Six employees of Dipankar's company quizzed by CBI

GUWAHATI, Nov 1: Assam Police and the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) questioned at least six workers of DB Stock Limited, a major suspect in the online trading scam run by Dipankar Barman, on Friday in Guwahati.

Barman hired about 15 employees for his contentious business, DB Stock Limited, where he allegedly embezzled crores of public funds by enticing ordinary citizens to invest in trading under the false pretense of earning significantly larger returns than

Six DB Stock employees—Nitumani Choudhury, Jintumani Kalita, Puja Patel, Sujit Das, Biswajit Barman, and Mahesh Rajja—were contacted by the police.

Both the CBI team and the Assam Police have questioned them. It has been learned that the central probe agency confiscated the mobile phones of the six persons who were subject to interrogation.

Earlier, on Thursday, Dipankar Barman faced marathon interrogation by a team of Assam Police officials in Guwahati; however, according to sources, he has hidden a lot of information regarding the scam.

The accused also tried to evade some key questions regarding the scam by the investigation team.

As per a highly placed source, there was sharp contrast between the statements of Barman and his girlfriend who is also under police custody for her alleged involvement in the trading scam.

Police arrested a Chartered Accountant (CA) who had worked for Burman and the investigation team found a difference between his and Dipankar Barman's statement as well. A senior police official said that the Hawla transaction was involved in this huge scam and the CA accepted this fact during the interrogation. But, according to sources, Barman denied involvement of Hawala in his business which allegedly looted crores of money from general people on the pretext of giving them much higher returns against their investment. Barman was arrested four days ago from a homestay in Goa and he was brought to Guwahati on Tuesday. (CONTD. ON PAGE-2)

GUWAHATI, Nov 1: Two persons were killed in a head-on collision between two vehicles in Guwahati on Friday, police said.

Two persons were also injured in the collision that took place early in the day on GS Road in the Khanapara area when one of the two SUVs was making a U-turn and the other was coming from the opposite direction, a senior officer

"The accident occurred when an SUV with white colour coming from Six Mile side was making a U-turn at the Assam Rifle Transit Camp point and a black Sports Utility Vehicle (SUV) was coming from the opposite direction," the police officer told PTI.

The vehicle coming from Khanapara was at a very high speed and the impact of the collision was so huge that the black SUV climbed up to the footover bridge and then fell on the road, he added. The black SUV broke the iron railing of the structure and damaged the footover bridge, and it got mangled after the accident, the officer said. The occupants in the black SUV probably came from a nearby bar as entry bands were seen tied on their hands, he said.



Two youths in the black-coloured vehicle were declared dead, Gauhati Medical College and Hospital Superintendent Abhijit Sarma said. The deceased persons have been identified as Deepat Dey (22) and Konamika Narjaree (19), Sarma said.


Adani reduces power supply to Bangladesh by half: Report

GUWAHATI, Nov 1: India's Adani Power Jharkhand Limited (APJL), a wholly-owned subsidiary of Adani Power, has stopped half of its power supply to Bangladesh because of outstanding bills of USD 846 million, according to a local

media report on Friday.

from Power Bangladesh PLC showed the Adani plant reduced supply on Thursday night, The Daily Star newspaper said. Bangladesh reported a shortfall of more than 1,600 megawatts (MW) on the intervening night of Thursday and Friday as the 1,496 MW plant is now producing 700 MW from a single unit, the newspaper reported.

Earlier, the Adani company wrote to the power secretary asking the Bangladesh Power Development Board (PDB) to clear its outstanding



dues by October 30.

The letter, dated October 27, said that if the bills are not paid, the company shall be constrained to take remedial action under the Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) by suspending the power supply on October 31. The company said that the PDB has neither provided a letter of credit (LC) for an amount of USD 170.03 million from Bangladesh Krishi Bank nor cleared the outstanding

The newspaper quoted a PDB official as saying that they had earlier cleared a portion of previous dues, but since July, Adani has been charging more than the previous months. He said the PDB has been paying around USD 18 million weekly, while the charge is more than USD 22 million.

"This is why the due payments increased again," he said, adding that they had submitted last week's payment to Krishi Bank as well, but due to a dollar shortage, the bank failed to open a letter of credit against the payment.

About the additional payment, he said, when the PDB raised a question on the coal pricing in February last year, they signed a supplementary deal that obliged Adani to quote coal prices less than the rates charged by the other coal-fired power plants.

Economist Bibek Debroy dies

NEW DELHI, Nov 1: Bibek Debroy, a key economic adviser to the Prime Minister whose prolific work included economic theory, income inequality, and infrastructure financing, died on Friday. He

Debroy, who had a history of diabetes, hypertension, and a blockage in the heart for which he had a pacemaker, was admitted to the AIIMS emergency late on October 31 and died around 7 am on Friday.

"He was admitted with subacute intestinal obstruction. He also suffered from hypertension and diabetes mellitus," an official source at AIIMS, Delhi said.

An empirical economist and a Padma Shri awardee, Debroy was the chairman of the Prime Minister's Economic Advisory Council since September 2017.

A columnist to several newspapers, he had four days before his death sent a piece to The Indian Express newspaper, with a note: "Unusual Column. Short of a requiem", according to the daily.

In the article, which was not published yet, he wrote about life after coming out of the cardiac care centre (CCU) at AIIMS nearly a month ago.

"There is a world outside that exists. What if I am not there?

What indeed?" he wrote according to the article posted by the newspaper on its website on Friday.

"A few condolences, perhaps even from important people. 'Irreparable loss'. Perhaps a posthumous Padma Bhushan or Padma Vibhushan. A few obituaries," he wrote. A prolific writer, Debroy authored and edited several books, including translations of the Puranas, the four Vedas, and 11 major Upanishads. Educated in Ramakrishna Mission School, Narendrapur and Kolkata's Presidency College, he went to the Delhi School of Economics and Trinity College, Cambridge.

He worked on trade issues in the 1980s and law reform in the following decade. He was also a full-time member of NITI Aayog from its

India commits to 30% protected areas in updated biodiversity plan

NEW DELHI, Nov 1: India has launched its updated biodiversity action plan with a goal to protect at least 30 per cent of its terrestrial, inland water, and coastal and marine areas by 2030, in line with global biodiversity targets.

The updated National Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan (NBSAP), unveiled at the 16th UN Biodiversity Conference in Cali, Colombia, outlines 23 national targets aligned with the 23 global goals set under the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework (KM-GBF), which was adopted at the 15th UN Biodiversity Conference in Canada in 2022.

A key goal of the KM-GBF is to protect at least 30 per cent of the world's land and ocean areas by 2030. It also aims to restore de-

Global climate finance reached USD 1.5 tn in 2022, must rise fivefold by 2030: Report

The "Global Landscape of Climate Finance 2024: Insights for COP29" report, published by global think tank Climate Policy Initiative (CPI), said climate finance currently represents only 1 per cent of global GDP, far short of the required level. Emerging markets and developing economies (EMDEs) may need around 6.5 per cent of their GDP by 2030 to meet climate goals.

"While global climate finance has made some strides, a much more ambitious, cohesive, and effective approach is essential to address the vast funding gap," said Barbara Buchner, CPI"s Global Managing Director.

"The data from CPI's Global Landscape report leaves no doubt that investment needs to scale across all fronts -- domestically, internationally, and across sectors -to reach our mutual climate goals. COP29 is an opportunity to establish clear, collaborative commit-

ATF price hiked 3 pc, commercial LPG up ₹62 per cylinder

NEW DELHI, Nov 1: Jet fuel, or ATF, price on Friday was hiked by 3.3 per cent and rate of commercial LPG used in hotels and restaurants increased by Rs 62 per 19-kg cylinder in the monthly revision done in line with international oil price trends. The aviation turbine fuel (ATF) price was increased by ₹ 2,941.5 per kilolitre, or 3.3 per cent, to ₹ 90,538.72 per kl in the national capital, according to stateowned fuel retailers.

The hike comes after two rounds of reduction that had taken the rates to their lowest this year.

ATF price on October 1 was cut by 6.3 per cent (₹ 5,883 per kl) and by ₹ 4,495.5 per kl, or 4.58 per cent on September 1.

The ATF rate in Mumbai was increased to ₹ 84,642.91 per kl on Friday from ₹ 81,866.13 previously. Oil firms also increased the price of commercial LPG by ₹ 62 to ₹ 1,802 per 19-kg cylinder.

This is the fourth straight monthly hike in commercial LPG prices. Prices were hiked by ₹ 48.5 to ₹ 1,740 on October 1. Prior to that rates were increased by ₹ 6.5 per cylinder on August 1 and by ₹ 39 on September 1. The four rounds of increase follow four

monthly price reductions. In four price reductions, rates were cut by ₹ 148 per 19-kg cylinder and now in four rounds of increase, prices have gone up by ₹ 156 per bottle

Commercial LPG now costs ₹ 1,754.50 per 19-kg cylinder in Mumbai, ₹ 1,911.50 in Kolkata and ₹ 1,964.50 in Chennai.

The rate of cooking gas used in domestic households, however, remained unchanged at ₹ 803 per 14.2-kg cylinder.

State-owned Indian Oil Corporation (IOC), Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd (BPCL), and Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Ltd (HPCL) revise prices of ATF and cooking gas on the first of every month based on the average price of benchmark international fuel

The CPI's report warns that economic losses by 2100 could be five times greater than the climate finance needed by 2050 to stay

The report also said that adaptation finance more than doubled from 2018 to 2022, reaching USD 76 billion. However, annual adaptation flows have reached just onethird of the volume needed each year from 2024 to 2030 in EMDEs

According to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), adopted in 1992, high-income, industrialised nations -- which have hisbenefited industrialisation and contributed most to greenhouse gas emissions -- are responsible for providing finance and technology to help developing countries combat and adapt to climate change.

These countries include the United States, Canada, Japan, Australia, New Zealand, and EU member states such as Germany and

Developing and poorer countries view an ambitious new climate finance goal as crucial to increasing climate action. They argue that expecting them to do more, especially when many are still grappling with poverty and inadequate infrastructure amid worsening climate impacts, undermines

Petrol sales rebound in festival season, diesel demand continues to drop

NEW DELHI, Nov 1: India's petrol consumption soared 7.3 per cent in October on the back of increased demand from the start of festive season but diesel sales were down 3.3 per cent, preliminary data of state-owned firms showed on Friday.

Petrol sales of three state-owned firms, which control 90 per cent of the fuel market, rose to 3.1 million tonnes during October when compared to 2.87 million tonnes of consumption in the same month last year.

Diesel demand dropped 3.3 per cent to 6.7 million tonnes.

While petrol sales were up mostly due to an increase in use of personal vehicles as the festive season kicked in, diesel demand dropped due to lower demand from the agriculture sector owing to the extended rainy season.

Petrol and diesel sales have been tepid during the last few months as monsoon rains reduced vehicular movement and demand for the agricul-

ture sector. Month-on-month petrol sales were up 7.8 per cent when compared to 2.86 million tonnes of consumption in September. Diesel demand was however almost 20 per cent more than 5.59 million tonnes of consumption in September.

Diesel is India's most consumed fuel, accounting for almost 40 per cent of all petroleum product consumption. The transport sector accounts for 70 per cent of all diesel sales in the country. It is also the predominant fuel used in agriculture sectors, including in harvesters and tractors.

