

Cong to contest all five state seats in bypolls

Our opposition to CAA to continue: Bhupen \bullet Cong to explore ways to repeal CAA in \overline{RS}

GUWAHATI, July 16: Assam Congress president Bhupen Kumar Borah on Tuesday said the party will contest all the five Assembly seats where bypolls will be held.

He also reiterated the party's opposition to the Citizenship (Amendment) Act, even as the state government asked its border police wing to advise non-Muslim illegal immigrants entering the state prior to 2015 to apply for citizenship under the new law.

These decisions were part of discussions during a meeting chaired by AICC general secretary Jitendra Singh with district-level party leaders here on Monday, marking the first day of his three-day visit, Borah said

Singh plans to hold further meetings with MPs, MLAs, and other leaders to strengthen the party's organisational structure and strategise for the future.

Nepal authorities coordinating with India Cong gave OBC quota to Muslims in K'taka, **BJP won't allow it in Haryana: Amit Shah**

MAHENDRAGARH (HARYANA), July 16: Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday accused the Congress of being anti-backward classes and said if the party comes to power in Haryana, it will snatch reservation for them and give it to Muslims.

Addressing a 'Backward Classes Samman Sammelan' here, Shah referred to the Kaka Kalelkar Commission formed in the 1950s to provide reservation to Other Backward Classes (OBCs) and said the Congress did not implement its recommendations for vears

"In 1980, (the then prime minister) Indira Gandhi put the Mandal Commission in cold storage. In 1990, when it was accepted, Rajiv Gandhi gave a two-anda-half-hour speech and opposed OBC reservation," the Union minister said.

"In Karnataka, the Congress snatched reservation for backward classes and gave it to Muslims. The same will happen here if they come (to power) here," Shah said.

"I want to assure you that we (BJP) will not allow Muslim reservation in Haryana. We will protect the rights of backward classes," he said.

He asserted that the BJP would form the govern-



ment in Haryana with a full majority.

The Haryana Assembly elections are scheduled to be held later this year.

When Narendra Modi became prime minister in 2014, he had said that his government was of Dalits, the poor and backward classes, said Shah.

The BJP has given the country its first strong prime minister who comes from a backward class. Twentyseven Union ministers are from backward classes including two from Haryana, (CONTD. ON PAGE-2)

TMC's parliamentary party leader in Rajya Sabha Derek O'Brien wrote to Rijiju and informed him that his party will not be able to attend the meet.

"For 30 years now, 21st July has been observed as 'Martyrs' Day' in Bengal in honour of our 13 colleagues who were unlawfully killed in a police firing on the day in 1993.

"In this context, all MPs of the All India Trinamool Congress including myself will be in our home state to mark the day along with other party colleagues. Therefore, no MP will be able to attend the meeting," he said.

The July 21 Martyrs' Day is observed in memory of 13 Congress supporters who were shot dead in firing by the Kolkata Police in 1993 during a march to the state secretariat -- Writers Buildings -when the CPI(M)-led Left Front was in power in West Bengal.

NEW DELHI, July 16: At nearly 16 lakh. India had the second highest number of children who did not receive any vaccine in 2023, preceded by Nigeria which had the most number of zero-dose children at 21 lakh in the same year.

However, India's rank improved from 2021 when the country had recorded the most number of zerodose kids globally at 27.3 lakh.

According to data published on Monday jointly by the World Health Organization (WHO) and UNICEF, Nigeria had the most number of zero-dose children at 21 lakh in 2023. Other countries following India are Ethiopia, Congo,

Sudan and Indonesia. China is 18th on the list of top 20 zero-dose countries rank, while

"The increasing numbers of unvaccinated and under vaccinated children calls for urgent and accelerated action. We need to identify where and why these children are missed and prioritise reaching them at the earliest.

"No child should fall sick or die of any vaccine preventable disease when safe and effective vaccines exist to protect them against these deadly (CONTD. ON PAGE-2)

Sensex, Nifty close at fresh record highs in 3rd straight day of gains

MUMBAI, July 16: Continuing the record-breaking run for the third straight day, benchmark Sensex and Nifty closed at record high levels on Tuesday following buying in FMCG, telecom and select IT shares and FII inflows.

The 30-share BSE Sensex climbed 51.69 points or 0.06 per cent to settle at a new lifetime high of 80,716.55. During the day, it advanced 233.44 points or 0.28 per cent to hit a fresh record high of 80,898.30.

The NSE Nifty rose by 26.30 points or 0.11 per cent to settle at an all-time closing high of 24,613, extending the gaining streak to the third day. Intra-day, it rallied 74.55 points or 0.30 to hit a new record peak of 24,661.25.

Stock markets opened on a firm note and benchmark indices hit intra-day record high levels in the first half. However, losses in Reliance Industries and Kotak Bank restricted gains and dragged indices from the day's highs.

Sensex and Nifty have been on a record-breaking run since Friday as foreign investors have turned net buyers in the Indian equities amid growing hopes of a rate cut by the US Fed by September. Encouraging quarterly results by blue-chips have also supported the rally despite high valuation con-

Budget should focus on welfare of citizens, allocate more funds for mfg sector: Kaushik Basu

NEW DELHI, July 16: The Modi government needs to focus on welfare of ordinary citizens in the upcoming Budget and earmark more funds for the manufacturing sector to boost small businesses and create more jobs, former World Bank chief economist Kaushik Basu said on Tuesday.

In an interview with PTI, Basu further said it is critically important for the government to shift some of its attention to ground-level economic welfare.

"I hope that, starting with the Union Budget this month, the government will turn its attention to the welfare of ordinary citizens and not just to climbing up the chart of aggregate GDP," he said.

Union finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman is scheduled to present the Budget for 2024-25 in the Lok Sabha on July 23.

"I believe that the rich can afford to pay higher taxes and using this money to incentivize the manufacturing sector can go a long way in boosting demand for labour, helping small businesses and raising the income of ordinary people," the eminent economist suggested. Basu, who was also chief economic adviser, said India's overall GDP growth over the last two years has been good.

"But by focusing so much attention on this aggregate statistic, we are missing out on two major ground-level challenges India is facing: steeply rising inequality and high unemployment, especially youth unemployment, which is among the highest in the world," he said. Basu said the inflation faced by poor families is much greater than the national average of 5.08 per cent and the inflation that rich households face.

Retail inflation was 5.1 per cent in June.

The RBI, which has been mandated to ensure that inflation remains at 4 per cent (with margin of 2 per cent on either side), mainly factors in CPI while arriving at its monetary policy.

On a question concerning the correlation between coalition governments and economic reforms, he said single-party, majority-run governments are typically more effective in making policy, but for the nation what



is good depends on what the government's aim is. "If the aim of the single-party majority run government is to raise GDP at all cost, even if this means ordinary people are left worse off, it is better to have a coalition government because that can put a brake on such policy,' Basu, currently a professor of economics at Cornell University, said.

With the support from N Chandrababu Naidu's TDP and Nitish Kumar-led JD(U), along with other alliance partners, the Narendra Modi-led National Democratic Alliance (NDA) crossed the halfway mark in the recently held Lok Sabha elections to form the government at the Centre. Responding to a question on high unemployment, Basu said all political parties have a self-interest in high youth unemployment since this is the catchment of cheap labour from which they get their political volunteers.

While expressing hope that the parties will rise above their own interest and implement policies in the interest of the nation, he said at this point of time, the most important policy should be job creation, even as there can be no denying that a part of the problem is global.

"With the advance of technology, the demand for labour is declining worldwide. (PTI)

In the national capital, gold of 99.9 per cent and 99.5 per cent purity quoted higher at ₹ 75,700 per 10 grams and ₹ 75,350 per 10 grams, respectively.

Traders attributed the rise in gold prices

to a pick-up in demand by local jewellers and retailers in the domestic market.

In addition, silver prices also jumped by ₹ 400 to ₹ 94,400 per kg. It had ended at ₹ 94,000 per kg in the previous session.

Meanwhile, the Congress on Tuesday said it was exploring ways to get the CAA repealed since the BJP's tally in Rajya Sabha has dipped below 90 for the first time in the past few years.

"The Congress will never accept CAA. We have been firm on it. And we stand by our promise that when Congress comes to power at the Centre, this law will be repealed," the state party spokesperson Bedabrata Bora told PTI.

"As the BJP's tally in the Rajya Sabha has come down to below 90 now, we will see what can be done to get the Act repealed via the Upper House," he added.

Bora also asserted that Assam MP Gaurav Gogoi, who has been named the Congress' deputy leader in the Lok Sabha for the second time, will play a proactive role in raising the matter and placing undisputable arguments against it.

"A law passed only based on numbers, which goes against the welfare and sentiments of the people, cannot be accepted," the Congress spokesperson added.

In a letter to the special director general of police (Border), home and political secretary Parth Pratim Majumdar asked the state police border wing not to forward the cases of persons belonging to Hindu, Sikh, Buddhist, Parsi, Jain and Christian communities who entered India prior to December 31, 2014, directly to the Foreigners Tribunal (FT).

Majumdar stated that such persons should be advised to apply on the citizenship portal for consideration of their application by the Indian government.

Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma accepted that the government had issued the letter and it was 'just a statutory order' as per the law.

Nalbari and Udalguri, among other places on Tuesday. "The CAA is against the Assam Accord and AASU will never accept it. So, there can be no question of accepting this directive," an AASU leader claimed.

According to the Assam Accord, names of all foreigners coming to the state on or after March 25, 1971 would be detected and deleted from the electoral rolls and steps would be taken to deport them.

"Our demand for constitutional safeguard of identity of the Assamese people remains, and we ask the government to amend the Constitution if required to ensure it," they added

Senior advocate Santanu Borthakur, a petitioner in one of the suits before the Supreme Court against the CAA, said that the government's latest directive is within legal provisions of the Act.

"However, propriety demands that the government should not have issued it since the CAA as a law has been challenged before the Supreme Court claiming it is unconstitutional," Borthakur told PTI.

In such a scenario, both the Centre and the state should have waited for the verdict of the Supreme Court, he said.

Borthakur also pointed out that the updated National Register of Citizens (NRC) for the state is yet to be notified, with about 19 lakhs of the applicants being left out of the final draft published in August 2019.

"It is common knowledge that majority of the left-out applicants are Hindu Bengalis. Now, when the NRC is notified and these people become foreigners, it will be upon the government how it will deal with them.

