

Leasing of 3.5 acres of land to Global Health Ltd (Medanta) for healthcare facility gets nod

GUWAHATI, July 18: The Assam Cabinet, in a meeting chaired by Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Friday, approved a series of key decisions aimed at improving public infrastructure, streamlining land use policies, and extending welfare benefits.

The decisions were conveyed in an official statement issued after the meeting

One of the major approvals was for the construction of teachers' guarters and students' hostels at the Assam Medical College and Hospital (AMCH), Dibrugarh.

The project, covering a total built-up area of 85,509 square metres, has been sanctioned at a cost of ₹357.28 crore.

It aims to enhance campus facilities and includes the construction of residences for faculty, gazetted and Grade-III staff, nursing staff,

the principal, vice-principal and medical superintendent.

Hostels for MBBS and postgraduate students of both genders, a dining block, a GNM hostel for female students, and a community hall are also part of the development.

The Cabinet also approved land settlement under 'Mission Basundhara 3.0' through a digital allotment system for non-individual juridical entities.

In a separate decision, the Cabinet allowed land settlement to Dinesh Buragohain and 11 others in Kamolabaria mouza under the North Lakhimpur Revenue Circle. Each beneficiary was allotted

land measuring 1 katha and 5 lechas, and the government waived the applicable settlement premium. In a move reflecting the state's

plementation. To streamline land availability for hydrocarbon exploration and production, the Cabinet decided to exempt such activities from the

purview of the Assam Regulation of Reclassification and Reclassification cum Transfer of Lands Act, 2015. The exemption will apply subject to the payment of applicable premiums. The decision is expected to facilitate operations by companies such as Oil India Limited, ONGC and other entities authorised by the Centre.

# Cong duo 'encouraged' evicted people: Himanta

GUWAHATI, July 18: Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma has said police will "not hesitate" to take action against Congress leaders Mallikarjun Kharge and Rahul Gandhi if it finds that their speeches had instigated encroachers to attack security forces in Paikan Reserve Forest on Thursday. Sarma also maintained that the opposition party was preparing to fight next year's state polls with a single-point agenda of putting him behind bars.

Talking to reporters after attending a party meeting late on Thursday evening, Sarma said, "Kharge and Gandhi visiting Assam is not the question. But in their meeting, they openly encouraged the encroachers and land jihadis to encroach government land."

Congress president Kharge and Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Gandhi had visited the state on Wednesday, during which they had held a closed-door discussion with top state party functionaries here and later addressed party workers at Chaygaon, 40 km from Guwahati. The chief minister claimed that the speeches by the two lead-"encouraged and ened" encroachers, who allegedly attacked security forces in Paikan Reserve Forest in Goalpara on Thursday morning and in clashes that followed, one civilian was killed and 20 others, including policemen, (CONTD. DIPHU, July 18: Chief Executive Member of Karbi Anglong Autonomous Council (KAAC) Tuliram Ronghang and MP Amarsing Tisso flagged off the inaugural stoppage of the Rajdhani Express at Diphu Railway

Station late on Thursday, marking the resumption of the halt discontinued since the COVID-19 pandemic. CEM Ronghang expressed gratitude

Briefing the media, Tisso said he had personally met the Prime Minister, the Railway Minister, the Assam Chief Minister, and the CEM of KAAC, and thanked all Northeast MPs for their support in facilitating the Rajdhani stoppage.

Sarma alleges 'designed encroachment' by US designation of TRF 'timely and important' step: India outsiders, vows crackdown across Assam

GUWAHATI, July 18: Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Friday claimed that people from as far as Manipur are coming to encroach land in the state, and affirmed his government's commitment to clear all areas under illegal possession, including forest land.

He also maintained that there is a 'design' in these encroachments, where a handful of people first migrate to an area, start cultivation and soon bring others to start a major illegal settlement.

"In Lakhimpur, where we recently conducted an eviction drive, we found people from Manipur. Today, 12 families from Manipur and Nagaon (in Assam) had reached there. Perhaps, they were asked to come by the encroachers earlier, but they didn't know that eviction had taken place in the meantime," Sarma said at a press conference here. The district commissioner will send back these families, he added.

Sarma said that though many encroachers claim to be from Goalpara and neighbouring districts during eviction drives, they could be from West Bengal or even Bangladesh originally.

"Earlier, there was no system of stopping Bangladeshis from entering. Now we are keeping a strict vigil. Just yesterday, we caught 16 illegal Bangladeshis. It is possible that many of these encroachers were brought from Bangladesh," he said. He said the reason behind the suspicion that the encroachers are not from districts within the state is that most of them 'vanish' within 30-45 days.

The chief minister said there is a 'pattern' in which the encroachment is started.

Citing an example of Lumding, where his government had carried out an eviction drive earlier, Sarma said, "We found large tracts of ginger cultivation. First, a few people come to an area and earmark it. Then they bring in more people and start cultivation."

A similar pattern of undertaking betel nut cultivation in Urianghat in Golaghat district, or rubber plantation in Sribhumi and Hailakandi districts have been observed, he said.

Noting that the government is preparing for an eviction drive in Uriamghat, Sarma said it will take fourfive months as legal procedures have to be followed and in this case, Nagaland also has to be informed as it is along the inter-state border.

He said in Uriamghat, thousands of bighas of land have been encroached, with about 500 families taking over an entire forest. Mostly from Dhing and Lahorighat areas in central Assam, each encroacher family has grabbed 300-500 bighas of land there and undertaken betel nut cultivation. (CONTD. ON PAGE-2)

# Monsoon rains 9 pc above normal but northeast, south India reel under shortfall

Uneven distribution raises concern for agriculture despite overall surplus

NEW DELHI, July 18: India has received nine per cent more rainfall than normal so far this monsoon season, but the rain has not been evenly spread across the country

While some states like Jharkhand, Rajasthan and Ladakh received much more rain than usual. several others, especially in the northeast and southern parts, are facing a big shortage, according to data from the India Meteorological Department (IMD).

Between June 1 and July 16, the country received 331.9 mm of rain, which is about 9 per cent more than the normal rainfall of 304.2 mm for this period.

But this average hides the largescale spatial variation. Jharkhand received 71 per cent more rain than normal, with 595.8 mm rainfall compared to its usual 348.9 mm. Rajasthan saw a huge increase too -- 271.9 mm rainfall against a normal of 125.6 mm, which is 116 per cent more than usual.



Ladakh, which usually gets very little rain, received 15.8 mm compared to a normal of 8 mm which is 97 per cent above normal. These three have been classified as receiving "large excess" rainfall. Five other states and Union territories recorded "excess" rainfall, meaning 20 to 59 per cent more than normal. These are Haryana,

Odisha, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat and Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu

For example, Madhva Pradesh received 470.6 mm rain against a normal of 281.3 mm which is 67 per cent more than usual. Gujarat got 388 mm of rainfall, which is 64 per cent more than normal. Many states and Union territories have seen normal rainfall, which means rainfall was within 19 per cent above or below the normal range.

#### **Drought-like situation** in 5 western Assam districts: Himanta

GUWAHATI, July 18: Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Friday said there is a drought-like situation in five districts in the western part of the state.

He said the cabinet has in principle approved notifying the affected districts, and the revenue department will formally declare the drought-like situation.

"According to data from the meteorological department and groundwater commission, there is less-than-normal rainfall in five districts of western Assam," Sarma said, addressing a press conference after chairing a meeting of the council of ministers.

Sarma said these districts have received 40-per cent deficient rainfall, and farmers who had insured their crops under the Fasal Bima Yojana will be eligible for compensation as per the guidelines.

A few other districts of Assam have also received less rainfall so far this year, and paddy output could be hit if it continues in July-August, he said.

Asked if tea production got impacted, too, Sarma said it has not been affected yet though it could face difficulty if rains are not adequate. Among other decisions taken at the cabinet meet was approval for a major project for Assam Medical College and Hospital (AMCH), Dibrugarh, on its platinum jubilee year.

