# Perpetrators of attack identified; 3 sketches released

## J-K bloodbath: India promises strong response in 'near future' as families mourn their dead

**SRINAGAR/NEW DELHI, April 23:** A day after 26 people were ruthlessly gunned down in Kashmir's Pahalgam town, security agencies on Wednesday released sketches of three Pakistani terrorists as a grim Centre took stock of the situation and anguished families said adieu to the men they had loved and lost.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who cut short his visit to Saudi Arabia, met external affairs minister S Jaishankar and national security advisor Ajit Doval in the morning at the airport itself. In the evening, he chaired a meeting of the Cabinet Committee on Security to formulate India's response.

"People responsible for such acts will get a strong response in the near future," defence minister Rajnath Singh said.

Reflecting the government's resolve in the face of the deadliest terror attack since the Pulwama strike and the abrogation of Article 370 in 2019, he added, "We will not only trace those who perpetrated the attack but also trace those who



conspired to commit this nefarious act on our soil."

Singh also reviewed the security situation in Jammu and Kashmir with Chief

of Defence Staff Gen Anil Chauhan, the three service chiefs, defence secretary and the director general of military operations.

## Arrangements made to bring back Assam family: CM

**GUWAHATI, April 23:** The Assam government is making arrangements to bring back a family that survived the terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir, the Chief Minister's Office said on Wednesday. "The @CMOfficeAssam has spoken to a survivor from Assam of the dastardly #PahalgamTerrorAttack and has taken a full brief of the incident which they have faced yesterday," the CMO said in a post on X.

"The entire family's return to the State is being arranged on priority and the Government of Assam is in touch with the Govt of India to bring the family back to Assam at the earliest," it added. Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma said the person is a faculty member of Assam University in Silchar and he was in Kashmir on a family holiday.

It is learnt that Singh directed the armed forces to enhance their combat readiness and increase intensity of anti-terror operations.

It was a day of hushed silences, angry discussions and cries of despair as an entire nation mourned those killed in the brazen attack targeting holidayers in the

scenic expanse of the Baisaran meadow, six kilometres from Pahalgam.

Other ministers, including Union home minister Amit Shah, also issued strong statements.

Shah, who visited Baisaran, met the injured in hospital and chaired security review meetings, also signalled the intent

of the government.

"Bharat will not bow to terror. The culprits of this dastardly terror attack will not be spared," he said. Those behind the Pahalgam atrocity will face severe consequences, Shah added.

## Kharge, Rahul speak with HM Shah, J-K CM

**NEW DELHI, April 23:** Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge and former party chief Rahul Gandhi have spoken with home minister Amit Shah, Jammu and Kashmir chief minister Omar Abdullah and senior party leaders from the union territory to get an update on Tuesday's horrific Pahalgam terror attack, asserting that the families of the victims deserve justice.

Kharge urged the central government to talk to all the political parties to ensure security in Jammu and Kashmir.

The Congress chief said that late on Tuesday night, he spoke to home minister Shah, J-K chief minister Abdullah, and senior J-K Congress leaders about the despicable carnage in Pahalgam that killed at least 26 people, mostly tourists.

"The perpetrators of this heinous terror attack must not go unpunished. The innocent victims must get justice," Kharge said in a post on X.

"Unity in action in the wake of adversity is the need of the hour. This cross-border terror attack should be responded to with an adequate and resolute reply," he said.

"Government of India must talk to all the political parties to ensure security in Jammu and Kashmir and make every possible effort to ensure the safety of tourists," Kharge added.

Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha, Rahul Gandhi, also said he spoke to Shah, Abdullah, and J-K Congress chief Tariq Karra about the horrific terror attack in Pahalgam to get an update on the situation.

The Congress leader, who's currently on a visit to the US, asserted that the families of the victims deserve justice and "our fullest support".

"Spoke with HM Amit Shah, J-K CM Omar Abdullah, and J-K PCC President Tariq Karra about the horrific Pahalgam terror attack. Received an update on the situation," he said in a post on X.

## Cowardly strike on innocent citizens will evoke strong response: Govt

**NEW DELHI, April 23:** After political parties called for hunting down the terrorists responsible for the Pahalgam attack on tourists, the Centre asserted on Wednesday that the "cowardly" strike on innocent citizens will soon evoke a "strong response".

Home Minister Amit Shah, who visited the attack site in Baisaran, near Pahalgam town in south Kashmir's Anantnag district, asserted that the country will not bend down before terror and those responsible for the heinous act will not be spared.

Shah reached Baisaran in a helicopter and was briefed by security officials on the sequence of events and the possible routes the terrorists took to reach the popular tourist spot, which is surrounded by thick pine forests. Shah later met the injured in the Anantnag hospital and

also called on the families of those killed in the attack.

After laying wreaths on the bodies of the victims, Shah said on X: "Bharat will not bend to terror. The culprits of this dastardly terror attack will not be spared."

As outrage and widespread condemnation poured in a day after the terrorists killed at least 26 people, mostly tourists, the country saw protests at several places, including in Jammu and Kashmir where a bandh was observed.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi held a meeting of the Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS) and took stock of the situation. Shah briefed the meeting after his visit to Jammu and Kashmir. The meeting was also attended by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and External Affairs Minister S (CONTD. ON PAGE-2)

## Time to show India's strength to Pakistan: Himanta on Pahalgam terror attack

**GUWAHATI, April 23:** A day after the Pahalgam terror attack that claimed 26 lives, Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Wednesday asserted that the time has come to demonstrate India's strength to Pakistan and deal firmly with its sympathisers within the country.

Sarma claimed that the terrorists killed people in south Kashmir after asking about their religion and targeted only Hindus.

The Assam CM claimed, "This is the first time that terrorists asked about religion before killing the people. Our people should understand that for Pakistan, there is no OBC, SC and ST among Hindus. It is only Hindus."

Terrorists struck at Baisaran in Pahalgam on Tuesday, killing at least 26 people, mostly tourists, and injuring several others.

Syed Adil Hussain Shah, a 30-year-old local pony ride operator, was among the deceased. He was laid to rest on Wednesday at the ancestral graveyard at his Hapatnagar village in Pahalgam with chief minister Omar Abdullah turning up to offer 'fatiha' to him and hailing his courage to stand up against the armed assailants.

He strongly believes that Prime Minister Narendra Modi will "handle" Pakistan, but it is time to know those who live in India and behave like Pakistanis.

He alleged that these people are trying to divide the Hindus and the society.

"They are more dangerous. The time has come to show our strength to Pakistan and its friends inside our country. I strongly believe that the nation will definitely teach them a

lesson," the CM asserted. Sarma said that what happened in Pahalgam is really concerning and is beyond any words to condemn it, and alleged that the Pakistani Army chief had threatened the Hindus seven days ago, and now the incident has taken place.

"We have political leaders in India who search for castes among the Hindus, but terrorists do not look for castes. If you are Hindu, then they will kill you. If you belong to other religions, then you are alive," Sarma said. (PTI)

## President Murmu postpones Assam visit due to J&K terror attack

**GUWAHATI, April 23:** President Droupadi Murmu's scheduled two-day visit to Assam later this week has been postponed following the terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir, officials said on Wednesday.

Murmu was slated to reach Guwahati on Thursday evening to take part in two official functions the next day.

"We received a communication from the Rashtrapati Bhavan informing us of the postponement of the visit due to the attack. It will be rescheduled at a later date," an official of the Assam Governor's Secretariat told PTI.

On Friday, Murmu was scheduled to confer the Srimanta Sankardeva Award to dance exponent Noman Mansingh at a state government function.

She was also invited to be the chief guest for the 32nd convocation of Gauhati University, scheduled to take place on Friday afternoon.

## Two in police custody, eight in jail for youth's death in Jorhat assault case

## Assam MP stayed in Pakistan for 15 days without informing Indian govt: Himanta

**GUWAHATI, April 23:** Without taking the name of Congress MP Gaurav Gogoi, Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Wednesday said one parliamentarian from the state had stayed in Pakistan for 15 days without intimation to the Indian government.

The Assam CM and the BJP have been attacking Gogoi, the Deputy Leader of Congress in Lok Sabha, over his British wife Elizabeth Colburn's alleged connection with Pakistan's spy agency ISI.

"The Assam government has information that one parliamentarian from the state had stayed 15 days in Islamabad. He also has a relationship with the Pakistan embassy. Many more information will come to light," Sarma told reporters on the sidelines of a campaign meeting for panchayat elections.

By September 30, the people of the state will see with evidence how the son of a proud father went against the nation, he added.



"We got proof that he stayed in Islamabad for 15 days without any intimation to the Indian government. We have many more proofs. So, I believe he learnt how to read namaz there itself," Sarma said.

The Assam CM has been attacking Gogoi for his pictures and videos showing his offering namaz during the Ramzan and Eid festivals.

"Pakistan is our big enemy, but those praising Pakistan while staying in the country are even a bigger enemy. We can identify the outside enemy, but it's not possible to know the enemy inside our home."

"We have got a lot of information. By September, we will submit all the (CONTD. ON PAGE-2)

## Shutdown against terror attack in Kashmir valley, first time in 35 years

**SRINAGAR, April 23:** Kashmir valley observed a shutdown against a terror attack for the first time in 35 years on Wednesday as organisations from all walks of life supported the bandh call to protest the killings in Pahalgam tourist resort, officials said.

Terrorists struck at a prime tourist location in Pahalgam in south Kashmir on Tuesday, killing at least 26 people, mostly tourists, and injuring several others.

Security has been beefed up across the valley, especially at vital tourist spots.

Most of the shops, fuel stations and other business establishments were shut in Srinagar, the officials said.

They said only shops dealing in essential commodities were open across the city.

Public transport was also sparse, but private vehicles were plying normally, they added.

Private schools were also shut

across the valley, but government schools were open, the officials said.

The effect of the shutdown was also witnessed in the other district headquarters of the valley, they said.

Peaceful protests were also held at several places in the valley, with the protestors denouncing the attack. They called for stopping the killing of innocent people.

Several political parties, socio-religious organisation, trade bodies, and civil society groups called for a shutdown in Kashmir to protest against the attack in Baisaran meadows of the Pahalgam resort in south Kashmir's Anantnag district.

The ruling National Conference (NC), Peoples Democratic Party (PDP), Peoples' Conference, and Apni Party were among the political outfits that supported the shutdown to protest the attack.

## India, US trade talks from April 23 in Washington; to give impetus to BTA negotiations

**NEW DELHI, April 23:** Indian and US officials will begin deliberations on the proposed bilateral trade agreement in Washington from Wednesday with an aim to iron out issues and give an impetus to the negotiations.

The US has stated that the pact with India will help open new markets for American goods and create new opportunities for workers, farmers, and entrepreneurs in both countries.

According to the US Trade Representative, the United States is looking at increasing market access, reducing tariffs and non-tariff barriers, and negotiating a robust set of additional commitments to ensure long-term benefits.

The US has on multiple occasions



flagged concerns on widening trade deficit with India, which is USD 45.7 billion in 2024. It would look at bridging this deficit with India through the BTA.

The two have finalised the terms of reference (ToR) for the agree-

ment. The three-day talks assume significance as the US has paused the imposition of tariffs for 90 days.

The ToRs cover around 19 chapters, such as tariffs, non-tariff barriers, and customs facilitation.

An official said these talks would lead to the formal launch of negotiations for the bilateral trade agreement (BTA).

India's chief negotiator, Additional Secretary in the Department of Commerce Rajesh Agrawal, is leading the team for the first in-person talks between the two countries.

On April 15, commerce secretary Sunil Barthwal had stated that India will try to close the negotiations as quickly as possible with the US.

India and the US have been engaged in negotiating a bilateral trade agreement since March. Both sides have targeted to conclude the first phase of the pact by the fall (September-October) of this year, with an aim to more than double the bilateral trade (CONTD. ON PAGE-2)

## 22 Meghalaya children return from Karnataka



**SHILLONG, April 23:** Twenty-two children from Meghalaya studying in an illegal private boarding school in Karnataka were handed over to their parents here on Wednesday, an official said.

Meghalaya Social Welfare minister Paul Lyngdoh was present in the ceremony where the children were handed over to their parents.

Of the 22 children, four were from East Khasi Hills district, seven from West Jaintia Hills district, eight from East Jaintia Hills district and three from West Khasi Hills district, the official said. (PTI)

# Hospitality industry braces for Kashmir travel booking cancellations

**NEW DELHI, April 23:** Anticipating largescale travel booking cancellations for Jammu and Kashmir in the aftermath of the terrorist attack in Pahalgam, aggregators on Wednesday said they are working with airlines and hotels to offer free date change and cancellation waivers to travellers.

Hospitality industry players expect the terror attack to sow fear in the minds of tourists who were keen to visit Jammu and Kashmir, adversely affecting the livelihoods of people in the state who are dependent on tourism.

At least 26 people -- mostly tourists -- were killed by terrorists on Tuesday at the Baisaran meadows in Pahalgam.

"As per the early observations, flight cancellations jumped 7x, and a drop in future bookings by nearly 40 per cent," said Manjari Singhal, Chief Growth and Business Officer, Cleartrip.

"As travellers navigate this difficult situation, our teams are working round the clock with airline and hotel partners to provide flexibility and assistance on bookings/ cancellations. Our on-ground team is doing everything in their capacity to offer support to travellers. We remain committed to providing continued assistance to both our customers and partners during this difficult time," a MakeMyTrip spokesperson said.



EaseMyTrip Chairman and Founder Nishant Pitti said, "In light of the ongoing situation in Srinagar, we at EaseMyTrip are fully committed to supporting our customers who are travelling to or from Srinagar. We understand the uncertainty this situation may cause and are here to minimise any inconvenience to your travel plans.

FAITH (Federation of Associations in Indian Tourism & Hospitality) General Secretary Rajiv Mehra said for the people of Jammu & Kashmir, tourism is not just a livelihood, it is their pride, their legacy and their hope.

"This attack has not only harmed innocent lives but has also dealt a cruel blow to the thousands of families who depend on tourism to survive. From houseboat owners and hoteliers to local guides and artisans, every individual in this chain of warmth and welcome is affected," he observed.

Indian Association of Tour Operators (IATO) also expressed its deep anguish and pain on selected targeting of tourists in Kashmir by a group of terrorists, saying it strongly condemns the cowardly terror attack "which is clearly designed to deeply impact tourism in Kashmir and create an atmosphere of fear."

"We are shocked and appalled at these attacks in our country. Since 2020, the J&K region has seen a steady upswing in tourism numbers going from 3 million in 2020 to close to 24 million in 2024," said Arjun Baljee, President, Royal Orchid Hotels.

"This 8x huge surge in tourists impacts and improves the lives of the long-tail of the tourism industry and leads to the prosperity of the locals. The Pahalgam attacks will sow fear in the tourists who want to visit this beautiful region and set it back in the near term," Baljee added. (PTI)

## Rupee falls 25 paise to settle at 85.44 against US dollar

**MUMBAI, April 23:** The rupee depreciated 25 paise and settled for the day at 85.44 (provisional) against the US dollar on Wednesday, on surge in crude oil prices and importer demand for the American currency. Forex traders said the American currency recovered, supported by Donald Trump's softened stance -- particularly towards the Federal Reserve and China.

However, positive domestic markets and weak US dollar index and foreign fund inflows supported the domestic unit at lower levels.

Forex traders said the market found support after Trump on Tuesday backed off from threats to fire FED Chair Jerome Powell after days of intensifying criticism against him for not cutting rates. Trump also signalled the possibility of lower tariffs against China. At the interbank foreign exchange, the domestic unit opened at 85.24, and touched an intra-day low of 85.52 against the greenback. The unit ended the session at 85.44 (provisional), registering a loss of 25 paise over its previous closing level.

On Tuesday, the rupee settled lower by 4 paise at 85.19 against the US dollar. "We expect the rupee to trade with a positive bias amid risk on sentiments in the global markets and FII inflows. Overall weakness in the US dollar may also support the rupee."

"However, rising crude oil prices and importer buying of dollars may cap sharp upside. Traders may take cues from PMI data from the US today. USDINR spot price is expected to trade in a range of 85.20 to 85.80," said Anuj Choudhary -- Research Analyst at Mirae Asset Sharekhan.

Meanwhile, the dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was trading higher by 0.02 per cent at 98.93. Brent crude, the global oil benchmark, rose 1.32 per cent to USD 68.33 per barrel in futures trade. In the domestic equity market, the 30-share BSE Sensex climbed 520.90 points, or 0.65 per cent, to settle at 80,116.49, while the Nifty rose 161.70 points, or 0.67 per cent, to 24,328.95. (PTI)

security agencies released the sketches of three of the five men suspected to be involved in the terror attack. They are all Pakistanis, officials said, identifying them as Asif Fauji, Suleman Shah and Abu Talha.

They had code names -- Moosa, Yunus and Asif -- and were involved in terror-related incidents in Poonch. Prepared with the help of survivors, the pencil sketches were in black and white. From the line drawings, they appear to be young and have beards.

The Resistance Front (TRF), a shadow outfit of the banned Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terror group, claimed responsibility for the attack on Tuesday afternoon.

The attack comes barely a week after Pakistan Army chief Asim Munir announced in Islamabad that it will continue to extend support to the so-called Kashmir cause. Significantly, LeT cadres earlier this month issued provocative anti-India slogans in Rawalakot on April 18, officials said.

As the top government brass met in Delhi and Srinagar to assess the security implications and strategise on what lies ahead, the families and friends of the 26 men, mostly tourists holidaying in Kashmir, dealt with their individual, very personal tragedies.