Consumption of petrol during October was 10.5 per cent more than in October 2022, and 32.8 per cent more than in Covid-marred October 2020.

Diesel demand was up 1.7 per cent over October 2022, and 12.6 per cent compared to October 2020.

Jet fuel (ATF) sales rose 2.5 per cent year-on-year to 6.47,700 tonnes during October 2024. But this was 2.6 per cent lower month-on-month when compared with 6,31,100 tonnes of fuel sold in September.

Like petrol and diesel, ATF demand too is now firmly above pre-Covid levels. ATF consumption was 11.5 per cent more than in October 2022, and 1.9 per cent more than in October 2020.

Cooking gas LPG sales were up 7.5 per cent yearon-year at 2.82 million tonnes in October 2024. LPG consumption was 13.1 per cent higher than in October 2022, and 19.1 per cent more than in October 2020.

Month-on-month, LPG demand was up 3.5 per cent against 2.72 million tonnes of LPG consumption in

Nara Lokesh pitches Vizag to Google Cloud CEO for setting up data centre

SAN FRANCISCO (US), Nov 1: Andhra Pradesh's IT and Electronics Minister Nara Lokesh has pitched port city of Vizag in his state for setting up a data centre to Google Cloud CEO, saying the new government in the state has taken various initiatives for supporting industry that will help it transform into a cloud infrastructure hub.

The state is focused on setting up data centres in Visakhapatnam and the minister invited Google Cloud to establish its data centre in the port city.

As part of his mission to attract investments during his ongoing visit to the United States, Lokesh visited the Google campus in San Francisco where he met Google Cloud chief executive Thomas Kurian, its global networking vice-president Bikas Koley, vicepresident of its business applications Rao Surapuneni, and vice-president of Google Maps Chandu Thota.

The minister asked all these top echelons of Google to consider setting up of a data centre in Visakhapatnam under Public-Private Partnership (PPP) mode. "Under the visionary leadership of the Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu, the State Government is im-

GST records second-highest collection at ₹ 1.87 lakh cr in Oct driven by domestic sales

NEW DELHI, Nov 1: Gross GST collection in October rose 9 per cent to over ₹ 1.87 lakh crore, the second-highest ever, on pickup in domestic sales and improved

The Central GST collection stood at ₹ 33,821 crore, State GST at ₹41,864 crore, Integrated IGST at ₹ 99,111 crore and cess at ₹ 12,550 crore during the month.

As per the government data released on Friday, the total gross Goods and Services Tax (GST) revenue grew 8.9 per cent to ₹ 1,87,346 crore. In October 2023, the mop-up was at ₹ 1.72 lakh

October 2024 recorded the second-best GST mop-up. The highest ever collection was in April 2024 at over ₹ 2.10 lakh crore.

During the month under review, GST from domestic transactions grew 10.6 per cent to ₹ 1.42 lakh crore, while revenues from tax on imports rose about 4 per cent to ₹ 45.096 crore.

Refunds worth ₹ 19,306 crore were issued during the month, registering 18.2 per cent growth over the year-ago period.

After adjusting refunds, net GST collection grew 8 per cent at over ₹ 1.68 lakh crore.

Deloitte India Partner MS Mani said the buoyancy in GST collections is on account of an excellent combination of festive season sales and increased compliance.

"The driver appears to be domestic supplies... While many large states have recorded an increase in GST revenue above 9 per cent, some of them and many of the smaller states have shown a below average increase, which would be an area of concern for those states," Mani said.

EY Tax Partner Saurabh Agarwal, however, said the single-digit growth in monthly GST collections signals a cooling-off period, indicating a potential slowdown in consumer spending in India, which surged in the previous fiscal year.

He said the November collections will show a better picture of the festive demand and the performance of the automobile sector will be crucial in determining the short-term trend.

"While the festive season is expected to boost collections, the



overall outlook for the near future remains cautious despite shortterm uncertainties, the long-term prospects for GST collections remain promising due to India's expanding consumer base and the government's pro-growth policies," Agarwal said.

accuse the KAAC of allegedly selling land to outsiders without any evidence. Another spokesperson, Chomang Kro, stated that the 'Purthimi Akemang' program is designed to provide land pattas to deserving villagers who are unable to apply for them on their own.

"This is a genuine effort to help villagers, not intended for any political gain. It is the APHLC that is trying to exploit this for political benefit by calling for an end to the scheme. If the scheme is halted, it will be the villagers who suffer," Kro said.

Meanwhile, Karbi Anglong Territorial Social Security Association (KATSSA), a social organisation in Karbi Anglong, has raised concerns about certain loopholes in the Karbi Anglong Autonomous Council (KAAC) flagship program 'Purthimi Akemang,' which aims to distribute free land pattas to indigenous communities in Karbi Angong and West Karbi Anglong.

Regarding the KAAC's initiative, KATSSA president Semson Engti, at a press conference held at Forest IB on Friday, stated that before the Lok Sabha elections in 2024, KATSSA submitted a memorandum to the KAAC CEM and to BJP East Karbi Anglong district committee president Roland Killing, requesting action on issuing land pattas to villagers, including those living across state and district lines. During that meeting, Killing assured the organisation that the BJP government would address these issues after the elections. KATSSA also demanded the withdrawal of land pattas being issued to non-indigenous communities. Engti noted that V-forms were being distributed at polling stations and party meetings.

"Distributing V-forms in party meetings is meant for political purposes. These meetings typically involve only party workers and supporters. Distributing B-forms at such meetings does not serve the interests of indigenous communities and facilitates access for all. Government officials should implement these schemes without party

He urged officials from the ARO office to directly visit villages and consult local headmen to identify genuine individuals from the scheduled tribes before distributing forms. Engti further stated that while the KAAC claimed that 5.61 lakh land pattas had been distributed previously, villagers have reported no records in the ARO office, with discrepancies in dag numbers and plot numbers.

"We demand that land pattas be distributed only to indigenous communities. The ruling party should not use this for publicity but should genuinely value the needs of villagers. The KAAC must take bold steps to protect the land of indigenous people," Engti asserted.

He also called for stricter oversight from the Taxation Department regarding trading licenses issued to nonscheduled tribe individuals operating businesses in the district. He highlighted that money laundering is flourishing without the department's knowledge, with outsiders engaging in such activities without proper permissions and documentation, leading to significant losses in revenue.

"The Taxation Department must regulate money laundering and enforce strict measures to curb these practices," Engti concluded.

Under National Biodiversity Target 3, India aims to expand Protected Areas and Other Effective Area-Based Conservation Measures (OECMs) to cover 30 per cent of the country's landscapes. This target emphasises the crucial role of communities in biodiversity conservation while ensuring sustainable use.

India's National Biodiversity Target 2 acknowledges widespread ecosystem degradation and aims for the effective restoration of at least 30 per cent of degraded terrestrial, inland water, coastal, and marine ecosystems by 2030. "Agricultural expansion, industrialisation, linear infrastructure development, mining, urbanisation, and other developmental activities, coupled with the overexploitation of natural ecosystems by resource-dependent communities, especially post-independence, have led to large-scale ecosystem degradation, reducing the ecosystem

ervices they once provided. This makes the target a top priority for focused actions," the NBSAP said. The NBSAP's Target 16 addresses overconsumption and waste generation as root causes of biodiversity loss. India has launched Mission Life to encourage the adoption of environmentally friendly lifestyles.

Adopted in 1992 to protect the world's biodiversity, the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) requires countries to create an NBSAP, which is a key tool for conserving and sustainably using biodiversity at the national level. Countries are also required to report their progress every four years through national reports. (PTI)



Residents alarmed by land purchases by Bengali-speaking minority

MORIGAON, Nov 1: Indigenous residents of Jaluguti, Tukunabori, Saru-Chakabaha, Boramari, and Majarbori under Mikirbheta Police Station face an existential crisis as Bengali-speaking religious minority people, often referred to as 'Miya', have reportedly been purchasing lands in these areas for an extended period. Allegations suggest that numerous Bengali-speaking minority individuals are acquiring land from indigenous residents through brokers, permanently settling there, and stirring significant discontent across the district.

Local residents claim that land brokers first purchase indigenous lands at lower prices, exploiting the sellers' financial constraints. only to later resell these lands to Bengali-speaking religious minority people at higher prices. Additionally, they express concerns that this group is posing a threat to local agricultural lands. Many locals fear that, if the trend continues, both residential and agricultural lands will be lost to these buyers through intermediaries.

In response, residents recently submitted a memorandum to the district commissioner and the local MLA, demanding rigorous verification of the citizenship status of the purchasers. In particular, residents of Takunabari village are concerned that numerous individuals of Bengali origin have constructed houses on farmland in Baotali Pathar and Majrabari-Jaluguti Kissam. They urge that measures be implemented to restrict non-residents from buying, selling, or living in these areas in the future.

The memorandum, however, has reportedly stalled in official channels, attributed to the recent transfer of the revenue circle officer. Meanwhile, residents from Rangdalai and Majrabari villages have submitted a petition to the district commissioner and local MLA, Ramakant Deuri, requesting decisive action.

Trump's Diwali message to Modi

epublican candidate Donald Trump's Diwali message. just four days before the crucial November 5 presidential elections in the USA, has enormous significance, which goes beyond the possible impact on Hindu-Americans voters on the polling day. The content of the message will have a big impact on Bangladesh politics in the event of a Trump victory. This message was the first comprehensive reaction by any political leader of the USA on the situation in Bangladesh after the fall of the Sheikh Hasina-led Awami League government on August 5 and her fleeing to India the same day. So far, the Biden government is dealing favourably with the interim government in Bangladesh headed by Dr. Muhammad Yunus, a personal friend of the Clintons, and no US Democratic Party leader has spoken against the attacks on the Hindu minorities in the country since August 5. The Hindus constitute eight per cent of the current population of Bangladesh. The Republican candidate has made it clear that he has no confidence in the interim government and the country is in chaos. Charging the Biden administration for being silent spectators to the killing of minorities. Trump mentions 'it would have never happened on [his] watch'.