The project will include construction of quarters and hostels for faculty members, students and nurses. "The tender process has already been completed and the foundation will be laid within 10-15 days," Sarma said. He said under 'Mission Basundhara 3.0', the cabinet approved land rights for more (CONTD. ON PAGE-2)

# Reliance Industries Q1 profit jumps 78 pc to ₹ 26,994 cr on better show by consumer businesses

NEW DELHI, July 18: India's most valuable company Reliance Industries on Friday reported its highest-ever quarterly profit of ₹ 26,994 crore for the April-June quarter, reflecting a growth of 78.3 per cent over the year-ago period, driven by consumer businesses and investment sales.

The oil-to-retail-to-telecom conglomerate's consolidated net profit attributable to owners of the company stood at ₹ 26,994 crore, or ₹ 19.95 per share, in April-June 2025 compared to ₹ 15,138 crore earnings in the year-ago period, according to an exchange filing.

The net profit was also 39 per cent higher quarter-on-quarter when compared to ₹ 19,407 crore earnings in the preceding three months ended on March 31.

Revenue from operations was up by 5.26 per cent to ₹ 2.48 lakh crore in the first quarter of 2025-26 compared to ₹ 2.36 lakh crore in the year-ago period.

Other income includes ₹ 8,924 crore, being proceeds of profit from the sale of listed investments, the company stated in the filing. Billionaire Mukesh Ambani-led

company continued to post an



uptick in its consumer businesses -retail and telecom.

While Jio was helped by a rise in consumer base, the retail business delivered steady performance due to an increase in footfalls at its expanded store network.

The mainstay oil refining and petrochemicals business, called O2C, posted a 1.5 per cent decline Y-o-Y due to a fall in crude oil prices and lower volumes on account of the planned shutdown. Segment revenues were supported by increased domestic placement of transportation fuels through Jio-bp, a company state-

ment said. RIL Chairman and Managing Director Mukesh Ambani said that Reliance has begun FY26 with a robust all-around operational and

financial performance. "Consolidated EBITDA for the first quarter of FY26 improved strongly from the year-ago period,

despite significant volatility in global macros. During the quarter, energy markets encountered heightened uncertainty, with sharp fluctuations in crude prices. Our O2C business delivered strong growth, with thrust on domestic demand fulfillment and offering

value-added solutions through the Jio-bp network. Performance was supported by improvement in fuel and downstream product margins,' Ambani said.

Jio Platforms, the digital services business, posted a 25 per cent rise in net profit to ₹7,110 crore in the first quarter. Its consumer base rose to 498.1 million at June end from 488.2 million at March end, and average per user revenue (ARPU) increased to ₹ 208.8 from ₹206.2

Jio Platforms' gross revenue climbed 19 per cent year-on-year (YoY) to ₹ 41,054 crore in Q1 FY26, according to the earnings statement released by parent Reliance Industries. Reliance Industries noted that Jio has scaled newer heights during the quarter, including crossing 200 million 5G subscribers and 20 million home connections.

"Jio AirFiber is now the largest FWA (Fixed Wireless Access) service provider in the world, with a base of 7.4 million subscribers. Our Digital Services business consolidated its market position with a robust financial and operational performance," Ambani said. (PTI)

The Cabinet also approved the inclusion of willing employees and dependents of the Assam Power Distribution Corporation Ltd (APDCL), Assam Electricity Grid Corporation Ltd (AEGCL), Assam Power Generation Corporation Ltd (APGCL) and Adarsh Vidyalayas under the Ayushman Asom-Mukhya Mantri Lok Sevak Arogya Yojana (AA-MMLSAY) on a voluntary basis.

Registered employees who pay the monthly subscription will be eligible to claim medical reimbursements from the month of registration, with inclusion under the scheme's cashless module after one year.

Further, the Cabinet sanctioned long-term leases of government land for various healthcare and hospitality projects under the Advantage Assam 2.0 initiative. Global Health Ltd (Medanta) will receive 3.5 acres for an advanced healthcare facility, Lineage Healthcare Ltd will receive 1 acre to develop women and child healthcare infrastructure, and RJ Corp Ltd will be allotted 1.75 acres for setting up a hotel.

The projects are also eligible for incentives under the state's Investment and Industrial Policy, 2019. In view of the severe drought-like conditions prevailing in parts of Assam, the Cabinet has identified the situation as a state-specific disaster. It has accorded in-principle approval to extend compensation benefits to affected beneficiaries in selected districts as per norms under the State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF).

One alleged encroacher was killed and more than 20 others, including policemen, were injured in a clash between evicted people and security personnel in Paikan Reserve Forest in Goalpara district on Thursday. The eviction drive carried out on July 12 to clear encroachment on around 135 hectares in the Reserve Forest under Krishnai Range had affected 1,080 families, and the evicted people were mostly Bengali-speaking Muslims.

The chief minister said Paikan is 'empty now' and added, "They won't come there again. After a point, they don't return, I know from experience."

He said 40-50 families were staying in temporary shelters even after the eviction drive, with the authorities also not pushing him out immediately as they had assured him of leaving the area soon.

Reiterating his accusation against Congress leader Rahul Gandhi of emboldening the encroachers through his speech during his Assam visit on Wednesday, Sarma said, "People from Goalpara had come for Gandhi's meeting. later, they went to Paikan at night and instigated the people, who attacked the forest guards and police the next day." "Police are looking into whether there was any impact of Kharge and Gandhi's provocative speeches. After all, one person died," he added. Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge had accompanied Gandhi during the day-long visit. (PTI)

Showing a video of the cultivations, Sarma said, "The Myanmar 'supari' (dried betel nut) comes up to Uriamghat. Here it is mixed with some local supari and then passed off as local produce." Asked on action against officials who allowed such encroachment, he said, "I am told three forest rangers were there and they were the same as these people. I will take action, that's why I am the chief minister."

He added that not just officials, but also local politicians, don't do anything about the illegal settlements once the population reaches 5,000-10,000 as it becomes a vote bank. The chief minister had said on Tuesday that 1,19,548 bighas (160 sq km) of land have been cleared of encroachment since his government took over in May 2021, affecting about 50,000 people. He added that another 63 lakh bighas, including 29 lakh bighas of forest land, are still under encroachment in the state.

He had claimed that the alleged encroachers are people of 'one religion' and said the indigenous communities of the state are facing 'invasion' from these people. Though Sarma did not specify, most of the evicted people are Bengali-speaking Muslims. (PTI)

# Sensex tanks 501 pts, Nifty closes below 25k on selling in bank stocks, foreign fund outflows

MUMBAI, July 18: Benchmark Sensex tanked 501 points while Nifty closed below the 25,000 mark on Friday due to selling in banking shares after muted quarterly earnings and foreign fund outflows.

Falling for the second straight day, the 30share BSE Sensex declined by 501.51 points or 0.61 per cent to settle at 81,757.73. During the day, it shed 651.11 points or 0.79 per cent to hit a low of 81,608.13.

The 50-share NSE Nifty dropped 143.05 points or 0.57 per cent to close at a month's low of 24.968.40

Analysts said investors turned cautious over banking stocks in response to Axis Bank's latest financial results, which fell short of market expectations.

Among Sensex firms, Axis Bank tumbled the most by 5.24 per cent after it reported a 3 per cent dip in its June quarter consolidated net profit at ₹ 6,243.72 crore, impacted by the implementation of changes in non-performing assets and loan upgrade policy.

Devarsh Vakil, Head of Prime Research, HDFC Securities, said Axis Bank's latest financial results fell short of market expectations.

"Notably, Axis Bank's GDR tumbled 4.8 per cent to USD 64.30 on Thursday, following a deterioration in the bank's asset quality during the June quarter," he said.

Among blue-chip bank stocks, Axis Bank, HDFC Bank, Kotak Mahindra Bank and State Bank of India ended lower.

Following the decline in bank stocks, the

floaded equities worth ₹ 3,694.31 crore on Thursday, according to exchange data.

"A broad-based sell-off was observed amidst a disappointing initial set of earnings from the finance and IT sectors. Elevated valuations in large-cap stocks, coupled with significant net short positions held by FIIs, have contributed to a cautious sentiment among investors," Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Investments Limited, said.

"Additional tariff threats are also casting a shadow on India over its trade relationship with Russia. Despite these pressures, the mediumto-long-term outlook for India remains optimistic, supported by low inflation levels and proactive monetary authority committed to sustaining economic growth," Nair added.

