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Manipur HC directs state govt to hold panchayat elections within six months

IMPHAL, Aug 29: The High Court of Manipur on Friday directed the state government to conduct panchayat elections within six months.

The order was issued by a division bench comprising Chief Justice Kempaiah Somashekar and Justice Guneshwar Sharma during a hearing on the long-pending local body polls.

Panchayat elections in the state were last held in 2017.

Although fresh polls were scheduled for June 2023 after the completion of the five-year term, they have remained pending.

Since then, the Panchayati Raj institutions have been functioning through administrative committees.

The court in its hearing noted that "in order to make the Panchayati Raj system workable in Manipur, the state government has been given the liberty to appoint fresh administrative committee for gram panchayat and administrator for zilla parishad not exceeding a period of six months."

The court also quashed all previous state government orders for appointments of administrative committees.

It said, "All orders of appointment of the administrative committee of the gram panchayat and administrator for zilla parishad, issued by state government in pursuance of the interim order dated 29.02.2024 for a term exceeding the period (CONTD. ON PAGE-2)

BJP blows 'war bugle' for Assam polls of 2026

Shah targets Gaurav, says Assam cannot be led by people who make frequent visits to Pak ● Himanta govt's achievements hailed

GUWAHATI, Aug 29: Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Friday said Assam cannot be led by people who make frequent visits to Pakistan, apparently referring to state Congress president Gaurav Gogoi's alleged links with the foreign nation.

He asserted that the BJP-led NDA will form the third consecutive government in Assam next year, riding on the back of the massive development works of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and CM Himanta Biswa Sarma.

Addressing a rally of panchayat representatives here, Shah blew the 'war bugle' for Assam assembly polls due in March-April next year and said the state cannot be represented by leaders who protect the infiltrators and encroachers.

"Modi carried out immense development works across the country, and Assam CM Himanta Biswa Sarma took that flow to every household of the state. On the back of these works, the BJP-led NDA will form the government in Assam for the third consecutive term next year," he said.

Slamming opposition Congress, Shah said Assam cannot be al-



lowed to be led by people who encourage encroachments by infiltrators.

"Assam will continue to be led by Modi and Sarma," he added. Alluding to Gogoi, Shah said, "Assam cannot be led by people who visit Pakistan frequently."

The Assam CM and the BJP have been attacking the Deputy Leader of Congress in Lok Sabha over his British wife's alleged connection with Pakistan's spy agency ISI.

Sarma had claimed that Gogoi's British wife Elizabeth Colburn had travelled 19 times between India

and Pakistan.

Shah said, "Infiltrators encroached thousands of acres of our land. The BJP government launched a drive to clear encroachments, but Gaurav Gogoi opposed it. The Assam government freed 1,29,548 acres from encroachment by infiltrators."

The home minister asserted that the BJP has restored the sanctity of Srimanta Sankardeva and Mahapurush Madhavdeva's satras (Vaishnavite monasteries) by evicting infiltrators from their lands.

GUWAHATI, Aug 29: Contributions of Assam's first non-Congress CM Golap Borbora were recalled as the state celebrates his birth centenary on Friday even as Union Home Minister Amit Shah, while attending a programme to mark the occasion, said that Borbora was among the many leaders sidelined by the Congress despite their towering contributions to the nation.

A socialist leader and freedom fighter, Borbora was also the first opposition member to be elected to the Rajya Sabha from this north-eastern state.

"Celebrating the birth centenary of Golap Borbora, a leader whose



life was a testament to courage, simplicity and dedication to Assam's people," Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma said in a post on X.

Union minister Sarbananda Sonowal in a social media post,

paid his tribute to Borbora, and said, "With steadfast dedication and selfless service, Golap Borbora, the first non-Congress chief minister of Assam, earned a lasting place in the hearts of the people."

Expressing gratitude to the state government for marking the birth centenary of Borbora, his son, Pankaj Borbora said, "We are thankful that the state government has taken this initiative. The ideologies that our father stood for are reflected in the work of the present government also."

Govt to bear medical expenses of panchayat members and their families from 2026

GUWAHATI, Aug 29: Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Friday used the massive gathering of panchayat representatives at Khanapara to showcase his government's achievements and deliver a fiery political message aimed squarely at the Congress and its allies.

Addressing more than 21,000 elected representatives, Sarma said the BJP's sweeping victory in the recent panchayat polls was a "mandate for continuity" and proof of people's faith in the party. "Out of 397 panchayat seats, we bagged 301. At the ward level, BJP won over 21,900 seats. This verdict is the people's blessing on the BJP-led alliance," he declared.

In a key announcement, the Chief Minister unveiled a new welfare measure for grassroots leaders: from January 1, 2026, the state government will bear the medical expenses of panchayat members

and their families.

Sarma reminded the gathering that the BJP came to power in 2016 with the slogan of protecting Assam's jati, mati, bheti (community, land, and identity), and insisted that the commitment remains unchanged. He reeled off milestones achieved under BJP rule—UNESCO recognition for Charaideo Maidams, classical language status for Assamese, global promotion of Bihu and Jhumur, implementation of the cattle slaughter ban, and big-ticket projects like AIIMS, the new IIM campus, and the proposed Brahmaputra underwater tunnel.

He also highlighted flagship schemes like Orunodoi and the Entrepreneurship programmes for women and youth, calling them "lifelines for the state's poor and aspirational classes."

But it was his sharp political attack that drew the loudest response. (CONTD. ON PAGE-2)

Putin to meet Modi on sidelines of SCO Summit

MOSCOW, Aug 29: Russian President Vladimir Putin will meet Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday on the sidelines of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) Summit in China's Tianjin, Kremlin foreign policy aide Yuri Ushakov said on Friday.

Both Modi and Putin will travel to China to attend the SCO Summit from August 31 to September 1.

"Right after the SCO Plus meeting (on September 1), our president will meet Indian Prime Minister Modi," Ushakov told journalists.

It will be their first meeting this year, although they have been regularly in touch on the phone, he said.

"Our countries are bound by a special strategic partnership," he said. "A relevant statement in this regard was passed in December 2010, which means that this year marks the 15th anniversary since then." "What is especially important is that preparations will be discussed for the upcoming visit of our president to India in December," Ushakov added. (PTI)

India's GDP grows 7.8 pc in Q1: Govt data

NEW DELHI, Aug 29: India's economy grew by a stronger-than-expected 7.8 per cent in April-June, its fastest pace in five quarters, before US President Donald Trump imposed tariffs that now cloud the outlook, threatening key exports like textiles.

The gross domestic product (GDP) growth in the first quarter of the ongoing fiscal year was mainly driven by good showing by the farm sector, and also helped by services like trade, hotel, financial and real estate, according to the latest government data released on Friday.

The previous highest pace of growth in the country's GDP was recorded at 8.4 per cent during January-March 2024, as per the data. India remains the fastest-growing major economy, as China's GDP growth in the April-June period was 5.2 per cent.

The agriculture sector recorded a 3.7 per cent growth, up from 1.5 per cent in the April-June period of 2024-25, as per the data released by the National Statistics Office (NSO).

However, manufacturing sector growth increased marginally at 7.7 per cent in the first

quarter of FY26 compared to 7.6 per cent recorded in the year-ago period. Earlier this month, the Reserve Bank of India had projected the real GDP growth rate for 2025-26 at 6.5 per cent, with 6.5 per cent in Q1, 6.7 per cent in Q2, 6.6 per cent in Q3, and 6.3 per cent in Q4.

Commenting on the official data, Aditi Nayar, Chief Economist, Head - Research & Outreach, ICRA, stated that after the unexpectedly strong Q1 FY2026, a lower YoY (year on year) momentum of government capex and the looming hit to exports from the US tariff (CONTD. ON PAGE-2)

Bangladeshi court imprisons 1971 war veterans, university professor on terrorism charge

DHAKA, Aug 29: A Bangladeshi court on Friday sent 16 people, including several 1971 Liberation War veterans, to jail under the tough Anti-Terrorism Act, a day after a mob allegedly disrupted their scheduled public discussion in the capital.

Magistrate Farzana Haque ordered them to be sent to jail after they were produced in court nearly 24 hours after their detention.

Police had initially detained them for their protection from "public unrest" on Thursday.

Dhaka police after midnight Thursday said the detainees were being charged under the Anti-Terrorism Act of 2009 without further elaboration.

The initial case document submitted in the court suggested at least six of the 16 arrested were in their 70s.

"For the sake of a proper inves-

tigation, which is yet to be completed, and the identity and address of the accused is yet to be verified, it is 'absolutely necessary' to keep the accused in custody," read the police application submitted in court.

According to media reports, former minister and 1971 war veteran Abdul Latif Siddiqui, Dhaka University law professor Hafizur Rahman Curzon, and journalist Manjurul Alam Panna were among those sent to jail.

Abu Alam Shahid, freedom fighter and retired secretary to the government, who joined Thursday's meeting, said several of those arrested were 1971 veterans.

"Most of the senior persons arrested were 1971 veterans as yesterday's meeting was a freedom fighters discussion," the former bureaucrat said.

Newly-formed veterans' plat-

form 'Moncho 71' organised the discussion at the Dhaka Reporters Unity (DRU) auditorium and at the onset of the meeting, the mob allegedly stormed the scene.

They called the organisers and participants of the event "accomplices of the fascist regime" of deposed prime minister Sheikh Hasina. However, Shahid said to his knowledge "no Awami League leader" was there at the event.

Former minister Siddique was expelled from Hasina's cabinet and the party for breaching discipline in 2014.

The violent uprising led by the Students against Discrimination (SAD) toppled Hasina's Awami League regime on August 5, 2024, when she left the country for neighbouring India.

Three days later, Nobel Laureate Muhammad Yunus took over as the Chief Advisor (CONTD. ON PAGE-2)

NEW DELHI, Aug 29: The Supreme Court on Friday sought response from the Centre on a plea by former Rajya Sabha MP Subramanian Swamy seeking a direction to the government to "expeditiously" decide his representation to declare 'Ram Setu' as a national monument.

'Ram Setu', also known as Adam's bridge, is a chain of limestone shoals between Pamban Island, off the south-eastern coast of Tamil Nadu, and Mannar Island, off the north-western coast of Sri Lanka.

A bench of Justices Vikram Nath and Sandeep Mehta agreed to hear Swamy's plea and issued notice to the Centre.

It posted the matter for hearing after four weeks.

In his plea, Swamy has referred to the January 19, 2023 order passed by the apex court in the matter.

On January 19, 2023, the Centre had told the top court that it was

looking into the issue pertaining to declaring 'Ram Setu' as a national heritage monument.

The top court was then hearing Swamy's plea on the issue.

"The solicitor general states that the process is currently underway in the Ministry of Culture, but if the petitioner would so desire, he may also submit any additional material or communication as he may wish within a period of two weeks," the apex court had noted in its January 2023 order.

The court had asked the Centre to take a decision on the issue and granted Swamy the liberty to move before it again if he was dissatisfied and disposed of his interim application on the issue.

The fresh plea filed by Swamy said no response or decision taken was conveyed either to him or to the apex court till date.

It said the Centre is duty-bound to protect 'Ram Setu' from any form of misuse, pollution or desecration.

cration.

"It is also important to note that this archeological site is a matter of faith and 'shraddha' of people treating Ram Setu as a pilgrimage and all these archaeological studies and scientific findings are foundational evidence supplementing the existence of the man-made monument as a pilgrimage for worshippers," the plea said.

It said after the January 19, 2023 order, Swamy had made a representation to the government on January 27, 2023 with all the accompanying documents.

The plea said the petitioner had again written a fresh representation to the government on May 13, 2025.

It has sought a direction to the Ministry of Culture "to decide the representation of the petitioner in an expeditious manner/time-bound manner in compliance of order of this court dated January 19, 2023". (PTI)

India and Japan resolve to expand defence cooperation

TOKYO, Aug 29: With an eye on Beijing's increasing military muscle flexing in the East and South China Seas, India and Japan on Friday unveiled a comprehensive framework to boost their defence cooperation to respond to contemporary security challenges.

The new initiative was announced after Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Japanese counterpart Shigeru Ishiba held summit talks that focused on significantly expanding the 'Special Strategic and Global Partnership' between the two countries.

Under the framework, the two sides also resolved to explore co-development and co-production of military equipment and technology for current and future security needs.

In their talks, Modi and Ishiba resolved to uphold the international order based on the rule of law and reaffirmed their steadfast commitment to a free and open Indo-Pacific that is peaceful, prosperous and resilient, according to a joint statement. The two leaders welcomed the evolution of the four-nation Quad into a vital and enduring regional grouping, and looked forward to their next Leaders' summit to be hosted by India later this year.

Modi and Ishiba expressed serious concern

over the situation in the East and the South China Seas.

"They reiterated their strong opposition to any unilateral actions that endanger the safety as well as freedom of navigation and overflight, and attempt to change the status quo by force or coercion," the joint statement said.

"They shared their serious concern over the militarisation of disputed features. They reaffirmed that maritime disputes must be resolved peacefully and in accordance with international law, in particular the UN Convention on the Law of the Sea," it said.

In his media statement, Modi said both sides have shared interests in the areas of defence and maritime security.

"We have jointly decided to further strengthen our cooperation in the fields of defence industry, and innovation," he said.

Under the new framework for defence cooperation, India and Japan decided to contribute to each other's defence capabilities by promoting interoperability and synergy between their defence forces.

