Imposition of emergency: CM seeks apology from Cong

GUWAHATI, June 25: The Congress should extend an unconditional apology to the people of India for imposing Emergency and dictatorship on a nation, the history and civilisation of which are rooted in democracy, Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma said on

Emergency was one of the darkest periods in India's history and the youth today should learn about how the nation was plunged into darkness and freedom was suppressed, he asserted.

The Emergency declared on June 25, 1975, by then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi lasted until March 21, 1977. It was marked by widespread press censorship, arrests without trial and the stifling of dissent in academia, politics and civil society. 'The Congress Party must give an open declaration that they will not bring back Emergency to our country', the chief minister told reporters after attending a 'Mock Parliament' to mark the 50th year of the imposition of emergency.

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi always 'talks about the Constitution but he must remember that it is his family and party that "murdered the spirit and soul of the Constitution', Sarma said.

'Today we are observing 'Black Day' because on this day 50 years ago, the then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi had clamped the emergency illegally and even went to the extent of suspending the Fundamental Rights of the people,' he said. There was a resistance movement led by Lok Nayak Jay Prakash Narayan and lakhs of people came out to the street and protested against the imposition of Emergency, Sarma added.



'If every youth of India remembers Samvidhan Hatya Diwas (Day of the Constitution's murder), then in future no one thinking like Indira Gandhi will be encouraged nor will the darkness of Emergency cover India again,' he said at the Mock Parliament.

Sarma said that one should not forget two facts - the Congress subverted the Constitution to latch on to power, and even 50 years later, the mindset behind Emergency is still thriving in the party.

Earlier in the day, the chief minister of the BJPruled state had also lashed out at the Congress, stating that those who had "strangled the Constitution are today trying to become its protector"

"As we mark 50 years of this brutal episode, India pays tribute to the brave men and women who stood firm to uphold the Constitution during those dark times," he said in a post on X. (CONTD. ON PAGE-2)

Tension runs high on Assam-Meghalaya border over plantation drive • One hurt in stone pelting incident

Police resort to aerial firing to restore order

GUWAHATI, June 25: A plantation drive on a disputed stretch of the Assam-Meghalaya border escalated into a violent confrontation on Wednesday, leading to the injury of one person and heightened tensions between residents of the two neighbouring states.

The incident occurred near Lapangap village, which lies in a contested area between Meghalaya's West Jaintia Hills district and Assam's West Karbi Anglong.

According to an official statement, the Karbi Anglong Autonomous Council (KAAC) of Assam had carried out a sapling plantation drive in the area earlier this week

However, around 10-11 am on Wednesday, a crowd of approximately 400 people from Lapangap and surrounding villages, supported by members of several Meghalaya-based social organisations, arrived at the plantation site and began uprooting saplings and dismantling wooden protective

structures. They claimed that Assam authorities were attempting to encroach into Meghalaya territory, a charge strongly contested by

local officials in Assam. Tensions quickly escalated into a physical confrontation when local residents from Assam objected to the uprooting of saplings. disperse the crowd and restore both states. On the Assam side, order. Meghalaya Police also sources from (CONTD. ON PAGE-2)

During the clash, one local resident, Chandra Terang of Tapat, sustained a head injury, allegedly after being hit by a stone thrown from the Meghalaya side.

West Jaintia Hills Deputy Commissioner Abhinav Kumar Singh told PTI that the plantation drive had taken place without prior notice to Meghalaya's district administration.

He added that the administration had been aware of the drive for a week and had advised local residents to refrain from escalating matters, as a peace meeting had been scheduled for the day.

However, the meeting at Tahpat village failed to take place due to

low participation. Singh confirmed that police personnel and three border magistrates have been deployed at the site for coordination with Assam officials, and that the situation is now under control. Assam govt changes nomenclature of officers to act against child marriage

GUWAHATI, June 25: The Assam government has rechristened all the District Child Protection Officers as Child Marriage Prohibition Officers (CMPOs), according to an official notification.

Women and Child Development Department Principal Secretary Mukesh Chandra Sahu issued a notification on Monday, which was made available to media on Wednesday, to effect the change in the nomenclature of the officers in all the districts.

"...the Governor of Assam is pleased to notify the District Child Protection Officers of all Districts of Assam as Child Marriage Prohibition Officers (CMPOs) at the district level with immediate effect," it added.

Sahu explained that the CMPOs duties specified under the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006 (PCMA 2006).

"In addition to these functions and duties as specified in PCMA 2006, the CMPOs will also perform the functions and duties as specified under...the Assam Prohibition of Child Marriage Rules, 2015," he added.

The CMPOs will lodge FIRs under The Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, 2012 (as amended in 2019) or under The Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006, as the case may be, the noti-

fication stated. "The CMPOs notified above are in addition to the Gram Panchayat Secretaries notified in general areas and the Lot Mandals (Patwaris in Dima Hasao) in Sixth Schedule areas for the same purpose. All CMPOs in the districts shall maintain close coordination with each other," Sahu said. (PTI)

88 undocumented immigrants deported from Cachar district

Himanta talks tough on illegal influx issue

GUWAHATI, June 25: Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Wednesday reaffirmed his government's hardline stance on illegal immigration, announcing the identification and deportation of 88 undocumented immigrants from Cachar district over the past month. The Chief Minister shared the update through a post on social media platform X, declaring "Uncompromising Action against Illegal Immigration.'

According to the statement, the operation, which began on May 24 resulted in the pushback of 59 Bangladeshi nationals and 29 Rohingyas. The individuals were identified through special intelligence-based operations and subsequently deported to Bangladesh via Sribhumi district, which lies along the interna-

"This is part of our continued fight for Jati, Mati, Bheti — identity, land, and homeland," Sarma said, reiterating his government's long-held position that illegal infiltration poses a threat to Assam's demographic balance and cultural fabric.

The crackdown aligns with Assam's broader campaign against undocumented immigrants, a politically sensitive issue that has seen heightened action in recent years. Police sources confirm that surveillance

tricts such as Cachar, Karimganj, and Dhubri, with more deportations expected as operations continue.

In the latest phase of Assam's intensified crackdown on illegal immigration, 15 suspected Bangladeshi nationals, including women and children, were detained on Sunday night in Cachar district. Authorities confirmed that ten individuals were apprehended from Hilara in Katigorah, while five others were intercepted by vigilant local residents in Bishambarpur and later handed over to the police.

A senior police official revealed that many of those detained originally hailed from Khulna, Bangladesh, and had been living and working in Surat, Gujarat, for several years. With mounting pressure from law enforcement in Gujarat targeting undocumented migrants, the group is believed to have attempted a return to Bangladesh by crossing through Assam's border

"They informed us they were trying to go back home out of fear of arrest in Gujarat," the officer said, crediting the Village Defence Party (VDP) and local villagers for assisting in their interception.

The latest detentions come just a week after a separate group of nine Bangladeshis, also believed to be returning from Gujarat, were stopped in Hilara area in

APCB issues show cause notice to **ONGC** over unauthorised rig operation

Assam Pollution Control Board (APCB) has issued a show cause notice to the Chief General Manager (Drilling), ONGC Assam Asset, directing the company to explain why Environmental Compensation should not be imposed for operating rig number RDS 147A at Barichuk Bhatiapar without obtaining the mandatory Consent to Establish (CTE) and Consent to Operate (CTO).

The rig has been spewing gas since June 12, posing environmental and public health concerns.

The APCB has cited violations under various provisions of the Water and Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Acts and the Environment (Protection) Act.

According to the notice issued by Jayanta Dutta, Regional Head

Restoration work underway in Lumding-Badarpur section

GUWAHATI, June 25: The Northeast Frontier Railway (NFR) has launched a massive restoration effort to reinstate rail connectivity in the Lumding-Badarpur Hill section, which was severely disrupted following a major landslide.

According to an official statement, nearly 100 metres of railway track were affected after continuous heavy rainfall triggered a slope failure near a road situated just 15 metres from the railway line. A high-level emergency meeting was held on June 24, 2025, involving the Chief Secretary of Assam, the General Manager of NFR, and senior officials from the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI), among others.

During the meeting, a coordinated restoration plan was finalised and a joint operation is currently underway. Over 25 units of heavy machinery, including excavators, JCBs, and dumpers, along with approximately 200 labourers, have been mobilised to carry out the work at the site.

Senior railway officials, including the Divisional Railway Manager (DRM) of Lumding, are monitoring the operation on the ground to ensure round-the-clock progress. (CONTD. ON PAGE-2)

As the rocket pierced through Florida skies, Group Captain Shukla became only the second Indian in history to travel to space after Rakesh Sharma in 1984 and the first Indian astronaut to travel to the International Space Station

father Shambhu Shukla told PTI. "I have nothing more to say at this moment. I am delighted," Shubhanshu's mother Asha Shukla said. "I know he will be successful. We are all overwhelmed with pride – our son has made history," she told PTI.

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Markets log gains for 2nd day; Sensex, Nifty surge nearly 1 pc on global rally

MUMBAI, June 25: Benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty surged nearly 1 per cent on Wednesday, powered by widespread buying and a positive trend in global equities amid easing tensions in the Middle East following a ceasefire between Iran and Israel. Besides, intense buying market heavyweights HDFC Bank, Infosys and Reliance Industries supported domestic equities, traders said.

Extending its previous day's rally, the 30-share Sensex jumped 700.40 points or 0.85 per cent to settle at 82,755.51. During the day, it surged 760.8 points or 0.92 per cent to 82,815.91.

As many as 2,821 stocks advanced while 1,207 declined and 134 remained unchanged on the

Similarly, the wider gauge NSE Nifty climbed 200.40 points or 0.80 per cent to 25,244.75.

"Benchmark indices extended their winning streak for a second consecutive session on Wednesday, closing decisively in the green as investor sentiment got a boost from the Israel-Iran ceasefire, which alleviated geopolitical overhang. The Nifty kicked off trade on a buoyant note, subsequently oscillated in a narrow band with a positive undertone...," according to Bajaj Broking market commentary.

Rupee falls 3 paise to close at 86.08 against US dollar

MUMBAI, June 25: The rupee gave up its gains and settled for the day lower by 3 paise at 86.08 against the US dollar on Wednesday, weighed down by the recovery in the US Dollar index and selling pressure from foreign funds. Forex traders said the cease-fire between Israel and Iran has led to a rise in risk appetite. Moreover, a strong show in the domestic equity market prevented steep losses in the local unit, they said.

At the interbank foreign exchange, the rupee opened at 86.00 against the US dollar and traded in the range of 85.79-86.14 before settling at 86.08, down 3 paise from its previous close.