'The government can then grant them citizenship as per regular means, or ask them to take the CAA route," he maintained.

Borthakur said certain provisions of the CAA, like submitting documents of origin of Bangladesh, are proving detrimental as the Hindu Bengalis here have been claiming to have entered Assam before March 25, 1971, the cut-off date for granting citizenship as per the Assam Accord.

The chief minister had stated on Monday that eight people have so far applied under CAA in the state. (With inputs from PTI)

Heavy downpour submerges Jorhat

Citizens demand urgent action as floods disrupt daily life

JORHAT, July 16: Jorhat woke up to rivers gushing down roads and overflowing into lawns, homes, offices, schools, and colleges on Tuesday. A heavy downpour in the early hours submerged the town and adjoining areas, leaving citizens frustrated as they realized that the taxes paid to the Jorhat Municipal Board had literally flowed down the drain.

The morning downpour disrupted normal life, flooding government offices, including the Jorhat DC's office, and educational institutions such as Jagannath Barooah College (Autonomous) and Jorhat Law College.

Water entered houses and shops in several localities, causing significant difficulties for residents. Vehicular traffic was affected until late afternoon in several areas as roads and streets remained submerged.

People heading to their offices and business establishments faced a tough time navigating the potholed, submerged roads.

With Jorhat experiencing such artificial floods frequently in the past several years, and twice within a month this year, aggrieved citizens have called for better planning and rapid implementation of long-term and short-term measures to mitigate the problem.

They emphasised the need for regular cleaning of drains and natural streams passing through the town to prevent severe water-logging and artificial floods

HT Bureau GUWAHATI, July 16: Noted agricultural scientist Dr Veena Vidyadharan delivered the inaugural Arun Roy Memorial Lecture on 'Inland Water Transport: Challenges and Opportunities in the Context of the Brahmaputra'. The lecture program was organised jointly by Aaranyak, the department of Humanities and Social Sciences at IIT Guwahati, and the Northeast India Water Forum (NIWaF) at the Conference Hall, Institution of Engineers, Assam State Centre.

She discussed the significance of National Waterway 2 (the Brahmaputra) and NW-16 (the Barak), providing insights into current trade dynamics between India and Bangladesh via these rivers. Addressing economic inequality

ndia, the world"s most populous country, faces significant challenges as shifts in economic status reveal increasing disparities. Despite a decline in extreme poverty by 12.5% and a reduction in the moderate poor population by 5%, the overall number of poor people rose by 11.4% between 2011 and 2019. During the same period, the non-poor population increased by 6%. A recent World Bank report, "Rethinking Social Protection in South Asia: Towards Progressive Universalism," underscores the urgency of addressing these disparities. The report categorizes individuals earning less than \$2.15 a day (2017 PPP) as extremely poor, those earning between \$2.15 and \$3.65 as moderately poor, between \$3.65 and \$6.85 as poor, and above \$6.85 as non-poor. Within the non-poor category, further divisions are made between those earning \$6.85 to \$15 a day and those earning above \$15. The report reveals that while the percentage of people earning above \$15 a day grew from 1.5% in 2011 to 3.5% in 2019, and those earning between \$6.85 and \$15 a day increased from 8.6% to 12.6%, the percentage of the poor surged from 27.6% to 39%. This alarming increase indicates a significant decline in earnings for the poor. Meanwhile, the proportion of the moderately poor slightly decreased from 39.8% to 34.8%, and the extremely poor dropped from 22.5% to 10%.

This situation demands immediate government intervention. Many individuals in the non-poor category, earning between \$6.85 and \$15 a day, are precariously close to falling back into poverty with any economic shock. The report also highlights that while South Asia has witnessed substantial economic growth over the last two decades, poverty reduction has been uneven. Households in the moderate poor category represent about a third of the region"s poor, with a significant percentage remaining vulnerable to poverty. For instance, in 2019, the extreme poverty rate in India"s poorest state was over three times that of the median state, and in six of the poorest states, it was more than twice the median rate. Rural residents and children are particularly at risk. In 2019, 87.2% of the extreme poor in South Asia resided in rural areas. In countries like Bangladesh and Pakistan, the rural-urban poverty differential is stark, with rural poverty rates at 26.7% and 26.8%, respectively. Children in these regions also face higher poverty levels than working-age adults and the elderly. For example, in Bangladesh, 58.5% of children lived below the \$3.65 poverty line in 2019.

The root causes of persistent poverty in South Asia include limited creation of quality jobs. Between 2000 and 2020, 386 million South Asians entered the workforce, yet only 81 million jobs were created. This gap is particularly acute among women and youth, with South Asia"s labour force participation rate at just 51%, much lower than the 64% average in low-income countries. Women's participation is even lower at 24% compared to 81% for men. A high percentage of youth in South Asia are not in employment, education, or training (NEET). The NEET rate is over 33% for South Asian youth, higher than the 28% average in lower-middle-income countries. Among young women, the NEET rate is 47%, compared to 14% for young men. To tackle these issues, South Asian countries must focus on creating quality jobs and improving social security coverage. Most workers are engaged in informal, low-productivity jobs that do not provide the stability needed to escape poverty.

India's road to the Paris Olympics: Challenges, preparations, and expectations relocate her training base. Now, on simulation training sessions. question arises: 'Ab ki baar, kitne

n just under two weeks, on July 26, the grand opening ceremony in Paris will mark the beginning of the world's greatest sporting event. Indian athletes are currently scattered across the globe, making final preparations for their big day. Countries such as Russia, Germany, Romania, Poland, Turkey, Switzerland, and Japan have become temporary homes for these athletes as they refine their skills. Among them is Antim Panghal, a 53kg wrestler and successor to Vinesh Phogat's legacy. Unlike her peers, she has opted to stay in Hisar, Haryana. Her sport, wrestling, has consistently earned medals in every Olympics since Sushil Kumar's unexpected bronze in Beijing 2008. However, in the past year and a half, the

sport has faced considerable challenges and uncertainty.

The wrestling community in India was shaken to its core when protests against Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh, the former president of the Wrestling Federation of India (WFI), erupted at Jantar Mantar. New Delhi. in January 2023. This turmoil disrupted the sport profoundly, leading to a near-complete halt of national training camps.

Even with a new WFI executive led by Sanjay Singh, the situation remains chaotic. Although the United World Wrestling recognizes this new body, the Union sports ministry does not, resulting in widespread confusion. Consequently, athletes like Antim Panghal are left to fend for themselves, navigating their training independently. Antim explains, "I considered training abroad, but the uncertainty surrounding the pre-Olympic trials made me hesitant. I decided it was wiser to stay in Hisar and continue my preparations here, rather than risk being summoned back unexpectedly for the trials."

After considerable hesitation, the WFI ultimately decided against holding trials for the Olympic quota winners. By this point, it was too late for Antim to

her sights are set on bringing home a medal. "I've already donned the Team India kit, and it gave me goosebumps," Antim shares. "Even though this is my first Olympics and I might be the youngest on the wrestling team, I want to make everyone proud. Sakshi Malik is the only female wrestler from India to have won a medal, and as a team, we aim to add more to that tally.'

Over 2,900 km away in Dagestan, Russia, Aman Sehrawat shares the same aspiration. "I understand that our sport has consistently brought us medals, and I am committed to doing everything possible to maintain our winning streak," says Sehrawat, the sole Indian male wrestler competing this time.

To date, India has amassed a total of 35 Olympic medals, with individual golds secured solely by rifle ace Abhinav Bindra in 2008 and Neeraj Chopra in 2021. Sushil Kumar, achieving in 2008 and 2012, and PV Sindhu, who excelled in 2016 and 2021, stand out as the sole Indians to secure two individual medals each in Olympic history. India's hockey teams boast a tally of 12 Olympic medals, highlighted by 8 golds, with the most recent gold captured in 1980. The bronze medal clinched at the Tokyo Games marked a triumphant return after a 41-year hiatus for hockey enthusiasts.

The Paris Games are set to be a groundbreaking global event, striving for carbon neutrality by cutting event-related CO2 emissions in half. The tumultuous Nepali politics

Teteran communist politician KP Sharma Oli was sworn in as Nepal's latest prime minister on Monday 15 July 2024, the fifth time in five years, hoping to ensure political stability in the impoverished Himalayan nation that badly needs to resurrect its economy by

wooing investors and creating new jobs. Oli, who heads the moderate Communist Party of Nepal (Unified Marxist Leninist),

will be the 14th since, with 72-year-old Oli himself returning for his fourth term.

Dahal was forced to prove his majority for the fifth time during a tumultuous 20month tenure after UML withdrew support to his Communist Party of Nepal (Maoist Center) and formed a new alliance with NC, the largest party in parliament.

UML leaders said the new alliance was needed to ensure political stability but have not elaborated on that. Nepal is one of the world's poorest countries and political instability has discouraged investment and hobbled its economic development, forcing millions of young people to seek work mainly in Malaysia. South Korea and the Middle East. The instability has also sparked sporadic protests with people demanding the restoration of the monarchy saying successive governments had failed to live up to commitments to develop the country sandwiched between India and China. Political developments in Kathmandu are watched closely by rivals New Delhi and Beijing that pour development aid and infrastructure investment into Nepal and jostle for geopolitical influence. Oli took Nepal closer to China by signing a transit agreement with Beijing in his first term in 2015-2016, ending India's monopoly over landlocked Nepal's foreign trade. Howevevr, it seems that NC and

UML, Nepal's two biggest parties, had taken a risk by pulling down Dahal's government and forming a new alliance.

If this coalition government also fails to deliver governance and political stability, the Nepali people may interpret it as the failure of the constitution and the system.

S is basically said to be run by the three sections of forces. One, of course, is state administration and its bureaucracy; second, NGO ecosystem, which is said to be a part of Deep state; third, academic institutions and media. Of them second and third sections are reported to be largely funded by Qatar, China and Soros kinds of rich. They have great interventionist role in the foreign policy of the country. Based in US, and held to be the most authentically reliable, the PEW research centre is engaged in the research concerning social-demography-religious as-

pects of different regions world over. It says in its report that in US in proportion to their population the most graduate degree holders, and economically most prosperous are Indians. As also the most of the doctors, engineers and start-ups in Silicon Valley come from Indian community.