Like the wife of 26-year-old Navy officer Lt Vinay Narwal. The couple had got married just a few days ago. Visuals of the young woman breaking down as her husband's coffin arrived at the Delhi airport shook the nation. "They were planning a honeymoon in Switzerland, but decided to go to Kashmir instead taking into account the leave he had..." the Narwals' neighbour Seema told reporters in Karnal.

Crowds jostled with each other and slogans went up when his flower bedecked coffin reached Karnal. And in Kanpur, another bride saw her husband being killed in cold blood. Shubham Dwivedi, a 31-year-old businessman from Kanpur, got married just two months ago in February.

He had gone with his wife and family for a weeklong vacation. The newly-weds couple decided to go horse riding around noon on Tuesday when they were confronted by terrorists who asked him to recite an Islamic verse. When he could not, they shot him in the head, his family said.

Hundreds of kilometres away in Kochi, the family of 65-year-old Ramchandran also contemplated a life without him. He had travelled to Kashmir with his wife, daughter and grandchildren who had come from Dubai. But the holiday was never to be. Ramchandran was shot dead in front of his daughter, family sources said.

The stories played out in a tragic echo across many homes. And in ground zero, Kashmiris sent out a clear message - Not In My Name. People poured into the streets across towns and villages to express their grief and condemn the massacre of innocent civilians.

## Upward trend of gold prices

Gold's surge past the \$3,500 mark represents more than just another financial milestone—it is a profound reflection of global market anxieties, geopolitical tremors, and a shifting investment paradigm that places growing scepticism on the stability and credibility of traditional economic hegemonies, particularly that of the United States. This year alone, gold has rallied an extraordinary 30 percent, a performance that is both historic in its pace and revealing in its implications. Market watchers now eye the \$4,000 level as the next benchmark, with Goldman Sachs predicting it could be breached by mid-next year. Other analysts have not ruled out the possibility of gold reaching \$5,000 in the not-so-distant future, signalling that what may appear as speculative exuberance is actually rooted in a deep and broad reassessment of risk. At the core of this gold rally is an erosion of confidence in the U.S. economy and its leadership in the global financial system. This loss of faith is not sudden, but has accelerated dramatically in recent months. The United States, long considered the anchor of financial stability, is increasingly seen as a source of uncertainty. Political volatility, particularly under President Trump's administration, initiated a series of aggressive economic policies that continue to reverberate. Chief among these was the forced trade war with China—a move intended to secure American economic interests but which has instead triggered a cascade of retaliatory actions, tariffs, and a general souring of bilateral relations between the world's two largest economies.

The fallout from this trade confrontation has not been limited to tariffs alone. Technology restrictions have intensified, with American firms being barred from supplying key components to Chinese tech giants, and Beijing responding in kind. These actions have effectively split the global tech landscape, complicating supply chains and introducing long-term unpredictability into investment decisions. As capital markets begin to fragment along geopolitical lines, the notion of a seamless global economy—already wounded by the pandemic—is increasingly being replaced by a more fractured, ideologically polarised model. In such an environment, assets that are free from counterparty risk, like gold, become extremely attractive. Gold's resurgence, then, is not merely a function of inflation hedging or low interest rates, though both play a role. It is fundamentally a reaction to geopolitical breakdown and a perceived weakening of U.S. economic stewardship.

The transformation in gold's market role also reflects a broader philosophical shift. Over the past decade, investors have been groomed to accept the primacy of fiat currencies and central bank control. The Federal Reserve's interventions during the 2008 crisis and again during the COVID-19 pandemic reaffirmed the dollar's dominance and the potency of monetary policy. But as government debt balloons, fiscal irresponsibility rises, and political division paralyzes legislative processes, the confidence in the long-term sustainability of such economic models is fading. Investors are beginning to ask: what happens when the debt is no longer serviceable at low rates? What happens when inflation resurfaces, and monetary authorities are constrained in their responses? It is suggested that the traditional inverse correlation between rates and gold prices is being overshadowed by a deeper, more structural reassessment of financial risk and monetary credibility.

On April 22, 2025, the serene and picturesque valley of Pahalgam in Jammu and Kashmir, often referred to as the "mini Switzerland" of India, was shattered by a brutal terrorist attack that left the nation reeling. The attack, one of the deadliest targeting civilians in the region in recent years, claimed the lives of at least 26 people, including tourists, locals, and a naval officer, while injuring several others. The incident, which unfolded in the Baisaran meadow, a popular tourist destination accessible only by foot or pony, sent shockwaves across India and drew widespread condemnation from political leaders, international figures, and civil society. The Resistance Front (TRF), a proxy outfit of the Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Taiba, claimed responsibility for the assault, raising fresh concerns about the security situation in Kashmir as the region prepares for the annual Amarnath Yatra pilgrimage.

Pahalgam, nestled in the Anantnag district of Jammu and Kashmir, has long been a jewel in India's tourism crown. Known for its lush green meadows, crystal-clear rivers, and snow-capped mountains, the area attracts thousands of domestic and international tourists every year. The Baisaran meadow, located approximately five kilometers from Pahalgam's main town, is a particular draw for visitors seeking tranquility and natural beauty. On the afternoon of April 22, the meadow was bustling with tourists enjoying pony rides, savoring local snacks, or simply soaking in the scenic vistas. Families, trekkers, and adventure enthusiasts milled around, unaware of the horror that was about to unfold. At around 2:30 PM, a group of heavily armed militants, reportedly dressed in fatigues resembling police or army uniforms, descended from the surrounding forests and opened fire indiscriminately on the unsuspecting crowd.

Eyewitness accounts paint a harrowing picture of the chaos that ensued. One survivor, a woman whose identity remains undisclosed, recounted the terror of watching her husband being shot in the head at point-blank range. "We were just eating bhelpuri when he came and shot my husband," she told reporters, her voice trembling with shock and grief. She claimed the

gunman singled out her husband after determining he was not Muslim, a chilling detail that suggests the attackers may have targeted victims based on religious identity. Another video circulating online captured a woman sobbing uncontrollably, pleading for help as she tended to a severely injured man. "Please save my husband," she cried, her words barely audible amidst the pandemonium. Visuals from the scene showed bodies strewn across the meadow, with locals and security forces scrambling to assist the wounded. The meadow, once a symbol of peace, was transformed into a scene of carnage, with blood staining the grass and cries of anguish piercing the air.

The attack's scale and brutality stunned authorities and civilians alike. Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah, in a statement on X, described the assault as "much larger than anything we've seen directed at civilians in recent years."

He expressed shock and outrage, calling the perpetrators "animals, inhuman, and worthy of contempt." While refraining from confirming the exact death toll initially, Abdullah noted that the numbers were still being ascertained, with official figures to be released as the situation became clearer. Later reports confirmed that at least 26 people had been killed, including two foreign nationals from Israel and Italy, tourists from states like Gujarat, Maharashtra, Karnataka, and Tamil Nadu, and a 26-year-old Indian Navy officer, Lieutenant Vinay Narwal, who was on leave from his posting in Kochi. The injured, numbering at least 12, were rushed to local hospitals, with some in critical condition. Medical teams worked tirelessly to stabilize the wounded, while helicopters were deployed to evacuate those trapped in the remote meadow.

The response from security forces was swift but complicated by the terrain. Baisaran's inaccessibility, reachable only by foot or horseback, posed significant challenges for rescue and counter-terrorism op-

erations. Local residents played a crucial role in the immediate aftermath, using ponies to transport the injured down from the meadow to awaiting ambulances. Security personnel, including the Indian Army, Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF), and Jammu and Kashmir Police, cordoned off the area and launched a massive anti-terrorist operation to hunt down the assailants. Preliminary investigations suggest the attackers may have infiltrated from Kishtwar in Jammu, traveling through Kokernag in South Kashmir to reach Baisaran. The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has since taken over the probe, with authorities vowing to bring the perpetrators to justice.

The attack drew immediate condemnation from India's top leadership.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who was on an official visit to Saudi Arabia at the time, spoke with Union Home Minister Amit Shah over the phone and directed him to take all necessary measures. In a post on X, Modi condemned the attack as a "heinous act" and assured the nation that those responsible would not be spared. "Our resolve to fight terrorism is unshakable, and it will get even stronger," he wrote, extending condolences to the families of the deceased and prayers for the speedy recovery of the injured. Shah, who cut short his engagements in Delhi to travel to Srinagar, arrived in the city on the night of April 22 and headed straight to Raj Bhawan for a high-level security review meeting. Accompanied by Chief Minister Omar Abdullah, Shah was briefed by local commanders and intelligence officials, including Intelligence Bureau Chief Tapan Deka and CRPF chief Gyanendra Pratap Singh. The Home Minister reiterated the government's commitment to delivering the "harshest consequences" to the perpetrators, emphasizing that the attack would not go unpunished.

Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha, in a series of posts on X, echoed the sentiments of Modi and Shah, calling the attack a "cowardly

and despicable act." He assured the public that security forces had launched extensive search operations and that the district administration was providing immediate medical attention to the injured. Sinha also announced the establishment of a 24/7 emergency help desk at the Police Control Room in Anantnag to assist tourists and their families. The attack's timing, during the peak tourist season and just months before the Amarnath Yatra scheduled to begin on July 3, heightened concerns about the safety of visitors to the region. Pahalgam serves as a key starting point for the pilgrimage, which draws thousands of devotees annually, and authorities have since intensified security measures, including increased patrolling and surveillance, to prevent further incidents.

The attack also sparked outrage among political leaders across party lines. Former Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Mehbooba Mufti, president of the People's Democratic Party, condemned the violence as "unacceptable" and called for a thorough investigation to identify the perpetrators and examine potential security lapses. "Historically, Kashmir has welcomed tourists warmly, making this rare incident deeply concerning," she wrote on X. BJP leader Ravinder Raina attributed the attack to "Pakistani terrorists," asserting that they targeted unarmed civilians because they could not confront India's security forces. Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi described the attack as a "crime against humanity," while Defence Minister Rajnath Singh labeled it an "act of cowardice." Even international figures, such as Israeli Foreign Minister Gideon Sa'ar and U.S. Vice President JD Vance, who was on a personal visit to India, expressed their condolences, with Vance noting the "devastating" impact of the attack on a country he had come to admire for its beauty and hospitality.

The attack's broader implications have reignited debates about the security situation in Jammu and Kashmir, particularly in the wake of the revocation of the region's special status in 2019. While militant activ-

ities have declined in recent years, sporadic incidents of violence continue to disrupt the region's fragile peace. The TRF's claim of responsibility, coupled with their stated intent to target "outsiders" and disrupt tourism, suggests a deliberate strategy to destabilize the region's economy and sow fear among visitors. Tourism, a vital lifeline for Kashmir's economy, saw 3.5 million visitors in 2024, and incidents like the Pahalgam attack threaten to undo years of progress in promoting the region as a safe destination. Local residents, who rely heavily on tourism for their livelihoods, expressed distress over the attack's impact. "It is a big loss for us. Our source of income has been snatched," said Mohd. Umar, a local resident, in an interview with ANI.

In the aftermath of the attack, protests erupted across Jammu and Kashmir, with political outfits like the Congress and various right-wing groups announcing demonstrations to condemn the violence. Security was beefed up in key cities like Mumbai and Jammu to prevent any spillover of unrest. Meanwhile, state governments, including Kerala and Karnataka, launched efforts to locate and assist their residents who may have been among the victims. Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah dispatched teams of senior officers and police personnel to Jammu and Kashmir, while Kerala authorities worked with local police to identify any Malayali victims.

The Pahalgam attack serves as a grim reminder of the persistent challenges in achieving lasting peace in Jammu and Kashmir. While the immediate focus remains on apprehending the perpetrators and supporting the victims, the incident has underscored the need for enhanced security measures, better intelligence coordination, and a renewed commitment to countering militancy in the region. For the people of Pahalgam, the scars of April 22 will linger, but their resilience, coupled with the nation's resolve, will be critical in restoring the valley's reputation as a haven of beauty and hospitality. As the investigation unfolds and security forces intensify their efforts, the hope is that justice will be served, and Pahalgam will once again reclaim its place as a symbol of peace rather than a site of tragedy.

## After the passing away of Pope Francis, a conservative shift in Vatican is likely

There may come a time when we look back on the last decade as an anomaly in the modern history of the Catholic Church. Pope Francis — the figurehead of these years, and a radical by the standards of the Catholic hierarchy — is gone, and we are now likely to see a major shift in the political orientation of the Holy See. Ultimately, and ominously, the death of Francis could well mean that the papacy ends up finding itself aligned with the global far right.

It didn't have to be this way. Elected in 2013, Jorge Mario Bergoglio, the first Latin American pope in history, brought to the Vatican a concern for social justice rooted in the radical liberation theology of his home region — along with an unprecedented focus on environmental issues and migrants' rights. This was a dramatic shift in priorities after the conservative pontificates of John Paul II and Benedict XVI, both of whom were more concerned with upholding traditional morality than with reviving basic Christian values of equality and fraternity.

In contrast, Francis dedicated two of his encyclicals — the highest-ranking papal declarations — to explicitly political issues. Laudato si' (2015) addressed the environmental crisis, while Fratelli tutti (2020) focused on social justice. The latter famously asserted "the right of every individual to find a place that meets their basic needs" — a sign of Francis's unwavering support for migrants against the backdrop of rising anti-immigrant sentiment in Europe and the United States. Francis was fairly open in his public disregard for far-right populist leaders like Donald Trump and his fellow Argentinian Javier Milei (Milei responded by calling Francis a "filthy leftist").

Bergoglio's papacy also saw a shift in the Church's attitudes to gender and sexuality, though not nearly to the extent initially expected. His stance on sexuality was considerably more liberal than those of his predecessors — as demonstrated when he responded "Who am I to judge?" when asked about homosexuality in the Church. Francis also angered ultra-conservatives when he opened the door to priests blessing "couples in irregular situations" (including same-sex couples) and surprised many by appointing women to key positions in the Vatican government. On the other hand, he upheld Catholic orthodoxy in opposing abortion rights, even in cases of rape. Shockingly, Bergoglio went so far as to call doctors who perform abortions "hitmen."

When it came to institutional matters, Francis's record was similarly mixed. From the outset, he aimed to bring order to a Vatican bureaucracy tarnished by the corruption scandals exposed in the "Vatileaks" revelations. He implemented a deep-dive reform of Vatican finances, resulting in the closure of 5,000 suspicious bank accounts, the creation of oversight bodies, and anti-money laundering regulations. However, another leak of compromising documents ("Vatileaks 2") occurred under his tenure in 2015, and the release of the Panama Papers in 2016 revealed widespread Church investment in tax havens. Decades of Vatican venality would not be overturned overnight.



Yet more serious were the thousands of cases of child sexual abuse committed by priests worldwide, many of which had been deliberately covered up by John Paul II and Benedict XVI. Francis sought to end impunity for the offenders with strong measures, as demonstrated by the dismissal of US cardinal Theodore McCarrick, who was found guilty in 2019 of committing and covering up sexual assaults. Also in 2019, the Vatican held a summit on pedophilia, which established new protocols for reporting abuse. However, a mere five years later, the first report from the Commission for the Protection of Minors revealed serious deficiencies in handling complaints. Such reforms now face an uncertain future under Francis's successor.

Away from the murky backroom dramas of the Vatican, Francis's ascension to the papacy also marked a break with the geopolitical orientation of his predecessors, as he aligned the Holy See much more closely with the Global South. While John Paul II had been a staunch ally of Washington in the so-called fight against communism, Francis made sure to distance himself from Western governments on issues such as relations with China, Ukraine, and Palestine.

In 2018, the Holy See signed a controversial agreement with the Chinese government that led to a fierce rebuke from the first Trump administration. Later, when Russia invaded Ukraine, he called the Ukrainian president while also visiting the Russian embassy to discuss his concerns about the conflict — a gesture interpreted in the West as being overly sympathetic to Vladimir Putin. Finally, the pontiff labeled Israel's massacres of civilians in Gaza "terrorism," in stark contrast to the silence (or complicity) of most Western governments on the subject.

What happens next, in the wake of Francis's death, is an open question. The conclave that elects the next pope combines religious pomp with political intrigue (a hallmark of Vatican history). When a pope dies, a sede vacante is declared, triggering the conclave process — a meeting of all vote-eligible cardinals worldwide under eighty years old, which takes place

fifteen to twenty days after a pope's death.

It is a secretive meeting in which cardinals are isolated from the outside world: they have no access to the internet and leave the Sistine Chapel only to eat and sleep at the Casa Santa Marta. The conclave lasts until one cardinal obtains two-thirds of the vote — usually requiring multiple rounds — at which point the famous fumatablanca signals the election of a new pontiff. Recent papal successions have been resolved within two or three days (two votes take place every day).

Between the pope's death and the start of the conclave are the General Congregations, in which all cardinals discuss the Church's state of affairs. Most of the political manoeuvring to predetermine the voting outcome happens here. This meeting was key to Bergoglio's election. As Gerard O'Connell recounts in his book on the 2013 conclave, The Election of Pope Francis, the then Archbishop of Buenos Aires gained popularity among prelates for his strong stance on financial transparency — a sensitive issue following the Vatileaks revelations.

It is difficult to predict the outcome of the forthcoming conclave. However, there are strong reasons to believe that Francis's successor will be a more conservative pope. First, his pontificate has been highly transformative, both institutionally and in its public messaging, making it unlikely that the cardinals will choose another candidate equally inclined toward reform. The Church tends to resist radical and sustained change.