The BSE smallcap gauge declined 0.64 per cent and midcap index dipped 0.62 per cent. Among BSE sectoral indices, capital goods dropped 1.50 per cent, followed by bankex (1.33 per cent), industrials (1.08 per cent), telecommunication (0.99 per cent), power (0.90 per cent) and consumer durables (0.90 per cent)

Metal, services and BSE Focused IT ended higher.

On the weekly front, the BSE benchmark tumbled 742.74 points or 0.90 per cent, and the Nifty declined by 181.45 points or 0.72 per cent

#### Floods and heavy rain have claimed 105 lives in the state so far. In May, the IMD had forecast that India is likely to receive 106 per cent of the long-period average rainfall of 87 cm during the June-September monsoon season. Rainfall between 96 and 104 per cent of this 50-year average is considered 'normal'.

Above-normal rainfall is expected in most parts of the country, except Ladakh, adjoining areas of Himachal Pradesh, the northeast and some parts of Bihar, Jharkhand, West Bengal and Odisha. Some isolated areas in Punjab, Haryana, Kerala and Tamil Nadu may record below-normal rainfall. The monsoon is crucial for India's agriculture sector, which supports the livelihood of around 42 per cent of the population and contributes 18.2 per cent to the GDP. "There are about 17,000 more such applications pending at the district-level and those will be cleared by July 31. From August, we will start distribution of the land 'pattas'," the chief minister said. He said the cabinet also cleared land allotment for 12 families, which were affected in an eviction drive on

government land in Lakhimpur district, and they will be exempted from paying any premium. For oil exploration projects undertaken by companies such as OIL, ONGC and similar entities, it was decided that the state government shall not initiate acquisition of land by default.

Oil exploration companies, central/state-owned or private sector agencies duly authorised by the central government have been permitted to purchase or lease the required land directly from landowners through negotiated settlement, as per prevailing market rates and applicable guidelines. An online portal shall be developed and hosted by the revenue department for facilitating hydrocarbon companies to apply for auto-reclassification of land and for making payment of premium at rates as applicable, Sarma said.

The cabinet has also approved notifying exemption of hydrocarbon exploration and production activities from the purview of 'The Assam Regulation of Reclassification and Reclassification cum Transfer of Lands Act, 2015', subject to the payment of the applicable premium.

This will streamline the process of land availability for hydrocarbon exploration and production activities in the state, and also expedite strategic hydrocarbon projects, generate premium revenue for the state, strengthen national energy security while promoting ease-of-doing-business, he said.

Sarma said the cabinet gave the nod for allotment of land in Sarusajai area of the city for a ₹ 800-crore hospital, the MoU for which was signed in Advantage Assam 2.0. Along with the hospital on the front side of the plot, a five-star hotel will also be built in the other part, a move that will promote medical tourism and create 2,700 jobs, the CM said. (PTI)

# Assam rolls out cashless treatment scheme for road accident victims

KHERONI, July 18: In a major step towards ensuring timely medical care for road accident victims, the Government of Assam has launched the "Cashless Treatment of Road Accident Victims Scheme-2025," in line with the guidelines of the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH).

The scheme provides cashless treatment of up to ₹1.5 lakh per victim for the first seven days following a motor vehicle accident.

According to a government notification dated June 14, 2025, all Deputy Commissioners have been directed to implement the scheme in their respective districts.

They have also been instructed to integrate the Transaction Management System (TMS) and Public Financial Management System (PFMS), open dedicated bank accounts with the Reserve Bank of idia, and submit necessary data in the prescribed format on a priority basis. The scheme is supported by the e-Detailed Accident Report (e-DAR), a digital platform developed by MoRTH under the Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PM-JAY), to streamline implementation

Gogoi claimed the evictions were aimed at raising election funds and were being first carried out in minority-dominated areas, before targeting tribal regions, particularly those inhabited by Ahom settlers.

He said around 55,000 bighas of land were planned to be transferred to corporate groups and demanded that evicted land should instead be allocated to landless people. He also urged the Chief Minister to follow Supreme Court guide-

The party further demanded that if any Bangladeshi citizens were among the evicted, they should be handed over to the Government of

Bangladesh. The CPI's memorandum highlighted the issue of unemployment, stating that over 36 lakh educated youth remain jobless in Assam and accused the state government of lacking any concrete employment

policy. The party accused the BJP of building its organisational strength from the grassroots level by raising corporate funds, influencing constitutional institutions like the Election Commission, CBI, and ED, and using administrative and propaganda machinery to its advantage.

It called upon opposition parties to unite and mount a street-level ernment for allegedly obstructing dialogue with ULFA (I) by attacking its camps in Myanmar and demanded that the insurgency issue be treated as a political problem rather than a law and order issue.

Among other demands, the CPI called for granting tribal status under Article 371(Å) to six ethnic groups, improving the state's irrigation infrastructure to enable multi-crop farming, and conducting a high-level probe into the alleged cattle theft and sale scam at Garukhuti.

## Woo-Christian policy in Kerala

he Bharatiya Janata Party's much-hyped political strategy to woo the Christian population in Kerala has fallen flat in the face of strong opposition from within the community. That the opportunistic strategy has not been to the liking of the community was clear from the very beginning. The latest manifestation of Christian anger against it came from the result of the recently-held by-election to the Nilambur Assembly constituency. The BJP had fielded a Christian candidate with an eye on the community vote in the constituency. But the strategy failed dismally with the party's vote share actually registering a steep decline! In the wake of the poor show of the BJP candidate who lost his deposit, the party's state leadership came in for stringent criticism from within the party. BJP state president Rajiv Chandrashekhar and other top leaders who crafted the strategy had to bear the brunt of the criticism in the meeting held to review the result. The BJP had formulated the Christian-wooing strategy mainly with an eye on the local bodies election to be held later this year and the crucial Assembly elections due next year. That it won't produce the desired results is evident from the strong undercurrent of the community's anger against the BJP as was evident from the voting pattern in Nilambur.

The resentment among the Christians against the BJP found powerful expression in an editorial in Deepika daily, the mouthpiece of the Christian church in Kerala. The editorial of July 14 has gone hammer and tongs against the BJP's double standards in hunting with the hunter and running with the hunted. How can the BJP, which says it is with the Christians in Goa and Kerala, which boast a sizable Christian population, ask for their votes while the party remains silent on the growing atrocities against the community in North Indian states, Odisha and Maharashtra? That is the question posed by the stronglyworded editorial. And the BJP leaders have maintained a deafening silence on the sensitive issue. The latest incidents of attacks against Christians have come from Maharashtra where a BJP MLA, Gopichand Padalkar, has openly announced a reward ranging between Rs 3 and 10 lakh for anyone organising attacks against the community. Another party MLA is on record that illegal construction of churches was going on in districts like Dhule and Nanderbar. As if all this was not enough, Maharashtra's Revenue Ministry has hinted at a new law against forcible conversions in the State. There is already a law against such conversions. Why is then the clamour for a new anti-conversion law? That is the question asked by the Deepika editorial.

The editorial further says that, since the Modi Government assumed power in 2014, there has been a rise - as many as 4316 instances, according to the United Christian Forum report - of attacks against the Christian community. The year 2024 alone saw 834 incidents. The Uttar Pradesh police filed as many as 835 FIRs , and made 1682 arrests. But out of this conviction has come in only four cases!

The dilemma, however, is not only symbolic or cultural; it is deeply material. The BTC, despite enjoying a constitutional status that affords considerable autonomy, remains constrained in terms of fiscal capacity and administrative reach. While both the Central and State governments have provided generous grants in the wake of the accords, the council's internal rev-

enue generation remains weak. This fiscal dependency limits the region's ability to transform autonomy into meaningful, everyday improvements for its people. Infrastructure remains underdeveloped, employment opportunities are scarce, and access to quality education is uneven. These deficits persist de-

Signature programmes like the Bodofa Super 50 Mission signal intent and direction, but the larger challenge, as Boro himself acknowledges, lies in creating an agile and accountable governance model that can translate legal autonomy into developmental gains at the grassroots. In this context, the upcoming BTC elections represent a defining moment. For the first time in recent memory, all major political parties—BJP, United People's Party Liberal (UPPL), Bodoland People's Front (BPF), Congress, and the Asom Gana Parishad (AGP)—have chosen to abandon alliance politics and contest independently. This significant break from past electoral strategy is not merely tactical; it reflects a broader recalibration of how po-

litical success is defined in the region. The BJP, in particular, has decided to contest all 40 BTC seats, signalling a high-stakes gamble based on its organisational confidence and expanding grassroots presence.