The latest political scenario in Bangladesh is in critical state. The interim government has decided to disallow Awami League from political activities, though the BNP is not agreeable to this decision. BNP wants a crippled Awami League to participate in the elections so that the party can claim legitimacy after coming to power in the new national elections. Then the Jatiyo Party, an important political party after BNP, was attacked and its central office was burnt on Wednesday, October 30 by the antiquota students' body, and this was done openly by giving a call through its Facebook page. Interestingly, Russian President Vladimir Putin, who has cordial relations with Narendra Modi, is looking for the victory of Donald Trump for different reasons. Russian official sources do not admit that, but the trends are discernible. President Putin feels that Trump in power will help Russia in the Ukraine war as Trump is sure to lessen US commitment to Ukraine and President Zelensky. In fact, Trump distrusts Zelensky. He is of the view that the Ukraine president is wasting NATO funds in a long-drawn war which he cannot win. As against this, China is rooting for the Democratic Party candidate Kamala Harris, though Chinese President Xi Jinping has not officially said anything. China's worry is about further hike in tariff rate on imports from China by the US. As the proponent of Make America Great Again (MAGA), Trump is insistent on this and the supply of semiconductor chips. On both issues, Trump is expected to be stiffer compared to Joe Biden. Taiwan and Asia Pacific will come later. China's economic goals will be greatly disturbed by Trump, if he comes to power, Chinese policy make

The interim government is very eager to have political discussions with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, but the Indian PM is stalling it. He is also waiting for the November 5 results, looking for a victory for Donald Trump. The Republican victory will be a double bonanza for him politically. India-China relations: A fragile thaw amidst persistent challenges

may ease tensions along volatile eastern Ladakh border, India and China have recently reached an agreement on phased disengagement and patrolling procedures in the contested Depsang and Demchok areas. This breakthrough, following over four years of military confrontation, signals cautious progress in managing a prolonged standoff along one of the world's most complex borders. However, as India reflects on this diplomatic step, it faces pressing questions about Beijing's commitment to upholding such agreements, especially given China's history of territorial aggression and strategic maneuvering in the region. While the move toward disengagement appears promising, India must remain vigilant, keeping in mind the deep-seated trust deficit between the two na-

Unresolved tensions: Beyond the Disengagement Accord

Although recent talks have yielded this phased disengagement, the underlying issues plaguing India-China relations remain unresolved. Both nations have yet to restore ties to earlier warmth, demonstrated during the informal summits in Wuhan and Mamallapuram in 2018 and 2019. The recent bilateral meeting between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President Xi Jinping, held on the sidelines of the BRICS summit, lacked the cordiality of these earlier encounters. Despite superficial progress, both leaders are acutely aware of the chasm in mutual trust and the significant diplomatic ground still to cover.

For New Delhi, the approach to China has evolved dramatically since the Ladakh incursions in 2020. The Indian leadership now embraces a more calculated stance, understanding that China's territorial posturing poses an enduring challenge to India's sovereignty. The Depsang and agreements.

sent only an initial step in India's roadmap, which also emphasizes de-escalation and eventual de-induction of troops along the Line of Actual Control (LAC). New Delhi's red line remains firm: any lasting resolution must prioritize "peace and tranquility on the border." India, therefore, is unlikely to lower its guard anytime soon, acutely aware that the disengagement agreements may not preclude future transgressions.

Broader regional implications and strategic concerns

The India-China con-

frontation is part of a larger boundary dispute spanning the 3,488 km LAC. The Ladakh standoff reflects a complex pattern of Chinese encroachment, marked by a recurring tactic of incremental territorial grabs or "salami-slicing." China's assertiveness is not limited to India's borders but extends to Bhutan as well, as evidenced by its ongoing attempt to dominate disputed territories in the Doklam plateau. In 2017, the Indian Army intervened to block Chinese road construction near the Sikkim-Bhutan-Tibet trijunction. Although this led to a 73-day standoff and eventual disengagement, China's permanent troop deployment in northern Doklam signals a lingering challenge to regional stability.

The incursions of 2020 were only the latest iteration of these tactics, designed to unsettle the status quo and test India's resolve. The China-Pakistan axis amplifies New Delhi's strategic concerns, necessitating a calibrated approach in dealing with Beijing. As countermeasure, Prime Minister Modi and President Xi recently agreed to resume the meetings of the Special Representatives (SRs) mechanism, a diplomatic framework established in 2003 to oversee border management and facilitate dialogue on the boundary issue.

While the SR mechanism has produced 22 rounds of discussions so far, its efficacy remains uncertain. The long-standing boundary dispute, compounded by China's reluctance to reach a conclusive settlement, limits the SR mechanism's impact to maintaining an open line of communication rather than achieving a substantive resolution.

This approach underscores India's resolve to counter Chinese advances, with the recent disengagement agreement serving as a step toward stability, not

complacency. Simultaneously, India's military strategy also emphasizes the need for de-escalation and dialogue to prevent further confrontation. The phased disengagement agreement represents a tentative move in this direction, allowing both nations to maintain a working relationship while continuing to address outstanding issues through diplomatic channels.

Balancing economic realities with national secu-

Despite India's desire to achieve economic self-sufficiency, the trade relationship with China remains asymmetrical, favoring Beijing. Recent policy initiatives have sought to reduce reliance on Chinese imports, but the results have been limited, and sectors such as electronics, machinery, and pharmaceuticals still rely heavily on Chinese supplies. This dependence has forced India to balance economic pragmatism with national security considerations, recognizing that decoupling from China is not an immediate option.

India's economic strategy, however, remains focused on fostering alternative supply chains and diversifying its trade partnerships. The "Atmanirbhar Bharat" (self-reliant India) initiative aims to enhance domestic production capacities and re-

The territorial dispute with China, along with the broader strategic rivalry, demands a nuanced approach that prioritizes national security while keeping the door open for dialogue.

At the same time, India's economic dependence on China presents an ongoing challenge. To address this, India must continue to diversify its supply chains and strengthen domestic industries to reduce its vulnerability to geopolitical disruptions. By pursuing this dual approach, India can work towards maintaining a stable relationship with China, while safeguarding its own strategic interests.

The recent disengage-

ment agreement is a welcome development, but it does not signify the end of India's challenges along the LAC. As New Delhi navigates its relationship with Beijing, it must remain cautious, mindful of the risks of over-reliance on diplomatic assurances alone. India-China border issue is sensitive, will take long time for an agreement

The relationship between India and China is a contentious issue. The boundary issue between the two nations is a longstanding problem. China has the concept of expansionism. It does not follow the Mac-Mahan Line and Johnson Line drawn by the erstwhile British colonial rulers in consultation with relevant parties. But in regard to Myanmar, it agrees on Mac Mahan Line, not in the case with India. As a result in 1962, China defied these two lines, invaded and occupied large chunks of Indian territory. Thus the Line of Actual Control (LAC) was drawn between the two countries. Still not satisfied with the occupation, Beijing claims parts of Indian territory like Ladakh and Arunachal as its own. Chinese expansionism is not the concept of Chinese Communist Party alone, it existed with the imperialist dynasties and the Nationalist Kuomintang Party also.

Beijing refuses to accept the LAC and the buffer zone between the two countries. There has been skirmishes along the LAC many times. The recent one was in June 2020 when COVID pandemic was at its peak around the globe. Incidentally Xi Jinping visited India in 2019 to have an interaction with Prime Minister Narendra Modi at Mahabalipuram in Tamil Nadu a few months before the trolling points at Track Junction and military standoff at Galwan valley in June 2020.

The incident at Galwan valley took a toll of 20 Indian brave hearts and killed or injured about 40 Chinese soldiers. Number of agreements were signed at Mahabalipuram. Modi and Xi Jinping never interacted since then till the BRICS meeting

Just before the 16th BRICS Summit at Kazan in Russia, New Delhi and China resolved to disengage their troops at both sides of only Demchok and Depsang plain and not other friction points. Troops of both held in April 2020, and they will patrol areas where they patrolled till April 2020. This was a gesture to handle differences and disputes re- Service)

have peace and tranquillity at the border. China probably wants to concentrate on Taiwan issue at the moment rather than focusing on boundary dispute with India. Another thing was to have an interaction with Modi at the sidelines of the BRICS Summit.

Disengagement of troops have already begun at Demchok and Depsang plain and is slated to be completed by this month end. But the moot question remains is what about other areas like Gogra-Hot Springs in Ladakh. Intelligence sources say that China continues to hold large swathes of India territory to the north in the Depsang plains.

A similar agreement should be worked out for in Arunachal Pradesh where a standoff developed in Yangtse, Asaphila and Subansi valleys. Depsang is critical for India since it provides access to the strips at Daulat Beg Oldie and prevents Chinese troops from threatening vital logistics centres in the area. Demchok is divided in two by the LAC: India controls the western part, which is claimed by China.

According to sources, in Depsang area, the Indian troops should now be able to patrol beyond the 'bottleneck' area as the Chinese had been preventing Indian troops from accessing the patrolling points that lay beyond. In Demchok, Indian troops should now be able to get to the pa-Charding Nullah.

Next after disengagement, the issues of de-escalation, sanctity of buffer zones and border management remain. The issues remain to be resolved when the Special Representatives of both sides – India's National Security Advisor Ajit Doval and Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi meet.

After the bilateral meeting between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping, the Indian Ministry of External Affairs said in a statement, "PM Modi welcomed the recent agreement on complete disengagement sides will fall back to positions they and resolution of the issues that arose in the India-China border areas in 2020. He emphasized the need to

sponsibly, ensuring they do not disrupt peace and tranquillity. Both leaders agreed that the Special Representatives on the boundary question will meet soon to manage peace and work toward a fair, reasonable, and mutually acceptable solution. Additionally, dialogue mechanisms at the Foreign Minister and official levels will be employed to stabilize and rebuild bilateral relations.

During the bilateral meeting with Chinese President Xi Jinping in Kazan, Russia, on the sidelines of the 16th BRICS Summit, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said, "We are having a formal meeting after 5 years. We believe that the India-China relationship is very important not only for our people but also for global peace, stability and progress. We welcome the consensus reached on the issues that have arisen in the last 4 years on the border. Maintaining peace and stability on the border should remain our priority. Mutual trust, mutual respect and mutual sensitivity should remain the basis of our relations."

N Korea's top diplomat in Moscow to help the war on Ukraine



MOSCOW, Nov 1: Russia's top diplomat on Friday hosted his North Korean counterpart for talks amid reports that Pyongyang has sent thousands of troops to Russia to support its military in the war in

Foreign Minister Choe Son Hui's visit to Moscow and her meeting with Russia's Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov came on the heels of the Pentagon's statement that North Korea has deployed about 10,000 troops to Russia to fight against Ukraine within "the next several

Western leaders have described the North Korean troop deployment as a significant escalation that could also jolt relations in the Indo-Pacific

Neither Moscow nor Pyongyang have specified the agenda for Choe's talks in Moscow, but in a closed-door hearing at South Korea's parliament, the South's spy agency said Choe may be involved in high-level discussions on sending additional troops to Russia and negotiating what the North would get in return.

South Korean and Western officials have voiced concern that Russia may offer technology that could advance the threat posed by North Korea's nuclear weapons and missile programme.

Meeting Choe in Moscow on Friday, Russia's Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov hailed ties between Moscow and Pyongyang, saying that they "have reached an unprecedented high level over the past few years," and proposed discussing the implementation of the strategic partnership agreement the two nations

signed earlier this year. 'We will have discussions on a series of issues regarding politics and foreign policy as well as matters that require a joint response between the Democratic People's Republic of Korea and the Russian Federation," Choe said, invoking the North's formal name.

She reiterated Pyongyang's support "for the just fight of Russia's military and people to defend their country's sovereign rights and security interests" in Ukraine.

Moscow and Pyongyang have responded vaguely to South Korean and Western claims of the North Korean troop deployment to Russia, emphasising that their military cooperation conforms with international law, without directly admitting the presence of the North's forces in Russia.

The United States and its allies also have accused North Korea of providing millions of artillery shells and other equipment to Russia to fuel its military action in Ukraine.

Russia, along with China, has blocked US-led efforts at the Security Council to tighten sanctions on North Korea over its recent missile testing, which intensified after Russia's invasion of Ukraine in 2022. Russia also vetoed a UN resolution to extend the mandate of monitors in March, in a move that effectively abolished oversight by UN experts of Security Council sanctions against North Korea.