The Indian rupee closed almost flat amid quiet regional price action. "Traders are now focused on upcoming trade-related updates for short-term direction. Near-term, USD/INR has support at 85.10 and resistance at 85.90," said Dilip Parmar, Research Analyst, HDFC Securities. The local unit had logged its steepest single-day gain in nearly five years on Tuesday to end 73 paise higher at 86.05 against the greenback. "The rupee made a high of 85.79 before oil companies stepped in and took it lower to 86.13 with the market still sceptical of the Iran-Israel ceasefire," Anil Kumar Bhansali, Head of Treasury and Executive Director, Finrex Treasury Advisors LLP, said. (PTI)

"Markets maintained their positive tone and gained nearly a per cent, supported by favourable global cues. A strong handover from the US markets triggered a gap-up start, which was further fuelled by buying interest in select heavyweight stocks," Ajit Mishra – SVP, Research, Religare Broking Ltd, said.

"Indian equity markets have staged a recovery, supported by easing geopolitical tensions in the Middle East and a moderation in crude oil prices. While FIIs continue to withdraw capital, positive global cues are helping sustain domestic market momentum. Domestically, a favourable monsoon forecast, and moderating inflation are further underpinning the optimism," Vinod Nair, Head of Research. Geojit Investments Limited, said.

In Asian markets, South Korea's Kospi, Japan's Nikkei 225 index, Shanghai's SSE Composite index and Hong Kong's Hang Seng settled higher.

European markets were trading on a mixed note in mid-session trade. US markets ended significantly higher on Tuesday.

Global oil benchmark Brent crude climbed 1.21 per cent to USD 67.95 a barrel.

Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) offloaded equities worth ₹ 5,266.01 crore on Tuesday, according to exchange data. Domestic Institutional Investors (DII) bought stocks worth ₹ 5,209.60 crore.

On Tuesday, the Sensex settled in the green, climbing 158.32 points or 0.19 per cent to 82,055.11. On similar lines, the Nifty rose by 72.45 points or 0.29 per cent to end at 25,044.35. (PTI)

ONGC well blowout in Assam: Gas leakage continues for 14 days

SIVASAGAR, June 25: Leakage of gas continued for 14 days from a crude oil well of ONGC in Assam's Sivasagar district although the energy major on Wednesday claimed to have achieved a "critical milestone" in its effort to control the blowout.

In its daily bulletin on the blowout incident, ONGC said it has achieved a "critical milestone" in its ongoing well control operations at the site.

"With precision and coordination, the extra-long boom crane and a 40-ton crane successfully worked together to remove the 42 tubing stands from the derrick of the rig, clearing the path for the safe removal of the rig base from the wellhead," it added.

The blowout took place on June 12 at Well No RDS 147A of Rig No SKP 135 of Rudrasagar oil field of Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC) at Barichuk of Bhatiapar. A private firm, SK Petro Services, was operating the well on behalf of the state-run Maharatna company.

The statement said that following the removal of the rig base, the next phase of operations involves dismantling the existing Blowout Preventer (BOP), followed by the installation of the capping stack.

"During this sequence, a temporary increase in gas discharge is anticipated. ONGC assures that the gas is nontoxic and the volume is significantly reduced, presenting no risk to inhabitants residing be-

yond a 500-metre radius," it added.

The company also said that it continues to make concerted efforts to control the unabated gas discharge from the well.

"Water blanketing operations continue as part of ONGC's layered safety strategy, while both ONGC and its technical partner CUDD remain fully focused on executing the well control operations in a carefully calibrated and safe manner," it added.

Water is being pumped continuously at high pressure from the Dikhow river, which is flowing near the rig. However, the rising waters in the river have introduced additional logistical challenges.

"In response, the teams are

proactively relocating high-capacity pumps to maintain uninterrupted support to ongoing safety systems," ONGC said.

It further said that ambient air quality continues to be rigorously monitored with all key parameters well within permissible limits, while medical and relief camps also remain operational to ensure the well-being of personnel and nearby communities.

"ONGC reiterates its commitment to operational excellence, environmental responsibility and community safety, and continues to work with determination to bring this complex operation to a safe and successful conclusion," the statement said.

Three blowout experts from the US reached the site on June 20 and

are actively engaged in the massive exercise to control the well.

Last week, Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma had urged Union Petroleum and Natural Gas Minister Hardeep S Puri to ask the energy major to ramp up their effort to control the blowout in a 'mission mode'.

Sarma had also written to Puri, saying that locals believe there has been "inadequate urgency and seriousness in ONGC's response" while trying to control the well.

The prolonged nature of the incident is causing considerable distress in the surrounding villages as already more than 330 families have been evacuated from their homes and are being supported with basic relief and safety measures at a camp set up in nearby Bangaon.

The Assam government has announced financial aid of Rs 25,000 each to about 350 families affected by the blowout.

An official of ONGC had earlier said that it was an old crude well without production and a perforation job was going on for zone transfer at the time of the blowout.

"It is a kind of servicing of the well. The production was supposed to start from a new zone after the perforation job. At the time of the incident, the logging perforation operation was going on. Suddenly gas started coming out in an uncontrolled manner immediately after the perforation, leading to the blowout," he had added. (PTI)

MUMBAI, June 25: Key economic indicators point towards resilient economic activity in India across industrial and services sectors amid twin shocks of global trade policy uncertainties and heightened geopolitical tensions, the Reserve Bank's Bulletin said on Wednesday.

An article published in the RBI's June Bulletin said the global economy is in a state of flux.

"In this state of elevated global uncertainty, various high frequency indicators for May 2005 point towards.

high-frequency indicators for May 2025 point towards resilient economic activity in India across the industrial and services sectors," it said.

Agriculture showed a broad-based increase in production across most major crops during 2024-25.

Also, the domestic prices situation remains benign,

with headline inflation staying below the target for the fourth consecutive month in May. Financial conditions remained conducive to facilitating an efficient transmission of rate cuts to the credit market, the article on 'State of the Economy' said.

"In this state of elevated global uncertainty, various high-frequency indicators for May 2025 point towards resilient economic activity in India across the industrial and services sectors," the bulletin said.

According to the article, gross inward foreign direct investment (FDI) amounted to USD 8.8 billion in April 2025, higher than USD 5.9 billion in March 2025 and USD 7.2 billion in April 2024. Manufacturing and business services accounted for nearly half of the gross FDI inflows in April 2025. (PTI)

Ambani, Adani join hands for fuel marketing in second business partnership

NEW DELHI, June 25: Mukesh Ambani and Gautam Adani have partnered to sell automotive fuels by leveraging each other's fuel retail networks -- marking the second business collaboration between the two billionaire industrialists

trialists.

Ambani's fuel venture with UK's BP, Jio-bp, will set up petrol and diesel dispensers at CNG retail outlets of Adani Total Gas Ltd (ATGL). Alongside, ATGL -- the equal city gas joint venture of Adani Group and TotalEnergies of France -- will put up CNG dispensing units at Jio-bp's fuel pumps, according to a joint statement on Wednesday.

The partnership will cover both group's existing as well as future outlets

Jio-bp owns 1,972 petrol pumps across the country while ATGL operates a network of 650 CNG sta-

tions in 34 geographical areas.

"Adani Total Gas Ltd (ATGL)
and Jio-bp (operating brand of Reliance BP Mobility Ltd) today
(Wednesday) announced signing
of an agreement to redefine the
auto fuel retail experience for Indian consumers.

"Under this partnership, select ATGL fuel outlets will offer Jio-bp's high-performance liquid fuels (petrol and diesel), while select Jio-bp fuel outlets will integrate ATGL's CNG dispensing units, within ATGL's authorised geographical areas (GA), thus enhancing the supply of high-quality fuels to transport consumers," the statement said

This is the second time in recent months that the rival billionaires have come together. In March last year, the two had signed the pact for their first-ever collaboration for a power project in Madhya Pradesh.

Ambani's firm Reliance had

picked up a 26 per cent stake in Adani Power's project in MP and signed to use the plants' 500 MW of electricity for captive use.

Adani and Ambani, both hailing from Gujarat, have often been pitted against each other in business. The two have also been jostling for the title of Asia's richest person for the last few years.

With Ambani's interests spanning oil and gas to retail and telecom and Adani's focus on infrastructure spanning sea ports to airports, coal and mining, they rarely crossed each other's path except in the clean energy business where the two have announced multi-billion investments.

Adani is building mega renewable energy parks and has also ventured into solar modules and wind turbine manufacturing. Ambani's Reliance, too, is building four gigafactories at Jamnagar in Gujarat -- one each for solar panels, batter-

ies, green hydrogen, and fuel cells.
Reliance is also eyeing setting up renewable electricity capacity at Gujarat's Kavada, the arid land bordering Pakistan where Adani is also building the world's largest solar park with 30 gigawatts canacity

The two had come face-to-face during an auction of the 5G spec-

trum airwaves. While Ambani bid for airwaves to sustain his telecom business, Adani's entry had surprised many. Adani, however, ended up buying a small quantum of spectrum which he later traded with Bharti Airtel.

While Ambani has been in the media space since 2014 with news channels such as CNBC-TV18, CNN-News18, and entertainment channels like Colors, Adani only recently followed in his footsteps. Adani's entry was facilitated when a close associate of Ambani sold out a firm to give him controlling stake in NDTV.

Ambani and Adani are coming together to challenge the dominance of state-owned retailers in the fuel retailing space. State-owned Indian Oil Corporation (IOC), Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd (BPCL) and Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Ltd (HPCL) control over 90 per cent of 97,366 petrol pumps in the country. PSUs are also a dominant player in city gas.

The joint statement issued on Wednesday said ATGL is India's leading city gas distribution (CGD) player, serving natural gas to households, industries, commercial customers, and motorists.

ATGL also offers compressed biogas (CBG), EV charging, and LNG for the transportation segment. Jio-bp, on the other hand, is a leading mobility solutions provider in India, with a strong presence in fuel retailing, low-carbon alternatives, and modern convenience stores. (PTI)

Several trains will be partially cancelled or short-terminated due to the disruption.

These include the Sealdah–Silchar Kaziranga Express (13175), Sabroom–Sealdah Kanchanjunga Express (13174), SMVT Bengaluru–Agartala Express (12503), Silchar–Thiruvananthapuram Express (12508), Charlapalli–Agartala Special (07030), Agartala–Charlapalli Special (07029), Agartala–Lokmanya Tilak Terminus Express (12520), and Agartala–Firozpur Express (14619), which will either start or terminate at Guwahati, Lumding, Kamakhya or other intermediate stations.

Train operations in the affected hill section will remain suspended until full restoration is completed. However, the NFR has assured that all-out efforts are being made to reopen the route within a week, subject to favourable weather conditions. Passengers have been urged to stay informed via official railway communication platforms for further updates on train movements and service resumption.