Perhaps more importantly, although the Sistine Chapel has thick walls, the Vatican is invariably influenced by global political trends. With Trump in the White House, and with the far right on the rise worldwide, electing another pope as progressive as Francis would be swimming against the tide — and the Vatican has a long history of adapting to changing realities rather than confronting them. That is why the next fumatablanca will likely announce a more conservative figure than Jorge Bergoglio. Indeed, the mood of the moment suggests that he may well be a stark antithesis to the "leftist" pope. (IPA Service)

## Murder of humanity in the valley of Pahalgam

2nd April 2025, some quiet moments of the morning. The snowy valleys of Pahalgam in Jammu and Kashmir were welcoming tourists. Newly married couples, children, and the elderly — everyone was hoping that the air of Kashmir would provide them with peace and some relief from stress. But then there was a sound of terror. Guns roared. And in that valley where snow falls, blood now flowed.

A newly married couple from Rajasthan was also among those tourists. They had gotten married just five days ago. They had come to Kashmir for their honeymoon. But perhaps fate had something else in store. The terrorists stopped the car, asked their names, identified them, and then shot them. The young man was a Hindu. This was the reason for his death. He was shot in the head. He died on the spot. His wife, whose mehendi on her hands was still wet, stood stunned. More than grief, she was frozen in an unspoken fear — as if time had stopped there.

This is not murder; this is religious hatred.

This was not just a terrorist attack. This was a planned murder — based on a thought, based on a religion. Today terrorism is no longer just a regional or ideological fight. It has now become a tool to erase religious identity. This murder shows that some elements have now decided who will live and who will die — and this decision will be taken by asking names.

Is this humanity? Is this the 'Kashmiriyat' in the name of which we have been pleading for peace for years?

When the screams of the martyr's wife fell silent:

The picture of the wife staring at her husband's dead body went viral on social media. No screams, no cries, no resistance. Just a stoic silence — which became the harshest accusation on the entire system. A question is hidden in that silence: "What wrong did we do?" Has it now become a crime for a couple to come to Kashmir, see its beauty, and love its valleys?

We have to understand that in this picture there was not just a woman but the soul of an entire nation — wounded, helpless, and ashamed.

Safety failure and insensitivity of administration:

After every attack, there is a readymade script from the government — condemnation, compensation, investigation. But there is no accountability. Shouldn't the question be asked as to how terrorists are allowed to move freely in the valley? How can they shoot someone by asking for their name and then escape?

Shouldn't additional security forces be deployed during the tourist season? Doesn't the Jammu and Kashmir administration know that such attacks attack tourism, the economy, and the unity of India?

Human rights or rights to terror?

Whenever India takes a tough stand against terrorism, the human rights shops open up. Delhi, London, New York — the so-called intellectuals everywhere suddenly become filled with 'sympathy'. But when a Hindu civilian is shot in the head just because of his name, these same voices fall silent.

Why? Is there sympathy only for the victims of a particular community? Is being a Hindu now equivalent to becoming invisible from the prism of human rights?

The terrorist attack in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir, where a newly married Hindu tourist was shot in the head after being asked his name. This attack is not just a murder but a symbol of hatred and terror based on religious identity. The shocked picture of the deceased's wife is considered the wounded face of the nation's soul. It warns that it is an attack on India's unity, civil security, and religious tolerance and that if concrete steps are not taken now, the next victim will be someone else.

This is an attack on the whole of India.

The Pahalgam attack is not just the murder of one person — it is an attack on the soul of India. It is an attempt to send a message that "this is not your place." It is a challenge to the unity, harmony, and secularism of India. And if we respond to this challenge only with tweets and candles, the next target will be another city, another name, another newsworthy.

Pakistan's role and global silence:

As usual, the terrorist organization behind this attack — "The Resistance Front" — is a new avatar of Lashkar-e-Taiba. And its roots are in Pakistan. But on the international stage, Pakistan is still a 'victim of terrorism.'

The United Nations, the United States, Europe — all must say it clearly that the killing of civilians on religious grounds is not just a crisis of one country but a crisis of global humanity.

Now is the time for decision.

India now needs to take a clear decision. The police alone cannot deal with terrorism in Kashmir; it requires political will. The soft layers of separatism will have to be uprooted. The hatred being spread in the name of religious identity will have to be challenged at the social level as well.

At the same time, we must decide that tourism in Kashmir is not just a deal to show "paradise" but a bridge of national unity — and it is the responsibility of all of us to protect this bridge.

Last lines: Another martyr, another life ruined.

After every terrorist attack, we feel sad for a few days and then forget about it. But for the woman who lost her husband and who was left alone with her dreams shattered, this incident is a lifelong wound.

This isn't news for him; it's his shattered world. Our condolences should not be limited to social media posts. We must ask, "For how long?"

How long will we not be able to protect our citizens?

How long will we keep lighting candles for terrorist attacks?

In other words, far from a choice or luxury, transition becomes an ecological and social imperative. Such a future requires sweeping changes in policies, technologies, corporate practices, and consumer behavior.

Plastics changed the world of industry and commerce and everyday life because of their robustness, their low cost, and their versatility. But at the same time, such qualities make them an environmental hazard. Single-use plastics are things like bags, bottles, straws, and packing materials. Such materials stay in the environment for hundreds of years. Annual plastic waste production has recently exceeded 300 million tonnes in a year around, most of which contaminate the oceans and environment. This is, especially with marine ecosystems, which absorb the impact of the crisis because millions of marine organisms are affected or killed through ingestion or entanglement with plastic waste. The famous "Great Pacific Garbage Patch," a floating sea of plastic debris, gives an impression of the scale of pollution it communicates to the public.

Other than the more obviously destructive one, the more dangerous one is the invisible, microscopic plastic fragment produced as a result of the fragmentation of larger pieces of plastic. Such micro-plastics have been found to seep into soil, water, air, and bodies, therefore entering food and harming wildlife and mankind equally. Studies have shown that exposure to micro-plastics and their chemical in relation has been found to be associated with hormonal imbalance, breathing problems, and cancer diseases. Their stealthiness close to impossible to bring back once they are let loose in the environment provides an explanation to the clamor for reduction of plastics at the source.

Recycling concept does not improve the prospects of curbing plastic waste. In the world, only 10% of plastic waste is recycled and the remaining is dumped in landfills, incinerators, and the environment. The systems of recycling are plagued with challenges of economic unviability of how to process most of the plastic materials, contamination in recyclable ones, and the lack of infrastructure in many places. More to this, virgin plastic is still being produced at a cheaper cost of producing than recycling, and because of government subsidies for the extraction of fossil fuels, the development of plastic waste continues.

Awareness needs to shift from the management of waste to its prevention in order to address this crisis. The basic principle of a plastic-free world is to abolish single-use plastics and adopt plastic-free alternatives. Governments around the world are now taking action. Such drastic steps are required around the world, like the European Union banning any product that contains a plastic straw and/or cutlery, to ban single-use plastics in certain parts of India or making efforts in Rwanda for such a ban on plastic bags. Conversely, the actual success depends on the strength of mechanisms for enforcing, coupled with a whole public engagement in this cause.

Technological innovation opens exciting avenues for reducing plastic dependency. Some of the newer alternatives include biodegradable and compostable materials coming from natural sources as cornstarch, algae, or agricultural wastes. Reusable systems, especially deposit-return schemes and refillable packaging, are other popular innovations. Great promises exist with such solutions but still, scalability and cost-effectiveness remain as critical central problems. Infrastructure becomes

essential to support the tremendous scale of adoption of alternatives.

One of the significant contributors to plastic waste is an organization and thus, takes critical responsibilities in encouraging change. Some global corporations have announced different strategies on how to reduce plastic development and adoption of sustainable packaging practices and circular economy models and discovery of new materials. Such efforts are, however, greenwashing companies most of the time. These organizations can be proud of the lip-service declarations of environmental responsibility, but nothing is being done in real practice. Complete accountability demands reportage with clarity, objectives set for completion, and meeting up to the world's benchmarking on the matters of environmental sustainability.

In this evolution, neither should be ignored the part which consumers have to play. It should be taken into account that though not a final solution, individual choices add up in their contribution towards the reduction in demand of disposable plastics. The upward trends in the demands for reusable bags, bottles, and all other alternatives find their placement in the feasibility of aggregate behavioral change. This would need a decade of public education complemented by incentives for ecologically friendly practices and the transition in culture away from convenience-driven behaviors that drive plastic usage.

Under the environmental benefit of the plastic-free world, a greater human health benefit stands. It will also save the cost of waste management and avoid the economic loss manufacturing industries, fisheries, and the tourism industry are suffering due to pollution with plastic debris. Reducing the use of plastics will have impacts on a public health basis since lesser intakes of toxic chemicals and microplastics will likely take place. This will again create new markets in green industries starting from recyclable package towards waste treatment and materials progression, etc.

In this plastic-free future it is not so easy. Plastics are now an indispensable part of modern living and their removal involves significant economic, technological, and social reorganization. Small businesses, low-income neighborhoods, and many others may not be able to afford or even have access to sustainable alternatives. The policy makers must ensure it is fair, financially as well as technically supporting those who have been most affected. Second, global cooperation is critical. Plastic pollution is a transboundary problem and piecemeal actions will prove to be insufficient. A universal, international framework, like the proposed global plastics treaty, may allow for standardization of policies, establishment of hard limits, and sharing of resources across nations.

No apathy will do as this is too severe a problem. Such a future of no plastics requires the ambition and concerted efforts of every entity in society. Policies in the pursuit of ambitious targets should be made and legislated on all sides from the government, business activity must be innovative and that should be used sustainably, and the consumer will take responsibility over the environment. The cost is too great to tarry. Plastic pollution threatens ecosystems and biodiversity and human health to a scale that requires drastic and sustained intervention.

A plastic-free future is not only an environmental wish but also a survival imperative for our planet, even a prescription for health. Humanity has the power to change plastic pollution by redefining its consumption pattern, improving innovations, and creating responsibility with all. The journey will be difficult, but it will be worthwhile in many ways: healthy ecosystems, clean environments, and a sustainable world. Now is the time to act. # Climate crisis in Assam's fields

The agriculture of Assam and the Northeast, deeply rooted in rhythm and tradition, now finds itself on fragile ground. As climate change accelerates, it no longer whispers its warnings—it shouts through erratic rainfall, unseasonal floods, prolonged droughts, and shrinking planting windows. What once followed the cosmic rhythm of nature now must wrestle with the chaos of climate disruption.

In Assam, agriculture is not just an economic activity; it is culture, continuity, and survival. From the lush paddy fields of the plains to the carefully balanced jhum cycles of the hills, traditional farming practices have coexisted with nature for generations. But this delicate relationship is rapidly unravelling. The once dependable monsoon now arrives late, or all at once. According to the India Meteorological Department, Assam witnessed a 20% monsoon rainfall deficit in 2022, followed by a 16% excess in 2023—both scenarios causing significant agricultural distress.

Floods have become more frequent and damaging. In 2022 alone, over 89 lakh people were affected by floods in Assam, with around 2.4 lakh hectares of crop land damaged, as per data from the Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA). These floods are no longer seasonal—they arrive in

repeated waves, often leaving farmers without time to recover between disasters.

Erosion caused by the swollen Brahmaputra and its tributaries continues to eat away fertile land. The Water Resources Department of Assam reports that over 4.27 lakh hectares have been lost to erosion since 1950, with an annual average loss of about 8,000 hectares. For many families, this means displacement and the collapse of generations-old agrarian livelihoods.

In the floodplains and char areas, where resilience has always been part of survival, people are now pushed beyond endurance. The nutrient-rich topsoil is being replaced by sterile silt. Crops fail, and relief remains delayed. While fields once yielded rice, pulses, and vegetables, now they lie barren for seasons at a stretch.

Compounding these challenges are rising temperatures, shifting humidity, and irregular rainfall. The Assam Agriculture Department reports a 30% increase in pest attacks over the past five years—posing new threats to indigenous rice varieties that have long been adapted to local conditions. These varieties are now struggling against diseases they were never bred to resist.

Livestock and fisheries—vital safety nets for rural families—are also under strain. Heat stress has reduced milk yield by up to 15%, according to a 2021 report from ICAR-NDRI. Fish

habitats are shrinking as water levels fluctuate unpredictably. Rising temperatures are disrupting the breeding cycles of indigenous fish species, with experts warning of a 25% decline in viable aquaculture zones in the Brahmaputra valley over the next decade.

Jhum cultivation, widely practised in the hill districts of Northeast India, depends on ecological balance. Climate disruption shortens fallow periods, slows regeneration, and increases the risk of forest fires. The Forest Survey of India has noted a 125% rise in forest fire incidents in the Northeast between 2015 and 2022—many linked to erratic climate conditions.

In many regions, adaptation has become a matter of survival. Farmers are shifting sowing dates, trying short-duration and drought-tolerant crops like "Ranjit Sub1," and modifying irrigation practices. But these innovations are rarely documented, scaled up, or supported institutionally. Women and indigenous farmers hold a wealth of knowledge, yet their contributions remain marginalised in mainstream agricultural planning.

Government response is largely post-disaster. Relief comes too little, too late. From 2007 to 2022, ₹ 1,000 crore was sanctioned under the Flood Management Programme in Assam, but only Rs 595 crore was utilised. Infrastructure such as embankments and irrigation canals remains either underfunded or poorly maintained. In

2022, embankment breaches in districts like Barpeta and Morigaon worsened flood impacts, exposing administrative lapses.

Early warning systems are inadequate. While weather forecasts exist, a 2022 NABARD report revealed that only 30% of farmers in Assam receive these alerts in a timely or accessible format. There is an urgent need for community-based dissemination in local languages through mobile alerts, panchayat networks, and NGOs.

Financial instruments like crop insurance need reform. During 2021–22, only 12% of eligible farmers in Assam were covered under the Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana. Long delays and complicated claims processes deter enrolment. Likewise, over 65% of farmers in the state still rely on informal credit sources, often falling into high-interest debt traps that worsen during climate shocks.

Agricultural extension and education must reflect the new climate reality. Extension services must bring modern scientific practices while also learning from traditional wisdom. Assam's farmers know how to read soil, sky, and insect movement. Their experiential knowledge must not be erased in the name of progress.

Assam's predominantly organic agricultural base provides a unique chance to lead India toward sustainable farming. As per APEDA, nearly 1.2 lakh hectares are under organic

farming in the state. Strengthening certification processes, expanding local procurement, and creating climate-resilient markets are necessary steps. Organic agriculture should not be seen as an environmental add-on, but as a central pillar of the climate economy.

For policymakers, climate change is often viewed as a future challenge. But for Assam's farmers, it is a current crisis. The impact is visible in falling yields, rising debts, shrinking harvests, and fading confidence. In 2021, rice yield in flood-affected areas dropped by 22%. The 2023 NSS survey reported a 15% decline in youth participation in agriculture in Assam, indicating a clear shift away from the land.

The climate crisis is real, measurable, and ongoing. It is seen in satellite images, felt in parched or flooded fields, and heard in the voices of those displaced. Assam's farmers are no strangers to adversity—but they cannot adapt without support. Resilience cannot substitute for resources. Courage cannot replace policy. Adaptation without recognition is a cruel expectation.

If India acts now—with urgency, empathy, and commitment—Assam's agricultural legacy can still endure. But delay will only deepen the crisis. In a land shaped by rivers, the question is whether governance will shape survival. (The author can be reached at herambanath2222@gmail.com)

# Tiny dips in sea level reveal flow of climate-regulating underwater waterfalls

Beneath the surface of the Southern Ocean, vast volumes of cold, dense water plunge off the Antarctic continental shelf, cascading down underwater cliffs to the ocean floor thousands of metres below. These hidden waterfalls are a key part of the global ocean's overturning circulation—a vast conveyor belt of currents that moves heat, carbon and nutrients around the world, helping to regulate Earth's climate.

For decades, scientists have struggled to observe these underwater waterfalls of dense water around Antarctica. They occur in some of the most remote and stormy waters on the planet, often shrouded by sea ice and funnelled through narrow canyons that are easily missed by research ships.

But our new research shows that satellites, orbiting hundreds of kilometres above Earth, can detect these sub-sea falls.

By measuring tiny dips in sea level—just a few centimetres—we can now track the dense water cascades from space. This breakthrough lets us monitor the deepest

branches of the ocean circulation, which are slowing down as Antarctic ice melts and surface waters warm.

Dense water helps regulate the climate

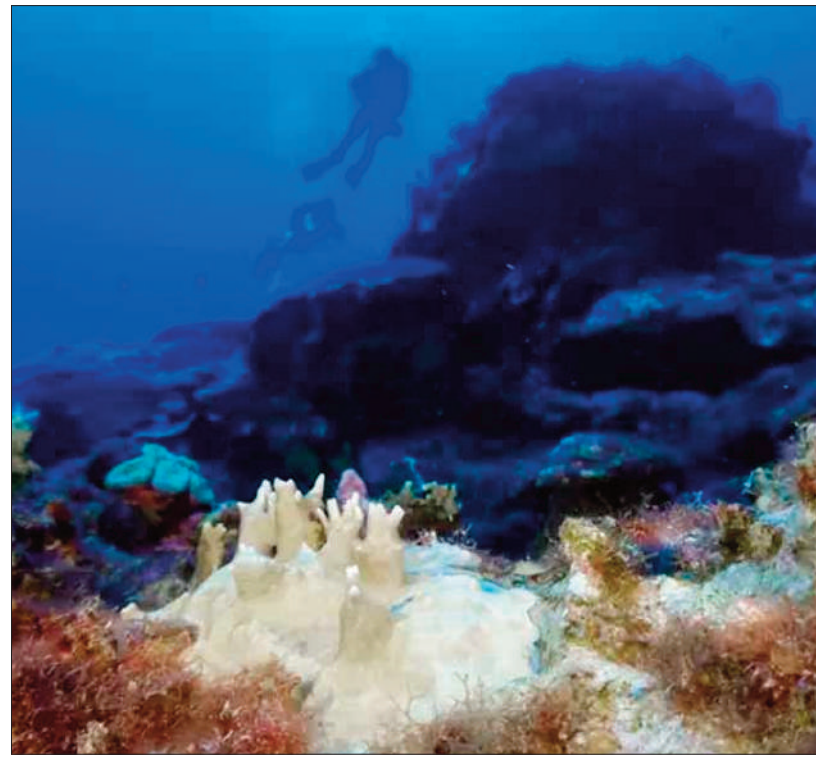
Antarctic dense water is formed when sea ice grows, in the process making nearby water saltier and more dense. This heavy water then spreads across the continental shelf until it finds a path to spill over the edge, plunging down steep underwater slopes into the deep.