South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol last month raised the possibility of supplying Ukraine with weapons while saying Seoul is preparing countermeasures that could be rolled out in stages depending on the degree of military cooperation between Pyongyang and

South Korea, a growing arms exporter, has provided humanitarian aid and other non-lethal support to Ukraine and joined US-led economic sanctions against Moscow. It has so far resisted calls by Kyiv and NATO to directly supply Ukraine with weapons, citing a longstanding policy of not providing arms to countries engaged in active conflict.

In other developments: Russia launched three aviation missiles and 48 drones of various types, including Shaheds, at Ukraine overnight, Ukrainian air force said. One missile and 31 drones were intercepted, 14 drones were jammed, three drones flew to the territory of Belarus, the air force said in a report on Friday morning said. Several civilian facilities, as well as apartment buildings and private houses in Poltava, Cherkasy, Kyiv and Odesa regions were damaged by drone debris.

The Russian military on Friday said it intercepted and destroyed a total of 83 Ukrainian drones over four Russian regions near the border with Ukraine and the annexed Crimean Peninsula. In the Bryansk region, a drone hit a residential block, local authorities said. No casualties were reported. In the Stavropol region, a drone hit an oil depot, according to local officials. Unconfirmed media reports said the oil depot caught fire. (AP)

Tim hails 'rising' political voice of Indian-Americans

US Vice Presidential hopeful Walz joins Diwali celebrations

Walz attended a Diwali celebration at a prominent Hindu temple in Pennsylvania, reaching out to the Indian-Americans in the crucial battleground state as the race for White House heads towards a photo-finish.

In his brief remarks at the event in the Bharatiya temple in Montgomery County on Thursday, the Democratic leader highlighted the "rising" political voice of the Indian-American community in the US and urged them to save energy to "celebrate" Kamala Harris's "victory" in the presidential election next week.

"Happy Diwali everyone. It is a privilege for me to be with you on this special day," he said.

"The Indian and the South Asian community are so much a fabric of our state and our identity," the Minnesota governor said, drawing cheers from the audience.

Besides lighting a 'diya', Walz posed for selfies, greeted Indians with a 'Namaste' and exchanged pleasantries.

Pennsylvania is one of the seven battleground states which is expected to play a critical role in the overall election outcome.



With Pennsylvania witnessing a tight race between Republican nominee Donald Trump and Harris, political observers said the position of the Indian-American community would be pivotal for the poll outcome.

"Diversity is the strength of the country (the US) and that is why we continue to want to make it a place where people want to come to. This place needs to remain so,"

Though he did not elaborate further, the comments are seen as an indirect criticism of Trump's im-

"On this happiest day of light

over darkness, I hope you find peace, find calm and save a little energy to celebrate next Wednesday morning," Walz said, referring to Election Day.

In his campaign speeches, the former Republican president promised a radical shift to tighten the US's immigration policy and vowed to carry out the "largest" domestic deportation operation in American history of undocumented immigrants if he is re-

Walz's presence at the Diwali celebration at the Hindu temple drew widespread appreciation from leading Indian community

"Tim Walz's visit is very significant for the Indian American community in Pennsylvania. His visit highlighted the importance of the Indian-American community in this swing state of Pennsylvania," said prominent Indian community leader Mukund Kute.

"We see this as a recognition of our contribution to mainstream America," he told PTI.

A similar sentiment was echoed by Manish Ingle, the CEO of medical devices firm Nova Probe Inc. and a leading community leader.

"This is a significant gesture by Walz. In our area, we never had a person of this authority to have graced such an occasion. The Indian American community is very fortunate to receive Tim Walz, who if all goes well, will be the next

Vice President of the US," he said "On Diwali, he lit the 'diya; here. I am very amazed that we got an opportunity in Bharatiya temple to greet someone like Walz," said Ingle, who also serves on boards of several institutions including the Pennsylvania Governor Advisory Council for Inclusive Procure-

and South Asian American groups have been engaged in mobilising support for her including through raising funds.

The number of Indian Americans residing in the US is around 5.2 million forming the secondlargest immigrant community, and out of them, around 2.3 million are eligible to vote.

Around 55 per cent of Indian American eligible voters identified as Democrats as against 26 per cent as Republicans, according to a 2024 survey conducted by research organisation AAPI before President Joe Biden pulled out from the re-election bid.

A survey this month by the Carnegie Endowment found that 61 per cent of registered Indian American voter respondents plan to vote for Harris while 32 per cent intend to vote for Trump.

It said 67 per cent of Indian American women intend to vote for Harris while 53 per cent of men, a significantly smaller share,

say they plan to vote for Harris. Twenty-two per cent of women intend to vote for Trump while a significantly larger share of men, 39 per cent, plan to cast their ballots for him, it said. (PTI)

5 schoolchildren among 7 killed in blast in southwest Pakistan

ISLAMABAD/KARACHI, Nov 1: Seven people, including five schoolchildren and a policeman, were killed while 17 others were injured on Friday in a remote-controlled blast targeting a police van in Pakistan's restive

Balochistan province. The blast occurred at 8.35 am near a girl's high school at the Civil Hospital Chowk of the Mastung district of the province. Terrorists used a remote control device to detonate explosive material hidden in a parked motorbike, officials said."It was an IED (improvised explosive device) used in the blast, and the target apparently was a police mobile parked near the school," Kalat Division Commissioner Naeem Bazai said.

The IED detonated when the police mobile came close to it, and a school van was caught in the mayhem. The police van and several auto-rickshaws were also damaged in the explosion. "The blast was so powerful that schoolchildren who were going to the school at that time were hit by the explosion," Bazai added.

Mastung District Police Officer (DPO) Miandad Umrani confirmed that five schoolchildren, one police official and a civilian were killed in the blast.

capital Quetta for treatment. According to DPO Umrani, 11 people were moved to the Quetta Trauma Centre for treatment.TV footage after the attack showed policemen and other people surrounding a charred vehicle. No group has claimed responsibility for the attack yet,

but ethnic Baloch terrorists and Taliban terrorists often attack the security forces in the province, which has been facing a low-level insurgency for about two decades now. Meanwhile, Balochistan Chief Minister Sarfaraz Bugti

took to X to condemn the blast, calling it "inhumane". He said terrorists had now "targeted innocent children along with poor labourers" in an apparent reference to a recent attack by unidentified gunmen at a dam construction site in the province's Panjgur district, which killed five workers and injured two others.

"We will avenge the murder of innocent children and people," CM said, adding that civilians in urban areas also needed to be on the watch for the terrorists. "The monster of terrorism can only be fought together," he said. He added that terrorists had targeted children, deeming

them to be a "soft target". In the aftermath of the blast, an emergency was declared

across all Quetta hospitals, Geo News reported, quoting the provincial health department spokesperson, adding that all doctors, pharmacists, staff nurses and other medical staff were summoned. (PTI)

UN-backed experts: Russia's torture of Ukrainian civilians, prisoners is a crime against humanity

UNITED NATIONS, Nov 1: Russia's torture of Ukrainian civilians and prisoners of war is a crime against humanity, U.N.-backed human rights experts said Thursday.

Erik Møse, chair of the independent commission investigating human rights violations in Ukraine, told reporters that the panel previously described Russia's widespread and systematic use of torture in Ukraine and Russia against civilians and prisoners, both men and women, as a war crime.

"Our recent findings demonstrate that Russian authorities have committed torture in all provinces of Ukraine that came under their control, as well as in the detention facilities that the commission has investigated in the Russian Federation," he said. Russia's U.N. Mission said it had no comment

on the press conference or the report by the commission, which is appointed by the Geneva-based U.N. Human Rights Council.

Møse said the commission is an investigative body. He noted that Ukraine's prosecutor general and the International Criminal Court are investigating possible war crimes and crimes against humanity in Ukraine and the commission may be asked for evidence. The commissioners examined reports from 41 different detention centers, from makeshift centers to well-established facilities, in nine occupied regions of Ukraine and eight areas in Russia,

He said the commission identified further evidence that violent practices common in Russian detention facilities were also practiced in similar facilities in Russian-occupied areas in eastern Ukraine, he said. The commission also found additional evidence of the recurrent use of sexual violence as a form of torture. Møse said.

Detainees were subjected to rape, long periods of forced nudity, body searches and more, commission member Vrinda Gover said. She said most prisoners of war reported being subjected to sexual violence and suffering long-lasting psychological trauma. Ukrainians in detention facilities in Ukraine and in Russia also reported "a brutal socalled admission procedure," Gover said.

"Harsh practices designed to scare, break, humiliate, coerce and punish detainees were used routinely," she said

Surveillance cameras were used to watch detainees and severe collective punishment of detainees was imposed for every breach of rules, while "interrogations were accompanied by some of the most violent treatment documented." Gover said. Commission member Pablo de Greiff told reporters it now has evidence of the Russian organizational structure that coordinated and enabled torture in the detention facilities.

"Moreover, the Commission now has evidence that the leadership of detention facilities or other higher ranking Russian authorities ordered, encouraged, tolerated or took no action to stop torture or ill treatment," de Grieff said.

Møse said the commission's investigation also found that the violent practices against detainees in Russia were transferred by Russian security forces and staff to detention facilities run by Russia in areas it occupied in Ukraine. (AP)

Earlier this week, he hosted the largest ever Diwali at the White House by inviting some 600 eminent Indian-Americans from across the country.

"Tonight, we join more than 1 billion people across America and around the world lighting diyas and celebrating the fight for good over evil, knowledge over ignorance, and

light over darkness," Harris said on a post on X from her campaign trail.

"Happy Diwali to everyone celebrating the Festival of Lights!," said the vice president who had been hosting Diwali at her official residence for the past several years but could not do so because of her hectic campaign. Secretary of State Tony Blinken said for many, the Diwali season represents the victory of light over darkness and the triumph of good over

"It erves as a reminder of the ability of each and every one of us to bring more light into our communities. We celebrate alongside families and friends all around the world – including millions of people here in the United States - who are gathering together, sharing sweets, decorating homes, and lighting diyas," he said.

"Reflecting on the strength that diversity brings our nation, we also take this occasion to reiterate the importance of freedom of religion or belief for all people everywhere," Blinken said. Minnesota Governor Tim Walz and Harris' running mate visited the Bharatiya Temple in Montgomery County, Pennsylvania to celebrate Diwali. The governor participated in a diya lighting ceremony before receiv-

ing a blessing. "Happy Diwali to everyone. It's a privilege for me to be with you on this special day, a privilege to stand amongst you. You can feel the sense of community here. You can feel the sense of love. You can feel the sense that there is something bigger than all of us," he

After Halloween, Christians observe All Saints' Day

WARSAW (POLAND), Nov 1: It's the time of year — tradition says when the veil between the worlds of

the living and the dead is lifted. That traditional belief has morphed over the centuries into the spooky and secular celebration of Halloween.

But one day later, Christians in many countries around the world are celebrating All Saints' Day on Friday, a sombre and spiritual day in the church's liturgical calendar that shares pagan roots with Halloween.