Rangiya division achieves 100% electrification

HT Bureau GUWAHATI, June 25: In a significant boost to green and efficient rail connectivity in the Northeast, the Rangiya Division of Northeast Frontier Railway (NFR) has achieved 100% electrification, becoming the second fully electrified division in the zone after Alipurduar.

The milestone marks a major stride towards Indian Railways' vision of sustainable, energy-efficient, and environmentally responsible operations.

According to an official state-



ment, the Principal Chief Electrical Engineer (PCEE) of NFR, Sandeep Kumar, recently carried out statutory inspections of the Gauripur-Abhayapuri section in the Rangiya Division. The inspection, essential for obtaining the sanction to commence commercial electric train services, covered a route length of 84.577 kilometres and 110.41 track kilo-

Following the inspection, a successful electric locomotive trial run was conducted at a maximum sectional speed of 90 kmph.

The trial confirmed the operational readiness and safety of the infrastructure for 25 kV AC electric traction.

The achievement is expected to improve the speed and reliability of train services, reduce operational costs, and cut down carbon emissions in the region.

Electrification of the Gauripur-Abhayapuri section completes the transition of Rangiya

Division to electric traction, significantly enhancing its capacity to offer sustainable rail services across Assam and neighbouring states.

The electrification is part of NFR's broader goal for the 2025-26 financial year, which includes electrifying approximately 640 route kilometres across its network. This initiative will help re-

CM joins mock parliament to mark Emergency anniversary

GUWAHATI, June 25: Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Wednesday took part in a Mock Parliament organised by the Bharatiya Janata Yuva Morcha and BJP Mahila Morcha at the Bhogeswari Phukanani Indoor Stadium in Guwahati, to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the imposition of the Emergency in India.

The event, held in remembrance of one of the most controversial chapters in India's democratic history, was attended by prominent party leaders and a large number of youth participants.

According to an official statement, the Chief Minister addressed the gathering, emphasising the importance of remembering and understanding the Emergency periodnot just as a historical event but as a crucial lesson for the future.

"It is imperative for the new generation of India to commemorate the Emergency every year to ensure that such events are never repeated," Sarma said.

He noted that the youth have a responsibility to study and reflect upon the widespread atrocities committed during the 21-month period from 1975 to 1977.

Sarma recounted that the Emergency was declared on June 25, 1975, by then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi, without prior cabinet approval, which he described as a direct assault on the nation's democratic fabric

Highlighting the legal and constitutional violations during that time, he pointed to the Supreme Court's infamous judgement that permitted the suspension of Article 21 of the Constitution—effectively nullifying the right to life and personal liberty.

"This enabled the government to arrest and detain individuals without judicial over-

sight, and the state was not held accountable even in cases of custodial deaths," he said. Citing the Shah Commission Report and

other declassified historical documents, the Chief Minister urged the youth to educate themselves about the Emergency and its long-lasting implications on civil liberties, press freedom, and institutional independ-

He recalled that in response to the crackdown, protest movements like the Navnirand later merged with a nationwide call for democratic restoration under the leadership of Jayaprakash Narayan.

Sarma paid tribute to leaders who resisted the Emergency and endured imprisonment for the cause of democracy.

"Leaders such as Morarji Desai, Bharat Ratna Atal Bihari Vajpayee, Lal Krishna Advani, George Fernandes, and Nanaji Deshmukh were instrumental in mobilising public opinion and forcing Indira Gandhi to withdraw the Emergency," he noted.

that the participants of the Mock Parliament would use the occasion to reflect on the illegitimacy-both legal and moral-of the

Emergency. He credited the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) and the Jan Sangh for their role in organising resistance against what he described as authoritarianism under Indira

Gandhi's regime. Taking a critical view of the Congress party's continued silence over its role during the Emergency, Sarma drew parallels with global precedents of historical accountabil-

"Whether it was the British expressing regret for the Jallianwala Bagh massacre or American Presidents visiting Hiroshima, history shows that those responsible for injustice have expressed remorse. Yet the Congress party has never apologised for the Emergency," he said.

He asserted that the party responsible should formally apologise to the nation for undermining its democratic values and pledge that such a chapter would never repeat itself.

Also present at the event were Assam BJP President and MP Dilip Saikia, State BJP Yuva Morcha President Rakesh Das, BJP Mahila Morcha State President Swapna Bania, and several other party leaders and dignitaries.

The Mock Parliament event saw enthusiastic participation from students, youth activists, and political workers, with segments reenacting the parliamentary procedures and events that unfolded during the Emergency.

The programme concluded with calls for preserving constitutional values and resisting any future threats to democratic institu-

The Pope generally preaches love, compassion and world peace. Iran is ruled by the supreme Shia spiritual cleric, Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, championing the cause of Shia supremacy. Shiite Iran is believed to be aspiring to build a nuclear arsenal ever since Sunni Islamic faction led Pakistan became a nuclear-armed state. Iran is an Islamic republic with a strong theocratic system and a great influencer of Shiite states and Shiites across the world. Estimates from the US Office of the Director of National Intelligence suggest that Iran possesses around 3,000 ballistic missiles, a figure that surpasses any other regional power, according to the Australian Broadcasting Corporation. They include missiles of various ranges and types, contributing to Iran's significant military

Iran has also emerged as a major manufacturer-exporter of highly sophisticated drones. Last year, the Ukraine government claimed that Russia launched over 8,000 Iran-developed drones during the war. Iran is recognized for its advancements in drone technology, particularly in areas like combat drones and loitering munitions (suicide drones). Iran has been exporting drone technology to various countries, including Sudan, Syria, and Ukraine, and has supplied drones to regional allies and militias.

To the credit of the country's spiritual leadership, Iran has developed a massive drone industry. It has been relying on indigenous production helped by international sanctions. Iran's drone industry has focused on local engineering and manufacturing. It has been producing drones like the Ababil, Mohajer, and Shahed series, including the Shahed-136 (also known as Geran-2 in Russia) and the newer Shahed 238. Iran's Kaman-22 drone resembles the US MQ-9 Reaper. Iranian drones are reshaping the dynamics of conflicts, particularly in West Asia and in the Russia-Ukraine war context.

atural Farming is considered as agroecology based diversified farming system which integrates crops, trees and livestock with functional biodiversity. It is largely based on on-farm biomass recycling with major stress on biomassmulching, use of on-farm cow dung-urine formulations; maintaining soil aeration and exclusion of all synthetic chemical inputs. Natural farming is expected to reduce dependency on purchased inputs. It is considered as a cost-effective farming practice with scope for increasing employment and rural develop-

Natural farming practices

1. No external inputs,

- 2. Use of Local seeds (use of local varieties), 3. Use of On-farm produced microbial formulation for seed treatment (such as bijamrita), 4. Use of On-farm made microbial inoculants
- (Jivamrita) for soil enrichment, 5. Use of Cover crops and mulching with green and dry organic matter for nutrient recy-

and for creating a suitable micro-climate for maximum beneficial microbial activity in soil.

6. Mixed cropping,7. Managing diversity on farm through inte-

Soil Management in Natural Farming A healthy soil microbiome is critical for optimal soil health and plant health, and thereby animal health and human health.

- 1. Soil may be covered with crops for maximum period of the year.
- 2. Diverse crops- a minimum of 8 crops over
- 3. Minimal disturbance of soils is critical 4. Integrated farming systems should be fol-
- 5. Bio-stimulants for healthy soil microbiome based on fermentation of animal dung and urine, and uncontaminated soil- Beejamrit, Jivamrit etc. should be used

Method 2 Take 10 Kg Cow dung, 5 to 10 litres cow urine, 2 Kg Jaggery, 2 Kg pulses powder, handful of soil. Mix all of these components together very well. Dry it under shade and cover it with gunny bag. Once dried make powder of this dried mixture. This organic manure can be stored for 6 to 8 months.

Bijamrita Beejamrutha is used for treating seeds, seedlings or any planting materials and effective in protection against fungus, soil-borne, and seed-borne diseases .Bijamrita has similar ingredients as organic fertilizer jeevamrut- Take 10 liters of water, 3 kg of Indian cow dung, 3 liters of local cow urine, and 30-gram lime and handful soil of the farm.

Bijamrita preparation method

3 kg Indian cow dung put in cloth and seal it by rope. This sealed cloth is hung in the 10-liter water for 12 hours. Add 30 gm lime in one-liter water and let it stable for 12 hours. Now stir and squeeze this sealed cloth of the cow dung in that water to accumulate all essence of cow dung in that water. Add a soil of farm in the solution and stir it well. Add 3-liter Indian cow urine and limewater and stir it well.

Deforestation in Assam's hills: An ecological crisis

Assam, known for its unparalleled natural beauty and ecological wealth, is facing an alarming crisis—deforestation in its hilly regions. The state's hills, sprawling with dense forests that have nurtured rich biodiversity and sustained indigenous communities for centuries, are rapidly losing their green cover. This ongoing deforestation is not the loss of trees but represents a complex ecological crisis with far-reaching consequences for Assam's environment, society, and economy.

The hills of Assam—stretching across districts such as Karbi Anglong, Dima Hasao, and Sonitpur—are among the most biodiverse landscapes in the country. These forests provide habitat to endangered species like the hoolock gibbon, the Bengal slow loris, and a variety of rare orchids and medicinal plants. Yet, over the last two decades, large swathes of these forested areas have been depleted due to a combination of factors ranging from illegal logging and mining to agricultural expansion and infrastructure projects. Satellite data and forest surveys reveal that Assam has lost significant forest cover since the early 2000s, with the hill regions disproportionately affected. This trend, if left unchecked, could irrevocably disrupt ecological balances, triggering a cas-

cade of environmental calamities. At the heart of this crisis lies illegal logging and timber smuggling, often orchestrated by well-entrenched mafias. The dense. remote forests in the hills provide ideal cover for these illicit operations, making law enforcement difficult and sporadic. Valuable timber species such as teak and sal are felled indiscriminately, often with little regard for reforestation or sustainability. This illegal activity is frequently compounded by corruption and insufficient governmental oversight, allowing the destruction to continue unabated. The economic incentives behind timber smuggling are powerful, as high demand for quality hardwood fuels an underground market that flourishes despite legal

