26 people, mostly tourists, killed in Pahalgam's 'mini Switzerland' 🔴 Toll may rise


PAHALGAM (J&K), April 22: Terrorists opened fire at a famed meadow near Kashmir's Pahalgam town on Tuesday afternoon, killing 26 people, mostly tourists, in what is the deadliest attack in the Valley since the Pulwama strike in 2019.

The 26 dead included two foreigners and two locals, a high ranking official said without getting into details. The toll is still being ascertained, Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah said while describing the terror attack as "much larger than anything we've seen directed at civilians in recent years".

The attack, which comes as US Vice President J D Vance is visiting India and just as the tourist and trekking season is picking up momentum, took place around 3 pm, officials said.

Baisaran, about six kilometres from the resort town of Pahalgam, is an expansive meadow ringed by dense pine forests and mountains and a favourite with visitors from across the country and the world.

Armed terrorists came into the grassland, dubbed 'mini Switzerland', and started firing at tourists milling around eateries, taking pony rides or just picnicking, officials and eyewitnesses said. At least 20 people were injured in the strike in the volatile Kashmir Valley where tourists have so far mostly been spared. As news of the terror attack targeting

"My husband was shot in the head while seven others were also injured in the attack," a woman survivor told PTI over phone.

The woman did not identify herself but pleaded for help in evacuating the injured to hospital.

As gunshots rang out, there was panic and tourists ran for cover but there was no place to hide in the wide, open space, said another woman tourist.

A woman said terrorists first asked the name before shooting down the victims.

The tourists gathered at Baisaran were from several states, including Karnataka, Maharashtra and Gujarat. Among those killed was Karnataka businessman Manjunath Rao, who was from Shivamogga. Chief Minister Siddaramaiah condoled the death and called a meeting of officials.

A team of officials from Karnataka left for Kashmir, an official statement said. With Baisaran accessible only by foot

or horses, choppers were deployed to evacuate the injured. The families of those killed and injured were taken to the government-owned Pahalgam Club under tight security. The entire district adminis-

GUWAHATI, April 22: Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Tuesday asserted that all the terrorists, who are responsible for attacking and killing 26 people in Jammu and Kashmir, will

be "hunted down" by India. The entire nation stands firmly with the bereaved families in this hour of grief, he added.

"I have full faith that Bharat will hunt down each and every one of those cowards responsible for the dastardly attack in #Pahalgam today," Sarma said in a post on X.

Child rescue

GUWAHATI: Assam Police rescued a one-year-old girl, who was sold around 11 months ago by her step-grandfather, and arrested two persons for their alleged involvement in the crime, a senior officer said on Tuesday. Deputy Commissioner (East) of Guwahati Police, Mrinal Deka, told reporters that the two accused have been arrested on charges of selling and buying a minor for a sum of ₹ 5,000 and the child has also been rescued. "We received a complaint from the mother, a resident of an area near the Games Village here, yesterday stating that her stepfather had taken away the child on May 30 last year on the pretext of medical treatment in the absence of her husband," he added. Subsequently, the woman came to know that her minor onemonth-old daughter was sold by her stepfather to someone for ₹ 5,000, Deka said. "Accordingly, a case was registered with Basistha police station and an investigation was initiated. A police team rescued the child from Sontali area in Kamrup district," he added. The DCP said that police apprehended the girl's stepgrandfather and the buyer from the village.

PRAYAGRAJ (UP), April 22: Shakti Dubey, who has secured the top rank in the Civil Services Examination 2024 conducted by the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC), achieved the feat without enrolling herself in any coaching institute, her father revealed on Tuesday.

Dubey, a resident of the Mamabhanja Talab area in the Naini area of Prayagraj's Yamuna Nagar locality, studied locally up to Class 12.

"Shakti studied till Class 12 at the SMC Ghoorpur, just nearby, and later topped the B.Sc exam from the University of Allahabad," her father, Devendra Dubey, a subinspector in the Uttar Pradesh Police, told reporters here.

After graduation, she pursued M.Sc from the Banaras Hindu University (BHU), where she also

Heroin worth ₹4 crore seized in KA

HT Correspondent BOKAJAN, April 22: In a significant seizure, Dillai police recovered over half a kilogram of heroin from a vehicle during a routine check at the Dillai Police Check Post on National Highway 36 in Karbi Anglong district on Monday night.

The vehicle, bearing registration number HR 26 AW 2022, was stopped around 10 p.m. while en route from Dimapur to Guwahati.

Upon inspection, police discovered 45 plastic containers filled with heroin, weighing a total of 528.72 grams. The seized narcotics are estimated to be worth approximately ₹4 crore in the illicit market.

One individual, identified as Azad Khan, a resident of Manipur, was arrested in connection with the case. Police sources noted that Karbi Anglong remains a key transit route for drug and arms trafficking in the region. Narcotics and illegal firearms (CONTD. ON PAGE 2)

Vance's visit takes India-US dialogue a step further: Scindia

NEW DELHI, April 22: US Vice President J D Vance's visit to India takes dialogue between the two countries a step further, Union Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia said on Tuesday as New Delhi looks to stitch an early deal with Washington that spares it from President Donald Trump's additional tariff hikes.

Vance began a four-day tour of India on Monday as the two nations engage in talks to nail a bilateral trade agreement that would avoid reciprocal tariffs. A 26 per cent 'reciprocal' tariff on Indian exports to the US is currently on a 90-day pause, set to expire on July 8. However, like other countries. India is presently subject to a 10 per cent tariff under the existing policy.

In an interview with PTI, Scindia said India and the US represent "tremendous markets". adding that closer cooperation between the two nations is not only mutually beneficial but also in the broader interest of the world.

'Vice President of the United States coming to India is a very welcome and a very important step. I think it takes that level of dialogue and communication one step further," said Scindia, who is the Minister for Communications as well as Development of North Eastern Region (DoNER).

Airtel announces new features in its continued fight against SPAM

HT Bureau GUWAHATI, April 22: Following the launch of its AI powered spam detection tool that flagged over 27.5 billion calls as SPAM to its customers, Airtel announced the introduction of two significant enhancements aimed at staying ahead of spammers on Monday.

According to an official release, customers will now receive SPAM alerts for calls and SMS messages in their preferred Indian languages. This new feature will be available in ten vernacular languages, with plans to add more in the future.

Airtel's AI-powered tool will now screen and alert customers to all SPAM calls and SMSes originating from international networks.

Once Airtel intensified its efforts to combat domestic spam calls. scamsters and spammers resorted to exploiting foreign networks to funnel fraudulent calls into India. This alarming trend resulted in a

personal rapport, but the US president has repeatedly criticised India's high tariffs, labelling it a "tariff king" and a "big abuser" of trade ties.

The US is India's largest trading partner and the biggest buyer of its exports. New Delhi has already cut tariffs on a number of goods in the past few months and may consider doing so on more products to help cut a bilateral trade deal.

India and the US are making progress in negotiating a bilateral trade deal, the countries had said after a meeting between Modi and Vance in Delhi on Monday.

Citing Modi's visit to the US and his meeting with President Trump at the White House two months ago, as well as his meeting

with Vance earlier, Scindia underlined the bond and synergies between the two nations.

"Our prime minister recently visited the United States, met with President Trump...he met with Vice President J D Vance...and I think this will go further in terms of taking forward our dialogues, not only in terms of our trade talks and other issues but also in terms of investment, also in terms of cooperation on many other fronts, be it defence, information technology,

biotech, innovation, AI, and across the board." the minister said. India and the US are the world's largest and the oldest democracies.

"They both present tremendous markets. We also have a huge added, very important form of

'ambassadorships' and that is our 'Pravasi Bhartiya' who are based in the US and they have created a tremendous amount of goodwill for Bharat in the United States and I think both these countries coming closer together, working closer together, is at the end of the day, in the interest of the world ... in the political space, in the business space, even in the social sector space and even in the space with Sunita Williams," he said. Vance, accompanied by Indian-origin Second Lady Usha Chilukuri, and their three children -- sons Ewan, Vivek and daughter Mirabel, landed in Delhi on Monday on a largely personal four-day visit to India that comes amid growing global tensions over the US tariff.

India and the US said on Monday that they made "significant progress" in negotiations for a mutually beneficial bilateral trade pact as PM Modi and US Vice President Vance held wide-ranging talks focusing on boosting cooperation in areas of defence, energy and strategic technologies.

The White House said Vance and Modi welcomed "significant progress" in the negotiations for the trade pact and formally announced the "finalisation of the terms of reference" for the negotiations, laying down a roadmap for further discussions about economic priorities. (PTI

Sensex, Nifty rise for 6th day on foreign fund inflows, buying in banking shares

MUMBAI, April 22: Benchmark equity indices Sensex and Nifty advanced on Tuesday, marking their sixth straight day of rise helped by gains in banking and FMCG shares and foreign fund inflows.

The 30-share BSE Sensex climbed 187.09 points or 0.24 per cent to settle at 79,595.59. During the day, it jumped 415.8 points or 0.52 per cent to 79,824.30.

The NSE Nifty rose by 41.70 points or 0.17 per cent to 24,167.25. Barring IT and energy sectors, most indices ended in the green, with realty, FMCG, and banking emerging as the top gainers. From the Sensex pack, ITC, Hindustan Unilever,

Mahindra & Mahindra, HDFC Bank, Eternal, Kotak Mahindra Bank, State Bank of India and ICICI Bank were the major gainers. On the other hand, IndusInd Bank fell the most by 4.88 per cent after reports claimed that the bank has hired EY for forensic audit into ₹ 600 crore microfinance discrepancy.

The bank after the market hours informed exchanges that it has not engaged EY for a forensic audit as reported in the news item but its Internal Audit Department (IAD) is conducting a review of the MFI business to examine certain concerns.

Power Grid, Bharti Airtel, Infosys, and Bajaj Finserv were among the laggards.

"Despite negative global cues related to Trump-Fed tensions, the national market has maintained its optimism. The RBI's relaxed liquidity coverage ratio guidelines, which are anticipated to enhance credit ties worth ₹ 1,970.17 crore on Monday, according to growth, boosted the finance sector. Army, CRPF and local police rushed to Baisaran, much sought after by filmmakers in the 1980s, after initial news came in of gunshots being heard, officials said. A massive anti-terrorist operation has been launched to hunt down the assailants and security forces have fanned out in all directions, they said. The Jammu and Kashmir administration set up 24X7 emergency control rooms in Anantnag and Srinagar. "The death toll is still being ascertained so I don't want to get into those details. They will be officially conveyed as the situation becomes clearer. Needless to say this attack is much larger than anything we've seen directed at civilians in recent years," Abdullah said in a post on X. "I'm shocked beyond belief. This attack on our visitors is an abomination. The perpetrators of this attack are animals, inhuman and worthy of contempt. No words of condemnation are enough. I send my sympathies to the families of the deceased," he said.

The office of Jammu and Kashmir Lt Governor Manoj Sinha said anti-terror operations had been launched to neutralise terrorists. "Entire nation is angry & blood of our forces is boiling. I want to assure the nation that perpetrators of Pahalgam attack will have to pay a very heavy price for their heinous act. My heartfelt condolences to bereaved families," it said on X.