The word "Halloween" derives from "All Hallows Eve," which means the eve of All Saints' Day, a holiday that has also been known as All Hallows. It honours martyrs and saints those who were hallowed, or deemed holy — a tradition begun by the Roman Catholic church in the early

medieval period. Scholars believe that the spectral aspects of Halloween emerged primarily from Samhain, an ancient Celtic festival that occurred during the harvest season, said Morgan Shipley, a professor of religious studies at Michi-

gan State University in East Lansing. It was a time when people were "transitioning from harvest and bounty and the fullness of summer to the desolation of winter," he said. "And it was said that in this time the veil between the physical, material human world



and the spiritual world essentially dis-

Some of the spirits or spectral beings were viewed as demonic in nature, and bonfires became a way to ward them away, or were used in divination by druid priests and priestesses when the veil between the material and spiritual world broke down, he

As Christianity spread, many pagan rituals were adapted to the new faith to be more attractive to converts. The period of reflecting on the dead continues though November 2, which is All

In Central Europe, the Slavic and Baltic populations had their own ritu-

many traditionally Roman Catholic societies observe the day.

In Poland, it is one of the most important days of the year. Many travel back to their family homes to gather with those still living and reflect on those who have left them. So many people observe the holiday

Cities including Warsaw and Krakow run many additional tram and bus lines to ferry the huge numbers to — and between cemeteries. While the reflections are mostly personal, people also leave candles at the graves of national heroes. So many people visit cemeteries at the same time that the celebration takes on a communal quality. It has become so much part of the

wider culture in Poland that people place candles in the Jewish and Muslim cemeteries as well. In the Philippines, millions trooped

to cemeteries across the country Friday to observe the annual tradition, visiting tombs of their loved ones. Thousands were seen visiting and offering flowers and candles to be placed at the graves of their deceased loved ones at the Manila North Cemetery in the capital.

"Even if I'm old, I still visit the tombs of my relatives, especially my husband's, during All Saints' Day. As long as I can walk, I will visit him,' said Manila resident Dory Oliquino. All Saints' Day has been a family reunion for many Filipinos, where

they keep vigil at the tombs. "All Saints' Day is the day we celebrate and remember our departed loved ones, so that even if they are gone our memories with them would still be fresh on our minds," said Luis Montibon.

Italians traditionally visit cemeteries to pay tribute to deceased family members on All Souls' Day, lighting candles or laying flowers. Pope Francis will visit Rome's third-largest cemetery, the Laurentino Cemetery, to celebrate Mass and lead prayers for the dead. The pope visited the same cemetery in 2018, stopping to pray in

an area dedicated to fetuses. In recent years as the holiday approaches, there are discussions about Halloween and its compatibility with

Christian beliefs in the afterlife. Poles began to celebrate Halloween after the fall of communism in 1989. but some worry that the foreign cultural import could eventual dilute the tradition of All Saints' Day. Some Catholics worry that it also might be sinful due to allusions to devils and ghosts. Pushing back, some church groups have begun holding alternative events for All Saints' Day.

This week, a church group organised the 3rd All Saints' Ball in the Polish town of Plock, according to a Catholic news site, Niedziela meaning Sunday — which reported that "the children came dressed as saints and blessed of the Catholic Church and as angels." (AP)

Russia sentences former US consulate worker to nearly 5 years in prison

MOSCOW, Nov 1: A court in Russia's far-eastern city of Vladivostok on Friday convicted a former U.S. consulate worker charged with cooperating with a foreign state and sentenced him to four years and ten months in prison.

Robert Shonov, a former employee of the U.S. Consulate in Vladivostok, was arrested in May 2023. Russia's top domestic security agency, the FSB, accused him of "gathering information about the special military operation" in Ukraine, partial call-up in Russian regions and its influence on "protest activities of the population in the runup to the

2024 presidential election." The U.S. State Department last year condemned the arrest and said the allegations against Shonov "are

wholly without merit.' Shonov was charged under a new article of Russian law that criminalizes "cooperation on a confidential basis with a foreign state, international or foreign organization to assist their activities clearly aimed against Russia's security." Kremlin critics and human rights advocates have said it was so broad that it could be used to punish any Russian with foreign connections. It carries a prison sentence of up to eight years.

Shonov worked at the U.S. consulate in Vladivostok for more than 25 years. The consulate closed in 2020 because of the COVID-19 pandemic and never reopened.

The State Department has said that after a Russian government order in April 2021 required the dismissal of all local employees in U.S. diplomatic outposts in Russia, Shonov worked at a company the U.S. contracted with to support its embassy in State Department spokesman

AIZAWL, Nov 1: Mizoram chief minister Lalduhoma on Friday announced that his government will provide special ration cards to low income families that are not covered under the National Food Security Act (NFSA).

At the launch of the convergence between the state's Handholding Scheme and the National Livestock Mission, the chief minister announced that special ration cards (of red colour) will be issued to 2.500 families, covering 1 lakh beneficiaries.

"In the ongoing revision of ration cards, the government will arrange special ration cards for those who avail white ration cards (non-NFSA) but have limited sources of income," Lalduhoma

He said that beneficiaries seeking to avail the special ration cards should approach their respective district civil supply officers.

The government will also re-

quire the support of local councils and NGOs in the process of selecting beneficiaries. he said

In Mizoram, ration card holders are divided into three categories -yellow (Antyodaya Anna Yojana or AAY), blue (priority household or PHH) and white (non-NFSA). AAY and PHH beneficiaries are covered under the NFSA.

State Food, Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs Minister B Lalchhanzova had earlier said that the government would revise the existing ration cards system as the government has decided to drop subsidies to white card beneficiar-

He had said that any existing non-NFSA beneficiary or white card holder whose annual income is less than 4 lakh for urban and ₹ 2.5 lakh for rural will be converted into NFSA beneficiary.

At the launch, Lalduhoma said that the Handholding Scheme would be implemented in pilot



phases for the current fiscal and in a broad way from the next financial year.

He said that the scheme was launched specifically to assist those who work hard and are determined to become economically

self-sufficient. Under this scheme, the government will act as guarantor for beneficiaries (partners) seeking loans from a bank and the government will provide subsidies to them on loan interest, he said.

The chief minister added that the meat processing industry will also be included under the handholding policy. (PTI)



Congress slams EC's response on Haryana Polls, warns of legal action



NEW DELHI, Nov 1: The Congress on Friday hit out at the Election Commission after it rejected allegations over irregularities in the Haryana assembly polls, saying if the poll panel's goal is to "strip itself of the last vestiges of neutrality", then it is doing a "remarkable job" at creating that impression.

The opposition party claimed that the EC's reply was written in a tone that is condescending and warned that if the poll panel persists with such language then it would have no choice but to seek legal recourse to expunge such re-

The Congress's response came days after the EC rejected allegations levelled by it over irregularities in the just-held assembly polls, saying the party was raising "the smoke of a generic doubt" about the credibility of an entire electoral outcome like it did in the past.

In its letter to the EC signed by nine senior Congress leaders, including general secretary in-charge communications Jairam Ramesh, the party said, "We have carefully studied vour response to our complaints. Not surprisingly, the ECI has given a clean chit to itself. We would normally have let it be at that. However, the tone and tenor of the ECI's response, the language

used, and the allegations made against the INC compel us to sub-

mit the counter-response.' "We do not know who is advising or guiding the hon'ble Commission, but it seems that the Commission has forgotten that it is a body set up under the Constitution and charged with the discharge of certain crucial functions - both administrative and quasijudicial," the response by the Congress lead-

Posting the reply on X, Congress general secretary Ramesh said, "ECI gave a non-reply to Congress' specific complaints in 20 Vidhan Sabha constituencies in

The Congress letter said that if the Commission grants a recognised national party a hearing or examines issues raised by them in good faith it is not an 'exception' or 'indulgence' but it is the performance of a duty which it is re-

"If the Commission is refusing to grant us a hearing or refusing to engage on certain complaints (which it has done in the past) then the law allows recourse to the higher courts' extraordinary jurisdiction to compel the ECI to discharge this function (as happened in 2019)," the letter said.

The leaders said the Congress' communications confine themselves to issues and are written with a regard for the high office of the CEC and his brother Commissioners. If the current ECI's goal is to strip itself of the last vestiges of neutrality, then it is doing a remarkable job at creating that impression," the party said in its letter to the EC.

"Judges who write decisions do not attack or demonise the party raising the issues. However, if the ECI persists then we shall have no choice but to seek legal recourse to expunge such remarks (a remedy with which the ECI is familiar since it unsuccessfully sought to do the same with a high court's unflattering but accurate observations after Covid)," said the letter signed by Ramesh, K C Venugopal, Ashok Gehlot, Bhupinder Hooda, Ajay Maken, Abhishek Singhvi, Uday Bhan, Partap Bajwa and Pawan

In a strongly-worded letter to Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge, the poll panel had said such "frivolous and unfounded" doubts have the potential of creating "turbulence" when crucial steps like polling and counting are in live play, a time when both public and political parties' anxiousness is peaking.

The BJP retained power in Haryana winning 48 of the 90 seats in the October 5 assembly elections with the Congress bagging 37 seats, INLD two and Independents three seats. (PTI)

Kedar confident of defeating CM Shinde in Thane's Kopri-Pachpakhadi

THANE, Nov 1: Shiv Sena (UBT) candidate from Kopri-Pachpakhadi assembly seat Kedar Dighe on Friday exuded confidence that he could pull off a giant-killer act and defeat Maharashtra Chief Minister and Thane strongman Eknath Shinde.

Dighe added that he has the blessings of his uncle late Anand Dighe, a hugely popular leader from the region who is also considered Shinde's mentor, and Shiv Sena founder late Bal Thackeray. In an interview to PTI, Dighe claimed the development vision of Shinde is flawed since he does not take all stakeholders into confidence. "I don't see my electoral debut as a challenge. I am here to win and have confidence and trust of the people, which will help me win. It is the people who decide who will be MP or MLA and represent them," Dighe said.

"The CM's vision of development is flawed. There is no dialogue with stakeholders. The Wagle Estate MIDC has shut down and corporate offices have come up there. Youth are facing unemployment. There are no IAS, IPS training academies (for competitive exams). Roads, bridges, connectors are built and then taxpayers' money is used to fill potholes,' he claimed. Listing more issues in Thane, Dighe said the problems of

slumdwellers have remained unheard for the past 20 years, while the city faces a garbage collection crisis.

"A sum of ₹ 2,000 crore was received for the 'smart city' project, but is Thane a smart city? Unauthorised construction is rampant. There is lack of urban planning. Thanekars have been held to ransom for the last 20 years. Why did the Shinde government announce waiver of toll (at entry points to Mumbai) just ahead of (assembly) polls," he said.

The Shinde government has failed to tackle farmer suicides and curb atrocities against women as well, Dighe further claimed.

"I believe the youth and senior citizens will support me. Senior citizens do not want the next generation to suffer. Youth have been misled. People want to be self-sufficient, but those in power want people to be dependent and vote for them," Dighe asserted. Dighe said his vision for Thane comprised jobs for youngsters and welfare of its people.

Queried about Shinde's supporters constantly harping on the CM being a hands-on leader unlike Uddhav Thackeray, Dighe said, "Why keep saying that I am there for the people. You (CM) are not doing anyone a favour. It is your job to stand by

BJP faults AAP, Kejriwal for Delhi's air woes

NEW DELHI, Nov 1: The BJP on Friday claimed Delhi's air quality had worsened due to AAP and Arvind Kejriwal's failure to repair the city's damaged roads by October 31 and not the firecrackers burst on Diwali.

Leader of Opposition in the Delhi Assembly Vijender Gupta, who visited the Shastri Park area on Friday, claimed hundreds of roads in the city were lying in disrepair despite promises by former chief minister Kejriwal and his successor Atishi to repair them before Diwali.