More notably, more than the 25% of the owners of the chain of big hotels and motels hail from the same community.

If taken a look at the list of top achievers of the US, Indians are no less among them too. Like Sunder Pichai and Satya Nadela, several other CEOs of the multinationals we already know. Many more are there in different fields of public significance. Late Dr. Ved Nanda had been a distinguished professor of Law in Colorado University. He had been the President of World Jurist Association; as also, the Vice President of American Society of International Law.

Taught by him were the three students who later rose to be the ministers in America's central government; and, of them former foreign minister, Condoleezza Rice, being the most prominent one. So popular and highly respectful among the students was Ved Nanda that they (students) themselves collected lacs of Dollars and raised two study-centres after his name. He had been the Sanghchalak of Hindu Swayam Sewak Sangh (a wing of RSS working abroad) in America notably. In 1918 he was awarded Padam Vibhushan by Government of India.

was administered the oath of office by President RamchandraPaudel, three days after his predecessor Pushpa Kamal Dahal lost a parliamentary vote of confidence. Oli announced a 22-member cabinet, with Bishnu Paudel picked as finance minister. and Arzu Rana Deuba of coalition partner Nepali Congress (NC) named foreign minister. Deuba is the wife of the NC president and former prime minister Sher Bahadur Deuba.

On Monday, Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi congratulated Oli and said he looked "forward to working closely to further strengthen the deep bonds of friendship between our two countries and to further expand our mutually beneficial cooperation for the progress and prosperity of our peoples". Nepal has been politically unstable since it abolished a 239-year-old monarchy in 2008. Oli's new government in power, leading to poor governance. Despite the institution of constitutional reforms related to federalism and guaranteed representation for marginalised forces following a civil war and the overthrow of the monarchy, the outcomes have been a perpetuation of the country's status as a "least developed country".

It is quite evident that the leadership of the three major parties have shown more interest in sticking to power by any means irrespective of whether they are driven by pre-poll coalitions or not. Besides, the inherent instability in a parliamentary system that reflects social fissures in the country has led to a form of coalition politics that is driven less by ideological or principled considerations and more by a hankering towards power. Such instability and an unprincipled pursuit of power will only result in more disillusionment among the Nepali

crisis if steps are not taken to improve the economy.

The developments in Kathmandu will be watched with caution by New Delhi. While Prachanda enjoyed goodwill in India, Oli's hardline stance during the border blockade of 2015, his pro-China position and moves to include disputed territories in Nepal's map have not gone down well with South Block.

The Chinese footprint in Nepal is growing. However, India continues to be Nepal's largest trading partner and about eight million Nepalese citizens live and work in India. New Delhi would, therefore, do well to take a nuanced position on the politics in the Himalayan nation and ensure that Beijing does not use the latest political turn in Kathmandu to its advantage. US envoy's angry reaction to Modi-Putin talks is undiplomatic, unwarranted

The US Ambassador to India. Eric Garcetti, may have exceeded his brief by issuing a warning to India that the country can't take its improved relationship with the United States for granted in the context of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's talks with Russian President Vladimir Putin in Moscow, last week. The ambassador, as also the US state department, was clearly upset with Modi-Putin bonhomie during the Indian prime minister's twoday visit in Moscow. Modi has described Russia as India's all-weather friend. Modi had embraced Putin for steering India-Russia friendship to greater heights in the last 20 years. The Indian PM was conferred the highest Russian civilian award, Order of St Andrew the Apostle, during his visit. The award was announced five years ago for Modi's contribution to fostering bilateral ties between the two countries. Putin had reaffirmed commitment to the resilient Russia-India relationship against the backdrop of a challenging and uncertain geopolitical situation.

The Indian PM rapped the Russian president publicly as he said that Russia-Ukraine peace talks could not succeed in the shadow of guns while venting his anger over a Russian missile strike on Ukraine's largest hospital for children on the day Modi had landed in Moscow after a gap of five years. India has always argued for peace talks between Russia and Ukraine, also a friendly nation, to settle their disputes. Prime Minister Modi had emphasized to President Putin that the solution to the Russia-Ukraine conflict lay in dialogue and not on the battlefield. Ukraine too has been a longstanding friend of India. The war has affected bilateral trade and economic relations between India and Ukraine. The volume of trade between the two countries has been downward since the Russia-Ukraine war. It dropped from \$3.38 billion in 2021 to \$2.58 billion in 2022. India runs a deficit trade balance with Ukraine. Lately, the two countries agreed to restore trade and bilat-

eral cooperation to pre-Russia war levels. It is wrong to surmise that India is not using its influence to convince the belligerent parties to end the war and bring them to peace talks. Contrary to the threat and outburst by the US ambassador in Delhi, White House press secretary Karine Jean-Pierre's statement appeared to be more down to earth. She said: "India is a strategic partner with whom we engage in full and frank dialogue, including their relationship with Russia and we have talked about this before. So we think it is critical that all countries, including India, support efforts to realize an enduring and just peace when it comes to Ukraine. It is important for all our allies to realise this." India does realise this. However, the US should also realise that Russia has been a time-tested strategic partner of India. The US must appreciate that the US-India strategic alliance along with Japan and Australia (QUAD) to contain the expansionist China in the Indo-Pacific region did not upset Russia, a strong China ally especially since the outbreak of the Russia-Ukraine war.

US National Security Advisor Jake Sullivan may be wrong to believe that Moscow would side with Beijing over New Delhi in case of a conflict between China and India. The fact is that such a conflict already exists strongly with the Chinese military continuously engaging India on its northern and north-eastern borders. Russia is vet to forget the Chinese military aggression and a sevenmonth-long border conflict between the former Soviet Union and China in 1969.

Notably, the US has always been strategically soft towards India on its oil import options. India is 86 percent import dependent on oil. The US understood India's severe oil constraints and did not stand in the way of India's massive oil import from Russia. It is not easy for any country to maintain strategic autonomy in times of conflict between its two strong allies. There is nothing to be excited or concerned about the Indo-Russian joint statement at the end of Prime Minister Modi's visit to Moscow. Russia has been non-interventionist in so far as India's local and world affairs are concerned. It has been most helpful to India since the 1960s, when most world economic and military powers kept their distance from India. The US chose Pakistan as its most preferred strategic partner in the region. Hard up for convertible foreign currency, India was offered a barter-trade solution by Russia in the 1960s and 70s. The three most interesting points of the latest Indo-Russian joint statement are: (1) facilitation of Russian corporate investment in India; (2) ramp-up the bilateral trade to \$100 billion by 2030 from the current level of \$65 billion; and (3) both sides agreeing to go ahead with trade in national currency. Rosneft, a giant Russian petroleum enterprise, which indirectly controls one of India's biggest oil refineries, is planning to set up a green field project in the country

However, a \$100-billion worth bilateral trade with Russia by 2030 looks highly ambitious at this stage. India's massive increase in the import of cheaper Russian oil after the Ukraine war is mainly responsible for a sudden spurt in India's trade with Russia. The situation may change sharply after Russia and Ukraine decide to halt the aggression. It may be noted that the Indo-Russian bilateral trade in 2020-21 amounted to only worth \$8.1 billion. Indian exports amounted to \$2.6 billion while its imports from Russia aggregated \$5.48 billion.

While massive oil imports from Russia changed the volume and pattern of the Indo-Russian trade, India is still struggling to raise exports to Russia. Last year, China, the No. 1 strategic adversary of India, marginally surpassed the US as the country's top trade partner (mostly as exporter). As a strategic ally, the US would probably do well to advise India on how the country could drastically reduce imports and investments from China. The US must not panic over the Russia-India relationship as it poses absolutely no threat to India's growing strategic alliance with America. (*IPA Service*)

Lenacapavir trials show 100% efficacy in preventing HIV infections in young women

large clinical trial in South Africa and Uganda has shown that a twice-yearly injection of a new pre-exposure prophylaxis drug gives young women total protection from HIV infection.

The trial tested whether the six-month injection of lenacapavir would provide better protection against HIV infection than two other drugs, both daily pills. All three medications are pre-exposure prophylaxis (or PrEP) drugs. Physician-scientist Linda-Gail Bekker, principal investigator for the South African part of the study, tells Nadine Dreyer what makes this breakthough so significant and what to expect next.

Tell us about the trial and what it set out to achieve. The Purpose 1 trial with 5,000 participants took place at three sites in Uganda and 25 sites in South Africa to test the efficacy of lenacapavir and two other drugs.

Lenacapavir (Len LA) is a fusion capside inhibitor. It interferes with the HIV capsid, a protein shell that protects HIV's genetic material and enzymes needed for replication. It is administered just under the skin, once every six months.

The randomised controlled trial, sponsored by the drug developers Gilead Sciences, tested several things.

The first was whether a six-monthly injection of lenacapavir was safe and would provide better protection against HIV infection as PrEP for women between the ages of 16 and 25 years than Truvada F/TDF, a daily PrEP pill in wide use that has been available for more than a decade

Secondly, the trial also tested whether Descovy F/TAF, a newer daily pill, was as effective as F/TDF. The newer F/TAF has superior pharmacokinetic properties to F/TDF. Pharmacokinetic refers to the movement of a drug into, through, and out of the body. F/TAF is a smaller pill and is in use among men and transgender women in high-income countries.

The trial had three arms. Young women were randomly assigned to one of the arms in a 2:2:1 ratio (Len LA: F/TAF oral: F/TDF oral) in a double blinded fashion. This means neither the participants nor the researchers knew which treatment participants were receiving until the clinical trial was over.

In eastern and southern Africa, young women are the population who bear the brunt of new HIV infections. They also find a daily PrEP regimen challenging to maintain, for a number of social and structural reasons.

During the randomised phase of the trial none of the 2,134 women who received lenacapavir contracted HIV. There was 100 percent efficiency

By comparison, 16 of the 1,068 women (or 1.5%) who took Truvada (F/TDF) and 39 of 2,136 (1.8%) who received Descovy (F/TAF) contracted the HIV virus.

The results at a recent independent data safety monitoring board review led to the recommendation that the trial's "blinded" phase should be stopped and all participants should be offered a choice of PrEP.

This board is an independent committee of experts who are put in place at the start of a clinical trial. They see the unblinded data at stipulated times during the trial to monitor progress and safety. They ensure that a trial does not continue if there is harm or a clear benefit in one arm over others.

What is the significance of these trials?