Altaf Ahmad Wani, National Conference MLA from Pahalgam, described the attack as "cowardly" and said targeting innocent persons is against the teachings of Islam. "The attack was very painful and unfortunate and took place at an unexpected location which is about five kilometres from Pahalgam (bus stand). It is used for trekking and the people go there on horses," he told reporters. Pahalgam town, which was teeming with tourists this morning, went into complete silence. Tourists began leaving in droves. The incident comes when Kashmir is witnessing a surge in tourist arrivals after reeling under militancy for years.

On February 14, 2019, 40 CRPF personnel were killed in a suicide attack in south Kashmir's Pulwama area. Since then, there have been other terror attacks but none as serious. More than 30 people were killed in an attack on Amarnath base camp in Pahalgam in 2000.

A year later, 13 people died in a strike on Amarnath pilgrims at Sheshnag while 11 persons were killed in another attack in 2002 in the Pahalgam area. A tourist couple from Rajasthan was injured in a firing incident by terrorists at Yannar in Pahalgam in May last year. In March 2000 when then US president Bill Clinton was visiting India, terrorists killed 35 Sikhs in Chhattisinghpora in south Kasmir in March 2000. (PTI)

The ECI stated that in every polling booth, the voting progressed in front of the polling agents formally appointed by candidates/political parties. Refuting allegations, the ECI further stated that INC's nominated candidates or their authorized agents had not raised any substantiated allegations with regards to any kind of abnormal voting at the time of scrutiny before the Returning Officer (RO) and the Election Observers on the next day.

"Electoral Rolls in India including Maharashtra are prepared as per the Representation of People Act, 1950 and the Registration of Electors Rules, 1960. As per law, either just before the elections and/or once every year, Special Summary Revision of the Electoral Rolls is conducted and a final copy of the Electoral Rolls is handed over to all the National/State political parties, including Indian National Congress (INC)," the statement read.

After the finalisation of these Electoral Rolls during Maharashtra elections, as against 9,77,90,752 electors, only a total of 89 appeals were filed before the 1st appellate authority (DM) and only 1 appeal was filed before the 2nd appellate authority (CEO). Therefore, it is amply clear that there was no grievance of INC or any other political parties before the conduct of Maharashtra Assembly Elections in 2024, the ECI stated.

Pointing out further about the process of revision of electoral rolls the ECI stated that for 1,00,427 Polling Booths, along with 97,325 Booth Level Officers appointed by the EROs, 1,03,727 Booth Level Agents were also appointed by all Political Parties, including 27,099 by INC.

The Election Commission had brought out all these facts in its reply to INC on December 24, 2024 itself which is available on ECI's website. It appears that all these facts are completely being ignored while raising such issues again and again," the statement read. (With inputs from PTI)

GURUGRAM, April 22: Union Minister Pralhad Joshi on Tuesday said 40 GW of renewable energy (RE) can soon come online as talks are on with states for signing power purchase agreements (PPAs).

"We are targeting 50 GW of RE capacity annually to meet the 500 GW target by 2030, which of course includes 292 GW of solar energy", Joshi told reporters on the sidelines of inauguration of solar PV module testing facility at National Institute of Solar Energy (NISE) here.

India added 29.52 GW RE capacity in 2024-25.

The New & Renewable Energy Minister said peak power demand will double in 2032 from the present levels.

The peak power demand touched an all-time high of 250 GW in May 2024. The power ministry has estimated 270 GW peak power demand during this summer.

Joshi said India needs to create innovative solutions to maximize solar energy generation from available land resources.

The minister also called for use of innovative solutions for using building materials like glass to generate solar energy from limited

space available like in high-rise buildings. He said talks are on with states to sign PPAs for 40 GW RE projects.

Joshi also said that 12 lakh households have installed rooftop solar under Pradhan Mantri Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana.

Earlier, speaking on the occasion, the minister said that India has already achieve 106GW of solar and 51GW of wind energy generation capacity. He stressed on the need for hav-

ing solar electric vehicle charging stations in the country saying that presently EVs are being charged by conventional energy. Joshi

opined that EVs should be charged by green energy. He noted that with this lab,

NISE is now empowered to offer comprehensive testing, calibration, and certification services, especially for photovoltaic modules and technologies where no established standards currently exist.

That makes this a pioneering facility in India, he said. As Indian companies scale up production of large modules, this facility will ensure that Indian products meet the highest standards, he noted.

He pointed out that this lab will give a major boost to India's PLI scheme, and to the country's ambition of becoming a global manufacturing hub

"Back in March 2014, our installed solar capacity was just 2.82 GW. Today, we have crossed 106 GW, which is a growth of over 3,700 per cent. We had just 2 GW of solar module production in 2014. Today, we have soared to 80 GW. And by 2030, we are confident to reach 150 GW," he said.

He stated that NISE must strive to become a global institution of excellence. Its work should reflect the ambition, innovation, and resilience of New India

"We want NISE to become a benchmark in solar R&D, testing, training, and policy support. In fact, I believe NISE should aspire to surpass even the Fraunhofer Institute for Solar Energy Systems in Germany

Today, he noted that NISE lags behind in global research impact and patent generation.

"I urge you to step up efforts in this direction. This journey demands deep research, cutting-edge innovation, and global collaboration. So I say to NISE: Build partnerships. Develop talent. Push boundaries. Let your work echo across labs, factories, and solar farms worldwide." (PTI)

HT Correspondent DIBRUGARH, April 22: Dibrugarh police arrested two persons on Tuesday in connection with the mob lynching of a youth at Hatigarh Bokpara Division of Bokul tea estate in Dibrugarh suspecting him of goat thief. The accused has been identified as- Lakhindra Bhakta and Sanjib Munda

On Monday, an enraged mob thrashed two youths suspecting them of goat thieves, and among them one youth died on the spot. The other was admitted at hospital in critical condition

The incident took place at around 10.30 am at Hatigarh Bokpara Division of Bokul Tea Estate in Dibrugarh on Monday.

"The two suspected goat thieves arrived on a scooter and were caught red-handed by local residents. The en-

ILO report on employment

T nformal employment in the total employment in India remains almost stagnant at around 90 per cent since 2014, according to a latest ILO report. It was worse in 2024 than the global average of 58 per cent, Asia Pacific average of 66 per cent, and worse than neighbouring countries like Pakistan, Bangladesh, and Sri Lanka. The ILO report titled "Innovative approaches to formalization in Asia and the Pacific" shows informality in India at 88.8 per cent, in Pakistan 84.3 per cent, in Bangladesh 84.9 per cent, and in Sri Lanka 67 per cent. Though the report mentioned many Indian schemes to improve schemes for formalization of employment in India while praising them as innovative approaches, but said nothing about the failures of the schemes in significantly reducing informality in the last one decade. For example, the Employment Linked Incentive (ELI) scheme was praised by the report but it does not mention that the budget year 2024-25 was just lost without even launch of this scheme. Nevertheless, the report read, "In terms of the overall global distribution of informality, the majority - nearly two thirds - of workers in the informal economy are in Asia and the Pacific. If we go through the India's innovative approaches mentioned in the ILO report to formalization of employment or creation of decent jobs, it reads well, but informal employment remaining at about 90 per cent is clear indication that India's strategy for formalization of jobs or creation of formal jobs have failed, a fact which ILO report avoided to put on record in clear terms.

Nevertheless, the report read, "In terms

of the overall global distribution of informality, the majority - nearly two thirds of workers in the informal economy are in Asia and the Pacific. This is due in part to the size of the population of the region, notably in China and India, and persistently high levels of informality. In fact, while there has been progress in reducing the incidence of informality over the past two decades, which has fallen from nearly 73 per cent of total employment in 2004 to just under 66 per cent in 2024, the rate of progress has slowed considerably since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic. As a result, the incidence of informality in the region remains second only

to Africa (83 per cent) and nearly 8 percentage points higher than the global average (58 per cent)."

Within the region, there is noticeable variation in the incidence of informal employment, ranging from nearly 87 per cent in Southern Asia to as low as 35 per cent in the Pacific Islands (East Asia is also considerably low, at around 27 per cent if China is excluded). The informal economy presents significant challenges to workers' rights, social protection, decent working conditions and inclusive economic growth. Globally, over two billion people work informally, with the Asia and Pacific region accounting for nearly two-thirds of this total, the report emphasized. The persistence of informality undermines sustainable enterprises, hinders access to labour rights and social protection, erodes public revenues and exacerbates inequality and poverty.

Informality is persisting despite the ILO's recommendation adopted in 2015, which provides guidelines for transitioning from informal to formal economy. Nevertheless, the ILO report says that Asia-Pacific region has made some progress, about 7 per cent decline in informality in the last two decades to 66 per cent. However, this decline has been offset by the overall growth in the total number of workers, leading to an increase in the absolute number of informal workers.

Part of the challenge in the region is the notable absence of dedicated and integrated approaches that acknowledge the complex interrelations and synergies required to effectively and persistently tackle informality. Currently, tripartite structures engaged in the governance and coordination of formalization efforts are largely lacking across the region, with only a few notable exceptions. Large segments of the workforce are trapped in low-productivity sectors. Efforts to reduce informality are most effective when focus is on increasing incomes and improving working conditions, which strongly influence workers' capacity to move between the informal and formal economies, and hence, the report says, more efforts are needed. Tinland is widely seen in Western Europe and the center-right-led coalition government in office since June 2023 has presided over far-reaching austerity measures, leading to rising homelessness and cuts in local health provisions. Yet there are also signs that this period may finally be coming to an end.

The coalition government, led by Petteri Orpo's pro-business National Coalition Party, has seemingly been weakened by the collapse in the vote share of its main partner, the harder right Finns Party, in municipal and regional elections held on April 13. This signals the probability of a government led by the center-left Social Democratic Party (SDP) following the next general election, to be held by spring 2027 at the latest.

Chair of the right-wing populist Finns Party Riikka Purra admitted defeat on results night, describing a "red wave" sweeping Finland. Overall, the Finns Party (formerly "True Finns") was down 6.8 percent compared to the 2021 municipal elections, while the Social Democratic Party (headed by Antti Lindtman, who replaced outgoing premier Sanna Marin in 2023) made gains of 5.3 percent and had the highest vote share overall. Meanwhile, the democratic socialist Left Alliance boosted its vote by 1.3 percent, overtaking the Finns Party and sitting just behind the Green League, with which it often forms a red-green pact. Crucially, while the SDP increased its percentage share, the redgreens did not suffer as a result, as in previous elections. This time, the SDP took votes from the Finns Party after making the local elections a kind of referendum on the coalition government's austerity measures.

Still, this has its limits. The SDP has moved further toward the center since 2021, when Marin was prime minister, during which time she gave members of the Left coalition with the center right.

This places Left Alliance as the genuine left opposition, who must perform well in the next general election to gain any leverage over the center. I emailed a handful of politicians from the party to see what currents they picked up on the local campaign trail, to better understand how they might move forward.

Olli Kohonen, a mental health nurse based in the Northern city of Oulu, who won both regional and municipal seats, cites mental health, waiting times, and eldercare as important campaign themes: "Basic issues that are really close to everyday life.'

