CM predicts Muslims becoming majority in state by 2041 'Census data says in every 10 years Muslim population rises by 11 lakh in Assam'

GUWAHATI, July 19: Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Friday claimed that the Muslim population in his state is growing around 30 per cent every 10 years, and they will become the majority

Addressing a press conference here, he said Muslims have now become 40 per cent of Assam's population as per "statistical sam-

"In 2011, 1.4 crore Muslims were there in Assam. By 2041, Assam will become a Muslim-majority state. It's a reality and nobody can stop it," Sarma asserted.

According to the 2011 census, Assam had a total Muslim population of 1.07 crore, making up 34.22 per cent of the total 3.12 crore residents. There were 1.92 crore Hindus in the state, around 61.47 per cent of the total population.

"In every 10 years, the Muslim population rises by 11 lakh in Assam... This is not Himanta Biswa Sarma's data, but Indian census data. These are all published data," the CM said.



Sarma said the population of the Hindu community is rising by around 16 per cent every 10 years.

The Assam government has taken steps to reduce population growth among the Muslim com-

DIPHU, HT Bureau July 19: Nirupam Chakma, member of the National Commission for Scheduled Tribes (NCST), Government of India, is on a one-day visit to Karbi Anglong Autonomous Council (KAAC), one of the autonomous councils constituted under the Sixth Schedule to the Constitution of India.

The KAAC comprises Karbi Anglong and West Karbi Anglong in the

state of Assam. Chakma visited KAAC with an aim to review the challenges faced by Scheduled Tribes within the jurisdiction of KAAC

and assess the coun-

cil's functioning. During his visit, Chakma engaged in discussions with elected members of KAAC, including executive members (EMs) and members of Autonomous Council (MACs), at the conference hall of the old KAAC secretariat building. The meeting, chaired by KAAC chairman Raju Tisso, was attended by Mukul Kumar Saikia, principal secretary of KAAC, and Nirola

Phangchopi, district commissioner of Karbi Anglong.

Rongphar informed Chakma that Scheduled Tribes in the region are dissatisfied with the current provisions of the Sixth Schedule due to certain limitations. Since 1986, there has been a widespread demand for an Autonomous State under Article 244(A) of the Indian Constitution, which has led to a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the Autonomous State Demand Committee (ASDC)

and the Central Government. Additionally, KAAC has passed two resolutions for the implementation of Article 244(A).

Rongphar also highlighted that despite these efforts, certain clauses of the

MoU signed in 2011 have not been fully implemented. He further expressed KAAC's demand for direct funding from the central government through the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, citing current funding practices that do not adequately support KAAC.

Furthermore, Rongphar addressed concerns regarding the interference of the Governor in KAAC affairs, stating that all bills must receive the Governor's consent. (CONTD. ON PAGE-2)

Assam encounter: Hmar apex body calls killing of 3 youths 'extrajudicial'

GUWAHATI, July 19: Several dent is found to be full of inconsis-Hmar community organisations have denounced the killing of three of its youths in an alleged encounter with Assam Police two days ago and urged the NHRC to take suo motu cognisance of these "extrajudicial" deaths.

In a statement, the Assam Hills Region of the Hmar Inpui, the community's apex body, termed the circumstances leading to death of the three Hmar youths as "a stark violation of human rights".

On July 17, three suspected Hmar militants were killed and three police personnel injured in a fierce encounter in Assam's Cachar district, senior police officials had

Two of them were from Cachar and one was from Churachandpur

"The police version of the inci-

tencies. Based on various videos circulated in social media, it is clear that the killings were extrajudicial and the policemen involved need to be tried in the court of law for the cold murder of three Indian citizens," Hmar Inpui said.

The organisation's Assam Hills Region in its statement demanded that the state government immediately institute a special commission to conduct an impartial investigation into their deaths in light of the evidence recorded on video and the "inconsistency" reported in the social media outlets.

"We also request the National Human Rights Commission to take suo motu cognisance of the deaths and notify the Assam government to institute a magisterial inquiry into the killings. The dastardly and cowardly attacks against minorities

by the brutal police forces should be stopped immediately," it added. The group said those involved in the alleged encounter should not go scot-free and be booked and

punished as per the law. "We also demand the Cachar Police to respect the right to live and should not covertly indulge in curbing the rights of minorities. We deeply mourn the loss of our three precious youths and stand in solidarity with the bereaved families," Hmar Inpui said.

Addressing a press conference after the shootout on Wednesday, Cachar SP Numal Mahatta had claimed that the deceased youths were part of a larger group, which was preparing to carry out "subversive activities" along the Assam-Manipur inter-state border areas. GUWAHATI, July 19: Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Friday said three crore saplings will be planted across the state between August 1 and 15 to increase forest cover. Addressing a press conference here, Sarma said the

cover by two per cent. "This year, our target is to plant three crore saplings from August 1 to 15. Last year, the target was one crore saplings in a single day, but we planted 1.12 crore and 90 per cent of those survived," he said.

The state government has already roped in various agencies and central forces including the army, air force, SSB, CRPF, BSF, schools, colleges, self-help groups and NGOs to implement the 'Amrit Briksha Andolan' campaign, Sarma said.

"Our aim is to plant 10 crore saplings in three-four years. If we can do that, we will see a positive impact on our environment in five-six years," he said. The chief minister also said his government carries

out afforestation drives in all the reclaimed areas from eviction of forests in different parts of the state. "Because of eviction, we are getting land and we



are planting trees there. So far, we have cleared around 10,000 hectares of forest land. Besides, we have cleared a large number of revenue villages, where solar power projects are being installed," he said.

The Assam government has reclaimed "huge areas" from the Brahmaputra, which were washed away due to years of erosion.

"In many such areas, plantation drives are underway. We will continue to clear forest lands," he added.

Internal matter: India on deadly clashes in Bangladesh

NEW DELHI, July 19: India on Friday described the violent protests in Bangladesh as an "internal" matter of Dhaka but at the same time said it was closely monitoring the situation in the context of 15,000 Indians residing in that country.

Bangladesh has been reeling under deadly clashes with protesting students demanding the Sheikh Hasina-led government scrap a controversial job quota system. Around 30 people have died in the clashes that began weeks ago.

The 15,000 Indians including 8,500 students are safe, External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said at his weekly media briefing.

"As you are aware, there are ongoing protests in Bangladesh. We see this as an internal matter of the country," he said.

External affairs minister S Jaishankar is himself following the matter closely in the context of safety of the Indians, Jaiswal added

The situation in Bangladesh deteriorated this week prompting authorities to stop bus and train services and shutting down schools and universities across the country.

"We have issued an advisory for Indian nationals, including our students, resident in Bangladesh for their safety and assistance if required," Jaiswal said

The Indian high commission has already activated helpline numbers that are operating 24x7, he said.

"Our High Commission will be providing regular updates. I will also be posting regular updates. I would urge family members to follow us for the latest developments," he said.

"We remain committed to providing all possible assistance to our nationals in Bangladesh," Jaiswal

Indian nationals in Bangladesh are estimated to be around 15,000 which included around 8,500 students, he said. "We are aware of the measures taken by (CONTD. ON PAGE-2)

Widespread technology outage disrupts flights, banks, media outlets and companies around the world

FRANKFURT, July 19: A global technology outage grounded flights, knocked banks and hospital systems offline and media outlets off air on Friday in a massive disruption that affected companies and services around the world and highlighted dependence on software from a handful of providers.

Cybersecurity firm CrowdStrike said that the issue believed to be behind the outage was not a security incident or cyberattack — and that a fix was on the way. The company said the problem occurred when it deployed a faulty update to computers running Microsoft Windows.

But hours after the problem was first detected, the disarray continued — and escalated.

Long lines formed at airports in the US, Europe and Asia as airlines lost access to check-in and booking services at a time when many travellers are heading away on summer vacations. News outlets in Australia — where telecommunications were severely affected — were pushed off air for hours.

Nobody expects RBI to be cheerleader, coordination with govt helped fast revival in economy: Guv Das

MUMBAI, July 19: Governor Shaktikanta Das on Friday said the Reserve Bank's relations with the government have been "smooth" during his nearly six-year term, and credited the close coordination between the two for the quick revival of the economy after the pandemic.

by Financial Express here, the bureaucrat-turned-central banker said nobody has expected him to be a "cheerleader" for the government during his term.

"I am saying from my experience. Nobody expects RBI to be a cheerleader. I have had no such experience," he said, responding to a specific question about a lament made by one of his prede-

cessors in a recent book. Asked if he is open for a new term at Mint Road, Das said he is very focused on the current assignment and does not think of anything outside that.

Das said the RBI is optimistic that its estimate of 7.2 per cent growth for FY25 will be met, and added that with steady growth, the focus of the policy has to be "clearly and unambiguously" on inflation. The inflation elephant is



taking pauses and grudgingly moving towards the forest or the 4 per cent target in an unidirectional way, he added

ICSI has already added two new subjects to its curriculum. ESG and artificial intelligence

"ESG is the need of the hour. It has been

made mandatory by SEBI to submit business responsibility and sustainability reporting (BRSR) for the top 1000 companies in terms of market capitalisation. These companies are required to disclose their ESG performance along with the annual reports," he said.

Narasimhan said companies which are ESG compliant will get noticed by foreign in-

"Foreign investors will enquire whether the Indian company in which they plan to invest are ESG compliant. The 'stewardship code' for institutional investors is still in its infancy in the country and gives immense scope for company secretary professionals to expand their scope of practice," he said.

Paytm Apr-Jun quarter loss widens to ₹840 cr


NEW DELHI, July 19: Fintech firm One97 Communications, which owns Paytm brand, on Friday said its loss has widened to ₹840 crore in the quarter ended June 30, primarily due to continued impact of restrictions on Paytm Payments Bank Ltd.

The company had posted a loss of ₹ 358.4 crore in the same period a year ago, according to a regulatory filing by the company.

The consolidated revenue of Paytm declined 33.48 per cent to ₹ 1,639.1 crore during the reported quarter, from ₹ 2.464.2 crore in the same period a year ago.

Paytm spokesperson attributed the widening of loss and decline in revenue primarily to the disruption in business due to restrictions imposed on associate company Paytm Payments Bank Limited (PPBL) by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI). The RBI barred PPBL from accepting deposits, credit transactions or top-ups in any customer accounts, wallets, and FASTags, keeping in view the interest of customers, including merchants from March 15 onwards.

"There were three factors which have led to this (decline in revenue and widening of loss) which are



primarily disruption on account of PPBL products like Wallet. We stopped using Wallet and some of the products," the spokesperson said. The company also temporarily stopped some of the products on which regulators may have concern at an industry-level.