This breakthrough gives great hope that we have a proven, highly effective prevention tool to protect people from HIV. There were 1.3 million new HIV infections globally in the past year. Although that's fewer than the 2 million infections seen in 2010, it is clear that at this rate we are not going to meet the HIV new infection target that UNAIDS set for 2025 (fewer than 500,000 globally) or potentially even the goal to end Aids by 2030.

PrEP is not the only prevention tool. PrEP should be provided alongside HIV self-testing, access to condoms, screening and treatment for sexually transmitted infections and access to contraception for women of childbearing potential.

In addition, young men should be offered medical male circumcision for health reasons. But despite these options, we haven't quite got to the point where we have been able to stop new infections, particularly among young people.

For young people, the daily decision to take a pill or use a condom or take a pill at the time of sexual intercourse can be very challenging.

HIV scientists and activists hope that young people may find that having to make this "prevention decision" only twice a year may reduce unpredictability and barriers. For a young woman who struggles to get to an appointment at a clinic in a town or who can't keep pills without facing stigma or violence, an injection just twice a year is the option that could keep her free of HIV.

What happens now?

The plan is that the Purpose 1 trial will go on but now in an "open label" phase. This means that study participants will be "unblinded": they will be told whether they have been in the "injectable" or oral TDF or oral TAF groups

They will be offered the choice of PrEP they would prefer as the trial continues.

A sister trial is also under way: Purpose 2 is being conducted in a number of regions including some sites in Africa among cisgender men, and transgender and nonbinary people who have sex with men.

It's important to conduct trials among different groups because we have seen differences in effectiveness. Whether the sex is anal or vaginal is important and may

have an impact on effectiveness. How long until the drug is rolled out?

We have read in a Gilead Sciences press statement that within the next couple of months the company will submit the dossier with all the results to a number of country regulators, particularly the Ugandan and South African regulators. The World Health Organization will also review the data and may issue recommendations. We hope then that this new drug will be adopted into

WHO and country guidelines. We also hope we may begin to see the drug being tested in more studies to understand better how to incor-

porate it into real world settings.Price is a critical factor to ensure access and distribution in the public sector where it is badly needed. Gilead Sciences has said it will offer licences to companies that make generic drugs, which is another critical way to get prices down. In an ideal world, governments will be able to purchase this affordably and it will be offered to all who want it and need protection against HIV. (Courtesy: The Wire)

droplets of the first monsoon rain hit the earth, the moisture content in the atmosphere also rises.

Far-right groups that block aid to Gaza receive tax-deductible donations from US and Israel

JERUSALEM, July 16: Under American pressure, Israel has pledged to deliver large quantities of humanitarian aid into the warravaged Gaza Strip. But at the same time, the U.S. and Israel have allowed tax-deductible donations to far-right groups that have blocked that aid from being delivered.

Three groups that have prevented humanitarian aid from reaching Gaza — including one accused of looting or destroying supplies — have raised more than \$200,000 from donors in the U.S. and Israel, The Associated Press and the Israeli investigative site Shomrim have found in an examination of crowdfunding websites and other public records.

Incentivizing these donations by making them tax-deductible runs counter to America's and Israel's stated commitments to allow unlimited food, water and medicine into Gaza, say groups working to get more aid into the territory. Donations have continued even after the U.S. imposed sanctions against one of these groups.

By not cracking down on these groups, Israel is showing a "lack of coherence" in its Gaza aid policy, said Tania Hary, executive director of Gisha, an Israeli nonprofit that has long called on Israel to improve conditions in the territory.

"If you're on the one hand saying you're allowing aid in but then also facilitating the actions of groups that are blocking it, can you really say you're facilitating aid?" she said. Israeli officials did not respond to requests for comment.



The U.S. State Department said it is committed to ensuring the delivery of aid, but had no comment on the fundraising efforts by the farright groups.

Israel has said repeatedly it does not restrict humanitarian aid and that the United Nations has failed to distribute thousands of truckloads of goods that have reached the territory. The U.N. and aid groups say deliveries have repeatedly been hampered by military operations, lawlessness inside Gaza and delays in Israeli inspections. The three groups examined by

AP and Shomrim have slowed the delivery of aid by blocking trucks on their way to Gaza, either by snarling traffic or simply standing in front of the main Kerem Shalom crossing into Gaza.

While these organizations are not the primary impediment to aid shipments, they have received tacit support from some Israeli leaders. Israel's ultranationalist minister for national security, Itamar Ben-Gvir, has said aid shipments to Gaza should be blocked and he supported the right of opponents to

demonstrate, though he said it

should not be done violently. One of the groups, Mother's March, has raised the equivalent of over \$125,000 via Givechack, an Israeli crowdfunding site, the AP and Shomrim found. The group also raised some \$13,000 via JGive, a U.S. and Israeli crowdfunding site. Donations to charitable organizations are tax-deductible in Israel and the U.S. Mother's March does not raise

the money directly. Instead, it works with an allied group called Torat Lechima that raises funds on its behalf. Torat Lechima, whose name

translates loosely as "combat doctrine," is active in Israeli nationalist circles and works to "strengthen the Jewish identity and fighting spirit" among Israeli soldiers, according to its website. Torat Lechima continues to solicit funds for Mother's March on the JGive site in the U.S.

Until it was sanctioned last month, a third group, Tzav 9, raised over \$85,000 from close to 1,500 donors in the U.S. and Israel via

JGive. JGive said that donations made to Tzav 9 were frozen even before the sanctions were imposed and not delivered to the group.

All three groups, which have ties with Israel's ultranationalist far right, say Israel should not be aiding the Palestinians as long as Hamas is holding dozens of people hostage. They also claim that Hamas is stealing much of the aid, though aid groups have disputed that.

"No to 'humanitarian' aid that grants fuel to the enemy who kills us! No to the hundreds of trucks that pass every day through Kerem Shalom – and drag out the war!' Mother's March said in a recent crowdfunding campaign. It said the funds were needed for demonstrations, shuttles, printing materials and publicity campaigns.

Hundreds of activists set up tents at Kerem Shalom for several nights in early February to stop the delivery of aid. The head of Mother's March, Sima Hasson, was briefly detained by Israeli police in January after temporarily blocking trucks. Israeli news reports have shown large convoys of cars blocking aid trucks from traveling on Israeli highways, as well as activists looting trucks and destroying supplies.

In its sanctions order, the White House accused Tzav 9 of violently blocking roads, damaging aid trucks and dumping supplies on the road. It said in May that Tzav 9 members looted and set fire to two trucks in the West Bank carrying aid destined for Gaza. Last week,

the White House imposed sanctions on the group's co-founders. Israeli police, who fall under the authority of Ben-Gvir, have made few arrests, though the group appears to have stopped its activities in recent weeks.

Tzav 9 defended its actions as "within the framework of the law, in a democratic protest." It called the sanctions from the U.S. "antidemocratic intervention.

Neither Mother's March nor Torat Lechima responded to requests for comment.

Israel launched its offensive in Gaza in response to the Oct. 7 attack by Hamas, which killed roughly 1,200 people and took 250 others hostage.

The offensive has killed over 38.000 Palestinians, according to local health authorities, and unleashed a humanitarian crisis in the densely populated territory. Over 80% of the population is displaced, and international officials say hundreds of thousands of people are on the brink of famine.

Two international courts have accused Israel of war crimes and genocide – charges Israel denies as it pledges to keep the aid flowing into Gaza. Those who violate the sanctions against Tsav 9 could have their assets frozen or face travel and visa bans.

It's unclear how effective these sanctions will be. Extremist Israeli settlers in the West Bank say similar U.S. sanctions imposed on them have had little effect, in part because Israeli leaders helped circumvent them. (AP)

US president Donald Trump, wearing a bandage partially covering his right ear, made his first public appearance at the Republican National Convention here since surviving an assassination attempt.

Trump, 78, on Monday, entered the hall to roaring applause and holding his fist aloft towards the end of the first day of the four-day convention.

He escaped an assassination bid over the weekend while attending a public rally in Philadelphia. Thousands of Republican delegates, supporters and members of the Republican party chanted "fight" as he entered the Fiserv

Forum in Milwaukee. Supporters on the convention floor and standing in the stadium sang along to a live rendition of "God Bless the USA" with singer Lee Greenwood as Trump waved to supporters and joined family members and new running mate JD Vance in their seats. Trump wore a subdued look as

the room around him erupted and chants of "USA" rang out.

On Monday, delegates from across the country elected him as the Republican presidential nominee for the November 5 general election against incumbent Democratic President Joe Biden.

However, Trump would deliver his acceptance speech on Thursday. The delegation from Florida put him over the top, with Eric Trump awarding the state's delegates to his father. Several lawmakers and other of-

New accord establishes a hotline Chinese and Philippine presidents can use to stop clashes at sea



MANILA, July 16: A recently signed agreement will open a direct line of communication between China and the Philippines' presidential offices to try and prevent any new confrontation from spiraling out of control in the disputed South China Sea, according to highlights of the accord seen by The Associated Press on Tuesday.

China and the Philippines have forged such emergency telephone hotlines at lower levels of their bureaucracies in the past to better manage their disputes, particularly in two fiercely disputed shoals where the Philippines has accused Chinese forces of increasingly hostile actions and China says Philippine ships have encroached despite repeated warnings. The territorial faceoffs, however, have persisted uncontrollably in the past year, sparking fears of a larger armed conflict that could involve the United States, which has repeatedly warned that it's obligated to defend the Philippines, a key Asian treaty ally, if Filipino forces come under an armed attack in the disputed waters.

In a confrontation between Chinese and Philippine forces at the Philippinesoccupied Second Thomas Shoal in August 2023, the Philippine government said it was unable to reach Chinese officials through an established "maritime communication mechanism" for several hours as the clash happened. That emergency telephone hotline was arranged after Philippine President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. met Chinese President Xi Jinping in Beijing in January 2023.

