre has been formed, where

the game of "pay money, get paper" is being played, he alleged.

The Modi government cannot escape its responsibility by placing the responsibility of its actions on the shoulders of NTA. There should be a CBI investigation into the entire NEET scam. If the Modi government is not ready for a CBI inquiry then the Congress party demands a fair inquiry under the supervision of the Supreme Court," Kharge said in a post. After investigation, the culprits should be given the harshest punishment and lakhs of students should be given compensation to save their year from being wasted, he said.

Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh also hit out at the government, saying the "one-third padhan mantri's" government has tried to wriggle its way out of the simmering NEET controversy and scam.

"It has assured the Supreme Court that grace marks given to 1563 students will be cancelled. But why were the grace marks given in the first place? The primary reason appears to be one physics question in the paper which gave four options. According to the new NCERT Class 12 text book, one of the four was right. But on the basis of an older textbook, another option could also be considered right," he said.

The students who ticked the latter, in addition to students who lost time due to delays in paper distribution, etc. were given grace marks, Ramesh said. "It is a pathetic state of affairs, reflecting on both the National Testing Agency and the NCERT," he said.

Ramesh posed questions to Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan and Health Minister J P Nadda.

Was the NEET question paper leaked, as indicated by several media and social media reports and a FIR filed by a student in Patna, he asked. "Were the results of the NEET-UG paper released ten days earlier than anticipation, on June 4th instead of June 14th so that they would coincide with the Lok Sabha Election results and attract less media attention?" he

said. Since 2019, there haven't been more than three toppers in any year of NEET UG, which is the single gateway for admission to all MBBS programmes in the country, Ramesh pointed out.

"In 2019 and 2020, there was one topper each. There were three toppers in 2021, one in 2022, and two last year. How did not one or two, but 67 students achieve a perfect score of 720 in 2024? 44 of them benefitted from the grace marks - but that still leaves us with 23 toppers, eleven times higher than last year. What changed this year?" he said.

"How do multiple NEET-UG 2024 toppers, all belonging to the same state, have similar roll numbers? Were they from the same examination center?" Ramesh said. The fate of 24 lakh students is hanging in the balance, he added. Addressing a press conference at the AICC headquarters here, Congress leader Gaurav Gogoi also slammed the government over the issue. "We demand a Supreme Court monitored investigation into this entire scandal which has affected around 24 lakh students," he said.

"The Congress believes that the BJP government's attitude towards the ongoing demand for an inquiry into the NEET exam is irresponsible and insensitive...Ordinary families have been forced to cough up amounts close to Rs 30 lakh due to promises given to them by different coaching and examination centres," he said.

"We believe that no inquiry can be a just, fair and comprehensive if it is headed by the NTA itself. The NTA chairperson should be removed and Prime minister Narendra Modi, who likes giving exam advice to Class 10 students, should not forget the mental anxiety caused to these undergraduates," Gogoi said.

Instead of paying attention to the "NEET scam", he is busy attending oath-taking ceremonies and going abroad on foreign trips, he said. Rest assured, the INDIA bloc will take up the cause of these students

because that is our responsibility, Gogoi said. "Now the INDIA bloc has the sufficient strength to bring the govern-

AI, energy, Africa to be in focus, says PM Modi as he leaves for Italy

NEW DELHI, June 13: As he embarks on a visit to Italy to attend an Outreach session at the G7 summit, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday said its focus would be on artificial intelligence. energy, Africa, and the Mediterranean. Modi said this in a departure statement before leaving for the European nation in his first for-

eign trip after becoming prime minister for a third term. The prime minister said issues crucial for the Global South will also be deliberated upon at the Outreach session.

The G7 summit, to be held in the luxury resort of Borgo Egnazia in Italy's Apulia region from June 13 to 15, is expected to be dominated by the raging war in Ukraine and the conflict in Gaza.

"At the invitation of Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni, I am travelling to Apulia region in Italy to participate in the G7 Outreach summit on June 14," Modi said. The prime minister said he was glad that his first visit in the third consecutive term is to Italy for the G-7 Summit.

"During the discussions at the Outreach session, the focus will be on artificial intelligence, energy, Africa, and the Mediterranean," Modi said.

