

GUWAHATI, Oct 25: A total of 38 candidates are in the fray so far for five assembly seats in Assam where by-elections will be held on November 13 as the nomination process concluded on Friday, with 24 nominees submitting their documents on the last day, an official re-

On Friday, three candidates filed their nomination papers for Dholai, one for Sidli, five for Bongaigaon, 12 for Samaguri and three for Be-

Prominent candidates in the fray so far are BJP's Diplu Ranjan Sarma in Samaguri, AGP's Diptimoy Choudhury, wife of eight-time party MLA Phanibhushan Choudhury, in Bongaigaon, Congress's Jayata Bora in Behali and Bodo People's Front's Suddho Kumar Basumatary in Sidli.

The nomination papers will be scrutinised on October 28 and the

The award was presented to him during the ongoing 5th IUCN SSC Leaders' Meeting in Abu Dhabi, where around 300 conservation experts have gathered to address the intertwined crises of biodiversity and climate change.

Talukdar was recognised for his significant contributions to species conservation, particularly through his leadership in the SSC and his work on the Indian one-horned rhi-

To appear before CBI court on October 30 Multi-crore trading scam accused brought to Guwahati

DIBRUGARH, Oct 25: The multi-crore online trading scam accused Bishal Phukan, Sumi Bora, Tarkik Bora, Amlan Bora, Ranjit Kakoti, Abhijit Chanda, Shubhan Jyoti Kurmi, and Chandan Nath were taken from the Dibrugarh Central Jail to Guwahati by road at around 8:25 am on Fri-

They were escorted by a 12member Assam police team. All 8 accused are likely to appear before the Special CBI Court in Guwahati on October 30 in connection with ongoing investigations into the online trading scams.

Meanwhile, the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) arrived in Dibrugarh on October 12, 2024, to probe two cases (No. 352/24 and 354/24) related to illegal online trading, registered against Bishal Phukan, Ranjit Kakoti, and others respectively at Dibrugarh Police Station.

Dibrugarh SP Rakesh Reddy said that on the way the team had a brief stop at the Barbaruah Police Station where a separate FIR was registered against accused Bishal Phukan apart from the one registered at Dibrugarh Police Station. After the brief halt, the team resumed the 443-km road journey to Guwahati.

Sources said that the 5-member CBI team led by an SP rank officer who has been camping in Dibrugarh in connection with the case since October 18 also left for Guwahati by flight on Friday.

Earlier on September 3, the prime accused in the multi-crore scam, 22-year-old Phukan was apprehended by the Dibrugarh Police on September 3 after the scam estimated to be worth at least ₹ 2,200 crore was uncov-

Subsequently, other key figures in the scam, including actorchoreographer Sumi Borah, her photographer husband Tarkik Borah and her brother-in-law Amlan Borah, were also arrested by law enforcement agencies.

Two of Phukan's accomplices, actor-choreographer Sumi Borah and her photographer husband Tarkik Borah were arrested by the Special Task Force (STF) of Assam police on September 12.

A day earlier on September 11 Sumi Borah's brother-in-law Amlan Borah was arrested from the Muzzaffarpur district in Bihar in a joint operation by Assam Police and Bihar Police.

The accused have been booked under section 316(2)/318(4) of the BNS 2023, along with section 21/23 of the Banning of Unregulated Deposit Scheme Act, 2019.

Issues corrosive for long-term growth: Cyclone Dana spares Odisha, Bengal of major damage

BHUBANESWAR/KOLKATA, Oct 25: Cyclone Dana spared Odisha and West Bengal of any severe damage to infrastructure while flight and rail operations resumed on Friday after the cyclonic storm completed landfall, triggering heavy rains and uprooting of trees and electric poles.

Odisha chief minister Mohan Charan Majhi asserted that no fatality report has been received so far and the state achieved its 'zero casualty mission', while West Bengal CM Mamata Banerjee said one person died due to the natural calamity.

The severe cyclonic storm Dana completed its landfall around 8.30 am on Friday and the system took at least eight and half hours to enter the landmass, the

The landfall of 'Dana' started around 12.05 am on Friday between Bhitarkanika in Kendrapara and Dhamra in Bhadrak district of Odisha with wind speeds of around 110 kmph.

Majhi, who reviewed the cyclone situation in Bhubaneswar this morning, announced that the state achieved its "zero casualty mission" as there has been 'no report regarding any loss of human life or injury in the severe cyclonic storm"

The chief minister said all the roads blocked by uprooted trees would be cleared during the day as the



rescue team personnel had already started working as soon as the intensity of wind reduced on Thursday

Majhi said many electrical installations like poles and transformers were damaged and were being re-

"By 6 pm on Friday, electricity will be restored in all places including the worst-hit Kendrapara, Balasore and Bhadrak district," he said.

Assam to suspend mobile internet tomorrow

GUWAHATI, Oct 25: Mobile internet services will remain suspended across Assam from 8.30 am to 4 pm on Sunday for the conduct of a government recruitment exam, an official notification said on Friday.

In a letter to states and UTs. director general of health services (DGHS) Dr Atul Goel has advised them to discourage stubble and waste burning and spread awareness among people about reducing firecrackers during festivities, promoting public transportation, limiting reliance on diesel-based generators, and curbing smoking. "Additionally, individuals



should be advised to minimise their exposure to polluted air by monitoring air quality indices through government mobile applications before venturing outdoors, avoiding heavily congested areas, and opting for cleaner fuels at home for cooking, heating, and lighting," Dr Goel said in the letter written last week.

He said air pollution has recently become a serious health challenge, with the Air Quality Index (AQI) in certain states/UTs reaching moderate to poor levels. This may even worsen consider-

ing the upcoming festive season and the onset of winter, he said.

Air pollution is a significant contributor to acute health conditions and exacerbates the progression of chronic diseases affecting the respiratory, cardiovascular, and cerebrovascular systems. These chronic illnesses, attributed to prolonged exposure to air pollution, often lead to an increase in premature mortality.

The adverse effects are particularly severe for vulnerable groups such as children, pregnant women, the elderly, individuals with preexisting health conditions, and those who face higher exposure risks due to their occupations, such as traffic police officers and municipal workers, Dr Goel said. Only 5 extradition requests for terrorists resolved by Canada, rest in limbo: Indian envoy

NEW DELHI, Oct 25: Of the 26 requests sent to Canada for extraditing Khalistani terrorists, Ottawa has resolved only five and the rest remain in limbo, India's top envoy to that country has said, calling it the result of "inaction"

The five men are in the process of being extradited, High Commissioner Sanjay Verma told PTI in an interview this week. He said he is not at liberty to disclose the name or give details.

The interview took place on Wednesday, a couple of days after his return to New Delhi. India recalled him and five other Indian diplomats after they were named "person of interest" in a Canadian investigation into the 2023 killing of Hardeep Singh Nijjar, a Khalistani terrorist who was a Canadian citizen.

Relations between the two countries have plunged to their lowest level ever over the issue of Canada's tacit support for Khalistani extremists among the large Sikh-Canadian population of about 8 lakh. New Delhi accuses Ottawa of doing next to nothing to stop the activities of Khalistani supporters who seek to undermine the sovereignty and territorial integrity of India.

"According to the last information that I had, five of them have been resolved. Twenty-one are still pend-



ing, and these are pending since decades. So, I would say that there is an inaction rather than consultation. All the issues which get into the judicial system of a country, sometimes need consultations, because we follow two different judicial systems," he said.

But, if there is no action in the last four, five or 10 years, then "I would only call it inaction", Verma said. Recently, the ministry of external affairs said the 26 extradition requests are for people who have been charged in India with terror and related crimes. India has also sought "provisional (CONTD. Pursuing for swift progress in India-EU free trade agreement negotiations: German Chancellor

NEW DELHI, Oct 25: German Chancellor Olaf Scholz on Friday said his government is pursuing swift progress and rapid conclusion of the negotiations for a proposed free trade agreement between India and the 27-nation European Union (EU).

"And I am sure if we both work on this together, Prime Minister, this could happen in months rather than years," he said while addressing the 18th Asia-Pacific Conference of German Business 2024 in the presence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi here.