Chinese and Philippine officials dealing with the territorial disputes held cru-

cial talks in Manila on July 2, following a violent confrontation in the Second Thomas Shoal in which Chinese coast guard personnel reportedly wielded knives, an axe and improvised spears in a chaotic faceoff that injured Philippine navy personnel and damaged two of their motorboats. The Chinese forces also seized seven Philippine navy rifles, said the Philippine military chief, who demanded China return the firearms and pay for the damages. Both sides "recognized the need to strengthen the bilateral maritime communication mechanism on the South China Sea" and signed an arrangement "on improving Philippines-China maritime communication mechanisms," the Department of Foreign Affairs in Manila said in a statement after the talks in Manila, but did not provide a copy or details of the agreement. A copy

of the highlights of the agreement, seen by the AP, said it "provides several channels for communication between the Philippines and China, specifically on maritime issues, through the representatives to be designated by their leaders.'

The hotline talks could also be done "through the Department of Foreign Affairs and Ministry of Foreign Affairs counterparts, including at the foreign minister and vice foreign minister levels or though their designated representatives," it said, and added without elaborating that Philippine officials were "in discussions with the Chinese side on the guidelines that will govern the implementation of this arrangement."

There was also a plan to set up a new communication channel between the Chinese and Philippine coast guards "once the corresponding memorandum of understanding" between them is concluded, according to the agreement.

During the recent talks in Manila, China and the Philippines agreed on two other confidence-boosting steps to intensify "cooperation between their respective coast guard authorities" and the possible convening of a maritime forum between Chinese and Philippine scientists and academic leaders. A North Korean diplomat in Cuba defected to South Korea in November, Seoul says

SEOUL, July 16: South Korea's spy agency said Tuesday that a senior North Korea diplomat based in Cuba has fled to South Korea, the latest in a series of defections by members of the North's ruling elite in recent years.

The National Intelligence Service said media reports on the defection of a North Korean counselor of political affairs in Cuba were true. A brief statement by the NIS public affairs office gave no further details. South Korea's mass-circulation Chosun Ilbo newspaper re-

ported earlier Tuesday that diplomat Ri Il Kyu fled to South Korea with his wife and children in November.

Chosun Ilbo cited Ri as telling the newspaper in an interview that he had decided to defect because of what he called disillusionment with North Korea's political system, an unfair job evaluation by Pyongyang's Foreign Ministry, and the ministry's disapproval of his hopes to visit Mexico to treat his neural damage. He said that hospitals in Cuba didn't have the necessary medical equipment to treat his health problem due to interna-

tional sanctions. Other South Korean media outlets carried similar reports later on Tuesday. Ri defected before South Korea and Cuba established diplomatic ties in February, an event that experts

The Chosun report said Ri had been engaged in efforts to block Cuba from opening diplomatic ties with South Korea until his defection. The report said Ri won a commendation from leader Kim Jong Un for his role in negotiations with Panama that led to the release of a ship detained in 2013 for allegedly carrying banned items like missiles and fighter jet parts. The report said Ri was then a third secretary of the North Korean Embassy in Cuba. The South Korean govern-

ment says the number of highly educated North Koreans with professional jobs escaping to South Korea has steadily increased in recent years. But it's still unusual for a member of the North's ruling elite to come to South Korea.

About 34,000 North Koreans have defected to South Korea to avoid economic hardship and political suppression since the end of the 1950-53 Korean War. A majority of them are women from the North's poorer northern regions who arrived in South Korea since the mid-1990s. when North Korea suffered a devastating famine that was estimated to have killed hundreds of thousands of people. (AP)

During his talks with Putin on July 9. Prime Minister Modi told President Putin that a solution to the Ukraine conflict is not possible on the battlefield and peace efforts do not succeed amid bombs and bullets. India has been stoutly defending its "special and privileged strategic partnership" with Russia and maintained the momentum in the ties notwithstanding the Ukraine conflict.

India has not yet condemned Russia's invasion of Ukraine in 2022 and has consistently pitched for a resolution of the conflict through dialogue and diplomacy. (PTI)



Two judges appointed to Supreme Court

Top court gets first judge from Manipur

NEW DELHI, July 16: Justices Nongmeikapam Kotiswar Singh and R Mahadevan were on Tuesday elevated as judges of the Supreme Court.

Once they take oath, the apex court will regain its sanctioned strength of 34, including the chief justice.

Chief Justice of Jammu and Kashmir High Court, Justice N Kotiswar Singh, has become the first judge from Manipur to have been appointed to the top court.

"His appointment as a judge of the Supreme Court will provide representation to the North-East, and in particular he will be the first judge from the state of Manipur to be appointed as a judge of the Supreme Court," the SC Collegium had said on July 11 while recommending his name along with that of Justice Mahade-

Justice Singh originally hails from Manipur. He was appointed as a judge of the Gauhati High Court in October 2011. Following the formation of the Manipur High Court, he was transferred there



chief justice of the Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh High Court and will demit office in February 2028 on attaining the age of 65 years. Justice Mahadevan is at present the acting chief justice of the Madras High Court.

While recommending his name for elevation, the Collegium had noted that "Justice Mahadevan belongs to a backward community from the state of Tamil Nadu. His appointment will bring diversity to the (SC) Bench."

'The Collegium has taken due note of the fact that Justice Mahadevan ranks

third in the order of presently serving judges of the Madras High Court including the judges who have been posted as chief justices outside the Madras High Court.

"At this stage, the Collegium has given precedence to the candidature of Justice Mahadevan in order to give representation to the backward community," it noted. Justice Mahadevan was born on June

10, 1963 and will demit office in June 2028.

Another vacancy will arise in the apex court in September when Justice Hima Kohli will retire.

In a set of consequential appointments, the law ministry said Justice Tashi Rabstan will be the acting chief justice of the Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh High Court following the elevation of Justice Singh to the top court. Similarly, Justice D Krishnakumar will be the acting chief justice of the Madras High Court following the appointment of Justice Mahadevan to the Supreme Court. (PTI)

J&K: Captain among four Army Soldiers killed in Doda encounter deliberate policy, wilful neglect: Cong

JAMMU, July 16: Four army personnel, including a captain, died after being injured in a gunfight with heavily armed terrorists in Doda district of Jammu and Kashmir, officials said on Tuesday while reinforcements were rushed in to track and neutralize the militants.

Those killed in the encounter have been identified as Captain Brijesh Thapa, Naik D Rajesh, Sepoy Bijendra and Sepoy Ajay, they said.

This was the third major encounter between security forces and terrorists in the forests of Doda district in the past three weeks.

The latest incident comes a week after a terrorist ambush on an Army patrol in the remote Machedi forest belt in Kathua district claimed the lives of five soldiers and injured as many.

Troops of the Rashtriya Rifles and Special Operations Group of Jammu and Kashmir Police launched a joint cordon and search operation at Dhari Gote Urarbagi in the Desa forest belt, some 55 km from Doda town. late on Monday evening when the encounter took place, the officials said.

Army Chief General Upendra Dwivedi and all ranks of the Army paid tributes to the bravehearts who laid down their lives while undertaking the counter-terror operation. "Indian Army stands firm with

the bereaved families in this hour of grief," Additional Directorate General of Public Information of the Indian Army posted on 'X'.

The Army's 16 Corps, also known as White Knight Corps, in a post on 'X' late on Monday night, said. "Based on specific intelligence inputs, a joint operation by Indian Army and JKP was in progress in the general area North of Doda. Contact with terrorists was established tonight at about 2100 hrs in which heavy firefight ensued.

"Initial reports suggest injuries to



our bravehearts. Additional troops have been moved into the area. Operations are continuing," it said. The officials said the Army and

police mobilized reinforcements on Monday night itself and launched a fresh search of the area with more troops on Tuesday morning.

The Army's elite para-commandos were deployed while drones and helicopters were also pressed into service for surveillance, they

said. According to the officials, there was no fresh contact with the terrorists on Tuesday who are believed to have infiltrated from across the border and been hiding in the forest area for the past couple of months.

On July 9, terrorists managed to escape after an encounter with security forces in the nearby Ghadi Bhagwah forest bordering Kishtwar district. Three foreign terrorists were killed in a day-long operation in the Gandoh area of the district on June 26.

The anti-terror operations in Doda were intensified after a fierce exchange of fire in Chattargalla pass left five army personnel and a

special police officer injured on June 12. A policeman was injured in another encounter in Gandoh the next day.

The Jammu region, which remained relatively peaceful between 2005 and 2021 after security forces wiped out decades-long terrorism, witnessed a spike in terror attacks over the past month. It included an attack on a pilgrim bus that left nine persons dead and 40 injured.

Terror activities resurfaced in October 2021 from the twin border districts of Poonch and Rajouri. Some of the deadly attacks that spread to Reasi, Kathua and Doda were attributed by the security establishment as an attempt by Pakistani handlers to revive terrorism in the Jammu region.

Over 70 people, including 52 security personnel -- mostly from the Army -- have been killed in terrorrelated incidents in the Jammu region since 2021. Most of the casualties were from Rajouri and Poonch districts where 54 terrorists were also eliminated, the officials said.

Three terrorists were also killed in Reasi district and two others in Kathua district, they added. (PTI)



NEW DELHI, July 16: The Congress on Tuesday alleged that the Modi government spent 10 years 'systematically bludgeoning' India's MSMEs through a combination of deliberate policy and wilful neglect, and asserted that the upcoming Budget will be judged by what it does to revive and rejuvenate MSMEs.

Congress general secretary incharge communications Jairam Ramesh said Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his government must "revisit their economic agenda, shed their cronyism, and end their whimsical policy-mak-

He said Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) account for 30 per cent of India's GDP and about 45 per cent of our exports.

"They employ 12 crore people second only to agriculture -- and are responsible for most job creation. MSMEs, with their wide geographic dispersion, also promote balanced regional development. Yet, the Modi Sarkar has spent 10 years systematically bludgeoning India's MSMEs through a combination of deliberate policy and wilful neglect," Ramesh said in a statement.

Listing the policies and steps that harmed MSMEs, Ramesh said the virtual cessation of all economy activity during demonetisation forced many MSMEs, unable to pay employees or repay their debts, to close.

"Business systematically moved from smaller firms to bigger, more rganised players," he said.

Ramesh further said the initial struggles with implementation of GST put many MSMEs out of business. "Seven years later, however,

GST continues to constrain MSMEs due to its high compliance burden, punitive enforcement, and slow disbursal of refunds. MSMEs do not have the resources to hire lawyers and CAs to deal with the compliance burden. Delayed tax refunds have led to working capital blockages, jeopardizing their financial stability," the Congress leader said. Ramesh said the "haphazard" Covid lockdown and misthe Modi government has "sponsored the oligopolisation" of key industries.