Ville Kellokumpu, a postdoctoral researcher who also ran in Oulu, says, "The current coalition has been very austerityminded, hawkishly demanding quickly balanced budgets from the regions [responsible] for welfare, which has led to a deterioration of especially health and social security services. The poll gains for the Left Alliance are a response to that."

Seemingly, the Left has made advances by simply pledging support for working people and functioning services. Former Left Alliance leader and current

member of the European Parliament Li Andersson argues that while the Finns Party promised that it would not cut services — in this, claiming to stand up for the Finnish working class — once in government it supported a slashand-burn policy. "The Finns Party have been trying to present themselves as a kind of voice of the working people. And I think we now see a huge contrast between what

was rejected. Yet the main ruling party, National Coalition, will more likely feel that its austerity approach has been exonerated: indeed, Prime Minister Orpo's party increased its municipal vote share by 1.2 percent, even though this only placed it second overall. Further, while many expect an SDP-led government sooner or later, it is not clear if it will lean toward left-wing parties or the center right. Meanwhile, even though the Finns Party is in decline, it should also be recognized that its voters generally turn out in higher numbers for general elections (turnout this week was just 54 percent for the municipal vote and 51 percent for

> the regionals). In these results, contradictions and uncertainties outnumber clear rules.

The best path for the Left Alliance may be to continue to build bridges with workers, with simple messages to bring working Finns to the Left: "You want affordable, prompt health care? So do we," "You want a secure future for your family? So do we," and so on.



Bangladesh factor in Saudi crackdown on immigration and visa curbs

A audi Arabia's recent sweeping crackdown on immigration viola-Utions and a sudden tightening of visa regulations, particularly targeting 14 nations including Bangladesh, signals more than just internal security enforcement. Behind these actions lies a mounting strain in Saudi-Bangladesh relations-now further exacerbated by the controversial arrest of Bangladeshi actress and model Meghna Alam, reportedly at the informal behest of the Saudi ambassador.

Between April 3 and 9, Saudi authorities arrested 18,669 individuals for violating residency, labour, and border security laws. Among them, 11,813 were detained for breaching residency rules, 4,366 for violating border protocols, and 2,490 for labour law infractions. Additionally, 1,497 individuals were apprehended attempting to enter Saudi Arabia illegally, while 59 were caught trying to flee.

The Interior Ministry's announcement of these mass arrests comes just as Saudi Arabia begins ramping up preparations for the 2025 Hajj season. Historically, the pilgrimage season attracts not only worshippers but also those looking to bypass labour restrictions and settle illegally under the cover of religious travel. This has led to overcrowding, logistical nightmares, and a persistent headache for Saudi authorities who aim to maintain tight control over migration during this critical period.

In a striking development, Saudi Arabia has temporarily suspended the issuance of

However, this decision has raised alarm in Bangladesh, where over five million citizens work and live in Saudi Arabia. The timing and sweeping nature of the visa ban have triggered concerns that the move may not be merely administrative but politically charged-especially in light of recent developments involving a Saudi diplomat.

The arrest of Meghna Alam, a model and actress in Bangladesh, adds another layer of complexity to the already fragile relationship. On April 11, police confirmed her detention under the Special Powers Act, citing a complaint filed by Saudi Ambassador Essa bin Yusuf Al Duhailan. The ambassador, who recently completed his term in Dhaka, reportedly lodged an informal complaint to the Bangladeshi Foreign Ministry, claiming that Alam had attempted to extort him and had made threats.

At a time when Saudi Arabia is tightening its visa policies and labour enforcement, this incident risks further souring relations.

Experts warn that Bangladesh must act quickly and diplomatically to manage the deteriorating situation. Failure to do so could have serious repercussions-not only in terms of the country's international image but also for its economy, which is heavily reliant on remittances from workers in the Gulf region, particularly Saudi Arabia.

Adding further fuel to the fire was a recent protest in Dhaka on April 12, where participants in a 'Palestine Solidarity Movement' at Suhrawardy Udyan were seen carrying placards that not only condemned Israel and the United States but also included derogatory slogans against US President Donald Trump, Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman and Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Footage of the event, which was organized by several Islamist-leaning political groups, has circulated globally and is being closely monitored by international media. The protest reflects the interim government's shifting foreign policy, which many observers say has veered toward an anti-US, pro-Pakistan, anti-India posture in recent months.

This ideological alignment-combined with incendiary rhetoric against key regional players-risks isolating Bangladesh at a time when it can ill afford diplomatic friction. Saudi Arabia, a historically close ally and one of the largest sources of foreign remittances, may interpret these actions as a hostile turn, further complicating matters for the millions of Bangladeshis living and working there.

The convergence of the visa ban, the arrest of a public figure based on a diplomat's complaint, and public protests targeting the Saudi monarchy indicates a rapidly deteriorating situation. The Bangladeshi government must tread carefully to repair ties with Riyadh, as any prolonged strain could endanger its labour exports, Hajj quota, and access to vital Gulf funding. (IPA Service)

Some Real Cases That Show the Reality

1. The Bulli Bai & Sulli Deals Incident (India)

This was one of the most shocking cases in recent years. Some people created fake apps that put up photos of Muslim women and called it an "auction." These pictures were stolen from social media and used without any permission. It wasn't a real auction-it was pure harassment and humiliation. After a lot of public outrage, some of the people behind it were caught. But this incident showed how easy it is to target women online.

2. Deepfake Abuse in Delhi (2023) A 23-year-old girl from Delhi found out that someone had made fake explicit images of her using deepfake technology and shared them on social media. She hadn't done anything wrong—but still, she became a victim. Even after complaining to the police, the content stayed online for a long time. It left her emotionally drained and scared. 3. Journalist Rana Ayyub's Story

Rana Ayyub, a well-known Indian journalist, has faced constant online harassment. People sent her threats. shared fake videos, and even leaked her personal details. Just because she spoke out boldly, she became a target. Her case shows how unsafe it can be for women, especially those who are in the public eye.



4. The Kerala Story (Movie Reference)

This movie, though controversial, shows how some young women were manipulated online and taken into dangerous situations. While the storvline is dramatized, it does reflect a truth-women are sometimes groomed and emotionally trapped through fake online identities. This is another side of cyber violence that doesn't get talked about enough.

It's Not Just in India—It's a **Global Problem**

In the USA, female celebrities like Jennifer Lawrence had their private photos leaked in 2014. The case became known as "The Fappening" and started a global conversation on digital privacy.

In the UK, a study found that 1 in 5 women faced online abuse. Politician Diane Abbott received thousands of hateful messages just because of her gender and race.

In the Philippines, when flight attendant Christine Dacera passed away under suspicious circumstances, people spread misinformation and shamed her online, even

women have been arrested just for sharing videos that some considered inappropriate. This shows how cyber policing can be used unfairly to con-

How Does Cyber Violence Affect Women?

• Mental Stress: Anxiety, depression, or even trauma from constant abuse

· Fear and Isolation: Many women delete their accounts or avoid being online

• Career Impact: Some women, especially journalists and creators, step back from their work.

• Safety Issues: In some cases, online abuse leads to real-life stalking or attacks.

A survey by Amnesty International showed that over one-third of women who were abused online changed how they behaved on the internet. Many of them were scared that things would get worse.

What Does the Law Say? In India, there are laws to deal with cybercrime, but they're not always enough

Other countries are also making changes. For example:

• Use better AI tools to detect harmful content.

• Teach Digital Safety: Everyone, especially young girls, should learn how to stay safe online.



Dolycystic ovarian disease PCOD, also referred to as polycystic ovarian syndrome (PCOS) is one of the most common complications found among women nowadays, especially under the age bracket of 40 years. It is a very common hormonal imbalance that occurs due to the irregularity of the menstrual cycle or no menstrual cycle at all or due to the presence of excessive male hormones in the body of women. As the name suggests, polycystic ovarian disease refers to a condition where the ovaries are enlarged and have multiple small cysts in it but in some cases, it is possible that a woman does not face the problem of having cysts in the ovary and still has this disease. Rural women, climate shock: Beijing report warns

hen we talk about climate change, the discussion often confines itself to melting glaciers, rising sea levels, and changing weather cycles. But its human face-particularly that of rural Indian women-is often forgotten. The Beijing India Report 2025 once again makes it clear that the climate crisis is not a "gender neutral" disaster. Its impacts are deep, unequal, and misogynistic. Millions of rural women in India are already burdened by resource scarcity, social limitations, and unpaid domestic responsibilities. Climate change makes this burden even heavier-sometimes in the form of droughts, sometimes in the form of floods, and sometimes in the form of a slow, toxic combination of malnutrition and exhaustion. The Beijing Report shows that the climate crisis is not only degrading the quality of women's lives but also depriving them of their biological, social, and economic dignity. Health facilities for rural women are already limited, but the nutrition crisis and heat stress caused by climate change severely impact their reproductive and maternal health. According to the report, persistent dehydration and anemia have led to a rise in the incidence of premature hysterectomies among women. This is not just a medical procedure but an assault on their bodily autonomy and dignity. Infertility, complicated childbirth, and difficulties in conceiving are now becoming common problems-and climate insecurity is clearly behind them.

Most of India's rural women either work in the fields or engage in small agricultural work, but they do not own the land. When rains are unseasonal, when crops dry up, or when soils turn barren,

these women are the first and the worst hit. In regions like Bundelkhand, persistent droughts have not only led to a drop in production but also increased seasonal unemployment among women. Being cut off from the field means an empty kitchen, girls leaving school, and another round of debt. Women who were engaged in handicrafts, food processing, or small-scale businesses other than agriculture are also not spared by extreme weather. The Beijing report shows that women's incomes in the non-agricultural sector fell by an average of 33% during extreme climate events in 2023-24. This is not just an economic loss but also a blow to self-reliance and confidence. Climate-induced displacement, falling family incomes, and traditional thinking—all three are hampering the education of adolescent girls. When families have limited resources, girls' education is one of the first to be cut short. They are pulled out of school and put into domestic work or prepared for early marriage. This broken chain of education limits their lifelong opportunities. Adivasi and Dalit women in particularwho are already socially marginalized are most vulnerable during climate disasters. During the 2020 cyclone Amphan, Dalit women in the Sundarbans region reported being excluded from relief centers and had no say in shelter decisions. Social discrimination becomes even more acute during a climate crisis.

The Beijing India Report not only highlights this crisis but also suggests clear ways to address it-most importantly, putting gender sensitivity at the center of climate strategy. State-level climate plans must incorporate women's specific needs. States like Odisha have begun incorporating gender indicators into their climate strategies, but this initiative needs to be

replicated in every state. Gender-based data collection by village, caste, and economic status is essential for policies to be effective at the ground level. Creating a climate vulnerability index with a gender component at the panchayat level can be an effective step. Self-help groups and women's cooperatives can be strengthened by providing skills in areas of climate-resilient agriculture, green jobs, renewable energy, and agro-processing.

Better resourcing of primary health centers, especially for reproductive and maternal care, is imperative-especially in areas affected by the climate crisis. Women-run Jal Samitis in Gujarat have proven that when women are part of policymaking and resource management, solutions are more sustainable and responsive. Women's participation should be made mandatory in local disaster management, forest rights committees, and water management. Missions under the National Climate Action Plan-such as Ujala Yojana, PMUY, etc.-should be redefined with a women-centric approach. Expansion of these schemes in climatesensitive areas will not only strengthen health and livelihoods but will also promote gender justice.