Scholz arrived in Delhi late on Thursday as part of his three-day official visit to India. Modi and Scholz will co-chair the seventh Intergovernmental Consultations (IGC) at Hyderabad House.

"We want the free trade agreement between the EU and India. My government is pursuing for swift progress and rapid conclusions," he said.

He also said that recently the German government has agreed on a strategy to attract skilled Indian employees to Germany.



"Today Indians are the largest group of foreign students at our universities. Last year alone, the number of Indians working in Germany grew by 23,000. That talent is a welcome addition to our

labour market," Scholz said. He added that Germany is digitising its visa process, speeding up procedures and making them more user-friendly.

"At the same time, we are reducing irregular migration and facilitating returns of those who have no right to be in our country. The message is that Germany is open for skilled workers but then we can decide who comes," he said.

In June 2022, India and the EU resumed the negotiations after a gap of over eight years. It was stalled in 2013 due to differences over several issues.

With India, the Chancellor said, "we want to deepen our cooperation in defence and agree to bring our militaries closer together". He noted that countries should not depend on one nation, particularly in the strategic importance of critical raw materials and certain

technologies. "For us, de-risking means diversification and this diversification is happening. Look at how India and German business have developed in recent years," Scholz said, recalling increasing cooperation between the two countries in areas like aviation. railways and automobiles.

He also said that China is an industrial giant and should give up the special treatment it has received as a developing country.

Germany is a key trading partner of India in the EU bloc. In 2023-24, India's exports to that country stood at about USD 10 billion, while imports were USD 16.7 billion. India also receives healthy foreign direct investments from

The FDI from Germany was USD 505 million in the last fiscal. During April 2000 and June 2024, the investments stood at USD 14.74 billion. (PTI)

"Only one person died in this natural disaster. The man died at his residence while conducting some cable-related work. It is quite unfortunate. The postmortem examination will give us a clear picture. If required we (state government) will help the family," Banerjee said.

Heavy rains packed with gusty winds lashed parts of southern West Bengal. In various parts of Mandarmani in Purba Medinipur and Gosaba in South 24 Parganas district, waterlogging has been reported, compounding the misery of the affected residents.

The full extent of the damage is still being assessed, but initial reports suggested that the storm brought heavy rains, which continued till Friday, causing inundation in low-lying areas.

Thirteen teams from the state's disaster management force and 14 battalions from the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) have been deployed in the Bengal coastal regions, the officials said.

Flight operations resumed at Kolkata airport in West Bengal from 8 am on Friday after being suspended since Thursday evening in view of the cyclonic storm. Train services on the south section of the Sealdah Division under the Eastern Railway also restarted at 10 am after scheduled cancellations due to the cyclone, they said. Flight and train services also resumed in Bhubaneswar on Friday morning even though cyclone Dana tore through the Odisha coast since midnight. Biju Patnaik International Airport here restarted its operation with the first flight landing around 9 am, Majhi told reporters. The East Coast Railway (ECoR), in a statement, said trains started running as per schedule, barring those cancelled earlier in its jurisdiction. The ECoR cancelled around 203 trains as a precautionary measure for the cyclone Dana. (PTI)

"In Dima Hasao's Umrongso area, predominantly Karbi villages such as Boro Lokhindong, Choto Lokhindong, Tharvelangso, Sikilangso, Cheksolangso, Borolobang, Choto Lobang, and Chotolarpheng have been there since ancient times," he added. Phangcho said Karbi Anglong Autonomous Council (KAAC) authority must immediately halt the illegal mining of coal, sand, and felling of trees to prevent environmental degradation, climatic change and depletion of forest resources. He further stressed that giving land to multinational companies and issuing leases must be stopped immediately.

Meanwhile, on October 21, the Karbi Students Association (KSA), Mining Area Affected People Association (MAAPA), and Kopili Area Mining Affected People Association (KAMAPA) led by Indian National Congress, Assam Pradesh Congress committee submitted a memorandum to the Governor of Assam, Lakshman Acharya urging immediate cancellation of 1270-hectare new mining project proposed by the Directorate of Geology and Mining, Government of Assam, at Borolokhindong and New Umrongso village (70 hectares).

They also raised concerns against the Garampani coal mine project measuring 109-hectare Borolokhindong area of Dima Hasao District, Assam and the cancellation of the Mahabal Cement Private Limited Factory covering an area of 2000 bighas, comprising the villages of Nobodi Longkukro and Chotolarpheng.

These projects pose significant environmental and social risks to the affected communities, including Umrongso, Boro Lokhindong, Choto Lokhindong, Tharvelangso, Sikilangso, Chekso, Borolobang, Choto Lobang, Wokha Nepali Basti, Nobodi Longkukro, and Chotolarpheng. Time's up for **Justin Trudeau**

anadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau is teetering from crisis to crisis. He survived a second no-confidence motion on October 1, the second in two days, and on October 25, Trudeau faced an internal challenge from his party MPs, 24 of whom have asked him to resign by October 28. Trudeau runs a minority Liberal Party government and his government is being rocked time and again by the opposition Conservatives, which wants to force a federal election. The first no-confidence motion failed after the Conservatives ran afoul of the required number. Their leader Pierre Poilievre couldn't get the backing of the rest of the opposition

Poilievre tabled his second no-confidence motion the day after, accusing Trudeau of failing Canadians on affordable housing, the cost of living, and crime-related issues. NDP leader Jagmeet Singh refused to support the Conservative motion. Trudeau has been facing growing pressure to resign after nine years at the helm. Without doubt, Trudeau is a drag on the fortunes of the Canadian Liberal Party. The Liberal Party has been lagging the Conservatives by wide margins in opinion surveys for months. Earlier this year, the Canadian Liberal party lost two by-elections, one in Toronto, and the other in Montreal, both of which were Liberal Party strongholds for years. But for Jagmeet Singh's NDP, Trudeau wouldn't have lived

The NDP has been helping the Liberal party to stay in power since 2021, when Canada held its last federal election. But in September of this year, Jagmeet Singh accused the Liberal Party of being "too weak" to govern. Justin Trudeau is a victim of his own party MPs, 24 of whom have set a deadline for him to throw in the

Trudeau's crisis is of his own making. The internal political challenge to his rule was on the anvil for months and it didn't matter how much Trudeau attempted to paper over the unhappiness in the Liberal Party over his leadership, Justin was bound to be told his time was up. Trudeau was in the closed-door meeting which saw the 24 MPs sign a letter asking Trudeau to resign. The reasons cited included dissatisfaction with his leadership and the Liberal Party's poor showing in recently held elections. No, Trudeau doesn't have to leave tomorrow or the day after. He has the option to show the middle finger to the '24'. There is no immediate danger of ouster. But the closed door meeting is significant for its reminder that Justin's fate lies in the balance. At the end of the day, Trudeau cannot avoid a confrontation. The meeting challenged Justin's poor leadership and the challenge came a year short of the next election, which has to be held by October of 2025.

That means Trudeau has less than a year to turn the ship around and berth in safe harbour. Is Justin capable of showing leadership where it has been missing? The 24 MPs have no confidence in Trudeau. But Justin was all smiles when the meeting ended, saying the "Liberal Party is strong and united" and that he will be leading the party even after the October 2025 election. His elation didn't reflect on the faces of the rest of the Liberal Party.

What happened in the meeting was that the MPs told the Prime Minister the truth and the ground rules from hereon, whether Justin liked it or not. Even Justin's close allies within the Liberal Party didn't seem to be touched by Justin's optimism. For all one cared, Justin Trudeau could have been speaking to himself about himself!

Toxic colleagues and employees mental health in workplace

TT Torkplace come from various backgrounds, and among them difficult personalities are common. Toxic coworkers can be found at any level within an organization and are not limited to any gender. They often create unexpected conflicts, and we frequently find ourselves unsure of how to handle them.