Armed with governmental support and economies of scale, oligopolies have driven MSMEs out of the market, he said.

Raising the issue of cheap Chinese imports, Ramesh said that since 2014, the percentage of imports from China has risen from 1 per cent of overall imports to 16 per cent

"The uncontrolled dumping of these imports has rendered domestic MSMEs uncompetitive, forcing them to shut down. Gujarat, for instance, is home to 80% of India's stainless steel MSMEs, but 35% of them have had to shut down due to China's export of cheaper steel," Ramesh said

Consequently, MSMEs are faced with high tax rates, severe credit crunch, high input prices, and widespread closures, he said.

"Unsurprisingly, their contribution to GDP today is the lowest it has been in decades. The Indian National Congress's pro-MSME agenda includes -- extension of the Non-Performing Assets (NPA) classification period for loans to MSMEs from 90 days to 180 days," he said.

The Congress agenda also includes establishing GST 2.0, with a single, moderate rate and relief for small taxpayers like MSMEs, he said.

It also calls for lessening the burden of tax on MSMEs owned by individuals and partnership firms, and abandoning the policy of rampant oligopolisation that has crowded out MSMEs, Ramesh

He said the Congress agenda also calls for dedicated funds for MSME export capacity creation, and enhanced funding for start-

It further includes fixing the USD 530 billion credit gap in the MSME sector through a dedicated credit fund and lower interest rates, he said.

The 45-day payment rule that became operational from April 1, 2024 has split the MSME community - some want it to continue while others feel it is a disincentive for large firms to do business with them, he said, adding that a middle path can and must be found.

Ramesh called for recognising MSME clusters across the country and provide for their growth and expansion, including through greater use of anti-dumping duties. More effective use of antidumping duties is needed to pro-

It is for Bengaluru for drinking water and it is for you (Tamil Nadu). Please permit us for Makedatu, don't object, we will cooperate in whatever way we can.

Mekedatu is a multi-purpose (drinking water and power) project proposed by Karnataka, which involves building a balancing reservoir near Kanakapura in Ramanagara district. Tamil Nadu has been opposing the project,

raising apprehensions that the state would be affected if the project takes shape.

The project, once completed, is aimed at ensuring drinking water to Bengaluru and neighbouring areas (4.75 tmcft); it also can generate 400 MW power, and the estimated cost of the project is Rs 9,000 crore (2019 rates), according to Karnataka officials.

A separate Project Division and two Sub-Divisions have already been set up to implement the ambitious 'Mekedatu Balancing Reservoir and drinking water project of Cauvery river valley', Chief Minister Siddaramaiah had said, presenting the state budget in February.

"A survey to identify land that will be submerged under this project and the counting process of trees have already been initiated," he had also said, adding, "action will be taken on priority to commence the work early after obtaining remaining necessary clearances from the competent authorities."

Responding to a question regarding Tamil Nadu holding an all party meeting about getting Cauvery water for the state from Karnataka, Shivakumar said: "Tamil Nadu has every right

to meet as we met, we don't object to their meeting, I don't want to comment on that."

Former Bihar minister's father stabbed to death, two persons detained for questioning

DARBHANGA/PATNA, July 16: In a ghastly incident that has sent shock waves across Bihar, former state minister Mukesh Sahni's 70vear-old father was found stabbed to death at his native home in Darbhanga district, a top police officer said. According to Jitendra Singh Gangwar, ADG (Headquarters), two persons have been taken into custody for questioning, on the basis of CCTV footage obtained from cameras installed in the vicinity of the site of the crime.

'They were found moving in a suspicious manner. However, the case is being investigated from all possible angles", said Gangwar, who did not divulge the identity of the detainees. He added, "An STF team has been sent to Darbhanga to assist the local police in the probe. Forensic experts and dog squad have also been pressed into service"

The items on the radar include "the liquid in three glasses" found inside the room where the body of the deceased was spotted by neighbours, with blood spattered all over.

The ADG said the body, which had deep wounds caused by a sharpedged object on the chest and abdomen, has been sent for post mortem.

"Prima facie, the deceased was attacked late in the night. An almirah that used to be in the room, has been found outside. We are examining its contents. We are also trying to trace the owners of three motorcycles parked nearby", said Gangwar. A former Bollywood technician who heads a fledgling outfit Vikassheel Insan Party (VIP), Sahni was away in Mumbai when the information reached him, party sources said. Bihar chief minister

Nitish Kumar, in whose cabinet he had served for about a year-and-ahalf, called him up to offer condolences and ensure speedy investigation. Upon arriving in Patna, on way to Darbhanga, Sahni told reporters at the airport that he was also telephoned by Union Home Minister Amit Shah and RJD president Lalu Prasad.

"All have expressed solidarity in this hour of tragedy", said the 44year-old leader, who did not respond to questions as to whether he suspected any motive behind the murder. Meanwhile, a political blame game has followed the tragedy befalling the VIP supremo, who has, in a political career spanning barely half-a-decade, aligned with parties on both sides of the ideological divide.

The Nishad community leader, who goes by the evocative sobriquet 'son of Mallah', was won over into the INDIA bloc by Tejashwi Yadav, who gave his party seats from the RJD's own quota in the recent Lok Sabha polls, besides ensu-

ing that Sahni accompanied him at over 250 rallies across the state. Yadav, who is the leader of the opposition in state assembly, came out with a statement lambasting NDA government for failure to check crime in Bihar where "people are forced to live in terror"

Leader of the Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi, who had shared the stage with Yadav and Sahni at some of the rallies, offered condolences and wrote on X "it is expected that the government in Bihar will ensure strongest possible punishment to the culprits at the earliest and ensure justice to the bereaved Sahni family". (PTI)

NEW DELHI, July 16: The Delhi government's pollution control body plans to penalise chief engineers of sewage treatment plants that do not treat wastewater to prescribed standards, a major cause of high water pollution in the Yamuna river.

Biological oxygen demand (BOD) and total suspended solids (TSS) in treated wastewater should be less than 10 milligrams per litre. This is critical for cleaning the Delhi stretch of the Yamuna.

The capital missed the December 2023 deadline to treat all the sewage generated to the prescribed standards The Delhi Jal Board (DJB) re-

ceived a six-month extension but failed to meet the goal, according to monthly progress reports on the Yamuna river's rejuvenation sent to the Jal Shakti Ministry. In March this year, Delhi set a

target to increase its sewage treatment capacity to 814 million gallons a day, but this too was not achieved. Now, the DJB aims to reach a sewage treatment capacity of 922 MGD by December 2024 and 964.5 MGD by March 2025, according to the latest monthly progress report submitted to the Jal Shakti Ministry.

Any further delays could make it very difficult for the Aam Aadmi Party-led Delhi government to fulfil its promise of cleaning the Yamuna to bathing



standards by February 2025.

"It is almost certain that the 2025 deadline will also be missed, given the abysmal pace of rehabilitation and upgradation of the existing STPs to meet the standards and the construction of new ones," a former DJB official told PTI.

However, the Delhi Pollution Control Committee (DPCC) wants the DJB to expedite their efforts.

"We have been issuing reminders to the DJB, urging them to expedite the work and meet

the deadlines. We even imposed penalties on the DJB. Now, we have decided to hold the chief engineers overseeing the upgrade of existing STPs and the construction of new STPs accountable," a senior environment department official told PTI.

We will impose personal penalties on the chief engineers responsible for specific sewage treatment plants if they do not comply with the standards," the official said.

Officials told PTI that the upgrade of the Kondli STP Phase 4 to achieve the prescribed standards will be completed by July. The construction of a new 7-MGD STP at Sonia Vihar and the rehabilitation of the 40-MGD Rithala STP (Phase 1) will be completed by September.

According to government reports, the 22-km stretch of the Yamuna between Wazirabad and Okhla in Delhi, which is less than 2 per cent of the river's entire length, accounts for around 80 per cent of its pollution load.

Untapped wastewater from unauthorised colonies and jhuggi-jhopri clusters along with the poor quality of treated wastewater discharged from STPs and common effluent treatment plants (CETPs) is the main reason for the high pollution levels in the river.

The river can be considered fit for bathing if BOD is less than 3 milligrams per litre and dissolved oxygen (DO) is greater than 5 milligrams per litre.

In January last year, the National Green Tribunal had constituted a high-level committee to oversee the Yamuna cleaning work. The HLC has met eight times since then, with the last meeting held in January this year. (PTI)

Committed to eliminate scourge of terrorism in J&K: Army after Doda encounter

JAMMU, June 16: The Udhampu based northern command is committed to eliminate the scourge of terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir, the Army said on Tuesday, as it paid tribute to four soldiers who died in a gunfight with heavily armed terrorists in Doda district.

The Army said it has been conducting a series of joint and coordinated operations with Jammu and Kashmir Police to eliminate foreign terrorists who have infiltrated from across the border and are moving in the upper reaches of Udhampur, Doda and Kishtwar districts in Jammu region and thereafter to Kashmir.

An Army captain and three soldiers were critically injured in an encounter with terrorists in Dhari Gote Urarbagi in the Desa forest belt of Doda on Monday night and later succumbed to injuries. The latest incident comes a week after a terrorist ambush on an Army patrol in the remote Machedi forest belt in Kathua district claimed the lives of five soldiers and injured as many

"All formations of northern command are committed to eliminate the scourge of terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir for which the relentless operations will continue." the Army said in a statement here.

A number of measures have been instituted to enhance synergy between



various agencies, it added.

The Army said similar intelligencebased and area domination operations are continuing in Kashmir region, North of Pir Panjal ranges.

BENGALURU, July 16: Three persons were killed and four others feared dead after a massive landslide near Shirur village in Karnataka's Uttara Kannada district on Tuesday, officials said.

Karnataka Revenue Minister Krishna Byre Gowda said seven persons, including four members of a family, were feared killed in the landslide on National Highway 66. A police officer told PTI: "We have recovered three bodies so far including that of 47-year-old Lakshman Naik and his 36-year-old wife Shanti Naik who were running an eatery on the National Highway 66. Search operations are underway to trace others who are feared dead." The others who are feared dead

are Roshan (11), Avantika (6), and Jagannath (55), the Minister's office said in a statement. Police sources said parts of a hill

collapsed on the road-side eatery. Gowda told the Legislative As-

sembly that drivers of three gas tankers had stopped by at the eatery for a tea break when mud and rocks plunged down the hill

The landslide, triggered by incessant rains, also swept away two of the three tankers into the Gangavali river flowing on other side of the road. Local police along with National Disaster Response Force personnel and other agencies are car-

This shows that "action to be taken when T/A 912 is issued to them is not clear. Some of the loco pilots have followed the 15 kmph rule while most of

the loco pilots did not follow this rule. The absence of proper authority and that too without adequate information created misinterpretation and misunderstanding about the speed to be followed." PTI had first reported that the T/A 912 didn't mention speed restriction which the CRS has also flagged in its report as a major reason for the accident.