"It will be an opportunity to bring greater synergy between the outcomes of the G20 Summit held under India's Presidency and the forthcoming G7 Summit, and deliberate on issues which are crucial for the Global South," he said. Modi will have a bilateral meeting with Italian Prime Minister Meloni. "Prime Minister Meloni's two visits to India last year were instrumental in infusing momentum and depth in our bilateral agenda," he

said. "We remain committed to consolidating the India-Italy strategic partnership, and bolstering cooperation in the Indo-Pacific and the Mediterranean regions," he said

The prime minister is likely to hold a number of bilateral meetings on the sidelines of the summit. "I am also looking forward to

meeting other leaders participating in the Summit,"

he said. The G7 comprises the US, the UK, France, Italy, Germany, Canada and Japan. Italy is holding the current presidency of the G7 (Group of Seven) and is hosting the summit in that capacity.

A key focus of the Italian presidency has been to defend the rulesbased international system.

According to Italy, Russia's war of aggression on Ukraine has undermined its principles and triggered growing instability, with multiple crises unfolding worldwide. The G7 will give equal importance to the conflict in the Middle East, with its consequences for the global agenda, it says.

The bloc expanded into the G8 between 1997 and 2013, with the inclusion of Russia. However, Russia's participation was suspended in 2014 following its annexation of Crimea.

In line with the grouping's tradition, representatives of a number of countries and international organisations are invited to the summit by the host nation that holds the chair.

Besides India, Italy has invited leaders from 11 developing countries in Africa, South America and the Indo-Pacific region to attend the summit. Though the European Union is not a member of the G7. it attends the annual summit. (PTI)

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Kuwait fire: IAF aircraft on standby to bring back mortal remains of Indians

NEW DELHI, June 13: Kuwaiti authorities are conducting DNA tests on the bodies of over 40 Indians killed in the devastating fire in Mangaf area and an IAF aircraft is on standby to bring back the mortal remains, officials said on Thursday.

Minister of State for External Affairs Kirti Vardhan Singh reached Kuwait to oversee assistance to Indians injured in the fire and to ensure early repatriation of mortal remains.

The total number of people killed in the fire incident in the southern Kuwait locality is 49 and 42 of them are learnt to be Indians, the officials said.

The IAF aircraft has been kept on stand-by to bring back the mortal remains, officials said. Hours after arriving in Kuwait, Singh met the Gulf nation's foreign minister Abdullah Ali Al-Yahya.

The Indian embassy in Kuwait said Al-Yahya assured of full support including for medical care, early repatriation of mortal remains and investigation into the incident.

"FM Yahya conveyed his condolences on the tragic incident. He assured full support including for medical care, early repatriation of mortal remains and investigation of the incident," the mission said on X.

"MoS conveyed his appreciation for the cooperation being extended by all concerned authorities of Kuwait," it said. Singh also visited Mubarak Al

Kabeer hospital where seven injured Indians are admitted.

"In an unfortunate and tragic fire incident earlier today in a Labour housing facility in Mangaf area of Kuwait, around 40 Indians are understood to have died and over 50 injured," the Ministry of External Affairs had said in a statement late on Wednesday night.

Last night, Prime Minister Modi reviewed the situation at a meeting with External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar, NSA Ajit

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Doval, Foreign Secretary Vinay Kwatra and Principal Secretary to PM PK Mishra among others. Following the meeting, the prime minister announced exgratia relief of Rs 2 lakh to the families of the deceased Indian nationals from the PM's Relief

nationals from the PM's Relief Fund and directed that the government should extend all possible assistance. Jaishankar spoke to his

Kuwaiti counterpart Abdullah Ali Al-Yahya on phone and urged him for the early repatriation of the mortal remains of those killed.

"Spoke to Kuwaiti FM Abdullah Ali Al-Yahya on the fire tragedy in Kuwait. Apprised of the efforts made by Kuwaiti authorities in that regard. Was assured that the incident would be fully investigated and that responsibility will be fixed," Jaishankar said on X on Wednesday night.

"Urged the early repatriation of the mortal remains of those who lost their lives. He emphasized that those injured were getting the requisite medical attention," he said. The officials had said most of the Indian victims are from Kerala.

The fire in Al-Mangaf building was reported to authorities in Al-Ahmadi governorate at 4.30 am on Wednesday and most of the deaths were due to smoke inhalation, Kuwaiti media reported, adding the fire started in a kitchen.