"We temporarily stopped a lot of those products and those products are in the process of starting. The third (factor) is that because of the disruption, our merchant base and GMV (gross merchandise value) came down and that has an impact on the profitability overall,' the spokesperson said. (PTI)

we do? The Muslim political leaders themselves have two children, but they never advice villagers about limiting the number of children to two," Sarma said. Sarma also opined that if earlier CMs "were not secular" and had spoken like him since 1971 or 1981 about population explosion, the state would have got positive results. "If the government had taken steps to educate the Muslim girls and against child marriage, this situation would not have developed. I cannot perform a miracle in just three years. If it (Muslims becoming majority) gets delayed till 2051, we will believe we have done something," he said.

Sarma claimed that when he was the health minister of Assam during the Congress tenure, one lakh male

sterilisations took place in 2009. "Gradually, the programme was stopped. If we can continue the process, we can be successful to a large extent... It is also not like this that all women want to give birth to five-eight children. There are some enabling factors, which help raise the numbers," he said.

Asked if the government's awareness drive regarding family planning has failed, Sarma said nothing has been done in this aspect, as compulsory family planning cannot be imposed in India.

"What awareness will work in Char (riverine islands) areas? If that had worked, the country would have progressed a lot. Therefore, we don't go for any awareness activities in Chars," he said.

The chief minister asserted that because of the rise of Muslim population, people from the community are visible in almost every sphere of life. "If you travel in app cabs in Guwahati, you will find that nine out of 10 are from one particular religion. You can go to Barpeta and Dhubri, and see the data," he added. (PTI)

Assam encounter: Hmar apex

Sarma too had termed the three youths as militants and said in a post on X, "In an early morning operation, @cacharpolice killed 3 Hmar militants from Assam and neighbouring Manipur. Police also seized 2 AK rifles, 1 other rifle and 1 pistol." Assam DGP on Thursday backed his force and Mahatta on X while sharing the press note distributed by the Cachar SP, saying it may be taken as authentic note on behalf of Assam Police.

According to Mahatta, police had received an input regarding movement of suspected militants at Krishnapur road under Kachudharam Police Station and three persons were arrested along with sophisticated weapons near Ganganagar while on way towards Bhuban Hills in an autorickshaw.

He had further said that as per preliminary investigation, the apprehended trio were members of a Hmar extremist organisation and trained cadres.

"During interrogation, they revealed that some of their cadres were hiding in a nearby jungle in Bhuban Hills and were planning to carry out some subversive activities along Assam-Manipur border," the SP had said. Subsequently, a special operation was launched led by the district Additional SP along with commandos in the Bhuban Hills side for apprehension of the suspected militants. The security team was being led by the apprehended culprits. "The moment we reached there, they started indiscriminate firing. There were 6-7 militants hiding behind the bushes. Police team immediately took their positions and retaliated. There was heavy exchange of fire from both the sides," Mahatta had claimed.

The apprehended militants, who were taken by the police team, were wearing bulletproof jackets and helmets. They sustained grievous injuries during the encounter and were immediately shifted to Sonai primary health centre and later were shifted to Silchar Medical College and Hospital, where the attending doctor declared them dead, he had added. He had also said three police personnel were severely injured during the exchange of fire and were admitted at the SMCH. The deceased militants were identified as Lallungawi Hmar (21), Lal-

CEM Boro inaugurates Chino Basumatary Space Lab in Chirang

BTR launches NE India's first space lab at govt school, initiates plan for ten more across region

KOKRAJHAR, July 19: The Department of Education, government of Bodoland Territorial Region (BTR), has added another feather to its cap with the inauguration of its first space laboratory on Friday, marking it as the first space lab in a government school in north-east India.

The chief executive member of Bodoland Territorial Region (BTR), Pramod Boro, inaugurated the 'Chino Basumatary Memorial Space Laboratory' at Sidli Kashikotra Higher Secondary School, Chirang, in the presence of a large gathering of students, senior government officials, and teaching staff.

The event was graced by the presence of esteemed dignitaries, including principal secretary of BTC, Akash Deep; secretary of Education, Amarjyoti Barman; and former senior space scientist at ISRO, Dr TN Suresh Kumar.

Dr Suresh Kumar is a former senior space scientist from ISRO with an illustrious career spanning over 38 years. He retired from the INSAT Master Control Facility, Department of Space, government of India, in July 2017. Dr Kumar's career began in 1978 at the Space Application Center, ISRO, Ahmedabad, after graduating in Electronics & Communication Engineering. Known for his diverse interests and extraordinary personal accomplishments, Dr Kumar has established himself as a pioneer in various fields, including education, exploration, and adventure. Dr Kumar holds several "firsts" as an Indian scientist, including traveling to the 'Edge of Space-Stratosphere' and experiencing zero gravity flight at the Yuri Gagarin Cosmonaut Centre in Russia. He has explored the Ennedi Plateau region of the Sahara Desert, reached the summit of the active Nyiragongo Volcano in Congo, visited Easter Island, and traveled to more than 175 countries across all seven continents. Dr Kumar's unique blend of scientific expertise and adventurous spirit has allowed him to contribute significantly to both the field of space science and our understanding of the world through his extensive travels and explorations. This inaugural space lab is

named in honor of Late Chino Basumatary, a renowned social worker and journalist from the village of Bhaulaguri, Kashikotra, in Sidli development block of Chirang. Born on April 13, 1954, to Late Saildendra Basumatary and Late Sabeswari Basumatary, he passed away on December 29, 2015. Chino Basumatary's contributions to society were numerous and significant. He was the editor and publisher of 'ARONAI' newspaper (1981), 'Bodosa' weekly newspaper (1991), and 'Bodosa' daily newspaper (2006). He served as the founder president of 'Bodoland Journalist Association' and Kokrajhar Press Club.

A folk song artist & composer at All India Radio, he was also president of Tribal Youth Association and Sidli Chirang Anchalik Com-



mittee, ABSU (1973-76). He founded the Bodosa Institute of Advanced Education & Information Technology, Kokrajhar, and actively participated in the Roman Script Movement and Bodoland separate state movement. In recognition of his contributions, he was awarded the Dr Ambedkar Fellowship Award in 2005.

The space laboratory marks the first of ten such facilities to be established across the BTR, following an MoU (Memorandum of Understanding) signed on February 23, 2024, between the government of BTR and M/S Vyomika Space Academy Private Limited, New Delhi.

The other selected schools for this pioneering initiative are Debargaon HS School, Kokrajhar; Grahampur HS School, Gossaigaon; and Tipkai Senior Secondary School, Parbatjhora in Kokrajhar district; Bijni Bandhab HS School, Bijni in Chirang district; Barama Girls High School, Mushalpur; and Salbari Girls High School, Salbari in Baksa district; Tamulpur HS School, Salbari in Tamulpur district; Udalguri HS School, Udalguri; and Khoirabari HS School, Bhergaon in Udalguri

The initiative aims to ignite interest in space and its applications among BTR students through an innovative gamification approach. These space labs, specially designed for government school students, have been developed under the ISRO Space Tutor Programme by Vyomika Space Academy, a global learning platform offering world-class educational tools and resources on space and technology. Each space lab is equipped with state-of-the-art facilities, including telescopes, ISRO satellite models, ISRO rocket models, aircraft and drone models, robots, 3D printers, and other cutting-edge technology tools. This initiative represents a significant step towards enhancing STEM education in the BTR, providing students with hands-on experience and exposure to space technology and its applications. The remaining nine schools will see similar setups in the near future, bringing this innovative educational opportunity to students across the region.

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CEM Pramod Boro, while at the event, said that the Bodoland region has reached for the stars and successfully established its first space lab in Chirang. He added that the BTR government is committed to working for the all-round development and welfare of the common masses across the region. He noted that the BTR government has launched and initiated several initiatives and missions while fostering a healthy educational environment.

"Chino Basumatary Memorial Space Laboratory at Sidli Kashikotra HS School, Chirang, was ceremonially inaugurated in the presence of students, teachers, and officials. Notable experts from the area Dr Rustam Brahma from Bodoland University, Dr Gaurisankar Narzary from Kokrajhar Government College, Dilip Narzary, a cultural activist and accredited folk dance trainer of Bodo Cultural Society and Chandra Kanta Basumatary, former president, Manas Maozigendri Ecotourism Society (MMES) and former brand ambassador, Forest & Environment Department, Assam attended the workshop.

The programme is an initiative of the Participatory Natural Resource Management (PNRM) Programme under the Tiger Research and Conservation Division (TRCD) of Aaranyak, and Dr M Firoz Ahmed, scientist F & head of the division, also participated in the workshop. The programme was also enriched by various other senior conservation biologists of Aaranyak. The entire programme was moderated by Dr Jayanta Kumar Sarma, senior project coordinator, Natural Resource Management (NRM), TRCD,

Aaranyak and Dr Simanta Kalita, CE expert.
Day one of the workshop commenced with
a welcome address by Dr Ahmed, who highlighted that Aaranyak has been working
closely with the communities around Manas
National Park to address the conservation
challenges in the region and stressed the key
role played by dedicated conservation education campaigns during 2016-2022 in resurrecting the old glory of the World Heritage

Site through the prolonged effort of all the stakeholders. He highlighted the important contribution of the Bodo folklore 'Sandw Baudiyani Dukhu' that was enacted as a forum theatre during the conservation education campaigns with stakeholders and was supported by IUCN-KfW.

The keynote address was delivered by Chandra Kanta Basumatary. Basumatary shared that Manas had experienced a decline in its glorious nature following the political upheaval during the 1990s. However, as situations improved communities came forward and worked incessantly, with the support of different non-government organisations and the Forest and Environment Department to ensure the revival of Manas's natural wealth, and MMES was at the forefront of this revival. He also emphasised that to strengthen these initiatives further, one has to integrate traditional and modern scientific knowledge to achieve better results.

The business sessions of the workshop commenced with a short presentation by Dr Sarma, where the participants were provided with an overview of the present perceptions of the community around Manas regarding the natural resources, their connection with the culture and their conservation aspects.

During the presentation, Dr Sarma communicated the perspectives and expectations of the workshop and the modalities that would be followed during the sessions.

Following the presentation, the participants were divided into five groups that were assigned to map the subjects, develop a framework and the strategic approach, explore the cultural value and develop the ethical framework for aspects such as: community and village institution engagement, women engagement, gender issues and building social capital, NRM, engagement of farmers and youth in NRM, teacher-student engagement and interfacing with educational institutions, and TKS, heritage, culture, associated with nature, human wellbeing and altruism

The workshop helped to develop a consensus and synthesis of a conservation education package for Manas landscape that focuses on the local knowledge system as its core, where cultural and spiritual practices and traditional ecological knowledge have been practiced traditionally across generations by the communities that find close connection with nature. It was proposed that this knowledge system and practices will be prioritised as part of the communications through intergenerational dialogue.