"AAP should stop indulging in politics and blame game and focus on local sources of pollution such as dust that are more responsible for the hazardous air quality in Delhi," Gupta said.

He said the air pollution situation in Delhi was as bad as it was before Diwali and added that AAP and Kejriwal should stop "misleading" the people. They said the rise in pollution

was due to the firecrackers, indulging in politics over the issue, he charged. "If all the damaged roads in the

city are repaired and sanitation is improved, pollution can be cut down by 50 per cent," he asserted.

The BJP's Delhi unit spokesperson Praveen Shankar Kapoor claimed that comparative Air Quality Index (AQI) data from the past four days would show that pollution levels had not increased due to firecrackers.

The local sources and paddy stubble burning will cause it to shoot up in the coming days, he

A thick layer of haze blanketed Delhi, with the national capital's AQI plunging to 362 on Friday as people defied a citywide ban on firecrackers during Diwali celebrations. Delhi also recorded its most polluted Diwali in three years.

On Diwali on Thursday, the city's 24-hour average AQI was recorded at 330, compared to 218 in 2023 and 312 in 2022, according to Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) data.

The national capital's AQI was recorded in the 'very poor' category with a reading of 362 at 9 am on Friday

An AQI between zero and 50 is considered 'good', 51 and 100 satisfactory', 101 and 200 'moderate', 201 and 300 'poor', 301 and 400 'very poor', 401 and 450 'severe' and above 450 'severe

BJP leader Devender Singh Rana passes away at 59



JAMMU, Nov 1: BJP MLA Devender Singh Rana, who passed away late Thursday night, was a prominent entrepreneur and influential politician often described as the "voice of Jammu".

Rana died at a hospital in Haryana's Faridabad after a brief illness. He was 59 years old.

The legacy of Rana -- who is survived by his wife, two daughters, and a son -- is marked by his remarkable journey from building a multi-crore automobile company to becoming a significant political figure advocating for the "Dogra chief minister" narrative in Jammu and Kashmir. Born into a Dogra family in Doda district in 1965, Rana was the son of former bureaucrat Rajinder Singh Rana and the younger brother of Union Minister of State in the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) Jitendra Singh.

Rana's residence witnessed a long queue of mourners from early morning to offer their condolences to the family.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed shock at the death of Rana and said his "untimely demise is shocking". In a post on X, the prime minister said, "...He

(Rana) was a veteran leader, who worked diligently towards Jammu and Kashmir's progress. He had just won the assembly polls and had also played a noteworthy role in making the BJP stronger in Jammu and Kashmir.' "In this hour of grief, my

thoughts are with his family and supporters. Om Shanti," he added. Union Home Minister Amit Shah also expressed grief over Rana's untimely passing.

"Devendra ji, who was always dedicated to the peace and development of Jammu and Kashmir and the interests of the people, made an invaluable contribution to the progress of the region. His demise is an irreparable loss for the BJP family. I express my condolences to his family and supporters," he said.

Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah, who visited Rana's residence on Friday afternoon, posted an emotional message on his X handle, saying, "The terrible news from late last night isn't really sinking in.

NEW DELHI, Nov 1: The Congress on Friday claimed growing monopolisation by five big conglomerates, including the Adani Group, was linked to India's shaky economic growth, unemployment crisis and high inflation, and asserted that companies must expand but the government had a responsibility to ensure oligopolies or

Viral Acharya established, five big conglomerates -- including the Adani Group -- were building monopolies in 40 sectors, including cement, he said.

"This growing monopolisation is linked to India's shaky economic growth, unemployment crisis, and high inflation. In 2015, when a common man used to spend ₹ 100 on goods, ₹ 18 would go as profit to the business owner -- in 2021, the owner now gets ₹ 36 in profits," Ramesh said in Hindi.

"Firms must grow. Companies must expand. But at the same time, the government has a responsibility to ensure competition is not stifled, oligopolies or monopolies do not emerge, takeovers are free and fair, and undue advantage arising out of access to political power is not exercised," the Congress general secretary said.

The Congress has been persistently attacking the government since Adani Group stocks took a beating on the bourses in the wake of US-based short seller Hindenburg Research making a litany of allegations, including of fraudulent transactions and share-price manipulation, on the conglomerate headed by industrialist Gautam Adani. The Adani Group had dismissed the charges as lies, saying it complied with all laws and disclosure requirements. (PTI)

In a post in Hindi on X, Murmu said she wishes that the people of these states "continue to contribute to the country's development journey and that their lives be filled with peace and prosperity".


Modi also took to X to highlight various features of these states.

NEW DELHI, Nov 1: A Delhi court has acquitted three men in a 2017 attempt to murder case, highlighting serious doubts over the investigation that could not be brushed aside.

Additional Sessions Judge Atul Ahlawat said the motive as an essential element of crime, based on the injured eyewitness' version, was a "double-edged sword" which could also be used to falsely implicate the accused.

The court was hearing the case against Faeem Kureshi, Naeem Kureshi and Hanif Khan, who were accused of allegedly entering complainant Aslam's house on October 18, 2017, and thrashing

During the incident, Faeem also fired upon Aslam, the prosecution

In the 72-page verdict pronounced on October 9, the court noted Aslam's statement according to which his brother Shakil had reached the spot after he was fired at, but underlined some "im-Minister M K Stalin paid tributes provements" in his testimony, where he claimed to have witnessed the entire incident, including the scuffle and Faeem clusion of Tamil-speaking areas in allegedly shooting Aslam.

Calling it a "blow to the prosecution's case", the court noted the absence of bullet holes on Aslam's trousers, which was never sent for forensic analysis.

The court observed neither the alleged weapon of crime was recovered nor the bullets were found on the crime scene and even the blood samples collected from the spot weren't analysed.

'Therefore, it could not be established whether the blood allegedly recovered from the scene of crime pertained to the injured or not. It could not even be established in the present case, that the Madras Presidency as Tamil Nadu,

being or an animal," the judge's verdict underlined

The court further took into account the view of the doctor who treated Aslam not ruling out the possibility of self-infliction of the

"In the present case, there are serious doubts about the investigation, which cannot be brushed aside," it added.

Regarding the motive of previous enmity between the complainant and the accused, the court said motive alone was insuffi-

It said, "Motive in itself is a double-edged sword. In cases which are based upon circumstantial evidence, motive plays an important role, however, not of so much importance in cases based

on eyewitness evidence." The court also observed several lapses in the investigation, including the testimony of the person who called the police helpline number not being recorded; police witness' testimony being "highly dubious and suspicious" and handwriting mismatches in the submitted documents.

"Therefore, it does not inspire any confidence and the possibility of the accused persons being falsely implicated in the present case cannot be ruled out," the court said. (PTI)

Experts cite enforcement gaps for firecracker ban violations in Delhi

NEW DELHI, Nov 1: Gaps in enforcement, limited monitoring, and easy access to firecrackers from the NCR region where restrictions were slack were largely responsible for the widespread flouting of the cracker ban in Delhi on Diwali, experts have opined.

Although the Delhi government had set up 377 enforcement teams and spread awareness through local associations to ensure compliance with the firecracker ban, neighbourhoods across the eastern and western parts of the city reported large-scale flouting of the restrictions.

highlighted firecrackers from neighbouring regions combined with weak onground presence of authorities contributed to the mass violations that left the city shrouded in smog on Thursday.

A senior Delhi Pollution Control Committee (DPCC) official said they conducted several awareness campaigns against bursting crackers but enforcing the ban was the Delhi Police's responsibility.

However, a senior police official denied the "failure of administration" charge, while asserting that legal actions were taken against people found flouting the ban.

The city's air quality dropped to the "very poor" category, with an Air Quality Index (AQI) of 330 at 10 pm on Diwali. Key areas, including Anand Vihar, saw the AQI plunge into the "severe" category while PM2.5 concentrations soared, creating hazardous condi-

tions for respiratory health. Many authorities lacked realtime monitoring tools to control the distribution and usage of firecrackers within city limits, making it challenging to uphold the ban effectively, environment experts

Rajiv Kakria, the convener of Save Our City (SOC), a South Delhi-based collective of resident welfare associations (RWAs). NGOs and activists said the firecracker ban in Delhi was not en-

forced effectively "The porous Delhi-NCR borders make it easy for people to buy firecrackers without any difficulty. It's challenging to impose this ban because while firecrackers are banned in Delhi, those can be easily obtained from neighbouring

"There wasn't adequate checking at the borders and police patrolling was also limited during Diwali," he said.

He added the ineffective enforcement of the ban reflects an institutional failure and also pointed out that "during the COVID-19 pandemic, orders were followed more effectively by both authorities and the public because it was imposed properly".

Atul Goyal, president of United

RWAs Joint Action (URJA), an umbrella body of 2500 RWAs across Delhi, also blamed the slack in strict enforcement of the ban for the widespread bursting of crack-

> "Firecrackers were being sold on the streets in many localities. It's difficult for the police to nab every seller. People had easy access to firecrackers," he said and emphasised the need for a more coordinated regional strategy to ensure compliance across borders.

A senior DPCC official said, "We conducted extensive campaigns and requested people not to burst firecrackers. However, enforcing the ban was under the ju risdiction of the Delhi Police."

This year, the pollution levels on Diwali were not as high as anticipated. However, it is expected to reach the severe category by November 3, an official from Skymet, a private weather forecasting agency, added.

"We expected air quality to fall into the severe category and two factors helped prevent this," said Mahesh Palawat, Vice President of Meteorology and Climate Change at Skymet.

"Since last night, wind began flowing from the northwest at a good speed, which dispersed pollutants. Additionally, the temperature did not drop during Diwali, which often leads to smog formation," he said. (PTI)

Bihar: Police team attacked by villagers in Motihari

MOTIHARI (BIHAR), Nov 1: Two policemen were injured after they were allegedly attacked by villagers in the Paharpur area of Bihar's East Champaran district on Friday when they went there to investigate a case, police said.

But we urge the common people to be more responsive and stop use of banned fireworks and stop bursting crackers after 10 pm.

Two more arrested over gang rape of girl in Bhubaneswar BHUBANESWAR, Nov 1: Two

more persons were arrested on Friday in connection with the gang rape of a 17-year-old girl in Bhubaneswar, police said.

With the fresh arrests, a total of five people, including a female friend of the victim, have been arrested in the case so far.

Police had on Thursday arrested two men, both aged 19 years, and a 16-year-old girl in connection with the incident. Two other persons, aged 21 and

23 years, were also detained. They have been arrested after their involvement in the case was found during investigation, Bhubaneswar DCP Pinak Mishra said.

The girl was allegedly gangraped in a hotel in the Odisha capital on October 16.

A case was registered with Nayapalli police station on Wednesday on the basis of a complaint lodged by the survivor, he

The arrested girl was a common friend of both the victim and the accused and had allegedly introduced the survivor to the accused, another police officer said.

"The accused had allegedly spiked the victim's soft drink with some intoxicant and gangraped her," he said.

The accused had also videotaped the incident and tried to extort the victim and her mother. (PTI)

Fire Breaks out in banquet hall in Delhi's Shahdara



NEW DELHI, Nov 1: A twofloor banquet hall was gutted in a fire that broke out in Delhi's Shahdara, police said on Friday. No casualties were reported.