Yet, when relationships with colleagues become strained or toxic, it can turn into a major source of stress and anxiety, undermining professional fulfilment. Toxic colleagues can create a hostile environment that deeply affects mental health, impacting our mood, self-esteem, and overall well-being. Recognizing these negative effects and finding ways to handle them is important for keeping a healthy work environment. We go to workplace with a fresh mind in the morning to deliver our best but unfortunately ended up with frustration due to continuous disturbance or trolls

from co-worker. Toxic colleagues can do anything to pull down others, planting office politics, bullies who use intimidation, gossips who spread rumours, manipulators who exploit others, and pessimists who always says no spread negativity among team. These behaviours not only disrupt the team but also disrupts the whole workplace, creating stress and tension that can lead to serious mental health issues.

Regular occurrence of these activities leads to increased stress and anxiety. Constant exposure to negativity—whether through bullying, manipulation, or criticism—keeps employees on edge. This stress can manifest physically as well as mentally to extreme level. A toxic colleague is like that rotten potato that spoils the whole bag, spreading negativity and dysfunction throughout the team.

Not talking to them unless it is too urgent, is good for own mental

Seeking support is also crucial. Talking to trusted colleagues, friends, or family can provide relief and ways to overcome it. If the situation is severe, consider seeking help from a professional to cope with stress. Documenting negative interactions, including dates and details, can be helpful if it is needed to take the issue to higher authority. This record can serve as evidence and highlight patterns that may require intervention. Focusing on self-care is essential in managing stress from toxic colleagues.

If a colleague's behaviour is affecting work and well-being, it's important to address it. It can be tried by having a direct conversation with them, if possible, escalate the issue to the higher authority. Every organization usually have policies for handling conflicts, and concerns are taken seriously. If things don't improve and mental health continues to suffer, consider other options like seeking a transfer or looking for a new job. Modi-Xi talks at BRICS Summit in Kazan signal a breakthrough in bilateral relations

The one-hour meeting between the Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the Chinese President Xi Jinping on October 23 on the side lines of the BRICS summit at Kazan, has signalled a breakthrough in the bilateral relations between the two largest nations of Asia and the world. What was of significance of the latest meeting was the cordial optics and the mood of the two leaders who gave definite indications of going ahead with the task of restoring normal relations based on cooperation and competition.

The stage was set with the agreement on the disengagement of the troops of both sides on the controversial Galwan area. This was a matter of satisfaction for the Indian side, but the more important was the desire to go ahead with the discussions on the border issue on which an understanding was reached. India's National Security Adviser Ajit Doval will be meeting soon his Chinese counterpart to broach the issue in its totality

The border dispute issue has been the bane of bilateral relations between India and China since 1959; it led into a full scale war in 1962, and then in the last six decades few clashes took place including the bloody one at Galwan in 2020. But the real issue of the conflict between India and China is related to the changing perception about India' foreign policy amongst the Chinese political leadership. Once this perception changes and becomes favourable, the developments will follow in positive direction in the bilateral relationship between the two neighbours.

If we begin from the first years of the India-China relationship in 1950's, the first phase was the era of Hindi-Chini Bhai Bhai in 1954 and afterwards; then suddenly Mao Zhe Dong called Jawaharlal Nehru as an ally of imperialists in 1960's, wanted to teach India a lesson and 1962 followed. During this Mao period, China took anti-India position, and even in 1971 India-Pakistan war, took a proPak stand, without getting in volved in the war. Mao died in 1976 and after Deng Xiao Ping's takeover; it was a period of only pursuit of growth and development in China. The India issue went into the background. The border dispute remained in the same state, excepting few occasional small skirmishes till Galwan clashes in 2020.

In the last ten years since Narendra Modi took over in 2014 as the Prime Minister of the BJPled government, there has been a perceptible shift in the India's foreign policy. India has distanced itself from the developing countries, including not taking part actively in the SCO and the BRICS, and becoming a part of the four-member QUAD, which China thinks as the security bloc led by the USA to confront China in Asia-Pacific. This latest perception about India becoming more and more getting aligned with US interests has

c l o u d e d DEGREE OF THOUGHT China's understanding.

There is another factor. Despite being a nation led by the Communist Party, the Chinese in general have a deep nationalistic pride. Now after emerging as the second largest economy in the world and by surpassing the USA in some key areas of technology, Chinese leadership wants to reshape the Global South away from narrow US interests. Now India and China nearly match in population, though Indian GDP and the per capita income is far less compared to China. China does not take

India as a peer competitor. While

economists talk of the 21st cen-

tury as an Asian century led by

China and India, Chinese leaders

term the 21st century as effec-

tively China's century. But there is a catch. Despite all the high GDP and per capital income growth by China compared to India, Chinese leaders are aware that India is growing fast, despite its inequality on the basis of a vibrant democracy. The elections are like carnivals for the In-

dian citizens including the poorest. This is an issue which keeps the leadership uneasy when they compare India with China.

President Xi Jinping is a product of Deng Xiao Ping period. He along with his politburo colleagues have considered a number of times some measures for democratisation of the Chinese society in the last twelve years he is at the helm as the general secretary of the Chinese

Communist Party, but finally, nothing could be done.

On the other hand, India is racing fast to emerge as the third largest economy after the US and China by certainly 2030, if not by 2027. China cannot ignore this competitor with the advantage of more demographic dividend and the sharing of the same history of ancient civilisation that is more than five thousand years old.

At a personal level, Xi Jinping and Narendra Modi are of same generation. Modi was born in 1950 three years after the Indian independence and Xi Jinping in 1953, four years after China's communist takeover took place on October 1, 1949. Both are techsavvy. Xi Jinping's daughter Xi Mingze, now 32, studied at Harvard University from 2010 to 2014.Xi gets information about the new generation through her. He follows each and every development in USA in high-tech sector including the semiconductor chips, and guides the Chinese technologists and scientists to modern mind. Similarly despite his Hindutva obsessions, Narendra Modi is tech-friendly, and has also a mind of quick adaptation as far as technology is concerned. Both these modern minds can

After the Kazan meet, as a follow-up, while the Doval-Wang boundary talks are very important, measures should also be taken to bring in FDI investment in areas required by India. The Indian government can certainly look at security aspects but there are a large number of areas where the Chinese investment can be sought without attracting security concerns. This step is needed since FDI inflows to India has dwindled in the last two years and one of the reasons is India has failed to allow global chain system of China in the country which would have led to investment by more foreign companies.

For India, growing tension between India-China limited the scope for foreign investors in China to diversify to India under China+1 strategy. Investment by USA is a case in point. USA was the second biggest foreign investor in India in 2020-21. It was US\$ 13,823 million. It plunged to US \$ 4998 million in 2023-24 – a drop by over 63 percent.

In contrast, USA investment in ASEAN surged by over 112 percent in 2023 over 2021, presumably, this demonstrates that US investors in China preferred to shift to ASEAN than in India under China+1 strategy. This is high time; India takes advantage eign inflows into India.

BRICS meet discussed the issue of de-dollarization and how the process is moving.. BRICS members including China also know that this is a long process, but it has to continue. Significantly, Prime Minister Modi said that he was in favour of an alternative payment system for the BRICS members. This is a major support to de-dollarization and this has been highly welcomed by both China and Russia.

Xi Jinping's assertion for more communication and cooperation between the two countries was notable in the present era of bilateral relations. China's top leaders generally tell politically correct remarks in public but that is not always followed by actions. This time when the year is ending, Chinese President has a chance to implement in action what he said at Kazan at the BRICS meeting. As regards Narendra Modi, he has to prove that he can really exercise strategic autonomy vis-a-vis USA as the upcoming third largest economy of the world. USA needs India more than India needs USA in view of India's burgeoning domestic market.

A follow-up of the positive signals from the BRICS summit at Kazan can be carried forward by the Indian Prime Minister at the G-20 summit in Brazil in the third week of November this year. India has to take the lead in ventilating the grievances of the Global South, along with Brazil and Mexico who are best examples of following strong independent foreign policy, keeping good relations with both USA and China on their terms.

By distancing itself from QUAD and refusing to be a part of USA's anti-China Asia-Pacific strategy in a calibrated manner, India can emerge as the leader of Global South by restoring its old position. That may lead to a better era in India-China relations and ensure peace and stability in Asia-Pacific also. For Narendra Modi, that is a big challenge. Will he be daring to accept it in the weeks

RSS at 100: A century of influence and cultural stewardship

s the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) steps into its centenary year, it A (RSS) steps into its content. grassroots mobilization and cultural preservation. Established in 1925, the RSS has emerged as the largest non-governmental organization in the world, maintaining a significant influence over India's social, cultural, and even political landscapes. This is achieved through its unique approach, blending tradition with contemporary relevance, while deftly navigating challenges and controversies. As it approaches its 100th year, the RSS remains a subject of both admiration and criticism, a force that has fundamentally impacted the contours of Indian society.