Rural women are not just victims of climate change-they can also be agents of change. But this requires us to see them as partners, not just 'objects for help.' This is the message of the Beijing report-that if we are to tackle climate change effectively, gender and climate must be understood together, not separately. When a woman scrapes drinking water for her child from the mud of a drying pond, she becomes not just motherhood but the most tragic image of the climate crisis. It is time for policy, science, and society to listen to her voice seriously.

Israeli strikes kill 14 in Gaza, destroy heavy equipment needed to clear rubble

DEIR AL-BALAH Strip), April 22: Israeli strikes on the Gaza Strip killed at least 14 Palestinians, mostly women and children, and destroyed bulldozers and other heavy equipment that had been supplied by mediators to clear rubble. Separate strikes on Tuesday killed two people in Lebanon

Israel's 18-month offensive against Hamas has destroyed vast areas of Gaza, raising fears that much of it may never be rebuilt. The territory already had a shortage of heavy equipment, which is also needed to rescue people from the rubble after Israeli strikes and to clear vital roads.

A municipality in the Jabaliya area of northern Gaza said a strike on its parking garage destroyed nine bulldozers provided by Egypt and Qatar, which helped broker the ceasefire that took hold in January.

Israel ended the truce last month, renewing its bombardment and ground operations and sealing the territory's two million Palestinians off from all imports, including food, fuel and medical supplies.

The strikes also destroyed a water tanker and a mobile generator provided by aid groups, and a truck used to pump sewage, the Jabaliya al-Nazla municipality said. There was no immediate com-

ment from the Israeli military on the strikes. The military says it only targets militants and blames

Lebanon's Health Ministry said another person was killed in an Israeli strike on the southern Tyre province, without providing further details.

Israel has continued to carry out regular strikes across Lebanon despite reaching a ceasefire with the Hezbollah militant group in November. Israel says it is targeting militants and weapons caches. The Lebanese government says 190 people have been killed and 485 wounded since the ceasefire took hold. Hezbollah began firing on Israel the day after Hamas' October 7 attack. Israel responded with airstrikes, and the conflict in Lebanon escalated into a fullblown war in September when Israel carried out a heavy wave of strikes and killed most of Hezbolthe remaining hostages in return lah's top leadership. DHAKA, April 22: Bangladesh has rejected New Delhi's charge that the recent killing of a Hindu leader was part of a "pattern of systematic persecution" of minorities in that country.

Body of Hindu community leader Bhabesh Chandra Roy, 58, a resident of Basudebpur village of Dinajpur district in north Bangladesh, was recovered on Thursday night. His son has claimed Roy was allegedly abducted from his home in the village, about 330 kilometres northwest of Dhaka, and beaten to death. "It is unfortunate that the death of Mr Bhabesh Chandra Roy has been described as part of a 'pattern of systematic persecution' of Hindu minorities under the interim government," interim government chief Muhammad Yunus' press secretary Shafiqul Alam told the state-run Bangladesh Sangbad Sangstha (BSS) news agency late Monday.

Alam, who is currently accompanying Yunus to an international conference in Qatar, said

Bangladesh is not a country where one would find government-sponsored systematic discrimination against minorities.

B'desh rejects India's allegation

Rather, he claimed, the Bangladesh government protects the rights of all of its citizens irrespective of religious denominations. The Bangladesh reaction came days after India condemned the alleged abduction and killing of the Hindu minority leader in Bangladesh and called on the interim government in Dhaka to live up to its responsibility of protecting the minorities.

This killing follows a pattern of systematic persecution of Hindu minorities under the interim government even as the perpetrators of previous such events roam with impunity," External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said in a post on X on Saturday. Roy's family had lodged a case

with Dinajpur police after his murder against four named suspects and several unnamed individuals. "The accused took my father to an unknown location and beat him to death in a premeditated manner," Roy's son 28-year-old Swapan Chandra Roy, alleged in his written complaint. Swapan Chandra Roy named Atikur Rahman as accused number one, who according to media reports, runs an informal money lending business.

Police said according to the family complaint, Roy borrowed Taka (Tk) 25,000 from Rahman agreeing to repay it in monthly installments of Tk 3,250 but financial hardship debarred him from regular repayment despite the lender's insistence making him sick.

Roy's son, in the complaint, said that on April 17 afternoon the accused went to Roy's house on two motorbikes and took him away under the pretext of an urgent discussion and added that he received a call in the evening when a co-accused, Ratan Islam told him his father had fallen sick.

The accused abandoned Roy on a spot near his home and fled and doctors declared him dead as the family took him to a hospital.

Yunus's press secretary, however, said "in this particular case. we have ascertained that the victim went out with some individuals previously known to him" and the autopsy report did not detect any prima facie sign of bodily injury.

"This notwithstanding, the authorities have ordered viscera analysis to conclusively determine the cause of death," he said, adding that appropriate actions would be taken once the viscera report is available. (PTI)

Cardinals set Pope Francis' funeral for Saturday Harvard sues Trump administration to stop freeze of morning, with public viewing starting today more than USD 2 billion in grants

BOSTON, April 22: Harvard University announced Monday that it has filed suit to halt a federal freeze on more than USD 2.2 billion in grants after the institution

said it would defy the Trump administration's demands to limit activism on campus. In an April 11 letter to Harvard,

the Trump administration had called for broad government and leadership reforms at the university and changes to its admissions policies. It also demanded the university audit views of diversity on campus and stop recognising some student clubs.

Harvard President Alan Garber said the university would not bend to the demands. Hours later, the government froze billions of dollars in federal funding.

'The Government has not and cannot — identify any rational connection between antisemitism concerns and the medical, scienment rights and the statutory pro-visions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act.

Within hours, the White House lashed back.

"The gravy train of federal assistance to institutions like Harvard, which enrich their grossly overpaid bureaucrats with tax dollars from struggling American families is coming to an end," White House spokesman Harrison Fields said in an email Monday. "Taxpayer funds are a privilege, and Harvard fails to meet the basic conditions required to access that privilege."

Separately, Education Department spokesperson Madi Biedermann declined to comment on the suit. For the Trump administration, Harvard presents the first major hurdle in its attempt to force change at universities that Republicans say have become hotbeds of liberalism and antisemitism. A part of that is targeting research funding which has fuelled scientific breakthroughs but has become an easy source of leverage for the Trump administration.

VATICAN CITY, April 22: Cardinals have taken their first decisions following the death of Pope Francis, setting Saturday as the date for his funeral and allowing ordinary faithful to begin paying their final respects starting Wednesday, when his casket is brought into St. Peter's Basilica.

The cardinals met for the first time Tuesday in the Vatican's synod hall to chart the next steps before a conclave begins to choose Francis' successor, as condolences poured in from around the world grieving history's first Latin American pope.

The cardinals set the funeral for Saturday at 10 am in St. Peter's Square, to be celebrated by the dean of the College of Cardinals, Cardinal Giovanni Battista Re.

Viewing the pope's coffin

The pope's formal apartments in the Apostolic Palace and in the Santa Marta hotel were sealed Monday evening, following a centuriesold ritual. Cardinal Kevin Farrell, who as camerlengo had the task of announcing the death and confirming it once the cause was determined, presided over the rituals.

Francis chose not to live in the palace, though, but in a two-room suite in Santa Marta on the other side of Vatican City. He died there and his body was transferred to the hotel chapel in the lobby, where the private viewing was being held Tuesday for Vatican officials and members of the pontifical household.

In changes made by Francis last year, his body was not placed in three wooden coffins, as it had been for previous popes. Rather, Francis was placed in a simplified wooden coffin with a zinc coffin inside.

Once in St. Peter's, his coffin will not be put on an elevated bier but will just be be placed simply facing the pews, with the Paschal candle nearby. The government also demanded Harvard audit its faculty and student body to ensure wide viewpoints in every department and, if necessary, diversify by admitting additional students and hiring new faculty. Russian drones batter Ukraine's Odesa as peace talks come to crux

KYIV, April 22: Russian drones battered the Ukrainian port city of Odesa in a nighttime attack, local authorities said Tuesday, less than 24 hours after a purported Easter ceasefire unilaterally declared by Moscow ended and just over a day before Ukrainian, British, French and US officials are due to meet in London to discuss the war.

Anticipation is building over whether diplomatic efforts can stop more than three years of fighting since Russia's full-scale invasion of its neighbour. Trump said last week negotiations were "coming to a head" and insisted that neither side is "playing" him in his push to end the grinding

This came after Secretary of State Marco Rubio suggested last week the US might soon back away from negotiations altogether if they don't progress. He spoke in Paris after talks among U.S., Ukrainian and European officials produced outlines for steps toward peace and appeared to make some long-awaited progress.

A new meeting is expected Wednesday in London, and Rubio suggested it could be decisive in determining whether the Trump administration continues its involvement.

Odesa came under a "massive attack" by Russian drones overnight, injuring at least three people, the head of Odesa regional administration, Oleh Kiper, wrote on his Telegram page Tuesday.

A residential building in a densely populated urban area, civilian infrastructure and an educational facility were hit, he said.

The Ukrainian air force said Russia fired 54 Shahed and decoy drones at Ukraine overnight, marking a resumption of long-range attacks that have blasted civilian areas and sown terror throughout the war.

Russia has stepped up in the past months its use of Shahed drones, expanding its production of the weapon and refining its tactics, the International Institute for Strategic Studies said in a recently published analysis.

After Putin declared a unilateral ceasefire on Saturday, Ukraine said it was ready to reciprocate but said Russian attacks were continuing. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said that Russia violated the ceasefire more than 2,900 times.

The Associated Press was unable to verify whether a ceasefire was in place along the roughly 1,000-kilometer front line. (AP)

After the funeral, there are nine days of official mourning, known as the "novendiali." During this period, cardinals arrive in Rome and meet privately before the conclave.

To give everyone time to assemble, the conclave must begin 15-20 days after the "sede vacante" - the "vacant See" - is declared, although it can start sooner if the cardinals agree.

Once the conclave begins, cardinals vote in secret sessions in the Sistine Chapel. After voting sessions, the ballots are burned in a special stove. Black smoke indicates that no pope has been elected, while white smoke indicates that the cardinals have chosen the next head of the Catholic Church.

The one who has secured two-thirds of the votes wins. If he accepts, his election is announced by a cardinal from the loggia of St. Peter's Basilica who tells the world "Habemus Papam," Latin for "We have a pope." (AP)

70 per cent of Jewish Holocaust survivors will be gone in next 10 years, report shows

BERLIN, April 22: Eighty years vivors who receive direct payafter the Holocaust, more than 2,00,000 Jewish survivors are still alive but 70 per cent of them will be gone within the next 10 years - meaning time is running out to

hear the voices of the last generation who suffered through one of the worst atrocities in history. Currently, the survivors' median age is 87, and more than 1,400 of them are over 100 years old, a new

report said Tuesday. We have known that this population of survivors would be the last, our final opportunity to hear their first-hand testimonies, to spend time with them, our last chance to meet a survivor," said Greg Schneider, the executive vice

president of the New York-based Conference on Jewish Material Claims Against Germany, also referred to as the Claims Conference, which published the study. The report's analysis of popula-

tion projections and mortality rates provides details through 2040. It is based on the extensive data collected since 1952 by the Claims Conference, which includes surments or social welfare services funded by the organisation as a result of ongoing negotiations with Germany.