Transgender in police force?

🔭 n a remarkable achievement, Manvi Madhu Kashyam has become India's first transgender police sub-inspector. Hailing from a small village, Manvi's appointment symbolizes a significant stride towards inclusivity in the country. She is among three transgender individuals selected for this role, with the other two choosing to remain anonymous. Manvi's story has captivated national attention, shedding light on the struggles and triumphs of transgender individuals in India. Historically, the transgender community has faced severe stigmatization, often relegated to begging or performing at events for a living. Manvi's success represents a monumental leap from these traditional roles to a position of authority and respect within law enforcement. As a police sub-inspector, Manvi's responsibilities include maintaining law and order, gathering intelligence, investigating crimes, and participating in raids and encounters. These tasks demand resilience, bravery, and dedication—qualities that Manvi has displayed in abundance. Despite the hurdles, including rejections from numerous coaching institutes during her preparation, Manvi persevered. She credits Mr. Rahman from a supportive coaching center and her family for their unwavering support. This perseverance paid off when she emerged successful among 6,788 candidates, with only three transgender individuals qualifying. India's transgender population, officially recorded for the first time in the 2011 census, stands at 4.87 lakh. This milestone paved the way for recognizing and addressing the community's needs and challenges.

The court's 2014 judgment emphasized that gender identity is an intrinsic part of an individual's dignity, protected under Article 21 of the Indian Constitution. This interpretation of dignity includes the right to self-expression, free from discrimination. Additionally, the right to equality (Article 14) and freedom of expression (Article 19(1)(a)) were recognized as gender-neutral, thereby extending to transgender persons. In 2019, the Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Act was enacted, prohibiting employment discrimination against transgender individuals in both public and private sectors. This law underscores the necessity of creating an inclusive culture and establishing mechanisms to address rights violations. Manvi's appointment is more than just a personal victory; it is a beacon of hope and possibility for the transgender community in India. It illustrates that with determination and the right support, transgender individuals can achieve positions of power

Money bill challenge in Supreme Court worsens vulnerability of ruling party

f Aadhaar is a money matter, anything can be interpreted to mean anything else. This will be one of the key dilemmas that the seven-member constitutional bench will consider when it begins deliberations on the petitions against the use of money bill overcome legislative hurdles in pushing controversial legislations. Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud this week decided that it is time the learned judges got down to work after the bench remained virtually dormant since October last year when the bench was announced.

The issue centres on the interpretation and application of Article 110 of the Indian Constitution, which defines what constitutes a money bill. Money bills, unlike ordinary bills, can be introduced and passed without the approval of the Rajya Sabha, effectively bypassing the scrutiny and potential obstruction by the oppositiondominated upper house. The government had provided a farfetched definition of Aadhaar as an instrument to provide efficient subsidy to vulnerable sections to bring the Aadhaar law in the ambit of a money bill. But this had widely raised eyebrows.

Critics, including opposition parties and legal experts, argue that the government has been misusing the money bill provision to evade parliamentary oversight and undermine the Rajya Sabha's role as a check on hasty legislation. They contend that several bills categorized as money bills do not meet the constitutional criteria and have been wrongly categorized to circumvent opposition in the Rajya Sabha. This practice, they argue, erodes the principles of democratic deliberation and legislative scrutiny that are essential for robust governance.

The Modi government, faced with legislative impasses in the Rajya Sabha, has increasingly turned to this route to push through key reforms and landmark legislations. As far as the BJP and the Modi government are concerned, the situation portends a murky past and a murkier future. The strength of BJP in the Rajya Sabha has fallen to 86, affecting NDA's legislative leverage. With other partners included, the strength increases to only 101. This has significant implications for the passage of contentious legislation through the

upper house. On the other hand, the government faces heightened opposition following successive state elections where opposition parties have gained ground with increased tally.

With a reduced strength and growing opposition unity on critical issues, the government faces an uphill task in securing legislaroute by the Modi government to tive mandates without resorting to contentious methods. The efficacy and legitimacy of governance through executive orders and ordinances have also been questioned in this context, reinforcing concerns about demogovernance cratic parliamentary accountability.

Petitions filed by various stakeholders question the validity of bills passed under the money bill label, alleging that such classification was arbitrary and designed to avoid debate and amendment in the Rajya Sabha. These petitions highlight specific legislative instances where controversial bills, such as those related to taxation and finance, were pushed through as money bills despite their broader implications beyond

fiscal matters. The legal challenge before the Supreme Court is not just about the technical interpretation of constitutional provisions but also about the broader implications for India's democratic framework. It raises fundamental questions about the balance of powers between the executive and legislative branches and the role of judicial oversight in upholding

constitutional principles. In response to these challenges, the government has defended its use of the money bill route as a necessary tool to overcome legislative gridlock and ensure the implementation of crucial reforms. It contends that the classification of bills as money bills was done in accordance with legal advice and parliamentary practice, emphasizing the need for expeditious decision-making in matters of economic and fiscal

The Supreme Court's eventual ruling on these petitions is eagerly awaited as it holds the potential to set a precedent for future legislative practices and the interpretation of constitutional provisions. Beyond the immediate legal implications, the case has broader ramifications for India's democratic governance, judicial independence, and the balance of power between different branches of government. The evolution of GST: Challenges, achievements, and future directions

Tax (GST) was rolled out seven years ago, on July 1, 2017, there was widespread apprehension about its implementation. Many deemed the decision to proceed with its launch risky, especially coming on the heels of the tumultuous demonetisation period just a year earlier. Economists and tax experts made dire predictions, arguing that the country was ill-prepared for such a sweeping tax reform. Nonetheless, then Finance Minister Arun Jaitley made the decisive call to introduce GST without further delay. In hindsight, this decision proved astute, as the economy would have faced prolonged uncertainties had implementation been delayed for broader readiness among stakeholders.

It's important to note that the idea of a singlepoint tax had been under discussion for nearly 18 years before its implementation. Originating during the Vajpayee government in 1999, the concept stemmed from recommendations by the Vijay Kelkar task force. This task force advocated for a unified tax structure to replace numerous indirect taxes levied by both the Central and state governments. Studies supported this approach, highlighting that countries adopting

such systems experienced increased efficiency and economic growth through simplified compliance and enhanced economic inte-

gration. In 2000, an empowered committee of state Finance Ministers, led by then West Bengal Finance Minister Asim Dasgupta, laid the groundwork for what would evolve into today's GST Council. This council, representing all states, ensures that revenue matters are jointly deliberated by the Centre and states in a collaborative manner. The committee initially drafted the GST Bill and navigated intricate negotiations to garner state support. De-

hesitation lingered regarding the launch of GST, culminating nearly two decades of preparation and deliberation.

One significant challenge arose from the complexity introduced into the initial idea of a singlepoint tax. This complexity stemmed largely from states' concerns about potential revenue losses from existing taxes. As a result, the GST system that emerged is multi-layand operational today. It includes an integrated GST for interstate goods movement, along-

side Central, state, and union territory GST comsystem incorporates four tax slabs, ranging from five to 28 percent, reflecting varying rates for different goods and services.

In addition to these complexities, states insisted on DEGREE OF THOUGHT excluding their biggest

> sources-petroleum and alcohol-from the GST framework. There was considerable anxiety at the time of its launch about whether states could sustain their finances with the revenue generated from this new indirect tax sys-

However, these concerns have proven unfounded. In reality, GST revenue collection has far exceeded initial expectations. Recent data indicates that GST collections reached ₹ 1.74 lakh crore in June, compared to an average monthly inflow of

around ₹ 90,000 crore during its first year. Furthermore, a Reserve Bank of India study reveals that states' own revenue shares have increased over the past two years compared to the pre-GST period.

As states demonstrate increased revenue resilience, there's potential to reduce reliance on the compensation mechanism originally integrated into the GST framework. Initially slated for five years, its extension to 2026 was necessitated by the Covid-19 impact. Continued robust revenue growth may pave the way to eventually phase out this provision altogether.

Despite numerous implementation challenges, particularly in streamlining bureaucracy and simplifying procedures, the GST Council, comprising representation from all states, convenes regularly address issues promptly. Initially, a major hurdle involved integrating small and micro busiwork through computerization, which initially caused significant disruption to the sector. At first, GST was criticized as detrimental to small industries. However, contrary to initial fears, it has successfully on boarded thousands of small enterprises into the digital economy, marking a trans-

nesses into the GST net-

concern that GST would increase the tax burden on the average consumer. However, these fears have been dispelled by recent studies revealing that 60 percent of consumer goods are taxed at the lowest slab of five percent or are exempt. In contrast. only three percent of items face the highest tax rate of 28 percent. However, it is evident that there is a pressing need to rationalize the GST rate structure. While achieving the original goal of a single-point levy may not be immediately feasible, reducing the number of tax slabs is essential for long-term

simplicity. Another crucial reform is to broaden the GST base to include high-value items. This includes petroleum products, with suggestions now extending to electricity and land as well. Initially, products like aviation turbine fuel and natural gas could be incorporated into GST, miglpltd@gmail.com)

However, it's increasingly urgent to also include petrol and diesel in the GST ambit. Alcohol remains a sensitive issue for states due to its significant revenue contribution, yet its eventual integration into GST is inevitable and should be addressed promptly.

During its latest session, the GST Council implemented measures to support micro and small enterprises, including granting amnesty for legacy disputes and increasing the appeal ceiling for disputes. There is also growing recognition of the necessity for a GST appellate tribunal to expedite the resolution of appeals related to disputes.

There is ample room for enhancing GST implementation, which includes streamlining procedures and rationalizing tax rates. However, achieving the initial goal of a singlepoint levy hinges on bringing key sectors such as petroleum into the GST framework. While the Centre must lead this effort, it is equally vital for states to adopt a pragmatic, forward-looking approach. Cash-based beneficiary schemes: The hidden costs of eroding work culture and long-term effectiveness

ash-based beneficiary schemes have become a popular tool for governments aiming to deliver financial assistance to those in need. These schemes, designed to provide direct monetary support to beneficiaries, are often touted for their simplicity and efficiency. However, beneath the surface of these seemingly straightforward programs lie a range of issues that has far-reaching consequences for work culture and overall

One of the primary concerns with cashbased schemes is their tendency to erode the intrinsic motivation of public sector employees. When cash transfers become the primary means of addressing social issues, the role of government employees shifts from one of active engagement and problem-solving to mere administrators of funds. This shift can diminish job satisfaction and commitment among workers who joined the public sector with a desire to make a meaningful impact. The reduction of their roles to processing payments rather than addressing complex issues undermines their professional growth and satisfaction, fostering a culture of disinterest and disengagement.