To this end, the two sides decided to explore tri-service exercises and look at collaboration between their special operations units. (PTI)

Agency currently developing Lunar Module Launch Vehicle (LMLV) with capacity to haul 80-tonne payloads

ISRO eyes Mars landing, building habitats over next four decades

NEW DELHI, Aug 29: India plans to set up 3D-printed dwellings on Mars and launch precursor missions to land humans on the Red Planet in the next four decades, according to a roadmap for the future drawn up by the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO).

The roadmap is an outcome of nationwide consultations carried out by the space agency, which culminated at the National Space Day celebrations here last weekend.

According to the roadmap, India plans to build a crew station on the Moon by 2047, mine for minerals and other resources, operate crewed lunar terrain vehicles and also have propellant depots that could fuel inter-planetary missions and support the stay of astronauts on the Earth's only natural satellite.

ISRO has also drawn up plans to upgrade its launch vehicles significantly that would aim to carry 150-



tonne payloads to orbit in a single mission. At present, ISRO's launch vehicle GSLV Mark-III can haul up payloads up to 4 tonnes to the geosynchronous transfer orbit and 8 tonnes payload to low earth orbit (LEO).

The space agency is currently de-

veloping the Lunar Module Launch Vehicle (LMLV) with a capacity to haul 80-tonne payloads to LEO and 27 tonnes to trans-lunar orbit.

The LMLV is designed to be 119 metres in height, as tall as a 40-storey building, and is expected to be ready

by 2035. ISRO plans to use the LMLV for the lunar missions, including the first human mission to the Moon, planned for 2040, chairman V Narayanan said last week.

In 2023, Prime Minister Narendra Modi had set targets for ISRO to build the Bhartiya Antariksha Station by 2035 and land an Indian astronaut on the Moon by 2040, signalling the government's long-term plans for the space sector.

Astronaut Shubhanshu Shukla's recent sojourn to the International Space Station as part of a commercial mission and the planned Gaganyaan missions also signal the government's intent to support human spaceflights in a sustained manner.

The prime minister has also asked ISRO scientists to plan deep space exploration to unravel the secrets of the universe for the benefit of humanity. (PTI)

NDA sets target to win 100 seats in Assam assembly polls

GUWAHATI, Aug 29: Slamming the Congress over alleged corruption during its tenure, several NDA leaders, including Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma, Union minister Sarbananda Sonowal and AGP chief Atul Bora, on Friday set a target of winning 100 of the 126 assembly seats in next year's elections in the state.

Addressing a rally of panchayat representatives here in the presence of Union Home Minister Amit Shah, Sarma appealed to all to take a pledge of protecting 'jati, mati, bheti' (community, land, foundation) of Assam.

"We will give land to our known people and will snatch away every inch of land from the unknown people. We will not settle down until we achieve our objectives," he added. Sarma also alleged that Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, along with "Islamic scholar Madani", threatened him in recent times.

"Madani and Rahul Gandhi came and threatened me. We know how to use 'hengdang' (Ahom sword) and give a befitting reply. We need to fight the battle of Saraighat again.

"I challenge Madani and Rahul Gandhi to fight with Assamese people. We will fight and win this battle," he added.

Slamming the opposition party, Sonowal claimed the Congress tenure was marked with "neglect, terrorism and disturbances".

"Forget about development, Congress had kept the Northeast in darkness. They don't have any right to question the BJP government. If Congress had worked even 5 per cent of what the Narendra Modi government has done, Northeast would have developed by now," he added.

The former Assam CM asserted that Prime Minister Narendra Modi freed the Northeast from darkness and backwardness, and there is peace and development everywhere in the region nowadays.

Bora, a state minister, alleged that the fundamentalist forces had expanded during the Congress tenure.

"But now, there has been an overall improvement in law and order. Many peace accords have been signed with in-

surgents under the NDA government," he added.

The developmental work in Assam during the tenure of Himanta Biswa Sarma has been very rapid, Bora said.

Claiming that the Congress did "decentralisation of corruption", the AGP president said, "We all will have to work hard with a target of winning 100 seats for the NDA in next year's assembly polls."

During the rally, Shah also said that the BJP-led NDA will form the third consecutive government in Assam next year, riding on the back of the massive development work of Modi and Sarma.

Assam Assembly, with 126 seats, is likely to go for elections in March-April next year.

Presently, the ruling BJP's strength in the 126-member Assam Assembly is 64, while its allies AGP has nine MLAs and UPPL has seven.

In the opposition camp, the Congress's strength is 26, AIUDF has 15 members, BPF has three and CPI(M) has one MLA. There is one Independent legislator as well. (PTI)

BJP will keep its promise to make country free of infiltrators: Amit Shah

GUWAHATI, Aug 29: Home Minister Amit Shah on Friday said the BJP will keep its promise to make Assam and the rest of the country free of infiltrators.

Addressing a programme in Guwahati on the birth centenary of the state's first non-Congress CM Golap Borbora, he said the high-powered demography mission, announced by PM Narendra Modi on Independence Day, is a definitive step towards studying the demographic pattern of the country and identifying infiltrators.

"We had made a promise to Assam, but we have not been able to fulfil it in 10 years. We will keep our promise and make Assam and the entire country free of illegal foreigners," he said.

Shah said the high-powered demography mission is based on Borbora's ideology, and it is befitting that it was announced in the same year the socialist leader's birth centenary is being celebrated.

"This mission will study the demographic pattern change in the country and also identify infiltrators... I am confident that it will be a major step towards freeing the country of infiltrators," he said.

"I am among those people who believe that not a single infiltrator should stay in our country," he added.

Shah recounted how Borbora, who led a Janata Party government from March 1978 to September 1979 in the state, had undertaken a drive to cleanse the voters' list when by-elections were necessitated for the Mangaldai Lok Sabha seat.

"In Assam, awareness against infiltrators was created for the first time through this



voters' list cleansing during Borbora's tenure. In that age, without computerised electoral rolls and technology, Borbora's government deleted the names of 36,780 illegal voters. If someone looks for the roots of the Assam Agitation, it will be in this cleansing exercise," he said.

The six-year-long Assam Agitation, which culminated with the signing of the Assam Accord in August 1985, was against illegal Bangladeshis living in the state.

Shah said the Election Commission is also undertaking a cleansing of the voters' list through Special Intensive Revision (SIR), but some parties are opposing it through the 'Ghusepetiya Bachao Yatra', in an apparent reference to the 'Voter Adhikar Yatra'. Main-

taining that the voters' list is the "heart" of any democratic country, he said, "This campaign was started in 1978 by Borbora and such is the moral degradation in society today that in order to strengthen their own vote bank, grab power, the move to delete names of infiltrators from the voters' list is being opposed."

"If Borbora was alive today, he would have come out on the road to protest against these parties," Shah maintained.

He lauded the state government for its actions against 'infiltrators', especially evicting encroachment and freeing over 1.29 lakh acres of land.

"The government here has freed not just Kaziranga forest land or other forest areas,

but also land of the Satras (Vaishnavite monasteries)," he said.

Shah also appreciated CM Himanta Biswa Sarma and his government for honouring Borbora, a staunch socialist leader who had no links with the BJP.

One has to rise above party politics and ensure that those who have contributed towards the nation are recognised and the future generations are aware of them, he said.

Shah claimed that after Indira Gandhi became the PM, contributions of only her family members were recognised by the Congress governments.

Stating that it was a trait of the BJP to recognise efforts of all, he said, "Sardar Patel's contributions were forgotten until PM Modi built his statue in Gujarat. Netaji did not have a notable memorial in Delhi before a statue was installed at Kartavya Path."

"Even Gopinath Bordoloi, the first CM of Assam, was bestowed the Bharat Ratna when the Congress was not in power," he added.

Shah said that Borbora's coming to power was a historic moment for the state as he was the first non-Congress leader to become the CM, and though his term was short, he left an indelible mark. Several decisions taken by his 18-month-government have impacted the socio-economic scenario of the state over the years, he said.

Free education till class 10, waiver of 'lagan' for up to 10 bigha of agricultural land, policy for small tea gardens, opening of passport office in Guwahati, and setting up of banking and railway recruitment boards in the state are among the notable decisions of his government, he added. (PTI)

Jorhat DC warns social organisations against compulsion donations for festivals

JORHAT, Aug 29: The Jorhat District Commissioner Jay Shivani, who is also the District Magistrate, has prohibited individuals, groups and organisations from forcing people to donate money as subscription or contribution, etc. for any purpose in Jorhat district.

An order passed by the DC under Section 163 in of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS) has barred forceful collection of chanda/ donations, its subscription or contribution, etc., for any purpose from any public, business establishments, institution and the vehicles plying on road throughout the district of Jorhat. The order mentioned that in the event of violation of the prohibitory order by anyone, action would be initiated against the violator under Section

223 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS).

The order stated that the ban on collection of forceful donation has been imposed in view of reports of such instances (forcing people to donate) being carried out by certain social organisations for the sake of organising festival, utsavs, gatherings etc., in the district. The order also mentioned that there has been instances where such forceful collection of donations have been found to have links with various other anti-social elements having potential of disrupting peace and public tranquility in the district.

Further, the order stated that the developmental activities in the district and the economy as a whole suffers on account of such forceful collection of donations and cause negative impact on the productivity and employment generation in the district.

Education Advisory Committee expresses resentment against BTC education secretary

KOKRAJHAR, Aug 29: The Education Advisory Committee of the government of Bodoland Territorial Council (BTC) raised allegations against the BTC Secretary's Education Secretary, Amarjyoti Barman, accusing him of creating a deadlock in the education department for the past two months.

Railways Approves 37 stoppages of different trains over NFR

In addition Kokrajhar station will now have a stop for the Dibrugarh Lalaghar Dibrugarh Express and Senchoa Junction for Tambaram Silghat Town Tambaram Express and Alipurduar Silghat Town Alipurduar Express.

Among other key locations in Assam are Goalpara Town station, which will now have stoppages for trains such as the Kolkata Silghat Town Kolkata Express and the Ranchi Kamakhya Ranchi Express and Sorbhog station which has been approved for halts of the Delhi Kamakhya Delhi Express and the Tambaram New Tinsukia Tambaram Express. Basugaon station has also been included for the Sealdah Sabroom Sealdah Express, while Agomoni station has received approval for the Alipurduar Silghat Town Alipurduar Express, whereas in the Barak Valley region, stoppages have been approved at Kayasthagram for Agartala Silchar Agartala Express and Katakhal Junction for Guwahati Silchar Guwahati Express.

Apart from Assam, approvals have also been granted for several stations in West Bengal. At Azamnagar Road, stoppages for trains including the Sealdah Alipurduar Sealdah Express, Sealdah Sabroom Sealdah Express and the Sealdah Silchar Sealdah Express have been confirmed. Similarly, stations such as Kumedpur, Sudhani, Taiabpur and Telta have been approved for halts for the Katihar - Siliguri Town Katihar Express and other long distance services. Old Malda and Rautara have also been included for DEMU and express services, enhancing local and regional connectivity.

Trouble for Indian students in US

In 2025, for hundreds of thousands of young Indians, the dream of studying in the United States is alive — but under siege. A fiery Reddit post recently captured the angst: “What’s so wrong with us that every country wants to limit us?” The thread, posted on r/AdmissionProcedure, went viral as Indian students compared horror stories of visa rejections, skyrocketing costs, and hostile immigration laws across the developed world. But nowhere is the storm fiercer than in America — still the top destination for Indian students, still the epicentre of the H-1B job pipeline, and still the country where opportunity collides with politics. Despite the Howdy Modi Houston bonhomie of 2019 and now bitter Tariff war between Trump and Modi add to the fire as India resists any kneel down over its right to sovereignty and trade policies. Donald Trump’s second stint in the White House has been marked by sweeping immigration crackdowns. His play-book is familiar, but the reach has widened. From Visa Denial to Campus Survival, getting into the U.S. is just the beginning. Survival is a more poignant story. American universities are hiking tuition. A master’s degree can cost upwards of \$70,000. Add soaring rents in cities like New York, Boston, and San Francisco, and students are drowning in debt. Currency fluctuations make matters worse; every dip in the rupee adds thousands to the bill. F-1 visas allow only 20 hours of on-campus work per week. Off-campus jobs are illegal unless under Optional Practical Training (OPT). Trump’s policies have narrowed OPT pathways, especially in non-STEM fields. Students risk deportation if caught working cash jobs to survive.

Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) has ramped up raids, even at universities. Fake university scams — like the infamous University of Farmington sting — still haunt Indian families. One visa slip, one expired document, one mistaken shift from full-time to part-time, and deportation looms. Indian students are also targets of hate crimes. Incidents of harassment in Mid-western and Southern states have rattled communities. Families in India now weigh not just costs, but also personal safety. For Indian students, the post-study phase is the biggest gamble. Many invest in U.S. degrees hoping for a work visa. But the H-1B lottery is brutal. Rejections strand graduates with degrees but no jobs, forcing abrupt returns.

As regards green cards even those who “make it” face purgatory. For Indians, the backlog stretches across generations. A student graduating in 2025 could realistically wait until the 22nd century for permanent residency. s Trump’s DOJ has opened an office specifically to audit naturalisation cases. Rumours of retroactive disqualifications terrify young Indians who see citizenship as the final reward. In effect: America beckons students with opportunity but, pushes them into a tunnel of uncertainty.