Equally troubling is the expansion of shifting cultivation, locally known as "ihum," in the hilly terrain. Traditionally a sustainable practice, jhum cultivation involved clearing small patches of forest for farming and allowing long fallow periods for forest regeneration. However, increasing population pressure and reduced availability of fallow land have transformed this practice into a significant driver of deforestation. Farmers now clear larger areas with shorter fallow cycles, preventing forest recovery and leading to permanent degradation of the land. The consequent soil erosion and nutrient depletion exacerbate ecological fragility. making the hills more prone to landslides

and floods, especially during the monsoon. Mining activities, particularly coal mining, pose another major threat to Assam's hill forests. Areas like the Dehing Patkai Elephant Reserve—a critical biodiversity hotspot—face encroachment from coal extraction, which not only destroys forest habitats but also contaminates soil and water through mining waste. Despite legal battles and environmental protests, mining operations have continued in some areas under pressure from industrial interests. The scars left by mining are often permanent, altering the landscape and fragmenting animal habi-

tats, thereby threatening species survival. Infrastructure development, while essential for regional growth, has also been a doumerely an environmental issue confined to ble-edged sword. Road construction, urban nomic costs of deforestation—loss of expansion, and industrial projects frequently slice through forested hills, resulting in direct loss of trees and fragmentation of ecosystems. For instance, the widening of highways through protected areas such as the Amchang Wildlife Sanctuary threatens thousands of mature trees and disrupts wildlife corridors, increasing humanwildlife conflicts. While connectivity and development are important, the manner and pace of infrastructure projects in ecologically sensitive zones have often ignored environmental safeguards, deepening the

The ecological consequences of this relentless deforestation are profound and multidimensional. The loss of forest cover directly impacts biodiversity, causing a decline in animal populations and the disappearance of plant species that are yet to be fully studied or cataloged. Assam's forests act as vital carbon sinks, absorbing significant amounts of carbon dioxide and mitigating climate change impacts. Their destruction releases stored carbon back into the atmosphere, contributing to global warming and altering regional climate patterns. The hills, once cool and temperate due to their dense canopy, are witnessing increased temperatures and erratic rainfall, affecting agriculture and water availability

downstream. Moreover, deforestation in Assam's hills intensifies soil erosion and landslide risks, especially during the heavy monsoon seasons. Without the stabilizing roots of trees, rainwater washes away topsoil, degrading the land and filling rivers with silt. This sedimentation not only reduces the fertility of agricultural fields but also causes flooding in lower plains and disrupts aquatic ecosystems. The degradation of watersheds reduces the natural capacity to retain and slowly release water, threatening water security for millions who depend on these rivers for

drinking, irrigation, and fishing. Beyond environmental impacts, deforestation has significant social and economic repercussions. Indigenous and tribal communities residing in Assam's hills have traditionally depended on forests for food, medicine, and cultural identity. Their intimate relationship with nature is disrupted as forests vanish, leading to loss of livelihoods and social dislocation. As their access to forest resources diminishes, many communities are pushed into poverty or forced to migrate to urban centers, exacerbating socio-economic vulnerabilities. The growing incidence of human-wildlife conflict—where animals stray into villages seeking food due to habitat loss—adds to local tensions and threatens both human safety and wildlife conservation efforts.

Economically, the destruction of Assam's forests undermines sectors like eco-tourism and agriculture. Wildlife sanctuaries and national parks that once attracted tourists are losing their appeal as wildlife populations decline and forest landscapes shrink. Farmers face declining soil productivity and water scarcity, while fisheries suffer from polluted and silted waterways. The long-term ecoecosystem services such as pollination, climate regulation, and water purification—are often overlooked but are critical for sustain-

able development. Addressing deforestation in Assam's hills demands urgent, comprehensive, and inclusive action. Stronger enforcement of forest protection laws is paramount, requiring enhanced surveillance, anti-logging operations, and judicial support to punish offenders. Equally important is involving local communities in conservation efforts by recognizing their traditional knowledge and rights, and by promoting alternative livelihoods that reduce forest dependence. Community forestry initiatives, which have succeeded in parts of Northeast India, can empower residents to manage and protect forests sustainably.

Reforestation and afforestation programs must be prioritized to restore degraded landscapes. However, such efforts need to be scientifically planned, using native species and considering the ecological context to rebuild habitats that support biodiversity and prevent soil erosion. Simultaneously, sustainable agricultural practices and land-use planning must be promoted to reduce pressure on forests. This includes improving yields on existing farmland, encouraging agroforestry, and educating farmers on soil

and water conservation techniques. Infrastructure development in forested areas needs rigorous environmental impact assessments and implementation of mitigation measures. Balancing economic development with ecological preservation requires integrated planning and political will, ensuring that projects do not sacrifice critical ecosystems for short-term gains. Public awareness campaigns can help build a conservation ethic among citizens, highlighting the interconnectedness of forests, climate, and human well-being.

In conclusion, the deforestation of Assam's hills is an ecological crisis that threatens to unravel the environmental and social fabric of the region. The loss of forest cover imperils biodiversity, aggravates climate change effects. destabilizes soils and watersheds, and undermines the livelihoods of indigenous communities. This crisis, while severe, is not irreversible if immediate and coordinated efforts are made. Assam stands at a crossroads, where decisions taken today will determine the fate of its forests and the future resilience of its hills. Protecting these natural treasures is not just an environmental imperative but a necessity for preserving the heritage, prosperity, and health of Assam and its people for generations to come. The truth about peudo millets

n recent years, as global dietary trends shift towards healthier, gluten-free, and alternatives. nutrient-dense pseudo cereals have gained significant attention. Among them, Fagopyrum esculentum, commonly known as common buckwheat, stands out as a promising crop with both nutritional and agronomic advantages. Often referred to as a "pseudo millet" due to its seed-based consumption and nutritional profile similar to millets, buckwheat is botanically distinct and belongs

to the Polygonaceae family.

What is a Pseudo Millet? Pseudo millets are non-grass seeds that resemble true cereals in composition and use, yet they belong to entirely different botanical families. Buckwheat, quinoa (Chenopodium quinoa), and amaranth (Amaranthus spp.) are the most recognized pseudo millets. Despite not being true cereals, they provide high-quality nutrients and can be cultivated in marginal lands, much like traditional millets—a fact highly relevant to the hill and tribal farming systems in

states like Assam. Origin and Cultivation

Buckwheat is believed to have originated in the Yunnan region of China around 6,000 years ago. It later spread to Central Asia, Europe, and eventually to the Americas. In India, it is primarily grown in the Himalayan belt—including Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Sikkim, and parts of North-East—including pockets of Arunachal Pradesh and Nagaland.

Though not yet widely cultivated in Assam, buckwheat presents an exciting opportunity for farmers in highland areas such as Dima Hasao, Karbi Anglong, and the foot-hills of Sonitpur and Udalguri, where the climate and soil conditions may support its growth. Given Assam's agro-climatic diversity, this crop could be explored as a short-duration, lowinput option for small and marginal farmers, especially in tribal and upland belts.

Buckwheat thrives in cool, temperate climates and matures quickly, usually within 70–90 days. It can be grown on poor, acidic soils where other crops may fail—conditions similar to several upland farming zones in Assam—making it a valuable option for climate-resilient farming in the state.

Furthermore, its deep root system improves soil structure and fertility, while its blossoms serve as an excellent source for honey bees, promoting apiculture—a sector gaining

ground in Assam's rural economy. **Uses and Culinary Value** Buckwheat seeds can be used

in various forms: • Flour: Used in making flatbreads, pancakes, noodles (soba), and other baked goods.

• Sprouts: Used in salads and health foods.

· Animal Feed: In some regions, the plant residue is used

as fodder. In India, buckwheat flour (kuttu atta) is popular during fasting seasons and is used in making puris, pakoras, and rotis. Such applications could be promoted in Assam's local markets and festivals, where ethnic and traditional food preferences are

valued and celebrated. Challenges and Scope for

Assam Despite its multiple benefits, buckwheat is not vet a common crop in Assam. Factors such as lack of awareness, absence of region-specific agronomic research, limited access to quality seeds, and weak market linkages

hinder its spread. However, Assam's Department of Agriculture, along with Krishi Vigyan Kendras (KVKs) and research stations, can pilot adaptive trials to evaluate buckwheat's potential in suitable agro-climatic zones. Local SHGs and FPOs can also be encouraged to include pseudo millets like buckwheat in their

value-added product lines. With the Government of India promoting millets and nutri-cereals under the "Shree Anna" initiative during the International Year of Millets 2023 and beyond, there's a timely opportunity to integrate pseudo millets into Assam's farming and nutrition strategies. Buckwheat's potential role in combating lifestyle diseases such as diabetes and hypertension both on the rise in Assam makes it a fitting candidate for public health and agri-nutrition programmes.

Conclusion

Fagopyrum esculentum, or common buckwheat, represents a powerful blend of nutrition, sustainability, and climate resilience. Though not a true millet, its "pseudo millet" status underscores its comparable health and agronomic benefits. For Assam, this crop holds un-

tapped potential—especially in upland, tribal, and organic farming systems. As the state moves toward a more diversified, healthconscious, and sustainable agricultural future, buckwheat deserves both a place on the plate and a plot in the field. 7 Israeli troops killed in Gaza bombing as Palestinian officials say 79 killed in Israeli attacks

JERUSALEM, June 25: The Israeli military says seven Israeli soldiers have been killed in the southern Gaza Strip when a Palestinian attacker attached a bomb to their armoured vehicle while Palestinians health officials in the battered enclave reported that 79 people were killed in Israeli attacks across the strip Wednesday.

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The attack on the Israeli troops, which occurred on Tuesday, was one of the deadliest for the army in Gaza in months, and quickly drew the nation's attention back to the grinding conflict with the Hamas militant group after nearly two weeks of war between Israel and

Among the 79 reported killed in Gaza were 33 people who died while trying to access aid.

Israel returns its attention to Gaza

Israel has been fighting in Gaza since the Hamas-led attack on Israel on October 7, 2023. US-led ceasefire efforts have repeatedly stalled in the conflict.

Brig. Gen. Effie Defrin, the army's chief spokesman, said the soldiers were attacked in the southern Gaza city of Khan Younis, where the army has operated on and off throughout much of the war. Helicopters and rescue forces were sent to the spot. They made attempts to rescue the fighters, but without success, he said.

The army said another soldier was seriously wounded in a separate incident in Khan Younis. It gave no further details, but Hamas claimed on its Telegram channel it had ambushed Israeli soldiers taking cover inside a residential building in the area.

Over 860 Israeli soldiers have been killed since the war began with the Octiber 7, 2023, Hamas attack, including more than 400 during the fighting in Gaza.

The initial Hamas attack killed some 1,200 people, mostly civilians, and took 251 others hostage. Some 50 hostages remain in captivity, at least 20 of whom are believed to still be alive.

Palestinians eager for a ceasefire of their own

Some Palestinians in Gaza City expressed frustration Wednesday that the war in the territory has dragged on for nearly two years. while the conflict between Israel and Iran lasted 12 days before a



fragile ceasefire was reached. I live in a tent and now my tent

is gone too and we're living in suffering here. The war between Israel and Iran ended in less than two weeks and we've been dying for two years, said Um Zidan, a woman displaced from northern Gaza.