Moreover, cash-based schemes often lead to a detachment from the real needs of the community. Government employees, when merely tasked with disbursing cash, are less likely to engage with beneficiaries and understand their actual circumstances. This detachment weakens the connection between the administration and the community, which is crucial for crafting effective policies and programs. As a result, there is a risk that the schemes become mere financial transactions rather than components of a broader strategy to improve social welfare.

Another significant issue is the potential for corruption and mismanagement. The sheer volume of cash transactions can create opportunities for unethical behavior, including the diversion of funds or falsification of records. The lack of accountability mechanisms in many cashbased schemes can exacerbate these problems, leading to a culture of suspicion and mistrust among both beneficiaries and employees. When employees see or hear about corruption within the system, it can demoralize them and lead to a more cynical and disengaged workforce.

The reliance on cash-based schemes also fosters a culture of dependency among beneficiaries. While these pro-

grams are designed to provide immediate relief, they do not necessarily contribute to long-term solutions for poverty or social issues. By focusing on direct financial aid rather than creating opportunities for employment, education, or skill development, these schemes can perpetuate a cycle of dependency rather than addressing the root causes of poverty. This dependency mindset can also affect work culture by reinforcing the perception that government assistance is a permanent solution rather than a temporary measure.

Additionally, cash-based schemes can undermine the importance of comprehensive, multi-faceted approaches to social problems. Complex issues like poverty, health, and education require a range of interventions that address various aspects of the problem. By prioritizing cash transfers, these schemes can overshadow other important initiatives that might offer more sustainable solutions. This narrow focus can lead to a reduction in the scope and ambition of public sector work, as employees may become accustomed to addressing only immediate, surface-level issues rather than engaging with the deeper, systemic challenges.

The administrative burden associated with cash-based schemes also has implications for work culture. Although these schemes are often designed to streamline processes, they can introduce a range of new administrative tasks that were not present in previous, more holistic programs. This can lead to an increase in bureaucratic procedures, paperwork, and

reporting requirements. Employees may find themselves overwhelmed by the volume of administrative work, which detracts from their ability to engage in meaningful, impactful activities. The added burden can contribute to job dissatisfaction and burnout, further weakening work culture within the public

Furthermore, cash-based schemes can create disparities among different regions or communities. The uniform distribution of cash without considering local needs and conditions can lead to inequities. Some areas may face more significant challenges that require tailored interventions, while others might benefit less from a one-size-fits-all approach. This inequity can create a sense of unfairness among both employees and beneficiaries, undermining morale and cooperation.

In the long term, cash-based beneficiary schemes risk diminishing the role of the public sector in addressing social issues. When financial assistance is prioritized over other forms of support, the broader mandate of government agencies-to provide comprehensive services, advocate for policy changes, and engage with communities-can be sidelined. This shift can lead to a reduction in the effectiveness and scope of public sector work, as well as a decline in the perceived value of government employment as a means of creating positive social change.

In conclusion, while cash-based beneficiary schemes offer a straightforward method for providing financial support, they come with a range of ill effects that can undermine work culture and the effectiveness of government programs. These schemes can lead to a disengaged workforce, foster corruption and dependency, and shift the focus away from more comprehensive solutions to social problems. By emphasizing the need for more holistic and integrated approaches, it is possible to address these issues and build a more effective and motivated public sector that truly serves the needs of the community. Bangladesh security forces fire bullets and sound grenades as protests over govt jobs escalate

A statement from the country's Telecommunication Regulatory Commission said they were unable to ensure service after their data centre was attacked Thursday by demonstrators, who set fire to some equipment. The Associated Press has not been able to independently verify this.

Student protesters said

they will extend their calls to impose a shutdown on Friday as well, and urged mosques across the country to hold funeral prayers for those who have been killed. Major universities have said they will close their doors until tensions ease. The protesters are demanding an end to a quota system that reserves up to 30 per cent of government jobs for relatives of veterans who fought in Bangladesh's war of independence in 1971 against

Drone strike by Yemen's Houthi rebels kills 1 person and wounds at least 10 in Tel Aviv

made drone sent by Yemen's Houthi rebels struck Tel Aviv on Friday, leaving one person dead and at least 10 wounded in the group's first lethal strike into Israel.

The aerial strike — the first lethal Houthi attack in Israel rumbled through the center of the city near the U.S. Embassy, causing shrapnel to rain down and spreading shards of glass over a large ra-

"We are holding an investigation today and in the coming days to understand exactly from where the threat was fired and what are the needed responses to defend the country and what are the attacking responses against who is threatening the state of Israel," said Rear Admiral Daniel Hagari, a

spokesperson for Israel's military. The Houthis have launched drones and missiles toward Israel throughout the country's war with Hamas. But until Friday, all were intercepted by either Israel or Western allies with forces stationed in the region. Yahya Sare'e, the Houthis' spokesperson, claimed responsibility for the attack in a statement published on the social media platform X. He said it was in retaliation for the Israel-Hamas war and had hit one of many of the group's

Israel's military said it believed

the drone — an Iranian Samad-3 upgraded to travel long distances had traveled from Yemen, but rebuffed the Houthis' claim that their arsenal was capable of bypassing Israel's aerial defenses.

An Israeli military official said the explosive-laden drone was identified on Thursday but penetrated Israel because of "human error" in operating the system. The assessment of aerial threats has not changed because, the military said, Israel's adversaries have attempted such attacks for months.

The Houthi strike, the first to threaten Tel Aviv, hit at around 3:10 a.m. Local police said it reverberated to nearby cities and physically injured at least 10 people.

Israel's military said they had not determined whether the drone exploded in the air or directly struck buildings, but it blew out windows and damaged cars throughout the coastal neighborhood. People thronged to the area as police helicopters hovered overhead. For many, it reaffirmed feelings of disillusionment with how the military has handled the war over the past nine months.

Yossi Nevi, a retired evacuee from Kiryat Shmona living in a nearby hotel, said the blast shook him awake to watch the aftermath from his balcony and decreased his faith in the army's management of

error, Nevi said, made him lose "all trust in the army, not that I had much after the past nine months."

Eldad Namdar, who owns a camera store next to the intersection where the drone is believed to have exploded, said he hopes the war ends soon, but he also wants it to be concluded in a way that secures his future. "I don't want this to happen again in six months, I want them to finish this situation until the end," he said.

The Houthi strike hit hours after Israel's military confirmed one of its airstrikes had killed a Hezbollah commander and other militants in southern Lebanon. Israel has so far not made attacks on the Houthis, allowing its allies instead to take the lead as it focuses its efforts on the war in Gaza and ongoing fighting with Lebanon's Hezbollah militant group.

The Houthis have routinely claimed responsibility for hitting targets in the Red Sea and Gulf of Aden. Analysts and Western intelligence services have long accused Iran of arming the group, a claim that Tehran denies. In recent years, U.S. naval forces have intercepted a number of ships packed with rifles, rocket-propelled grenades and missile parts on route from Iran to Houthi-controlled areas of Yemen.

Vietnam Communist Party chief Nguyen Phu Trong, dies at age 80

HANOI, July 19: Nguyen Phu Trong, general secretary of Vietnam's ruling Communist Party and the country's most powerful politician, has died following months of ill health, official media said Friday. He was 80.

"General Secretary of the Central Committee of the Party Nguyen Phu Trong passed away at 13:38 on July 19, 2024, at the 108 Central Military Hospital due to old age and serious illness," the Nhan Dan newspaper said. Official media said a state funeral would be held. Trong had dominated Vietnamese politics since 2011, when he was elected party chief. During his tenure, he worked to consolidate the Communist Party's power in Vietnam's single-party political system. In the decade before he took the top role in Vietnamese politics, the balance of power had shifted more toward the governmental wing led by then-Prime Minister Nguyen

Born in 1944 in Hanoi, Trong was a Marxist-Leninist ideologue who earned a degree in philosophy before becoming a member of the Communist Party at the age of 22. He viewed corruption as the single gravest threat in maintaining the party's legitimacy. "A country without discipline would be chaotic and unstable,' Trong said in 2016 after being reelected to the party's helm. Officially, Vietnam has no top leader, but the Communist Party chief is traditionally seen as the most powerful. (AP)

Russia seeks 18-year sentence for US reporter on trial for spying in highly politicised legal system

YEKATERINBURG, July 19: Russian prosecutors sought a prison sentence of 18 years on Friday for Wall Street Journal reporter Evan Gershkovich, who is on trial on espionage charges that his

employer and the US have

denounced as fabricated. Gershkovich, 32, was arrested March 29, 2023, while on a reporting trip to the Ural Mountains city of Yekaterinburg. Authorities claimed, without offering any evidence, that he was gathering secret information for the US. He pleaded not guilty, according to the court, and The Wall Street Journal and the US government have called the trial a sham.

Gershkovich appeared in court for a second straight day Friday as the closed-door proceedings in Russia's highly politicized legal system picked up speed. A verdict is expected later in the day, according to court offi-

in which reporters were allowed to see Gershkovich briefly before sessions began, there was no access to the courtroom this week and he was not seen, with no explanation given. Espionage and treason cases are typi-

Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov said Wednesday at the United Nations that Moscow and Washington's "special services" are discussing an exchange involving Gershkovich. Russia has previously signalled the possibility of a swap, but it says a verdict would have to come first. Even after a verdict, any such deal could take

months or years. State Department deputy spokesman Vedant Patel on Thursday declined to discuss negotiations about a possible exchange, but said: "We have been clear from the get-go that Evan did nothing wrong and should not have been detained

To date, Russia has provided no evidence of a crime and has failed to justify Evan's continued detention. Russian President

Vladimir Putin hinted earlier this year that he would be open to swapping Gershkovich Vadim Krasikov, a Russian serving a life sentence for the 2019 killing in Berlin of a Georgian citizen of Chechen descent. (AP)

'Close' bond with India must continue to flourish: Bhutan PM tells FS Misri

THIMPHU, July 19: Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri on Friday met Bhutan Prime Minister Tshering Tobgay, who asserted that the "close" bilateral bond "rooted in mutual trust and benefit" must continue to flourish.

Misri reached here on Friday on a two-day official visit to co-chair the India-Bhutan Development Cooperation Talks with his counterpart Pema Choden. This is his first official visit abroad in less than a week after assuming charge.

The foreign secretary met Prime Minister Tobgay who congratulated him on his appointment and said that their discussions "covered the full spectrum of our bilateral relations.

"Honoured that H.E. @VikramMisri has chosen to visit Bhutan as his first 'overseas visit barely 4 days after his appointment as the Foreign Secretary of India I congratulated him on his anpointment, and our discussions covered the full spectrum of our bilateral relations," Tobgay said in a post on X.