Language debate and future of Assamese identity

Assam finds itself at the confluence of language, culture, and politics, where the debates around the Assamese language have far-reaching consequences not only for cultural survival but also for the broader imagination of identity in the state. Language has historically been the defining symbol of Assamese selfhood, binding together communities in the Brahmaputra valley while also standing at the center of many conflicts that have tested the resilience of the state. To understand the present debate and its implications for the future of Assamese identity, one must revisit its history, confront the present challenges, and anticipate the trajectories ahead with clarity.

The roots of the Assamese language movement can be traced back to the nineteenth century when the colonial administration replaced Assamese with Bengali as the medium of instruction and administration in 1836. This decision created a rupture in cultural continuity and set into motion the first major battle for linguistic self-determination. Assamese intellectuals and reformers such as Anandaram Dhekial Phukan and the American Baptist missionaries fought for the reinstatement of Assamese, leading to the revivalist spirit that would later define the Orunodoi-era literary renaissance. This revival was not merely about securing a language in schools or courts; it was about affirming a collective identity in the face of marginalization. That experience remains etched in Assamese consciousness as the first assertion of cultural pride against both external imposition and internal erasure.

The decades that followed showed how language and identity became deeply intertwined with politics. Census figures from the early twentieth century reflected the shifts in linguistic affiliations, sometimes driven by demographic changes and at other times by the politics of assimilation. The growth of Assamese speakers between 1931 and 1951, from about a third to more than half the state’s population, was not solely a natural development but also linked to political efforts to unify diverse communities under a common linguistic umbrella. Yet this expansion also planted the seeds of contestation, as other linguistic groups felt alienated by what they perceived as forced assimilation into an Assamese identity.

The tensions came to a head during the Official Language Act debates of 1960 and the tragic events of 1961 in Silchar, where protests against the imposition of Assamese as the sole official language led to police firing and the death of eleven people in the Barak Valley. This remains one of the darkest chapters in Assam’s history, a reminder that language can unify but also divide when imposed without consensus. For Assamese speakers, the official recognition of their language was a historic victory, but for Bengali-speaking communities in Barak Valley, it was an existential threat. This duality illustrates the complexity of Assamese identity, which must constantly negotiate between assertion and accommodation.

In recent decades, demographic shifts caused by migration — both internal and cross-border — have reignited concerns about the future of Assamese language and identity. The Assam Accord of 1985, signed after years of agitation, sought to safeguard the cultural and linguistic heritage of the Assamese people through Clause 6, which promised constitutional, legislative, and administrative safeguards. Yet, decades later, the promise of Clause 6 remains largely unfulfilled, leaving space for anxieties to fester. For many Assamese speakers, the fear is not simply of numerical decline but of cultural dilution, where the language might lose its primacy in everyday life,

education, administration, and public discourse.

These anxieties became visible again during the census debates when certain organizations encouraged communities of Bengal-origin Muslims to declare Bengali as their mother tongue. This triggered sharp political responses, with the Chief Minister asserting firmly that Assamese would remain the official language of the state and any attempts to undermine it would not be tolerated. Such statements reflect the sensitivity



of the issue, as even census classifications are seen as direct threats to identity. The strong pushback against efforts to expand Bengali linguistic identity in Assam underscores the deep entanglement between language and political survival. It is no coincidence that leaders across parties frequently invoke the primacy of Assamese language when addressing issues of migration, citizenship, and demographic change.

Yet the politics of language in Assam is not only about confrontation. It is also about preservation, adaptation, and modernization. The Assamese language today faces challenges from globalizing forces, particularly the dominance of English in higher education, technology, and professional spheres. While Assamese continues to thrive in literature, cinema, and cultural life, its presence in digital platforms, scientific discourse, and higher academia remains limited. Without significant investment in modernizing Assamese language tools, creating robust digital infrastructure, and producing content

across diverse domains, there is a risk that younger generations may see Assamese as culturally impractical but practically dispensable.

The future of Assamese identity thus depends on how the language adapts to new realities. The digital age has opened new possibilities for regional languages to thrive, provided there is conscious effort to build resources and platforms. Assamese newspapers, television, cinema, and online content creators have expanded the reach of the language beyond traditional spaces. Technological advancements in natural language processing and digital publishing now allow Assamese to claim its place in global communication networks. Initiatives such as developing Assamese versions of popular software, increasing its visibility on social media platforms, and incorporating it into AI-driven tools are crucial steps to ensure the language’s survival in the twenty-first century.

But language is not just a technological or administrative issue; it is deeply social. Assamese identity cannot be preserved through exclusion or coercion but through inclusivity that acknowledges the multilingual nature of the state. Assam is home to numerous ethnic groups with their own languages

and dialects — Bodo, Mising, Karbi, Dimas, Rabha, and many more — each carrying its own cultural pride. For Assamese to remain the lingua franca, it must be seen not as a tool of dominance but as a shared platform of communication. The strength of Assamese identity will come not from rejecting diversity but from embracing it, positioning Assamese as the bridge language that connects all communities while respecting their distinctiveness.

The cultural heritage of Assamese literature, music, and cinema continues to inspire confidence in the vitality of the language. From the devotional verses of Srimanta Sankardeva and Madhabdeva to the modern plays of Jyotiprasad Agarwala, from the timeless Borgeets to the contemporary voices of Assamese cinema, the language has demonstrated resilience and adaptability. Its creative richness is a reminder that Assamese is not in decline but is very much alive, provided it is nurtured with care and foresight.

Education will be the key battleground in shaping the future of Assamese identity. Policies that strengthen Assamese-medium schools, update curricula with modern knowledge systems, and make learning attractive through technology will play a decisive role. At the same time, it is equally important to create space for English and other languages, so that Assamese students are not disadvantaged in global competition. The goal should not be to insulate Assamese speakers from global languages but to equip them to move fluidly between Assamese and English, between local and global spheres, thereby ensuring that Assamese remains relevant without becoming insular.

The political class has a responsibility to rise above short-term electoral gains and address the language debate with a vision for the future. Weaponizing linguistic insecurities for votes may yield immediate dividends but will ultimately weaken Assamese identity. Instead, leaders should commit to cultural policies that institutionalize support for the language across media, technology, and education, while simultaneously promoting harmony among communities.

The language debate in Assam is therefore not simply about Assamese versus Bengali or Assamese versus other ethnic languages; it is about redefining Assamese identity in a way that acknowledges both historical pride and contemporary pluralism. To secure its future, Assamese must be projected not as a language under siege but as a language of opportunity, creativity, and inclusivity. Only then can it command the loyalty of future generations, not through fear of decline but through the promise of relevance.

The history of Assam demonstrates that language is the core of its identity, but also that identity is not static. It evolves with time, responding to new challenges and embracing new realities. The task ahead is to ensure that Assamese evolves without losing its essence, that it speaks for all communities without being seen as a tool of exclusion, and that it thrives in the digital age while remaining rooted in its cultural soil.

Assam today stands at a linguistic crossroads, where decisions made in education, politics, and technology will determine whether Assamese emerges stronger or weaker in the coming decades. Its future lies not in retreating into isolation but in confidently asserting its place in both local and global contexts. For a state whose soul has always been expressed most vividly in its language, the path forward is clear: Assamese identity must be safeguarded not by erecting walls of exclusion, but by building bridges of belonging, ensuring that the language continues to carry the voices, dreams, and aspirations of its people for generations to come.

Assam’s Landmark free drugs scheme An appraisal of the Indian ports bill 2025

In the evolving story of India’s public health landscape, Assam has recently carved a milestone that could set a precedent for the entire country. On August 26, Health Minister Ashok Singhal proudly declared that the state had achieved complete availability of free essential drugs across all public health facilities. This announcement was not a routine administrative update but a statement of vision, determination, and humanity. It revealed how deliberate investment in medicines — the most fundamental of health interventions — can become a transformative tool for equity and social justice.

The government of Assam has spent Rs 378.67 crore during the financial year 2024–25 to procure and distribute free medicines under its flagship healthcare initiative. For the ongoing fiscal year, an even larger allocation of Rs 445.73 crore has been made, underscoring the seriousness with which the state approaches this mission. At its core, the Free Drugs Scheme is about dismantling the financial barriers that have long separated the privileged from the vulnerable when it comes to accessing healthcare.

Minister Singhal’s words were emphatic. He stressed that the state has ensured one hundred per cent availability of free medicines as listed in the Essential Drugs List (EDL). These medicines are now accessible across every tier of the health system — district hospitals, sub-district hospitals, community health centres, primary health centres, urban primary health centres, urban Ayushman Arogya Mandirs, and sub-health centres. What this means, in tangible terms, is that a villager in a remote corner of Assam has as much right to free essential medication as a patient seeking treatment in a state-of-the-art medical college hospital.

At the heart of this achievement lies the Essential Drugs List, a carefully compiled inventory that ensures the population’s priority health needs are addressed. The Assam Free Drugs Scheme makes 352 generic drugs and 69 specialty drugs available at medical colleges and hospitals. In district and sub-divisional civil hospitals, community health centres, first referral units, and model hospitals, as many as 261 drugs are supplied. Primary health centres stock 125 varieties, and even the smallest sub-centres carry about 30 drugs, thereby ensuring that essential treatments reach the grassroots. The scale of this outreach is extraordinary. For the first time, access to healthcare in Assam is not being defined by geography or economic status but by the principle of universality.

The array of drugs covered is impressive both in scope and detail. General and local anaesthetic medicines such as ketamine, propofol, and bupivacaine are available, along with opioid analgesics like morphine and fentanyl that are crucial in pain management. Anti-inflammatory and non-steroidal medicines including diclofenac, ibuprofen, and paracetamol are part of the package. Life-saving categories such as medicines for hyperuricemia, rheumatoid disorders, neuropathic pain, and hyperlipidaemia are all included. Drugs essential in emergency care like adrenaline, atropine, diazepam, and magnesium sulphate are also free of cost.

The list extends far beyond routine treatment. It covers cancer drugs such as 5-Fluorouracil, Paclitaxel, and Rituximab; antiviral medicines like acyclovir; antimalarials including artemether and chloroquine; and antitubercular medicines vital to India’s continuing battle against tuberculosis. Psychiatric and mental health medicines, often the most neglected in terms of affordability and access, find an equal place in this scheme, with drugs such as haloperidol, risperidone,

and lithium carbonate available free of cost. From simple antacids and antihistamines to highly specialised drugs for haemophilia, thalassemia, and organ transplant rejection, the list reflects comprehensiveness. Even vitamins, minerals, saline solutions, plasma substitutes, growth hormones, and antineoplastic monoclonal antibodies are included, ensuring a level of medical preparedness across all levels of care.

This is not just a state-driven measure in isolation. The free drugs service is a flagship programme of the Central government under the National Health Mission (NHM). Assam’s adaptation of this programme, executed through the Assam Medical Services Corporation Limited (AMSCL), has made it one of the most effective state-level healthcare models in India. AMSCL is tasked with procurement, logistics, and quality assurance. Every drug supplied undergoes rigorous testing, and the distribution system is continuously monitored to prevent interruptions or shortages. This quality assurance addresses a long-standing criticism of public healthcare systems where concerns about efficacy and safety often undermine patient trust.

To ensure that people are aware of their entitlements, the government has launched awareness campaigns. Posters in hospitals, advisories in rural health centres, and even WhatsApp helplines have been introduced to let citizens know that these drugs are their right, not a privilege. The state has provided a helpline number for citizens to report unavailability, thus building accountability into the system. Patients and doctors alike are being educated about the availability of these medicines so that no one is forced into unnecessary expenses due to ignorance or misinformation.

The financial impact of this initiative is immense. In India, household out-of-pocket expenditure on health accounts for nearly two-thirds of total health spending, and a majority of that is spent on medicines. This burden has often forced families into cycles of debt and poverty, especially in rural areas where incomes are unstable. By bearing the cost of medicines through the state budget, the Assam government is redistributing opportunity and easing the economic pressure on its people. A family that would have once struggled to afford an antibiotic course for their child can now access it without fear of financial distress. A diabetic patient who requires regular insulin injections no longer has to make choices between medication and food.

Beyond immediate financial relief, this measure strengthens the very foundation of Assam’s healthcare system. By ensuring uniform drug availability at every level, the scheme eliminates disparities between urban and rural healthcare. For too long, rural sub-centres have been synonymous with scarcity, offering little more than primary first aid. Today, they can dispense life-saving drugs, becoming credible centres of healthcare delivery in their own right.

This initiative is also aligned with global health priorities. Access to essential medicines is one of the pillars of Universal Health Coverage (UHC), an objective endorsed by the World Health Organization and central to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG). Assam’s achievement mirrors SDG target 3.8, which calls for universal access to safe, effective, quality, and affordable essential medicines and vaccines. It positions Assam not merely as a state catching up with national health targets but as a model that others might emulate.

The path, however, is not free of challenges. The logistical complexities of maintaining uninterrupted supply chains in a state prone to floods, difficult terrain, and dispersed populations cannot be underestimated.

Regular monitoring and technological interventions like digital inventory tracking, GPS-enabled logistics, and barcoded packaging will be essential to prevent shortages or leakages. There is also the risk of misuse and pilferage, which has historically plagued free medicine programmes in India. To counter this, the government must rely on transparency, third-party audits, and community participation in monitoring distribution.

The vision extends beyond numbers and logistics to the human dimension of healthcare. Each free vial of insulin or strip of paracetamol represents hope. For the elderly woman in rural Barpeta suffering from arthritis, free access to methotrexate can restore mobility and dignity. For the young father in Dibrugarh struggling with tuberculosis, free rifampicin can mean a second chance at life. For the child in Tezpur suffering from severe anaemia, free iron supplementation could secure a healthier future.