A legacy forged in tradition: The founding of the RSS

The RSS was founded by Dr. Keshav Baliram Hedgewar on the auspicious occasion of Vijayadashami in 1925. Initially conceptualized during a small seminar at Hedgewar's home in Nagpur, the early meetings involved figures like Vishwanath Kelkar, Bhauji Kavre, Anna Sahne, Balaii Huddar, and Bapurao Bhedi. It was not until April 17, 1926, that the organisation received its present

This model has resonated with millions, appealing to a broad spectrum of Indian society with its focus on holistic development. For the RSS, a healthy, morally upright, and dedicated volunteer is the bedrock of nation-building.

Navigating a turbulent history: Chal-

lenges and resilience The history of the RSS is marked by significant challenges, often in the form of outright bans and political opposition. It faced its first major crisis in 1948 following the assassination of Mahatma Gandhi, when the government imposed a ban due to suspicions about the organisation's involvement. This ban, however, was lifted unconditionally after the RSS distanced itself from the event and pledged to remain non-political. The second ban occurred during the Emergency in 1975, declared by then-Prime Minister Indira Gandhi, which saw many RSS leaders arrested for their opposition to the suspension

of civil liberties. This period, marked by political repression, only galvanized the RSS further, and when the Emergency was lifted in 1977, the RSS returned with greater influ-

This focus on cultural revivalism is seen as a bulwark against what the RSS perceives as the erosion of traditional values due to Western influences.

In its 100 years, the RSS has positioned itself as a guardian of India's diverse cultural heritage. Through initiatives aimed at reviving traditional crafts, indigenous agricultural practices, and local art forms, the Sangh seeks to reinforce a sense of pride in India's ancient civilization. This emphasis on cultural preservation, while appealing to many, has also been a point of contention, as critics argue it sometimes aligns with exclusionary interpretations of Indian history and identity. The political dimension: Influence with-

out direct involvement

One of the most debated aspects of the RSS is its connection to Indian politics. While the organisation officially claims to be non-political, its deep association with the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) is widely acknowledged. Many of India's leading political figures, including Prime Minister Narendra Modi, began their careers within the RSS. This connection has fueled the perception that the RSS is a powerful political force operating from behind the scenes, shaping India's policies and governance.

The RSS's political influence, however, is nuanced. It does not directly contest elections but often plays a pivotal role in guiding the ideological direction of its affiliated political entities. This influence has been a doubleedged sword - contributing to the RSS's rapid growth and prominence but also attracting accusations of fostering a divisive agenda. The organisation's role in promoting Hindutva, a concept of Hindu nationalism, has been both praised as a force for unification and criticized for its potential to alienate religious minorities.

A global presence: Reaching beyond India's borders

Over the past century, the RSS's reach has extended far beyond India's borders. It now has a presence in over 40 countries, focusing on uniting the Indian diaspora and fostering a connection to Indian culture abroad. These overseas branches often emphasize Indian traditions, yoga, language, and spiritual values, reinforcing a sense of identity among ex-

patriate communities. This global expansion underscores the RSS's ambition to act as a cultural bridge, connecting the Indian diaspora to their heritage while promoting a positive image of India internationally.

This international outreach has found mixed reception. While many diaspora communities welcome the sense of belonging and cultural continuity the RSS provides, some remain cautious of the organisation's political undertones. Nonetheless, the Sangh's global influence continues to grow, contributing to a sense of Indian soft power on the world stage

No grand celebrations: Humility over hubris

The RSS's decision not to hold grand celebrations for its centenary year is a conscious choice that aligns with its philosophy of humility and understated service. Dr. Mohan Bhagwat, the current Sarsanghchalak, has reiterated that achievements should not be a cause for boasting but an opportunity for introspection and continued reform. This is a marked contrast to the centenary celebrations of many political and social organisations, which often feature large public events and

media fanfare. Instead, the RSS has chosen to set ambitious goals for the future. It plans to increase its presence in every administrative block across the country and boost the number of daily Shakhas to 100,000. This strategic focus underscores the RSS's belief in steady, grassroots expansion rather than grandiose displays of power or influence. The organisation's leaders emphasize the importance of building a nation rooted in service, cultural pride, and unity—principles that have guided the Sangh since its inception.

The path forward: Challenges and prospects

As the RSS steps into its second century, it faces a complex landscape marked by globalization, technological advancement, and evolving social dynamics. It must navigate these changes while remaining true to its core philosophy of service, cultural preservation, and nation-building. Critics argue that the organisation needs to modernize and adopt a more inclusive approach, especially in a diverse and pluralistic society like India. Supporters, however, maintain that the RSS's adherence to traditional values will remain its greatest strength, serving as a moral compass in a rapidly changing world.

The RSS's future success will depend on its ability to balance tradition with modernity, ideology with pragmatism, and nationalism with inclusivity. Whether one views it as a steadfast protector of India's cultural heritage or a political juggernaut with a controversial past, the RSS's role in shaping India's destiny is indisputable. As it embarks on its next century, the organisation continues to evolve, adapt, and expand, determined to remain a key player in the narrative of Indian society. The story of the RSS is not merely about its past achievements; it is about its ongoing journey to influence the future of India, while adhering to the values it has championed for a century. Israeli strikes kill 38 people in Gaza's Khan Younis and 3 journalists in southern Lebanon

BEIRUT, Oct 25: Israeli strikes killed 38 people in Gaza and three journalists in Lebanon on Friday as growing worries about supply shortages in Gaza and international pressure for a cease-fire

The deaths reported by Gaza health officials were the latest in the southern Gaza city of Khan Younis, where people have in recent days lined up for bread outside the city's only bakery in operation. They come a day after United States Secretary of State Antony Blinken said that Israel had accomplished its objective of "effectively dismantling" Hamas and implored both sides to revive negotiations

Also on Friday, an Israeli airstrike on a compound housing journalists in southeast Lebanon killed three media staffers. Outside of now-collapsed buildings rented by various media outlets, cars marked "PRESS" lay covered in dust and rubble after the strike, Associated Press photos showed.

The Israeli army did not issue a warning prior to the strike. Representatives of the news networks and Lebanese politicians accused Israel of war crimes and intentionally targeting journalists.

"These were just journalists that were sleeping in bed after long days of covering the conflict," said Imran Khan, a senior correspondent for Al Jazeera English who

The Beirut-based pan-Arab Al-Mayadeen TV said two of its staffers — camera operator Ghassan Najar and broadcast technician Mohammed Rida were among the journalists killed early on Friday. Al-Manar TV of Lebanon's Hezbollah group said its camera operator Wissam Qassim was also killed in the airstrike on the Hasbaya region.

Al-Mayadeen's director Ghassan bin Jiddo alleged that the Israeli strike on a compound housing journalists was intentional and directed at those covering elements of its military offensive. He vowed that the Beirut-based station would continue its work.

Lebanon's Information Minister Ziad Makary said the journalists were killed while broadcasting what he called Israel's crimes, and noted they were among a Al-Manar TV

Hamas-led militants stormed into southern Israel on Oct. 7, 2023, killing some 1,200 people, mostly civilians, and abducting another 250. Around 100 hostages are still inside Gaza, a third of whom are believed to be dead.

Israel's retaliatory offensive has killed over 42,000 Palestinians, according to Gaza's Health Ministry, which does not say how many were combatants but says women and children make up more than half the fatalities. The Israeli military says it has killed over 17,000 fighters, without providing evidence.

The Israeli campaign has since expanded to Lebanon, where Israel launched a ground invasion Oct. 1, after trading fire with the Hezbollah militant group for much of the past year.