As the dense water flows northward along the seafloor, it brings oxygen and nutrients into the abyss—as well as carbon and heat drawn from the atmosphere.

But this crucial process is under threat. Climate change is melting the Antarctic ice sheet, adding fresh meltwater into the ocean and making it harder for dense water to form.

Underwater waterfalls around Antarctica carry dense, salty surface water into the depths of the ocean.

Past research has shown the abyssal circulation has already slowed by 30 per cent and is likely to weaken further in the years ahead. This could reduce the ocean's ability to absorb heat and carbon, accelerating climate change.



ating climate change.

Our research provides a new technique that can provide easy, direct

observations of future changes in the Southern Ocean abyssal overturning circulation.

Satellites and sea level

Until now, tracking dense water cascades around Antarctica has relied on moorings, ship-based surveys and even sensors attached to seals. While these methods deliver valuable local insights, they are costly, logistically demanding, carbon-intensive and only cover a limited area.

Satellite data offers an alternative. Using radar, satellites such as CryoSat-2 and Sentinel-3A can measure changes in sea surface height to within a few centimetres.

And thanks to recent advances in data processing, we can now extract reliable measurements even in ice-covered regions—by peering at the sea surface through cracks and openings in the sea ice.

In our study, we combined nearly a decade of satellite observations with high-resolution ocean models focused on the Ross Sea. This is a critical hotspot for Antarctic dense water formation.

We discovered that dense water cascades leave a telltale surface signal: a subtle but consistent dip in sea level, caused by the cold, heavy water sinking beneath it.

By tracking these subtle sea level

dips, we developed a new way to monitor year-to-year changes in dense water cascades along the Antarctic continental shelf. The satellite signal we identified aligns well with observations collected by other means, giving us confidence that this method can reliably detect meaningful shifts in deep ocean circulation.

Cheap and effective—with no carbon emissions

This is the first time Antarctic dense water cascades have been monitored from space. What makes this approach so powerful is its ability to deliver long-term, wide-reaching observations at low cost and with zero carbon emissions—using satellites that are already in orbit.

These innovations are especially important as we work to monitor a rapidly changing climate system. The strength of deep Antarctic currents remains one of the major uncertainties in global climate projections.

# Israeli strike on school-turned-shelter kills 23 Officials from Ukraine, US and UK meet in London in latest push to stop war

**DEIR AL-BALAH (Gaza Strip), April 23:** An overnight Israeli strike on a school-turned-shelter in Gaza City killed 23 people, as Arab mediators worked on a proposal to end the war with Hamas that would include a five to seven year truce and the release of all remaining hostages, officials said Wednesday.

There was no immediate Israeli comment on the strike, which set several tents ablaze, burning people alive. The military says it only targets militants and blames civilian deaths on Hamas because its fighters are embedded in densely populated areas.

France, Germany and Britain meanwhile said Israel's seven-week-old blockade on all imports to Gaza, including food, was "intolerable," in unusually strong criticism from three of the country's closest allies.

Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas called on Hamas to release the hostages in order to "block Israel's pretexts" for continuing the war. He reiterated his demands that Hamas give up their arms, referring to them as "sons of dogs" in unusually strong language during a speech in the West Bank.

Abbas, who heads the Western-backed Palestinian Authority, has no influence over Hamas but is seeking a role in postwar Gaza.

**A yearlong truce and a gradual withdrawal**

Egypt and Qatar are still developing the proposal, which would include the gradual withdrawal of Israeli forces from the entire strip and the release of Palestinian prisoners, according to an Egyptian of-



ficial and a Hamas official who spoke on condition of anonymity because they were not authorised to brief media.

Israel ended a ceasefire with Hamas last month and has vowed to continue the war until all the hostages are returned and Hamas is either destroyed or disarmed and sent into exile. It says it will hold parts of Gaza indefinitely and implement President Donald Trump's proposal for the resettlement of the population in other countries, which has been widely rejected internationally.

Hamas has said it will only release the dozens of hostages it still holds in return for Palestinian prisoners, a complete Israeli withdrawal and a lasting ceasefire, as called for in the now-defunct agreement reached in January. A Hamas delegation arrived in Cairo late Tuesday to discuss the evolving proposal.

The Egyptian official said the proposed truce, with international guarantees, would last between five and seven years, and that a

committee of politically independent technocrats would govern Gaza — a measure Hamas has accepted.

The Hamas official said the militant group is open to a long-term truce that includes the complete withdrawal of Israeli forces and international guarantees, naming Russia, China, Turkey or the United Nations Security Council as possible guarantors.

**Israel and the US say Hamas must be destroyed or removed**

There was no immediate comment from Israeli officials. But Israel has ruled out any arrangement that would allow Hamas to preserve its influence in Gaza and rearm. The Trump administration, which has also been involved in the ceasefire talks, has said it fully supports Israel's position.

Israel and the US have pressed Hamas to accept a temporary truce in which it would immediately release several hostages in return for

vague promises of talks on a more permanent ceasefire. Hamas has rejected those proposals and says it won't disarm as long as Israel oc-

cupies Palestinian territory.

The Hamas official said the group does not trust either Netanyahu or the US after they shattered the existing ceasefire agreement, which had facilitated the release of over 30 hostages.

The Egyptian official said mediators had the impression that President Donald Trump wants a deal before he visits the region next month. Trump will travel to Saudi Arabia, Qatar and the United Arab Emirates from May 13 to May 16.

**France, Germany and Britain condemn Israeli food blockade**

Israel ended the ceasefire last month by launching a surprise bombardment across the territory that killed hundreds of Palestinians. Ground forces have expanded a buffer zone along the border, encircled the southern city of Rafah and now controls around 50% of the territory.

Israel says the military operations and the tightened blockade are tactics to pressure Hamas to release hostages. Aid groups say thousands of children are malnourished and most people are surviving on one meal a day or less. "The Israeli decision to block aid from entering Gaza is intolerable," France, Germany and Britain said in their joint statement. They also condemned recent remarks by Israeli Defence Minister Israel Katz,

who said the blockade was a pressure tactic and that troops would hold parts of Gaza indefinitely.

"Humanitarian aid must never be used as a political tool and Palestinian territory must not be reduced nor subjected to any demographic change," (AP)

**LONDON, April 23:** Officials from Britain, the US, European nations and Ukraine will meet in London on Wednesday to push for a peace deal between Moscow and Kyiv.

British Defense Secretary John Healey said the meeting follows talks last week in Paris and will include "what a ceasefire might look like and how to secure peace in the long term."

But a plan for the talks to involve foreign ministers was scrapped at the last minute after the US State Department said Secretary of State Marco Rubio, who attended the Paris talks, was unable to come because of a scheduling issue.

UK Foreign Secretary David Lammy posted on X that the talks would now include "officials." Those attending include retired Lt Gen Keith Kellogg, President Donald Trump's envoy for Ukraine and Russia.

It came amid growing speculation that the US will press Ukraine to cede territory to Russia as part of a potential peace agreement.

During similar talks last week in Paris, US officials presented a proposal that included allowing Russia to keep control of occupied Ukrainian territory as part of a deal, according to a European official familiar with the matter. Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelenskyy pushed back against that idea, saying: "There is nothing to talk about — it is our land, the land of the Ukrainian people."

Some European allies are wary of the American proposal. But there's also acknowledgment by some allies that Russia is firmly entrenched wholly or partially in five regions of Ukraine — Crimea, Luhansk, Donetsk, Zaporizhzhia and Kherson.

If the goal is to obtain a ceasefire immediately, "it should be based on the line of contact as it is," said a senior French official. The official was not authorised to be publicly named and spoke on the condition of anonymity according to French presidential policy.

Still, Ukraine's territorial integrity and aspirations to strengthen ties with the rest of the continent are a top priority for the Europeans, the European official said. It remains to be seen whether the latest diplomatic efforts can lead to an endgame after more than three years of war since Russia's full-scale invasion



of its neighbour.

Britain downplayed expectations of a breakthrough, but says this is an important week for diplomatic efforts to stop more than three years of fighting since Russia's full-scale invasion of its neighbour.

Trump said last week that negotiations were "coming to a head" and the US might "take a pass" if either of the two sides didn't move toward peace.

Rubio has also indicated the US might soon back away from negotiations if they don't progress, and suggested that Wednesday's meeting could be decisive in determining whether the Trump administration continues its involvement. Putin's foreign affairs adviser, Yuri Ushakov, said US special envoy Steve Witkoff was expected to visit Moscow again this week. Ushakov provided no further details.

Western analysts say Moscow is in no rush to conclude peace talks, because it has battlefield momentum and wants to capture more Ukrainian land.

Prime Minister Keir Starmer's spokesman, Dave Pares said "the ball's in Russia's court."

"Now is the time for (Russian President Vladimir) Putin to show he's serious about peace," he said.

Zelenskyy said Tuesday that Ukraine's delegation heading to the UK has a mandate to discuss only an unconditional or partial ceasefire with Russia. He said that "after a ceasefire, we're prepared to sit down for talks in any format." (AP)

## Baghdad invites new Syrian president to summit, sparking political division in Iraq

**BAGHDAD, April 23:** An official invitation to new Syrian President Ahmad al-Sharaa to attend the upcoming Arab League summit in Baghdad has triggered sharp political divisions within Iraq.

Al-Sharaa took power after leading a lightning rebel offensive that unseated his predecessor, Bashar Assad, in December. Since then, he has positioned himself as a statesman aiming to unite and rebuild his country after nearly 14 years of civil war, but his past as a Sunni Islamist militant has left many — including Shiite groups in Iraq — wary. Formerly known by the nom de guerre Abu Mohammed al-Golani, al-Sharaa joined the ranks of al-Qaida insurgents battling US forces in Iraq after the US-led invasion in 2003 and still faces a warrant for his arrest on terrorism charges in Iraq.

Prime Minister Mohammed Shia Al-Sudani confirmed last week that Iraq had extended a formal invitation to al-Sharaa to attend the May 17 summit, following a previously unannounced meeting between the two in Qatar. Al-Sharaa has not confirmed plans to attend. Iraq, which has strong ties with both the United States and Iran, has sought to position itself as a regional mediator. It hosted talks between regional rivals Iran and Saudi Arabia before they reached a deal to normalise relations. Many Iraqi and regional stakeholders see the invitation to al-Sharaa as an opportunity to bolster Baghdad's image as a hub for regional diplomacy.

However, strong opposition to al-Sharaa's invitation has emerged from powerful Shiite factions aligned with Iran. Tehran, which backed Assad in Syria's civil war and used Syria as a conduit to smuggle weapons to the Hezbollah militant group in Lebanon, was widely seen as the biggest loser from Assad's ouster. Several Iraqi Shiite militias fought alongside Assad's forces during the civil war that followed his brutal crackdown on pro-democracy protests in 2011, making al-Sharaa a particularly sensitive figure for them.

Mustafa Sand, a member of parliament from the Coordination Framework — a coalition of Iran-

allied factions that brought al-Sudani to power in 2022 — said in a video posted on X, formerly Twitter, that the foreign ministry had reached out to Iraq's Supreme Judicial Council to verify whether an arrest warrant was issued against al-Sharaa and that the council had confirmed the existence of a valid warrant. A security official who spoke on condition of anonymity because he was not authorised to comment publicly confirmed the existence of the warrant to The Associated Press.

The Islamic Dawa Party, led by former Prime Minister Nouri al-Maliki — one of the most influential figures in Iraq's ruling coalition — called on the government in a statement to "ensure that any summit participant has a clean judicial record, both locally and internationally," adding, "The blood of Iraqis is not cheap, and those who have violated their sanctity or committed documented crimes against them should not be welcomed in Baghdad."

A spokesperson for the powerful militia Kataib Hezbollah, Abu Ali Al-Askari, said in a statement, "Arab summits have been held without President Assad, Iraq, or Libya. They certainly won't stop because the criminal Abu Mohammad al-Golani ... isn't attending."

On the other side, Sunni political factions have rallied to defend al-Sharaa's inclusion in the summit. Former MP Dhafir Al-Ani, a prominent Sunni figure, said he supports Baghdad's attempts to build ties with the new Syrian authorities. "Preventing his presence would be a stab in the heart of the Iraqi government and a sign that violence still dictates the country's fate," he said.

The Iraqi government has not responded publicly to the backlash.

A warrant would not necessarily block al-Sharaa from joining the summit. Other countries have chosen to waive similar measures. In December after Assad's fall, the United States said it had decided not to pursue a USD 10 million reward it had previously offered for al-Sharaa's capture, although Washington also has not yet officially recognised the new Syrian government. (AP)

## London talks on ending Russia-Ukraine war pared down as Russian drone attack on bus kills 9

**KYIV, April 23:** A planned meeting Wednesday between top US, British, French and Ukrainian diplomats to push for a peace deal between Russia and Ukraine was scrapped at the last minute amid little sign of progress in international efforts to end the more than three-year war.

UK Foreign Secretary David Lammy announced the talks in London would involve only lower-ranking officials after the US State Department said Tuesday that Secretary of State Marco Rubio was unable to attend because of a scheduling issue.

Rubio's abrupt cancellation raised doubts about the direction of the negotiations. It came as Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy ruled out ceding territory to Russia as part of any potential peace agreement, calling it a non-starter. The Ukrainian leader spoke Tuesday in response to reports the Trump administration was proposing a deal that would allow Russia to keep occupied Ukrainian territory as part of a potential peace agreement.

Even achieving a limited, 30-day ceasefire has been beyond the reach of negotiators, as both sides have continued to attack each other in a grinding war of attrition along the 1,000-km front line and launch long-range strikes.

A Russian drone struck a bus carrying workers in Marganets, in eastern Ukraine's Dnipropetrovsk region on Wednesday morning, killing seven women and two men, regional head Ser-



hii Lysak wrote on his Telegram channel. More than 40 people were injured, he said. Lysak published photos of a bus with its windows blown out and shards of glass mixed with blood spattered on the bus floor.

**Ukrainian delegation arrives in London despite change in US plans**

President Donald Trump has pushed for an end to the war and said last week that negotiations were coming to a head. That comment came after Rubio suggested that the US might soon back away from negotiations if they don't progress. Rubio had indicated that Wednesday's meeting could be decisive in determining whether the Trump administration remains engaged.

Those still attending the meeting included retired Lt Gen Keith Kellogg, Trump's envoy for Ukraine and Russia.

Andrii Yermak, the head of Ukraine's presidential office, said on X that a delegation including him, Foreign Minister Andrii Sybiha and Defence Minister Rustem Umerov had arrived in London for the talks despite the alterations.

## UN to review impact of its agency helping Palestinian refugees in Gaza, elsewhere

**UNITED NATIONS, April 23:** The United Nations chief appointed a British human rights activist on Tuesday to carry out a strategic review of the UN agency helping Palestinian refugees to assess its impact under the "present political, financial, security and other constraints."

Israel has banned the agency, known as UNRWA, from operating on its territory, but its Palestinian staff have still been key to delivering aid and running medical clinics in Gaza, even though Israel has cut off all humanitarian deliveries since March 2.

UN spokesman Stephane Dujarric, who announced the review, said Ian Martin, a former head of Amnesty International, would also be looking at the "consequences and risks for Palestinian refugees" of UNRWA's operations.

UNRWA was established by the UN General Assembly in 1949 to provide relief for Palestinians who fled or were expelled from their homes before and during the 1948 Arab-Israeli war, which followed the establishment of Israel, as well as their descendants, until there is a political solution to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict.

The agency has been providing aid and services — includ-

ing health and education — to some 2.5 million Palestinians in Gaza, the occupied West Bank and east Jerusalem, as well as 3 million more in Syria, Jordan and Lebanon. This month, Israel ordered six UNRWA schools in east Jerusalem to close.

Dujarric stressed that the review is not about changing UNRWA's mandate. "We're trying to see how, in this very complex environment, UNRWA can best deliver for the Palestine refugees it serves, for the communities it serves," he told reporters. "They deserve to be assisted by an organisation — by UNRWA — that can work in the best possible manner given all these challenges."

Israel alleged that 19 out of UNRWA's approximately 13,000 staff in Gaza took part in Hamas' October 7, 2023, attack in southern Israel, which killed about 1,200 people and set off the war in Gaza.

UNRWA said it fired nine staffers after an internal UN investigation concluded that they could have been involved, although the evidence was not authenticated and corroborated.

Israel later alleged that about 100 other Palestinians in Gaza were Hamas members, but never provided any evidence to the United Nations. (AP)

## International students stripped of legal status in US piling up wins in court

**ATLANTA, April 23:** Anjan Roy, from Bangladesh, was studying with friends at Missouri State University when he got an email that turned his world upside down. His legal status as an international student had been terminated, and he was suddenly at risk for deportation.

"I was in literal shock, like, what the hell is this?" said Roy, a graduate student in computer science.

At first, he avoided going out in public, skipping classes and mostly keeping his phone turned off. A court ruling in his favour led to his status being restored this week, and he has returned to his apartment, but is still asking his roommates to screen visitors.

More than a thousand international students have faced similar disruptions in recent weeks, with their academic careers — and their lives in the US — thrown into doubt in a widespread crackdown by the Trump administration. Some have found a measure of success in court, with federal judges around the country issuing orders to restore students' legal status at least temporarily.