Minister Singhal’s assurance summed up the spirit of this initiative: “Our government remains committed to providing quality healthcare services to all citizens. The free drugs initiative is a significant step towards achieving this goal, and we will continue to ensure that all citizens have access to essential medicines and quality healthcare services.”

Ultimately, the Free Drugs Scheme of Assam is not just about stockpiling medicines in government facilities. It is about redefining the contract between the state and its citizens, where health is not treated as a commodity to be purchased but as a right guaranteed. It is about ensuring that a poor farmer in Karimganj has the same access to treatment as a wealthy professional in Guwahati. It is about recognising that the health of a state is measured not merely in GDP or infrastructure but in the well-being of its people.

The scheme also has broader economic implications. Healthier populations are more productive, less prone to absenteeism, and contribute more actively to the economy. Reducing the financial burden of medicines frees up household resources for education, nutrition, and livelihood, creating a ripple effect of progress.

Assam’s success in implementing the Free Drugs Scheme should serve as a clarion call for other states. While many Indian states have announced free medicine schemes, their coverage often remains partial, plagued by irregular supply, and limited lists of drugs. Assam’s example demonstrates that with political will, robust institutional frameworks like AMSCL, and significant budgetary commitment, universal access is achievable.

As the state continues to strengthen its health infrastructure, the Free Drugs Scheme will be remembered not merely as a welfare programme but as a historic leap toward equity and justice. In an era where the affordability of healthcare continues to divide societies, Assam has made a bold statement: that medicines are not a privilege reserved for the few but a right owed to every citizen.

The Free Drugs Scheme represents a moral victory as much as a medical one. By ensuring 100 per cent availability of essential medicines across its health facilities, Assam has taken a giant step toward achieving universal health coverage. It has lightened the financial burdens of its people, improved healthcare outcomes, and reaffirmed the principle that access to health is a fundamental human right. The long-term impact of this initiative will not only be measured in healthier bodies but also in stronger, more resilient communities that can look to the future with renewed confidence. Two more high profile Sri Lankan politicians arrested

COLOMBO, Aug 29: In continuation of the arrests of former parliamentarians on charges of corruption, two more political leaders in Sri Lanka were arrested after they surrendered at local courts on Friday.

These arrests come days after former president Ranil Wickremesinghe was arrested on charges of corruption.

Rajitha Senarathne, a former minister, and Athuraliyie Rathana, a former parliamentarian Buddhist monk, were both absconding and surrendered in the court on the day of hearing in their respective cases.

A magistrate's court remanded Senarathne until September 9 while Rathana was remanded until September 12 by the suburban Nugegoda court, police said.

Senarathne, a senior politician,



was charged with awarding a questionable contract to a Korean company for sand dredging causing a loss to the government when he

was the minister of fisheries in 2013.

Rathana has been evading arrest in connection with an ongoing in-

vestigation in the 2020 abduction of a fellow Buddhist monk.

The monk, Vedinigama Wimalathissa, had alleged that Rathana was behind his abduction to force him to sign documents so that Rathana could be appointed to parliament from the Ape Janabala Party in the 2020 August parliamentary election.

The arrests and subsequent remanding of the two former parliamentarians follows the August 22 arrest of former president Ranil Wickremesinghe in a case of alleged misuse of state funds. He became the first head of state of the country to be arrested and remanded.

President Anura Kumara Dissanayake rode to power last year after campaigning on the anti-corruption plank. (PTI)

Kabul blames Pakistan for airstrikes that killed 3 people in eastern Afghanistan

ISLAMABAD, Aug 29: Airstrikes that Afghanistan's Taliban government blamed on neighbouring Pakistan struck two eastern provinces of the country, killing at least three people, wounding seven others and damaging homes, officials and witnesses have said.

In Kabul, the foreign ministry decried the strikes that took place late Wednesday in Nangarhar and Khost provinces, calling them a "provocative act" by Pakistan and summoning the Pakistani ambassador in Kabul on Thursday.

The Afghan Defence Ministry also condemned the strikes. "Such

barbaric and brutal actions benefit neither sides; rather intensify the distance between the two Muslim nations and fuel hatred. These irresponsible activities will have consequences," it wrote on the X social media platform.

Neither the Pakistani government nor the military commented on the alleged strikes.

Kabul previously has accused Pakistan of launching airstrikes in Afghanistan against suspected hideouts of the Pakistani Taliban, a militant group banned in Pakistan and blamed for some of that country's deadliest terrorist attacks.

In Nangarhar's Shinwari district, members of a family whose house was reduced to rubble sifted through the debris to try to recover what they could. "They dropped the first big bomb on my house. My house was completely destroyed," said Shah Sawar, a resident of Nangarhar's Shinwari district. "First I pulled a child out of the rubble, then I pulled four children and a woman out."

Nangarhar's deputy governor, Maulvi Azizullah Mustafa, said the strikes were fired by Pakistani drones. The Afghan foreign ministry said three people were killed and seven wounded in Nangarhar

and Khost. Kabul in December 2024 accused Pakistan of carrying out airstrikes against suspected hideouts of the Pakistani Taliban in Paktika province. Pakistan also did not acknowledge those strikes at the time. Kabul claimed hitting several points inside Pakistan in retaliation.

The latest violence comes a week after top diplomats from Pakistan, China and Afghanistan met in Kabul and pledged closer cooperation against terrorism. It also came three months after Pakistan and Afghanistan upgraded their diplomatic ties to improve bilateral relations. (AP)

Thai court dismisses Prime Minister over compromising phone call with Cambodian leader



BANGKOK, Aug 29: Thailand's Constitutional Court on Friday dismissed Paetongtarn Shinawatra from her position as prime minister, ruling that as the country's leader she violated constitutional rules on ethics in a phone call with Cambodia's Senate President Hun Sen.

The ruling means she immediately loses her job, which she had

held for about a year. Paetongtarn was suspended from her duties on July 1 when the court agreed to hear the case against her, and Deputy Prime Minister Phumtham Wechayachai took over her responsibilities.

The Cabinet led by Phumtham is expected to stay in place on a caretaker basis until Parliament approves a new prime minister. The caretaker Cabinet could also dissolve Parliament and call a new election.

Paetongtarn's leaked June 15 call with Hun Sen was aimed at easing tensions over competing claims to territory along their border, but sparked outrage in Thailand because Paetongtarn seemed overly friendly in discussing a matter of national security and appeared to malign a Thai army general. (AP)

Vice President Vance says prepared for top job if 'terrible tragedy' strikes

WASHINGTON, Aug 29: US Vice President JD Vance has said that he is ready to lead the country if "God forbid" there is a "terrible tragedy", as he hoped that President Donald Trump would serve his full term.

In an interview with USA Today on Thursday, Vance dismissed ongoing speculation about the health of Trump, the oldest president ever to take the oath of office.

The 41-year-old said that he has got a lot of "good on-the-job training" in the last 200 days of being in office and stressed that Trump is in "incredibly good health".

"Yes, terrible tragedies happen, but I feel very confident the President of the United States is in good shape, is going to serve out the remainder of his term and do great things for the American people. And if, God forbid, there's a terrible tragedy, I can't think of a better on-the-job training than what I've got over the last 200 days," he said.

His comments come amid growing concern among Democrats over Trump's health and age. The president has dismissed such concerns, insisting he remains energetic and vigorous.

Trump, who turned 79 in June this year, became the oldest US President to be sworn into office on inauguration day in January this year at 78.

Former President Joe Biden was also 78 when he was sworn in as President in 2021, but Biden was five months and six days younger than Trump on his inauguration in January 2021.

Trump, who earlier this month described Vance as the "most likely" heir to his Make America Great Again (MAGA) movement, has fuelled speculation about the vice president's prospects in the 2028 presidential election.

However, the vice president dismissed suggestions that he is already eyeing the Oval Office.

Israel declares Gaza's largest city combat zone as bodies of 2 hostages recovered



GAZA CITY, Aug 29: Israel on Friday declared Gaza's largest city a dangerous combat zone and said it was in the "initial stages" of a planned offensive that has drawn international condemnation.

Israel's military said it suspended mid-day pauses to fighting, which

had allowed food and aid supplies to enter from 10 am to 8 pm, while also reporting it had recovered the bodies of two hostages and vowed its military offensive would return more.

The shift comes weeks after Israel first announced plans to widen

its offensive in Gaza City, where hundreds of thousands of displaced people are sheltering and enduring famine. The resumption of around-the-clock fighting is the latest escalation after Israel reported strikes in some of the city's key neighbourhoods and called up tens of thousands of reservists.

"We will intensify our strikes until we bring back all the kidnapped hostages and dismantle Hamas," Israeli army spokesperson Avichay Adraee said.

Bodies of hostages recovered
Israel on Friday said its military had recovered the bodies of two hostages, including an Israeli man who was killed in the Oct 7, 2023, attack that sparked the war.

The bodies of Ilan Weiss of Kibbutz Be'eri and another unnamed hostage were returned to Israel, Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's office said. (AP)

At least 49 died when boat carrying migrants capsized

NOUAKCHOTT (MAURITANIA), Aug 29: At least 49 people died and nearly 100 are still missing after a boat carrying migrants capsized this week, the Mauritanian coast guard said Friday.

Authorities said the boat came from Gambia and capsized Tuesday morning off the coast of Mhei-jrat.

"The boat left Gambia a week ago and had 160 people on board, including Senegalese and Gambian nationals," Mohamed Abdallah, the head of the coast guard, told The Associated Press.

"When the migrants saw the lights of the Mhei-jrat, they tried to move to one part of the boat, causing it to capsize," Abdallah said.

The official said 49 bodies have washed ashore and just 17 people have been rescued so far. The others remain missing, the official said.

In recent years, Mauritania's waters have become a highway for migrants across sub-Saharan Africa seeking to reach Europe, primarily the Canary Islands. In July 2024, a similar incident killed more than a dozen migrants on their way to Europe off Mauritania, with 150 others declared missing.

The country's authorities have tightened control and expulsion measures for migrants. Last year, it signed a 210 million-euro deal (USD 225 million) with the European Union in a deal aimed at deterring migrants from using the country to get to the European Union.

Mauritania has also been accused of abuse towards migrants who are transiting through the country in a nationwide coastal crackdown, according to human rights groups. (AP)

Peace efforts in limbo as Kyiv mourns 23 dead after Russian attack

KYIV, Aug 29: The death toll in a major Russian missile and drone strike on the Ukrainian capital rose to 23, including four children, officials said Friday, as US-led efforts to end the three-year war remain stuck in apparent limbo.

Authorities in the Kyiv region declared Friday an official day of mourning. Flags flew at half-staff and all entertainment events were cancelled after Russia hammered Ukraine with almost 600 drones and more than 30 missiles overnight from Wednesday to Thursday, including rare strikes on downtown Kyiv.

Rescue workers pulled 17 people from the rubble after the Kyiv attack, among them four children, Interior Minister Ihor Klymenko said. The youngest victim was a 2-year-old girl. Some bodies have yet to be identified, and eight people remain unaccounted for, authorities said. More than 50 people were injured.

"Thousands of personnel from the Interior Ministry's agencies and units worked at the strike sites in Kyiv, rotating every few hours," Klymenko said of the non-stop 30-hour rescue operation.

Efforts to stop the fighting with a ceasefire and end Europe's biggest conflict since World War II through a comprehensive peace settlement have made no progress.

US President Donald Trump has bristled at Putin's stalling on an American proposal for direct peace talks with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy. Trump said a week ago he expected to decide on next steps in two weeks if direct talks aren't scheduled.

Trump complained last month



that Putin "talks nice and then he bombs everybody". But the latest attack on Kyiv drew no public condemnation from the Trump administration, with White House press secretary Karoline Leavitt noting that Ukraine has been striking Russian oil refineries.

European Union defence ministers expressed outrage Friday over Russia's continuing onslaught in Ukraine and vowed to exert more pressure on Moscow.

Putin is due to attend a summit meeting in China from Sunday that will also include Iran and North Korea, countries which like Beijing have aided Russia's war effort, according to the United States.

From Sept 9 world leaders are expected to attend the UN General Assembly where Russia's invasion will likely be discussed.

Meanwhile, Western officials are working on security guarantees for Ukraine that aim to deter another Russian invasion if a peace deal is signed.

Zelenskyy noted Friday that Russia hasn't budged from its terms for stopping its invasion. Ukraine, on the other hand, has accepted an American proposal

for a ceasefire and a meeting between Putin and Zelenskyy.

The Ukrainian leader urged countries to crank up the pressure on Russia's economy through sanctions and tariffs.

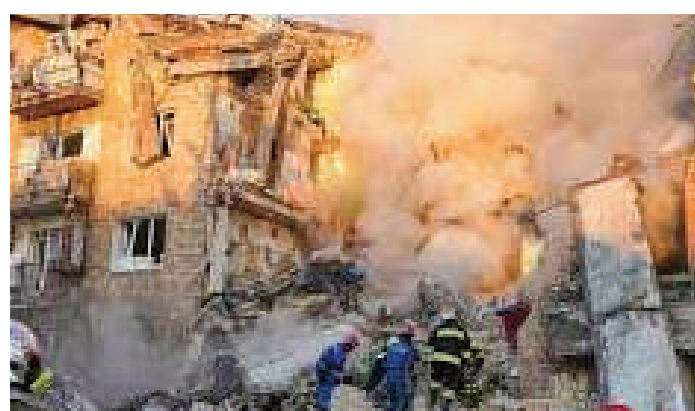
"Russia refused to stop the killing — they even said no" to President Trump. We're seeing negative signals from Russia regarding a possible leaders' summit," Zelenskyy said in a social media post. "Honestly, we think Putin is still interested only in continuing this war."