"We reaffirmed the close bond between Bhutan and India, agreeing that our partnership, rooted in mutual trust and benefit, must continue to flourish," he said. (PTI)

South Korea restarts propaganda broadcasts across border in reaction to North's balloon launches

SEOUL, July 19: South Korea said on Friday it has restarted blasting propaganda broadcasts into North Korea to retaliate against the North's latest round of trash-carrying balloon launches, a resumption of Cold War-style tactics that are raising animosities between the rivals.

South Korea's Joint Chiefs of Staff said in a statement that it used frontline loudspeakers to blare anti-Pyongyang broadcasts over the border between Thursday evening and on Fri-

The broadcasts were the first of their kind in about 40 days. The contents of the broadcasts were not immediately known, but its previous ones on June 9 reportedly included K-pop songs, weather forecasts and news on Samsung, the biggest South Korean company, as well as outside criticism of the North's missile program and its crackdown on foreign video.

The South Korean broadcasts could trigger an angry response from North Korea which is extremely sensitive to any outside attempt to undermine its political system. In 2015, when South Korea restarted loudspeaker broadcasts for the first time in 11 years. North Korea fired artillery rounds across the border, prompting the South to return fire, according to South Korean officials. No casualties were

South Korea's military earlier said North Korea floated the balloons on Thursday afternoon in its seventh such balloon campaign in

Starting in late May, North Korea has floated more than 2,000 balloons carrying wastepaper, scraps of cloth, cigarette butts and even manure toward South Korea, saying they were in response to South Korean activists sending political leaflets to the North via their own balloons. No hazardous materials were found. North Korea last flew such balloons in late June. In response, South Korea suspended a 2018 tension-reduction deal with North Korea, resuming propaganda broadcasts briefly and front-line live-fire military drills at border areas.

Earlier this week, the powerful sister of North Korean leader Kim Jong Un hinted at flying rubbish-carrying balloons again or launching new countermeasures, saying South Korean balloons have been found again at border and other areas in North Korea. In her statement Tuesday, Kim Yo Jong warned that South Korean "scum" must be ready to pay "a gruesome and dear price." That raised concerns that North Korea could stage physical provocations, rather than bal-

Eyeing White House, Trump calls for unity in his first major speech after Surviving assassination attempt MILWAUKEE, July 19: In his first

major public address since surviving an assassination attempt, Donald Trump gave a clarion call for unity as he accepted his Republican party's presidential nomination with a pledged to deliver a government that will begin four greatest years in American history if he is elected in November. The 78-year-old former US president

took to the stage at the Republican National Convention Thursday night to accept his party's nomination for a third consecutive presidential bid. Trump also gave details about the attempt on his life last week and thanked Americans for their "outpouring of love and support." "So tonight, with faith and devotion, I

proudly accept your nomination for president of the United States," Trump said to applause. In his speech, Trump urged Americans to help him win the race for the White House on November 5.

"Tonight, I ask for your partnership, for your support, and I am humbly asking for your vote. Every day, I will strive to honour the trust you have placed in me, and I will never let you down," Trump said.

"To all of the forgotten men and women who have been neglected, abandoned, and left behind, you will be forgotten no longer. We will press forward, and together, we will win, win, win," he said. In his first speech after the assassination bid on him on Saturday in Pennsylvania, Trump said he stands before Americans with a message of confidence, strength, and hope.

"Four months from now, we will have an incredible victory, and we will begin the four greatest years in the history of our country," Trump said.

"In an age when our politics too often divide us, now is the time to remember that we are all fellow citizens. We are one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all," he said.

The former president basked in the adoring cheers of thousands as he called for unity behind his effort to return to the

White House after the attack "The discord and division in our soci-



ety must be healed. As Americans, we are bound together by a single fate and a shared destiny. We rise together. Or we fall apart. I am running to be president for all of America, not half of America because there is no victory in winning for half of America," he said.

Standing alongside firefighter's gear that belonged to slain Trump rallygoer Corey Comperatore, Trump claimed that divine intervention saved him from also being killed in the attack last weekend.

"As you already know, the assassin's bullet came within a quarter of an inch of taking my life. So many people have asked me what happened, and therefore, I'll tell you what happened, and you'll never hear it from me a second time, be-

cause it's too painful to tell," he said. "I felt something hit me really, really hard. It was a bullet, [and] my head was covered with blood. But I felt very safe because I had God on my side," he said.

He said he was standing before Americans only by the grace of the almighty God. "Despite such a heinous attack, we unite this evening more determined than ever. Our resolve is unbroken, and our purpose is unchanged--to deliver a government that serves the American People. Everything I have to give, with all of the energy and fight in my heart and soul,

I pledge to our nation tonight," he said. This election should be about the issues facing the country and how to make America successful, safe, free, and great

again, Trump said. "Nothing will sway us. Nothing will slow us. And no one will stop us," he said. He said no danger or obstacle would divert him from his path to save the country. (PTI)

Hindus largest minority community in Pakistan with 3.8 million population

ISLAMABAD, July 19: The population of Hindus in Pakistan increased from 3.5 million in 2017 to 3.8 million in 2023 to make it the largest minority community in the Islamic nation, according to the official data of last year's census.

The Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) released results of the 7th Population and Housing Census 2023 on Thursday, the Dawn newspaper reported. The country's total population in 2023 stood at 240,458,089.

It showed that the share of Muslims in the total population decreased slightly from 96.47 per cent in 2017 to 96.35 per cent in 2023, while the population of all major religious minorities increased in the past six years. However, their share in the percentage of the total population gives a mixed picture.

The population of Hindus increased from 3.5 million in 2017 to 3.8 million in 2023, but their share in the total population went down from 1.73 to 1.61 per cent, which showed other minority communities in-



creased at a faster rate.

The population of Christians, also increased from 2.6 million to 3.3 million, with their share in the total population also going up from 1.27 to 1.37 per cent.

Ahmadis witnessed a decline in their real population as well as their share in the total population. The size of their community was reduced by 29,053, from 191,737 (0.09 per cent) in 2017 to 162,684 (0.07 per cent). The population of the Sikh community

stood at 15,998 and Parsi at 2,348. The data showed that the country's population increased from 207.68 million in

2017 to 241.49 million in 2023 at a growth rate of 2.55 per cent. At this rate, the data showed that Pakistan's population is expected to double by 2050.

According to the population breakdown, the total number of males stood at 124.32 million, compared to 117.15 million females, with a gender ratio of 1.06. The population of transgender has been reported at

Data showed that 67 per cent of the total population in 2023 was below the age of 30 and 80 per cent below 40. Those of 67 years or above constituted only 3.55 per cent of the total population. In 2017, 66.12 per cent of the total population was married, compared to 64.79 in 2023.

The percentage of the divorced population has reduced from 0.42 per cent in 2017

to 0.35 per cent in 2023. The data also revealed a stark difference in the growth of rural and urban populations, with the former going up at the rate of 1.88 per cent and the latter 3.67 per cent.

SHILLONG, July 19: The Khasi Students' Union (KSU) announced its decision to continue intensifying checking of documents of migrant workers on Friday till the government is ready to put effective anti-influx mechanisms in place.

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The announcement was made by KSU chief, Lambokstarwell Marngar after attending a meeting called by the chief minister Conrad K Sangma at the government secretariat.

"We will intensify further in checking till we see the government is ready to put in place effective anti-influx mechanisms by ensuring that the inner line permit (ILP) and Meghalava Residents Safety and Security (MRSSA), 2016 is implemented at the earliest," Marngar told reporters.

The KSU chief said that the chief minister had told the delegation that he would soon call a meeting with all NGOs to discuss the issue related to the MRSSA.

"We are even yet to see the observations made by the Centre while returning the MRSSA but despite this we insist that the MRSSA, 2016 should be implemented where the district task force (DTF) has been constituted and are being headed by the DCs and SPs besides traditional heads but it seems that the DTFs are functional only in 7 localities of Shillong city so therefore, we insist that the government should address the issue of people coming to the state without proper documentation," he said.



Marngar also maintained, "If discussions will only end in the government examining these long pending demands then we will have no choice but to examine them outside the secretariat on the things that we need to get done. If the government continues to take so much to examine important laws, we too don't have time to wait but to take action on the ground."

"The ongoing exercise is a wake up call to the state government that its duty is to aggressively take up with the Centre for immediate implementation of the ILP in Meghalaya," he added.

KSU general secretary Donald V Thabah said, "The government had assured us to look into these matters but as we have stated, we are tired with the word of "examination" as it might take one-two months or it might take 5-10 years. Therefore, the KSU will continue to be vigilant in checking the entry of people into the state.'

BJP MLA raises concern over China's under-construction mega dam near Arunachal



ITANAGAR, July 19: Expressing concern over the under-construction mega dam by China near Arunachal Pradesh which poses a threat of a flood-like situation in the state, senior BJP MLA Ninong Ering on Friday urged the government to take up the issue with the Centre.

China is building a 60,000 megawatt dam on the Yarlung Tsangpo River in Medog, near the international border.

Tsangpo is known as Siang in Arunachal Pradesh and Brahmaputra in Assam. The main channel of this river is the Jamuna, which flows through Bangladesh before joining the Bay of

Participating in the motion of thanks to the governor's address in the assembly, Ering, a former Union minister said, "We cannot trust our 'neighbour'. You never know what they can do. They can either divert the entire river flow drying up our Siang or release water at once causing unprecedented floods havoc downstream."

He added that not just India, but the construction of the dam might also affect Bangladesh.

"People's safety and country's security cannot be compromised. Our motto should be 'Nation First' and we have to think for India's security," the former minister of state for minority affairs

While supporting construction of dams with storage capacity to check floods in the region, the MLA from Pasighat West assembly constituency informed that there is no water treaty between India and China so far.

Referring to the opposition by anti-dam protagonists, the lawmaker suggested that they should be consulted before constructing dams so that the interest of the people could be looked at.

N Biren Singh said that on investigation, so far it has been revealed that around 3500 number of ILPs have been prepared through the said 5 outlets in Imphal. A Special Investigating Team (SIT) led by an Additional SP rank officer shall be instituted for further investigation

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During the raid, certain items

were seized including computers and laptops, the Chief Minister said. The State Government views the issues of ILP very seriously, he said, adding that Prime Minister Narendra Modi had granted the implementation of the ILP in the State to save the indigenous population. He further called on all the officers and officials involved in its implementation to act with sincerity, dedication and nationalism.

The chief minister also clarified that only the concerned deputy commissioners and the Labour Commissioner are the ILP card issuing authorities and that they cannot authorize their

subordinate officials to issue these cards. Stressing that anyone with fake ILP cards should surrender before the police or concerned authorities at the earliest, the chief minister said that the government has already implemented the ILP Facial Recognition System to identify ILP defaulters.