In addition to the cases filed in Atlanta, where Roy is among 133 plaintiffs, judges have issued temporary restraining orders in states including New Hampshire, Wisconsin, Montana, Oregon and Washington.

Judges have denied similar requests in some other cases, saying it was not clear the loss of status would cause irreparable harm.

**International students challenge grounds for their status revocation**

Secretary of State Marco Rubio said last month the State Department was revoking visas held by visitors who were acting counter to national interests, including some who protested Israel's war in Gaza and those who face criminal charges. But many affected students said they have been involved only in minor infractions, or it's unclear altogether why they were targeted.

The attorney for Roy and his fellow plaintiffs, Charles Kuck, argued the government did not have legal grounds to terminate the students' status.

He speculated in court last week the government is trying to encourage these students to self-deport, saying "the pressure on these students is overwhelming." He said some asked him if it was safe to leave their homes to get food, and others worried they wouldn't receive a degree after years of work or feared their chances of a career in the US were shot.

"I think the hope is they'll just leave," Kuck said. "The reality is these kids are invested." An attorney for the government, R David Powell, argued the students did not suffer significant harm because they could transfer their academic credits or find jobs in another country.

At least 1,100 students at 174 colleges, universities and university systems have had their visas revoked or their legal status terminated since late March, according to an Associated Press review of university statements, correspondence with school officials and court records.

The AP is working to confirm reports of hundreds more students who are caught up in the crackdown.

In a lawsuit filed Monday by four people on student visas at the University of Iowa, attorneys detail the "mental and financial suffering" they've experienced. One graduate student, from India, "cannot sleep and is having difficulty breathing and eating," the lawsuit reads. He has stopped going to school, doing research or working as a teaching assistant. (AP)

## 84 per cent of world's coral reefs hit by worst bleaching event on record

**WASHINGTON, April 23:** Harmful bleaching of the world's coral has grown to include 84 per cent of the ocean's reefs in the most intense event of its kind in recorded history, the International Coral Reef Initiative announced Wednesday.

It's the fourth global bleaching event since 1998, and has now surpassed bleaching from 2014-17 that hit some two-thirds of reefs, said the International Coral Reef Initiative (ICRI), a mix of more than 100 governments, non-governmental organisations and others.

And it's not clear when the current crisis, which began in 2023 and is blamed on warming oceans, will end.

"We may never see the heat stress that causes bleaching dropping below the threshold that triggers a global event," said Mark Eakin, executive secretary for the International Coral Reef Society and retired coral monitoring chief for the US National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA).

"We're looking at something that's completely changing the face of our planet and the ability of our oceans to sustain lives and livelihoods," Eakin said.

Last year was Earth's hottest year on record, and much of that is going into oceans. The average annual sea surface temperature of oceans away from the poles was a record 20.87 degrees Celsius.

That's deadly to corals, which are key to seafood production, tourism and protecting coastlines from erosion and storms. Coral reefs are sometimes dubbed "rainforests of the sea" because they support high levels of biodiversity — approximately 25 per cent of all marine species can be found in, on and around coral reefs.

Coral get their bright colours from the colourful algae that live inside them and are a food source for the corals. Prolonged warmth causes the algae to release toxic compounds, and the coral eject them. A stark white skeleton is left behind, and the weakened coral is at heightened risk of dying.

The bleaching event has been so severe that NOAA's Coral Reef



Watch programme has had to add levels to its bleaching alert scale to account for the growing risk of coral death.

Efforts are underway to con-

serve and restore coral. One Dutch lab has worked with coral fragments, including some taken from off the coast of the Seychelles, to propagate them in a zoo so that

they might be used someday to repopulate wild coral reefs if needed.

Other projects, including one off Florida, have worked to rescue corals endangered by high heat and nurse them back to health before returning them to the ocean.

But scientists say it's essential to reduce emissions from the greenhouse gases, such as carbon dioxide and methane, that warm the planet.

"The best way to protect coral reefs is to address the root cause of climate change. And that means reducing the human emissions that are mostly from burning of fossil fuels... everything else is looking more like a Band-Aid rather than a solution," Eakin said.

"I think people really need to

recognise what they're doing... in-

action is the kiss of death for coral reefs," said Melanie McField, co-chair of the Caribbean Steering Committee for the Global Coral Reef Monitoring Network, a network of scientists that monitors reefs throughout the world.

The group's update comes as President Donald Trump has moved aggressively in his second term to boost fossil fuels and roll back clean energy programmes, which he says is necessary for economic growth.

"We've got a government right now that is working very hard to destroy all of these ecosystems... removing these protections is going to have devastating consequences," Eakin said. (AP)

Police also arrested two members of radical outfit Arambai Tenggol from Jiribam district on Tuesday for their alleged involvement in the kidnapping of a person from Assam's Cachar. They have been identified as R K Khomdonsana (32) and Lourembam Thoiba alias Jackson (20) and both are residents of Jiribam district. Security forces seized a carbine, a self-loading rifle, seven magazines, 73 cartridges and 37 empty cases during a search operation at the foothills of Mongjam in Imphal East district on Tuesday. **AGARTALA, April 23:** Alleging rising trends in crime against women, Tripura Mahila Congress on Wednesday submitted a memorandum to the Director General of Police, Amitabh Ranjan demanding severe punishment of the culprits.

A delegation of the Mahila Congress met, DGP Ranjan and alleged that the BJP Government has been saddled in power in Tripura

Otherwise, we shall be compelled to organise State wide protest against increasing crime against women", he added.

# Political parties, other organisations across UP condemn Pahalgam attack; Akhilesh hits out at BJP

**LUCKNOW, April 23:** Political parties, bar associations and various other organisations across Uttar Pradesh have condemned the terrorist attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam, while Samajwadi Party president Akhilesh Yadav hit out at the BJP over its reaction on the Pahalgam attack.

In a strongly worded post on social media platform X, Yadav accused the BJP of "politicising" the attack and "lacking genuine empathy" for the victims and their families.

"By publishing a childish advertisement on the extremely painful tragedy of Jammu and Kashmir, the BJP has proved that BJP leaders have zero sympathy for those who have lost their lives and whose families are in deep sorrow. Even if BJP removes this advertisement, even its staunch supporters will not forgive this sin," Yadav wrote.

Though Yadav did not specify which advertisement he was referring to, sources in the Samajwadi Party suggested that his comments were directed at social media posts shared by some official BJP handles, which claimed that the attackers in Pahalgam asked the victims their religion before opening fire.

Blaming the central government for alleged security lapses, Yadav said, "When the BJP government

in Jammu and Kashmir has done everything according to its own will, then it cannot shirk its responsibility for the untimely deaths of so many people. It is the failure of the central government that it could not anticipate such a gruesome incident."

Yadav also questioned the alleged "lack of adequate security measures" at Pahalgam, a well-known tourist destination. "If the BJP and their allies are encouraging tourists to visit Jammu and Kashmir, then why were adequate security arrangements not made beforehand?" he asked.

The BJP also hit out at the SP for "appeasement politics".

"It's not surprising for a party that has always engaged in appeasement politics to engage in politics even at this moment when we all should be speaking in one voice. But, I want to assure you, Akhilesh Yadav that unlike you, we won't engage in politics of appeasement. Rather our government will ensure a befitting reply to the perpetrators of this dastardly attack," UP BJP general secretary and party's Rajya Sabha MP Amarpal Maurya told PTI.

BJP units in several cities, including Lucknow, Unnao, Hapur and Jhansi, cancelled their planned party programmes for Wednesday as a mark of respect for the vic-



times. In Sant Kabir Nagar, the bar association held a protest and condolence meeting for those killed in Pahalgam. Association president Shashi Kumar Ojha announced a cessation of judicial work for the day and demanded swift action against the perpetrators.

Shahjahanpur witnessed protests by Hindu Jagran Manch workers, and their leader demanded immediate and "forceful retaliation" against the terrorists.

In Varanasi, Shri Kashi Vishwanath temple authorities lit a lamp in condolence and organised a Rudra Path for the peace of the victims' souls. Locals also gathered at the Varad Anjane Hanuman

temple to light lamps and observe silence, urging Prime Minister Narendra Modi to take "decisive action" against terrorism.

BJP Hapur district president Naresh Tomar condemned the attack and called for a strong action against Pakistan's alleged role.

The Hindu Jagran Manch in Hathras also staged a protest at the Shaheed Bhagat Singh Memorial, burning an effigy of "Islamic terrorists". In Meerut, both the Congress and the BJP announced separate tribute programmes to honour the victims.

# Make choice between post and freedom: SC to Senthil Balaji

**NEW DELHI, April 23:** The Supreme Court on Wednesday told DMK leader V Senthil Balaji to make a choice "between post and freedom" as it warned him of cancelling bail if he did not step down as minister in Tamil Nadu.

A bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Augustine George Masih took exception to the fact that Balaji was reinstated as a Tamil Nadu cabinet minister days after getting bail in a money laundering case related to the "cash-for-job" scam.

"There is grave apprehension that you will interfere and will influence witnesses. You have to make a choice between the post (minister) and freedom. What choice you want to make, you tell us," it said.

The top court referred to a previous judgment which recorded that he forced people to withdraw complaints against him. Grant of bail did not mean power to influence witnesses, it noted.

"When you were a minister, categorical findings have been recorded against you in the manner in which you brought about settlement and the proceedings are quashed. Grant of bail does not mean power to influence witnesses. In the past, you have influenced witnesses," the bench said.

The top court, as a result, offered him a choice.

"So, you have to make a choice between the post and the freedom. Such drastic findings are recorded against you in capacity as a minister," the bench said. The court was hearing pleas to recall Balaji's bail on the ground that he influenced witnesses in the case. The top court found a prima facie case against Balaji based on his past conduct which showed he "interfered and influenced" the witnesses.

"Now, you have gone back to the same position where as a minister you will be able to influence. We have granted you bail on totally different grounds. You must remember one thing. He had not been granted bail on merits. He had been granted bail on possible violation on Article 21 of the constitution. What signal are we sending when you hold office of minister?" it asked.

Senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi, representing Balaji, said there was no direct finding against his client.

Senior advocate Kapil Sibal, on behalf of the Tamil Nadu government, said the trial could be shifted out of the state if there was any possibility of influencing the wit-

nesses. The court disagreed, saying no purpose would be served.

Solicitor general Tushar Mehta, appearing for the Enforcement Directorate, referred to its affidavit alleging Balaji influenced the witnesses. "We will record it in the order that we have made a mistake by ignoring the judgements against you, because the entire hearing proceeded on the footing that he is no longer minister. We will accept our mistake," Justice Oka offered.

When Sibal submitted there was no possibility of Balaji influencing witnesses, the top court remarked, "You (Balaji) are preventing witnesses from coming." The apex court also expressed apprehension about politicians misusing the liberal bail jurisprudence developed by the court in money laundering cases.

"What troubles us is for the first time in case of PMLA, we have applied a law that if a case is not going to commence we will grant bail. This order is being followed consistently. When we read the order of the trial court and the high court, we were told that he is no longer minister," it noted.

The bench went on, "Therefore, we ignored the allegation based on the judgements on the ground that he is no longer minister. Now you bring about a change within few days of order granting bail and he is again the minister. This is not the way to deal with the court. After that don't blame us that this court is not liberal in granting bail. You know how difficult it is to get bail in PMLA."

The top court, however, granted the Sibal's request for some time, posting the matter on April 28.

Balaji previously said his appointment as a cabinet minister in Tamil Nadu was not violative of the bail conditions imposed on him by the top court in a money laundering case and he couldn't be chastised for seeking a political office following a popular mandate.

On September 26, 2024, the top court granted bail to Balaji, who had spent over 15 months in jail and observed there was no possibility of the completion of trial in the near future.

Balaji, 48, was sworn in as a minister by Tamil Nadu Governor R N Ravi on September 29, last year and was assigned the same key portfolios -- electricity, non-conventional energy development, prohibition and excise -- he held previously in the Stalin cabinet. (PTI)

## Modi govt will hunt down masterminds of Pahalgam terror attack: Fadnavis



**MUMBAI, April 23:** Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis on Wednesday asserted the government led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi will soon hunt down the masterminds of the Pahalgam terror attack and bring them to justice.

Talking to reporters here, Fadnavis said it was disgusting that terrorists opened fire at tourists after asking them their religion.

Terrorists struck at a prime tourist location in Pahalgam town in south Kashmir on Tuesday afternoon, killing at least 26 persons, mostly holiday-makers, and injuring several others. As many as 6 of the deceased hailed from Maharashtra.

"PM Modi will hunt down the masterminds (of Pahalgam terror attack) and bring them to justice," he said. Fadnavis, who holds the home portfolio, emphasised that the assault was on Indians and there should be no politics over the massacre of innocent civilians.

The entire country is with the people of Kashmir, he affirmed. To a query on the terror assault taking place after a new government was sworn-in post-assembly polls in J&K last year, Fadnavis said, "It is true such an attack didn't happen when the LG (Lieutenant Governor) was in charge (of the administration). But we are with the government (of the Union Territory) and this was an attack on Indians."

Talking to reporters in Pune, Nationalist Congress Party (SP) working president Supriya Sule urged PM Modi and Union Home Minister Amit Shah to convene an all-party meeting and apprise people about the situation in Jammu & Kashmir post the Pahalgam strike. "This is not the time to play blame game. Security and safety of people is paramount. Till the Home Minister (who visited Kashmir after the attack) comes out with a statement, we, as responsible public representatives, should speak with a lot of caution," Sule maintained. A lot of tourists are still stranded in various parts of Kashmir and the local administration is proactively helping them, noted the Lok Sabha MP from Baramati in Pune district.

Most of the tourists who want to come back are complaining of very expensive air tickets, she maintained and requested the government to intervene.

"I request the civil aviation ministry, Railways and the state transport department to facilitate the return of tourists without thinking about making profits. The government should facilitate special flights and bring back those who want to return home," the opposition MP emphasised. (PTI)

## Pahalgam terror attack is direct assault on Indian state, the country is one in fighting: Kharage

**BENGALURU, April 23:** Congress President Mallikarjun Kharage on Wednesday termed the Pahalgam terror attack in which 26 people were killed as a direct assault on the Indian state, and said that at this moment the entire nation is one with the government to fight the terrorists.

He urged the government to use all its strength to hunt down the terrorists, and also suggested that an all-party meeting be called to address the challenge of terrorism in a spirit of consensus.

"Very unfortunate incident happened in Pahalgam in Jammu & Kashmir and the terrorists dastardly killed innocent and unsuspecting tourists yesterday around 2:30 pm. This has deeply hurt, shocked and saddened us all. The Congress party unequivocally condemns this cowardly act of terror and those responsible for it in the strongest possible terms," Kharage said.

Addressing a press conference here, he said, this attack is a direct assault on the unity and integrity of our nation.

"Since the horrific Chittisinghpura massacre in 2000 this is among the most brazen and outrageous attempts by terrorists and separatists. We firmly reiterate that those who murdered unarmed and innocent civilians cannot be human," he



said. Noting that late last evening he spoke to Union Home Minister Amit Shah, who was in Kashmir and to J&K Chief Minister Omar Abdullah and Congress leaders there, and gathered information, the AICC chief said, "Shah told me that they are going to take action drastically in that area."

The Congress Working Committee will meet at 11 am on April 24 at AICC office in New Delhi to discuss the terror attack, he said. Stating that this is not a time for partisan politics, Kharage said, "it is a moment for collective resolve to ensure justice for those who lost their lives and for their grieving families by bringing the perpetrators of this terror attack to justice." "In this moment we all are one with the government and together we have to fight such incidents, terrorists and

whosoever fights against us. We will be one to save the country and for the country's unity and integrity," he said.

The entire nation is in shock and a Pakistani terrorist organisation has claimed responsibility, Kharage said, "we must give a fitting response and in this matter we are all one and we will fight. But, there should not be claims without doing or without properly managing and fingerprinting." "We urge the government to use all its strength to hunt down the terrorist, it has been almost 22 hours now. The government must do everything possible to maintain tourists' confidence in the security arrangement of Jammu and Kashmir," he added.

"They should call an all-party meeting and take some advice. This is not politics, and we don't want politics in this situation," he said, adding that the Congress Party is committed to coordination and cooperation with the government to eliminate terrorism from its roots.

Tourists from various parts of the country were present at Pahalgam, and among the victims were Manjunath and Bharat Bhushan from Karnataka who also lost their lives, Kharage said, "I personally spoke to both the grieving wives of the victims and offered my condolences to them." (PTI)

## Pahalgam terror attack a 'cowardly act of Pakistan', says MP CM Yadav

**BHOPAL/INDORE, April 23:** Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Mohan Yadav on Wednesday termed the Pahalgam terrorist attack in Jammu and Kashmir as a "cowardly act of Pakistan" and asserted the entire country is united in giving a response to the strike.

He expressed grief over the loss of innocent lives in the attack in which an Indore resident was also killed.

Terrorists struck a prime tourist location in Pahalgam in south Kashmir on Tuesday, killing at least 26 people, mostly holiday-makers from other states.

"This is a cowardly act of Pakistan... The whole country is united to respond to this cowardly act of Pakistan and its 'picchlagu' (hangers-on). Our government is moving ahead with a very good plan. We all will pray to Baba Mahakal (Lord Mahakaleshwar) that no such cowardly act happens again in the future," the CM said in a statement in Bhopal.

Indore resident Sushil Nathaniel (58), who had gone to Jammu and Kashmir with

his wife, daughter and son to celebrate Easter, was among the 26 people killed in the terror attack in Pahalgam.

"I pray to Baba Mahakal to give him a place in his feet," Yadav said, mourning the death of Nathaniel.