The Atlantic Council, a Washington think tank, noted that recent American presidents have shied away from taking a tougher line with Putin over fears of a potential nuclear conflict.

"Putin knows that Washington and its allies have more than enough capacity to reverse his gains in Ukraine, but it is nearly certain that he doubts the United States has the will to do so," the Atlantic Council said in an assessment this week.

It added that "the second Trump administration has repeatedly signalled that the United States has no vital interests at stake in this war." (AP)

Outraged over Russian strike on Kyiv, European defence leaders pledge pressure to end war



BRUSSELS, Aug 29: European defence ministers are meeting in Copenhagen to discuss the war in Ukraine, the day after a Russian air assault on Kyiv killed 23 people and badly damaged a European diplomatic compound.

Outrage over the attack propelled the political leaders of Europe's armed forces to condemn Russia even before Friday's meeting and call for stronger measures on Moscow like seizing frozen assets, further sanctions and increasing support for Ukraine's military and membership in the European Union.

They will also discuss European troops' deployment in Ukraine to guarantee security and monitor a peace that seems distant as American efforts to broker peace between Ukraine and Russia appear stalled.

"Everybody understands that, considering how (Russian President Vladimir) Putin is mocking the peace efforts, the only thing that works is pressure," said Kaja Kallas, foreign policy chief for the European Union.

Two missiles landed about 50 metres from an EU diplomatic mission in Kyiv, shattering the office's windows and doors but causing no injuries there. The EU summoned the Russian envoy in Brussels over the attack.

The UN Security Council scheduled an emergency meeting on airstrikes against Ukraine on Friday afternoon at the request of Ukraine and the five European council members — Britain, France, Slovenia, Denmark and Greece. Two of Ukraine's top envoys were set to meet Friday with the Trump administration regarding mediation.

White House press secretary Karoline Leavitt criticised both Putin and Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy after the Thursday attack on Kyiv.

She said that Trump "was not happy about this news, but he was also not surprised".

Leavitt noted that Ukraine has also launched effective assaults on Russia's oil industry in recent weeks.

"Perhaps both sides of this war are not ready to end it themselves," Leavitt said. "The president wants it to end, but the leaders of these two countries... must want it to end as well."

In Copenhagen, Kallas said defence ministers from across the 27-nation bloc would discuss increasing sanctions on Russia, ramping up defence supplies to Ukraine's army and

European contribution to post-war security guarantees, which could include EU training missions into Ukraine once a ceasefire is in place.

"We are discussing today how to change the mandate of those missions in order to be ready after any peace agreement is put in place," said Kallas, who called for harsher sanctions targeting Russia's economic lifelines.

On Thursday, the United States approved a \$825 million arms sale to Ukraine that will include extended-range missiles and related equipment to boost its defensive capabilities.

Lithuania's defence minister Dovile Skaliene said that the attack on Kyiv on Thursday shows that hope now for peace is "naive" and that "all Putin is doing is really stalling, actually cheaply buying time to kill more people and to imitate sort of willingness to maybe stop his own murderous actions."

She said Europe must deal with Russia more forcefully, like seizing frozen Russian assets.

"That is actually one power that we are not using enough yet," she said. "Over 200 billion of Russian assets would be extremely helpful in both pumping this money in Ukrainian defence industry and buying American weapons."

Simon Harris, Ireland's defence minister, said that more must be done to force Russia to end the war. "It's imperative that those of us in the European Union now consider further sanctions, what more measures can be taken to increase the pressure on Russia to end this brutal and aggressive war on Ukraine and the huge impact that that's having on civilians," he said. India, Japan ink pact for Chandrayaan-5 to explore moon together

TOKYO, Aug 29: India and Japan on Saturday signed the implementing arrangement for the Chandrayaan-5 mission, a joint exploration of the polar region of the moon by the space agencies of the two countries.

The Implementing Arrangement between the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) and Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency (JAXA) concerning Joint Lunar Polar Exploration Mission was inked on the sidelines of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit here.

The Chandrayaan-5 mission aims to study the lunar volatile materials, including lunar water, in the vicinity of a Permanently Shadowed Region (PSR) in the lunar South pole. The mission will be launched by JAXA onboard its H3-24L launch vehicle, carrying the ISRO-made lunar lander, which



will carry the Japan-made lunar rover. ISRO, apart from developing the lunar lander, is also responsible for developing a few scientific instruments for the mission for exploration and in-situ analysis of the volatiles reserved in the lunar polar region. "I am glad that India and Japan are joining hands for the next edition of the Chandrayaan series or the LUPEX (Lunar Polar Exploration) mission.

This will contribute to deepening our understanding of the permanently shadowed regions at the lunar south pole," Modi said in an interview with The Yomiuri Shinbun.

"Our G2G collaboration in the space sector, between ISRO and JAXA, is fostering a culture of cooperation between our industries and startups. This is creating an ecosystem where innovation flows both

ways — from labs to launch pads, and from research to real-world applications," Modi said.

The Prime Minister said he was confident that the scientific teams of India and Japan will be working together to push the boundaries of space science. "And, our partnership in space will not only expand horizons above us, but also improve lives around us," Modi said.

He said India's space journey is a story of determination, hard work and innovation of the country's scientists.

"From Chandrayaan-3's historic landing on the moon's south pole to our advances in interplanetary missions, India has consistently demonstrated that space is not the final frontier, it is the next frontier," Modi said. The Prime Minister said the impact of space science is linked to progress in our daily lives, from agriculture, disaster management, to communications and beyond. (PTI)

Body of missing student found in school compound

ITANAGAR, Aug 29: Police have recovered the body of a student, missing from his hostel, in Arunachal Pradesh's Kra Daadi district, an officer said on Friday.

Fifteen-year-old Taku Kania, a class 8 student of a private school in Palin, went missing on Thursday afternoon, Kra Daadi, Superintendent of Police Sepraj Perme said.

He said the school's principal had filed a missing report at the Palin police station.

Later, police and school authorities launched a manhunt for the missing student, but he could not be traced.

At around 6 am on Friday, police received a call from school authorities informing them about the recovery of the body of the missing student from the school compound, the SP said. The boy's body was found behind the hostel kitchen near a power transformer.

Prima facie, it appears to be a case of electrocu-

tion, the SP said, adding that an inquest and post-mortem have been done.

Police said the student must have been stressed as they were writing their exams and must have wandered and come into contact with a live wire.

He said the body has been handed over to the family for last rites.

An unnatural death case has been registered at Palin police station, and the investigation in the case is going on, the SP added. (PTI)

SC finds no 'misbehaviour' charge against Arunachal public service commission member

NEW DELHI, Aug 29: The Supreme Court on Thursday did not find any proof of charges of "misbehaviour" against an Arunachal Pradesh Public Service Commission (APPSC) member in the examination paper leak case and directed revocation of her suspension forthwith.

A bench of Justices J K Maheshwari and Aravind Kumar answered the Presidential Reference Article 317(1) of the Constitution of India which deals with removal and suspension of the chairman or member of a public service commission and said no charges were made out against APPSC member Mepung Tadar Bage. "The actions alleged against the Respondent do not meet the threshold of 'misbehaviour'; rather, they do not even meet the threshold of 'lapse' which has a lower threshold. It is not a case where the Respondent was unable to maintain the standard of conduct expected of a Member of a Commission and her actions alone brought disrepute to the APPSC," the bench said.

It added, "In view of the foregoing, the inescapable conclusion on the allegations of charges as made in the reference is that the allegations have not been proved. In terms of Order XLIII Rule 5 of the Supreme Court Rules, 2013 and answering the reference under Article 317(1) of the Constitution of India, this report with recommendation shall be sent to the President of India that the charges as alleged do not bring about any act of 'misbehaviour' by Ms. Mepung Tadar Bage for taking action within its contours."

The bench said the court further recommends that her suspension be revoked forthwith and she would be entitled to all consequential and monetary benefits.

The top court also found fault with the decision of the state government to recommend for Presidential reference under Article 317(1) which contemplates that the chairman or any other member of a public service commission can only be removed by an order of the president of India on the ground of misbehaviour.

It further contemplates that the said misbehaviour may be proved by inquiry before the Supreme Court following the procedure prescribed in Order XLIII of the Supreme Court Rules, 2013 framed under Article 145(1)(j) of the Constitution of India and the report in this regard shall be submitted to the president of India.

"In our view, the act of the State requesting the President of India to initiate the removal of the Respondent is arbitrary, unfair and discriminatory," the bench said in its 77-page verdict.

It noted that after the leakage of the question paper for Mains Examination for the post of Assistant Engineer (Civil) came to light, the state made a reference to the Inquiry Committee and the chairman and fellow members of the APPSC submitted their resignations on moral grounds and for other reasons.

The bench noted that following the resignation, two members of the commission were sworn in as the state chief information commissioner of Arunachal Pradesh and as chairperson of the Arunachal Pradesh Private Educational Institutions Regulatory Commission. "If the members of the APPSC who were allegedly collectively found involved in the paper leak as per the letter of Chief Minister, later resigned and got assignment of new post by the State, it is a question to ponder upon, which ought to be looked into by the State especially so when Article 319(d) of the Constitution of India bars members of a State Public Service Commission from taking up any other employment either under the Government of India or under the Government of a State after they cease to be in office," the bench said.

It added that in the court's view, if the members were collectively involved, the act of the state government bequeathing responsibility upon such members, giving them assignment of posts having responsibilities, clearly goes to indicate that there was nothing against the chairman or any member of the commission showing their indictment in a personal capacity of committing any act or omission which may prove misbehaviour on their part. sity, in her address, highlighted the importance of education in empowering communities and urged students to stay determined despite challenges in life.

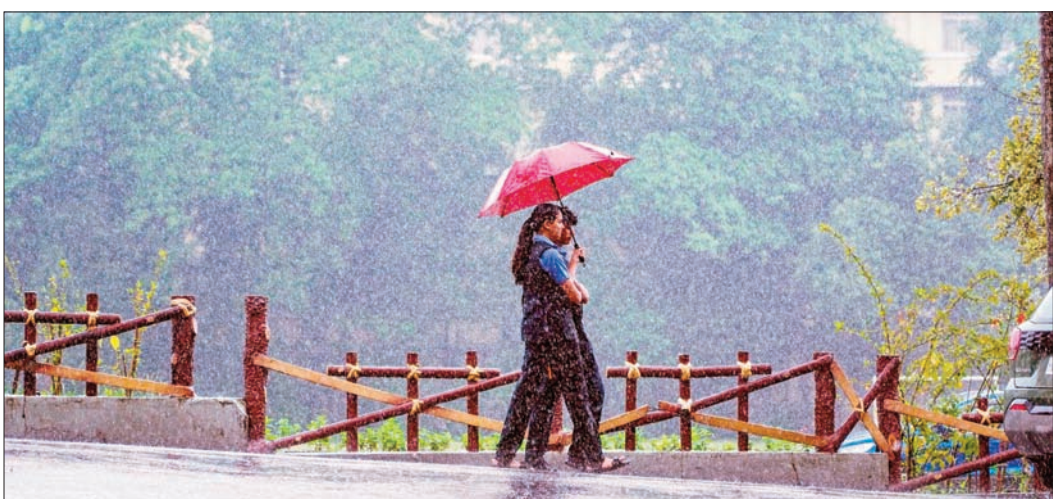

IMD issues heavy rain alerts for Arunachal Pradesh



ITANAGAR, Aug 29: The India Meteorological Department (IMD) forecast thunderstorms, lightning and heavy to very heavy rain in parts of Arunachal Pradesh for two days since Friday.

Heavy rain measuring 7 to 11 cm in 24 hours is very likely at isolated places in West Siang and Namsai districts, while Papum Pare may experience very heavy

rainfall in the range of 12 to 20 cm in a single day.

The shower, with comparatively less intensity, is likely to continue till September 3.

A bulletin issued by the meteorological centre here said that the weather conditions could cause poor visibility, temporary disruption of traffic due to waterlogging and uprooted trees, and longer

travel time.

It also warned of flooding of low-lying areas, landslides, mudslides and flash floods triggered by intense spells of rain.

The department further pointed out that agricultural and horticultural crops face risks from heavy rain and gusty winds, with chances of soil erosion, seed displacement and poor germination in fields al-

ready sown.

Advisories issued by the weather office suggested that residents avoid waterlogged and landslide-prone areas, follow traffic guidelines, and stay away from weak structures during heavy rainfall.

Farmers were asked to provide proper drainage in fields, use mulching materials to protect soil and roots, support vegetable pandals, and postpone sowing of seeds where possible.

The rainfall will gradually reduce in the next few days.

On August 30 and 31, heavy rainfall is likely to persist over the eastern and central parts of the state.

On September 1, widespread moderate rain with isolated heavy spells will occur, particularly in the foothill districts adjoining Assam. The rainfall is expected to become scattered the next day, although isolated heavy showers may occur over the eastern and central belts. Light to moderate rain is expected at many places on September 3, the IMD said. (PTI)

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BJP workers storm Bihar Cong HQ over 'abusive language' targeting PM

PATNA, Aug 29: The issue of the alleged abuse hurled at Prime Minister Narendra Modi during Rahul Gandhi's 'Voter Adhikar Yatra' in Bihar spilled out on the streets on Friday when BJP workers stormed the state Congress headquarters, prompting the Leader of the Opposition in Lok Sabha to declare "truth always triumphs".