Gaza health authorities had announced on Tuesday that the number of Palestinians killed in the war has risen above 56,000. Israel's blockade and military campaign have driven the population to the brink of famine. Mazen al-Jomla. a displaced resident of Shati camp,

questioned why war in the coastal enclave has stretched on, noting that Israel's assault on Iran was based on accusations of possessing nuclear weapons.

We have been suffering for two years; from horrors, destruction, martyrs and injured people," he said. "What do they (Israel) have left here? There are no houses, trees, or rocks, or humans left, Everything was destroyed.

Deadliest round of fighting The latest reported death toll of 56,156 is higher than in any previous Israeli-Palestinian fighting.

The health ministry in Gaza doesn't distinguish between civilians and combatants but says more than half of the dead have been women and children. The ministry said the dead include 5,759 who have been killed since Israel resumed fighting on March 18, shattering a twomonth ceasefire.

Israel says it only targets militants and blames civilian deaths on Hamas, which operates in heavily populated areas. Israel says over 20,000 Hamas militants have been killed, though it has provided no evidence to support that claim. Hamas has not commented on its casualties.

The BRICS Summit in Russia's Kazan last year became significant as both Modi and Xi met there, breaking the four-year deadlock over the frozen bilateral ties due to the standoff at eastern Ladakh.

After their meeting, both sides agreed to revive various bilateral dialogue mechanisms.

Following the Modi-Xi talks, the two sides held a series of meetings in the last few months aimed at normalising the bilateral rela-

If Xi misses the summit at Rio de Janeiro, the next opportunity for the Xi-Modi meeting could be the SCO summit to be held in China if the Prime Minister attends it.

China, the current chair of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO), plans to hold its summit in the next few months.

The news of Xi's plans to opt out of the Rio Summit reportedly came from Brazil where officials told the media that Beijing informed the Brazilian government that Xi had a scheduling conflict.

During the media briefing on Wednesday, Foreign Ministry spokesman Guo Jiakun declined to comment on the reports about Xi's decision, saying that information on China's attendance at the BRICS summit would be released in due course.

China supports Brazil's presidency of the BRICS, Guo said.

While it is unclear why the Chinese President has decided to opt out of the BRICS Summit in Rio, there is a sense of unease in Beijing over Brazil's decision not to endorse the multi-billion-dollar Belt and Road Initiative (BRI), which is also Xi's pet initiative.

Brazil is the second country in the BRICS after India which refrained from joining the BRI.

Outlining the reasons for Xi's reported decision, The Post report quoted Chinese officials that Xi met Brazilian President Luiz In cio Lula da Silva twice in less than a year first at the G20 summit and a state visit to Bras lia last November, and again in May during the China-Celac forum in Beijing as a reason for his absence.

Since he came to power, Xi, who is currently in power for an unprecedented third five-year term, has never missed a BRICS summit, highlighting the importance he attaches to the grouping.

Even during the coronavirus pandemic, he took part in the BRICS virtual summit in 2020.

In Bras lia, officials made no secret of their frustration over Xi's absence, according to the Post re-

ISLAMABAD, June 25: An officer of the Pakistan Army's Special Services Group, who had claimed to have captured Indian Air Force pilot Abhinandan Varthaman after his jet was shot down in a dogfight in 2019, was killed in a clash with the Taliban militants, according to the army.

Major Syed Moiz Abbas Shah, 37, was killed on Tuesday in a clash with the Taliban militants in the Sararogha area of South Waziristan near the Afghan border, according to a statement by the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR), the media wing of the army. Lance Naik Jibran Ullah, 27, was also killed in the same battle, it said. The army troops killed 11 terrorists belonging to the Tehreeke-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) and wounded seven others in the same operation, the statement said.

Moiz's funeral prayer was offered at Chaklala Garrison, Rawalpindi, and army chief Field Marshal Asim Munir attended it.

ITANAGAR, June 25: Marking the 50th anniversary of the imposition of the Emergency in India, a solemn event was held at DK Convention Hall in Itanagar to observe Samvidhan Hatya Diwas, or Constitution

The event was led by Arunachal Pradesh Governor Lt General K T Parnaik (Retd), PVSM, UYSM, YSM, and deputy chief minister Chowna Mein, and was attended by a host of dignitaries, government officials, and members of the public.

According to an official statement, the observance served as a poignant reminder of the 21-month-long Emergency declared on June 25, 1975—widely regarded as one of the darkest periods in India's democratic

"Even distant regions like Arunachal Pradesh and Assam were not spared. Leaders were imprisoned, voices were stifled, and civil rights were suspended," he said. Highlighting the widespread impact of

the Emergency, Mein pointed out that over 1.1 lakh people were detained across India under arbitrary charges, many without

"It is important to remember that fundamental rights are not privileges handed down by any government—they are inalienable and non-negotiable. The Emergency was a blatant assault on those rights," he said.

The Deputy CM also lauded the historic resolution passed by the Lok Sabha in June 2024, which formally condemned the Emergency and designated June 25 as Samvidhan Hatya Diwas.

He noted that this official recognition underscores the need to preserve demo-

Two-day training on incident response system and civil defence drills begins in Yingkiong

Initiative aims to enhance disaster preparedness at the district level

YINGKIONG, June 25: A two-day district-level training programme on the Incident Response System (IRS) and Civil Defence Security Drills commenced on Wednesday at the Conference Hall of the Deputy Commissioner's office in Yingkiong, Upper Siang district.

The training, organised under the aegis of the District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA), is part of a broader capacity-building initiative in line with the National Disaster Management Guidelines. According to an official statement issued by the District Administration, the programme is designed to enhance the preparedness and coordination capabilities of district-level response teams during natural or man-made emergencies.

The event is being attended by members of the Incident Response System Team (IRST), Upper Siang, and is chaired by Additional Deputy Commissioner (ADC) and Incident Commander N Nonang. During the inaugural session, Anie

Yangfo, District Disaster Management Officer (DDMO), delivered a detailed orientation to the participants, briefing them on their designated roles and responsibilities within the IRS framework.

Her presentation was aimed at familiarising team members with the operational structure of disaster response and encouraging proactive involvement.

The training included the use of case study scenarios drawn from real-life emergency situations to simulate crisis response and encourage critical thinking.

Participants engaged in group discussions and role-based exercises to understand how different wings of the administration—from police and fire serv-

ices to health and public works-can collaborate efficiently under the IRS model.

The IRS, developed by the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), provides a standardised approach for command, control, and coordination of emergency response, ensuring that efforts during disaster situations are not fragmented but synchronised.

Speaking at the event, ADC N Nonang emphasised the importance of readiness and unified action.

"Disaster can strike at any moment, and our response must be swift, structured, and coordinated. This training is a step forward in equipping our district administration with the tools needed to manage such challenges effectively," he said.

Officials from various departments including police, fire & emergency services, health, public works, forest, and education

are participating in the workshop. The training also focuses on interagency coordination, communication protocols, safety assessment, evacuation

procedures, and first response actions. The programme is scheduled to continue on June 26 with mock drills and teambased simulations that will assess the preparedness of each department in the face of

hypothetical emergency situations. The DDMA noted that similar capacitybuilding programmes will be conducted in other administrative blocks of the district in the coming months to ensure grassrootslevel readiness in disaster risk reduction and management.

The training programme has been welcomed by the local administration as a timely and strategic initiative to strengthen resilience against the increasing threats of floods, landslides, forest fires, and other hazards prevalent in the hilly terrain of Arunachal Pradesh.

'Undeclared Emergency@11': Congress says democracy under 'five-fold assault' under Modi govt

NEW DELHI, June 25: In a scathing attack on the Modi government, the Congress on Wednesday alleged that over the past eleven years, Indian democracy has been under a "systematic and dangerous" five-fold assault that can be best described as "Undeclared Emergency@11".

With the BJP in an all-out attack mode on the Congress on the 50th anniversary of the imposition of the Emergency by the then Indira Gandhi government, the Congress launched a counter-offensive and alleged that the government was weakening Parliament and eroding the autonomy of Constitutional bodies.

The opposition party also claimed that there has been "unbridled hate speech and crackdown on civil

In a statement, Congress general secretary in-charge communications Jairam Ramesh alleged that government critics have been routinely vilified, hate and bigotry is deliberately spread by the ruling establishment, protesting farmers were labelled "Khalistanis", and advocates of caste census were dismissed as "urban Naxals.'

"The killers of Mahatma Gandhi are glorified. Minorities live in fear of their lives and property. Dalits and other marginalised groups have been disproportionately targeted, and ministers making hate speeches have been rewarded with promotions," he claimed.

His remarks came on a day when the government is marking 'Samvidhan Hatya Diwas' on the anniversary of imposition of Emergency.

In his statement, Ramesh said, "Over the past eleven years and thirty days, Indian democracy has been under a systematic and dangerous five-fold assault that can be best described as Undeclared Emer-

Besides "unbridled hate speech and crackdown on civil liberties", he also cited alleged "attacks on the Constitution, tax terrorism and intimidation of businesses and institutions, control over the media and misuse of investigative agencies", to claim that an "undeclared emergency" was in place.

Claiming that attacks were being launched on the Constitution, Ramesh claimed that during the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, the prime minister sought a '400 Paar' mandate for a new Constitution and to betray Babasaheb Ambedkar's legacy.

"The people of India denied him that mandate. They

"The office of the Governor has been misused to block bills in opposition-ruled states and to interfere in university appointments. The Centre has bypassed constitutional fiscal arrangements by overusing cesses to deprive states of their rightful revenue share," he

Ramesh also accused the government of "damaging judiciary" and said there has been a definite policy of quiet threats to the judiciary, primarily through delayed elevations, punitive transfers, post-retirement sinecures for pliant judges, and selective implementation of collegium recommendations.

Alleging tax terrorism and intimidation of businesses and institutions, Ramesh said the fear of regulatory retaliation has had a chilling effect on previously outspoken business leaders.

"Investigative agencies have been weaponised to patronise a favourite business group. Major assets, including airports, ports, cement plants, and even media houses, have been handed over to this group," Ramesh alleged. (PTI)

NEW DELHI, June 25: In a jibe at Congress leader Shashi Tharoor, party chief Mallikarjun Kharge on Wednesday said his party believes in "country first" mantra but for some it is "Modi first and country later"

"I can't read English well. His (Tharoor's) language is very good, that's why we have made him a Congress Working Committee member," Kharge said when asked about Tharoor's article on Operation Sindoor outreach in which he praised Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

"But I want to say the people of the opposition together said they are with the Army that is fighting (during Operation Sindoor). We (the Congress) said the country is biggest and we will work together (with the government). We said 'country first, party later'. Some people say 'Modi first, country later' What can we do in that," he said.

Soon after Kharge's remarks, Tharoor put out a cryptic post on X in which there was an image of a bird with the caption --"Don't ask permission to fly. The wings are yours. And the sky belongs to no one...'