Nathaniel was posted as a manager with the Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) in Madhya Pradesh's Alirajpur, about 200 km from Indore, as per officials.

Meanwhile, after the deadly strike in Pahalgam, many tourists from Madhya Pradesh who are currently in Jammu and Kashmir want to return home as soon as possible and they are contacting travel agents for journey to their native places, an official of the Travel Agents Association of India (TAAD) said in Indore.

Hemendra Singh Jadon, chairman of the Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh chapter of TAAI, told PTI, "After the terror attack, most of the tourists from Madhya Pradesh want to end their trip to Jammu and Kashmir before their scheduled time and return home as soon as possible." (PTI)

## Pahalgam attack: Punjab put on high alert, CM Mann holds high-level security meeting

**CHANDIGARH, April 23:** Punjab has been put on high alert in the wake of the Pahalgam terror attack, with Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Wednesday holding a high-level security meeting here to take stock of security arrangements in the state.

At a press conference after chairing the meeting, Mann said security has been enhanced in Punjab.

"It is our duty to keep Punjab safe and secure...I want to assure people of Punjab that we will keep the state safe and secure," he said. With reports that terrorists first asked the names of people before killing them in Pahalgam, Mann said terror has no religion.

Which religion allows to kill innocent people, which religion allows such barbarism, he asked. Terrorists struck at a prime tourist location in Pahalgam in south Kashmir on Tuesday, killing at least 26 people, mostly tourists, and injuring several others.

Replying to a question, Mann said, "Those tourists who belong to Punjab and may be stuck in hotels there, we are making arrangements to bring them back safely. We are in touch with J-K authorities".

Mann also said that Punjab authorities are also in touch with student associations of J-K and the government has assured them of their safety and security. DGP Gaurav Yadav said police deployment has

been strengthened at educational institutes in Punjab where there is a high footfall of students from J-K.

Immediately after the Pahalgam incident took place, Mann had ordered that security be stepped up in the state. DGP Yadav said, "At vulnerable points, intensified checkings are going on, especially along the inter-state and inter-district boundaries," the DGP said.

"There has been hardening of security around high risk individuals, including increased patrolling in and around their places of residence. There has been enhanced patrolling near religious places, political gatherings, transport hubs and high footfall public and tourist areas where the police deployment is there to maintain a sense of confidence," the DGP said.

Intelligence coordination and surveillance of anti-national elements has been strengthened. "We are in touch with intelligence and border guarding agencies," Yadav further said.

The DGP said instructions have been issued to ensure maximum visibility of uniformed personnel in sensitive zones to instill public confidence.

"We are in touch with J&K police and the central authorities and a close watch is being kept on the situation," he said. (PTI)

## One nation, one election foundation stone of 'Viksit Bharat: Dharmendra Pradhan

**NEW DELHI, April 23:** 'One Nation, One Election' is the foundation stone of the vision of 'Viksit Bharat' and will prove to be a key factor in building a strong and stable India, Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan said on Wednesday.

Pradhan was addressing an event -- 'Students for one nation, one election' -- that saw the participation of student leaders from across the country. "One nation, one election is the foundation stone of the vision of Viksit Bharat (developed India), which will prove to be decisive in the direction of a strong and stable India.

"The subject has now gone beyond legal and political discussions and has become a part of the main agenda of the country. To take any major national decision to a decisive level, policy, planning, strategy and most importantly,



public participation are necessary," Pradhan said.

It is not a subject limited only to election expenditure and code of conduct; rather, it is a medium to give a new direction to political stability, good governance and development of the country, he said.

Pradhan alleged the "negative attitude" of the opposition disrespects the mandate of the people.

"When Prime Minister Narendra Modi says, 'This is the time, it is India's time', the negative attitude of the opposition is unfortunate. It not only questions the constitu-

tional institutions of the country, but also disrespects the mandate.

"This negative politics of the opposition is unfortunate, in which questions are being raised on the constitutional institutions of the country. These people who talk about the Constitution are the ones who are hurting the Constitution the most," he said.

## Delhi to table cloud-seeding proposal, launch pollution action plan next week: Sirsa

**NEW DELHI, April 23:** To tackle air pollution in the national capital, a proposal to conduct a cloud-seeding trial will be tabled at the next Cabinet meeting, while the pollution action plan is set to be launched in the upcoming week, Delhi Environment Minister Manjinder Singh Sirsa said on Wednesday.

He said the Delhi government is ramping up its efforts to curb pollution through advanced technological interventions, including maximum digitisation, artificial intelligence-based monitoring and round-the-clock surveillance of construction and traffic hotspots.

In the upcoming week, the department will launch its pollution action plan, focusing on comprehensive measures to address the sources of pollution, Sirsa said.

He added that efforts will be prioritised to reduce public inconven-



ience and enhance transparency, with most of the work being carried out through digitisation.

Giving an update on the progress of the artificial-rain initiative, Sirsa told PTI that a cloud-seeding proposal -- currently in its final stages -- will be presented at the next Cabinet meeting. If ap-

proved, it will be circulated among all departments for the required no-objection certificates (NOCs) and a detailed evaluation.

"The proposal will be tabled in the cabinet and once approved, we will quickly apply for all the necessary NOCs. We plan to conduct a trial during peak summer on the

outskirts of Delhi. If everything goes smoothly and without any hurdles, we will consider it as an emergency option to tackle severe pollution for the betterment of our residents," the minister said.

"Our government is committed to working for the welfare of people. Pollution is a serious problem in Delhi and we are working at every level to address all sources contributing to it," he added. There are a total of 12 agencies from which the government must obtain NOCs before proceeding with the artificial-rain (cloud-seeding) trial.

These include the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA), Ministry of Defence, Ministry of Home Affairs, Special Protection Group (SPG), Ministry of Environment, Ministry of Forest and Climate Change (Government of India) and Airports Authority of India. (PTI)



## Delhi court issues non-bailable warrant against Medha Patkar for flouting order

**NEW DELHI, April 23:** A Delhi court on Wednesday issued a non-bailable warrant against Narmada Bachao Andolan leader Medha Patkar and said she "deliberately" flouted its order to submit probation bonds and deposit ₹ 1 lakh fine in a defamation case of Delhi LG V K Saxena.

Observing her plea for adjournment was "frivolous and mischievous" and filed with the intent to "hoodwink" it, the court cautioned Patkar against her action saying it could make it "reconsider the benevolent sentence".

Additional sessions judge Vishal Singh said, "Instead of appearing before the court to comply with the order on sentence dated April 8, the convict (Patkar) is absent and has deliberately failed to comply with the order on sentence and to avail of the benefit of probation subject to furnishing of the compensation amount."

The court went on, "The intention of the convict is apparent that she is deliberately violating the court order; she is avoiding appearing before the court and also avoiding accepting the terms of the sentence passed against her. There is no order of suspension of sentence passed by this court on April 8." Given the scenario, the court said, it was left with no other option but to enforce "her production through a coercive order".

"Issue non bailable warrants (NBWs) against convict Medha Patkar, through the office of the Commissioner of Police, Delhi Police, for the next date. Put up for report on NBWs and further proceedings on May 3," the court directed. The judge said Patkar sought adjournment on the grounds that her revision petition was pending in the Delhi High Court.

"The application has no substance; there is no direction in the order dated April 22 of the Delhi High Court that the convict Medha Patkar is not required to comply with the order on sentence dated April 8. The present application is frivolous, mischievous and is only calculated to hoodwink the court," said ASI Singh and dismissed it.

In a reprieve to Patkar, who was facing a five-month imprisonment, the court on April 8 released her on "probation of good conduct" in the defamation case.

The sessions court had "modified" the order of a magisterial court sentencing her to five months of simple imprisonment on July 1, 2024. It asked her to deposit the



compensation amount of ₹ 1 lakh, which should be released to Saxena. "On deposit of the compensation amount, the convict or appellant Medha Patkar shall furnish a probation bond of ₹ 25,000 with one surety of like amount for an operative period of one year from the date of furnishing the probation bond," the court had said.

On Wednesday, the matter was listed for Patkar's appearance, furnishing of probation bonds and depositing the fine amount.

Advocates Gajinder Kumar and Kiran Jai appeared for Saxena.

Saxena filed the case as the president of the National Council of Civil Liberties against Patkar for her defamatory press release against Saxena, issued on November 24, 2000. On May 24, last year, a magisterial court observed Patkar's statements calling Saxena a "coward" and alleging his involvement in hawala transactions were not only defamatory per se but also crafted to incite negative perceptions about him.

Also, the accusation that the complainant was "mortgaging" the people of Gujarat and their resources to foreign interests was a direct attack on his integrity and public service, it added.

The arguments on sentencing were completed on May 30, following which the order on the quantum of sentence was reserved on June 7.

On July 1, the court sentenced her to five months' simple imprisonment, following which Patkar filed an appeal in a sessions court.

The sessions court, which held the 70-year-old guilty in the defamation case, released her on "probation of good conduct" on April 8 and imposed a precondition on her of depositing ₹ 1 lakh as fine. Probation is a method of non-institutional treatment of offenders and a conditional suspension of sentence in which the offender, after conviction, is released on bond of good behaviour instead of being sent to prison. ## Pahalgam attack: Doing our best to minimise dent on J-K tourism, says Shekhawat

**NEW DELHI, April 23:** Union Tourism Minister Gajendra Singh Shekhawat on Wednesday said some people with nefarious intentions have tried to again "incite separatism and terrorism" in the Valley and asserted that his ministry will do the best to "minimise the dent" on tourism in Jammu and Kashmir in the wake of the Pahalgam attack.

Interacting with reporters on the sidelines of the 38th meeting of the Central Advisory Board of Archaeology (CABA) here, he said he and his office are in "continuous touch" with the chief secretary and the tourism secretary of the Union Territory and keeping an eye on the situation.

Terrorists struck at a prime tourist location in Pahalgam in south Kashmir on Tuesday, killing at least 26 people, mostly tourists, and injuring several others. The deceased included two foreigners - from the UAE and Nepal -- and two locals.

Before the commencement of the meeting, chaired by the minister, a minute of silence was observed by the attendees.

"The entire country is pained, and also filled with a sense of



anger. I convey my sentiments to the families of the victims of the Pahalgam terror attack," Shekhawat said in his opening remarks at the meeting held at the Bharat Mandapam here.

Talking to reporters, he said, "This cowardly incident has hurt our sentiments. But, some people with their nefarious intention, have tried to incite separatism and terrorism in Kashmir again."

The Union culture and tourism minister also said Prime Minister

strikes, India has sent a message to the world that anti-India activities, whether emanating from Indian soil or from outside the country, will not be tolerated," he said.

Asked if he has approached the Jammu and Kashmir government and tourism department authorities in the wake of the attack, Shekhawat said, "I am in touch with everybody, my office too, my secretary is also in touch with the tourism secretary in Jammu and Kashmir, the chief secretary of Jammu and Kashmir".

"We are in continuous touch and keeping an eye on that. And, we will do our best to minimise the dent on tourism in Kashmir because of this incident, and tourism across the country," he said.

In his opening remarks at the meeting, the Union minister, who also holds the portfolio of culture in the government, suggested to "increase the frequency" of the CABA meeting, and lamented that a delay or prolonged gap between two successive meetings is not a favourable situation either for the board or its members.

The 37th meeting of CABA was held on June 14, 2022, under the chairpersonship of the then Union

Minister of Culture, G Kishan Reddy.

A member of Parliament is elected for five years, and if a meeting of CABA happens after a gap of three years or more, then it's a loss, it's a "national loss".

The Archaeological Survey of India -- an autonomous institution under the Ministry of Culture -- hosted the 38th meeting of CABA.

The board was formed in 1945 by the government of India to foster strong ties between the ASI and Indian universities, academic institutions and state governments for conducting archaeological research, the ministry said in a statement.

Every three years, the board is re-constituted through a gazette notification after the approval of the Union Minister of Culture, who also serves as the chairman of the CABA.

"The 38th meeting of CABA will discuss the resolutions/suggestions received from Members of the Advisory Board and the action taken for the resolutions/suggestions during the previous meeting," the Ministry of Culture said in a statement on Tuesday. (PTI)

### Delhi traders hold protest against Pahalgam terror attack

**NEW DELHI, April 23:** Several traders' associations in the national capital held protests on Wednesday, condemning the Pahalgam terror attack that claimed the lives of 26 people.

As a mark of protest, traders tied black ribbons on their arms, demanding immediate action against the terrorists involved in the attack.

During the demonstration, protesters held placards with slogans such as 'Doshiyon ke khilaf karwayi karo' (take action against the guilty), 'Begunahon ka balidaan nahi sahega Hindustan' (India will not tolerate the sacrifice of innocents) and 'Kaleaam band karo' (Stop the massacre).

They also carried posters featuring photos of the victims and their families, which had been circulating online.

The Chandni Chowk Traders Association held a demonstration outside the Town Hall, while the Federation of Sadar Bazaar Traders protested near Qutub Road.

Paramjit Singh Pamma, president of the Federation of Sadar Bazaar Traders, expressed deep sorrow over the incident, stating that the attack had shaken the entire nation.

"We are a country with diverse religions, but terrorism knows no religion. A terrorist is a terrorist," said Rakesh Kumar Yadav, Secretary of the Federation of Sadar Bazaar Traders. (PTI)

### Wife bids tearful adieu to Navy officer Vinay Narwal killed in Pahalgam attack

**CHANDIGARH/KOCHI, April 23:** There was hardly a dry eye as Indian Navy officer Vinay Narwal's wife Himanshi bid adieu to him embracing his coffin wrapped in the tricolour. Married on April 16, the couple was on their honeymoon trip to Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam when terrorists killed the officer in cold blood in front of his wife.

"Let his soul rest in peace...We should all be proud of him in every way. And we will make him proud in every way," said Himanshi, who hails from Gurugram and is pursuing a PhD.

On Wednesday afternoon, Narwal's mortal remains were brought to the IGI airport in Delhi from Kashmir, from where they were taken to his native place Karnal in Haryana.

"Jai Hind," Himanshi said, saluting her husband Narwal at the IGI.

At the airport, Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta paid homage to Narwal (26) and laid a wreath at the mortal remains and was also seen trying to comfort his wife. On Wednesday morning, Chief Minister Saini made a video call to Narwal's grandfather Hawa Singh, who sought from Prime Minister Narendra Modi exemplary punishment for the perpetrators of the attack and firm action to weed out terrorism.

"Today, I have lost my grandson, tomorrow it can be someone else," he said while speaking to CM Saini. "I was eating bhel puri and my husband was also here. A person came and asked if he was Muslim and when he denied, the man shot

him dead," Himanshi is heard saying in a purported video of her, which has gone viral on social media. Narwal's colleagues remembered him as a cheerful and dedicated officer.

"Lt Narwal was always cheerful and deeply committed to his duties," a Navy officer recalled. Narwal had been serving at the Southern Naval Command in Kochi for the past one-and-a-half years after joining the Navy in 2022, officials said. "The Chief of the Naval Staff, Admiral Dinesh K Tripathi, and all personnel of the Indian Navy are shocked and deeply saddened by the tragic loss of Lt Vinay Narwal, who fell victim to the dastardly terror attack in Pahalgam," the Navy spokesperson said in a post on 'X'.

"We extend our heartfelt condolences to his family during this moment of unimaginable grief. The Indian Navy also stands in solemn solidarity with all others who lost their lives in this heinous act of violence," the post added.

Narwal's neighbour Naresh Bansal said, "After the marriage, everyone was celebrating and was in a happy mood. And now suddenly this sad news comes." Another neighbour Seema recalled that there were grand celebrations at his home and not just the Narwal family, but the entire neighbourhood was celebrating after the wedding.

"They were planning a honeymoon in Switzerland, but decided to go to Kashmir instead, taking into account the leave he had...We can't imagine what his family is going through," she said. (PTI)

### Attached assets worth over ₹ 600-cr in 3 West Bengal recruitment 'scams': ED

**NEW DELHI, April 23:** The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Wednesday said it has attached assets worth more than ₹ 609 crore as part of its money laundering investigations into three different teachers and staff recruitment "scams" in West Bengal.

It said a fresh order has been issued to attach land parcels, commercial spaces, flats and villas worth ₹ 56.50 crore in the case related to hiring by School Service Commission (SSC) for group C and D staff. The assets are held in the name of the companies and LLPs (limited liability partnership) of alleged "main middleman" Prasanna Kumar Roy and his associates, the federal probe agency said in a statement.

These properties are worth ₹ 56.50 crore, it said. A total of 25,753 teaching and non-teaching staff of state-run and aided schools lost their jobs after the Supreme court found large-scale irregularities in the 2016 recruitment process and scrapped the entire panel on April 3.

The Supreme Court on April 17 extended till

December 31 the services of terminated teachers found clean by the CBI.

The ED earlier attached properties worth ₹ 163.66 crore in this case in the name of Roy and his "main agent" Chandan Mondal. Both are currently lodged in jail under judicial custody after the agency arrested them.

The second recruitment "scam" case of West Bengal in which the ED has earlier attached assets is the assistant teacher recruitment for classes 9 to 12. The attachment value in this case is ₹ 238.78 crore, it said. The third such case is that of the primary teachers recruitment where the agency has seized assets worth ₹ 151 crore.

"Thus, the total attachment by ED Kolkata office in the recruitment scam cases stands at ₹ 609.9 crore," it said.

West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Tuesday urged protesting teachers, who lost their jobs following a Supreme Court ruling, to return to work, assuring them that her government will "protect" their salaries. (PTI)

### CLAT UG-2025: Delhi HC asks NLUs consortium to revise marksheets, republish result

**NEW DELHI, April 23:** The Delhi High Court on Wednesday directed the Consortium of National Law Universities to revise the marksheets and republish the final list of selected candidates of CLAT UG-2025 within four weeks.