While the person who had allegedly screamed expletives into the mic at Darbhanga two days ago was arrested, BJP workers in the state capital staged a march to the Sadaqat Ashram, the BPCC headquarters, and clashed with their counterparts in the opposition party. "We will not tolerate the insult to Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Rahul Gandhi, his party and alliance partners will have to apologise," said state minister Nitin Nabin who had led the procession from the BJP office, situated a couple of kilometres from Sadaqat Ashram. Gandhi, who was in Gopalganj, about 120 kms away, and is likely to be in Patna on Monday when the Yatra will conclude, came out with an X post in Hindi, indirectly referring to the clash. "Violence and falsehood stand no chance before truth and non-violence. Indulge in assault and vandalism to your heart's content. We will continue our fight to protect truth and the Constitution. Truth always triumphs! (Satyamev Jayate)", wrote Gandhi.

Congress general secretary Sachin Pilot, who is accompanying Gandhi, was more blunt.

"Whoever used abusive language deserves condemnation. But it is wrong to associate the Con-



gress and the INDIA bloc with the episode. And the attack on our party's state headquarters was abominable. We hope the Bihar government takes appropriate action against the accused. It is clear that the BJP is rattled by the success of Voter Adhikar Yatra", said Pilot. Addressing the same press conference, RJD national spokesman Manoj Jha said, "We took no time in condemning the incident. But has the BJP ever apologised for many foul remarks made, over the years, by its top leaders, including the Prime Minister himself? They are the followers of Nathuram Godse who assassinated Mahatma Gandhi."

Today, they could not have fired bullets, so they wielded sticks, Jha said and claiming that it was an attempt by the saffron party to make headlines. "The BJP, which rules the Centre, may get so-called mood of the nation surveys published in its favour, but it knows that if elections are held today,

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will be left looking for options for himself," he said. Congress general secretary (organisation) K C Venugopal wrote on X: "Baffled by the soaring popularity of the Voter Adhikar Yatra, the BJP has once again unleashed its hooligans to intimidate and scare us. The attack on our Bihar PCC office Sadaqat Ashram in Patna, led by a cabinet minister and other BJP leaders, is an act of cowardice."

The Bihar police must take strict and exemplary action against perpetrators of this crime, he said.

Diksha, Superintendent of Police, Patna Central, said, "Injuries have been sustained by people from both sides. The situation has been brought under control. Further action may be taken after investigation."

Notably, abusive language was used in Jale assembly segment of Darbhanga on Wednesday when Gandhi, his sister and Congress general secretary Priyanka Vadra

and RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav had passed through the district on motorcycles.

On Thursday, local Congress leader Mohd Naushad, who has been named in a case lodged at Simri police station by Darbhanga BJP president Adityan Narayan "Manna", admitted that the video was of a podium he had got erected, but claimed that profane language was used by people not known to him in his absence. On Friday, Darbhanga police identified the culprit as Mohd Rizvi alias Raja, a 20-year-old resident of Singhwara, and arrested him.

Meanwhile, senior Congress leader Pawan Khera, who heads the party's media and publicity department, claimed that he suspected the "BJP toolkit" at work.

"We would like to know who had instigated the person to indulge in such behaviour. It is obvious that we would not do anything that would take the focus away from Yatra. The BJP toolkit works by planting such elements in gatherings of opposition parties so that its leaders can later on raise a huge and cry," Khera said.

Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah claimed that the BJP attacked the Congress office, which is a "historical building where the freedom movement took place", as the saffron party were disturbed by Rahul Gandhi's yatra.

"They are afraid of Rahul ji's growing popularity; they know they're going to lose the upcoming elections. That's why they attacked the Congress office," he said in a video clip shared by the Congress in its X handle. (PTI)

Bihar SIR row: SC to hear RJD, AIMIM pleas on extension of deadline for claim filing on Sep 8

NEW DELHI, Aug 29: The Supreme Court on Friday agreed to hear on September 8 pleas of the RJD and AIMIM for extending the deadline to file claims and objections in the special intensive revision of electoral rolls in poll-bound Bihar.

The deadline for filing claims and objections is September 1.

A bench of Justices Surya Kant, Joymalya Bagchi and Vipul M Pancholi said it would hear the applications of the political parties on September 8.

"List all the interlocutory applications along with the main matter on September 8," the order said.

Advocate Prashant Bhushan and senior advocate Shob Alam, appearing for the Rashtriya Janta Dal (RJD), mentioned to the bench about several parties filing pleas for the extension of the deadline.

Advocate Nizam Pasha, appearing for the AIMIM, sought the extension due to large-scale filing of claims and objections.

"The number of claims filed are exponentially rising. The deadline needs to be extended," Alam said.

Pasha said over 80,000 claims were filed before the August 22 order whereas after the order around 95,000 claims have been filed so far. "We are requesting that these applications be listed as early as possible," he said.

The bench asked the petitioners why they hadn't approached the Election Commission (EC) for relief. Bhushan claimed their request was not considered by the EC.

The plea filed by RJD through advocate Fauzia Shakil said in the SIR, the number of polling booths had increased to 90,712 and the



party appointed booth level agents (BLAs) in 47,506 polling booths which is approximately 52 per cent of the polling booths.

The party said after the August 22 court order, the claims along with Aadhaar card were collected by the BLAs and despite the acknowledgment of claims by booth level officers (BLO) claims were not lodged and were not reflected on the daily EC status report against the party to portray a wrong narrative that the BLAs of political parties were not cooperating and filing claims.

"Since the last order of this court dated August 22, 2025 which permitted the filing of claims along with Aadhaar card, the number of claims have doubled from 84,305 on August 22, 2025 to 1,78,948 electors on August 27, 2025 in only five days," the RJD said.

The plea alleged across districts, however, in many instances officers refused to accept the claims with the Aadhaar card only and instead insisted on one of the 11 doc-

uments mentioned in the ECI order of June 24 in "utter disregard to the orders passed by the court".

Seeking direction to the poll panel for extending the timeline by two weeks and accept the claims of deleted voters till September 15, the RJD said the EC's own daily SIR update showed the number of claims had increased and more than a lakh claims were filed in the last week and 33,349 claims were filed in the last two days.

"The period of filing claims expires on September 1, 2025. Unless extended, genuine electors whose names have been erroneously deleted by the EC will not be able to submit their claims and consequently will be barred from exercising their right to vote in the coming elections. The EC in its manual on electoral rolls has also mentioned that no suo moto deletion shall be done in the election year. In the present case, the period of filing claims, unless extended, will have an impact on the purity of electoral rolls," it added. (PTI)

IAF intensifies relief and rescue ops

NEW DELHI, Aug 29: The government on Friday said the Indian Air Force has intensified its relief and rescue operations in the flooded regions of northern India, with 215 people being rescued in the last three days.

Mi-17 and Chinook helicopters have conducted more than 55 sorties to rescue stranded civilians, including personnel from the Indian Army and Border Security Force (BSF), from inundated areas in Dera Baba Nanak and Pathankot in Punjab, and Akhnoor in Jammu and Kashmir, the officials said.

"The IAF has escalated its flood relief and rescue operations in northern India since August 27, focusing primarily on the severely affected Jammu and Punjab regions," the defence ministry said.

Also, C-130 transport aircraft have been deployed to facilitate the rapid movement of specialised National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) teams into the affected zones, it said.

And, 215 individuals have been rescued during the operations, while 7,300 kg of essential relief material has been delivered in affected areas in the past three days, the ministry said in a statement.

Current efforts are concentrated in northern Punjab, where the "situation remains most critical" due to the continuing high level of waters, which has hampered surface connectivity, officials said.

They said air assets are strategically tasked to maximise coverage and support.

Relief missions are being executed in close coordination with the Indian Army, the BSF, the NDRF and local administration to ensure timely evacuation and distribution of supplies, it said.

The IAF reaffirms its unwavering dedication to safeguarding citizens in distress and will continue to deploy required resources and personnel as the situation evolves, it added. (PTI)

Will write to all MPs urging them to consider my candidature: Reddy

MUMBAI, Aug 29: The Opposition's candidate for the vice presidential polls, B Sudershan Reddy, on Friday said he would write to Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha MPs urging them to consider his candidature.

If given an opportunity to serve as Vice President, he will protect and defend the Constitution, Reddy said at a press conference here.

He said his journey with the Constitution began in 1971 when he was enrolled as an advocate by the Bar Council of Andhra Pradesh, before going on to become a judge in the High Court and the Supreme Court.

"I am not a member of any political party. I have never been a member of any political party or organisation. I do not intend to be a member of any political party in future. Precisely, this is the reason I am the only candidate entitled to make a request to MPs belonging to all political parties, colours, hues, requesting them to consider my candidature on its own merits," he said.

"I propose to write a detailed letter to all members of both the Houses, individual letters to all members, appealing to them to consider my candidature," he added.

Reddy said he will appeal to their conscience.

The jurist said he was ready to meet the BJP leadership if given a chance.

The vice presidential poll, necessitated by the sudden resignation of Jagdeep Dhankhar recently, has been described by the Opposition as an ideological battle.

The numbers, however, are stacked in favour of the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party-led National Democratic Alliance, which has nominated Maharashtra Governor C P Radhakrishnan for the September 9 election.

Earlier in the day, Reddy met Shiv Sena (UBT) chief Uddhav Thackeray and NCP (SP) president Sharad Pawar as he canvassed for votes for the vice presidential polls.

Thackeray told Reddy that his party and other Maha Vikas Aghadi constituents are wholeheartedly backing him in the VP election.

The Shiv Sena (UBT) chief said miracles can happen, hoping for Reddy's victory. He said those NDA MPs who have love for the country can vote for Reddy.

"The consensus on my candidature among the Opposition would not have been possible without Uddhav Thackeray's backing," Reddy said.

After meeting Pawar at his residence, Reddy said he came to seek the blessings of a statesman who built modern Maharashtra.

He described Pawar as a personality whose imprint is visible in every major political, social and economic development of the last five decades.

Backing Reddy's candidature, Pawar said a chief minister was arrested inside Raj Bhavan when NDA's nominee Radhakrishnan was the governor of Jharkhand, and asked what dignity he would bring to India's second-highest constitutional post.

"I respect the chair of the governor. But I cannot forget that when he was the governor of Jharkhand, the chief minister of that state, who comes from a tribal community, was arrested inside the Raj Bhavan despite his request not to do so," he said, referring to the arrest of Hemant Soren last year.

"This shows what his views are about institutions and maintaining their dignity. And now such a person has been made a candidate for vice president," Pawar said after meeting Reddy at his Mumbai residence. (PTI)

CBI grills TMC MLA Atin Ghosh over RG Kar hospital graft case

KOLKATA, Aug 29: CBI officers questioned TMC MLA Atin Ghosh at his north Kolkata residence for nearly two and a half hours on Friday over the alleged financial irregularities at the RG Kar Medical College and Hospital that the agency is probing alongside the rape and murder of a postgraduate intern within the institution premises last year, officials said.

Ghosh, also the deputy mayor of Kolkata Municipal Corporation, is the second TMC lawmaker, after the party's Sreerampram MLA Sudipto Roy, to face the agency's examination in connection with the case.

Emerging from the questioning session, Ghosh said he answered all queries put before him by the CBI officers but refused to divulge further details on the grounds that the matter was sub-judice. His statements were recorded by the investigating agency.

The leader confirmed, though, that the agency's questions revolved around the functions of the hospital's Patient Welfare Committee, of which he was an ex-officio member on account of him being the MLA of the local Kashiapur-Belgachhia constituency.

"I have been the local MLA since 2021 and have attended some 8-10 meetings of the RG Kar Patient Welfare Committee. The committee held some 3-4 meetings annually and the CBI wanted to know about the role of the body in running the hospital administration and my involvement in it," Ghosh said, holding up the agency notice certifying that the legislator was questioned as a witness to the case under Section 179 of the BNSS.

A team of two CBI officers, accompanied by a contingent of armed central paramilitary troops, landed up at Ghosh's Shyambazar residence, APC Abasan, an apartment building on APC Road, at around 2.15 pm.

The officers, who were seen carrying document files when they walked inside Ghosh's house, left the premises at around 5 pm. "The CBI had called me and informed me about their intentions to question me in connection with the case. At first, I disbelieved them because of such fraudulent calls one gets from scammers these days. I have no regrets that the agency visited my house," Ghosh said.

The CBI previously arrested five accused, including the college's former principal Sandip Ghosh, in connection with the case, all of whom are currently in jail.

The arrests were made following the gruesome rape and murder of the junior doctor on August 9 last year and a subsequent complaint of multi-crore corruption and a 'syndicate raj' prevalent at the institution, al-

legedly at the behest of the hospital's Patient Welfare Committee.

The complainant, Akhtar Ali, a former deputy superintendent of the medical college, alleged trafficking of bodies and biomedical waste from the hospital by its authorities, besides bribery and large scale financial irregularities involving nepotism by means of fraudulent work orders and bypassing of tenders.

On August 29, last year, the CBI submitted its preliminary chargesheet in the financial corruption case at RG Kar hospital in Alipore Court, naming five people, including Ghosh who doubled up as the Committee secretary. Charges against all five were framed in court in July this year under multiple sections of the Prevention of Corruption Act.