He further warned of stringent actions as per the law of the land against anyone found misusing the ILP. He said steps have also been taken up to strengthen all ILP monitoring cells. Further stating that the base year for ILP has been adopted as 1961, he said that steps will be taken up to verify all ILP holders through the issuing authorities and Labour department. (NNN)

Roy Barman himself was attacked near Tepania RD Block in Gomati district on Thursday when he was escorting Congress candidates to file nomination papers. At least three party leaders were injured in the attack.

3 bills introduced in Arunachal assembly on first day of budget session



ITANAGAR, July 19: Three bills were introduced on the first day of the Arunachal Pradesh assembly's budget session on Friday, including one that seeks to curb irregularities and use of unfair means in recruitment examinations.

Chief minister Pema Khandu introduced the Arunachal Pradesh Public Examination (Measures to Prevent Unfair Means in Recruitment) Bill, while the Arunachal Pradesh Amending Bill and the Balipara/Tirap/Sadiya Frontier Tract Jhum Land Regulation (Amendment) Bill were tabled by two other state ministers.

The bill on recruitment tests is aimed at providing ef-

fective measures to prevent and curb offences of question paper leaks and use of unfair means in examinations for the purpose of recruitment to any post under the state government, officials said.

A provision dealing with designation of a special court for speedy trial of such offences has also been provided in the bill, they said.

According to the bill, any person resorting to such unfair means would be punished with imprisonment for a term not less than three years, which may be extended to five years, and with a fine up to ₹ 1 crore.

Law, Legislative and Justice Minister Kento Jini introduced the Arunachal Pradesh Amending Bill, which will substitute the words Indian Penal Code 1860, Code of Criminal Procedure 1973 and the Indian Evidence Act 1872, by the words Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita 2023, Bharatiya Nagarik Suiraksha Sanhita 2023 and Bharatiya Sakshya Adiniyam 2023, respectively, in several state acts.

The Balipara/Tirap/Sadiya Frontier Tract Jhum Land Regulation Bill in its amended form was tabled by Land Management Minister Balo Raja. The bill deals with land compensation procedures. (PTI)

Rail line that will connect Mizoram likely to be complete by July 2025: Officials 'Railway project will boost Mizoram's economy'

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WB Governor molestation row

NEW DELHI, July 19: The Supreme Court on Friday agreed to examine the contours of Article 361 of the Constitution which grants 'blanket immunity' to governors from any kind of criminal prosecution.

The top court's order came on a plea of contractual woman employee of West Bengal 'Raj Bhavan' who has alleged molestation by Governor C V Ananda Bose and her wrongful confinement by the officials there.

A bench comprising Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud and justices JB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra also issued a notice to the West Bengal government on the plea of the woman and granted her liberty to make also the central govern-

It also sought the assistance of Attorney General R Venkataramani in dealing with the constitutional issue

At the outset, senior Shyam advocate Divan, appearing for the woman whose name has redacted been from the judicial records, said, "It be that cannot there is no investigation. Evidence has to be gathered right now. It cannot be deferred indefi-

nitely till the governor demits of-The plea said the immunity granted to the governors under clause 2 of Article 361 cannot bar

time is the essence in such probes. "The petition raises the issue pertaining to the ambit of the protection which is afforded to the governor under clause (2) of Article 361 of the Constitution," the bench said in its order of issuing notice to the state government and

others. The Article deals with the protection of President and the governors and its clause 2 reads: "No criminal proceedings whatsoever shall be instituted or continued against the President, or the Governor of a State, in any court during his term of office."

The woman petitioner has also sought directions to frame specific guidelines under which governors enjoy immunity from criminal

"This court has to decide whether a victim like the petitioner can be rendered remediless, with the only option being to wait for the accused to demit his office, which delay will then be inexplainable during the trial, and render the entire procedure a mere lip service, without any justice to the victim

herein," the plea said. The plea has also sought a probe into the case by the West Bengal Police and protection for her and her family along with compensation from the government for her

loss of reputation. The contractual woman employee of Raj Bhavan had lodged a complaint with the Kolkata Police alleging that she was molested by Bose in the governor's house on April 24 and May 2.

She accused Bose of orchestrating a "ridiculous drama" to deflect attention from his actions, emphasising that he should have

provided the CCTV ootage from premises to police at the outset of the investigation.

Footage from two CCTV cameras positioned at the main (north) gate, from 5.32 pm to 6.41 pm on May 2, was shown to a select

group of people and journalists at the Central Marble Hall on the ground floor of Raj Bhavan.

In the first footage, the employee, dressed in jeans and a top, was seen hurrying to the police outpost housed within the governor's house amid a significant number of police personnel who were deployed in the premises for the scheduled visit of Prime Minister Narendra Modi on that day.

The second footage, which lasted for around 10 minutes, showed various vehicles including fire tenders arriving at the north gate of Raj Bhavan and policemen lining up for their regular duties. The victim, however, could not be

In the wake of the controversy, Bose filed a defamation case against Chief Minister Mamata Baneriee on June 28, a day after she claimed that she had been approached by women saying they were afraid to visit the Raj Bhavan because of the "activities"

SC to examine Art 361 Rahul Gandhi 'blackmailed' voters with fake narrative: Athawale

AHMEDABAD, July 19: Union Minister Ramdas Athawale on Friday said Congress leader Rahul Gandhi "blackmailed" voters by creating a fake narrative that the BJP would change the Constitution if it won 400 Lok Sabha seats, leading to losses to the ruling party in several states.

The Union minister of state for social justice and empowerment also said despite such moves Prime Minister Narendra Modi emerged victorious and the BJP-led National Democratic Alliance got a clear majority with 292 seats.

"In the 2019 general elections the BJP got 303 seats and the NDA got 353 seats. On the basis of work done in the last five years, PM Modi gave the slogan of 'abki baar 400 paar'. However, the opposition united just for the sake of defeating the PM and spread fake narratives. Rahul Gandhi blackmailed voters but he failed," he told reporters.

Asked how Gandhi blackmailed voters, Athawale said, "He created a narrative that the BJP will change the Constitution and abolish reservations if it won 400 Lok Sabha seats. People were swayed by this fake narrative and we lost seats in Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra, Rajasthan and West Bengal," the sen-

PANAJI, July 19: Celebration of Opinion Poll Day on January 16 to mark the 1967 referendum through which the people of Goa chose not to merge with Maharashtra would be restarted, Chief Minister Pramod Sawant said on Friday.

on January 16, 1967, where the people were asked to vote in favour of or against a proposed merger with neighbouring Maharashtra. The majority of people voted against the merger and favoured continuing as a Union Territory. Goa became a state in

Delhi court reserves order on framing charges against Tytler

NEW DELHI, July 19: Delhi court on Friday reserved its order on whether to frame charges against Congress leader Jagdish Tytler in an anti-Sikh riots case in which three people were killed.

Special judge for Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) cases Rakesh Siyal reserved the order after hearing arguments by the counsel for the central probe agency and the defence.


The court is likely to pronounce the order on August 2.

The CBI, while quoting a witness, had alleged in the charge sheet that Tytler stepped out of a white ambassador car in front of Gurudwara Pul Bangash on November 1, 1984 and instigated a mob to kills Sikhs.

"Kill the Sikhs, they have killed our mother," Tytler, a former Union minister was alleged to have told the mob that led to the killing of three people.

Anti-Sikh riots had erupted in several parts of the country in the aftermath of the assassination of Prime Minister Indira Gandhi by her Sikh bodyguards on October

A sessions court had in August



last year granted anticipatory bail to Tytler in the case.

The court had also imposed certain conditions on Tytler, including that he will not tamper with the evidence or leave the country without its permission.

The central agency has invoked charges under Sections 147 (rioting), 109 (abetment of an offence) read with 302 (murder) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC), among others, against Tytler. (PTI)

name and the licence number. The Muzaffarnagar police advisory came in for severe criticism from several quarters.

Union minister and BJP ally Chirag Paswan unequivocally opposed it and said he would "abnever support or solutely encourage" any divide in the name of caste or religion.

Another BJP ally, the Janata Dal (United), also criticised the advisory. JD(U) leader KC Tyagi said the Muzaffarnagar police should be withdrawn as it may cause communal tension and there should not be any discrimination based on religion or caste.

It's being prepared to make crony capitalists richer: Cong targets govt ahead of Budget

NEW DELHI, July 19: Days ahead of the presentation of the Union Budget, the Congress on Friday alleged that it would be aimed at making a few crony capitalists richer rather than addressing concerns such as unemployment, rising inequalities and "drying up" of FDI.

Congress spokesperson Supriya Shrinate also alleged that this government has nothing to do with common people, farmers, youth, women and middle class, and claimed that the upcoming budget, like in the past years of the Modi government, is being prepared to build more monopolies in various sectors.

In the wake of the recent train accidents, she also asked what is being done to make the railways safer and will Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman allocate more funds which would in turn be used to protect people.

"On July 23, 2024, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman will present her seventh budget. Before preparing this budget, she met some industrialists, bankers and farmer organisations and discussed issues with them but has she met the families who are unable to eat three meals a day? Has she met the women who are struggling with inflation? Has she met the farmers who are struggling to get fair prices for their crops? Has she met the youth who are suffering due to paper leaks? Has she met the real India?" Shrinate asked. "It is clear that she has not met them.

This budget is being prepared to make a few crony capitalists richer," she said at a press conference at the AICC headquarters here. Displaying slides with economic data at the presser, Shrinate said the foreign direct investment (FDI) is drying up and

India has traded deficit with nine of the top 10 trading partners. She claimed that monopolies have been increasing in sectors such as cement, telecom, aviation and tyres, and said this budget will see more monopolies being built.

"Will this budget do anything to bridge

this gap," she asked. Shrinate said food inflation has remained consistently above 9% and the vegetable prices have increased by more

"It may not matter to the rich, but you (government) have made the vegetables disappear from the plate of the poor. This inflation is everywhere, be it transport, school fees or clothes etc. So the question

is: will this budget be able to stop inflation?" she asked. Noting that consumption accounts for 60% of our economy, Shrinate said the data shows that despite price cuts, fastmoving consumer goods sales have

halved in April and May. "Vehicles worth ₹ 60,000 crores are lying unsold. The situation of inflation is such that even those who want to buy a car are not able to do so," the Congress leader said.

She said there is a culture of savings in India and this culture has kept our economy strong but today "we are suffering so much from unemployment, inflation and low income that the domestic debt, which never went above 25% of GDP, is close to 41% today".

Household debt has risen to 41% of the GDP, causing household savings to fall to less than 6% of the GDP, she said.