90 per cent of Holocaust survivors will pass away in the next 15 years

Notably, nearly 50 per cent of all Holocaust survivors will pass away within the next six years, while 70 per cent will die within 10 years and 90 per cent within 15 years, according to the report titled 'Vanishing Witnesses." Those still alive are often of frail health and suffer from ailments that come with age and have been amplified by traumas in their youth.

Six million European Jews were murdered by the Nazis and their collaborators during the Holocaust.

It is not clear exactly how many Jews survived the death camps, the ghettos or somewhere in hiding across Nazi-occupied Europe, but their numbers were a far crv from the pre-war Jewish population in Europe.

In Poland, of the 3.3 million Jews living there in 1939, only



about 3,00,000 survived.

Around 5,60,000 Jews lived in Germany in 1933, the year Adolf Hitler came to power. After the Holocaust, their numbers had diminished to about 15,000 through emigration and extermination.

After the end of World War II, survivors settled all over the globe and even today they are still living in 90 different countries.

Mortality rates vary across locations

The "Vanishing Witnesses" report shows that mortality rates for

survivors vary greatly across locations depending on access to health care and economic stability. For example, Israel, which is home to about half of all Holocaust survivors, had 1,10,100 survivors as of October 2024 and is estimated to see their population decline to 62,900 by 2030, a drop of 43 per cent.

The United States had 34,600 in the fall of 2024, but is projected to lose 39 per cent over that same time, dropping to 21,100 survivors. Countries in the former Soviet Union had 25,500 survivors in October 2024, but are expected to be at 11,800 in five years, down 54 per cent by the start of 2030.

"This report is a stark reminder that our time is almost up, our survivors are leaving us and this is the moment to hear their voices." said Gideon Taylor, the president of the Claims Conference.

Many survivors worry who will keep alive their memories

Albrecht Weinberg, a 100-yearold survivor from Germany who lost almost his entire family in the Holocaust, said that even today the horrendous memories are haunting him. "I sleep with it, I wake up with it, I sweat, I have nightmares; that is my present.'

Weinberg survived the concentration and death camps Mittelbau-Dora, Auschwitz. Bergen-Belsen and three death marches at the end of the war. He spent many years teaching high school students and others about the atrocities he had to live through. Still, he worries what will happen when he is no longer around to bear witness. (AP)

Home Minister Amit Shah briefed Prime Minister Modi, who is in Saudi Arabia, and rushed to Srinagar to take stock of the situation after one of the biggest terror attacks in recent times.

Terrorists struck in the picturesque Baisaran in Pahalgam which is the favourite hotspot of tourists from across the country, gunning down 26 people and injuring several others.

Anurag bats for 'one nation, one election', calls it 'win-win situation' for country

SRINAGAR, April 22: BJP MP Anurag Thakur on Tuesday said the implementation of the 'one nation, one election' formula would be a win-win situation for the country as it would not just cut the expenses incurred in conducting various polls but also save a lot of time.

"Elections were held in Haryana and Jammu and Kashmir within a few months of the Lok Sabha polls (last year). Then elections were held in Maharashtra, Jharkhand and Delhi. So, there are at least five assembly elections in a year.

"If all the polls are held simultaneously, it will reduce the expenditure, save time and increase the voting percentage as well," Thakur told reporters in Srinagar on the sidelines of a party event on 'one nation, one election' (ONOE). The former Union minister said conducting simultaneous polls would reduce the expenditure of the candidates, political parties, and help the country save money.

"Around Rs 1.5 lakh crore was spent in the (2024) Lok Sabha elections -- by political parties, candidates, other institutions and the Centre, which can be saved. It can add 1.5 per cent to India's GDP. Thus, it will be a win-win situation for India wherein people will have good government for five years," Thakur said.

With the implementation of ONOE, officials who are usually busy conducting elections will be able to focus on their primary duties, the five-time sitting MP from Hamirpur, Himachal Pradesh, said.

"When the model code of conduct is implemented, it slows down developmental works. A lot of time is lost before and after the conduct of elections, which usually takes 45-90 days.

"It also takes time to form a government, so a lot of time is lost. That is why we are saying that there should be 'one nation, one election'," Thakur said. If the ONOE formula is implemented in 2029, all

the elections will be held together, he said.

"If it (ONOE) matures up for 2029, elections in Himachal Pradesh. Uttar Pradesh. Gujarat and Punjab. which are scheduled in 2027, will be valid for two years only, and in 2029, all the elections will be held together," Thakur said.

"If Lok Sabha polls and state elections are conducted together, the country will benefit," he added. To a question on the restoration of statehood to Jammu and Kashmir, Thakur said the BJP has prom-

ised it and "J-K will get it". Asked about the situation in the Jammu region,

which witnessed a spate of terror attacks in the recent past, Thakur said the BJP has zero tolerance policy towards terrorism.

"Naxalism and terrorism are being dealt with sternly across the country. Naxals are being killed and



arrested at many places, while several Naxals have laid down arms. If you see the situation in Kashmir, there is a lot of peace now compared to the previous years

"If there were attempts (to launch attacks) in some parts of Jammu, our security forces took strong action against those. There is no place for terrorism. BJP has zero tolerance policy against terrorism," Thakur said.

Asked whether some BJP leaders were trying to put pressure on the Supreme Court over the challenges to the Waqf (Amendment) Act, the former Union minister said, "We are not putting any pressure on anyone. Our national president has made it clear." "The Congress and the opposition parties created fear and misled the people on issues such as Articles 370, and 35A, triple talaq, Ram Mandir, and the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA). When these cases went to the SC, the government's stand was proven right.

"Banning triple talaq has benefitted our Muslim sisters. After the Ram Mandir was built, no one suffered any losses, but got benefitted. None of the Muslims lost their citizenship after the CAA was implemented. The opposition is lying while Rahul Gandhi is maligning India even on foreign shores," Thakur said.

Hitting out at Rahul Gandhi, Thakur said he loses elections in India and then runs an agenda against the nation in foreign countries.

"He (Gandhi) should ask Uncle Sam, his mentor Sam Pitroda, for clarity. Pitroda said there is no contribution of Babasaheb Ambedkar in framing the Constitution but Rahul Gandhi walks with Ambedkar's photo in India.

"So, what is their stand? Pitroda said there should be wealth distribution ... What is Rahul Gandhi's stand on that? Pitroda has made statements against India many times, not just once. But he is a mentor to Rahul Gandhi, from whom he takes inspiration," Thakur alleged. (PTI)

MP govt turned tribal-dominated districts safe corridors for liquor smuggling, alleges Cong



BHOPAL, April 22: The Congress on Tuesday accused the Madhya Pradesh government of turning tribal-dominated districts like Jhabua, Alirajpur, Dhar and Ratlam into "safe corridors" for liquor smuggling, and demanded a ban on alcohol in these areas on the lines of religious places.

Addressing a press conference, Vikrant Bhuria, the president of the Congress' tribal wing, claimed that liquor is smuggled in large quantities from this tribal belt in Madhya Pradesh to neighbouring Gujarat, where it is banned.

"Tribal-dominated districts in the state, especially those bordering Gujarat and Maharashtra, like Jhabua, Alirajpur, Dhar and Ratlam, have become safe corridors for liquor smuggling...Large consignments of liquor seized from

time to time are proof of this," he said

Smuggling of liquor is not possible without the connivance or protection of the state government, administration and police officials. he alleged.

Citing media reports, Bhuria claimed that seven corridors have

been built for liquor smuggling in Jhabua and Alirajpur bordering Gujarat, and wine shops have been opened there at a distance of 400 metres to 5 kilometres from the Gujarat border so that the smuggling of alcohol can be done eas-

He also demanded that all the liquor shops bordering Gujarat be closed with immediate effect.

Bhuria, MLA from Jhabua, also alleged that the contract of each liquor shop in the villages located

along the Gujarat border was given

for ₹ 13 crore. But this area is backward and impoverished, and half of the population here is below the poverty line, he said. "In such a situation, where does

the alcohol go?" he asked. All types of alcohol, except traditional mahua liquor, should be banned in tribal areas because the use of mahua alcohol is a part of tribal tradition and worship practices. "To protect our culture and future in tribal-dominated areas, we demand the government to impose a complete ban on all other liquor except the liquor made from

mahua." he said. Mahua liquor is made from the dried flowers of the mahua tree.

"When alcohol can be banned at religious places, then why can't it be banned in the tribal areas of the state?" he asked.

Alcohol has been banned in 19 cities of religious importance in Madhya Pradesh and areas falling under some gram panchayats. These include Ujjain, Omkareshwar, Maheshwar, Mandleshwar, Orchha, Maihar, Chitrakoot, Datia, Panna, Mandla, Multai, Mandsaur and Amarkantak. Apart from this,

liquor ban is also applicable in the village panchayats of Salkanpur, Kundalpur, Bandakpur, Barmankalan, Barmankhurd and Linga. (PTI)

NEW DELHI, April 22: BJP MP

Nishikant Dubey on Tuesday hit out at the Congress over appointments in the higher judiciary during its tenure, evoking a sharp response from the opposition party that said the "shameless political use" made by the RSS, Jana Sangh and the BJP of the judicial process, courts and judges was recorded in history.

Dubey cited the example of former Rajya Sabha member and Supreme Court ex-judge Baharul Islam to attack the Congress over appointments in the higher judiciary.

"An interesting story of the Congress' 'Save Constitution'. Baharul Islam sahib joined the Congress in Assam in 1951. In the name of appeasement, the Congress made him a Rajya Sabha member in 1962. Six years later, in 1968, he was again made a Rajya Sabha member for his service. The Congress could not find a bigger sycophant than him. Without making him resign from the Rajya Sabha, he was made a high court judge in 1972," Dubey said in a post in Hindi on X.

"Then, in 1979, he was made the acting chief justice of 'Assam High Court'. The poor fellow retired in 1980. But this is the Congress. A judge who retired in January 1980 was directly made a Supreme Court judge in December

1980. In 1977, he had resolved all the corruption cases against Indira Gandhi with great dedication. Then, happy with this, the Congress retired him from the Supreme Court in 1983 and made him a Rajya Sabha member for the third time from the Congress in 1983. Will I not say anything?" he said. In an earlier post, Dubey said, "Do you know that Kailash Nath

Wanchoo, the chief justice of India in 1967-68, had not studied law at all." Hitting back at the BJP MP, Jana Sangh and the BJP, Khera the Congress' media and publicity pointed out. department head Pawan Khera said Dubey might not have heard the name of Guman Mal Lodha and would not say it even if he had

heard it. "He (Lodha) was president of Jana Sangh Rajasthan from 1969

to 1971. He was a member of the Rajasthan Legislative Assembly from 1972 to 1977 and head of many committees. Then, with the grace of the Jana Sangh in the Janata Party government, he became a judge of Rajasthan High Court in 1978. The matter did not end there. In 1988, Guman Mal was made chief justice of Guwahati High Court," Khera said in a post on X. When he left, he was made an MP thrice on tickets of the

Another incident is even more serious in which the chief justice of the Supreme Court was forced to resign and asked to contest the presidential election, he said, claiming that this incident was the "biggest and most shameful example" of political use of judges in independent India.