Construction firm NBTC group rented the building for the stay of more than 195 workers, most of them Indians from Kerala, Tamil Nadu and northern states, the Kuwaiti media said. The NBTC group is partly owned by an Indian, officials said.

Interior Minister of Kuwait Sheikh Fahad Al-Yousuf Al-Sabah ordered an investigation into the fire incident and issued directions to apprehend the owner and janitor of Al-Mangaf

J&K: DGP talks tough on terror, warns locals supporting terrorism

KATRA/JAMMU, June 13: In the wake of four terror attacks in as many days, Jammu and Kashmir Director General of Police R R Swain on Thursday accused Pakistan of trying to disturb peaceful atmosphere through its mercenaries, and asserted that the Indian forces were determined to give a befitting response to the enemy.

He warned the "enemy agents" that they would repent their decision of supporting terrorism and said "they have stakes including families, land and jobs unlike Pakistani terrorists who have nothing to lose." Terrorists struck at four places in Reasi, Kathua, and Doda districts over the past four days, killing nine people, including seven pilgrims returning from Shiv Khouri temple, and a CRPF jawan, and left seven security personnel and several others injured.

Two suspected Pakistani terrorists were killed in an encounter with

security forces in Kathua and a large quantity of arms and ammun tion were recovered from them.

"The starting point (of terrorism in J&K) is across the border. The clear intent of the adversary is that if they cannot motivate locals for subversive activities to disturb the peaceful atmosphere in Kashmir, send their own people, Pakistanis, after recruiting them there and forcibly pushing them into this side," the DGP told reporters in Reasi district. The police chief was in Katra, the base camp for the pilgrims visiting the famous Mata Vaishno Devi shrine, and chaired a highlevel meeting to review security in the district, where terrorists attacked a bus Sunday evening, killing nine and injuring 41.

The meeting, among others, was attended by Reasi Deputy Commissioner, Vishesh Paul Mahajan, Udhampur-Reasi Range Deputy Inspector General of Police Rayees Mohammad Bhat, and Reasi Senior Superintendent of Police Mohita Sharma.

"The enemy agents are doing it (helping foreign terrorists) for money and narcotics. They will be identified and dealt with sternly. We want to warn them that while the (foreign) terrorists will get killed ... those who are supporting them will repent," the police chief said. He said the foreign terrorists have nobody to care about, whether they have children or not. "We don't know whom they are sending here after picking them from jails. Those who are supporting them have land, children and jobs here and they will suffer."

Swain said Pakistan seeks to use the tough terrain of Jammu and Kashmir by sending foreign terrorists into the forests and to disturb the peaceful atmosphere. "This is the truth." He, however, said the security forces are determined and promise-bound to maintain peace and eradicate terrorism from Jammu and Kashmir.

"What will be our response? We are ready for the small loss because when a war is thrust upon us and terrorists stand before us to kill or get killed, we utilize all our resources and our effort is to give a befitting response. Since they don't have anyone to care about, their power to inflict loss appears more," he said.

He said terrorism spread its tentacles to Jammu region especially Doda and Ramban in 1995 but it was completely wiped out by 2005.

"If we are face to face with the same type of challenge, rest assured that we are committed and promise-bound to give them a befitting response and kill them one by one to maintain a peaceful atmosphere," he said. (*PTI*)

Follow govt guidelines for Eid sacrifice: Jamiat to Muslims

NEW DELHI, June 13: Prominent Muslim organisation Jamiat Ulema-e-Hind on Thursday urged Muslims to strictly follow government guidelines while offering sacrifice on Eid-ul-Azha and not share pictures of slaughtered animals on social media.

Eid ul-Azha, also called the festival of sacrifice, will be celebrated on Monday. In his message to Muslims on Eid-ul-Azha, Jamiat president Maulana Arshad Madani said there is no substitute for sacrifice in Islam and it is a religious duty which is obligatory on every Muslim for whom it is prescribed.

"It is important that Muslims take precautionary measures while offering sacrifice. Avoid advertising, especially sharing pictures of slaughtered animals on social media," Madani said.