Lebanese health officials reported another day of intense airstrikes and shelling Thursday, which they said killed 19 people over 24 hours and raised the overall Lebanese death toll to 2,593 since October 2023. (AP)

Trump says China's leader will bully Harris 'like a baby' as his allies try to infantilise her

WASHINGTON, Oct 25: Donald Trump said on Thursday that China's leader would handle Vice President Kamala Harris "like a baby" if she's elected to the White House, as the former president and his top allies increasingly have moved to infantilise the Democratic nominee.

"If somehow Kamala wins, she'd have to deal with Xi Jinping," conservative radio host Hugh Hewitt said of the Chinese president. "How would he handle her?"

Trump replied, "Like a baby." "He'd take all the candy away very quickly," Trump continued. "She wouldn't have any idea what happened. It would be like a grand chess

master playing a beginner." Trump has built his political career around

name-calling, inventing jeers for his opponents going back to his first run for president in when he slammed Republican primary rivals like "Low Energy" Jeb Bush, the former governor of Florida, and "Little" Marco Rubio, the Florida senator. The former president also has a long history of belittling women.

But Trump has unleashed a special array of personal — often condescending — attacks against Harris, from calling her "lazy" — a word long used to demean Black people in racist terms — to insisting she's a "stupid person" and asking whether she is "on drugs." He's also called Harris, the first woman of colour to lead a major-party ticket, "slow" and has accused her of having a "low IQ."

The latest line of attack, combining sexism and deeply personal jeers with referring to Harris as a child, comes with Election Day now barely a week off. His campaign did not immediately respond to a request for comment about the remarks.

The former president, who has escalated his already dark and inflammatory rhetoric in the race's final stretch, spoke at a rally later Thursday in Tempe, Arizona, where he criticised Harris' handling of immigration. He accused Harris of perpetrating "a wicked betrayal of America" and having "orchestrated the most egregious betrayal that any leader in American history has ever inflicted upon our people," even though crime is down.

During an evening event in Las Vegas, Trump compared Harris to "a vulture" in the way he characterised her approach to tax in-

"Even after Kamala wrecked your economy with inflation, she came after you with tip income, like sort of like a vulture would do," Trump said. "If she gets four more years, Kamala Harris will pick your pockets.

Harris has offered her own share of insults against Trump, calling

him "increasingly unhinged and unstable.' During a CNN town hall Wednesday she also called Trump a "fascist." She was set to join a rally Thursday night in the Atlanta suburbs with President Barack Obama and musician Springsteen.

In his Thursday morning interview with Hewitt, Trump said he watched Harris' town hall on CNN and described her as coming off "like a child, almost,"

"She's an empty vessel," Trump said. "But she's beautifully pushed around by a very smart, very powerful, very liberal, viciously liberal but very, very smart, powerful party called the Democrats." Some of Trump's allies have used similar attack lines. On Wednesday, former Fox News Channel host Tucker Carlson was warming up the crowd at a Trump rally in Georgia when he suggested that Trump was ready to punish the vice president.

"Dad is pissed," Carlson told the crowd. "And when dad gets home, you know what he says? You've been a bad girl. You've been a bad little girl, and you're getting a vigorous spank-

WELLINGTON, Oct 25: King Charles III told a summit of Commonwealth countries in Samoa on Friday that the past could not be changed as he indirectly acknowledged calls from some of Britain's former colonies for a reckoning over its role in the trans-Atlantic slave trade.

The British monarch told leaders in Apia that he understood "the most painful aspects of our past continue to resonate." But Charles stopped short of mentioning financial reparations that some leaders at the event have urged, and instead exhorted them to find the "right language" and an understanding of history "to guide us towards making the right choices in future where inequality exists.'

"None of us can change the past but we can commit with all our hearts to learning its lessons and to finding creative ways to right the inequalities that endure," said Charles, who is attending his first Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting, or CHOGM, as Britain's head of state.

His remarks at the summit's opening ceremony were an acknowledgement of the strength of feeling on the issue in countries that Britain once colonised.British Prime Minister Keir Starmer also struck an emollient tone, after earlier insisting that the meeting should avoid becoming mired in the past and "very, very long endless discussions about reparations.

Starmer said at the summit that it was important to acknowledge a "hard" shared history, and that he understood the "strength of feeling here and that there are some calls to face up to the harms and injustices of the past through reparatory justice."

Flanked by leaders from Uganda and Tanzania, Starmer said he wanted to work "together to make

sure the future is not in the shadow of the past," and promised to host a UK-Caribbean forum next year with leaders of the nations most impacted by slavery's legacy. Britain's handling of its involvement in the trans-Atlantic slave trade is seen by many observers as a litmus test for the Commonwealth's adaptation to a modern-day world. Other European nations and some British institutions have started to own up to their role in the trade.

"I think the time has come for this to be taken seriously," said Jacqueline McKenzie, a partner at London law firm Leigh Day. "Nobody expects people to pay every single penny for what happened. But I think there needs to be negotiations." Such a policy would be costly and divisive at home, McKenzie said.

The UK has never formally apologised for its zens were kidnapped and transported to plantations in the Caribbean and Americas over several centuries, enriching many individuals and companies. Studies estimate Britain would owe between hundreds of millions and trillions of dollars in compensation to descendants of slaves.

The Bahamas Prime Minister Philip Davis on Thursday said he wanted a "frank" discussion with Starmer about the matter and would seek mention of the reparations issue in the leaders' final statement at the event. All three candidates to be the next Commonwealth Secretary-General — from Gambia, Ghana and Lesotho — have endorsed policies of reparatory justice for slavery.

Starmer said Thursday in remarks to reporters that the matter would not be on the summit's agenda. But Commonwealth Secretary-General Patricia Scotland told The Associated Press in an interview that leaders "will speak about absolutely anything they want to speak about" at an all-day private meeting scheduled for Saturday.

King Charles said in Friday's speech that nothing would right inequality "more decisively than to champion the principle that our Commonwealth is one of genuine opportunity for all."

The monarch urged leaders to "choose within our Commonwealth family the language of community and respect, and reject the language of di-

The security personnel were killed when gunfight erupted following the attack on Thursday at the checkpost in the Daraban area of Dera Ismail Khan district, a police official said.

A contingent of troops rushed to the site immediately after the attack, the official said, adding that troops have launched a massive search operation to arrest the assailants. Ten security personnel have lost their lives in the attack, another official



The Pakistani government has repeatedly accused the TTP of operating from sanctuaries in Afghanistan.

There has been an uptick in the incidents of terrorism in Pakistan since the Taliban took over the government in Kabul in 2021, dashing hopes in Islamabad that a friendly government in Afghanistan would help to tackle militancy.

The TTP was set up as an umbrella group of several militant outfits in 2007. The Pakistani government has officially declared the banned organisation as "Fitna al-Khawarij", a reference to a group in earlier Islamic history which was involved in

"Even Justin Trudeau wants to close Canada's Borders," Donald Trump wrote Thursday on social media while arguing for tougher border measures in the US. Trudeau said Canada needs to sta-

bilise its population growth to allow

all levels of government to make necessary changes to health care, housing and social services so that it can accommodate more people in the future.

Iran's imprisoned Nobel Peace Prize laureate sentenced to another 6 months in prison

DUBAI, Oct 25: Iranian authorities have issued an additional six-month prison sentence against Nobel Peace Prize laureate Narges Mohammadi, a group campaigning for the activist

The Free Narges Coalition said in a statement on Thursday that Mohammadi was sentenced on October 19 to an additional six months in prison on the charge of "disobeying and resisting orders.

According to the statement, the charge was brought after Mohammadi staged a protest against the execution of another political prisoner in the women's ward of Evin Prison on August 6. Mohammadi is the 19th woman to win the Nobel Peace Prize and the second Iranian woman after human rights ac-

tivist Shirin Ebadi in 2003. Mohammadi, 52, has kept up

her activism despite numerous arrests by Iranian authorities and years behind bars.

She is being held at Iran's notorious Evin Prison, which houses political prisoners and those with Western ties. She already had been serving a 30month sentence, to which 15 more months were added in January. Iran's government has not acknowledged her additional

The latest order reflects the Iranian theocracy's anger that she was awarded the Nobel prize in October 2023 for years of activism despite a decades-long government campaign targeting her.