K Subbarao became the ninth chief justice of India on June 30, 1966, but resigned a few months later on April 11, 1967, under pressure from the Jana Sanghis as the Jana Sangh and the Swatantra Party wanted him to be the presidential candidate, Khera claimed.

"Subbarao resigned from the post of chief justice of India on April 11, 1967, and entered the electoral fray. However, he lost the presidential election and the plans of the Jana Sangh could not be fulfilled. Zakir Hussain defeated him by a huge margin," the Congress leader pointed out.

"The matter does not stop there, it goes up to Ranjan Gogoi... nowadays a video of a hateful Sanghi is also very viral that how he announced the decision on Ram Mandir to save his son-in-law," he alleged.

J&K LG, CM condemn Pahalgam terror attack

JAMMU/SRINAGAR, April 22: Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Tuesday condemned the terror attack in the tourist resort of Pahalgam in south Kashmir's Anantnag vestigation. district and vowed to bring the per-

petrators to justice. At least 12 tourists were injured in the terror attack at Baisaran, a meadow accessible only by foot or ponies in Pahalgam.

"I strongly condemn the cowardly terror attack on tourists in Pahalgam. I assure the people that those behind this despicable attack will not go unpunished," the LG said in a post on X.

He said he has spoken to the director general of police and other security officials, and that teams of the Army and police have been rushed to the area to launch search operations

"Directed the district administration and the health officials to provide immediate medical attention to those admitted at Pahalgam. An injured tourist has been evacuated to GMC Anantnag. I pray for the speedy recovery of all the injured," he added.

Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah also condemned the attack, saying it is an abomination.

"I'm shocked beyond belief. This attack on our visitors is an abomination. The perpetrators of this attack are animals, inhuman and worthy of contempt. No words of condemnation are enough. I send my sympathies to the families of the deceased," he said in a post on X.

Abdullah said he has spoken to his ministerial colleague, Sakina Itoo, who has reached the hospital to oversee the arrangements for the injured.

"I'll be flying back to Srinagar immediately," the chief minister, who was in Jammu, added.

He also said the attack is "much larger than anything we have seen" directed at civilians in recent years.

"The death toll is still being ascertained so I don't want to get into those details. They will be officially conveyed as the situation becomes clearer. Needless to say this attack is much larger than anything we've seen directed at civilians in recent years," he said.

People's Democratic Party (PDP) chief Mehbooba Mufti said such attacks must be denounced.

"I strongly condemn the cowardly attack on tourists in Pahalgam, which tragically killed five and injured several as being reported for now. Such violence is unacceptable and must be denounced," she said in a post on X.

The former chief minister said historically, Kashmir has welcomed tourists warmly, making this rare incident deeply concerning, and called for a thorough in-

"A thorough investigation is needed to bring the perpetrators to justice and examine potential security lapses. Ensuring visitor safety is paramount, and steps must be taken to prevent future attacks. Our thoughts are with the victims and

their families," she added. The Jammu and Kashmir Pradesh Congress Committee (JKPCC) strongly condemned the attack, describing it as the most unfortunate and shameful act.

"The rank and file of the JKPCC, led by president Tariq Hameed Karra, strongly denounced the militant attack on tourists. It is very shocking and anguishing to learn about the mindless and dastardly militant attack on innocent tourists," it said in a

statement. Such incidents are highly deplorable and have no place in a civilised society, it added.

The incident has put a big question mark on the tall claims of the Bharatiya Jnata Party-led Centre with regard to the security situation in Jammu and Kashmir, the statement said, adding that the perpetrators of the heinous crime must be

Éarlier this month, the Supreme Court had, for the first time, prescribed that the President should decide on the Bills reserved for her consideration by governors within three months from the date such reference is received. "There is a directive to the pres-

ident by a recent judgement ... We never bargained for democracy for this day. President being called upon to decide in a time-bound manner, and if not, becomes law," Dhankhar said

The vice-president was criticised for questioning the judiciary, with critics terming his remarks "unconstitutional".

In an apparent response to Dhankhar's "super Parliamet" remark, a top court bench on Monday said that "as it is, we are alleged of encroaching upon the parliamentary and executive func-

Justice B R Gavai, who was heading a bench also comprising Justice Augustine George Masih, made a similar observation in another matter.

While one matter was over the recent violence in West Bengal during anti-Waqf law protests, the other plea sought a direction to the Centre to take appropriate steps to prohibit streaming of sexually explicit and pornographic content on OTT and social media platforms.

While hearing the plea on online content, Justice Gavai said, "Who can control it? It is for the Union (government) to frame a regulation in that regard.'

Gavai is set to be the next chief justice of India.

In a related development, Rajya Sabha MP Kapil Sibal on Tuesday said everything the apex court said was consistent with the country's constitutional values and guided by national interest.

Sibal's remarks in a post on X came soon after Dhankhar asserted that every word spoken by a constitutional functionary was guided by supreme national interest. (PTI)

Return to work, leave tainted-untainted list to govt: Mamata

KOLKATA, April 22: West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Tuesday urged protesting teachers who lost jobs following a Supreme Court ruling, to return to work, assuring them that her government will "protect" their salaries.

Thousands of teachers on Tuesday continued their overnight protests outside the West Bengal School Service Commission (WBSSC) headquarters in Salt Lake.

"You don't need to worry about who is tainted and who is not. You only need to worry about whether you have your job and whether you are getting your salaries on time. The list to identify the tainted and untainted teachers remains with the government and the courts.

'We assure that your jobs are safe for now and you will get your salaries. Please return to your schools and resume classes. I have spoken about this several times since last night. We are with you," Banerjee said at an administrative programme in Midnapore.

The CM said a review petition for Group C and Group D staff, who have lost their jobs, will also

NEW DELHI, April 22: Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday left for Srinagar to take stock of the situation in Jammu and Kashmir in the wake of a deadly terror attack on tourists at Pahalgam, official sources said.

Narendra Modi spoke to him and asked him to visit the Union Territory, they said.

Lieutenant Governor of Jammu and Kashmir Manoj Sinha, who was in the national capital, Union Home Secretary Govind Mohan, Director of Intelligence Bureau Tapan Deka and a few senior officials accompanied the home minister, who has left on a special flight from IGI airport here.

The home minister in a post on 'X' said he had briefed the prime minister about the incident and held a meeting with the officials concerned via video conferencing

"Anguished by the terror attack on tourists in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir. My thoughts are with the family members of the deceased. Those involved in this dastardly act of terror will not be spared, and we will come down heavily on the perpetrators with the harshest consequences," Shah said

In Srinagar, Shah will hold an urgent security review meeting with all the agencies.

Multiple tourists were feared killed and at least 20 injured when terrorists opened fire in a picturesque meadow near Kashmir's Pahalgam town, breaking the calm of a regular Tuesday afternoon with scores of people enjoying their day out.



The death toll could be more than 20, a high-ranking official indicated without getting into details.

The attack, which comes as US Vice President J D Vance is visiting India, took place around 3 pm, the officials said. The toll is still being ascertained, Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah said while describing the terror attack as "much larger than anything we've seen directed at civilians in recent years". More than 30 persons were killed and 60 others injured in a terror attack on Amarnath base camp in Pahalgam in 2000. A year later, 13 persons were killed

and 15 others injured in an attack on Amarnath pilgrims at Sheshnag while 11 persons were killed in another attack in 2002 in the Pahalgam area. Eight pilgrims were killed in a terror attack in 2017

Shah headed for J-K soon after Prime Minister

RAMBAN (J-K), April 22: Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Tuesday said he will approach the Centre to declare Ramban a "disaster zone", and hoped adequate Central assistance will be provided to extend relief to the people affected by flash floods and landslides in the hilly district.

In his second visit to the affected area in as many days, the chief minister assessed the ground situation and met with the affected families.

Abdullah said the road clearance operation along the Jammu-Srinagar National Highway is going on at a war footing and officers have assured him that the only allweather road connecting Kashmir with rest of the country will be restored for single-way traffic within next 24 hours.

"The first priority of the administration was to save the lives of the people trapped in their homes and vehicles, which was successfully done. The second priority is to restore the blocked roads to restore con-

nectivity and for that machinery has been deployed and I was assured that the highway will be opened for single-way traffic by 24 hours which will be followed by clearing the massive sludge in other areas," he told reporters.

"We are trying to rehabilitate the affected population temporarily somewhere till their houses are restored. The deputy commissioner (Baseer-ul-Haq Chaudhary) has been directed to provide immediate relief under Red Cross norms to the affected families and when the recovery work is over, we will make assessments to provide relief under SDRF and NDRF norms. We will also approach the Centre to declare Ramban as 'disaster zone'. I am fully confident that the Centre will provide us with the required assistance," Abdullah said.

The natural calamity has claimed the lives of three persons, while causing extensive damage to residential structures, vehicles, and critical road infrastructure. The chief minister, accompanied by his

political advisor Nasir Aslam Wani, flew in a helicopter to Chanderkote area of Ramban this morning and immediately left for landslide-hit Seri to assess the situation.

Confident of getting adequate central help for landslide-hit in Ramban: Omar

Deputy Commissioner, Ramban was seen briefing the chief minister as he moved on foot and met the affected families. The chief minister made an impromptu stop during his visit to Ramban market to meet a group of residents, who had halted his motorcade, seeking urgent assistance following the devastating cloudburst that damaged their homes.

"I am here to listen to your concerns and assure you that we will do everything possible to help you rebuild your lives," the chief minister stated.

Among the crowd, an agitated woman said, "Our house was washed away in the cloudburst, but nobody from the administration has provided any help so far. If the government won't listen to us, then who will? We chose them, and it is their responsibility to provide us relief.'

The atmosphere was charged as protesters chanted, "Fulfill our demands"

Another resident highlighted the ongoing distress within the community, indicating that the administration has yet to offer any relief or restore essential services such as electricity and water supply to the affected areas.

In an apparent reference to the protest, Abdullah said this was the third time that senior ministers in the administration visited Ramban to review the situation and supervise the rescue and relief measures.

"On day one (Sunday), deputy chief minister along with two MLAs concerned toured the district. On Monday, I came by road from Srinagar and today I am here again to ensure that the restoration work is done as fast as it could be," he said.

Indirectly blaming local BJP leaders for the protest, Abdullah said, "I would like to request a BJP candidate moving around here to do this type of politics in Delhi rather than here. Instead, he should seek a be filed before the Supreme Court and "keep your faith in us till then"

Banerjee also warned the protesting teachers not to fall prey to those trying to provoke them.

"Had I been in Kolkata, I could have solved the issue within seconds. Do not pay heed to those who are provoking you. Let the state government look after it," she said.

Referring to "similar developments in Uttar Pradesh and Tripura", Banerjee said, "People have lost jobs in those states in huge numbers and never got them back. Don't let that happen here.'

Bengal school job loss: Protesting teachers vow US Vice President Vance, family to intensify stir, stay put outside SSC office visit Amber Fort in Jaipur

JAIPUR, April 22: Caparisoned elephants, colourful rangolis and folk dancers... There was all this and more as US Vice President J D Vance and his family visited the famed Amber Fort to a red carpet welcome on Tuesday morning.