He also urged Muslims to strictly follow government guidelines while performing 'Qurbani' and avoid sacrificing prohibited animals. "If mischievous elements, at any place, prevent the sacrifice of a buffalo also, some sensible and influential people should take the administration into confidence and then sacrifice should be offered," he said. Karan Johar on rising star fee: **Every actor has** to review, many not in touch with reality

MUMBAI, June 13: The remuneration of movie stars need to be looked at again and many of them are not in touch with reality, filmmaker Karan Johar said on Wednesday as he weighed in on the debate around the rising star fee in Bollywood.

The lacklustre performance of many big ticket Hindi movies in the recent months has led to a debate around the money charged by some of the big stars whose entourage also adds to the film budget. At the trailer launch event of

his upcoming production "Kill", Johar said actors need to introspect what they are charging for a movie.

"The main remuneration of the actors has to be looked at again. It's very critical for all the actors to understand exactly how the times are, how the climate of our movies are, and how difficult it is to maneuver through making a massive motion picture or a

motion picture of any magnitude and size," the directorproducer told reporters.

"Every single movie star has to review what they are asking for because many a times there will be certain producers that will pay that money because they want to make that film, but it will eventually cause a lot of damage to the entire system and the ecosystem," he added.

According to Johar, the entourage of actors are not a big issue, even though it does add to the overall cost of making a movie. "The real issue is the cost.

So they have to look at that and say that there can be back end deals or there can be percentages of profit... all that is possible. But every actor has to really look within, because a lot of them are not really in touch with reality," he added. Recently, "Chandu Champion" actor Kartik Aaryan and director Kabir Khan shared

their thoughts on the debate around star fee. Aaryan, one of

the top stars in the industry today, said a film's mathematics should add up at the end of the day. "There are so many rights of a

film when it releases So you get an 'x' amount of money out of it. If your star value and the entire project's value gives profit to the entire team, I think then the math adds up. If it doesn't, then you have to, you should take a cut... It's a healthy discussion," Aaryan told PTI in an interview here

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Khan, known for directing big budget blockbusters such as "Ek Tha Tiger" and "Bairangi Bhaijaan", said the discussion around star fee has been prompted by the shift in industry dynamics after the pandemic. (PTI)

Antony Starr of 'The Boys' on Homelander's redeemability: It's like asking 'Jaws' shark to be vegan

NEW DELHI, June 13: Redemption for Homelander, the psychopathic superhero from "The Boys", is somewhat like the shark in "Jaws" becoming vegan and how many people would be in-terested in that, asks actor Antony Starr about the "narcissistic character" that has made him famous. Starr said he worked closely with creator Eric Kripke to develop the character in the superhero satire now in its fourth season.

"We have a great working relationship and I think we've parented this character into something that's three dimensional and is more multifaceted than your average moustache twitty villain. That's why people relate to it," Starr told PTI in a virtual interview.

In "The Boys", adapted from the comic book series of the same name by Garth Ennis and Darick Robertson, Homelander is the leader of The Seven, a group of superheroes managed by the powerful corporation Vought International.

The character presents himself as the quintessential superhero with all the likeable qualities he is charming, patriotic, and all-powerful. Beneath the facade, however, is a deeply flawed and malevolent individual, who is racist, neurotic, psychopathic, narcissist and much more. Can Homelander ever be redeemed?

"I mean, it's kind of like the shark in 'Jaws' becoming vegan. Like, who wants to see that?" he said referring to the killer shark from Steven Spielberg's 1974 cult classic film.

But never say never, he added. "Personally, I'm an optimist. So I'd love to say yes but in truth, I'm not sure What Eric said... one of the strong themes in the show is that if someone does the wrong thing, they get punished. In Homelander's case, he's racked up enough on the wrong things to make him pretty irredeemable, but I don't know." s been fun for the acto

The "Amar Singh Chamkila" star was speaking at the trailer launch of "Jatt & Juliet 3". Also starring Neeru Bajwa, "Jatt & Juliet 3" is directed by Jagdeep Sidhu and co-produced by Grewal

Dosanjh credited Grewal for "raising" his standard in the Punjabi film industry. "After 'Jatt and Juliet' be-

came a hit, Darshan Grewal came to me with another blank cheque. I filled in the amount which no one demanded in the industry. My standard is due to Darshan paaji. I took double (amount) of what I got for the first film," he said.