The BJP's evolution in Bodoland merits special attention. During the last BTC term, the party supported the UPPL in forming the council government, using that opportunity to understand local dynamics and develop its own cadre. Now, emboldened by years of investment in training, data-driven outreach, and digital infrastructure, the party believes it can stand independently on the strength of its organisational architecture.

Drawing from party organisation theory, the BJP in Bodoland has evolved into a "hybrid party"-combining the precision of a professionalised, cartellike structure, the expansive appeal of a catch-all party, and the relentless mobilisation tactics of a mass-based movement. This synthesis is practically embodied in initiatives like the 'Pristha Pramukh' system, which ensures continuous voter engagement at the booth level and allows for targeted outreach that is both personal and strategic.

By decoupling from alliances, the BJP is also putting to test a central premise of modern party politics: that robust, autonomous organisational machinery can replace the need for tactical coalitions. In many ways, the party's decision mirrors its national model of political expansion, whereby it enters new territories by first supporting a regional ally, gradually builds infrastructure and capacity, and eventually seeks dominance through self-reliance. If successful in Bodoland, this strategy could become a template for the party's approach to other Sixth Schedule and autonomous regions across India.

For the UPPL, BPF, Congress, and AGP, the decision to contest independently is fraught with both peril and potential. These parties now face the urgent need to scale up their grassroots presence and mirror the BJP's hybrid organisational structure. Mere rhetoric or reliance on legacy vote banks will not suffice. Sustainable engagement-not just campaign rallies or manifesto launches, but sustained presence and responsiveness-has become the new currency of political credibility. Each party must demonstrate not only electoral viability but also administrative capacity to govern an ethnically complex and resource-challenged region.

The transformation of BTC politics into an arena of organisational competition is both promising and perilous. On the one hand, it pushes parties to become more responsive, professional, and inclusive. On the other, it risks overshadowing the more delicate aspects of Bodoland's unique social fabric-especially the need to maintain a politics of coexistence, where cultural and linguistic differences are not only respected but celebrated. In an era where national and regional identities often clash. Bodoland must serve as a model of how constitutional autonomy can be harmonised with multiculturalism.

This makes the 2025 BTC election more than a local contest. It is a referendum on the real meaning of the Bodo and BTR Accords. Can self-rule lead to self-reliance? Can linguistic diversity be reconciled with a cohesive political identity? Can parties move beyond symbolic politics to offer real governance for youth, farmers, students, and entrepreneurs? The answers to these questions will shape not just the future of the BTC, but potentially, the larger experiment of decentralised governance under the Sixth Schedule.

In the final analysis, Bodoland today stands at a critical inflection point. The peace it has earned is fragile but precious; the autonomy it enjoys is incomplete but evolving; and the elections it holds are not merely procedural but profoundly transformational. Whether the promise of inclusive development, dignity, and harmony-enshrined in the Accords-is fulfilled or diluted will depend not just on who wins, but on how they govern. For the people of Bodoland, this election is not just about parties or personalities, but about securing a future where peace is productive, identity is inclusive, and governance is grounded in grassroots reality. BRICS originally comprised of five countries: Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa. It began in 2009 with the first four countries and South Africa joined a year later. BRICS was conceived to be a forum which would reflect the interests and aspirations of the global south. The five members of the BRICS constituted 40 per cent of the world's population and a quarter of the world's economy. At the 16th **BRICS** Summit in Johannesburg in 2024, it was decided to admit six more countries to the forum -Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, Saudi Arabia, UAE and Indonesia. Now these eleven countries of BRICS put together represent 49.5 per cent of the world's population, 40 per cent of the world's GDP and

26 per cent of the world's trade. The BRICS is not a bloc or an alliance. It is a grouping of countries of the global south (Russia being the sole exception), which seeks to arrive at common positions on reform of multilateral institutions, trade, economic cooperation, climate change and technology. As such, BRICS has the potential to challenge the domination of the G-7 countries and Western imperialism over the institutions like the IMF, the World Bank, and trade and financial mechanisms. The BRICS emerged in the background of the global financial crisis of 2008 and became more relevant after the failure of G-20 to come out of

the shadow of G-7 countries. The Rio de Janeiro Declaration has reflected the position of the global south clearly with regard to the two acts of aggression which have occurred. It has condemned the attacks on Iran's sov-

blockade of food and humanitarian supplies. The declaration has also expressed serious concern over the rise of unilateral tariff and non-tariff measures, without naming the United States in this regard. It has also reiterated the long standing demand for greater voting powers for the major global south countries in the IMF and the World Bank, and for the representation of Brazil and India in the UN Security Council. What has provoked the ire of

President Trump is the way BRICS has been evolving steps and measures to lessen dependence on the dollar and loosen the grip of the US and G-7 countries over the multilateral financial institutions. With the United States increasingly utilising economic and financial sanctions against specific countries and excluding them from the international financial and banking systems, more and more countries sought to safeguard their interests through alternative arrangements. BRICS members have discussed trade in local currencies and currency swap arrangements.

Steps for cross-border payments are also on the agenda. The Rio Declaration states that the leaders will task ministers of finance and central bank governors of their countries "to continue discussion on BRICS Cross-Border Payments Initiative, and acknowledge the progress made by the BRICS Payment Task Force (BPTF) in identifying possible pathways to support the continuation of discussions on the potential for greater inter-operability of BRICS payment systems.' Though there is no specific goal of an alternative currency arrangement, the limited steps to reduce dependence on the dollar is raising the red flag in the Trump administration.

That the BRICS is making gradual progress in setting up some alternative institutions is evident in the example of the New Development Bank (NDB). This was set up in 2015 with a capital of \$100 billion and is headquartered in Shanghai. The



bank seeks to provide loans for infrastructure projects rather than loans to repay loans. The bank has so far extended \$36 billion for 98 infrastructure projects in BRICS member countries and other countries of the global south. At present the head of the bank is Dilma Rouseff, the former President of Brazil. Apart from the NDB, there is also the Contingent Reserve Arrange-

Under the leadership of President Lula, some other significant steps were taken. The group introduced a new framework for joint action which signified the group's coordinated position ahead of the United Nation's upcoming Climate Change conference, known as COP30. On technology, the declaration advocated for more inclusive global discussions on Artificial Intelligence (AI) governance, echoing the concerns of the global south that are often under-represented in these debates. Another outcome was the proposal for a BRICS Multilateral Guarantees initiative, to facilitate infrastructural and

development investment across the global south by providing investment guarantees to reduce risk. The 2026 chair will be India and Modi has declared the theme to be, "Building Resilience and Innovation for Cooperation and Sustainability". Despite all its professions to be the voice of the global south, the Modi government's foreign and strategic policies have generally been aligned with the United States and Israel. Its current pre-occupation to make terrorism the primary agenda in all multi-lateral institutions based on its Pakistan-centric approach has also not been in tune with the overall concerns of the global south. It is keen to cement its role in the US sponsored OUAD. Yet, India is also being subject to the vagaries of Trumpism. However much it seeks to compromise with Trump's aggressive demands, it will be at the receiving end of many of Trump's blows.

The official stance of the government is that it seeks to promote multipolarity. In the recent period, India and China have taken joint steps to reduce tensions on the border and begin the process of restoring economic and travel ties. This should remove hindrances to a smoother cooperation within the BRICS forum. It is to be hoped that the Modi government will utilise the BRICS leadership position to pursue an agenda which will promote the collective interests of the global south and rebuff all attempts to weaken the alternative policies and mechanisms which have been set in motion. # EU, UK hit Russia with new sanctions; Moscow's energy revenue, spies targeted

**BRUSSELS. July 18:** The European Union and Britain on Friday ramped up pressure on Russia over its war on Ukraine, targeting Moscow's energy sector, shadow fleet of aging oil tankers and military intelligence service with new sanctions.

"The message is clear: Europe will not back down in its support for Ukraine. The EU will keep raising the pressure until Russia ends its war," EU foreign policy chief Kaja Kallas said after the bloc agreed its new measures, including a new oil price cap.