A bench of Chief Justice D K Upadhyaya and Justice Tushar Rao Gedela accepted certain objections of the candidates while rejecting some of them.

"We direct the respondent/consortium to revise the marksheets and to republish/renotify the final list of selected candidates within four weeks from date," the bench said. It clarified that the consortium should apply the evaluation to each appellant and petitioner and the candidates who might have attempted certain questions under the court's consideration.

The consortium, the court said,

should also apply the evaluation to all the candidates to whom certain benefits could be granted in view of the analysis. The bench, as a result, disposed of the petitions and appeals pointing out certain errors in the common law admission test (CLAT) UG-2025 questionnaire. The appeals were filed by the aspirants and the consortium challenging a single judge's order. The court on April 9 concluded hearing the lawyers for petitioner aspirants, who appeared in the exam in December 2024, and Consortium of National Law Universities (CNLU) and reserved its order.

The court heard arguments on the questions which were under challenge in the petitions and is yet to hear pleas challenging the questions of CLAT PG-2025. CLAT determines admissions to undergraduate and postgraduate

law courses in national law universities in the country.

Multiple pleas were filed in different high courts alleging several questions in the exam were wrong.

On February 6, the Supreme Court transferred all the petitions over the issue to the Delhi High Court for a "consistent adjudication".

The top court passed the direction on the transfer petitions of CNLUs.

The CLAT, 2025 for admissions in five-year LLB courses in NLUs was held on December 1 and results were declared on December 7, 2024.

Several students wanted the cases to be transferred to the Delhi High Court, saying it passed a favourable order for some petitioners by identifying errors in two questions of the CLAT-UG 2025 exam and directing the consortium to revise their results. (PTI)

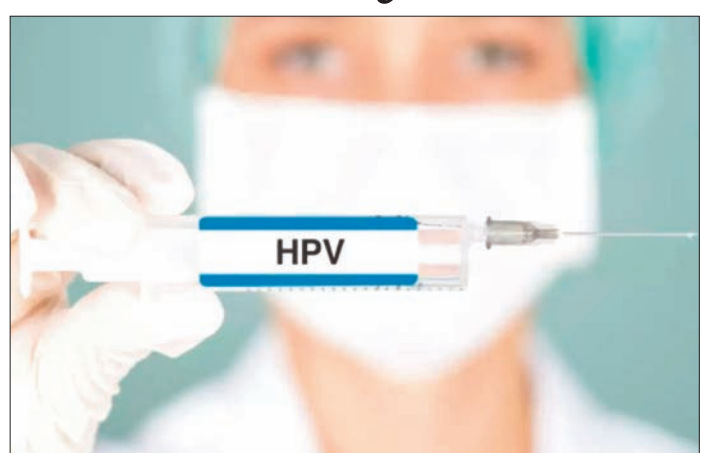
### HPV diagnostic test kits for screening of cervical cancer ready for roll out: Govt

**NEW DELHI, April 23:** The government on Wednesday said indigenously developed HPV diagnostic kits for screening of cervical cancer were ready for roll out and will prove to be a cost-effective method for carrying out tests for the second most common cancer among Indian women.

Union Minister Jitendra Singh, at a meeting to share the findings of the validation of the Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) test kits, called for greater private sector participation for the roll out of a mass screening programme for cervical cancer.

According to the World Health Organization data, one out of every five women in the world suffering from cervical cancer is an Indian. Late diagnosis of the disease leads to poor survival, and 25 per cent of the global mortality due to cervical cancer occurs in India.

"Over 90 per cent of cervical cancer cases are linked to HPV, with over 70 per cent affecting young girls. It is our national responsibility to ensure affordable



vaccines, screening and care," Singh said.

"The objective of this entire exercise is to have affordable, accessible screening and, if possible, mass screening, which is feasible only when you have large-scale private sector participation," he said at the review meeting.

The HPV test kits have been developed by the Department of Biotechnology, BIRAC, AIIMS-

New Delhi, ICMR, as well as partners from the industry.

At the outset, the participants of the review meeting observed a two-minute silence to mourn the deaths in a terror attack at Pahalgam on Tuesday.

Cancer of the uterine cervix is the second most common cancer among Indian women and also constitutes the largest burden of cervical cancer patients in the

world.

The Department of Biotechnology (DBT), through its partnership with Grand Challenges India (GCI) at the Biotechnology Industry Research Assistance Council (BIRAC), has supported a programme 'Validating Indigenous Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) Tests for Cervical Cancer Screening in India'.

It validated indigenously developed, rapid, point-of-care, RT-PCR-based HPV diagnostic test kits for screening cervical cancer in premier R&D laboratories of India.

Evidence suggests that early diagnosis with regular population screening programmes has substantially contributed to the reduction of the cancer incidence rate in several developing countries, an official statement said.

"The recent development of these point-of-care HPV diagnostic test kits may prove to be an important health invention and prevention strategy for cervical cancer in India," it said. (PTI)

### Airlines operate addl flights to Srinagar; govt says fares being kept at reasonable levels

**NEW DELHI, April 23:** The government on Wednesday announced additional flights will be operated from Srinagar and that airlines on the route are being kept at reasonable levels amid a large number of tourists looking to return from J&K in the aftermath of the Pahalgam terror attack.

As many as 3,337 passengers flew out of Srinagar in 20 flights between 6 am and 12 pm on Wednesday.

IndiGo, Air India and SpiceJet are operating a total of seven extra flights in addition to their normal scheduled services from Srinagar. At least 26 people, mostly tourists, died in the Pahalgam terror attack.

Civil Aviation Minister K Ramamohan Naidu on Wednesday said that strict instructions were given to airline companies to avoid any fare surges, and that fares are being monitored and kept at reasonable levels. His comments also came against the backdrop of some websites apparently showing ticket prices of over ₹ 50,000 for flights to Srinagar.

The country's largest airline IndiGo said that in view of the emergent situation, it has taken steps to keep the fares moderated.

The minister also emphasised that constant efforts are being made to ensure safe travel of tourists from Srinagar. "In addition to the four extra flights already announced, three more flights to Delhi have been added for today -- IndiGo 6E 3203 (Dep: 1700, Arr: 1800), IndiGo 6E 3103 (Dep: 1800, Arr: 1930), and a SpiceJet flight scheduled to depart at 10:30 PM," he said in a post on X.

All airlines operating from Srinagar have waived

cancellation and rescheduling charges to support passengers. "Food and water are being provided at the airport, and an extra tent has been set up outside for those waiting. Between 6 am and 12 pm today, Srinagar Airport handled 20 departures with 3,337 pax," Naidu said. The minister also said that he is personally monitoring the situation and is in constant touch with the home ministry as well as airline operators.

In an advisory on Wednesday, DGCA said that in the aftermath of the incident in Pahalgam, there is an unexpected demand from tourists seeking to return to their homes.

"In this regard, the airlines are advised to take swift action to increase the number of flights in response to heightened demand and also to ensure uninterrupted connectivity from Srinagar to various destinations across India, facilitating evacuation of stranded tourists," it said.

According to the advisory, airlines have also been asked to provide all necessary assistance to tourists facing unexpected circumstances and challenges during this difficult time. IndiGo said that to support those travelling to/from Srinagar, it is offering waivers for cancellation fees or rescheduling charges.

"IndiGo has added special flights to Srinagar from Delhi and Mumbai with immediate effect and will be operating these over and above the regular schedule of 160 weekly flights from / to Srinagar from various parts of India," the airline, which operates 20 flights daily connecting Srinagar with various Indian cities, said in a statement. (PTI)

Actor Sidharth Malhotra termed the Pahalgam terrorist attack "a cowardly act".

# Players wear black armbands during Super Cup match to mourn terror attack victims

**BHUBANESWAR, April 23:** The players of Bengaluru FC and Inter Kashi wore black armbands and observed a minute of silence before their Super Cup match here on Wednesday to mourn the victims of the terrorist attack in Pahalgam.

At least 26 persons -- mostly tourists -- were killed by terrorists on Tuesday at the Baisaran meadows in Pahalgam.

The Resistance Front (TRF), a shadow group of the banned Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terror group, has claimed responsibility for the attack. The attack has drawn strong condemnation from across the world.

The players of both teams, including their foreign recruits, came out to the ground with black armbands to pay respect to the victims of the terror attack.

Just before the start of the match, the players, the match officials and the spectators at the Kalinga Stadium stood in silence for one minute in memory of the departed souls.

Earlier, Bengaluru FC expressed solidarity with the victims and those injured due to the terror attack.

"Bengaluru FC stands in solidarity with the victims, their families, and all those affected in the #PahalgamAttack," the club, which won the ISL in 2018-19 season, said on 'X'.

"A minute's silence will be observed ahead of today's #KalingaSuperCup fixture, where the Blues will wear black armbands as a mark of respect."

Bengaluru FC and India captain Sunil



Chhetri condemned the "cowardly" act of the terrorists.

"Saddened at the news coming out of Pahalgam. Words fall short. My thoughts

are with the families of all those affected by what is a cowardly act of terror," he said. Inter Kashi described the terrorist attack as "a wound on the soul of this Nation".

"They say the show must go on. And it does. But not without remembrance. Not without rage. Pahalgam bleeds, and so do we. What happened is not just a headline — it's a wound on the soul of this Nation.

"Terror must not just be condemned, but in fact confronted and defeated. We stand united - in grief, in rage, and in resolve," the Varanasi-based I-League club said in a strong and emotional reaction.

"As the world moves on, we pause to stand in solidarity and in anger. Sport goes on, yes — but not in silence. Because sport reflects life, and today, we raise our voices for the lives that were so

cruelly taken away."

Chennaiyin FC and Mumbai City FC, who face each other in the second match of the day, also condemned the terrorist attack, terming it as "senseless violence".

"The tragedy in Pahalgam — ordinarily a place of serene beauty in India — has taken innocent lives in an act of senseless violence. There is no place for terrorism, anywhere.

"The club stands in heartfelt solidarity with the victims, their families, and all those impacted now and in the days to come," the Chennai-based ISL club said.

"Our thoughts are with everyone affected by the tragic attack in Pahalgam. We mourn the lives lost and stand in solidarity with their families during this time of grief," Mumbai City FC posted on 'X'. (PTI)

## 5 Mizoram girls among 15 selected for NCOEs from ASMITA sub-junior hockey league

**NEW DELHI, April 23:** Five under-16 girls from Mizoram are among the 15 hockey players selected by the Sports Authority of India to be inducted into the various National Centres of Excellence (NCOEs).

Seen as the building block for women's hockey in India, the girls have been chosen after the conclusion of the 2024-25 season of the ASMITA leagues matches.

The 15 selected for training at the NCOEs include three players from Haryana and two each from Jharkhand and Odisha, besides girls from Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka and Uttar Pradesh.

Piyush Dubey, hockey's High Performance Director for SAI and Khelo India, said these girls have been chosen keeping future Olympics in mind.

"We have to think of a pathway and these girls have the potential to make it to the senior national team. In the last three-four years, ASMITA has provided the opportunity to see so many players in action and this is a welcome change in our hockey ecosystem. This did not exist before," said Dubey.

He added that many players like Sunelita Toppo, Sujata Kujur and Sakshi Rana have emerged from this hockey league and are now representing India.

Six teams featuring 120 under-



16 players took part in the ASMITA sub-junior hockey league's final phase.

A total of 17 matches were played in the ₹ 15.5 lakh prize money event. SAI Shakti won the team championship for the third consecutive time beating Madhya Pradesh Hockey Academy 2-1 in the final match at the Major Dhyan Chand National Stadium here.

Mizoram's hockey has been quite startling. For the first time in its history, the tiny North-eastern

state, known for its footballers and boxers, won a bronze medal in the senior national women's hockey championship in Panchkula.

Dubey said the Mizoram girls have shown immense improvement in the last five-six years and credit goes to the coaches who are working at the SAI centre in Thanzawl. Lalrothuami, a 2009 junior India player, said young girls are taking interest in hockey and some 40 are training at the SAI centre.

Mizoram have found a unique

way to attract youngsters to play hockey. The image and profile of current Indian women's team player and Tokyo Olympian Lalremiam have been used in advertisements and social media to attract girls to participate in trials.

"The response has been fairly good from the villages. Two of our girls — Lalhantluangi and Lalrinpui — are ASMITA products and are junior Indian team members. They are a great advertisement for us and we are very happy that five Mizoram girls have been selected

for training at NCOEs," said Lalrothuami.

"Our players need more competitive exposure and better training ecosystem. In terms of skills, all players are more or less equal but Mizo girls are stronger and have the stamina. We hope they will utilise the facilities at NCOEs well."

However, selection at NCOEs does not guarantee long-term membership. There are two assessments every year and players are judged on the three basic parameters -- physical strength, sports science tests and skills.

## I felt sidelined and ignored by PCB after 2024 T20 World Cup: Mohammad Amir

**KARACHI, April 23:** Ex fast bowler Mohammad Amir says he felt sidelined and ignored by the Pakistan cricket setup after the 2024 T20 World Cup and cited lack of communication as the reason behind his retirement late last year.

Amir and Imad Wasim had come out of their retirements to play in last year's T20 World Cup in which Pakistan's flop show saw the winners of the 2009 edition failing to make the Super Eight stage.

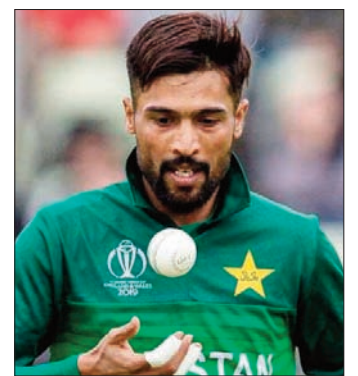
Both these players announced their retirements on consecutive days last December.

Amir said on a TV channel, "I felt sidelined and ignored by the Pakistan cricket setup after the T20 World Cup. After the T20 World Cup ended, no one even talked to me. No one told me if I was part of the future plans."

"A wise person understands the signs — if you're not in the plans, then you have to think about yourself. That's exactly what I did. I've made up my mind now — thank you very much, international cricket," he said.

The left-arm pacer had earlier retired from international cricket in December 2020 at the age of 28 citing issues with coaches Misbah Ul Haq and Waqar Younis.

Amir said he had even refused accepting a contract to play



County cricket after PCB had asked him to play in the World Cup in the Americas.

"Honestly speaking, I ended up spending more money than I made. I travelled with my trainer, and all those expenses came out of my own pocket. But that's a different matter," Amir said.

Meanwhile, Amir supported players having an aggressive mindset in cricket.

"Cricket used to be fierce. Being mentally aggressive is part of the game's beauty. It's not about disrespect — it's about shifting the batter's focus. Off the field, we all hang out and joke around," he said.

The 33-year-old Amir also backed Pakistan batting mainstay Babar Azam to come out strong from his recent struggles while pointing out his technical flaws. (PTI)

## No fireworks, cheerleaders in MI vs SRH IPL match; players to sport black armbands

**HYDERABAD, April 23:** The players of Sunrisers Hyderabad and Mumbai Indians will wear black armbands during their IPL match which will not feature cheerleaders and fireworks here on Wednesday to mourn the victims of the terrorist attack in Pahalgam that caused 26 deaths.

The teams will also observe a minute's silence to pay their respects to those affected by the incident that has drawn international condemnation.

"The players of two teams will wear black armbands and observe a minute's silence in memory of all those who lost their lives in the terrorist attack in Kashmir's Pahalgam," a BCCI source told PTI.

"As a mark of respect there would be no cheerleaders on the sidelines of MI vs SRH game. No crackers will be burst," he added.

Terrorists opened fire on civilians at the popular tourist location in south Kashmir on Tuesday, killing at least 26 persons and injuring several others.

The Resistance Front (TRF), which is a part of the banned Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terror group, claimed responsibility for the attack. The attack has drawn strong condemnation from across the world.

The Indian cricket team snapped bilateral cricket with Pakistan after the 2008 Mumbai terror attacks and recently refused to tour the country for the Champions Trophy, prompting the ICC to make provisions for a neutral venue in Dubai. (PTI)

## We never press the panic button, it's just a game: CSK CEO Kasi Viswanathan

**NEW DELHI, April 23:** Chennai Super Kings as a franchise never presses the panic button and there is not much to worry about despite the five-time champions' ordinary run in the current season IPL, its CEO Kasi Viswanathan told PTI on Wednesday.

CSK have lost a record five games in a row this season and more than halfway into the tournament, find themselves at the bottom of the points table with six losses in eight games.

They have lacked firepower in the batting department and captain Ruturaj Gaikwad's absence due to an injury has only made it worse for the storied outfit.

CSK CEO has also spoken about his team's run in IPL 2025.

"We have not been performing up to the mark. We are trying to improve and we will try to do well in the next few games. We have never pressed the panic button in our franchise is not like that, it is just a game," Viswanathan told PTI.

M S Dhoni is back leading the side in Gaikwad's absence but as head coach Stephen Fleming put it 'he doesn't have a magic wand' and can't change the team's fortunes overnight.

Following the defeat to Mumbai Indians, CSK find themselves in a must-win situation in their remaining six games



with Dhoni already speaking about the planning for 2026.

Can Dhoni script a turnaround after taking over from Gaikwad midway into the tournament?

"See, it's not the question of anybody. It's a question that the team should do well and not just one individual. We don't talk to the team management. Dhoni will do what is right for the team."

"What we are expecting as administrators is good performance by the team and we don't criticize our team at all," he added. (PTI)

## Home advantage is not prevalent because teams, players are new after big auction: Dravid

**BENGALURU, April 23:** Rajasthan Royals head coach Rahul Dravid on Wednesday cited cases of players joining new franchises and consequent lack of familiarity with the conditions as a plausible reason for teams complaining about the lack of home advantage in this IPL.