Mohammadi was a leading light for nationwomen-led protests sparked by the

death last year of a 22-year-old woman in police custody that have grown into one of the most intense challenges to Iran's theocratic government. That woman. Mahsa Amini, had been detained for allegedly not wearing her headscarf to the liking of authorities. The statement demanded Mohammadi's unconditional release, saying her health situation

has deteriorated drastically during her long incarceration and she is suffering from heart disease. (AP)

4 astronauts return to Earth after being delayed by Boeing's capsule trouble and Hurricane Milton

CAPE CANAVERAL, Oct 25: Four astronauts returned to Earth on Friday after a nearly eight-month space station stay extended by Boeing's capsule trouble and Hurricane Mil-

A SpaceX capsule carrying the crew parachuted before dawn into the Gulf of Mexico just off the Florida coast after undocking from the International Space Station mid-week.

The three Americans and one Russian should have been back two months ago. But their homecoming was stalled by problems with Boeing's new Starliner astronaut capsule, which came back empty in September because of safety concerns.

Then Hurricane Milton interfered, followed by another two weeks of high wind and rough SpaceX launched the four — NASA's

Matthew Dominick, Michael Barratt and Jeanette Epps, and Russia's Alexander Grebenkin — in March. Barratt, the only space veteran going into the mission, acknowledged the support teams back home that had "to re-



plan, retool and kind of redo everything right along with us ... and helped us to roll with all those punches.'

Their replacements are the two Starliner test pilots Butch Wilmore and Suni Williams, whose own mission went from eight days to eight months, and two astronauts launched by SpaceX four weeks ago. Those four will remain up there until February.

The space station is now back to its normal crew size of seven — four Americans and three Russians — after months of overflow.

Philippine police official says 33 people killed mostly in landslides set off by storm south of Manila

MANILA, Oct 25: A Philippine provincial police chief said Friday that 33 people were killed mostly in landslides set off by Tropical Storm Trami in a province south of

The deaths caused by landslides and flash floods in Batangas province brings to 65 the overall death toll from Trami, which blew away Friday from the northwestern Philippines, Batangas police chief Col Jacinto Malinao Jr said.

Eleven other villagers remain missing Malinao Jr. told The Associated Press by telephone from the lakeside town of Talisay, where he stood beside a villager whose wife and child were buried in the deep mound of mud, boulders and trees. With the use of a backhoe and shovels, police scrambled to search into 10 feet of mud, rocks and debris and found a part of a head and foot that apparently were those of the missing woman and child.

"He's simply devastated," Malinao said of the villager, whose wife and child were buried in the landslide that happened Thursday afternoon amid torrential rains.

"He's in shock and couldn't speak and we're only asking him to point to where their bedroom was located so we can dig in that part." (AP)

NEW DELHI, Oct 25: The DGlevel border talks between India and Bangladesh, scheduled to be held in Delhi next month, have been postponed following a change in plan by the neighbouring country, official sources said on

The bi-annual talks led by the heads of the Border Security Force (BSF) and its Bangladeshi counterpart the Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) were to be tentatively held between November 18 and 22 in the national capital, the first such meeting after the collapse of the Sheikh Hasina government on Au-

Sources told PTI that the Bangladeshi side informed about the postponement and indicated that they were working on "an early date" for the meeting to be

Overall, it will be the 55th edition of the Director General (DG)level talks between the two forces that also includes officials from the home and external affairs ministries, and anti-narcotics, Customs and some other federal agencies from both the countries that have a stake in border management.

The last edition of these talks were held in Dhaka in March.

The BSF guards a 4,096-kilometre-long international front with

Bangladesh on India's eastern side. The sources had earlier said the next meeting, whenever it took place, was expected to be held on the traditional issues and subjects related to "comprehensive" border management, curbing cross-border sharing real-time intelligence along the front.

An interim government led by 84-year-old Nobel laureate Muhammad Yunus is in charge of affairs in Bangladesh at present.

HYDERABAD, Oct 25: Telangana Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy on Friday accused the BJPled NDA government of discrimination against the southern states in the allotment of funds and developmental projects.

Attacking Prime Minister Narendra Modi, he asked what has the Centre done for the country and also alleged that the BJP raises emotional issues to win elections and tries to split other parties.

Taking a jibe, he said the NDA government's contribution was that it brought the three black farm laws, since repealed, and caused unemployment in the country.

You are trying to bring a southnorth division in the country. Whenever Congress was in power, whenever Congress leaders were prime ministers, there was a practice to give the President post to south India when a leader from the north is the prime minister," he said at an event organised by a media organisation. From Neelam Sanjiva Reddy to APJ Abdul Kalam, several leaders from the south became Presidents as per a "gentleman's agreement between north and south," he claimed. "But, you have refused to give anything to the south. You want our votes, our money. But, you are trying to give hatred in return," he said. The previous UPA regime under the leadership of Sonia Gandhi and Manmohan Singh took revolutionary decisions, including right to education act, right to information act, and food security act, he said.

He said the BJP and Modi are only focused on winning elections.

Eventually, they added, the patrolling status is expected to move back to pre-April 2020 level.



The agreement framework was first agreed upon at the diplomatic level and then military-level talks took place, the army sources said, adding the nitty-gritty of agreement was worked in Corps Commander-level talks.

Adhering to agreements between the two sides, Indian troops have begun to pull back equipment to rear locations in these areas.

CHANDIGARH, Oct 25: BJP leader Amarinder Singh on Friday lashed out at Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann over the "tardy" paddy procurement in the state, alleging the latter "turned his back on the farmers" facing hardships in

Visiting the grain market in Khanna where farmers are complaining of slow paddy purchase, the former Punjab chief minister hit out at the Mann-led AAP government and told reporters that the grain markets are bursting at the seams as paddy has not been lifted from the mandis

Claiming that the farmers never faced any problem in crop procurement when he was the chief minister, Singh, who was accompanied by BJP leader Fateh Jung Bajwa, said, "We always lifted paddy and wheat and never faced any problem. So why are they (AAP government) facing problems? I was a Congress chief minister when BJP was in power at the Centre.3

Replying to a query on lesser yield of the PR-126 variant sown in Punjab, Singh asked who told the farmers to sow this particular variety.

"It was the chief minister. But where is he now? He should have come here. When farmers are facing problems, he has turned his back on them," Singh said.

remarks during a public address in Maharajganj district adjoining Gorakhpur where he inaugurated 505 development projects totalling Rs 940 crore and unveiled the newly constructed office building of Nagar Panchayat Chowk Bazar. "Prime Minister Narendra Modi has set an ambitious target for

'Aatmnirbhar' and 'Viksit Bharat' by 2047, encouraging citizens to engage with both development and heritage. The government is working on a war footing to realise this goal, but there is also a unique role for local bodies, gram panchayats and the public to reflect on how they can contribute in building a developed India," Adityanath said.

"It is crucial for nagar panchayats and local bodies to connect with developmental areas that not only expand civic services but also open avenues for employment," he

which foundation stones were laid span critical sectors, including roads, education, vocational training, healthcare, support for stray cattle, vending zones for street vendors, drinking water facilities, tourism development, police services and fire brigades.

He further explained, "The second employment opportunity comes from the operation of public toilets, where the gram panchayats hire a woman caretaker, with her salary funded through user charges. The third role in villages is that of BC Sakhi, who facilitates banking transactions for villagers and earns honorarium and incentives. Currently, there are 42,000 BC Sakhis active across Uttar Pradesh."

A Self-Help Group (SHG) member who works on the field to do banking transactions using her laptop, desktop, mobile or tab is called a BC Sakhi.

Expanding on employment potential, the chief minister stated, 'The fourth job opportunity arises with the establishment of convention centres in villages. These centres will not only provide venues for events such as weddings but also create maintenance-related jobs for locals.'

The fifth employment opportunity, he mentioned, will be at the ration shops.

UDHAMPUR, Oct 25: The Unified Headquarters has discussed the spate of terrorist attacks in Jammu and Kashmir at a meeting in Srinagar and formulated a strategy, a senior army official said on Friday, highlighting the focus is on breaking the cycle of violence and dismantling the terror ecosystem.