Vance, his Indian-origin wife Usha Chilukuri and their three children -- Ewan, Vivek, Mirabel -- reached the UNESCO World Heritage at around 9.30 am. The Vances spent around two hours at the fort before returning to the luxurious Rambagh Palace Hotel, where they are staying. Rajasthan Chief Minister Bhajanlal Sharma and Deputy Chief Minister Diya Kumari welcomed them at the fort. Flanked by security personnel, as the Vances entered the main courtyard -- Jaleb Chowk -- two decorated female elephants named Chanda and Mala greeted them by raising their trunks, an official said. They also witnessed a cultural performance featuring folk dances, including Kacchi Ghodi, Ghoomar and Kalbeliya, offering a glimpse into the vibrant culture of



Rajasthan, he said. While Vice President Vance walked the red carpet holding his sons, Ewan and Vivek, by the hand, his wife carried their daughter Mirabel. The family appeared captivated by the impressive courtyard and architecture, officials said. After the visit, the family returned to the hotel as Vance is scheduled to deliver a speech on US-India ties at the Raiasthan International Centre. The Amber Fort Palace was

closed to the public from 12 pm on Monday to make preparations for the Vance family's visit. Traffic was rerouted to ensure that the

stretch of road from Rambagh Palace Hotel to the fort remained clear for the VIP movement. The Amber Fort is situated in the Aravalli mountain range, nearly 11 km from the centre of Jaipur. It is

an extensive palace complex built with pale vellow, pink sandstone and white marble. The fort is divided

into four main sections, each with its own courtyards. Amber was the capital of the Kachhwaha Rajputs before they shifted their capital to Jaipur. Man Singh I started the construction of the new palace complex at the end of the 16th century.

After Raja Man Singh I, Mirza Raja Jai Singh I and Sawai Jai Singh II made some modifications, including to the interiors of the fort. The fort was constructed in four stages, and the palace inside was the residence of the Rajput Maharajas and their families.

It consists of a 'Diwan-e-Aam' (hall of public audience), 'Diwane-Khaas' (hall of private audience), a 'Sheesh Mahal' (mirror palace) and a 'Sukh Niwas'. In the Sheesh Mahal, numerous minuscule mirrors are placed on the walls in a unique arrangement. Even a single ray of light entering the palace gets reflected in a way that illuminates the entire hallway.

The Sukh Niwas is known for its distinctive cooling feature created by winds blowing over cascading water. (PTI)

KOLKATA, April 22: Thousands of teachers, whose appointments were annulled following a Supreme Court verdict, on Tuesday vowed to intensify their stir, as they continued the overnight protests outside the West Bengal School Service Commission (WBSSC) headquarters in Salt Lake.

The agitators were among nearly 26,000 teaching and non-teaching staff whose appointments were invalidated by the apex court on April 3, citing "widespread irregularities" in the 2016 recruitment drive.

Braving the scorching sun, the protesters numbering over 2,000 surrounded the WBSSC headquarters, denying entry and exit of officials, including its chairman Siddhartha Majumdar, who has been inside the building since last evening.

The agitating teachers have been demanding that the commission publish the list of candidates who were recruited on the basis of merit, and those who got appointments by allegedly paying bribes. "We have realised we have nothing more to lose. This agitation will only end with justice - not another promise, not another lie," asserted one of the protesters.

"We will not let any food item enter the SSC building. If we are forced to starve on the streets under the open sky, those sitting inside air-conditioned rooms should also feel the heat," said another agitator, as more barricades were put up around the commission premises and security was tightened.

The protesters banged empty bottles and raised slogans for justice, accusing the commission of "consistently lying" and terming state Education Minister

Bratya Basu's assurances "betrayal in the disguise of legal advice"

A delegation of eight teachers who had gone to meet the chairman was still inside the building and continuing their sit-in without any food, a protester claimed.

"A woman protester had earlier fainted in this heat, but she insists she will not budge until justice is delivered," he said.

Another sacked teacher said: "I have served for seven years. Now, all of a sudden I have been deemed 'undeserving'. My daughter needs regular kidney treatment. I have nothing left to save her."

Earlier, state Education Minister Bratya Basu had said that the list of "deserving and undeserving" candidates would be published in two weeks.

The protests outside the SSC building erupted after the commission failed to publish the list by Monday evening, even after another round of meeting with representatives of the teachers.

SSC Chairman Siddhartha Majumdar, in a latenight statement on Monday, said the commission will abide by the apex court directives and ensure "the (jobless) teachers having rendered services will be given salary".

Making no mention about posting the list of all "tainted/untainted" candidates as per the April 21 deadline, Majumdar said: "In respect of the matter of recruitment of teachers in 2016, it is made clear that SSC will abide by the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court." (PTI)

that the film is based on the book she said, adding that she has already sent two legal notices, but received no response.

To buttress her point, Kapoor cited her August, 2023 WhatsApp exchange with Kangana Ranaut's brother, Aksht Ranaut of Manikarnika Films, in which she repeatedly emphasised that the contract must be followed and that the phrase "based on her book" should not be used, though referencing the book in the sources section is acceptable.

"Aksht replied and had agreed to these terms during the conversation," she said.

The film, "Emergency", on Netflix includes a disclaimer, stating that it is "inspired by the books, 'The Emergency' by Coomi Kapoor and 'Priyadarshani' by Jaivanth Vasant Shinde".

However, toward the end, the disclaimer shifts tone, stating that the film is "based on the books, 'The Emergency' by Coomi Kapoor and 'Priyadarshani' by Jaivanth Vasant Shinde", which Kapoor argues directly contradicts the terms of their agreement.

The author further pointed out that at the time of signing the agreement, she was told that only a specific chapter on former prime minister Indira Gandhi from her book would be referenced for the film. However, she was surprised to find that the film's title closely mirrored that of her book.

"This now appears to be a deliberate attempt on part of you to get traction for the said film, especially since it had been subject to uncomplimentary remarks," states a legal notice sent by Kapoor to the filmmakers.

The author pointed out that the film contains numerous historical inaccuracies -- far more than those detailed in the legal notice. Among those is a scene that shows Gandhi personally threatening the then President Fakhruddin Ali Ahmed into declaring the

Emergency without consulting her Cabinet as well as a depiction suggesting that the Emergency ended

when she announced the general

election. "Factually, the Emergency was not removed till after Mrs Indira Gandhi lost the general election in March 1977," the legal notice said. On June 25, 1975, Gandhi declared a state of Emergency in the country, suspending civil liberties, jailing opposition leaders and dissidents and effecting press censorship. The Emergency was lifted on March 21, 1977. Other distortions highlighted in

the legal notice include the incorrect association of Jayaprakash Narayan's 1974 "Total Revolution Movement" with Gandhi's 1972 Shimla Agreement as well as inaccurate portrayals of the arrest and imprisonment of political leaders during the Emergency.

PTI attempted to contact Kangana Ranaut's sister and manager, Rangoli Chandel, for a comment, but she was unavailable. Aksht Ranaut though, according

to Kapoor, did reach out to her over the phone after the media reported the issue. "Yes, he (Aksht) called. I told

him 'you were never available all this while'. He asked me, 'What would you like?'. I told him I will talk to my lawyer," Kapoor said. However, according to the no-

tice, Kapoor has demanded immediate compensation for the severe reputational, professional, emotional and financial damage suffered by her due to the filmmakers' reckless and illegal conduct.

"If you fail to comply, our client reserves the right to initiate legal proceedings to seek appropriate remedies for this egregious violation of her rights," the notice said.

"Emergency", which was also directed and produced by Kangana Ranaut, had earlier courted controversy over its censor certificate and allegations that it misrepresented the Sikh community.

It was not screened at cinema halls in Punjab after protests by the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) and other Sikh organisations. (PTI)


Johar's Dharma Productions and

Kashyap, who has criticised the protests by the Brahmin community against the release of Hindi film "Phule" and the censor troubles faced by caste-based films such as "Santosh" and "Dhadak 2", admitted that he deviated from his "point of view" due to the choice of his words.

"I sincerely apologize to this community to whom I did not want to say this, but wrote it in anger while responding to someone's cheap comment. I apologise to all my friends, my family and the (Brahmin) society for my way of speaking and for the abusive language.

The filmmaker said he will work on his anger to avoid a similar situation in future. "And if I have to talk about the issue, I will use the right words. I hope you will forgive me," Kashyap wrote in Hindi.

On Friday, the 52-year-old "Gangs of Wasseypur" director said he and his family were receiving "rape and death threats" for his comments, which were "taken out of context".

"This is my apology, not for my post but for that one line taken out of context and the brewing hatred. No action or speech is worth your daughter, family, friends, and colleagues getting rape and death threats from the kingpins of sanskar. I won't take back what I said. Abuse me all you want. My family didn't say anything. If you want an apology, here it is," he said at the time. (PTI)

Pope Francis: How cinema has explored papacy and the man at the helm of Vatican

NEW DELHI, April 22: Pope Francis, the first non-European pope in 1,300 years, figured in many films and documentaries centred on him and exploring his extraordinary legacy.

Pope Francis died on Monday at the age of 88. Jorge Mario Bergoglio, from Buenos Aires, presided over the Catholic Church for more than 12 years and was known for injecting a breath of fresh air into the 2,000-year-old institution with his progressive views.

He was the first pope to play a cameo in the 2017 film "Beyond the Sun", which was directed by Graciela Rodriguez Gilio and Charlie Mainardi and revolved around stories of hope, faith and courage from the Bible

German filmmaker Wim Wenders famously explored the late Pope's life in his 2018 documentary "Pope

Francis: A Man of His Word". The documentary premiered at the Cannes Film Festival. It features the Pope addressing various global issues, aiming to connect directly with viewers.

In an interview with the Film Society Lincoln Centre, Wenders said the documentary began after a cinephile prefect at Vatican contacted him.

"My secretary came with a letter and said you have got mail from the Vatican and it was in Italian," Wenders said, sharing that he was asked in the letter whether he was interested in exploring a project on Pope Francis' life.

Wenders said he had some 55 questions and the Pope answered them all "quite spontaneously".

The 2013 documentary "Francis: The Pope From the New World", which was filmed in Buenos Aires,

features interviews and archival footage to draw an intimate portrait of the Pope and his efforts towards the upliftment of the poor and downtrodden.

A 2015 Italian film "Call Me Francis" revolved around his life as Jorge Mario Bergoglio in Buenos Aires before he became the Pope.

The 2019 film "The Two Popes", directed by Fernando Meirelles, starred Anthony Hopkins as Pope Benedict XVI and Jonathan Pryce as Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio.

It is set before the events of 2013 when Pope Benedict XVI resigned. It follows him as he tries to convince the Cardinal to reconsider his decision to resign as archbishop. He tells Bergoglio that he is planning to abdicate.

Bergoglio took over as the pope in March 2013.

"The Two Popes" was nominated

for best actor, best supporting actor and best adapted screenplay. Renowned filmmaker Martin Scorsese met Pope Francis in 2023

and announced a film about Jesus. It was not just Pope Francis. The papacy has also held fascination for the common public.