Several teams such as Royal Challengers Bengaluru, Chennai Super Kings, Lucknow Super Giants and Kolkata Knight Riders had expressed unhappiness about the nature of pitches at their respective home venues.

"I think it depends from ground to ground really. I'm not really sure what specific franchises might have wanted from their curators, so to speak, but home advantage, generally, the teams are new as well right after a big auction," Dravid said on the eve of RR's match here against RCB.



Dravid then validated his arguments by giving the examples of players like RR's Nitish Rana and RCB's Phil Salt, who joined those teams after last year's mega auction.

"It's the first year after a big auction, so for a lot of the players as well, even though they may be

your home players, they are playing for those teams or those grounds for the first time. For example, in the case of say, at RCB, someone like Phil Salt was at KKR and he's coming here for the first time.

"I'm just using him as an exam-

ple. We have players in our team, for example, someone like Nitish Rana (KKR) was not with us, so for him, Jaipur is actually kind of a new ground."

The former Indian skipper said the new set of players will get more acclimatised to the conditions as the season progresses.

"So, I think that when you just have a big auction and there's a change of squad, the home advantage may not be that significant. But maybe as you go later on into the cycle, maybe you might start seeing their significance a little bit more because then your players get to practice and play a little bit more."

"So, maybe, that could be a factor as well, that some teams are sort of home advantage is not that prevalent this time," he added. (PTI)

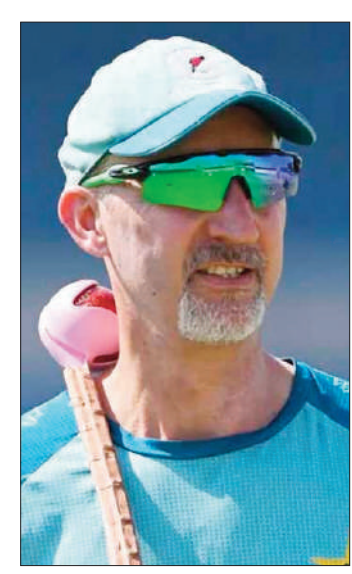
## Former Test head coach Gillespie has not been deprived of remunerations: PCB source

**LAHORE, April 23:** The PCB has said that Australian Jason Gillespie, who had resigned as the head coach of Pakistan's red-ball side in December last year, has not been deprived of his remunerations as is being claimed in media reports.

A Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) source, reacting to media reports that the former Australian pacer had approached the International Cricket Council (ICC) and was weighing legal options over alleged unpaid dues, said the PCB had "done nothing out of contractual obligations".

"There was a clear contract between the board and Gillespie and the PCB is only acting on what is laid down in the contract," the source said.

He said that all the matters related to remunerations were being handled by the PCB's legal depart-



ment as laid down in the contract. Gillespie has claimed that the PCB still owes him some remuneration.

ations, including bonuses for winning the home Test series against England and a One-day series in Australia.

Media reports have claimed that Gillespie has also approached the World Cricketers' Association (WCA) and is considering legal action against the PCB.

"He didn't give the required notice period as laid down in the contract and we are acting as per our agreement with him," the source said.

Gillespie and Gary Kirsten were appointed as the red-ball and white-ball head coaches in April last year on two-year contracts, but seven-eight months down the line, they resigned citing issues with the PCB over their authority.

The PCB appointed Aaqib Javed as interim head coach for both the formats after the foreign experts resigned. (PTI)



## Zimbabwe beats Bangladesh by 3 wickets in first cricket test



**SYLHET (BANGLADESH), April 23:** Fast bowler Blessing Muzurabani claimed 6-72 and opener Brian Bennett scored 54 as Zimbabwe beat Bangladesh by three wickets in the first cricket test on Wednesday.

Offspinner Mehidy Hasan gave Bangladesh an outside chance at victory by taking 5-50 on day four, but Zimbabwe's batters held their nerve to reach 174-7 for their first test victory since 2021.

Bangladesh was dismissed for 255, adding just 61 to their overnight 194-4, after Muzurabani hastened the collapse by becoming the joint-fastest to 50 test wickets for his country.

Zimbabwe appeared set for a comfortable victory by racing to 95 in the 21st over without losing a wicket as it chased a modest target of 174.

Mehidy then broke through with the wicket of Ben Curran, who made 44 off 75 balls.

Left-arm spinner Taijul Islam, who finished with 2-70, had Nick Welch leg-before for 10 as Bangladesh pulled itself back into the match.

Bennet clipped Taijul's full-length delivery past mid-wicket for two to raise his second half-century in the last over of the second session.

But Mehidy gave Bangladesh a genuine chance by dismissing Sean Williams and Bennett in consecutive overs before Taijul got the better of captain Craig Ervine.

Batting against spinners became increasingly tougher as the light faded but Wesley Madhevere, who was 19 not-out, held things together with grit and patience to ensure his side's victory.

Small Target Earlier, Blessing gave Zimbabwe its small target by taking advantage of reckless Bangladeshi batings.

An injudicious shot from captain Najmul Hossain Shanto, who made a team-high 60, triggered the collapse after a delayed start following morning showers.

His attempt for a pull shot against a short delivery that was well outside off brought an end to his innings when Bangladesh needed him badly to take the game out of Zimbabwe's reach.

Just three overs later, Muzurabani extended Mehidy Hasan's lean patch, undoing him with an extra pace and bounce.

Jaker Ali played patiently to raise his fourth half-century in as many tests from 106 balls by pulling Victor Nyachu for a fine-leg boundary.

Left-arm spinner Wellington Masakadza then claimed the wicket of Hasan Mahmud and Khaled Ahmed in consecutive deliveries before Muzurabani wrapped things up by dismissing Jaker Ali, who finished with 58. (AP)

## Some demand end of sporting ties with Pakistan

# Indian athletes condemn Pahalgam terror attack

**NEW DELHI, April 23:** India's sporting fraternity oscillated between grief and rage as it joined the nation in condemning the deadly terrorist attack in Pahalgam with some demanding that the country should cut all sports ties with Pakistan.

On Tuesday, terrorists opened fire at a prime tourist location in south Kashmir's Pahalgam, killing at least 26 civilians and injuring several others. The Resistance Front (TRF), a shadow group of the banned Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terror group, has claimed responsibility for the attack.

Sachin Tendulkar and Virat Kohli expressed shock as they mourned the loss of lives.

"The affected families must be going through an unimaginable ordeal - India and the world stand united with them at this dark hour, as we mourn the loss of lives and pray for justice," Tendulkar wrote.

"Heartfelt condolences to the families of the victims. Praying for peace and strength to families all those who lost their lives and justice to be served for their cruel act," Kohli posted on his Instagram.

Similar sentiments were expressed by other top players such as Jasprit Bumrah and Suryakumar Yadav. Pacer Mohammed Siraj posted an emotional message in which he called for justice.

"To target and kill innocent civilians in the name of religion is pure evil... No cause, no belief, no ideology can ever justify such a monstrous act. Yeh kaisi ladai hai... jahaan insaan ki jaan ki koi keemat hi nahi (what sort of a fight is this in which there is no value for human life)," he asked.

"I hope this madness ends soon and these terrorists are found and punished, without mercy," he added.

Former India cricketer Shreevats Goswami wrote a strongly-worded post, demanding an end to all sporting ties with Pakistan.

"And this is exactly why I say - you don't play cricket with Pakistan. Not now. Not ever. When BCCI or the government refused to send India to the Champions Trophy in Pakistan, some had the audacity to say, 'Oh, but sport should rise above politics',"

### Have requested Indian help to build cricket venue in Jaffna: SL sports minister

**COLOMBO, April 23:** Sri Lanka's sports minister Sunil Gamage has revealed that national coach and batting great Sanath Jayasuriya has requested Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi for assistance to build a cricket venue in Jaffna and he is hopeful that the neighbouring country would respond positively to it.

Gamage made this statement while addressing a ceremony held here on Tuesday night to inaugurate a new swimming complex at the Sri Lanka Cricket headquarters in Premadasa Stadium.

"We are keen to let the northern youth develop their cricket. Mr Sanath Jayasuriya, the national coach, requested Prime Minister Modi to help build it. When someone like Mr Jayasuriya makes a request, India won't ignore it," Gamage said. (PTI)

"...murdering innocent Indians seems to be Pakistan's national sport and India should respond with zero tolerance and not with bats and balls," he added.

While India has not played bilateral cricket with Pakistan since 2012-13, and the BCCI declined to send its team for the Champions Trophy earlier this year, other Indian teams have continued to travel to Pakistan for international events.

Goswami, who had recently visited Pahalgam, said he had sensed hope and peace returning to the valley.

"And now... this bloodshed again. It breaks something inside you. It makes you question how many more times we're expected to stay silent, stay 'sporting,' while our people die. No more. Not this time," he added.

An "outraged" Olympic bronze medal-winning boxer and ruling BJP member Vijender Singh also called for firm "action".

"Our brave soldiers will definitely give a befitting reply to this cowardly attack in the coming times. In the presence of the brave sons of Mother India, the plans of those who

want to disturb the peace in Jammu and Kashmir will never succeed," he asserted.

Indian cricket team head coach and former BJP MP Gautam Gambhir wrote: "Praying for the families of the deceased. Those responsible for this will pay. India will strike."

Two-time Olympic medal-winning badminton player PV Sindhu too penned down an emotional post.

"My heart aches for the victims of the Pahalgam terror attack. So much pain. So much loss. No reason, no cause can ever justify such brutality."

"To the families left behind -- your grief is beyond words, but you are not alone. We are with you. In these dark moments, may we find strength in each other, and never let go of the hope that peace will return!" Sindhu wrote.

Olympic gold medalist duo of javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra and Abhinav Bindra prayed for the victims.

"Heartbroken by the tragic attack in Jammu & Kashmir. Prayers for the victims and their families," Chopra wrote.

"Heartbroken by the horrific terrorist at-

tack in Pahalgam. My thoughts are with the victims and their families. Terror has no place in our world, we must stand united against hatred and violence," Bindra added.

The attack is the deadliest terrorist act in the valley since the 2019 Pulwama strike.

"Strongly condemn this cowardly act by Pakistan-sponsored terrorists. India stands united with our brave Army, J&K Police, and Paramilitary forces in the fight against terrorism. Justice will prevail," said former India all-rounder Suresh Raina.

"My heart goes out to family members of all those who lost their lives in dastardly attack. This can't be forgiven," former India spinner Harbhajan Singh wrote.

Olympic medal-winning former hockey goalkeeper PR Sreejesh, shuttler Saina Nehwal and two-time world champion boxer Nikhat Zareen also called for justice.

"Condemnation is not enough, justice must follow. Our hearts bleed for Pahalgam. Terror must never win. Prayers for all affected in the Pahalgam attack," Sreejesh wrote.

"The Pahalgam terror attack is a heart-breaking reminder of the threats we continue to face. To those spreading fear -- know that India stands united, and justice will prevail. Jai Hind," Saina posted.

Zareen added, "Those who attack innocents attack humanity itself. Strongly condemn the cowardly terror attack in Pahalgam. Justice must be swift."

Former India wicketkeeper Parthiv Patel said he was left numb by the terrible act.

"Shocked and angry to hear what happened in Kashmir. While those responsible will be punished, right now there's a numb disbelief at the terrible acts and the manner in which it all happened," Parthiv wrote.

The Indian batting duo of Shubman Gill and KL Rahul and former spinner and India captain Anil Kumble also offered their condolences.

"Innocent lives lost to senseless violence. Praying for strength and peace for the affected families. Let's stand together against hate," he wrote.

Former India coach Ravi Shastri added, "A ghastly, cowardly act that should unite the nation fully, bar none." (PTI)

## Rahul has left last season's baggage, it will help him do well for DC, feels Pujara

**NEW DELHI, April 23:** Cheteshwar Pujara feels KL Rahul has moved on from a disappointing last season at Lucknow Super Giants and the change in mindset was not only helping him flourish at his new IPL franchise but will also make him a strong asset for the Indian team.

Rahul hit his third fifty of the season to take his new team Delhi Capitals to a commanding eight-wicket win against his former franchise LSG in Lucknow on Tuesday.

"Just move on, don't carry any baggage from the past. And that's a good thing. KL is a mature player. Last couple of years, he's been batting well across formats," Pujara said on ESPN-cricinfo's TimeOut.

"He doesn't want to think about the past and wants to enjoy his batting and be in his zone, rather than think about what went wrong when he was playing for the LSG team."

"It's good to move on, which will also help him play well for DC and even for the Indian team. Because, lately, he is someone the India team also relies on, the way he's batting."

Under Rahul's captaincy LSG had reached the



play-offs in 2022 and 2023 seasons. However, the Lucknow outfit finished seventh last season.

Rahul's relationship with LSG owner Sanjiv Goenka also deteriorated last year. In a video that went viral on social media, Goenka was seen publicly reprimanding the former Lucknow captain after a defeat.

A few months later, the 33-year-old was re-

leased by the franchise ahead of the mega auctions. At DC, the wicketkeeper batter, one of the most consistent players in the IPL, has emerged as the leading run scorer this season, scoring 323 runs in seven innings.

"Even as a person, he looks a lot more mature now, he understands his game very well. We have seen a different KL Rahul this season. When he started (against LSG), he didn't look that (fluid), but still he picked it up," Pujara said. Former England opener Nick Knight added that the absence of captaincy responsibilities may also be contributing to Rahul's freedom with the bat.

"Captaincy can do funny things to you - sometimes you thrive on it, sometimes it's a burden. Whether that's had any impact, of not being captain now, just being free and being able to play the match situation," Knight said.

"We've got this obsession in cricket that the best player has to be captain. That's not always the case, is it? I'm not saying that's the case with KL Rahul, or even Rishabh Pant, but he's batting with so much freedom and looks relaxed in the crease." (PTI)

## ECB should offer BCCI minority ownership in Hundred to attract Indian players: Lancashire CEO



**LONDON, April 23:** The England and Wales Cricket Board should bring on board the BCCI as a "minority ownership partner" of The Hundred in order to attract Indian players to the tournament, Lancashire CEO Daniel Gidney has said, according to a report.

Even though Indian men's players are not issued 'No Objection Certificates' to play outside the IPL, the T20 league owners have expanded their footprint across the globe, and have stakes in SA20 (South Africa), ILT20 (UAE) and Major League Cricket (USA).

According to ESPNcricinfo, Gidney be-

lieves "aligning interests" would be the way to bring Indian players to compete in The Hundred.

"I think it's possible. If I was the ECB, I'd be talking about perhaps bringing the BCCI in as a minority ownership partner in the tournament as a whole. If you do that, then you are aligning interests," he said.

While Indian men's players feature only in the IPL, the country's women cricketers, including captain Harmanpreet Kaur and Smriti Mandhana, have featured in England's The Hundred and Australia's Women's Big Bash League.

"That is probably your best chance of get-

ting (Indian) players in The Hundred. It comes down to the will, and the individuals on both sides," Gidney said.

"The BCCI have been really successful with protecting their brand and by making sure they don't plan any T20 tournaments anywhere in the world..."

"If I was the BCCI, then I would have to say I would need a significant incentive to relax the current policy because that has been extraordinarily successful and has grown the IPL into the massive commercial entity that it is," he said.

The report added that the Lancashire CEO was in India recently to finalise a deal with

RPSG Group, which will see them acquire a 70 per cent stake in the Manchester Originals and run the franchise as a joint venture.

Gidney also cited the ties between Lancashire and Indian players to make his point. "We've probably had more Indian overseas players than any other county. When you have VVS Laxman at the NCA, who Mark Chilton (Lancashire director of cricket) captained, then you have strong relationships all the way through," he said.

"If you build a relationship with the BCCI and understand the types of players that they see as potential future Test players, that's a lot easier than putting in an NOC request saying, 'We'd like to see Virat Kohli or Rishabh Pant playing in the County Championship'," he added.

To start with, Gidney proposed the hosting of exhibition matches. "Imagine having an LSG (Lucknow Super Giants) vs Delhi Capitals game here at Old Trafford -- at the end of the season, say in September. That could be pretty mega, in terms of the Indian fans in the UK. It would make commercial sense for everybody," he said.

Additionally, the Manchester Originals have used their links with the Super Giants group to sign Afghanistan's Noor Ahmad and South Africa's Heinrich Klaasen, who play for the Durban Super Giants in SA20.

"When an overseas player gets bought at auction in the IPL, and that's locked in for three years via retentions, then it just makes commercial sense for that player to then potentially play for Durban, for Manchester, and also potentially for Lancashire in the (T20) Blast," he said.

"It's a lot more efficient, and it could become a lot more straightforward," Gidney added. (PTI)

## RCB eye home improvement against struggling Rajasthan Royals

**BENGALURU, April 23:** Struggling to find form in their own den, Royal Challengers Bengaluru will look to regain control of their IPL campaign at home when they meet a floundering Rajasthan Royals here on Thursday. RCB's three defeats at the Chinnaswamy Stadium in as many matches offer one of the biggest paradoxes of this edition. An outfit that has steam-rolled opposition in all parts of the country has been left chasing shadows in their own backyard.

The RCB batters have appeared strangely subdued and their bowlers seem to have forgotten the lengths to adopt here.

Central to that woeful run is the changed character of the 22-yard strip here which has offered some grip to the bowlers. The Bengaluru batters are yet to find the right tempo to ride over the slowness in the pitch, as they seem to have been caught in the dilemma of whether to step on the gas or not. It's evident in the team's totals here so far -- 169/8, 163/7 and 95/9 (14 overs). They have scored over 9-10 runs an over in other venues, but here the rate has dropped down to 7-8 runs an over.