Kallas said it's "one of its strongest sanctions packages against Russia to date" linked to the war, now in its fourth year. It comes as European countries start to buy US weapons for Ukraine to help the country better defend itself.

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy welcomed the new measures, describing them as a "timely and necessary" step amid intensified Russian attacks.

"All infrastructure of Russia's war must be blocked," Zelenskyy said, adding that Ukraine will synchronize its sanctions with the EU and introduce its own additional measures soon.

Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov brushed off the EU move, saying that "we consider such unilateral restrictions unlawful".

"At the same time, we have acquired certain immunity from sanctions. We have adapted to living under sanctions," Peskov said in a conference call with reporters. "We will need to analyse the new package in order to minimise negative

consequences from it."

The UK has Russia's spies in its sights The UK, meanwhile, imposed sanctions on units of Russia's military intelligence service, GRU. Also added to the list were 18 officers the UK said helped to plan a bomb attack on a theatre in southern Ukraine in 2022 and to target the family of a former Russian spy who was later poisoned with a nerve agent.

Hundreds of civilians sheltering in the theatre in Mariupol were killed in March 2022, shortly after Russia invaded Ukraine

"GRU spies are running a campaign to destabilise Europe, undermine Ukraine's sovereignty and threaten the safety of British citizens," UK Foreign Secretary

NATO also condemned Russia's cy-

berattacks, saying in a statement that "we will respond to these at a time and in a manner of our choosing, in accordance with international law, and in coordination with our international partners including the EU".

**Targeting Russian energy interests** The European Commission, the EU's executive branch, had proposed to lower the oil price cap from \$60 to \$45, which is lower than the market price, to target Russia's vast energy revenues. The 27 member countries decided to set the price per barrel at just under \$48.

The EU had hoped to get major international powers in the Group of Seven countries involved in the price cap to broaden the impact, but the Trump administration could not be brought onboard Oil income is the linchpin of Russia's

economy, allowing President Vladimir Putin to pour money into the armed forces without worsening inflation for everyday people and avoiding a currency collapse.

A new import ban was also imposed in an attempt to close a loophole allowing Russia to indirectly export crude oil via a number of non-EU countries.

The EU also targeted the Nord Stream pipelines between Russia and Germany to prevent Putin from generating any revenue from them in future, notably by discouraging would-be investors. Russian energy giant Rosneft's refinery in India was hit as well

The pipelines were built to carry Russian natural gas to Germany but are not in operation.

On top of that, the new EU sanctions targeted Russia's banking sector, with the aim of limiting the Kremlin's ability to raise funds or carry out financial transactions. Two Chinese banks were added to the list.

Agreeing sanctions is getting harder

The EU has slapped several rounds of sanctions on Russia since Putin ordered his troops into Ukraine in February 24, 2022. (ÂP)

# Arunachal Cabinet approves key reforms in education, child safety and governance

ITANAGAR, July 18: The Arunachal Pradesh cabinet on Friday approved a series of crucial decisions aimed at strengthening technical education, boosting internal security, enhancing child protection, ensuring transparent housing allocation, and improving administrative efficiency across depart-

The addition of the new battalion is expected to enhance policing capacity, ensure better law and order, reduce dependency on Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs), and create employment opportunities for eligible local youths

In a key move towards child protection, the cabinet adopted the model guidelines for support persons under Section 39 of the POCSO Act, 2012, with necessary state-specific modifications

# Modi says BJP only protector of Bengali 'ashmita'; slams TMC's infiltration politics

DURGAPUR, July 18: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday tore into the TMC, accusing it of risking Bengali 'ashmita' and national security by promoting infiltration for vote-bank politics and alleged that the Mamata Banerjee government has "crossed all limits" of appeasement politics.

Modi, who launched projects worth Rs 5,400 crore in the state, across the oil and gas, power, rail, and road sectors, also positioned the BJP as the harbinger of a new Bengal, promising a clean break from the past, saying "the BJP has big dreams for West Bengal. We want to build a prosperous, developed Bengal. All the projects being launched here are a step towards that dream."

In a stinging critique of Bengal's economic environment under TMC, Modi said the state has become inhospitable for industry and investors

"TMC's 'Gunda Tax' is deterring investment in Bengal. The state's resources have fallen into the hands of the mafia, and government policies are deliberately designed to enable ministers to engage in blatant corruption," he alleged.

In a fiery address at a packed rally in only party that truly respects and protects turned the tables on the TMC.



Bengali 'ashmita' (pride), calling for an end to what he termed a regime of "lies, lawlessness and loot.

"TMC, because of its vested interests, has put the identity of West Bengal at stake. For the sake of vote-bank politics, infiltration is being encouraged here. A complete ecosystem has been created to support infiltrators. This is a threat to both national security and Bengal's security and identity," Modi alleged.

He also accused the ruling party of 'openly challenging constitutional institutions" and "defending illegal immigrants."

Amidst a growing political row over the alleged harassment of Bengali-speaking Durgapur, Modi positioned the BJP as the migrant workers in BJP-ruled states, Modi

"For the BJP, Bengali 'ashmita' is supreme. Wherever there is a BJP government, Bengalis are respected, Bengali language is respected," Modi said to thunderous applause.

"The TMC is actively helping infiltrators. I want to say this very clearly that those who are not citizens of India and have entered illegally, the law will take its own course in accordance with the Constitution," he said, sending a clear message on illegal immigration.

Modi said the TMC's appeasement politics have "crossed all limits" and they are now on the streets to protect infiltrators. TMC's corruption and appeasement are pushing the youth out of Bengal, he added.

Taking a swipe at the TMC, Left and Congress, the Prime Minister said: "For years, the TMC and Left ran the government in Delhi with Congress but never considered recognising Bangla, whereas it was the BJP government that granted it classical language status."

Recalling the time when Bengal attracted job-seekers from across the country, he said people used to come here from across India for employment, but today, the youth of Bengal are forced to migrate even for small jobs. (PTI)

# INDIA bloc parties to hold key online meet today

#### AAP distances itself from opposition grouping

NEW DELHI, July 18: INDIA bloc parties will hold an online meeting on Saturday to reach a consensus on issues that they would raise to corner the government during Parliament's Monsoon Session and convey a message of unity, but AAP has distanced itself from the opposition grouping

The TMC, which was earlier said to be skipping the INDIA bloc meeting, however, said its national general secretary Abhishek Banerjee will attend the online meeting.

The meeting comes right before the Monsoon Session of Parliament, which starts on Monday. It will be held after a long gap since the INDIA bloc parties jointly deliberated the country's political situation. Congress general secretary incharge of communications, Jairam Ramesh, said the INDIA bloc is united and its prominent leaders will hold deliberations online on Saturday and meet in Delhi later.

Late on Thursday night, the Congress announced that a meeting of the leaders of the INDIA bloc parties will be held online on Saturday evening to discuss the prevailing political situation of the country.

The leaders would deliberate on a host of key issues, including the Election Commission's Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the electoral rolls in Bihar, the demand for a discussion on the Pahalgam attack, and Operation Sindoor.

US President Donald Trump's claims of bringing about a halt in hostilities between India and Pakistan, and the push to impeach Justice Yashwant Varma, embroiled in a row following the discovery of burnt wads of currency at his residence after a fire incident, are also likely to feature in the discussions.

However, in a jolt to opposition unity ahead of the Parliament session, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) distanced itself from the INDIA bloc, saying it is not part of the alliance anymore and questioned the Congress' role in leading it. "The AAP has cleared its stand. The INDIA bloc was for the (2024) Lok Sabha polls. We fought the Delhi and Haryana Assembly polls on our own. We are going to fight the Bihar election solo. We fought the bypolls in Punjab and Gujarat all by ourselves. The AAP is not part of the INDIA (bloc)," Singh told PTI Videos. He, however, said AAP will strongly raise issues in Lok Sabha while asserting the party has "always played the role of a strong opposition". The Arvind Kejriwal-led party contested the Lok Sabha seats in Delhi and Haryana during the

2024 general elections in alliance with the Congress. Slamming the Congress, Singh questioned its role in leading the opposition bloc.