The police suspects that the fire broke out when a misfired cracker struck the banquet hall. However, the exact cause is

yet to be ascertained, they said. On the night of Diwali, the police was patrolling in the Krishna Nagar area when they saw a banquet hall, in flames, prompting them to call the fire department,

The hall was locked from the outside.

Ten fire tenders were immediately rushed to the spot and doused the flames. The ground, first and second floors of the hall were damaged.

"The crime team inspected the spot and recorded the incident. The forensic science team will also visit the spot for further investigation.

The owner of the building, Rakesh Nagpal, was contacted. The exact cause of the fire remains under investigation,' Deputy Commissioner of Police (Shahdara) Prashant Gautam said.

Meanwhile, the Delhi Fire Services experienced a surge in fire-related calls this Diwali with more than 300 such incidents reported across the city, which is the highest in the past 13 years, an official said on Friday.

According to officials, the increase is attributed to the extensive use of firecrackers.

"The figure marks the highest number of Diwali-related fire and emergency incidents in the past 13 years," DFS chief Atul Garg

The DFS, which had ramped up its readiness for the festival by deploying fire engines and personnel across the city, reported that most calls were received between 5 pm on October 31 and 5 am on November 1. (PTI)

NEW DELHI, Nov 1: Delhi's pollution board claimed that the air quality index did not show any significant change this Diwali even after many flouted pollution

According to a report by the Delhi Pollution Control Committee, the 24-hour average Air Quality Index (AQI) reached 328 on Thursday, rising to 360, a day after Diwali, which avoided a severe

The report stated that the PM2.5 levels decreased by 4 per cent as compared to the Diwali last year. While the PM10 levels, consisting of particulate matter that is 10 micrometres or less in diameter, increased by 11 per cent. PM2.5 are fine inhalable parti-

ally 2.5 micrometres and smaller, and are the greatest risk to health. The acceptable annual standard for PM2.5 is 40 micrograms per cubic However, the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) data

The national capital's AQI was recorded in the 'very poor' category with a reading of 362 at 9 am on Friday.

Most monitoring stations in Delhi showed similar pollution levels, with 37 out of 39 reporting air quality in the 'very poor' category. However, it avoided a severe

spike due to various pollution control efforts implemented across the city, the report said.

A significant reduction in crop residue burning incidents also helped mitigate severe pollution levels. The data revealed a 51 per cent reduction in residue-burning incidents in Punjab, Haryana, and Uttar Pradesh as compared to 2023, contributing to lower overall

regional pollution. The report further underscored the effectiveness of government ef-

forts to combat pollution, stating that a city-wide dust-control campaign was implemented, which included deploying two mobile smog guns in each Assembly constituency.

The Delhi government had en-

forced a comprehensive ban on firecrackers for the fifth consecutive year, prohibiting their manufacture, storage, sale and use. They also set up 377 enforcement teams and spread awareness through local associations to ensure compliance with the ban. Police teams were deployed to monitor neighbourhoods, with officials warning that legal action would be taken

against violators. Additionally, the DPCC monitored six major gaseous pollutants ammonia, sulfur dioxide, nitrogen dioxide, carbon monoxide, ozone, and benzene, all of which remain within the prescribed National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS).

Additionally, DPCC anticipates that air quality in Delhi will stay in the "very poor" category till November 3. (PTI)

Just going whichever way god is showing me: Actor Abhimanyu Kashinath

BENGALURU, Nov 1: The title of his latest film, 'Ellige Payana Yavudo Daari' pretty much sums up his life's journey, said Abhimanyu Kashinath, who plays the hero of the debut film of Kiran Surya.

"I know I want to be a good actor, but I am not sure of my wheres and hows also. Like my film title, I am full of questions too. So, I am doing the next best thing – just going whichever way god is showing me," said Abhimanyu.

Son of Kashinath, one of the legendary actor-directors of the Kannada film industry, Abhimanyu said unlike most star kids, growing up he was busy chasing the dreams of being a cricketer.

"My father always believed that we all must do what we want to do, so he stood by all my decisions. He never said I should try my luck in films instead of cricket. That is how I ended up playing for Bengaluru University," said Abhimanyu.

But despite going for selection matches for the state team at all levels – under 16, 19 and 22 – Abhimanyu said he could not really make the cut.

"I guess there came a point when I had to make up my mind about cricket. So after finishing my college, I decided to get into films," added Abhimanyu.

When he decided to carve a career for himself in the film world, Abhimanyu said his father again took it in his stride. "But he told me to try theatre first, so I understand the nuances of acting. And that is what I did for a couple of years," said Abhimanyu.

While the theatre took care of his acting training, he knew to be a hero in the Insta era, he had to hone his body too.

"If given a choice, I would choose just to act. But nowadays, you have to market yourself too. Whether you like it or not, you have to get on social media and show the world how good you are. I am more on the scrawny side, so I knew I needed to build some mass. I also learnt to dance, and trained myself for stunts..." said Abhimanyu.

Although a newcomer, since his father is a veteran, Abhimanyu said his journey into the film world was somewhat smooth.

"For instance, my first film 'Baaji', which also featured the legendary Anant Nag, was directed by S Shidlaghatta Srinivas, who had trained under my father. I know my father tried to ensure that I did

something different," said Abhimanyu.
His second film, '12am Madhyarathri', a horror film, was produced by his father, who also appeared in a supporting role.
The success that was enjoyed by his father eluded him, said Abhimanyu.

"At the end of the day, it doesn't matter if your father is famous or not. Unless you give a hit, there is no way you can sustain yourself in this industry," he said.

Still, having a mentor like Kashinath was something he never took for granted, said Abhimanyu. So, when his father passed away in 2018, Abhimanyu said he was doubly heartbroken as he lost not just his father but also his mentor.

"For most part my father left me on my own, so I could figure things out for myself. But whenever I went to him with things that were bothering me, he was there to guide me," said Abhimanyu. (PTI)

Directed by Pablo Larrain, known for films like 'Jackie' and


'Spencer', 'Maria' portrays Callas' retreat to Paris following a glamorous yet tumultuous life in the public eye.

'Santosh' a deeply political but accessible film, says director Sandhya Suri

NEW DELHI, Nov 1: British-Indian filmmaker Sandhya Suri says her debut feature "Santosh", which is the UK's official entry to the Oscars, is a deeply political film but she was careful that the story, woven around two female cops, doesn't become "didactic". Set in the interiors of north India, the movie revolves around a widow, played by Shahana Goswami, who gets her late husband's job of a police constable. She and her senior inspector (Sunita Rajwar) are soon sucked into a high profile investigation into the rape and murder of a Dalit teenager.

"My film is deeply political about the role of women and where we are," Suri told PTI in an interview, admitting that she often gets lost for words to talk about the movie in a "bigger way" because she funnelled everything she felt about the subject into her movie.

Suri said she knew from the beginning that her script was strong and hoped that as a director she makes the film "as good as the script".

"I'm happy that I did manage to do that... The key to the story is that it doesn't become didactic or it doesn't become a campaigning film or a militant film," she said. "Santosh" premiered in the Un Certain Regard category at the Cannes Film Festival in May and recently screened at the Mumbai MAMI film festival. It will travel to the Dharamshala International

Film Festival in November.

Suri, who has made critically acclaimed documentaries such as "I For India" and "Around India with a Movie Camera", said the violence perpetuated against women is not a new topic, but it always disturbed her. It was also the starting seed for her movie.

"There's been more media and outrage about some of these incidents in the last 10 years. But I remember reading daily reports about the casual daily violence and how almost depressingly normal it was for these things to happen even before 2012 (the Delhi gangrape and murder case). I was more outraged by the regularity of such incidents. So it was more like a cumulative effect about the violence as opposed to one particular event."

Asked whether not being based in India gave her the necessary distance to explore the caste, gender and political faultlines in her movie, Suri credited her training in documentary filmmaking for helping her approach the topic a certain way.

"For me, it is not about distance. It is about being a documentary maker and having a certain rigor about the level of observation and research, having a lot of respect for detail and putting them in the film... This film, in script and in shooting, elevated in its craft," she said.

While she didn't set out to make a commercial or genre film, Suri is hopeful that when the film



releases in India, "people would want to go and see it". "It just ended up that I made a film on the Indian police. Actually, it is a very accessible film and the actors are so great. I had an amazing run in the cinemas in France."

Suri said the film's release in India is of "supreme importance" to her.

"Î did not make this film for viewers only outside of India... There are things which an Indian audience will definitely pick up that others might not." It was by design that her central protagonist is a housewife-turned-cop because the filmmaker wanted a lower middle class constable, who "does not move in higher circles".

"I just wanted that really normal average woman who goes on this crazy journey. I wanted that type of woman to be seen all over the world."

Suri does not want to make much of the fact that her film is the first Hindi film to represent the UK in the best international film category at the Oscars.

"Given that it is a largely British-funded film with support from France and Germany and that I'm a British filmmaker of Indian origin, it sort of makes sense. In the beginning of this journey, financing myself out of the United Kingdom was difficult but with time, people have become a bit more used to that and I had great support here," she said.

Both "Santosh" and Payal Kapadia's "All We Imagine As Light" screened at Cannes at different times. The director said while she missed meeting Kapadia at the French movie gala where "All We Imagine As Light" won the Grand Prix award, they crossed paths at the Telluride Film Festival later. (PTI)

India to compete in 16-team ITTF Mixed Team World Cup

LAUSANNE, Nov 1: India will compete in the second edition of the ITTF Mixed Team World Cup for the Guoliang-Sörling Trophy along with 15 other teams. The International Table Tennis Federation (ITTF) on Friday unveiled the elite 16-team lineup for the tournament scheduled to be held in Chengdu, China from December 1-8. The hosts China are the defending champions. The other 14 teams to compete are --Australia, Canada, Chinese Taipei, Egypt,

France, Germany, Hong Kong, Japan,

South Korea, Poland, Romania, Singapore, Sweden and the United States of America (USA). The tournament will have a threestage format, with Stage 1 consisting of 16 teams divided into four groups of four.

The highest-ranked sides have been placed in different groups, whereas the remaining teams have been drawn two at a time in seeding order after a snake system. Every group will be competing in a complete round-robin format.

As for Stage 2, the top two sides from

every Stage 1 group will advance and form a single eight-team group, competing in another round-robin format.

However, there will be a strategic variation, as the sides that have already faced each other in Stage 1 won't clash in this round, while their previous results will get carried forward. In Stage 3, the top four teams after Stage 2's standings will make it to the knockout phase featuring the semi-

finals along with the placement matches. The semi-finals will be decided via ranking, with the first-placed team facing the fourth-placed side, while the second goes against the third. Each team's journey terminates with either the final or the bronze medal contest. "This comprehensive format, totalling 52 matches across all stages (24 in Stage 1, 24 in Stage 2, and 4 in Stage 3), guarantees that the eventual champions must demonstrate both consistency through the round-robin phases and excellence in the knockout stage," said ITTF in a release.

All of them can trigger bidding wars but let there be no confusion that Pant will be cynosure of all eyes at the two-day event supposed to be held in third week of December. The Rs 75 crore retention cap on international players coupled with Right To Match cards will certainly make it an intriguing auction as some teams, which have exhausted their retention quotas, will now have to recruit at least 15 more players for a lesser sum.