While he refused to divulge details, Northern Army Commander Lieutenant General M V Suchindra Kumar did say, "The core of this strategy is to strengthen the relationship between citizens and soldiers while encouraging nationalist and mainstream narratives, particularly among youths."

The focus is on breaking the cycle of violence, dismantling the terror ecosystem, empowering the youth and women, facilitating education, promoting sports, and reviving the region's rich historical and cultural heritage, he said.

"I must assure you that situation is under control," the Army Commander told reporters here.

There has been a spike in terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir in recent days. Two soldiers and as many civilian porters engaged by the Army were killed in an attack on an army vehicle in Gulmarg on



Thursday.

This came five days after six non-local labourers and a local doctor were killed when terrorists fired indiscriminately upon them at the Z-Morh tunnel construction site in the Gagangir area of central Kashmir's Ganderbal district.

Before that, a labourer from Bihar was shot dead by terrorists in Shopian district on October 18. Earlier on Thursday, terrorists

shot at and injured a labourer from Uttar Pradesh, Shubam Kumar, in the Tral area of Pulwama district.

On security forces' ongoing response, Lieutenant General Kumar able to neutralise 720 ultras in Jammu and Kashmir over the past five years. "As far as residual terrorists are concerned, multiple agencies keep updating figures.

HC refuses early hearing on bail plea of Shifa-ur-Rehman



NEW DELHI, Oct 25: The Delhi High Court has dismissed a plea seeking an early hearing on the bail of Jamia alumni president Shifa-ur-Rehman in an Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA) case of

Delhi riots. In its order on October 21, a bench of Justices Navin Chawla and Shalinder Kaur, refused to grant the request but said "endeavour will be made" to hear it on the fixed date.

"Keeping in view the nature of this (cases) board, it is not possible to accede to this request. The appeal is already listed for hearing on November 25, 2024, when an endeavour will be made to hear the same...The application is, accordingly, dismissed," held the bench.

The high court had on October 7 listed the bail plea of Jamia Millia Islamia alumni president Rehman,

along with the similar applications by other co-accused in the case --Umar Khalid and Sharjeel Imam -on November 25 for hearing. Rehman moved court in June, 2022 challenging a trial court order that had refused to grant him bail fol-

to the Delhi police on June 3, 2022. The trial court had dismissed Rehman's bail plea on April 7, 2022, saying there were reasonable grounds to believe the accusation against him was "prima facie" true.

Exam for 111 posts in Rajasthan govt cancelled

JAIPUR, Oct 25: The Rajasthan Public Service Commission (RPSC) has cancelled a competitive examination for recruitment to 111 senior posts of the Local Self Government Department following breach of confidentiality during the conduct of the test.

In the Revenue Officer Grade II and Executive Officer Class-IV Competitive Examination, 2022 conducted by the Commission on May 14 last year, 1,96,483 candidates had appeared for 111 posts.

Of them, a total of 311 candidates were included after the exam in the list issued for eligibility check and document verification.

There were incidents of cheating at examination centres at Bikaner and three FIRs were registered there on the day of the examina-

"It is clear from the FIRs and their challan reports that cheating took place at the examination centres through ultra-modern electronic devices. Alia Bhatt slams online videos, clickbait articles claiming she had 'Botox gone wrong'

MUMBAI, Oct 25: Bollywood star Alia Bhatt on Friday strongly hit back at claims circulating in online videos and clickbait articles that she had a botched Botox proce-

The "Jigra" actor posted a lengthy statement on her Instagram Stories and said the rumours about her undergoing a cosmetic surgery are "beyond ridiculous" and "damaging". "Absolutely NO JUDGEMENT towards anyone who chooses cosmetic corrections or surgery-your body, your choice. But wow, this is beyond ridiculous! To the random video floating around literally claiming I've had Botox gone wrong (and to the numerous clickbait articles) - I have a 'crooked smile' and a 'weird way of speaking' according to YOU," she said.

"This is your hypercritical, microscopic judgment of a human face. And now you're confidently tossing around 'scientific' explanations, claiming I'm paralysed on one side? Are you kidding me?" she added.

Bhatt, 31, criticised that "serious claims" about her are being "casually thrown out there with zero proof, no confirmation, and absolutely nothing to back it up".

"What's worse, you're influencing young, impressionable minds who might actually believe this garbage. Why are you saying this? For clickbait? Attention? Because none of it makes sense," she added.

The actor said women are often judged through an "absurd lens" and are objectified on the internet for "our faces, bodies, personal lives, even our bumps".

"We should be celebrating individuality, not tearing it apart under a microscope. These types of judgments perpetuate unrealistic standards, making people feel like they're never 'enough' It's damaging, and it's exhausting," she added. What is even more saddening is that such kinds of judgement is perpetuated by women, Bhatt said.

"Whatever happened to 'live and let live'? To 'everyone has the right to their own choices'? Instead, we've become so accustomed to picking each other apart that it's almost normalised. "Meanwhile just another day of even thorougher entertainment with scripts made up by the Internet," she concluded the leased in theatres earlier statement.



GUWAHATI, Oct 25: Jamshedpur FC will look to continue their winning streak when they face a doughty NorthEast United FC in an away Indian Super League (ISL) match here on Saturday.

The Jamshedpur side is placed second on the table, having accumulated 12 points from five games, and the hosts have managed only five points from as many contests and are positioned

But beyond those contrasting

numbers, the Highlanders have remained unbeaten in their previous two fixtures against the Red Min-

Meanwhile, scoring a goal in this match will mark NEUFC's joint-longest goal-scoring streak against JFC, having done so earlier between January 2021 and February 2022.

But JFC have also been taking risks up front, as indicated by their passing accuracy of 57.1% in the opposition's half this season.

The number also proves that they have been creating chances in the final third, allowing them to score 10 goals until now.

Their possession rate of 36.2% is the lowest in this ISL, but it allows them to play fearless football by letting the opposition dominate with the ball before launching their counter-attack.

NorthEast head coach Juan Pedro Benali played down the talk that his team is under pressure after managing just one win in

their last five games. However, he stressed on the

need to improve their defence. "There is no pressure on us. But, we are hungry. I don't look at points, but I look at the goals scored against us. Two goals

Messi and Inter Miami will take on Atlanta United in an MLS Cup playoff opener

FORT LAUDERDALE (USA), Oct 25: Inter Miami's Lionel Messi played in only one Major League Soccer loss in 2024. It was in May, at home, against Atlanta

Messi makes his MLS playoff debut Friday night — at home, against Atlanta United.

Inter Miami, which set the MLS records for most points and best winning percentage in the regular season, gets a big challenge right out of the gate in the playoffs by facing an Atlanta team in a best-ofthree Eastern Conference firstround series. Messi is coming off a hat trick in the regular-season finale, a 6-2 romp past New England. And even though he missed nearly half the MLS season because of injury and commitments to Argentina's national team, Messi is still a serious contender for league MVP after 20 goals and 16 assists in 19 appearances.

"If I could vote for him, I would have voted for him." Inter Miami defender Julian Gressel said. "Yes, because for me, the MVP stands for the best player in the league. And Leo, is that, by far. You know, there's other people out there that have the definition of an MVP that maybe makes the team better or that a team can't live without. In a sense, to me, Leo is that, too."

MVP or not, Messi is obviously the key to Inter Miami's MLS Cup hopes. Friday night will be the first home playoff match in club history. If Inter Miami wins this series, it would stay home for the rest of the season — with home-field edge for the single-game conference semifinals, conference final and MLS Cup, provided it keeps

"This was always about creating history for Miami," said soccer icon David Beckham, part of Inter Miami's ownership group — and the person who originally announced plans to bring an MLS team back to Miami more than a decade ago. "This was always about our family, La Familia, the people in this stadium, the people in this city.

Messi's arrival midway through 2023 was the big step toward Inter Miami getting to the global stage. The team won the Leagues Cup last year shortly after Messi arrived, won the Supporters Shield this year as the best MLS regularseason team and now goes after the MLS playoff title.

There are some ties that bind these franchises. Among them: Inter Miami coach Gerardo "Tata" Martino was with Atlanta in 2018 when that team won the MLS Cup, and Gressel played for that Atlanta team as well.