"Talking about petrol and diesel, five big companies saved about 900 billion rupees by buying cheap oil from Russia. But did petrol and diesel become cheaper for the public?" she asked.

Shrinate also pointed out that the growth rate of agriculture in the financial year 2024 was 1.4% as against 4.7% in the previous financial year.

The Modi government has continuously reduced the budget of the agriculture sector, where most of our people work, she said.

The Congress leader further said the investment in the country is "completely sluggish", while the investment during the UPA government was 30% of the GDP, today it is at 20-25%.

"We have a trade deficit with nine out of the top 10 trading partners of India. We are importing more from them and exporting less to them. That means we are buying more goods from them but selling less to them," Shrinate said.

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman is scheduled to present the Union Budget on July 23. (PTI)

DSEU revokes fee waivers for SC, ST, and EWS students



NEW DELHI, July 19: The Delhi Skills and Entrepreneurship University (DSEU) has revoked a 20 per cent fee concession for SC and ST students and a 10 per cent waiver for the EWS category, raising concerns among those affected.

Several students said they were concerned not only by the revocation of waivers, but also a recent fee hike and the rule to exempt "fee defaulters" from taking exams. The DSEU, a state established and funded Institute has revoked the concession provided to Scheduled Caste (SC), Scheduled Tribe (ST), and Economically Weaker Section (EWS) students starting the 2024-25 academic session and has hiked the fees by up to nine times for majority of its 80 courses, except the master's programmes, Aawaz, the varsity's students' body, said.

The revised fees can be viewed in DSEU's admission brochure -- Information Bulletin 2024 -- which provides the complete fee structure of courses offered at the university. Asked about the fee hike and revocation of the concession for SC, ST, and EWS students, DSEU Vice-chancellor Ashok Kumar Nagawat told PTI that the hike has been effected based on the recommendations of the Finance Committee considering the funding crunch and financial burden on the varsity. He added that the committee is slated to meet next on July 31 and will discuss the matter.

According to the bulletin available on the website, the fees of Bachelor of Optometry for first-year students has increased to around ₹ 1.10 lakh per annum (including other annual charges) from ₹29,700 in 2023-2024. The fees have been increased to the same amount in other courses such as BSc Data Analytics (previous fees ₹ 41,580) and Bachelor of Computer Science (previous fees ₹ 34,940), the document shows.

"There will be an annual increase of 10 per cent in the fees. The semester fee will be accordingly based on that," the bulletin also states. On June 17, the varsity issued a list of of hundreds of "fee defaulter" students, barring them from sitting in the end term examination as well as from taking classes, the students' body alleged. The list was released on an official WhatsApp group of the administration which was shared by the respective campus directors with students, Awaaz claimed. (PTI)

District Magistrate of Gonda, Neha Sharma, said, "So far, four passengers have died and 31 are injured. Of the injured, the condition of around half a dozen is crit-

"The deceased include Rahul 38, Saroj Kumar Singh, 31, and two unknown passengers. The body of one of the unknown passengers was retrieved on Friday morning," Sharma said.

"The bodies of the four have arrived at the district headquarters. Their post-mortem examination will be conducted after their relatives arrive," Sharma said, adding orders have been given to conduct a magisterial inquiry into the incident. Sharma said she was present at Mankapur Junction when a special train with 600 passengers of the Chandigarh-Dibrugarh Express left for Assam on Thursday night, hours after the accident, according to an official statement.

The officer said she interacted with several passengers and none of them complained about any of their co-passengers missing. She also said that work to restore the railway track is going on, and it will be completed soon.

The district magistrate reached the district hospital on Friday morning and met the injured admitted there. She directed the chief



pital to provide proper treatment and care to the injured

The DM asked the chief medical officer and the district to take special care of the lone passengers injured in the train.

Speaking to reporters at the hospital, she said two of the critically injured passengers are undergoing treatment at Lucknow's trauma centre while four patients each are admitted to the district hospital and the railway's empanelled hospital.

A railway official said a highlevel investigation has begun to ascertain the cause behind the derailment. The railway technical team, which reached the spot late last night, collected samples from the accident site and took photographs. Meanwhile, the railway administration is trying to restore traffic by removing the damaged coaches from the track.

A railway official said the restoration work was carried out through the night using light from a generator. A team of about 800 railway employees has been engaged in repair work since Friday morning, he added.

"It's a relationship not of addition... it's not India plus the United States when India and the US are together, it's a multiplicative relationship," he said. Garcetti said that India and the US are moving forward together because "we love each other." "All the things we have been able to do are examples of how India and the

Garcetti said the US and India are working together closely in the field of artificial intelligence.

He said that the two countries working together can also ensure that people are not dependent on equipment from any single country in the telecommunications sector.

The ambassador said that India and the US can work together on climate change which is showing its vicious signs with some extremely hot days and very heavy rain in short periods of time.

Garcetti said that Indian and US expertise are being used together to help third countries in fields like healthcare as done in Fiji and the Philippines. He said that the two countries will also work together with Tanzania as part of such triangular cooperation. He said that India has been, for the second year in a row, the number one source of higher education students for American universities and colleges. (PTI)

SC agrees to hear plea against HC order on removal of protesters from Chandigarh-Mohali road

NEW DELHI, July 19: The Supreme Court on Friday agreed to hear a plea challenging an order of the Punjab and Haryana High Court which asked the authorities to clear the Chandigarh-Mohali road of protesters.

In May this year, the apex court had stayed the operation of the April 9 order of the high court while hearing a separate petition.

On Friday, a bench of Justices B R Gavai, K V Viswanathan and N Kotiswar Singh sought responses from an NGO, on whose petition the high court had passed the order, and others on the fresh plea. It tagged the plea with a pending petition raising the same issue.

In its April 9 order, the high court had said despite repeated opportunities given, neither the state of Punjab nor the Union territory of Chandigarh has been able to redress the grievances of the commuters of Chandigarh and SAS Nagar in Mohali. "Only on account of the fact that some of the protestors have been hiding behind a shield of religious legitimacy by placing the Guru Granth Sahib would not as such give the State reason not to act against the persons concerned, who are misusing the religious sentiments," the high court had said.

It had passed the order on a plea by an NGO which contended that local residents and commuters were facing unnecessary harassment because of the protest on the Chandigarh-Mohali road that has been going on since February 2023. The protesters have been seeking the release


of Sikh prisoners, including Devinderpal Singh Bhullar, a 1993 Delhi bomb blast convict. The fresh plea, filed in the apex court by 'Kaumi Insaf Morcha', said it has been leading

a non-violent and peaceful protest for over a year and half there. The plea, filed through advocate Satya Mitra, has claimed that the high court had "erroneously ordered the forceful removal of protestors from the site, despite the state govern-



ment's affidavit to the court indicating that the protestors had not disrupted traffic and that traffic flow around YPS Chowk was normal".

"The longstanding demand for the release of Sikh political prisoners have been a sensitive and emotional issue for the people of Punjab. The movement is giving a representation to those demands through a peaceful sit-in which is neither causing any disturbance of public tranquillity and nor falls under the reasonable restrictions specified in Article 19(2) of the Indian Constitution," it said. The plea claimed that the high court, in its impugned order, cast aspersions on the motive of the protesters by wrongly claiming they were hiding behind Guru Granth Sahib, using the holy book as a shield. It said these observations of the high court were unreasonable and excessive. In its April 9 interim order, the high court had observed that "on account of handful persons sitting and blocking the road, inconvenience is being caused to the commuters and residents of the Tri-city and the misery is continuing". The high court, while deferring the proceedings, had further said it was hoping that Punjab and Chandigarh administration will "wake up from their slumber" and keep in mind the observations of the apex court given in various verdicts related to protests on roads. (PTI)



Pitching for 'atmanirbharta' in defence, he said the DRDO, private industries and others can bolster armed forces' capabilities in radars, communications and a plethora of other

'Atmanirbharata' is "not just a buzzword", it is something that all stakeholders need to put their heart and soul into, and make sure technologies and weapons are developed and manufactured in India, "so that we are not relying on an outside agency who could change its alliance or stop flow of weapons to our country" when the time comes, he said. Air Marshal Singh emphasised that the "biggest lesson that we have learned from today's geopolitics is to be self-reliant". As they say, there is no permanent enemy or permanent friend, there is only permanent interest, he said. In his address, the VCAS pitched for fostering greater 'atmanirbharta' but with a rider.

"Atmanirbharta is what we are riding on. Majority of contracts are with Indian partners, Indian industry... But, this atmanirbharta cannot be at the

cost of nation's defence. Nation's defence comes first and foremost," he said. "And, if the IAF and Indian forces have to ride on this atmanirbharta, it is only possible if everyone, from DRDO to DPSUs to the private industry, hold our hands and take us on that path. And, don't let us deviate from that path. Because, when it comes to national defence, there will be compulsions to deviate from that path in case we do not get the things that we need, or the kind of systems or weaponry required to survive in today's world," the air marshal said. He urged that "we all have to work in unison" and at a "much, much faster pace". However, the VCAS flagged that

"the rate at which we are getting our equipment at the moment, is too low" and there was a need to increase it. 'When we look at our adversaries. the rate at which they are growing, the rate at which they are imbibing these technologies and still growing in numbers... we have a long gap to catch up with and this gap is widening further. This is something that we need to look at as a whole and we need to find a solution to this gap that is building," he said.

During the seminar exhibition on air and missile defence hosted by the think-tank at Subroto Park here, many speakers also spoke about various lessons from ongoing conflicts in the world. The VCAS in his address also said the ongoing Russia-Ukraine conflict has demonstrated the integration of multiple forces in domains of air, land, sea, cyber, information and space, and how they are "united" to achieve the goal. "One thing is certain, if we need to do something, we need to stay... in the game, we need to modernise, we need to continue to grow, continue to innovate and we need to continue being ahead of the curve. Otherwise, we lag behind and we are just chasing," Air Marshal

'MY SPY THE ETERNAL CITY' A LOVE LETTER TO ITALY: DIRECTOR PETE SEGAL

NEW DELHI, July 19: A real-life personal story served as the starting point for his latest release "My Spy: The Eternal City", says filmmaker Pete Segal, who describes the film as his "love letter" to Italy.

The movie, a sequel to Segal's 2020 action comedy "My Spy", brings back Dave Bautista and Chloe Coleman as veteran CIA operative JJ and his high school-going stepdaughter and protege, Sophie.

"My Spy: The Eternal City", which started streaming on Prime Video from Thursday, sees the action shift from Chicago to Italy when Sophie's high school choir goes on a tour to the European country. The trip is interrupted by a nefarious nuclear plot targeting the Vatican which compels the duo to reunite to save the world again.