Challengers Bengaluru (Rs 83 crore) will be making some insane bids Never before in an auction has

one witnessed three IPL captains back in the pool -- Pant of Delhi Capitals, defending champions KKR's Iyer and Lucknow Super Giants' KL Rahul. In case of Pant, more than

India hand New Zealand control after batting flop show on Day 1 in 3rd Test

plot in a matter of 20 minutes, leaving the side at a jittery 86/4 after Ravindra Jadeja and Washington Sundar gave the hosts the early bragging rights by dismissing New Zealand for 235 on an eventful day one of the third and final Test here on Friday.

Jadeja (5/65) and Sundar (4/81) did their job to perfection but India's batting continued to be a weak link as the side lost three wickets in the space of eight balls, starting with Yashasvi Jaiswal's (30) inexplicable reverse slog sweep.

With his 14th five-for in Tests, Jadeja also moved ahead of former pace bowling teammates Zaheer Khan and Ishant Sharma to climb to the fifth spot in the list of highest wicket-takers for India in the format.

With 314 wickets so far, Jadeja is now behind Harbhajan Singh (417 wickets) in

India, who lost by eight wickets in Bengaluru and by 113 runs in Pune, are in a desperate position to remain alive in the race to the World Test Championship final but the contest seems to be slipping away.

If Virat Kohli (4) missed an innocuous full toss to be cleaned up in first innings at Pune was an aberration, the batting maestro ran himself out in ending stages of the first day's play which left India staring at a mountain to climb.

India's rapid fall displayed their fast eroding confidence with the bat as Rohit Sharma (18) too was among those who fell without making a significant dent.

In between the loss of the team's batting pillars, Jaiswal and Shubman Gill (31 not out) forged a 53-run stand for the second



wicket before the closing stage collapse. Rohit, playing only his second Test on his home turf of the Wankhede Stadium, dazzled with a few attractive strokes to get off the blocks quickly but failed to make the most of a reprieve.

William O'Rourke spilled a tough chance at fine leg off Henry when Rohit pulled one towards his left with the fielder also covering fair distance to get to the ball in the fifth

In the seventh, Rohit played awkwardly at a back of a length ball, looking to work it on the leg side, the Indian skipper was perhaps surprised with the bounce as he closed the face of the bat but the ball flew to his counterpart Tom Latham in the sec-

Rohit's fall had Gill joining Jaiswal and the two did try to rebuild before the latter's

Earlier, spinners ruled the roost as Jadeja (5/65) and Washington (4/81) shared nine wickets between them to keep New Zealand to 235 after the visitors opted to bat.

Washington sparkled with a crucial twowicket burst claiming key wickets of New Zealand captain Tom Latham (28) and the in-form Rachin Ravindra (5).

Even though Will Young (71) and Daryl Mitchell (82) played outstanding knocks, on a spin-friendly track, humidity and heat tested the Kiwis' resolve while they pushed

full tilt to counter India's spin threat. Young and Mitchell put New Zealand on track for a big first innings score but Jadeja played a decisive role in pegging them back and handing the advantage to India with his mastery over the pitch and the conditions, picking five wickets along the way.

R Ashwin, deployed first among the Indian spinners, remained wicket-less despite his variations but his bowling partners exploited the pitch perfectly, particularly leftarm Jadeja who bowled comparatively quicker and attacked the wickets.

New Zealand, who crumbled from 159 for three to 235 all out predominantly against Jadeja, did deserve credit for braving the conditions which had their highest scorer in the innings, Mitchell, really struggling in the middle.

The burly batting all-rounder consumed liquids frequently and kept dropping to his haunches and even lay flat on his back as he made a fighting 82 off 129 balls, laced with three fours and as many sixes.

Mitchell felt the heat more than anyone else also because he dealt a lot in singles and doubles until he brought up his maiden fifty of the tour. Each of this three sixes came towards the end

Like Mitchell, Young too looked set for a century but Jadeja's brilliance ended his

Getting one to turn away against Young's front-foot defence, Jadeja had the ball kissing the shoulder of the bat and Rohit did the rest at first slip, bringing an end to a fine knock in which Young scored 71 off 138 balls with four fours and two sixes. (PTI)

Sudharsan, Padikkal rebuild India A with unbeaten fifties after Mukesh rattles Australia A



MACKAY (AUSTRALIA) Nov 1: Rising youngsters Sai Sudharsan and Devdutt Padikkal struck fighting fifties after Mukesh Kumar's searing six-wicket haul to put India A in command with a 120-run lead against Australia A on day two of their first 'Unofficial Test' here on Friday. Mukesh stole the show, claiming 6/46 to help India A restrict Australia A to 195 in their first innings but despite the Bengal seamer's heroic efforts, the hosts secured a crucial 88-run lead. The visitors had scored 107 in their first essay.

India A once again suffered a jittery start in their second innings with skipper Ruturaj Gaikwad and fellow opener Abhimanyu Easwaran getting out cheaply to have India down to 30/2 in 8.5 overs.

Gaikwad, who fell for a golden duck in the first innings, this time nicked Fergus O'Neill to second slip where Cameron Bancroft took a low catch. While Easwaran, who had notched up four consecutive first-class centuries to earn a spot in the senior team as cover for skipper Rohit Sharma for the upcoming Test series against Australia, once again recorded a single-digit score, this time getting run out while backing up for Sai Sudharsan.

But thereafter Sudharsan and Padikkal showed fine temperament and soaked the pressure on the bouncy pitch to produce an unbroken 178-run stand for the third wicket to help India seize control. Sudharsan hit nine boundaries in his 185-ball 96, while Padikkal was unbeaten on 80 from 167 balls, scoring five fours.

Padikkal played a patient yet composed knock, working the ball around for quick singles and capitalising on loose deliveries to reach his fifty. At the other end, Sudharsan exhibited his range of shots, particularly adept at dispatching anything short, cutting and pulling with precision. His well-timed boundaries, including a powerful pull past square leg and a fluent cover drive, allowed him to reach his own half-century as they took the team past 200.

India A now have an overall lead of 120 runs with two more days left in the four-day fixture. The second and final unofficial Test is scheduled in Melbourne from November 7. Earlier resuming at 99/4 on Day 2, overnight batters Nathan McSweeney and Cooper Connolly added 51 runs for the fifth wicket, the match's first fifty-run stand.

However, Mukesh who bagged two wickets on the opening day, once again broke the partnership by dismissing Connolly.

Josh Philippe became Mukesh's fourth victim, while Nitish Kumar Reddy dismissed captain McSweeney, leaving Australia A reeling at 136/7 in 47.4 overs. A frustrating 41-run stand for the eighth wicket between Todd Murphy and O'Neill was finally broken when Prasidh Krishna claimed the latter en route to his third scalp.

Agartala may become KKR's second home ground next year



AGARTALA, Nov 1: The under-construction international cricket stadium at Narsingarh in Tripura could become Kolkata Knight Riders' second home ground for the 2025 IPL season since the iconic Eden Garden in Kolkata is set for a massive makeover next year, a Tripura Cricket Association (TCA) official said on Friday.

The construction at the international stadium at Narsingarh began way back in 2017 with an estimated cost of Rs. 185 crore but the stadium is not yet ready.

"IPL chairman Arun Kumar Dhumal recently visited the proposed international stadium at Narsingarh on the outskirts of the state capital. He said if the stadium's is ready before February next year, it could be made second home ground of KKR or some else other state will get the benefit," TCA secretary Subarta Dey told PTI.

"Since it is a golden chance to host IPL matches at the proposed stadium, we have summoned a reputed construction agency to expedite work and get it completed by February 2025.

"The TCA will review the construction work and if the agency fails to meet the deadline, we will terminate it and engage a new firm to complete the remaining work," he

The agency has so far completed 80 percent in the past seven years even as the deadline of the project was only 22 months Dey said the matter was discussed during the TCA's

general body meeting held here on Thursday where it was decided to go for all-out to get the stadium works completed by the stipulated time.

"If we could complete the stadium's work by February next year, I am confident of hosting at least two IPL matches of KKR at Narsingarh international cricket sta-

Lewis cuts loose as West Indies beat England by 8 wickets in the rain-affected 1st ODI

NORTH SOUND (ANTIGUA), Nov 1: Evin Lewis hit four times as many sixes as the entire England team in a commanding innings of 94 which led the West Indies to an eight-wicket win in the rain-affected first one-day international.

First-time captain Liam Livingstone hit two sixes in a top score of 48 in his team's under-par total of 209. That was England's best performance as it was bowled out in 45.1 overs on a tricky pitch on which only Lewis flourished.

The left-handed Lewis hit eight sixes in his innings of only 69 balls but was out 13 runs before the West Indies reached their Duckworth-Lewis System revised total of 157 to lead the threematch ODI series. No overs were lost when rain extended the interval between innings but the West Indies innings was reduced by 15 overs after a lengthy rain break after the 15th over.

They already were in command, thanks to Lewis. He had reached his half century from 46 balls before the rain came and the West Indies were 81-0, 48 runs ahead of the Duckworth Lewis calculation though they had to face 20 overs for the result

Lewis returned to the West Indies ODI lineup for the first time in almost three years during their recent tour to Sri Lanka, scoring an unbeaten 102 in the third one-day international in Pallekele. That was his last innings before Thursday and he narrowly missed back-to-back centuries.

Lewis was the only batter to command tricky conditions at the Sir Viv Richards Stadium. During the England innings, deliveries from both the seamers and spinners tended to grip and hold up, making expansive stroke play difficult.

Brandon King made 30 in a 118-run opening partnership with Lewis and Keacy Carty was 19 not out when the West Indies won with 9.1 overs remaining.

Livingstone's 48 and Sam Curran's 37 in a 72-run partnership for the fifth wicket provided the backbone of England's innings. Both batters were undone by left-arm spinner Gudakesh Motie, who took 4-41.

England may have struggled because it was coming off a test series against Pakistan while the West Indies have been playing white-ball cricket in Sri Lanka.(AP)

players want more time in the nets instead. Rohit Sharma and his men will head to Australia after a shocking home series loss to New Zealand. Vying for a third straight Test series victory in Australia, the tourists will face added pressure, as a place in the World Test Championship final is also at stake. It is understood that since the bounce of the WACA

centre strip resembles that of the Perth Stadium track, all top order batters would prefer more time in the middle An intra squad match might not work in that scenario as if a batter gets out cheaply, then he might not immediately get a chance to bat again on the centre strip.

Four senior players led IPL retention discussions: MI coach Jayawardene NEW DELHI, Nov 1: Mumbai In-

dians head coach Mahela Jayawardene has disclosed that the team's senior quartet - Rohit Sharma, Jasprit Bumrah, Hardik Pandya, and Suryakumar Yadav- was actively involved in discussions about captaincy and retentions for the IPL's 2025 season. The five-times champions have

retained the quartet of Bumrah, Suryakumar, Pandya and Rohit along with youngster Tilak Verma. "We had extensive discussions.

These four senior guvs led those discussions. Obviously, what happened last season, as well as how we collectively move forward that was crucial for us to align in that right direction," Jayawardene told Jio Cinema on Thursday.

"So coaching staff, owners, management and these four guys the direction came from them, what needs to be done, how it needs to go about.

MI have paid the top retention price of ₹ 18 crore to pace spearhead Bumrah while Suryakumar and Pandya have been retained for an equal retention price of ₹ 16.35 crore each.