Bajwa, who has also starred in the first two "Jatt & Juliet" movies

with Dosanjh, thanked her fans for her two decade career. The actor is another popular name in Punjabi cinema courtesy films such as "Beautiful Billo" and "Channo Kamli Yaar Di",

"My audience supported me when I broke some stereotypes like working in the industry after getting married and having children.

"Our Punjabi audience is very progressive. We used to underestimate them but today I continue to be an actress. It's a big deal for me too. I never thought my career would enjoy so much longevity but it's all thanks to my audience," she said. 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Hashtags 'Boycott Netflix', 'Ban Maharaj Film' trend ahead of debut of Aamir Khan's son Junaid



NEW DELHI, June 13: A section of social media users have called for a ban on the period drama "Maharaj", which marks the debut of Bollywood star Aamir Khan's son Junaid Khan, a day before its premiere on Netflix.

Hashtags like 'Boycott Netflix', 'Ban Maharai Film' and 'Aamir Khan' started trending on X on Thursday morning and well into the afternoon ahead of the film's premiere on June 14.

According to the makers, "Maharaj' is set in pre-independent India and is based on the Maharaj Libel Case of 1862, which was ignited by "allegations of misconduct by a prominent figure". Directed by Siddharth P Malhotra and

produced by Aditya Chopra under YRF Entertainment, the movie also stars Jaideep Ahlawat.

In an unusual move, the movie is releasing on the streamer without any promotions. No teaser or trailers have been

put out by the makers for the film, barring a poster featuring Jaideep and Junaid.

They are standing side by side with Ahlawat's character sporting a 'tilak' on his forehead while Junaid's character, reportedly a journalist, is dressed in a waistcoat.

VHP leader Sadhvi Prachi was one of the many X users who called for a ban on "Maharaj". "Won't tolerate the disrespect of Sanatan Dharma (Sanatan Dharma ka apmaan sehen nahin karenge). Ban Maharaj Film. #BoycottNetflix," Prachi wrote on the microblogging site.

According to a press release issued by Netflix last month, "Maharaj" follows Karsandas Mulji, a journalist and social reformer, who was a pioneering advocate for women's rights and social reform.

A student at Elphinstone College in

Mumbai and a protege of the scholarleader Dadabhai Naoroji, Mulji wrote on widow remarriage, stood up for the oppressed, and sowed the seeds of reform in society.

"It all came to a head in the Maharaj Libel Case of 1862, which was ignited by allegations of misconduct by a prominent figure, the case garnered widespread attention and scrutiny, setting the stage for what many consider to be one of the most significant legal battles of all time," the streamer said. Until when "Hindu saints" will continue to be insulted in films, asked another X user.

Another alleged that Aamir was launching his son in a "Hindumisic movie creating a false image of Sadhus and the Vallabh Sampradaya, by quoting an incident during the British regime (sic)"

Such content could alienate the Hindu youth from Sanatan Dharma, he said

using '#BoycottNetflix' and asked people to demand a ban on "Maharai". One of the X users said there were double standards when it comes to movies on Hinduism and Islam.

"Since the film is 'Maharaj' ... it's on your gods and goddesses and religion, you are calling for a boycott. When it's about the other community, there is an attempt to sell as much hate as possible through films," the user said, referring to movies such as "72 Hoorain" and "Hamare Barah"

The Supreme Court on Thursday stayed the June 14 release of Annu Kapoor's movie "Hamare Baarah" after taking note of allegations that the film is derogatory to the Islamic faith and married Muslim women. The film also underwent a title change (earlier called 'Hum Do Humare Baraah') as per a directive by the Central Board of Film Certification. (PTI)

U20 Asian Cup Qualifiers: India drawn alongside Iran, Mongolia and Laos

NEW DELHI, June 13: India were on Thursday drawn alongside Iran, Mongolia and hosts Laos in Group G for the 2025 AFC U20 Asian Cup 2025 Qualifiers, which will be held from September 21-29.

In the qualifiers for the continental U-17 competition, India drew Thailand, Brunei Darussalam and Turkmenistan in Group D, which will be hosted by Thailand between October 19-27.

The draws for both the qualifiers were held at the AFC House in Kuala Lumpur.

The main U20 tournament will be hosted by China from February 6-23, while Saudi Arabia will organise the U17 event from April 3-20.

For the U17 qualifiers, 43 teams were divided into 10 groups -- seven of four each and three of five.