Classifying the accident under the "Error in Train Working" category, the CRS said there was "inadequate counselling of loco pilots and station masters about train operation in automatic signalling territory creating misinterpretation and misunderstanding of rules."

It said the large number of signalling failures in automatic signalling territory is a cause of concern and should be taken up with those concerned to improve the reliability of the system.

"The occurrence of as many as 208 cases of Signal Passing at Danger (red signal overshooting) from 1.4.2019 to

31.03.2024, out of which 12 cases resulted in collision, highlights the limitations of preventive measures taken by zonal railways (counselling of loco pilot/assistant loco pilot, safety drives, etc.)," the CRS said.

"This underscores the need for implementation of the Automatic Trainprotection system (KAVACH) on top priority. Use of non-signalling-based systems such as Artificial intelligencebased detection of the RED aspect of the signal and providing an early warning to the loco pilot/GPS-based anti-collision systems shall be explored for provision in locomotive cabs across Indian Railways in non-ATP (automatic train protection) territory," it said.

The CRS also said that there was a shortage of walkie-talkies in the Northeast Frontier Railway (NFR) Zone under whose jurisdiction the accident took place and hence the goods train crew was not issued the "critical safety equipment". (PTI)

Five dead, 42 injured as bus ferrying pilgrims hits tractor on Mumbai-Pune Expressway

MUMBAI, July 16: At least five persons were killed and 42 injured when a bus carrying `warkaris' or pilgrims headed for Pandharpur hit a tractor on Mumbai-Pune Expressway, police said on Tuesday.

The bus was ferrying 54 warkaris, devotees of Lord Vitthal, on their way to Pandharpur in Solapur district for Ashadhi Ekadashi celebrations from Dombivli near Mumbai.

Notably, tractors are not allowed on the expressway.

The accident took place around midnight near Panvel in Navi Mumbai, deputy commissioner of police Vivek Pansare said.

The speeding bus hit the tractor from behind while trying to overtake it, police said. Three passengers from the bus and two persons riding on the tractor -- driver Tarvez Salahuddin Ahmed (27) and Deepak Sohan Rajbhar (30) -- and were killed,

After hitting the tractor, the bus broke through the barricade of the expressway and fell into a 20-feet deep gorge, an official said.

The deceased bus passengers were identified as Hausabai Hari Patil (65), Ramdas Narayan Mukadam (71) and Gurunath Bapu Patil (65). The injured pilgrims were rushed to a private hospital. The condition of seven of them was serious, he said.

Ashadhi Ekadashi will be celebrated on Wednesday.

Outsider, that's me: Anita Desai on belonging, identity and writing every day

NEW DELHI, July 16: Still a foreigner in her adopted home in the US and finding herself alienated from the rapidly changing India of today, veteran author Anita Desai says she has accepted the "outsider" tag and that's what a writer should be anyway.

The 87-year-old, one of India's best known writers in English and a pioneer in the genre, has always been intrigued by the question of identity. Born to a German immigrant mother and an Indian father, it is a theme she has explored in depth in her many books and in her personal life as well

"I am still a foreigner here, I am still an outsider here, and I have accepted it. Well, that's what a writer's life is: to be the outsider. India has changed so much. I don't understand those changes. There are many occasions where I feel I don't belong in India," Desai told PTI in a Zoom interview from her home in Cold Spring, New York.

"...I don't feel like going back to India, to the old Delhi that I grew up in. Because the place doesn't exist anymore. It has been torn down, rebuilt or just vanished.'

Desai, who started writing at the age of seven and has just released her latest work, a novella called "Rosarita". a haunting tale of identity, memory, grief and genera-



On 'incredible day,' Mbappé welcomed by Real Madrid fans at packed Santiago Bernabeu

MADRID, July 16: Kylian waved to the fans who chanted dation were also on hand. Mbappé finally put on a Real Madrid jersey on Tuesday, fulfilling his childhood dream in front of a packed Santiago Bernabeu Stadium.

Nearly 80,000 fans were in hand at the Bernabeu to welcome the 25-year-old France star during his official presentation as the club's newest player. After signing his fiveyear contract with the Spanish powerhouse alongside club president Florentino Pérez, Mbappé entered the stage set up at the Bernabeu to loud cheers by the Madrid fans.

Wearing the No. 9 jersey, Mbappé smiled broadly and his name, then embraced Pérez and former Madrid player and coach Zinedine Zidane, who invited Mbappé to visit the Spanish club for the first time when he was just a teenager.

"It's incredible day for me," Mbappé told the crowd, in Spanish. "Since being a kid I dreamed about playing for Madrid and today I'm here. It means a lot to me.

Mbappé's relatives, club officials and several former players were by the stage at the Bernabeu, which had its roof closed for the midday ceremony in the Spanish capital. Kids linked to Mbappé's foun-

The record-15 European Cups won by Madrid were also on display on the stage where Mbappé was introduced. The message "Welcome, Mbappé" was shown on the large video boards at the newly revamped Bernabeu. Some of the club's most iconic moments were also shown while the song "Nessun Dorma" was played on the loudspeakers. Images of Mbappe's career were also displayed, as well as photos including Mbappé wearing Madrid's uniform as a kid and posing alongside former club star Cristiano Ronaldo.



Pérez called Mbappé's presentation a "historic act" for the club. "Today we welcome an exceptional player who today is fulfilling his childhood dream," Pérez said. "Today you are here because it's something that you wanted. Thank you for making a great effort to be able to wear this white iersey." Mbappé's presentation came after he played at the 2024 European Championship, where France lost to eventual champion Spain in

the semifinals. After years trying to sign the young player, Madrid finally reached a deal with him in June when he opted not to stay

with Paris Saint-Germain and became a free agent.

Mbappé had played club soccer only for French teams - first at Monaco before joining PSG and staving there for the past seven seasons.

Pérez made signing Mbappé a strategic club priority since the powerhouse failed to lock him up when he visited the club's facilities at age 14 and instead joined Monaco's youth academy.

In 2021, Madrid was rejected after offering PSG a bid of 180 million euros, the same amount PSG paid Monaco for a teenage Mbappé years earlier. (AP)

THGATE'S CONTRACT WAS DUE Gareth Southgate says he will step down as England manager

LONDON, July 16: Gareth Southgate will step down as England manager after eight years in charge, he said on Tuesday. Southgate led England to the final of Euro

2024 - losing 2-1 to Spain on Sunday.

"As a proud Englishman, it has been the honour of my life to play for England and to manage England. It has meant everything to me, and I have given it my all," he said. "But it's time for change, and for a new chapter.'

Southgate's contract was due to expire this year and his announcement comes after months of uncertainty surrounding his future

He was hired in 2016 and led England to back-to-back finals at the Euros and to the semifinals of the World Cup in 2018.

But he was unable to end the nation's decades-long wait for a major trophy since the World Cup in 1966.

He said before the European Champi-onship that it would likely be his last if England did not win and faced fierce criticism during the tournament, which saw some fans throw plastic beer cups towards him at the end of the 0-0 draw with Slovenia during the group phase.

But he achieved what no other England manager has by leading his team to back-toback Euros finals and the first final on foreign soil.

'Gareth has made the impossible job possible and laid strong foundations for future success. He is held in the highest regard by the players, the backroom team, by everyone at the FA and across the world of football," FA chief executive Mark Bullingham

From being hapless victim of a TV sting to Olympic medallist: Lalit's journey to stardom

NEW DELHI, July 16: From being a hapless victim of a sting operation at the start of his career to becoming an Olympic medallist, Indian men's hockey team striker Lalit Upadhyay has worked hard to rebuild his career and considers all the setbacks as blessings in disguise.

At the the age of 17 in 2008, Lalit's fledging career came to a sudden halt when he was embroiled in an unnecessary scandal for no fault of his.

Posing as an agent, a reporter from a TV channel offered then Indian Hockey Federation (IHF) secretary K Jothikumaran a sponsorship deal only if a player of their choice was taken into the Indian team, and Lalit's name was taken as a bait.

Lalit was unaware of such a 'deal' and shaken by the incident, he almost quit hockey.

"If this happens to any boy who is immature and has come into the team with big dreams, he would be shattered. We had only heard about India winning eight

Olympic medals but had not seen it happen in front of us. It was a dream to play in the Olympics and win a medal," Lalit told PTI Bhasha.

"But in a way it was a blessing in disguise for me. When I faced all this in the beginning. I became mentally stronger. Although I have forgotten that incident, whenever I remember it, I feel stronger.

"Now the circumstances have changed a lot, social media has also come, so it will not happen with anyone. I consider myself lucky that I have left that behind and now going to play in the Olympics for the second time. Whenever I wear this jersey, I get inspired to do something special," said the 30-year-old forward, who was a vital member of India's bronze medal-winning side in Tokyo.

An Olympic bronze and Asian Games gold already in his kitty, Lalit is now focussed on changing the colour of the medal in Paris Games, starting July 26.

"We know that expectations are high because we won an Olympic medal after a long time in Tokyo. We are confident that the colour of the medal will be changed," said Lalit, who has scored 45 goals in 168 international appearances. "We have worked hard on fitness in the last four years, which is visible on the field. In fitness,

we are at par with the top teams in the world. The fitness level of seniors along with young players have improved tremendously." But it won't be easy in Paris as India are placed in a tough Pool B along side New Zealand, reigning champions Belgium, mighty Australia, Argentina and Ireland. India will open their campaign

against New Zealand on July 27. "It's irrelevant to focus on the pool because all teams come with full preparation to give their best. We will focus on one match at a time and try to give our best in every match," said Lalit.

Lalit is optimistic about India's chances, saying in modern day hockey the gap is very narrow between top teams of the world.