Sources confirmed that the Trinamool legislator was questioned after his name cropped up during the course of the investigation.

"Atin Ghosh was an ex-officio member of the RG Kar Patient Welfare Committee and his role in that body needs to be ascertained. We examined him as part of this ongoing investigation," an official said.

A week ago, the CBI conducted search operations at the north Kolkata residence of another TMC MLA and doctor Sudipto Roy in Sinthi for his alleged involvement in the financial irregularities case.

Roy, a legislator from Sreerampram, was the chairperson of the Patient Welfare Committee at RG Kar hospital at the time of the crime and is also the president of the West Bengal Medical Council.

The CBI, as well as the ED, has conducted multiple raids at Roy's house in the past for his alleged involvement in the case. Responding to the Friday raids at Ghosh's residence, the father of the RG Kar victim said he felt a "wee bit happy" that the TMC leader's name "finally surfaced" in connection with the crime.

"We always doubted his involvement in various matters of RG Kar. But his name never came to the forefront before. We are happy that he is finally under the CBI's scanner," he said.

Union minister and BJP leader Sukanta Majumdar questioned the activities of the committees across state-run hospitals and their composition.

"This patient welfare committee is a curious thing. The posts here are almost always exclusively reserved for TMC leaders. Atin Ghosh has derived the sweeteners from this panel for so long, it's time for him now to taste the bitter agency pill," Majumdar said. (PTI)

Cremations done on rooftops as spate in Ganga, Varuna rivers inundates Varanasi ghats

VARANASI/BALLIA (UP), Aug 29: The rising water levels in Ganga and Varuna rivers have caused a fresh bout of floods in Varanasi, inundating low-lying areas along their banks and disrupting daily life.

According to the Central Water Commission, the water level in Ganga touched 71 metres on Friday, setting its warning mark of 70.262 metres.

The danger level for the city is 71.262 metres.

All of Varanasi's famous ghats are under water. At the Manikamika and Harishchandra ghats, cremations are being carried out on rooftops and in nearby alleys. The famous 'Ganga Aarti' at Dashashwamedh Ghat is now being performed symbolically on a nearby roof.

In areas like Ramana, Samne Ghat, Nagwa, Konia and Hukulganj, floodwaters have entered homes.

Ramesh Singh, a resident of Sangampuri in Nagwa, said he is living on the second floor of his house as the first floor is flooded. "I haven't been able to leave the house for two days," he said, adding that relatives and acquaintances are delivering food. "The menace of mosquitoes has increased a lot," he noted.

Singh explained that the floodwater re-entered homes two days ago, even after residents had cleaned

up from the last bout of flooding.

"The children in our neighbourhood are wading through water to go to school, as it is not possible for boats to enter the alley," he said.

Sampurnanand, a resident of Ramana, said that after the previous flood, farmers had sown seeds for crops like beans and eggplants, which have now been ruined. Shantanu Kumar Sinwar, Sub-Divisional Magistrate of Rajatalab, confirmed that crops in some fields have been damaged. He noted that flood relief centres are active, but most people who had previously evacuated have returned home.

"All preparations for the flood are complete," he said. "If people return to the flood relief centres, all preparations are in place. Relief materials, including medicines and all necessary supplies, are available at the flood relief centres, along with a team of doctors and nurses." Rising water levels in Ganga and Saryu rivers have flooded Ballia, forcing residents of border areas to deal with significant problems.

The Mahavir Ghat at the district headquarters is submerged, and cremations are now being performed on the road near the under-construction Greenfield Expressway, officials said. (PTI)

NEW DELHI, Aug 29: The

Supreme Court-mandated Central Empowered Committee (CEC) has sought a ban on Conocarpus, a fast-growing exotic species planted widely in India for quick greening of roads and urban spaces, saying it poses grave ecological and public health risks.

In a 40-page report submitted to the apex court, the CEC described the tree as "ecologically unsuitable" and said its unchecked spread threatens biodiversity, groundwater, infrastructure and human health.

"The Conocarpus plant, although tempting for roadside plantation and quick creation of green belts, has serious negative interactions in terms of health risks and environmental degradation, which makes it quite unsuitable from an ecological point of view," it said.

The committee said the tree is often referred to as a "green desert" because it provides almost no nectar or shelter for birds, bees or other insects.



Its dense canopy and chemical-laden leaf litter suppress native plant growth, damaging natural regeneration, the CEC said.

"Due to its prolific nature and varied adaptability to different climatic conditions, it poses a threat to native ecosystems. This will become yet another invasive species," the report cautioned.

Imported from the Americas and Africa, Conocarpus erectus and Conocarpus lancifolius were introduced in India over the past two

decades as drought-tolerant and low-maintenance trees that could withstand pollution, salinity and poor soils.

Their rapid growth and evergreen foliage made them popular in Gujarat, Telangana, Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu. But the CEC found that these very traits have turned the tree into a silent threat.

The committee said its roots are aggressive and penetrate deep into aquifers, depleting shallow

groundwater in arid regions like Kachchh.

In cities like Ahmedabad and Hyderabad, root intrusion from Conocarpus plantations has caused frequent damage to footpaths, underground pipelines and building foundations, the report said.

The CEC said pollen from the tree aggravates asthma, rhinitis and respiratory allergies, especially in children and the elderly.

Tamil Nadu reported "many cases of pollen allergies during the flowering season", prompting the state to impose a ban earlier this year.

The report also flagged fire hazards, saying the tree produces dry, brittle wood that is "highly flammable during summer months, increasing the risk of accidental fires in public spaces".

The committee listed allelopathic impacts too. Studies suggest the species releases chemicals into the soil that inhibit the growth of nearby vegetation, alter soil pH and disrupt local ecosystems. (PTI)

Rio hints at breakthrough after cabinet's talks with MHA officials in Delhi FNTA issue almost resolved: Nagaland CM Rio



KOHHIMA, Aug 29: Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio on Friday said the discussions on the demand for Frontier Nagaland Territory Authority (FNTA) by the people of the six eastern districts are nearing conclusion.

The Eastern Nagaland Peoples' Organisation (ENPO), the apex body representing eight tribes across Mon, Tuensang, Longleng, Kiphire, Noklak, and Shamator

districts, has been demanding a separate state since 2010, alleging decades of neglect.

"For your information, we have almost resolved the FNTA issue," Rio said while briefing the press on the recent visit of the state cabinet to New Delhi.

Responding to PTI on why the cabinet returned without meeting Union Home Minister Amit Shah, he said, "No, he sent his delega-

tion, the home secretary, the IB director, and the joint secretary (Northeast). We had a long discussion, and I also had one-to-one meetings with them. So our mission is accomplished, and next time when I go, I am asked to have a one-to-one meeting again."

The ENPO boycotted the 2024 Lok Sabha elections and also did not participate in urban local body polls over its demand for a separate state.

In April, the organisation agreed to the Centre's proposal for a certain degree of autonomy under the FNTA framework, suspending its agitation for statehood.

The ENPO has stated that the FNTA arrangement would be subject to review after 10 years, and that remaining issues will be addressed through democratic and political means.

The organisation has also stated that it will not sign any agreement without firm assurances of financial, legislative, and executive autonomy. (PTI)

TCK. A tripartite meeting was held in New Delhi on July 23 among officials from the Ministry of Home Affairs, the Nagaland government, and ENPO representatives.

The meeting was understood to have resolved several contentious issues, leaving only a few for the Nagaland government to work on.

On the speculation that the final agreement on FNTA will be signed by October, Rio said, "We have already cleared our side, so it is up to them to arrange, and then bring us the final draft."

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Nagaland honours 151 sports persons on National Sports Day

KOHHIMA, Aug 29: Nagaland honoured 151 sportspersons from across the state, who excelled at Northeast, national and international levels, on the occasion of National Sports Day on Friday.

In his address at a function, Advisor for Youth Resources and Sports, S Keosho Yimkhung, announced that the state government is drafting a new sports policy in line with the 'Khelo Bharat Niti 2025'. He said the policy will strengthen the state's sports ecosystem and reflect athletes' interests.

Extending greetings on behalf of the government, Yimkhung congratulated the awardees and said the day marks the birth anniversary of the hockey wizard Major Dhyan Chand, whose life remains an inspiration for generations of athletes.

He said the state has been developing sports infrastructure across all 17 districts.

"Most districts have already been equipped with modern stadiums, futsal courts and other facilities, while projects are in the

pipeline in the remaining districts," he said.

He urged the police to provide job opportunities to promising athletes.

Nagaland Director General of Police Rupin Sharma, in his address, highlighted both the passion and challenges of pursuing sports in the state.

Former Arunachal minister Thinghap Taiju dies, leaders pay tributes

ITANAGAR, Aug 29: Former Arunachal Pradesh Minister Thinghap Taiju died at his residence in Changlang district on Friday, family sources said.

Taiju had been unwell for the past two days and was on oxygen support. He was aged over 70 and is survived by wife, two sons, and a daughter. Taiju first entered the Assembly by winning the Changlang North constituency seat in 1995 as an independent candidate and later retained it in 1999 on a Congress ticket. In 2009, he returned as a Congress legislator from the same constituency.

He had served as deputy minister of Geology and Mining under the Gegong Apang government, and later as a minister of state for IFCD and education under the Mukut Mithi and Dorjee Khandu governments, respectively.

In September 2022, Taiju formally joined the BJP. Chief Minister Pema Khandu expressed deep sorrow at Taiju's demise.

"I am deeply saddened by the demise of Former Minister Shri Thinghap Taiju Ji. His dedicated service and contribution to the state will always be remembered. My heartfelt condolences to his family and loved ones during this difficult time. May his soul find eternal peace and light," Khandu said in a post on X.

Deputy Chief Minister Chowna Mein also conveyed grief over the passing away of the veteran leader.

"Saddened to learn about the demise of former Minister Shri Thinghap Taiju Ji. He devoted his life to the service of Arunachal Pradesh, leaving an enduring legacy of leadership, dedication, and commitment to the people. His contributions to the state's growth and welfare will always be remembered," Mein said in a social media post. He added, "My heartfelt condolences to his family, friends, and all his well-wishers. May his soul rest in eternal peace." (PTI)

Tripura CM mulls to use Bangladesh's Titas River water for 51 wards of Agartala

AGARTALA, Aug 29: Tripura Chief Minister Manik Saha on Friday said he is contemplating the use of water from the Titas River for supplying drinking water to all 51 wards of the Agartala Municipal Corporation.

Saha made this announcement after inaugurating the Vivekananda Township Project at Kaman Chowmahani, Agartala.

"Our government is transparent and we are working for the betterment of the people. These flats are for the lower-income group, middle-income group, and higher-income group. We were waiting to hand over the keys to the flat owners, and now we have done it. I want to thank TUDA for constructing such flats in the heart of Agartala," said Saha.

He added that these flats are earthquake-resistant.

"We are working for development, and there is no talk without development. From January till August, we have inaugurated and laid foundation stones worth Rs 800 crore. This is what the BJP-led government is about. We have formed TUDA to construct beautiful buildings for comfortable living. We have also given permission for high-rise buildings by following all rules," he said.

Saha further informed that the main aim of TUDA is to build



modern flats for economically weaker and middle-class people.

"We are also constructing roads. Another project of 216 flats at a cost of around Rs 96 crore is underway near the Bhagat Singh Youth Hostel. It is expected to be completed by March next year," he said.

The Chief Minister also said he has requested the Centre to remove the cap on loan amounts for externally aided projects.

"There are many states where such a cap does not exist. But in our case, due to many ongoing development works, we are facing issues because of this cap," he said.

He also informed that work on preparing GIS master plans for 20 urban areas of the state is underway. The master plan for Agartala

city is already about 70% complete and development projects worth around Rs 530 crore have been undertaken in the first phase of the Mukhyamantri Nagar Unnayan Prakaalpa with the help of ADB.

Speaking about the drinking water issue, Saha said, "The water of the Haora, Kalapania, or Katakhal canal mix with the Titas River. I have good knowledge of the Titas River. I have proposed that water from the Titas River be supplied to the 51 wards of Agartala Municipal Corporation as drinking water. Proposals have been given, and if everything goes as planned, we will raise this matter with the Centre so that we can provide iron-free water. We are working on this," he added.

Kohima lacks prescribed air quality standards, says NPCB

DIMAPUR, Aug 29: Aghali A Swu, senior environmental engineer, Nagaland Pollution Control Board (NPCB), on Friday said the state capital Kohima does not meet the national ambient air quality standards.

Citing air quality data collected by the Magog Pollution Control Board since 2010, Swu said Kohima town is yet to reach the prescribed air quality standards of 60 micrograms per cubic meter.

Delivering the keynote address at a talk show on International Day of Clean Air for Blue Skies, 2025, organised by the NPCB, at Capital Convention Centre in Kohima, she also said Kohima and Dimapur failed to meet the prescribed air quality standards for five consecutive years from 2011 to 2015, per the Central Pollution Control Board.

Swu said under the National Air Monitoring Programme, the Magog Pollution Control Board has set up four manual air monitoring stations and one continuous ambient air quality monitoring station in Kohima. She stated that with the Union ministry of environment, forest and climate change, launching the

National Clean Air Programme in 2019, various stakeholders are involved to implement action plans to mitigate air pollution in Dimapur and Kohima towns.

She emphasised that achieving clean air is not the sole responsibility of the stakeholders but a shared responsibility that rests on each one of us. She said it can be attained only through collective action by protecting our environment and building a future for blue skies, clean air and healthy lives.