The 10 group winners and five best second-placed teams among all groups will advance to the Finals.

India will aim to qualify for the AFC U17 Asian Cup for the fourth successive time.

In their last finals appearance from September 18-28. in 2023 in Thailand, the Blue Colts were eliminated in the group stage.

Quota belongs to country, not to athlete: Bindra backs NRAI's team selection for Olympics

MUMBAI, June 13: Olympics gold winner Abhinav Bindra on Thursday said promising shooter Rudrankksh Patil was unfortunate to miss the flight to Paris Games, but emphasised that the quota belongs to the country and not to one athlete.

Patil, who had bagged a 10m air rifle quota for the Paris Olympics, could not find a place in the 15-member Indian squad for the quadrennial extravaganza after finishing behind Sandeep Singh and Arjun Babuta in the selection trials organised by the National Rifle Association of India (NRAI).

As per the Olympic guidelines, a country can only send top two shooters in one event from trials to the Games.

"See, it's not a call. It's a matter of selection. There's a due process laid out and they followed the process," Bindra told the media here on the sidelines of the IISM Convocation Ceremony 2024.

in case the process was not followed. But a fair process was put out for everybody, and it was followed," Bindra added.

Bindra further explained his point

"Well, that is the process laid down for the country. Many countries follow that process. It's not just that India is following that process. The quota doesn't belong to an athlete per se. It belongs to the country and a process was put out well in advance," he said.

Bindra backed the method which NRAI followed and said a clear system should be followed.

"I think credit the Federation for following the process. I think, as athletes, what do we need? We need a clear system. We need a clear process and we need that clear system and policies followed," he said.

"That is what has been done, which I think is fair. You know, when you (an athlete) make (it "You'll ask the same question to the Olympics), when (an-



other) athlete doesn't make it, there will be a few who will be disappointed. It is natural. It is fair. It is a normal thing," he added.

Bindra said he was not aware if Patil had reached out to the Federation. The 2022 Asian

Games gold medallist has written to NRAI to take his past performances into consideration for selection

with," he said.

"Of course, I feel bad for noted. Rudrankksh, who is a good athlete and who's been doing consistently well. But he's young and I'm sure that there will be many more opportunities for him in the future," Bindra said. Bindra admitted that hopes

will be high on the Indian shooting contingent in Paris after having notched up seven medals — India's best-ever tally — at the Tokyo Olympics.

"I think (it is) the largest ever (medal haul) in history and I think I'm very positive that we'll do well. Of course, I know very well what your next question is going to be, which is we didn't do too well in Tokyo, but I'm positive of a good performance by our athletes," he said.

"There are so many athletes who have qualified with strong performances. They've undergone a rigorous domestic selection process as well this time. So, I'm quite hopeful and positive that we'll come back with some good results in Paris," he

"We won seven (medals) in Tokyo without shooting, firing at all. So, if we come close, or if we, it is realistic to expect close to 10, which will put us in double digits so

I'm hopeful of that," he continued.

Bindra, however, did not pick any favourite to bring a medal. "I don't want to discuss any

particular athlete. but I think all of them who have made the team have the potential to go and do well," he said.

"Of course, Manu (Bhaker) has done well. She's experienced. She has experience of competing in Tokyo, and now I think she's competing in three odd events in Paris so I wish her

well. "I wish her all the best and hope for good results from her, but also from the rest," he said. Bindra did not read too much into theories like facing mental blocks on a big occasion. "Well, the event has not happened, so

where is the mental block? Let's give them a chance at least," he said.

The first Indian to have won an individual Olympics gold medal, Bindra offered a word of advice for star javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra, a gold winner from Tokyo.

"It's important and all athletes know, and Neeraj would know for sure, in sport yesterday never counts — you're only as good as what you're on the present day," he said.

"The only advice to him would be to focus on his process, to remain in the present and to keep all distractions at bay because obviously with the profile that he enjoys, there will be a lot of eyeballs on him," Bindra said.

"There will be a lot of expectations on him. But I think it is for him to put that aside and remain focused on doing what he does so well," said Bindra, adding that he would be travelling to Paris. (PTI)

NEW YORK, June 13: Accustomed to batting on belters in India, bighitting all-rounder Shivam Dube conceded that the two-paced tracks for the T20 World Cup matches here left him bamboozled to such an extent that it almost felt like playing a Ranji Trophy game.