Atlanta got to this series by beating Montreal in a wild-card match Tuesday. Its reward: Messi, again. "He's arguably the best player that's ever played," Atlanta United interim coach Rob Valentino said. "We've faced him a few times and we know obviously his qualities, but also at the same time, they have other players that are good, too. There has to be a focus on him — and his teammates around him.'

The stadium almost certainly will be sold out on Friday night and Miami has known for weeks that it would be opening the playoff march on its home field.

Divergent views on whether Aussie teenager Sam Konstas should be selected for India series

MELBOURNE, Oct 25: Former Australia Test opener Chris Rogers and current team paceman Josh Hazlewood differed on whether 19-year-old New South Wales opener Sam Konstas should be picked for the upcoming Border-Gavaskar Trophy against India with experience of only six first-class games.

Konstas has played six Sheffield Shield games with twin centuries against South Australia (152 and 105) grabbing the attention of Cricket Australia's selection committee head George Bailey, who has picked him in the Australia A side for the opening match of a two-game four-day first-class series against India A at Mckay later this month.

Along with Konstas, 32-yearold Marcus Harris, who has previous experience of playing against India, and Nathan McSweeney are in contention for a place in the Test squad.

"I know there's a lot of talk about Konstas," Rogers told SEN

"I would just ask the question is he going to help win us this series, he's going to make that much of a difference, I would just leave it for this summer just because going and facing India could set you back a little bit," Rogers added.

The senior Indian team is due to tour Australia for a five-match Test series starting November 22 in Perth. Since Konstas has only played six games scoring 457 runs, Rogers feels that there is still some time before he is thrown into the deep end of the pool. "And there's no rush, he's only 19, there's going to be a big future for

Rabiot could punish his detractors when Marseille faces PSG in French league

PARIS, Oct 25: Marseille's Adrien Rabiot could come back to haunt his Paris Saint-Germain detractors on Sunday when the clubs meet in the French league.

The midfielder won five league les with PSG and made ove 200 appearances. For supporters of both clubs, joining the other team is the ultimate soccer betrayal.

Going to Marseille was bad enough, but Rabiot's popularity among PSG fans had long-since diminished. When he was still at the club, Rabiot was roundly jeered by PSG fans during a Champions League game against Liverpool amid frustrations over agonizingly long contract talks.

His mother and agent Veronique Rabiot said after that match in 2018 that there was "no way back" for him at PSG, where he came through the club's youth academy and was once a firm favorite among fans.

He eventually left to join Juventus, helping the Italian giant win the Serie A title in 2020 and two Italian Cups. A robust defensive midfielder with good technique and excellent ball distribution, Rabiot became an integral part of France's midfield along the way, scoring at the 2022 World Cup.

Given his high profile, his relatively young age of 29, and his vast experience, it was some coup when Marseille signed him in the offseason on a free transfer when he had the option of joining much bigger clubs

During last Sunday's 5-0 win at Montpellier, he linked up well with fellow midfielders Amine Harit and Pierre-Emile Höjbjerg. With four seasons in the Premier League with Tottenham and 85 caps for Denmark, the 29-year-old Höjbjerg is another strong signing by coach Roberto De Zerbi.

Consistency vital for India to cross semifinal hurdle in big hockey events: German great Furste

NEW DELHI, Oct 25: Being here that saw both teams wina two-time Olympic goldmedallist, former German hockey captain Moritz Furste knows a thing or two about consistency and he feels the ability to deliver even performances in a series of games is the "little missing piece" in India's admirable resurgence in the last one decade.

The Indian men's hockey team was nowhere close to the top sides of the world 15 years back but it made significant strides to win back-to-back Olympic bronze medals in Tokyo and and Paris.

The Indians are currently placed fifth in the world rankings and are seen as capable to upstage any top side in the world. "I think 15 years ago India was far away from the top-five nations, really far away but that changed to India now being one of the 6 teams competing for medals in any tournament," Furste told PTI in an interview on the sidelines of the two-match Test series between India and Germany

"I feel there is still one little piece missing and that's making the final and really play for the gold medal. That's usually consistency, the Indians still really struggle to have seven games at the same level. David Warner's leadership ban has been lifted by Cricket Australia



SYDNEY, Oct 25: David Warner's lifetime captaincy and leadership ban has been lifted by Cricket Australia, a move which could see the retired test player captain the Sydney Thunder in the Twenty20 Big Bash league this

Warner received the penalty for his role in the 2018 sandpaper scandal in South Africa, on top of a one-year ban from cricket, which was also imposed on Steve Smith with a lesser playing suspension given to Cameron Bancroft, who was caught on film rubbing and scuffing the ball with yellow sandpaper at a test match in Cape

But the leadership sanction was lifted Friday by an independent three-member review panel who deemed the opener had met the necessary criteria.

Warner appeared before the independent panel content earlier this month. It ruled that he met the criteria to be considered for future leadership roles

"The respectful and contrite tone of his (Warner's) responses, as well as the content impressed the Review Panel and led it to the unanimous view that he was sincere and genuine in acknowledging responsibility for the conduct and in his statement that he had extreme remorse for his conduct," the panel said in a statement Friday.

"Mr. Warner's conduct and behavior since the imposition of the sanction has been excellent and he appears to have made a substantial change, one example of which is that he no longer sledges or tries to provoke the opposing team.'

Warner played his final test match in January against Pakistan, an Australian win. He has also said he will no longer play one-day internationals, only the T20 format of the game.

The move could also be considered an early birthday present from Cricket Australia — Warner turns 38 on Sunday. (AP)

fourth quarter as they missed a chance in the 46th minute. New Zealand, on the other hand, came up with brilliant counter attacks in the following minutes but Indian defence held sway.

With 90 seconds left on the clock, India found a golden opportunity to equalise when they earned a PC.

Giving up on Test dream would be doing injustice to my younger self: Glenn Maxwell second day of India-New Zealand Test

NEW DELHI, Oct 25: Australia's white-ball star Glenn Maxwell may not have donned the Baggy Green for seven years, but the 36-year-old believes he would be doing "injustice" to his younger self by giving up his Test cricket dream, which still burns brightly within him.

From overcoming a broken leg to scoring Australia's fastest double century with his 201 in the lead-up to their 2023 World Cup triumph, Maxwell has enjoyed remarkable highs in his career.

However, his Test appearances remain limited to just seven matches, with his last outing during Australia's 2017 tour of Bangladesh.

"I think if I gave up on that Test dream now, I don't think I'd be doing justice to that younger Glenn Maxwell who was dying to put on the baggy green when he was a kid," he tells ESPNcricinfo. "And I think while there's still a glimmer of hope, I'll keep going

Though his selection for the upcoming India series is unlikely, Maxwell remains committed to chasing a Test spot on the Sri Lanka tour in January after nar-



rowly missing out in 2022.

"I think the hard thing with Test cricket is, when I grew up, that's all I wanted to do," Maxwell says. "I definitely got my chance at Test level a bit prematurely. It all happened really fast when I got my chance to debut. It was just a whirlwind. I had no idea what I was doing. I probably hadn't had the experience at first-class level that I would have liked.

"And then when I came back in 2017, I felt like I was a readymade first-class cricketer and was really at peace with my game and

Australia's selectors have eased requirements for Shield cricket in preparing for Sri Lankan Tests, encouraging Maxwell's quiet redball return with Victoria's second XI. Managing a leg injury, Maxwell feels ready to adapt quickly to red-ball batting if picked for the Sri Lanka tour.

"The interesting thing about last week, even just playing the second XI game, was having a few technical changes and working through them, having a few different sets of eyes looking at your batting, and just trying to work your way through that has been really enjoyable," he says.

"I remember in 2022 (in Sri Lanka) the first couple of net sessions that I had working through all those cracks, and working through your different techniques of facing spin that's exploding, was so enjoyable. And it doesn't take long when you're really experienced in those conditions to work out a way to play over there.

"It's probably what makes Cameron Green's success over there so extraordinary, the fact that it's the first time he's played Test cricket over there in those conditions, and he was so successful and strong-minded in the way he was going to go about it. It takes a strong mind to have success over there. I'd just love to be over