"Hockey is always changing and all the teams keep updating themselves. Our training program is also prepared keeping this in mind. We recently played the FIH Pro League and we practice keeping in mind top teams like Australia, Germany and Belgium," he

"This time there have been a lot of field goals in the Pro League and the focus is on creating opportunities inside the D. As forwards, we try to score field goals or produce penalty corners which is important in modern very hockey," added Lalit.

India have retained 11 players from Tokyo while five will make their Olympic debut in Paris. "These boys (young players) have won gold medal in the Asian Games and overcame the pressure to qualify for the Olympics, so they are capable of handling pressure. We have been playing with them for a long time and the coordination is good. We keep talking to each other and share our expe-

riences," said Lalit, who hails from Varanasi.

Lalit described mutual respect, bonding and unity as major strengths of the current team. "During COVID we all stayed together for a long time at the SAI centre in Bengaluru, which gave us more opportunities to get to know each other. This strengthened the team bonding and helped us immensely to give Indian hockey a new lease of life by breaking the jinx in Tokyo."

The ancient city of Varanasi has given Indian hockey legends like late Mohammed Shahid, who has an indelible impact on Lalit's life and career.

'There is a saying in our Banaras (Varanasi) that everything starts from here and ends here. When we also sit on the banks of Ganga, at one side there is Dashashwamedh Ghat (Ganga arti ghat) and on the other side there is Manikarnika Ghat (cremation ghat). We pray at one ghat and on the other one we pray for peace of departing souls," he said. (PTI)

Hardik Pandya to lead India in T20Is against Sri Lanka

NEW DELHI, July 16: Star allrounder Hardik Pandya is all set to lead India in the three-match T20 International series against Sri Lanka starting July 27.

However, one of the heroes of India's T20 World Cup victory last month will take a break during the three-match ODI series, which is scheduled in August, due to "personal reasons"

"Hardik Pandya was India's T2O vice-captain under Rohit Sharma. He is completely fit and available for the three-match T20I series and will lead the side," a senior BCCI source told PTI on conditions of anonymity.

Rohit retired from T20 Internationals at the end of the World Cup. The T20Is against Sri Lanka will run from July 27 to 30 in Pallekele, followed by the ODIs from August 2 to 7 in Colombo. The squad for the series is expected to be announced in the next couple of days.

While there is still no clarity on who would be Pandya's deputy, the toss-up is between Shubman Gill, who recently captained India to a 4-1 series win over Zimbabwe, and Suryakumar Yadav, who led the side during the T20Is against South



Africa last year. About the ODIs, the official confirmed that Pandya has asked

for leave and has already communicated this to regular skipper Rohit Sharma, who is also taking a

break from this series. "The break from ODIs is for very personal reasons. Hardik doesn't have any fitness issue as is being floated in the media," the official said.

For the ODIs, KL Rahul, who led in the last ODI series in South Africa, and Gill are in contention for the leadership role.

BCCI secretary Jay Shah has made it clear that even star cricketers must make themselves available for domestic engagements when they are free from national duty. But exceptions will be made for the likes of Rohit, Virat Kohli and pace spearhead Jasprit Bumrah.

The BCCI would, however, want all the other Test specialists to play at least one if not a couple of Duleep Trophy games in August as a precursor to the Tests against Bangladesh and New Zealand. "This time there is no zonal se-

lection committee for Duleep Trophy. Only national selection committee will pick Duleep teams. "All Test team contenders will

be picked. For Rohit, Virat and Bumrah, it will be their choice if they want to play or not," the source added. (PTI)



NEW DELHI, July 16: The presence of some established foes notwithstanding, Indian shuttler Lakshya Sen has got a "fair" draw in his debut Olympics, according to his coach Vimal Kumar, who expects the youngster to play freely in Paris thanks to his "underdog" status and some technical improvements in his overall game.

World No. 19 Sen's path to an Olympic medal has multiple hurdles as he will need to get past familiar Indonesian nemesis Jonatan Christie, last Olympics' surprise semifinalist Kevin Cordon from Guatemala, and Julian Carraggi from Belgium in Group L.

"I think it (the draw) is very fair, I feel it is a very reasonable draw for him," Vimal, a former India coach, told PTI from Marseille, France where Sen is currently training ahead of the Paris Olympics.

"A couple of times, he has lost to Jonathan Christie in close matches. It's a 50-50 match. You have to convert (chances) if you have to get to the second stage. In my opinion, Lakshya has nothing to lose. He will be the underdog and he can play a lot more freely,' he asserted

had worked with Sen in 2022 "We have brought in a lot of speed work into closing stages, we introduced a lot of double drills in finishing, pushing the pace towards certain points. Last three weeks, Yoo Yong-Sung has been helping us with those drills," Vimal

said Vimal said Sen has also been doing a lot of service variations practice

"(The idea is) basically to bring in some sort of intensity in the routines. Certain sets of routines that we follow are mostly singles-oriented. He (Sen) worked on those flat exchanges, retrieving and things like approaching the net and being a little more alert at the net," Vimal explained.

For the last one week, Sen has been training at the Halles des Sports Parsemain in Fos-sur-Mer, which is about 45 minutes from Marseille city centre.

Sen is also training with the Olympic-bound Popov brothers --Christo and Toma Junior -- till July 21. Indian shuttlers Kiran George, Ayush Shetty have been roped in too for sparring. "Next week we will be doing

one set of tournament practice because he needs that little bit of that match practice. It would have been good to see him in Canada. So next week I want to see how he is implementing what he learned.

"Against both the Popov brothers, it will be a good test. So I'll be able to assess him. Once he gets into the village in Paris, we won't get to play much. We will have limited time for practice in the main arena."

Lakshya had struggled through much of 2023 and early part of 2024. He fell behind in the qualification race but turned things around in time with two semifinal finishes at the All England Championship and the French Open to seal his place in the Olympics.

"From all that he has survived, he got an opportunity to qualify. He has been practising and has worked on his game. Lakshya has acclimatised to the conditions, he plays well there in those condi-

"We have also got some of that tournament shuttlecock (F-90) because the conditions are a little on the slower side in Paris. So we have been practising with those shuttles," said Vimal, who guided Saina Nehwal to world No. 1 in 2015

Sumit Nagal attains career-high ATP ranking of 68

NEW DELHI, July 16: Olympic-bound Sumit Nagal continued his ascent in the ATP singles chart, climbing to a career-high ranking of 68.

The 26-year-old rose five spots in the latest ATP ranking list released on Monday. His previous best was 71. Nagal thus moves past former world No. 71 Sashi Menon to become the fourth highest-ranked Indian man since 1973

Vijay Amritraj (ranked 18th in 1980), Ramesh Krishnan (ranked 23rd in 1985) and Somdev Devvarman (ranked 62nd in 2011) are the only other Indian players who have held a higher rank than Nagal.

A string of impressive results in recent times has not only helped Nagal improve his ranking but also make the cut for singles event at the Paris Games.

Nagal, who will be the sole Indian in the men's singles event at the Paris Olympics, has so far logged 779 ATP points.

The year began with a win against Alexander Bublik, the 31st seed from Kazkakhstan at the Australian Open. He also competed at the French Open and Wim-

I started doubting if all the hard work was worth it. I called my father, who encouraged me to participate in next competition in Sri Lanka," he said in a JioCinema release. Jena won in Lebanon (on July 21) with a throw

"I followed it up with another personal best of 87.54m at the Asian Games (in Hangzhou, China where he won a silver behind Chopra) securing my ticket to Paris 2024. I now want to give my best at Paris. I am quite confident. While I haven't set any particular targets, I am aiming to improve my personal best."

Jena is currently struggling for form as he has crossed the 80m mark just once in the six events he has taken part after the World Championships. He threw 80.84m to win a bronze medal at the National Inter-State Championships in Panchkula in June and that was his season's best so far. (PTI)

Moudgil overcomes mental demons to secure place in shooting contingent for Paris Games

NEW DELHI, Jul 16: Overcoming mental demons after being left out of the Indian team from last year's Asian Games and the World Championships was key to shooter Anjum Moudgil securing a Paris Olympic berth.

Former world no.1 Moudgil, a world championships and Commonwealth Games medallist, competed in two events during the last edition in Tokyo. She finished 15th in the 50m rifle 3 position and 18th in the 10m air rifle, but in Paris, she will be featuring in only women's 50m 3 position.

By her own admission, the ouster from the Indian team for Worlds and Asian Games due to inconsistent form was an eye opener for her as the 30-year-old worked on bettering her mental toughness besides focussing entirely on her training

"Three years after Tokyo was a rollercoaster ride for me. I have seen tough times but I wanted to comeback stronger. The experiences of Tokyo will surely be of helpful (in Paris)," Moudgil said in a virtual media interaction.

"I really took advantage of quotas and trials, the federation told me not to lose out hope. They understood the things I

was going through. I was really confident of making through to the team after I didn't make the team for World Championships and the Asian Games because of just 2 points in the trials.

"I was too focussed and positive in giving my best in the trials. I knew my strengths and how to work under pressure and it paid off.

"One year after Tokyo, I won couple of medals in World Cups and became world no.1. I did mental training focus, it's been a positive step for me. I now speak up, which is a positive change heading to Paris. I used time to get better and find what works better for me," she added.

Understanding the importance of mental health issues, the International Olympic Committee (IOC), has set up the Mentally Fit Helpline, a dedicated, independent and confidential mental health counselling service available to all athletes accredited for the Paris Games.

"It's (mental health) so important for all the federations and IOC to understand. It's important to understand the mental side, understand how it works for an ath-

lete, understand mental toughness. So, it's positive step to see mental helpline being introduced in Paris Olympics,"



Moudgil said.

"Athletes have spoken in the past about mental health issues. It's a common issue which needs to be addressed not only for

athletes, but in every profession. "People should respect mental health,

"The competition is very high in India and the pressure situations we face during trials will definitely help in Olympics. "...we had a different experience in Tokyo because of Covid, we won quotas 3 years before and was waiting as the Games were postponed. But we really don't discuss too much baggage of Tokyo. It's just another big competition and that's what we discuss.

Shooting competitions of the Paris Olympics will be held at National Shooting Center in Châteauroux, the capital city of the French department of Indre. central France, which is approximately 270km from Paris.

"The preparation is going really well and according to plan. We are Luxembourg for the last phase of our training and preparation before we head to Châteauroux, France on 21st." (PTI)