The Chennai Super Kings star regained some form with a 35-ball 31 in the seven-wicket win over a fighting USA team that propelled India into the event's Super Eight stage on Wednesday. The World Cup would move entirely to the West Indies with the Super Eight games.

"I was struggling with my form and focusing on my process," Dube

Bhowneesh finishes fourth in men's trap final

LONATO (ITALY), June 13: India's Bhowneesh Mendiratta could not emulate his excellent qualifying performance and settled for the fourth position in the final of the men's trap event at the ISSF World Cup for shotgun shooters here on Thursday.

Bhowneesh bowed out with 29 after the first 35 shots of the 50-shot six-man final.

Great Britain's Matthew John Coward-Holley won the gold medal with a score of 47, Daniele Resca of Italy claimed silver with 46, and China's Haicheng Yu

bagged bronze with 34.

Bhowneesh the first Indian shooter to win a quota for the Paris Olympics, shot 123 and finished third in qualifying after a excellent outing. He had shot rounds of 25 and 24 each in the final two rounds of qualification to take the third spot in the 142-strong field.

Bhowneesh missed three of the first 15 targets in the final and then went on a run of 11-hits in a row, before missing two consecutive targets which put the brakes on his bid. (PTI

PRANNOY, SAMEER VERMA ENTER AUSTRALIAN OPEN QUARTERS

SYDNEY, June 13: Indian shuttlers HS Prannoy and Sameer Verma progressed to the men's singles quarterfinals of the Australian Open with contrasting victories over their respective opponents here on Thursday.

While fifth seed Prannoy, a former world No.1, took just 46 minutes to get the better of Misha Zilberman of Israel 21-17 21-15 in the round of 16. Verma had to toil hard for one hour two minutes to upset eighth seed Loh Kean Yew of Singapore 21-14 14-21 21-19. Prannoy will be up against second seed Kodai Naroaka of Japan in the next round, while



Verma will take on Chinese Taipei's Chun-Yi Lin on Fri-

Among the Indian women shuttlers, eight seed Aakarshi Kashyap beat Australia's Kai Qi Bernice Teoh 21-16 21-13 to progress to the quarterfinals, where she will be playing third seed Yu Po Pai of Chinese Taipei.

But the tournament ended for Anupama Upadhyaya and Malvika Bansod in the women's singles second round.

While Anupama lost 11-21 18-21 against sixth seed Putri Kusuma Wardani of Indonesia, Malvika was shown the door by another Indonesian, eight seed Ester Nurumi Tri Wardoyo 17-21 21-23. It was also the end of the road for Panda sisters, Rutaparna and Swetaparna, in the women's doubles. The seventh seeded India pair were shocked 5-21 9-21 by Malaysian combination of Pei Jing Lai and Chiew Sien Lim.

The mixed doubles pair of B Sumeeth Reddy and N Sikki Reddy, however, continued to march ahead as the eighth seeded Indian duo defeated Australia's Kai Chen Teoh and Kai Qi Bernice Teoh 21-11 21-11 to enter the last-eight. But a tough contest awaits the mixed doubles duo in the quarterfinals. They will be up against top seeds Zhen Bang Jiang and Ya Xin Wei of China. (PTI)

NEW YORK, June 13: The makeshift Nassau County cricket ground, which was built specifically for the T20 World Cup, is all set to be demolished after the New York leg of the event came to an end with India's seven-wicket victory over co-hosts USA here.

Built in just over 100 days, the stadium became notorious for its challenging drop-in pitches, which were sourced from Adelaide. The massive structure sat on the edge of the 930-acre Eisenhower Park in Long Island here.

The stadium had 10 drop-in pitches, four for the main ground and six for the adjacent training facility in Cantiague Park. "After the last match is held at

East Meadow on June 12, the stadium will be dismantled, the parts shipped back to Las Vegas and another golf event, and Eisenhower Park will return to normal, but with a world-class cricket pitch left behind," a New York Times report had stated a few days ago.

The stadium that "almost popped up overnight" will be dismantled over a period of six weeks. It had a capacity of 34,000 and hosted a housefull crowd during India's marquee clash against Pak-



istan on June 9 with some tickets sold at an astronomical price of