"It is not a child's play. Did they hold any meeting after the Lok Sabha polls? Was there any initiative to expand the INDIA bloc? Sometimes they criticise Akhilesh Yadav, sometimes Uddhav Thackeray and sometimes Mamata Banerjee. The INDIA bloc should have been united. The Congress is the biggest party of the bloc. But did it play a role (in ensuring opposition unity)?" he asked

Meanwhile, the TMC said that initially it was to skip the INDIA bloc meeting that was to be hosted in Delhi, but now that it is going to be held online, Abhishek Banerjee will attend it.

On the INDIA bloc's online meeting, Ramesh said all the prominent leaders of the bloc will attend the Saturday meeting. "People would not be able to come to Delhi on Saturday due to different programmes. It has been decided that we will have an online meeting before the Parliament session. After that, we will meet in Delhi also," he said and asserted that the INDIA bloc was united. "The question that should be asked is why the name of the BJP president after J P Nadda has not been announced till now ... The BJP people need to worry about what is happening in their party and what is happening between the BJP and the RSS," Ramesh said. In a post on X Thursday night, Congress General Secretary K C Venugopal said, "A meeting of the leaders of the INDIA parties will be held online on Sat-

urday, July 19, 2025, at 7 pm to discuss the prevailing political situation in the country.' During the Parliament session, the top Con-

gress leadership would also raise issues such as the demand for the restoration of full statehood to Jammu and Kashmir and rising atrocities

against women in the country The opposition party has also decided to raise farmers' problems, the issues of rising unemployment, safety and security of the country and

the Ahmedabad air crash during the session. Congress Parliamentary Party chairperson Sonia Gandhi had convened a meeting of the party's parliamentary strategy group at her 10, Janpath residence here on Tuesday evening.

Top party leaders, including Congress president Kharge, Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi, Deputy Leader in the Rajya Sabha Pramod Tiwari, Jairam Ramesh, K Suresh, Manickam Tagore and others had participated in the meeting. (PTI)

# NHPC to set up 800 MW Pumped Storage Project in Tripura first in NE: Power Minister

AGARTALA, July 18: In a move to generate more power in Tripura, a Pumped Storage Project (PSP) will be set up in the state the first such project in the North-East after the 900 MW pumped storage project at Bagmundi in Purulia

The National Hydro Power Corporation of India (NHPC) will set up this pumped power storage plant in Tripura, which will generate a total of 800 MW of power.

Tripura's Power Minister Ratan Lal Nath informed this while participating in the 29th North Eastern Region Power Committee meeting held in Guwahati on 18th July.

In this meeting, the Power Minister relieved not only Tripura but all the North Eastern states of India from a huge financial burden. A day earlier, in the Technical Committee meeting, a proposal was made to increase the gas price for the OTPC Palatana power project. If implemented, this would have imposed a huge financial burden on consumers not only in Tripura but across the entire North Eastern region.

However, Power Minister Ratan Lal Nath strongly opposed the proposal, stating that it was not only unreasonable but also against the public interest. He said the burden of crores of rupees in additional expenditure would fall on the people, which was unacceptable. Due to his strong stance, the North Eastern Power Committee was compelled to reject the proposal. Later, the Power Minister said that the Government, under the able leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi Ji, is committed to the ideals of 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas, Sabka Prayas' to build an Atmanirbhar Bharat, and each of us must contribute with utmost sincerity to implement this vision.

He mentioned that everyone is aware of India's progress in the green hydrogen sector. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has highlighted the National Green Hydrogen Mission, which will pave the way for India

to become a global hub for hydrogen production and export.

The Power Minister informed that Tripura is working diligently to accelerate the implementation of clean and green energy initiatives announced by the Government of India to achieve net zero carbon emissions. So far, around 45,000 solar street lights, 4,900 solar pumps, 215 solar micro-grids, 3 MW of solar rooftops, and 2 MW of off-grid solar power have been installed, generating a total of 26 MW of solar power.

"As per the guidelines of the Ministry of Power, Government of India, Pumped Storage Projects will be set up in the state. The NHPC will establish a pumped power storage plant in Tripura, which will generate 800 MW of power. This will be the first pumped power storage plant in the North-East after the 900 MW project at Bagmundi in Purulia," said the Power Minister.

The Minister also stated that integrating battery energy storage systems with renew-

power during peak hours by utilizing surplus renewable energy generated during daytime/off-peak hours. The installation of storage batteries in Tripura to store solar energy for use during peak load periods is also being explored.

"The Central Government has taken several landmark initiatives in the power sector. These reforms have transformed the sector with a focus on providing affordable electricity to all. We all know that the North-East region of the country is not only rich in natural resources but also in social capital," he added. He said that the Asian Development Bank (ADB) is providing funding to address the power sector challenges in the North-East region by developing and expanding power generation, transmission, and distribution systems.

"The Tripura government has signed an agreement worth Rs 2,275 crore with ADB to strengthen and improve power distribu-

able energy will ensure the availability of tion efficiency in the state. Under the ADB project, two power projects - Rokhia in Sepahijala district and the Gomati hydropower project in Gomati district — are planned for major renovation. Currently, the gas-based Rokhia power project generates 63 MW of power, and its installed capacity will be doubled by modernizing the plant. Similarly, the capacity of the Doombur hydropower project will be increased from 5 MW to 10 MW," said the Minister.

The Power Minister also stated that a detailed roadmap for the Inter-State Transmission System requirements for Tripura up to 2031-32 has been finalized. This includes the construction of new GIS/AIS substations, new transmission lines, augmentation of EHV substations, and the replacement of old conductors with high-conductivity HTLS conductors to adequately meet future demand. # Vaani Kapoor on cancel culture: 'Don't understand this volatile behaviour'

MUMBAI, July 18: Actor Vaani Kapoor says she does not understand the current wave of "cancel and boycott culture", which she believes is contributing to a toxic environment and restricting artistic freedom.

The actor, who will soon make her digital debut in Netflix's Mandala Murders. expressed her views on censorship and online hate during an interview, highlighting the impact such behaviour has on artists and society at large.

"I don't get the cancel and boycott culture," said Kapoor. "Censorship, in any form, limits an artist's freedom to take creative risks and explore new ideas.'

Her remarks come in the wake of the controversy surrounding her recent film Abir Gulaal, a romantic drama co-starring Pakistani actor Fawad Khan. The film, scheduled for release in May, was shelved following the Pahalgam terror attack. In the aftermath, political figures and trade bodies renewed calls to boycott Pakistani artists, ultimately preventing the film's release in India

When asked about how the situation affected her, Vaani responded:

"I'm not so into censorship. I believe in certification. Sometimes, there's no limit — when I hear about censorship, I think, 'They can cut this or that.' As an artist or filmmaker, you're constantly trying to create something new. But with boundaries set around you, how much can you truly explore new territory?"

Kapoor, known for films like War, Chandigarh Kare Aashiqui, and Raid 2, criticised the rise of "cancel and boycott" movements, which she feels have made public discourse increasingly toxic.

"This whole cancel culture — 'say one wrong thing, cancel them, boycott them' — I don't get that



volatile behaviour. We're being far too harsh with one another," she said.

"I keep hearing so much toxicity and hate — 'Let's cancel this person today, let's boycott that one'. Don't do that, yaar. Give people space. Let them be.'

At the trailer launch of Mandala Murders, Kapoor also spoke about the negative psychological effects of online hatred, particularly among younger people still discovering their identity.

"There's a psychological impact — people start to doubt themselves before they even understand who they are. Whether it's kids in school or college, or someone in the industry, we're all affected by it," she said.

"We're human. We'll make mistakes — we're not saints. But you learn from your errors.

Calling for empathy and compassion, Kapoor added:

"Just because we have a difference of opinion doesn't make someone a bad human being. It doesn't mean they should be cancelled or that they don't deserve a place in the world. Don't be so harsh. Be happy, kind, and give love a chance.

Mandala Murders is a psychological thriller produced by YRF Entertainment, with Aditya Chopra, Uday Chopra, Yogendra Mogre, and Akshaye Widhani serving as executive producers. The series premieres on Netflix on 25 July. (PTI)

The shootout featured some terrible attempts — nine misses in all — before England triumphed 3-2 with 18-year-old Smilla Holmberg missing the last one after Lucy Bronze had powerfully dispatched hers for the Lionesses.