"The choir trip (in the film) is based on a real choir trip that I was actually a chaperone on for my children's high school. They have a tremendous choir, led by the real Dr Brookie, who we portrayed with another actor in the film, and the tour started in Venice.

"Then, they took the kids to Florence on the train and then they all performed before the Pope in the Vatican and I just wanted to capture that same adventure on film... So, it's a bit of a love letter to Italy, and I'm excited for people to see the characters they love but in this new, bigger environment," Segal told PTI in an interview when asked why he chose to

move the plot in the follow-up film to Italy. The sequel is bigger and grander than "My Spy", which was made on a USD 19 million budget, he said, adding Amazon Studios gave the team "triple" the amount to mount the new movie. "We were the beneficiaries of our success on the first movie. It was the third biggest movie of 2020. And so our budget originally was USD 19 million. And, Amazon rewarded us with triple that to do the sequel. So, we knew we had a lot more money to make a bigger canvas.

"We wanted the set pieces to be bigger. We wanted the action to be bigger. We wanted new characters. You have to challenge yourself not to repeat. Just because a joke worked in the first movie, don't do it again. Try to be as fresh and original as you can," he added. The director, best known for comedies such as "50 First Dates", "The Longest Yard", "Anger Management", and "Get Smart", said "My Spy: The Eternal City" is one of the few films to be shot inside the Colosseum, the historical landmark in Italian capital Rome, in a while. And that's what made filming the climax of the movie one of his favourite sequences.

"... The fact that we were able to shoot for real in Rome. Obviously stuff inside the Vatican had to be faked. That was visual effects because no one is allowed to film inside the Vatican, but there is access even to the Colosseum. It apparently is very rare. Only four films have been granted access to film inside the Colosseum in the last 25 years," Segal said. Growing up, characters like Inspector Jacques Clouseau from "The Pink Panther" movies and James Bond starring Sean Connery and Roger Moore were his favourite spies.

Connery and Roger Moore were his favourite spies. "I liked Inspector Clouseau. He was a lot of fun. But I've always loved James Bond. Going back to Sean Connery and Roger Moore. 'Moonraker' (is) one of my favourite movies when I was a kid. "And also 'Moonraker' was shot quite a bit in Venice, Italy. So I thought about that when I was there. I thought about where Roger Moore came up into St Mark's Square on the gondola that became a car. Those things went

through my head because they're iconic."
The director already has "a couple of thoughts" for a third part in the action comedy franchise, but all will depend on the response to "My Spy: The Eternal City".

"We'll see how this one does. And if we have the same kind of success that we did on the first one, then I'll really think about it," he said. His film "50 First Dates", a popular romcom film starring Adam Sandler and Drew Barrymore, completed 20 years in February.

The 2004 movie followed Henry Roth (Sandler), a womanising marine veterinarian who falls for an art teacher named Lucy Whitmore (Barrymore), who resolves to win her over again every day when he discovers she has amnesia. "I think everyone should have the patience of Henry Roth to woo that woman that you love over and over again, every day from scratch. Let's just say that's not me, but very inspirational to me and hopefully to everyone," he said. (PTI)

"It might be a small role, but it's so important and I wanted to be associated with something like this, I wanted to be the catalyst for this fire, and that is how things started," the actor told PTI.

Maniktala, who has starred in prominent roles in OTT series like "Flames", "A Suitable Boy", "Tooth Pari" and "P I Meena", remembers discussing her role with the

director who was confident that her portrayal will bring an emotional heft to the story.

"Nikhil sir told me this is what is on paper, but I want to see how you make your character come alive because there's only so much I can do to her on paper. After all, action is what we are playing with, but how you make yourself the underlying emotion behind all of that is entirely up to you.

Asked her if she was worried about "Kill" receiving flak for the depiction of violence, Maniktala said that "Kill" does not "glorify violence", and rather portrays action as an "art form".

"By keeping it as real as possible, Nikhil sir has made it clear that in no way he intends to glorify violence or action. We are trying to create a chain of something new."

About parallels between "Kill" and the iconic romance-drama "Dilwale Dulhania Le Jayenge" as both begin on train, the actor said, "Guneet ma'am (Monga, producer) pointed out that if 'DDLJ' had been an action movie, it would be 'Kill'."

"...It's a huge compliment because it's not just action, romance, comedy, and drama. It's driven by all these human emotions and is a full package combined," Maniktala said.

"Kill", which is still running in cinemas, has garnered significant acclaim and has amassed over Rs 16 crore at the box office.

The actor also reflected on the reception to her debut film "Mumbaikar", which released on JioCinema last year.

She starred alongside Vikrant Massey, Vijay Sethupathi, Sanjay Mishra, and Sachin Khedekar in the film, a remake of the 2017 Tamil movie "Maanagaram".

Despite the great names associated with the film and the directorial prowess of Santosh Sivan, the timing of the release was not good, she believes.

"We shot 'Mumbaikar' in 2020 and it was released at the end of last year, so all of my expectations were done by that time because I thought we already sort of missed it with the timeline. Like had it been released way earlier, it would have picked up."

Their adversary is the titular band of everyday guys who have only one mission -- to expose the real nature of the so-called superheroes.

The series, which is based on bestselling comic by Garth Ennis and Darick Robertson, had a smash hit debut with its first season that came out in 2019, earning major praise for flipping the superhero genre on its head.

The fourth season also introduces Valorie Curry as Firecracker, a new member of the superhero group called The Seven.

What Curry liked about the show was its "unapologetic point of view" about what's happening in the world.

"Particularly in those early seasons,

there was an intelligent and incisive portrayal of Me Too (movement). And like how corporate culture interacts with politics and celebrity. The writers don't dance around things. They're willing to really name things and quote people and be specific in what they're commenting on. That's brave and something that I wanted to be a part of,"

The character of Firecracker comes across as a political commentator and the host of a far-right show called The Truth Bomb.

Asked to explain the moral compass of the character, Curry said every villain thinks they're a hero.

"I think from the outside, it's pretty clear to see where she stands in terms of her moral compass. But what I find intriguing about her playing her is really grounding into her vulnerability. She's actually a character who's experienced and continues to carry a lot of pain with her and she's putting on a face all the time for everyone.

"She does care about the world and people. She sees people's pain and wants to be a voice for them. And it feels very at odds with how just loud and awful she is but it's kind of a means to an end," she said. (PTI)

So near yet so far: India's tryst with fourth-place Olympic heartbreaks

often said that finishing fourth in the Olympics is peak agony.

If coming last carries the sting of embarrassment, securing the fourth place inflicts the pain of being so near yet so far, something that can either drive an athlete to future glory or leave them completely crushed.

India's affair with near misses at sport's grandest stage has been a long-standing one, beginning way back in 1956.

Here is a look at the instances when Indian athletes came close but ended at just that. 1956, Melbourne

The Indian football team made the semifinals after beating hosts Australia 4-2 in the quarterfinals, with Neville D'-Souza becoming the first Asian to score a hat-trick at the Games.

By giving his team the lead, Neville looked like doing an encore in the last-four clash against Yugoslavia. But the Yugoslavians came back strongly in the second half to seal the contest in their favour.

In the bronze medal classification match, India lost to Bulgaria 0-3, drawing to a close an eventful few days which the great P K Banerjee would often reminisce with a hint of understandable anguish.

Verstappen's Red Bull



BUDAPEST, July 19: Just when Lewis Hamilton decided he needed to switch teams, here comes Mercedes and finally gives him a competitive car.

Mercedes has elbowed its way into the most tightly contested Formula One season since threetime reigning champion Max Verstappen wrested the mantle of serial winner from Hamilton in

But the seven-time world champion and Mercedes teammate George Russell have won back-to-back races, with Russell finishing first in Austria before Hamilton surprisingly took the victory at Silverstone, and the team arrives to this weekend's Hungarian Grand Prix with renewed hope after a long spell of selt-doubt.

Hamilton's win at the British GP was his first victory since the second-to-last race of the 2021 season. The British driver also knows better than anyone how to win on the Hungaroring's tight corners. He holds a record eight wins here, with his last triumph coming in 2020. He also scored a pole position on this track last year. "It's game on, we're fighting, we're chasing, and we're going to try and win as many races or compete for as many wins as possible," Hamilton said while preparing for the race

Hamilton stunned the sport by announcing that he was leaving

for Ferrari in 2025. He has since insisted that his focus in completely on making the most of his final months with Mercedes.

"We are united as a team, and we're going to try and make sure we finish the season on a high.

With five different winners in the last seven races, it is clear that it is no longer a foregone conclusion that Red Bull will sweep up most of the victories.

Verstappen still commands a healthy lead on 255 points, with McLaren's Lando Norris in second with 171. But the Dutch driver is now facing fast challengers from three different teams when you include the Ferrari's of Charles Leclerc and Car-

Verstappen acknowledged that the gap between his car and the best of rest has largely disappeared. "The last few races we've not been the quickest car, so I don't expect that to suddenly now be any different," said Verstappen, who has won here the past two years.

"Of course we will bring upgrades, hopefully that will give it a good boost, but at the moment just one to try and see how that will work this weekend.'

Red Bull is under more pressure in the constructors' championship, which combines the points taken from each team's two drivers. Red Bull has 373 points; Ferrari 302, McLaren 295, and Mercedes 221. (AP)

"Amit is in a strong place now because he has made a comeback and seen the tough times in the past few years," Akhil told PTI on the sidelines of a panel discussion on India's Olympic prospects hosted by the Delhi Sports Journalists Association in collaboration with the Sports Authority of India.

The snubs severely dented Panghal's confidence and made him question his abilities.

However, when the opportunity came, India's lone men's world championships silvermedallist grabbed it with both hands to secure an Olympic quota in the 51kg category. The Games begin on July 26.

"When he was not in the team he must have had sleepless nights, he trained hard. He must have felt things that he cannot put into words. He has walked out of all that stronger and should take it as a motivation," Akhil added.

He once stood at the pinnacle of his sport with gold medals at the Asian Games and Asian Championships and a historic silver at the World Champi-

Everton's proposed sale to Texasbased Friedkin Group fail to take-off

proposed sale of Premier League club Everton to the Texas-based Friedkin Group has fallen through, both parties said in a joint statement on Friday.

The Friedkin Group, which has a portfolio of companies in the automotive, entertainment, hospitalsports and adventure industries, entered into exclusive discussions to buy a majority stake in Everton last month.

But the two parties said discussions had ended and the proposed deal would not go ahead

"The parties agree it is in both their interests for Everton to explore alternative options," the joint statement said. The development places more

uncertainty over the future of Everton after the proposed takeover by 777 Partners — a Miami-based private investment firm — collapsed last month.

Nine-time English champion Everton has battled relegation in each of the last three seasons and in its most recent accounts reported losses of \$112.5 million.

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