Tharoor, in an article published in The Hindu on Monday, said Modi's energy, dynamism and willingness to engage remained a "prime asset" for India on the global stage but deserved greater backing.

His remarks were seen as likely to irk his Congress party and widen cracks in his ties with its leadership.

In the article, Tharoor said the diplomatic outreach following Operation Sindoor was a moment of national resolve and effective communication. The Prime Minister's Office had shared Tharoor's article on X.

Speaking at an event in Moscow, Tharoor on Tuesday said his article on Operation Sindoor's global outreach was not a sign of his "leaping to join" Prime Minister Modi's party but a statement of national unity, interest and standing up for India. Also on Tuesday, the Congress distanced itself from party MP Tharoor's remarks in the article.

Asked about Tharoor's comments in the article, Congress spokesperson Supriya Shrinate had said, "It may be his own opinion, it is not the opinion of the Congress party. It is not the Congress' view since we have presented our views with evidence and proof.

Tharoor's praise for the prime minister comes at a time when the Congress has been consistently attacking the Modi government over its foreign policy, alleging that Indian diplomacy is being "shattered" and the country stands "isolated" globally. Following the Pahalgam terror attack, Tharoor has been making comments on the India-Pakistan conflict and the diplomatic outreach that are at variance with the stand of the Congress.(PTI)

Allowing probe agencies, police to summon lawyers threatens justice administration: SC

NEW DELHI, June 25: The Supreme Court on Wednesday said allowing police or probe agencies to directly summon lawyers for advising clients would seriously undermine the autonomy of legal profession and was a "direct threat" to the independence of justice ad-

A bench of Justices K V Viswanathan and N Kotiswar Singh observed the legal profession was an integral component of the process of administration of justice. "Permitting the investigat-

ing agencies/police to directly summon defense counsel or advocates who advise parties in a given case would seriously undermine the autonomy of legal profession and would even constitute a direct threat to the independence of the administration of justice," the apex court said.

The bench also framed a couple of questions in the matter. "Some of the questions which arise for consideration are: (1) when an individual has a association with a case only as a lawyer advising the party, could the investigating agency/prosecuting agency/police directly summon the lawyer for questioning?" the bench asked.

The other question read, "Assuming that the investigating agency or prosecuting agency or police have a case that role of the individual is not merely as a lawyer but something more, even then, should they be directly permitted to summon or should a judicial oversight be prescribed for those exceptional criteria?"

Both points aside from other issues, the bench said, could arise and require addressal on a comprehensive basis for "what is at stake is the efficacy of the administration of justice and the capacity of the lawyers to conscientiously, and more importantly, fearlessly discharge their professional duties".

The bench said since it was a matter directly impinging on the administration of justice. "to subject a professional.. when he is a counsel in the matter... prima facie appears to be untenable, subject to further consideration by the court".

The order came when the top court was hearing a plea of Gujarat-based advocate, challenging an order of the high court passed on June 12.

The high court on March 2025 refused to quash a notice summoning the lawyer before the police in a case against his client. The top court, however, directed the state not to summon him till further orders and stayed the operation of the police's notice issued to him.

The bench also issued notice to Gujarat government, asking for its response. The top court noted an

Tripura CM warns of strict action BJP Janajati Morcha holds demonstration in front of Congress MLA's residence against drug traffickers

AGARTALA, June 25: Tripura Chief Minister Manik Saha on Wednesday said that drug traffickers will not be tolerated under any circumstances and that strict action is being taken against them under a zero-tolerance policy.

Saha said that the central and state governments are taking a firm stance against drugs, and people from all sections of society must unite and fight against the menace.

The Chief Minister made these remarks at a motorcycle rally held at Umakanta Maidan in Agartala today on the occasion of the International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking. A blood donation camp was also organized as part of the Drug-Free India campaign. On the occasion, Saha, who also holds the Home portfolio, said that the United Nations declared this day as the International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking in 1987 to prevent drug abuse and raise awareness about illegal drugs.

"This issue is very relevant today. Tripura is geographically surrounded by international borders on three sides and shares boundAbout ₹ 20 crore has been allocated for each center, and an additional ₹ 198 crore has been sanctioned by the Ministry of DoNER to set up a larger drug de-addiction center in Tripura. The foundation stone for the facility has already been laid at Bishramgani The Chief Minister further in-

formed that currently, there are two drug de-addiction centers operating in the state, in addition to several others managed by private initiatives.

"It has been observed that those who use injectable drugs are mostly affected by HIV/AIDS. We try to provide treatment to such individuals if detected early. The AIDS Control Society in the state has been carrying out various initiatives to prevent HIV/AIDS. OST (Opioid Substitution Therapy) arrangements have also been made. The state government is firmly committed to a zero-tolerance policy against drugs. Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Home Minister Amit Shah have made it clear that drug peddlers will not be spared under any circumstances," Saha added.

He said that drug seizures in Tripura have increased by 104% from 2023-24 to 2024-25, while drug destruction has seen a rise of 132%. Police, security forces, and other concerned agencies are actively working against drug traf-

Mizoram Child Rights Commission demands stringent punishment against man for sexual abuse

AIZAWL, June 25: Mizoram State Commission for Protection of Child Rights (MSCPCR) has demanded stringent punishment against a man, who was arrested recently in a case involving sexual assault of a minor and possession and circulation of child sexual abuse material

Speaking to reporters in Aizawl, MSCPCR chairperson Jimmy Laltlanmawia on Tuesday said that Lalrampana was arrested by CBI on June 9 for allegedly sexually assaulting a minor and uploading a video of the act online.

"MSCPCR expresses deep regret over the incident and demands stringent punishment against the accused," he said.

Jimmy said that the POCSO act strictly prohibits sexual assault against children and possession or sharing online of child sexual-related

Any violator can be convicted with an imprisonment of 5 years and a fine of up to ₹ 10 lakh and another 7 years imprisonment and ₹ 10 lakh fine for repeated offence, he said.

Expressing regret over incidents of child sexual abuse in Mizoram, Jimmy said that the commission want that such incidents do not occur He said that there are currently 194 under-trial cases under the

POCSO Act in various district courts across the state. The CBI had tracked the activities of Lalrampana using cyber intel-

ligence, forensic tools and international co-operation mechanisms. After registering the case on May 30, the CBI pin-pointed his location

and raided his premises in Aizawl on June 4 during which incriminated digital devices were seized. The agency alleged that the accused was creating, collecting, storing and uploading child sexual abuse material (CSAM), in violation of laws.

Subsequent forensic examination revealed a substantial cache of child abuse content, including graphic images and videos, a CBI spokesper-

These materials were corroborated with data from Interpol's International Child Sexual Exploitation (ICSE) database as well as Cyber Tipline Reports (CTRs) generated by Google and shared with the Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre (I4C), Ministry of Home Affairs, he

The analysis further uncovered that a minor had been threatened and sexually assaulted by the accused.

The case was detected suo motu by the CBI, as neither the victim nor the family had complained about the incident to any law enforcement agency prior to CBI's intervention, the CBI had said in a statement. (PTI)

Mizoram introduces e-office system to enhance digital governance

AIZAWL, June 25: The Mizoram government has joined other states in launching e-office system to enhance digital governance and streamline official functioning, a minister said on Wednesday.

Speaking to reporters at a press conference here, state Information and Communication Technology (ICT) minister Dr Vanlalthlana said that e-offices have been rolled out at the state secretariat on April

Initially, it was introduced as a pilot in four departments, including the school education department and PWD in the secretariat, it has now been adopted in all the 41 departments in the secretariat and the Chief Minister's Office, he said. After the secretariat, such offices will be intro-

duced in directorates and district offices, he said.

According to Vanlalthlana, initiatives have been taken since January 2024 to introduce e-office system in the state. He said the Centre's Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances sanctioned Rs

1.99 crore under the State Collaborative Initiative



scheme for opening e-offices. At least 6,492 files have been created so far

using the system, he said.

He said that it has enhanced governance as office files can now move at a faster pace and there are no more reports of missing files.

The minister said that the system has been effectively used by the chief minister, ministers, chief secretary, secretaries and senior officials as they can work outside offices through the virtual private network.

He said that the digital system will reduce the government's expenses as it will do away with paper works.

Vanlalthlana also said that the ICT Department currently is upgrading the domains and hosting of more than 300 government websites.

He expressed regret that many government websites could not be accessed due to the transfer of websites from the existing server host Ctrl-S Data Centre to a more secure Google Virtual Private Server (VPS).

He said that 23 department websites have so far been re-activated. (PTI)

When asked whether she has found such love in life, the actor said, "No one is there. No good guys. They exist only in films."


About working with Madhavan, Shaikh said she didn't want to let go off the opportunity to collaborate with the "Rehnaa Hai Terre Dil Mein" star.



IDEA OF EQUALITY IN 'SEE YOUR PRIME MINISTER ON SCREEN': WHAT LED TO A BAN ON **GULZAR'S** 'AANDHI' DURING **EMERGENCY**



NEW DELHI, June 25: "Aandhi" was running in theatres in 1975 when lyricist-filmmaker Gulzar, who was in Moscow to present it at a film festival, received the news about the movie being banned in India.

Set against the backdrop of elections, "Aandhi" is a love story between a hotel manager (Sanjeev Kumar) and his estranged wife, played by Suchitra Sen, who reconnects years later after she becomes a politician.

Author Saba Mahmood Bashir's 2019 "Gulzar's Aandhi: Insights into the Film" sheds light on the controversy around the movie and the political climate in the country during its release.

Many had noted the similarities between prime minister Indira Gandhi and Sen's characters, including the white streak of hair, the attire and the walk but the then I&B ministry, headed by IK Gujral, found nothing objectionable in it and the movie was released in theatres in February.

Then on June 25, 1975, Gandhi declared Emergency.

In July the same year, Gulzar was in Moscow to present the movie at a film festival and that's when he got to know that. It had been in theatres over 20 weeks at the time.

"He learnt that he would have to pull out of the show as the film had been banned in India. To be sure, it was a film magazine that had published a feature on 'Aandhi', with the headline, 全ee your Prime Minister on screen'." Bashir writes in the book.

The book also featured an interview with Gulzar, who spoke about how he rushed back to India after the ban.

"Sanjeev was also there with me. After we got back, J Om Prakashji (film's producer) tried very hard to have the ban lifted. We were already in the twenty-fourth week, so we decided to modify two scenes," the cinema veteran recalled. One of the new scenes that were in-

corporated featured Aarti Devi looking at a portrait of Indira Gandhi and calling her a "role model"

"They made us add that bit. They insisted. By then the movie was run-

ning in its twenty-third or twentyfourth week," he said.