"Stressful. Stressful watching, stressful playing," England goalkeeper Hannah Hampton told British broadcaster the BBC when asked about the shootout.

Inter Kashi become I-League champions after Euro 2025 semifinals after dramatic comeback CAS rejects AIFF Appeal Committee decision

NEW DELHI, July 18: Inter Kashi were on Friday declared I-League champions after the Switzerland-based Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) rejected the All India Football Federation's (AIFF) Appeal Committee's decision of awarding the title to Churchill Brothers of Goa.

The AIFF had announced Churchill Brothers as the I-League champions after its Appeal Committee ruled against Inter Kashi in a matter related to the fielding of an 'ineligible player'. The Varanasi club had ended at second spot after points were deducted from their fally. But following an appeal by

Inter Kashi, the CAS asked the AIFF to reverse its decision of awarding the 2024-25 season title to Churchill.

The AIFF shall forthwith declare Inter Kashi FC as winner of the I-league 2024-25 season," the Lausanne-based CAS said in its order

"The appeal filed on 4 June 2025 by Inter Kashi FC against the decision issued on 31 May 2025 by the Appeal Committee of the All-India Football Federa-

tion is partially upheld. 'The decision issued on 31 May 2025 by the Appeal Committee of the All India Football Federation is set aside," said the CAS award handed by sole arbitrator Frans de Weger of the Netherlands.

This is, in fact, the second appeal won by Inter Kashi against the AIFF Appeals Committee's decision, having already secured a favourable verdict last month. Inter Kashi thus won the I-League title in its second season of featuring in the second tier club competition of the country. They had finished fourth in their maiden I-League season in 2023-24. Under the rules, Inter Kashi will be promoted to the top-tier Indian Super League (ISL) in 2025-26 season though the event is on "hold" due to the uncertainty over the issue of the renewal of Master Rights Agreement - to expire on December 8 - be-

tween the AIFF and the organisers Football Sports Development Limited (FSDL).

The I-League champions of 2022-23 and 2023-24 - Punjab FC and Mohammedan Sporting respectively - were promoted to the ISL.

The CAS, in its verdict, also asked the AIFF to amend the points table of the I-League 2024-25 to reflect Inter Kashi's top position.

Accordingly, Inter Kashi FC will get 42 points, Churchill Brothers will secure 40 points for the second position, while Real Kashmir would be third with 37 points

Earlier, Churchill were on top with 40 points, followed by Inter Kashi (39) and Real Kashmir (37).

The AIFF will also have to pay 55 per cent of the cost of arbitration, amounting to 3,000 Swiss francs (₹ 3,22,275 approx) to Inter kashi, while the other parties to the case - Churchill, Namdhari FC and Real Kashmir - will have to shell out 15 per cent each (Swiss francs 1,000 or ₹ 1,07,413 approx).

"The costs of the arbitration, to be served to the Parties by the CAS Court Office separately, shall be borne for 55% by the AIFF, 15% by Churchill Brothers FC Goa, 15% by Namdhari FC and 15% by Real Kashmir

"The AIFF shall pay an amount of CHF 3,000 (three thousand Swiss francs) and Churchill Brothers FC Goa, Namdhari FC and Real Kashmir FC shall each pay an amount of CHF 1,000 (one thousand Swiss francs) to Inter Kashi FC as legal contribution towards its legal costs and other expenses incurred during these arbitral proceedings.

On June 17, Inter Kashi won their first appeal at the CAS against AIFF Appeals Committee's April 18 ruling in a case relating to their match against Namdhari FC - who were alleged to have fielded an 'ineligible player' - in an I-League match on January 13. (PTI)

hearts this month. A more recent vintage is Switzerland's men surprisingly beating Spain, the soon-to-be champion, at their opening game of the 2010 World Cup in South Africa.

"We try to share stories, that's what life is all about," Sundhage

said Thursday, hours after show ing video of that 1-0 Swiss win to her players.

"Sharing stories brings us together.'

"And just the mindset that it is possible," the veteran coach said. "We feel it, we remind each other it is possible because it's football.'

Switzerland defender Noelle Maritz said listening to Sundhage and watching the game film "really made me feel goosebumps."

The modern Wankdorf Stadium that hosts Switzerland's first game in the knockout rounds at any Women's Euros is built on the site of soccer lore from 71 years ago.

U.S. President Donald Trump waded into the topic while at the Club World Cup final in New Jersey last Sunday.

He joked that he could pass an executive order to bring the United States in line with much of the rest of the world and ensure that from now on Americans refer to it as football.

"I think I could do that," he said with a smile during an interview with host broadcaster DAZN.

It was a light-hearted comment. but at a time when the U.S. is playing an increasingly significant role in soccer the question of why Americans continue to call it by a different name to the one by which it is most commonly known has been raised again.

There is, of course, already a popular sport called football in the — and that complicates things. "They call it football, we call it soccer. I'm not sure that change could be made very easily," Trump said.

Soccer keeps growing in the U.S. and so does its influence on the sport. It is co-hosting the men's World Cup with Canada and Mexico next year — the third year in a row that it stages a major tournament after the 2024 Copa America and this summer's Club World

Other factors are keeping soccer more often in the U.S. consciousness — and perhaps they will make saying "football" more commonplace in a tough sporting landscape.

One of the greatest players of all time, Lionel Messi, plays for MLS team Inter Miami; the popularity of the Premier League and Champi-

ons League is booming; and the documentary series "Welcome to Wrexham" about a low-level Welsh club co-owned by Hollywood actors Ryan Reynolds and Rob McElhenney, has attracted new eveballs.

Despite "soccer" being widely associated with the U.S., it is commonly accepted that the word was actually coined in Britain, perhaps as far back as the 1880s.

The exact date when it was first used is not known, but it is believed "soccer" was derived from association football," which was the first official name of the sport. The charity English Heritage says the nickname may have first been used by pupils at the iconic Harrow School to "distinguish the new association game from their older pursuit, known as 'footer.'"

Numerous versions of football began to flourish, often involving handling a ball more than kicking

it. One example dating back to the 1600s and still played today in England is Royal Shrovetide. Rugby is another example.

The English Football Association was created in 1863 and drew up codified rules for associated football to set it apart from other versions being played elsewhere in Britain and, from there, soccer as we know it was born.

Dr. Stefan Szymanski, a professor of sport management at the University of Michigan, co-wrote the book "It's Football, Not Soccer (And Vice Versa)" and explored the origins of the name. In a lecture to the American University of Beirut in 2019 he said soccer was "very clearly a word of English/British origin."

"And bear in mind that the name 'association football' doesn't really appear until the 1870s," he said, "so it appears really very early on in the history of the game and the

word 'soccer' has been used over and over again since it was coined at the end of the 19th century."

"Soccer" is not a commonly used term in Britain these days but that has not always been the case. It was the title of a popular Saturday morning television show, "Soccer AM," which ran from 1994 to 2023 on the Premier League's host broadcaster Sky Sports.

England great and 1966 World Cup winner Bobby Charlton ran popular schools for decades, titled Bobby Charlton's Soccer School." And Matt Busby — Manchester United's iconic manager who won the 1968 European Cup - titled his autobiography, which was pub-lished in 1974, "Soccer at the Top, My Life in Football."

That book title suggests the terms "soccer" and "football" were interchangeable in British culture at that time. (AP)

# Jadeja's 'incredible fight' at Lord's Test earns him **Team India's MVP tag**

LONDON, July 18: India head coach Gautam Gambhir led the chorus of praise for experienced all-rounder Ravindra Jadeja, describing his heroics in the Lord's Test against England as an "incredible fight".

Jadeja remained unbeaten on 61 off 181 balls but despite his valiant knock, India went down by 22 runs in the third Test.

'That was an incredible fight. The fight from Jaddu was absolutely brilliant," said Gambhir in a video titled 'The MVP ft. Ravindra Jadeja', which was posted on the BCCI website on Friday.

Chasing a modest 193, India's batting line-up crumbled with the top eight lasting less than 40 overs. But Jadeja, who came in at No.

7, stood firm and showed immense courage and grit alongside tailenders Jasprit Bumrah and Mohammed Siraj

Together, they batted for more than 34 overs to keep India afloat. Bumrah faced 54 balls for his 5

and Siraj played out 30 deliveries for his 4 before becoming the final wicket to fall to Shoaib Bashir. India folded for 170 in 74.5

overs to trail 1-2 in the five-match series.