"Conclave", a 2024 film deconstructs the mystery of how a pope is elected. It is set just after the death of a pope and revolves around the papal election process and the College of Cardinals convene to elect the Bishop of Rome.

Directed by Edward Berger, the film featured a starry cast in Ralph Fiennes, Stanley Tucci, John Lithgow, Sergio Castellitto, and Isabella Rossellini. It was nominated at the Academy Awards in eight categories including the best picture. The film won the Oscar for best adapted screenplay. (PTI)

India finish third in Peru World Cup, NRAI pleased with young shooters' performance

LIMA (PERU), April 22: Indian shooters finished third at the ISSF World Cup after the pair of Prithviraj Tondaiman and Pragati Dubey failed to reach the medals round in the trap mixed team event, here on the final dav

Simranpreet Kaur Brar fetched India's final medal in the women's 25m pistol event on Monday, taking the country's tally to seven, including two gold, four silver and a bronze.

While the USA also ended with seven medals, they edged ahead of India to take second place, courtesy of a higher gold-medal count.

China finished on top of the standings with four gold, three silver and six bronze medals

The standout performer for India

was 18-year-old Suruchi Inder Singh, who claimed both of the country's gold medals. She outgunned Paris Olympics double medallist Manu Bhaker to win the 10m air pistol title before teaming up with Saurabh Chaudhary to secure gold in the mixed team event.

In the trap mixed team event on Monday, Tondaiman and Dubey posted a combined score of 134 to finish eighth, while the other Indian pair of Lakshay and Neeru ended 13th with the total score of 128. Only the top four teams advance to the medal rounds. K Sultan Singh, Secretary General,

National Rifle Association of India (NRAI), seemed pleased with the young Indian shooters' show. "It was a young squad and the expo-

sure of going half-way around the

world into alien conditions, adapting to the surroundings, the ranges, and then bringing out your best for India, will be an experience which will hold them in good stead," Singh was quoted as saying in a press release.

"Remember, the next LA Olympics will be a similar experience. Having said that, given the quality of competition, the squad as they have been doing generally over the years, performed splendidly," added Singh.

In the back-to-back World Cups in Argentina and Peru, Indian shooters reached a total of 32 finals, including medal matches in the mixed events and returned with 15 medals including six gold.

The 18-year-old Suruchi was the most successful, bringing home three

gold and one bronze medal. Arya Borse was the other World

Cup debutant to shine, making it to three finals and returning with two silver medals in the mixed team rifle event

"It gives us immense pleasure to look at the depth we have developed in the sport. There are so many accomplished international shooters who were back home and not part of this tour and still we have produced such results. This shows that Indian shooting is moving in the right direction," Singh said.

The next international assignment for Indian shooters will only for shotgun exponents who will compete in the Cyprus World Cup, beginning in the first week of May in Nicosia. (PTI)

"I bow at the feet of Rafa because of what he did week after week," Alcaraz said. "You have to respect that.'



KKR facing same failures as seen throughout this IPL, says Eoin Morgan

KOLKATA, April 22: Defending champions Kolkata Knight Riders have struggled with batting issues throughout this IPL season and the changes made for the home game against Gujarat Titans were not effective, feels former captain Eoin Morgan.

KKR's loss to Gujarat Titans by 39 runs here on Monday was their second consecutive defeat in the tournament, third in the last five matches and overall fifth in eight games.

It has also been a season of struggle at home for the three-time champions who have also lost three of the four matches at the Eden Gardens.

"Kolkata Knight Riders has simply not bounced back as well as we would have liked them to. It's always a good sign for a strong team with a lot of character around, but they had the same failures that they've shown throughout the tournament," said JioStar expert Morgan

"They made a couple of changes (against GT), mainly to try and gain some impetus in their batting line-up, and it didn't necessarily come off. Were the changes worth it? They'll sit back and say no.'

Morgan said KKR failed to forge partnerships in chase of 199 as they finished at an ordinary 159 for eight.

"It was interesting to hear Ajinkya Rahane talk about 199 being a chaseable score because towards the back end of Gujarat Titans' innings, we thought the ball held up more than we expected (and) that made finding boundaries harder," he said. Morgan added, "But there was no rhythm, no sub-

stantial partnerships - almost the polar opposite of what Gujarat Titans displayed."

Morgan was all praise for India and GT pacer Prasidh Krishna who delivered another vital spell of 4-0-25-2. "He's the purple cap holder at the moment, and his rhythm just keeps getting better. We know he has that extra bit of pace to work with, but you have to admire the strength he brings during the middle phase of the game," he said. (PTI)

It wasn't on my roster: Bhogle explains absence from KKR-GT match commentary panel

NEW DELHI, April 22: Noted commentator Harsha Bhogle has rejected speculation that he was kept away from the IPL match between Kolkata Knight Riders and Gujarat Titans on Monday due to a complaint by the Cricket Association of Bengal, insisting that he was only empanelled for two games in Kolkata, which are over.

His clarification came a day after the CAB's letter to the BCCI, sent about 10 days ago by its secretary Naresh Ojha, was revealed in media reports. In the letter, the body asked for the removal of Bhogle and New Zealand's Simon Doull from the commentary panel for matches in Kolkata after they stated that the Eden Gardens pitch was not helping the local franchise Kolkata Knight Riders.

"There are some inappropriate conclusions being drawn about why I wasn't at yesterday's game in Kolkata. Quite simply, it wasn't on the list of matches I was down to do!" Bhogle posted on 'X'.

"Asking me would have resolved the issue. Rosters are done before the tournament starts. I was rostered for two games in Kolkata. I was there for the first and an illness in the family prevented me from being at the 2nd," he added without specifying the games.

tans at the Eden Gardens on Mon-

198 here "IPL is a tough tournament, and when you don't start well, you know, batsmen go into a period where they lose confidence," Bravo said at the post-match media interaction, summing up the mood in the dressing room. 'That's what's happening at the moment. So like I said, we

just have to keep backing them, and hopefully they come good...our batters, low in confidence and normally runs bring confidence.

"Form brings confidence. And we, at the moment, to be honest, don't have that confidence," he explained.

The Eden Gardens surface has been under the spotlight this season after the KKR camp voiced concerns about not getting its preferred home track. However, Bravo steered clear of blaming the pitch

"Nothing is wrong with the wicket. I didn't come here to talk about the wicket. I think both teams play on the same wicket. We didn't play a good game of cricket. They played better than us," he asserted.

Last night's loss came close on the heels of an embarrassing collapse against Punjab Kings, where they were bundled out for 95 while chasing just 112. Bravo insisted that despite the horror run, the batsmen have been doing everything they can to regain rhythm in practice.

...they are not sitting back and missing practice. So as coaches, as a group, we cannot fault the effort. It's just not working out in the middle. But I have to just keep backing the team and supporting

the guys."

Asked about the big-hitting Andre Russell's continued struggles with the bat, Bravo was quick to dismiss the idea of teams targetting their star all-rounder in particular

"Russell is not the only one who is struggling at the moment. Russell is an experienced player, he's a successful player. Actually as a team we're not batting properly. So that's just the reality.

...But as a group, we have to make sure that the players keep putting in their work and practice, keep preparing well, try to keep them mentally focused," he explained.

Rahane has done the heavy-lifting, and young Angkrish Raghuvanshi has impressed with his fluent strokeplay. KKR's decision to send the promising youngster as low as number nine as an impact sub raised several eyebrows in their match against GT.

Bravo, however, defended the move

'Well, we didn't start the game for him to bat at number nine. But the way how the game panned out, eventually, he ended up at number nine. So, you know, we tried to create that left-right combination." he reasoned.

"He's one of our better players. he's been doing very well for us throughout the season. But when you're chasing 200, you try to maximise as much as possible and try to get the guys who have the ability to really hit the ball in the middle.

Bravo however did admit that they were "caught up" with the left-right combination and Raghunvanshi ended up batting way down the order when the match had all but slipped out of their hands.

Bravo acknowledged that finishing has become a massive problem for KKR.

Another sinewy left-hander, who got a chance to make his Test debut in Australia due to the absence of Rohit Sharma in the first game. Padikkal did show glimpses of his talent in the second innings during an effective stand with Yashasvi Jaiswal. He has been in good touch in IPL and if he doesn't make the senior team cut, he will be in and around the India A team for sure.

Sarfaraz Khan:

After he scored a 150 against New Zealand in Bengaluru in October, Sarfaraz should have sealed his place in the Test squad but some atrocious shot selection in the following Tests put him down

in the pecking order. In Australia, he was more of a tourist and wasn't even discussed for a place in the first XI. However for the sake of continuity, selectors can still look at him. (PTI)

BAI pushes for former players to hone coaching skills under foreign coaches

NEW DELHI, April 22: The Badminton Association of India (BAI) wants former top Indian players to hone their coaching skills under foreign coaches and work with junior players but also strive to save the Indian style of play from fading.

BAI had advertised coaching position and received an overwhelming response with as many as 49 former players applying for the job.

"We invited applications from the top players who want to come into coaching with BAI and SAI. We got 49 applications out of which we have shortlisted 10-11. The list has gone to SAI for approval," BAI General Secretary Sanjay Mishra said in an interaction.

Mishra stressed the importance of preserving the traditional Indian playing style, which he believes is slowly fading due to the increasing influence of foreign coaches.

"The Indian style is somewhat fading. Prakash (Padukone) sir used deception to win the All England, (Pullela) Gopichand played net game to win. But now, under foreign coaches, the Indian shuttlers are playing a more physical game, more like the Indonesian or Malaysian style.

"Maybe our physique also doesn't fully support that kind of play. After playing one or two games the body may not be able to sustain the tempo. So these Indian coaches can pass on our style apart from learning the foreign style which may give better results,' he added.



BAI plans to rotate the shortlisted coaches across training centres. Initially they will be assigned to junior players at the National Centres of Excellence (NCoE).

"These coaches will be rotated in the centres. We want these coaches to work with

junior players at the NCoE before moving to elite coaching.

The BAI is also focussing on the development of junior players as it wants to create a "chain of talent"

"Our focus at the NCoE is on junior play-

ers. Earlier, we would just hold 15-day camps before tournaments. But now, with the NCoE, they have a consistent space to train together," he said.

"It will take 3-4 years, but eventually, the question of 'who after Sindhu?' or 'who after Prannoy?' will be answered."

"In China if top two are not playing, the third string player also goes and wins a tournament. We want to develop a similar system, prepare a chain of players so that even if the top two are not available then third best player has the capability to reach the semifinals."

Mishra added that the top players will be given a choice to train across the three NCoEs in Bengaluru, Hyderabad and Guwahati where one foreign coach will also be stationed.

Currently, Malaysia's Tan Kim Her works at NCoE in Hyderabad and Indonesian Irwansyah Adi Pratama in Bengaluru while South Korea's Park Tae-Sang, who coaches junior players, works in Guwahahti.

He also added that shuttlers will undergo fitness tests thrice a year.

"SAI has been focussing on players being fit or ready to play. They have set some parameters for this, some test that players should take thrice a year.'

India will host the senior World Championships next year and a team from the world body BWF will travel to India to inspect the venue -- the Indira Gandhi Stadium in New Delhi -- in June. (PTI)