Gulzar insisted that there was no similarity between the lead character and Indira Gandhi but he did borrow references from the late prime minister for Aarti Devi's personality traits and mannerisms.

"At the time, it was not Indira Gandhi's life story. But even today, there is no one like her, so she was the best persona to keep in mind. Accordingly, that was the reference one could offer to any actor - the way she used to walk, the way she used to descend a flight of stairs, the way she would come out of a helicopter.

"We used her traits in good taste not because the character was based on her or her life. But then things happened - the opposition parties remarked that Aarti Devi's character is shown to consume alcohol, and some decided to connect the two unrelated personalities," Gulzar said.

According to Gulzar, what added fuel to the fire were the advertisements and posters for the film.

In the book, Bashir wrote that it was baseless to debate whether "Aandhi" has been modelled on the life of Indira Gandhi but the similarities between the real and reel characters were quite striking.

"Both Aarti Devi and Mrs Gandhi had an estranged marriage. If stones were pelted at Aarti Devi at a rally, they were also pelted at Mrs Gandhi in 1967 at a rally near Bhubaneswar, Orissa. "It is this coincidence about the estranged marriage, and the fact that Feroze Gandhi too ran a hotel in Allahabad that led the critics and viewers to connect the dots and begin to believe that 'Aandhi' was the story of Indira Gandhi," she wrote.

Gulzar recalled that he went to Moscow at a later time where he met Gujral, who was serving as the Indian ambassador to the Soviet Union.

"Gujral sahib told me that it was Sanjay (Gandhi) who had not taken the controversy well. Otherwise, there was no objection from the others. I remember my reply too, that it was just one of those things which happens in a democracy." (PTI)

My conscience revolted at this dictatorial act: Dev Anand on Emergency crackdown, floating his own political party

NEW DELHI, June 25: After he "vehemently and vociferously" opposed to speak in favour of Youth Congress and its leader Sanjay Gandhi, Dev Anand said his movies were banned from being screened on television and mention of his name forbidden on official media.

The actor described the period of Emergency, which marks 50 years today, and the months after that in great detail in his 2007 memoir "Romancing with Life"

The matinee idol, known for movies such as "Baazi", "Taxi Driver", "Guide" and "Jewel Thief", said his troubles began after "a very charming young lady of the youth wing of the party" charmed him into attending a youth rally, led by Sanjay Gandhi

While in Delhi, the actor found his colleague Dilip

Kumar also there besides all the bigwigs of the party. "It clearly seemed a planned strategy to have Sanjay accepted by the masses at a time when the rule of law and all norms of fairplay and democratic functioning were stifled... "The Emergency had been declared for the sole purpose of keeping the ruling party in power and strengthening its hold on the country which had once boasted of being the largest democracy in the entire world," Dev Anand, who died at the age of

88 in 2011, wrote in the book. After the meeting, the actors were asked to say a few words about the Youth Congress and its leader on television.

"While Dilip also hesitated to go to the TV centre to participate in any propaganda in favour of the Emergency, I vehemently and vociferously opposed the suggestion, with the

result that not only were all my pictures banned from being screened on television, but also any mention of or reference to my name on an official media was forbidden, along with Kishore Kumar's, who had also refused to go and sing in one of their programmes.

"My conscience revolted at this dictatorial act, and I called the information and broadcasting minister in Delhi and sought an appointment with

V C Shukla, the then information and broadcasting minister, asked why Dev Anand was not cooperating in praising the government but the actor had his own set of questions for the minister, chief among them was: "'Are we living in a

democracy or in a police state? When Shukla said they were living in a democracy, then Dev Anand asked him why actors

Dev Anand wanted farmers and labourers, coolies and aristocrats, "all move around in cars, waving at each other in a spirit of bonhomie".

"And the intellectual elite would be in charge of running the country, showcasing the strengths of a new nation that would dazzle with prosperity and overflow with joy," he wrote.

But the initial enthusiasm of party members fizzled out to the great disappointment of the actor. (PTI)

BRING BACK KULDEEP, DROP SHARDUL FOR SECOND TEST: MANJREKAR

NEW DELHI, June 25: India must bring in left-arm wrist spinner Kuldeep Yadav and drop Shardul Thakur to address a bowling attack that looked woefully inadequate during the first Test against England, feels former India cricketer Sanjay Manjrekar.

While ace speedster Jasprit Bumrah picked up a five-wicket haul in the first innings at Headingley, the rest of the Indian pace unit -- comprising Mohammed Siraj, Prasidh Krishna and Thakur -- failed to provide meaningful

England chased down a steep fourth-innings target of 371 with five wickets in hand, exposing the lack of potency in India's bowling line-up. "Kuldeep Yadav has to come back. I'm sorry to say, but Shardul Thakur has to go out," Manjrekar said on 'Match Centre Live'. "That is one change India will have to make. As for Nitish Kumar Reddy -- I backed him for the first Test purely based on what he did in Australia.

"It's an unpopular choice, because when he comes in, the balance does get affected a bit. He won't quite bowl like a fourth seamer, so India need to take a

"This was a final-day pitch with rough patches for him to exploit. And while there were a couple of chances, we have to expect more from someone of his experience. "I felt he didn't use the rough nearly enough — especially against Ben Duckett. Against Ben Stokes, yes, he did make an effort. Two Americans fail doping tests in top Chinese basketball league

BEIJING, June 25: The Chinese Anti-Doping Agency has released the names of two American basketball players who failed in-competition tests in April during the domestic league.

In a statement released on Tuesday, the Chinese Basketball Association said it had been notified by the agency of doping violations involving Montrezl Dashay Harrell and Troy Akeem Gillenwater.

It said both players tested positive for Carboxy-THC and that both have given up the right to have their "B" samples tested. The CBA said it will impose penalties on the players once the anti-doping agency makes a final decision

Carboxy-THC is found in cannabis. The World Anti-Doping Agency bans all forms of psychoactive cannabinoids during in-competition periods.

Harrell, who was playing for the Xinjiang Flying Tigers at the time of the doping test on April 15, has been associated with four NBA teams. He played college basketball for the Louisville Cardinals, winning the Karl Malone Award in 2015 as a junior for being the top power forward in the US.

Gillenwater, who was playing for the Guangdong Southern Tigers when his test was conducted on April 16, graduated from New Mexico State in 2011. "The CBA firmly opposes any form of doping violations and maintains a zero tolerance stance on anti-doping efforts," a CBA statement said. "We are committed to safeguarding the integrity and fairness of basketball and will not tolerate any breaches of anti-doping rules." (AP)

Players and fans at the Club World Cup are coping with high temperatures as a heat wave hits US

WASHINGTON, June 25: Substitutes who watch from the locker room, abandoned practice sessions and sweat-soaked jerseys. A heat wave hitting a wide swath of the country is taking a toll on players at the FIFA Club World Cup.

The grueling conditions could also be a preview of what's to come next summer when the United States, Canada and Mexico host soccer's premier event, the 2026 World Cup.

"It's impossible, it's terribly hot. My toes were sore, even my toenails were hurting, I couldn't stop or start. In the end, it's incredible, but since it's the same for everyone, there's no excuse," Atlético's Marcos Llorente said following a match against Paris Saint-Germain. A "heat dome" of high pressure has settled in over the central and eastern United States, sending temperatures soaring into the 90s in Fahrenheit and above in many

That's rough on both Club World Cup players and fans, who can potentially experience dehydration and cramps, or more serious conditions like heat exhaustion and heat

"In Europe it's more of a dry heat and this is more of a humid heat. I think it's going to hit them twice as hard," fan Tyler Fernando said before Bayern Munich's match against Benfica on Tuesday in Charlotte, North Carolina, where the temperature was 97 degrees Fahrenheit (36 Celsius) at game time.

Those at the Auckland City match against Boca Juniors in Nashville on Tuesday braved temperatures in the upper 90s. Male spectators went shirtless and fans sought sections where there was shade

Heat is of particular concern during big tournaments like the Club World Cup because the players

don't have much time off to recover between games. And in the group stages, matches are usually staggered each day, meaning some teams play in the midday sun. Chelsea cut short a practice ses-

sion in Philadelphia, where temperatures reached the 90s. "I always try to avoid excuse, I always try to be honest. It's not

about excuses, it's about reality. It's an excuse when it's not hot, and we say it's hot. That's an excuse. But if it's hot, it's hot. But we are here, and we're trying to do our best," Chelsea coach Enzo Maresca said. During a match between Borus-

sia Dortmund and the Mamelodi Sundowns, Dortmond posted on social media: "Our subs watched the first half from inside the locker room to avoid the blazing sun at TOL Stadium — never seen that before, but in this heat, it absolutely makes sense.

"We always think about how we



can help the team, how we can minimize a negative influence. And it was just very, very hot. We had cooling sticks in order to cool the players down. We had them waiting in the dressing room with the air conditioning," Dortmond coach Niko Kovac said through an interpreter. "This was very important for all of us. It's not only about tactics,

load, minimizing the stress. The stress is already high enough."

FIFA guidelines mandate breaks when the Wet Bulb Globe Temperature - a composite of factors including temperature and humidity — reaches 89.6 degrees. The breaks usually occur around the 30th and

Cooling breaks were initially used at the 2008 Olympic final between Lionel Messi's Argentina and Nigeria at Beijing's National Stadium, where the on-field temperature reached 107 degrees.

But at the time, such breaks were rare. They became more commonplace following the 2014 World Cup in Brazil, where a Brazilian labor court ordered hydration breaks when the Wet Bulb Globe Temperature reached 89.6 degrees.

Miami-Dade Fire Rescue went to social media to urge Club World Cup fans to exercise caution in the heat before Inter Miami's match against Palmeiras on Monday night, and Chelsea posted "heat mitigation" guidelines on its official website before the Blues' match against Esperance on Tuesday. It's not just high temperatures that can impact summer tournaments: Five Club World Cup matches have been delayed by thunderstorms.

The climate is going to be an increasing issue for FIFA as global temperatures rise. Sixteen cities will host World Cup games next year. Five of the stadiums that will be used have roofs to provide some sun protection.

At Mexico's venues, Mexico City and Guadalajara could be impacted by the summer's hurricane season, and in Monterrey, summer temperatures average in the 90s.