"His batting has reached another level. In the last two Tests the consistency and the calmness he brought to the dressing room. I've watched him for so many years and how he's developed his game

now, his defence is rock solid, looks like a proper batter," Gambhir's deputy Ryan ten Doeschate said in the video.

India's batting coach Sitanshu Kotak, Jadeja's former Saurashtra teammate at domestic level, highlighted the all-rounder's temperament under pressure.

"I always felt he has the ability to take pressure. With so much of experience, he normally comes with something that the team needs in any challenging conditions. Really, really valuable to the team," Kotak said

Pacer Mohammed Siraj echoed the sentiment, underlining Jadeja's all-round value

"It's very difficult to get a player like me and we are lucky to have such a player in our team," Siraj said

Opener Shubman Gill, speaking at the post-match press conference, had earlier summed up Jadeja's impact.

"He is one of the most valuable players of India. The skillset he brings with his batting, bowling and fielding. He is someone who is very rare to find. The way Jaddu bhai batted was a very proud effort. The character and the courage they showed was tremendous,

Gill had said. India will have to win the fourth Test beginning in Manchester on July 23 to keep their hopes of winning the series alive. (PTI)

LONDON, July 18: Armed with multiple match-winners, India will look to continue their excellent build-up to the forthcoming World Cup when they face England in the potentially series-deciding second and penultimate women's ODI here on Saturday. India won the opener at Southampton by four wickets, and a victory at Lord's will give the visitors an unassailable 2-0 lead in the three-match rubber. This would extend their string of wins in the format in recent times, including the tri-series triumph involving Sri Lanka and South Africa in May. The games against England carry added significance as they serve as vital preparation for the ICC Women's ODI World Cup, which India will host later this year.

With several players delivering standout performances, competition for spots in the World Cup squad is heating up, but this problem of plenty is a happy headache for India coach Amol Muzumdar and skipper Harmanpreet Kaur.

The management has several options to choose from for certain roles. The depth and bench strength of the team has never been this good.

In the absence of pacers Renuka Singh Thakur and Pooia Vastrakar due to injures. the side preferred Kranti Goud over the slightly more experienced Arundhati Reddy. The 21-year-old newcomer showed her met-



tle with two big wickets in the opener while sharing the new ball with Amanjot Kaur, who is also a rookie.

Pratika Rawal has emerged as the preferred choice for Smriti Mandhana's partner at the top of the order while Shafali Verma also remains in contention after her form in the T20 Internationals, the Women's Premier League (WPL), and domestic cricket.

Harleen Deol is also in good nick and in the event Shafali returns to the playing XI in the number three slot.

a storm, the manufacturer of the Dukes ball on Friday said it will conduct a thorough review following widespread criticism of the 'soft" balls used in the first three Tests between India and England, according to a report in the BBC.

The on-field umpires have regularly changed the balls in the ongoing five-match series as they were unable to retain hardness and were going out of shape quickly, particularly post 30 overs. The whole process has caused delays to the match proceedings.

Following criticism by India captain Shubman Gill and former English pacer Stuart Broad, the England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) will collect as many used balls as possible and return them to the company that produces Dukes balls by the end of the week.

"We will take it away, inspect and then start talking to the tanner, talking about all of the raw materials - everything," Dilip Jajodia, owner of British Cricket Balls Ltd, who make the Dukes, told BBC Sport.

"Everything we do will be re-

years after becoming the first Black cricketer to play for England, Roland Butcher says there is still a long way to go before racism is rooted out of the game and the British society in general. Butcher, who shuttles between his na-

tive Barbados and the United Kingdom, currently in England spreading the



message of an inclusive society through his autobiography -- 'Breaking Barriers: Barbados to England and Back'.

Speaking to PTI, the 71-year-old, who made history by playing three Tests and as many ODIs for England, looked back at his early days as a black cricketer in the '70s and '80s, his last minute withdrawal from the rebel tour of South Africa in the apartheid era and how his story opened the doors for the younger generations who went on to play for the country.

"I am pragmatic enough to understand that something doesn't just finish just like that. The only thing that would finish anything in a hurry is a meteorite. But everything takes time and you chip away at it," said Butcher, a former batter.

"Racism has been chipped away in England by a foreign person since the 1950s. We're in 2025 and we're still talking about it. So that tells you just how long the process is.

"I think it's a never-ending process. It's one that has to be worked at all the time. So, you know, you've got to keep chipping away. We've got it to this point, but there's still a long way to go.'

Butcher was among the many in the cricketing world that were shocked by racism allegations made by Karachi-born cricketer Azeem Rafiq against his county team Yorkshire in 2020, leading to multiple resignations at the club.

Though it is easier to call out racism in county cricket than his playing days, Butcher feels the discrimination, whether subtle or in your face, remains.

"There has been incremental progress. I don't think that you will just suddenly get a blank sheet of paper and it'll all be a perfect drawing on it. That's not going to happen. I think it's something that has to be worked at continuously. And gradually over time, let's reduce the instances.

"But it's not going to just suddenly disappear. If something's been going on for centuries, it doesn't disappear within one year. And both players, ECB, everybody has to work at it. Trying to just level the playing field. That's the important thing," said Butcher. Butcher played for Middlesex from 1974 to 1990. He faced racism on the county cricket circuit but the others had it much tougher.

"Well, for me personally, it wasn't that bad because (as he grew up in Barbados



before moving to England at the age of 13), I am the sort of person that I didn't let anything deter me from what I really wanted to achieve. But in saying that, back in the '80s, there certainly was a lot of racism in England, not just in cricket, but I think in society.

"A lot of black players had difficult times, more difficult times than me around the circuit. But having made the breakthrough, I think it assisted a number of other black players who had been striving to get forward.

"I'm still very proud of that achievement because as I said, not only did I get to where I wanted to be as an international cricketer and achieve what I wanted to, I'm very proud that it opened the doors for many and many black players have passed through that door as well.'

Having said that, incidents of casual racism remember remains fresh in Butcher's memory.

"One of the things that I remember me personally is, I was fortunate to play in a very good Middlesex team that was very successful. We had a lot of good players, but we also had, at any one time, we had five black players in the team. So there was myself. Wayne Daniel. Will Slack. Neil Williams and Norman Collins.

"So, you know, we were a pretty multiracial team, but it didn't stop opposition fans from remarking at times. I can remember one particular game against Kent where we were taking the field after tea and as we walked through the crowd, someone remarked, 'look, they've got five of them'.

"I just thought, how perceptive, we've been playing all day and you only just realised that there's five black players in Middlesex team," he recollected as if it was yesterday.

Butcher was a beacon of hope for the Black community in England but a controversy erupted when he decided to tour South Africa in 1989 when the apartheid policy was still in effect and the team from the rainbow nation was banned from international cricket.

There was intense backlash and Butcher realised that it was in his and his community's best interests that he did not board the flight to South Africa with a predominantly white team, including captain Mike Gatting.

"I had made the decision to go for various reasons. And, then in reflection over a period of time, perhaps a little bit more education, I realised that going would be perhaps not the best thing in my interest or in the interest of black people in South Africa and outside of South Africa.

"There were legal challenges but then I made the decision to withdraw from the tour," said Butcher, who played county cricketer against the likes of Farok Engineer, Sunil Gavaskar, Bishan Singh Bedi and Imran Khan.

In the end, Butcher said it is not all doom and gloom when it comes to dealing with racial matters in England, considering a sizeable chunk of the country's population is black or coloured.

"I think Britain is a much more tolerant country now than it used to be. It has to be if you think of the nationalities that live within England, Scotland and Wales right now. They have no choice but to be more tolerant because there are large percentages of foreign people living in this land.

...Back in the '70s, '80s, '90s, it would have been much more difficult to call out racism because any black or Asian or any foreign player didn't feel they could speak out because they were not represented in any way.

"Now they've got more of a voice because they're now encouraged to speak out. If you have a problem within your club, you're now encouraged to speak. And they've got people dedicated within the clubs to listen to you and take it forward. That didn't happen before. So again, that is progress," concluded Butcher. (PTI)