After the the 2026 World Cup, the 2030 edition will be held in Morocco, Spain, and Portugal. And the problem isn't just on the men's side: The 2027 Women's World Cup is

set to be played in Brazil. Peter Crisp from Fossil Free Football said: "Scheduling matches in no-shade stadiums in the middle of the day and promoting oil-dependent sponsors shows FIFA is dangerously out of touch with the threat extreme heat poses to its major summer tournaments." (AP)

India lost the opening Test despite five of their batters scoring centuries, as England chased down 371 in the fourth innings to take a 1-0 lead in It was baptism of fire for Gill in his first Test as skipper since succeed-

ing the now-retired Rohit Sharma, and Hussain said the youngster was "reactive rather than proactive" as a leader. "I saw someone finding his way. He (Gill) didn't quite have that onfield aura of Rohit and (Virat Kohli). I thought he followed the ball a lot

and was reactive rather than proactive," Hussain said on Sky Sports. "When Rohit and Kohli captained, you looked down and you immediately knew who was in charge but when I looked down in this game I saw two or three captains, captaincy by committee," Hussain said, alluding to Gill not taking complete control of the team.

Hussain, however, said India lost the match because of two things Gill couldn't control -- drop catches and batting collapses.

"The collapses concern me. In India they have had spin-bowling allrounders that are magnificent - Ravi Ashwin, Ravindra Jadeja, Axar Patel - but in England they are still looking for a seam-bowling all-rounder who can bat.

"If they keep going 6-31 and 7-41 this could be a quick series," said the 57-year-old who played 96 Tests between 1990 and 2004. Former India coach Ravi Shastri, however, feels that Gill has done "more than can be asked of him."

"There is a big role for the coaching staff to take the positives. As a captain, Gill has done more than can be asked of him.

"He got a hundred in his first Test in charge and the dropped catches (and collapses) are not in his control." Gill scored 147 in India's first innings total of 471 and 8 in the second

"This will be a tough pill for India to swallow. You don't get in positions like this very often and blow it from there. They had a chance to

take England out of the contest and dictate terms. "They have to learn and they need more bottle from the tail, for them to be stubborn and put a price tag on their wicket," added Shastri. The former India all-rounder also said that strike bowler Jasprit Bum-

rah should play in the second Test starting on July 2 in Birmingham "If he was looking at a rest you may have to think twice. If you don't

have him and then go 2-0 down it could be an uphill task." Bumrah, who took five wickets in England's first innings, only plans to play three of the five Tests in order to manage his workload after a recent back injury.

Former England fast bowler Stuart Broad also felt that India had opportunities to win the Test but wasted them.

"It's a wonderful feeling when you win a Test match like that, when in

reality India had so many opportunities to put this game to bed. "But England just scrapped and fought hard ... It was a sensational run chase. Duckett was absolutely outstanding. It's just incredible how this team keeps doing this." (PTI)

Gill didn't quite have that We need to give them time: Gambhir Rishabh Pant reaches careeron India's mis-firing pace attack

LEEDS, June 25: The lack of depth in India's bowling resources was exposed during the opening Test defeat to England but head coach Gautam Gambhir has urged critics to give the inexperienced pace attack more time in its "early days".

Barring Jasprit Bumrah, who got five wickets in England's first innings, none of the other bowlers looked penetrative as the hosts chased down a target of 371 with minimum fuss on the fifth and final day of the

match on Tuesday. The pace trio of Prasidh Krishna, Mohammed Siraj and Shardul Thakur was not consistent enough with the line and length.

"We will have to give them time. Earlier, we used to have four fast bowlers in the squad with an experience of more than 40 Tests. It doesn't make such a big impact in one-day or T20 matches, but when you go to Australia, England, or South Africa for Tests, experience matters," said Gambhir following the loss.

"These are early days. If we start judging our bowlers after every Test, how will we develop a bowling attack? Outside Bumrah and Siraj, we don't have that much experience, but they (the others) have quality, which is why they are in this

"But we have got to keep backing them because it's not about one tour. It's about building a fast-bowler battery that can serve India for a long time in Test

Also part of the squad, Arshdeep Singh is yet to a play a Test while Harshit Rana has featured in only two games.

He felt that Prasidh, who got five wickets in the match despite going for plenty of runs, has "all the ingredients of becoming a very good Test match

He also defended Shardul Thakur, who just bowled 16 overs in the entire match with only six overs in the

"Sometimes captain goes with his instincts and

Ravindra Jadeja gave us control in the first innings, that was important and we could rotate our three pacers at the other end," he said.

"We know what is Shardul's quality and that is why he is playing for India and is in the dressing room. Just because he is the fourth seamer does not necessarily mean that he has to be brought ahead of a spinner. A captain went by his instinct and depending on surface, ve were playing.'

Two late batting collapses in as many innings cost India dearly in the series opener.

They were on course to amass 600 in their first innings but ended up with 471, losing seven wickets for 41 runs. In the second innings, the visitors lost six for 31 to allow England to come back in the game once again

"First of all, I'll tell you it's not that they were not applying themselves," Gambhir said of the tail.

"Sometimes people fail, and that's okay. I know it is disappointing and more importantly, I think they are more disappointed than anyone. Because they knew that we had the opportunity. If we

had got up to 570, 580 in the first innings, we could have dominated from there.

"It's not that they're not working hard in the nets as well. Sometimes these things happen, even the pure batters fail as well. So hopefully they got to learn and hopefully we can have better performances from our tail, and that is not the only reason why we lost the Test match, to be honest."

Shubman Gill scored a century on his captaincy debut. On leadership front, Gambhir said Gill is only going to get better.

"Look, first Test match, obviously, there are nerves. Not many people get that opportunity, and he was phenomenal. More importantly, I think the way he batted in the first innings. I'm sure he would have had his own nerves being the captain for the first time and then getting the hundred...

"He has everything that it takes for him to be a successful captain, but we have got to just give him time. It's still very early days," Gambhir added. (PTI)

high 7th in ICC Test rankings



DUBAI, June 25: India's swashbuckling wicketkeeper Rishabh Pant reached a career-high seventh in the latest ICC Test rankings for batters on Wednesday, following his twin centuries in the series-opener against England in Leeds. India's new Test captain Shubman Gill jumped five rungs to 20th over-

all following his century in the first innings of the match that his team lost by five wickets despite setting England a stiff target of 371. Pant, who became only the second wicketkeeper to hit two hundreds

in the same match during the first Test of the five-match series, climbed one spot in the list. Before the 27-year-old Pant joined him, Zimbabwe's Andy Flower re-

mained the sole stumper with two centuries in the same Test match. Pant struck 134 and 118 in the thrilling Leeds Test that England won by five wickets.

There was little change in the rankings for Test bowlers, with India's

pace spearhead Jasprit Bumrah maintaining his place at the top of charts following yet another five-wicket haul in the Headingley Test. Meanwhile, Ben Duckett, who was adjudged Player of the Match for

his scores of 62 and 149 in England's victory, jumped five places to eighth in the rankings. Duckett's teammates Ollie Pope (up three spots to 19th) and Jamie

Smith (up eighth places to 27th) also made significant gains. England veteran Joe Root remained the No.1 ranked Test batter, with teammate Harry Brook his closest challenger.

England skipper Ben Stokes gained three places to move up to fifth in the list for Test all-rounders following solid contributions with both bat and ball across the same game.

The drawn first Test between Sri Lanka and Bangladesh saw a host of their players make some inroads in the latest batters' rankings. Mushfiqur Rahim led the way, following his innings of 163 in Galle.

Rahim gained 11 spots to move to 28th for Test batters, while teammate Najmul Hossain Shanto jumps a whopping 21 places to improve to 29th on the same list after he scored a pair of tons in the same match. (PTI)

Knocking Indian tail quickly twice was among the pivotal moments: Ben Stokes

order heroics, England captain Ben Stokes has credited his bowlers' ruthless dismantling of India's lower-order, twice in the match, as a "pivotal factor" in their fivewicket win at Headingley

While openers Ben Duckett and Zak Crawley earned praise for their 188-run stand in a record fourth-innings chase of 371, Stokes stressed that the match had swung much earlier when England's bowlers prevented India from posting a total that might have been unchaseable."It was obviously a very good wicket for batting on, the high scores have shown that," Stokes said at the post-match media interaction.

"But some other pivotal moments in the game, obviously there will be people who get the headlines here, but the way in which we were able to knock the Indian tail over very quickly on two occasions was also a massive reason to why we were able to restrict them to a score that we definitely felt comfortable to be able to chase...

"...we didn't allow it to get above 450-500, which India could easily have done." I think as well as skill, there's been a huge contribution of our attitude and commitment to what we needed to do every single day and every single session," he said.

India appeared in complete control through large passages of the match, headlined by five individual centuries across both But a sudden collapse saw them lose their

last six wickets for 41 runs, folding for 471

in the first innings. The pattern repeated it-

self in the second innings with the last six

wickets falling for 34 runs. "Chasing 370 (371) like we were, you al-

ways want to get off to a good start. The least amount of wickets that you lose early on is obviously crucial, but the way he (Duckett) went about it with Zak and then played the game at the top of that order for us was huge in particular," said Stokes.

"The way that Zak played as well was huge. They complement each other so, so well. Left hand, right hand, one's a giant, one's not. So it's very hard for the bowlers to settle in when they both get going. I'm sure you can ask the opposition. "It can be a nightmare when they're in for a long period of time. Ducky's got the 149, but I think that 70 (65) as well was so, so important."

Duckett's dominance against Ravindra

Jadeja on the final day, especially his fearless reverse sweeps from the rough, caught the eye of many including Stokes.

"I actually spoke to him when we came off for that tea break, or rain break, whichever one it was. He's one of the best in the world at doing reverse sweeps and he's a fantastic player of spin, in particular on really tricky surfaces," said the skipper. Stokes said he sought Duckett's advice to

see his options against spin. "I just had a little word with him about

what he thought I could potentially look at to give myself a better chance. When you're in there, you feel like you're either getting forward or getting back and trying to manipulate on the leg side. "Just going in with a clear game and reverse sweeps was some-

thing I went out there with. Yeah, it's a difficult condition, but again, just going back to being clear and confident in what I needed to do to try and knock those men (close-in fielders) off."

This chase marked the sixth time under the Stokes-Brendon McCullum leadership that England had hauled in targets of 250 or more in the fourth innings.

Stokes attributed the team's consistency in such high-pressure pursuits to a shared philosophy of keeping things "simple and calm." "When you're chasing down totals like that, how you are in the dressing room is actually very important. Keeping the sort of calm, relaxed vibe as much as we can throughout the dressing room is so important to sort of the mindset of how someone is to go out there when you're out there in the middle with the pressures of that situation in

"It was pretty simple yesterday. It was if we bat the overs that is left in this game, we will win this game just because of how quick this ground is at scoring.

"I don't know what I've read, but it's probably been over four an over (scoring rate) anyway without any team really doing anything... barring Rishabh (Pant). It's just a very, very quick scoring ground.

On the debatable decision to bowl first, he added: "The wicket here on day one looked like there was a bit of grass on top of it. There was a bit of moisture underneath it.

"We backed ourselves to win that toss and bowl first, and try and strike a couple of early poles. But the opposition is allowed to play well." (PTI)