The NPCB hosted the talk show, under the National Clean Air Programme "The Air We Share : Bridging Policy and Public Action", calling for collaboration between various stakeholders, civil societies and the public to bring about tangible changes and achieve meaningful progress to ensure clean air.

Kohima DC B Henok Buchem, SP Kirodi Rhetso, member secretary, NPCB, Hukato K Chishi, MD (respiratory medicine) Dr Kezholenu Sakhrrie, and a BA 3rd semester student of Oriental College Kohima Angile were the panelists of the show, which was moderated by Rongsenben Longkumer, junior scientific assistant, NPCB.

Meth tablets worth ₹ 144 crore seized, 3 arrested

AIZAWL, Aug 29: In a major blow to trans-border narcotics smuggling, the Border Security Force (BSF) in a special joint operation with the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) seized 9.6 lakh tablets of methamphetamine (Yaba) worth over ₹ 144 crore and arrested 3 persons in Serchhip district, the paramilitary force said in a statement on Friday.

This is the second such major haul of meth tablets by the BSF in the past few days. Acting on a tip off, the BSF troops and NCB officials launched a joint operation and intercepted a pickup truck near Serchhip town on Thursday, the statement said.

The team recovered 9.6 lakh methamphetamine tablets worth ₹ 144 crore from the vehicle and arrested three residents of Aizawl for possessing the contraband, it said.

Earlier on August 21, the BSF, NCB and Mizoram Excise and Narcotics department seized 5 lakh tablets of methamphetamine and 36 grams of heroin altogether worth ₹ 75 crore during a joint operation on the Aizawl-Champhai highway (NH-6) between Keifang and Seling villages about 60 km from Aizawl.

Eight people and four vehicles used for transporting the contraband were seized during the special joint operation. (PTI)

No law in Nagaland prohibits women from working during night hours

DIMAPUR, Aug 29: Nagaland labour commissioner SL Wati Aier on Friday clarified that notwithstanding the wording of Section 20 of the Nagaland Shops & Establishments Act, 1982, there is no law presently in force in Nagaland that prohibits women from working during night hours.

Issuing a clarification regarding Section 20 of the Nagaland Shops & Establishments Act, 1986 - Employment of women during night hours - Aier said women may be engaged in employment beyond 7 pm or before 6 am, subject to their safeguards.

The official said employment during

night hours will be only with the voluntary and written consent of the concerned woman employee.

Regarding safety measures, Aier stated that adequate transportation, lighting, and security arrangements must be provided to ensure safety during travel and at the workplace.

He stated that all provisions relating to working hours, overtime, rest intervals, and weekly holidays under the Act and relevant labour laws must be complied with in full, as per the labour laws.

The labour commissioner added that this notification, issued with the approval of the competent authority, will be applicable with immediate effect.

BEE index lauds states' progress in energy audits, retrofits, and clean mobility initiatives

Tripura and Assam among top performers in State Energy Efficiency Index 2024

AGARTALA, Aug 29: Tripura and Assam have emerged as leaders among smaller and medium energy-consuming states in the recently released State Energy Efficiency Index (SEEI) 2024, an initiative by the Bureau of Energy Efficiency (BEE) in association with the Alliance for an Energy Efficient Economy (AEEE).

The index, unveiled by Akash Tripathi, IAS, Additional Secretary, Ministry of Power and Director General, BEE, assesses the energy efficiency performance of 36 Indian states and Union Territories for FY 2023-24.

Tripura, with a total final energy consumption of less than 1 MToe, and Assam, consuming 1.5 MToe, have been recognised as top performers in their respective groups, reflecting strong on-ground implementation of energy efficiency measures.

SEEI 2024 evaluates states across seven critical sectors—Buildings, Industry, Municipal Services, Transport, Agriculture, Electricity Distribution Companies (DISCOMs), and Cross-Sector initiatives—using 66 indicators.

Speaking at the launch, Tripathi said, "India's energy transition is not just a response to climate imperatives – it is a strategic opportunity to foster innovation, resilience, and inclusive growth. Energy efficiency is a foundational pillar, offering impactful, low-cost solutions across sectors. The State Energy Efficiency Index 2024 brings a sharper focus on ground-



level implementation, sectoral outcomes, and measurable progress."

The sixth edition of the SEEI highlights significant advancements across sectors.

In Tripura and Assam, state-led initiatives such as energy audits, retrofits, technology demonstrations, and capacity-building programmes have strengthened performance.

Key developments include the adoption of the Energy Conservation Building Code in the Buildings sector, MSME energy efficiency poli-

cies in Industry, climate action plans in municipalities, electric mobility policies in Transport, and solar-powered agricultural pumps in the Agriculture sector.

The SEEI 2024 also shows growing adoption of demand-side management strategies and reports that all 36 states and UTs have developed State Energy Efficiency Action Plans, with 31 forming State-Level Steering Committees on Energy Transition under the chairmanship of their Chief Secretaries.

NEW DELHI, Aug 29: Legendary rock band Linkin Park will perform in India for the first time as one of the headliners of Lollapalooza India 2026, organisers announced on Friday.

Linkin Park, which paused live shows following the death of frontman Chester Bennington in 2017, made its comeback in 2024 with a new lead vocalist, putting to rest years of speculation about the band's future.

son, Joe Hahn, Dave Farrell and Colin Brittain, introduced its new album "From Zero", led by singles "Lost" and "Friendly Fire".

"For over 20 years, Linkin Park's music has soundtracked personal journeys across the world and in India their fan base has only grown stronger. Their debut is one of the most anticipated moments in India's live music history," BookMyShow Live, promoter and co-producer of the festival, said.

Lollapalooza India, returning for its fourth edition, will also feature rapper Playboi Carti, Yungblud, Kehlani, Knock2, LANY, Fujii Kaze, Calum Scott and several other global acts.

BookMyShow Live, the live entertainment experiential division of BookMyShow, spearheads Lollapalooza India as the promoter and co-producer for the festival's Indian edition along with global producers, Perry Farrell and C3 Presents.

'I HAVE THREE WEEKS FOR WORLDS' TIMING WAS NOT GOOD AT DL FINALE: NEERAJ CHOPRA



ZURICH, Aug 29: Indian javelin throw star Neeraj Chopra acknowledged that his timing was off in the Diamond League Finals in which he finished second but he is hopeful of hitting his strides at the World Championships next month in Tokyo, where he is the defending champion.

The two-time Olympic medalist finished runner-up in the Diamond League Finale for the third time in a row as Julian Weber of Germany lifted his maiden trophy with two 90m-plus throws in a commanding show here on Thursday.

Chopra was lying third till the fifth round following his opening throw of 84.35m before his final effort of 85.01m took him to the second spot, overtaking 2012 London Olympics gold winner Keshorn Walcott of Trinidad and Tobago who ended third with 84.95m.

"The timing was not so good today (Thursday), run-up was not so good. There is something I didn't find today, but I still have

three weeks for the World Championships, and I will try my best," Chopra said after the event on Thursday.

The Tokyo Olympic gold medalist had crossed 90m for the first time earlier this year at the Doha Diamond League, but has on numerous occasions said he needs to improve his technique to hit the mark consistently.

"This was not too bad. But we are getting very close to the World Championships, so I still need to throw a little bit farther. There were a few things that went well, but still, there were the things which did not go that well," Chopra said.

"In the last attempt, I still managed to throw 85. But I am very happy for Julian (Weber), he managed to throw really far, and to show 91m was really good. We will see in three weeks.

"I still need to train a little bit. In this sport, we do not know. It depends on the day."

On how his season was shaping up ahead of the World Champi-

onships, the Paris Olympics silver-medallist said, "It's going well and today was a hard day. There is always a harder day in sports, so today was a hard day for me, but I still managed in the last (throw) over 85 metres."

Chopra, who has been dealing with a right groin injury for a long time, added that he is in good shape for the track and field showpiece in Tokyo, and that he was only looking to time his throw perfectly.

"I feel good and I just need to find some good timing," he added.

On Thursday, Weber took the top spot in the DL Finals, achieving a season's world-leading throw of 91.57m, his personal best, in his second attempt. He began with 91.37m effort, and after that it was a one-man show in the seven-man field.

None of Weber's rivals could even come near his mark, as his best effort of the day was over six metres more than that of Chopra. The German had a foul, 83.66m,

86.45m and 88.66m after his second throw.

Clearly, Chopra was not at his best as he had three legal throws out of the six attempts.

Known for his consistency in producing 88m-plus throws, it was a rare instance of the 27-year-old Indian star just being able to touch the 85m mark.

He was hoping to regain the trophy he had won in 2022, but ended up finishing second for the third time after 2023 and 2024.

With Thursday's title, Weber extended his head-to-head record against Chopra to 3-1 this season. The German had earlier beaten Chopra to second place in Doha DL in May and ORLEN Janusz Kusocinski Memorial event in Chorzow, Poland, the same month.

Chopra won in Paris DL in June with Weber finishing second. However, Chopra leads Weber in overall head-to-head record by a wide margin of 15-5 in competitions involving the duo since 2016. (PTI)

Lacklustre India scrape past lowly China 4-3



RAJGIR (BIHAR), Aug 29: Skipper Harmanpreet fired a hat-trick but India were far from impressive in their narrow 4-3 win over lower-ranked China in their Asia Cup opener, here Friday.

Harmanpreet (20th, 33rd, 47th minutes) converted three penalty corners but missed a penalty stroke. The other goal getter for India was Jugraj Singh (18th).

China's goals came through Shihao Du (12th), Benhal Chen (35th) and Jiesheng Gao (41st).

India stood on the right side of the result but the hosts didn't have a very good day in office and were guilty of letting China come into the match.

India also squandered plenty of chances, converting just four out of 11 penalty corners.

As expected India started on an offensive note and created their first opportunity with the first move. Mandeep Singh set it up for Sanjay but his shot was saved by Chinese goalkeeper Weihao Yang.

India kept up the pressure and seconds later secured their first penalty corner from which Mandeep scored but the goal was disallowed for a push by the striker after China went for referral.

Minutes later Dilpreet Singh's reverse hit from close range was saved by the Chinese custodian. It was China who took the lead from their first penalty corner in the 12th minute through Shihao Du.

A minute from the end of first quarter India had two more bright chances but on the first occasion Abhishek was denied by Weihao and then skipper Harmanpreet Singh

flicked wide from the home team's second penalty corner.

India restored parity three minutes into the second quarter with a perfect penalty corner conversion by Jugraj. Two minutes later India earned their fourth set piece and this time Harmanpreet scored with a powerful dragkick.

A minute later the hosts secured another penalty corner but wasted the chance.

China also got another penalty corner soon but shot wide.

It was raining penalty corners for India as the hosts secured another three minutes from halftime, but Harmanpreet's flick was brilliant saved by a diving Weihao to his left.

India continued from where they left in the first half and extended their lead three minutes into the third quarter from another penalty corner conversion by Harmanpreet.

China, however, pulled a goal back two minutes later through Benhal Chen, whose flick from a penalty corner went through the legs of India keeper Krishan Bahadur Pathak.

In the 39th minute India had a golden opportunity to extend their lead when they were awarded a penalty stroke for a foul on Mandeep but Harmanpreet hit the post.

India had to pay heavy price for that miss as two minutes later Jiesheng Gao converted a penalty corner to level the scores at 3-3 as Pathak was found wanting yet again.

But luck favoured India as they secured three back-to-back penalty corners in the 47th minute, the last of which was put into goal by Harmanpreet. (PTI)

So far, so good for Naomi Osaka and her new coach at the US Open

NEW YORK, Aug 29: Naomi Osaka is back in the third round of the U.S. Open for the first time since 2021, the year after she won her second championship at Flushing Meadows.

She's playing rather well at the moment, too, under the guidance of a new coach. Just don't expect Osaka to weigh in on whether she feels as if she is ready to make another deep run at the place.

"Honestly, I don't really know. I don't make it my business to know anymore. I kind of just leave it up in the air," the 23rd-seeded Osaka said after eliminating Hailey Baptiste 6-3, 6-1 in the second round in just 70 minutes Thursday. "For me, I realize that I've done everything that I could. I've trained really hard. I practiced really hard. If it happens, it happens."

Osaka's four Grand Slam trophies all arrived on hard courts: two at the U.S. Open, two at the Australian Open. Since her 2020 title in New York, her trips there have gone this way: losses in the third round in 2021, first round in 2022, second round last year.

The surface tends to favor the big serves and powerful, first-strike tennis Osaka is best known for, and something she displayed against Baptiste, of course, although she also demonstrated a willingness to vary speeds and spins.

The other talent Osaka is using to great effect so far this week is returning that gets an opponent on the defensive. Osaka already has won 11 of the 18 return games she's played so far, including during a 6-3, 6-4 win over Greet Minnen in the first round.

After her third-round exit at Wimbledon last month, Osaka split from coach Patrick Mouratoglou and began working with Tomasz Wiktorowski, who used to be part of Iga Swiatek's team. One key, Osaka said: Wiktorowski has encouraged her to focus more on the placement of her shots "and not necessarily

going for winners most of the time." They appear to be making quick progress — and Osaka said her impression of him changed quickly.

"Honestly, I didn't know him, I thought he was very scary, because he's very tall and he didn't smile," she said. "Now that we're working together, I see that he smiles often. He has a very friendly smile, and it's very nice. That's my little fun fact about Tomasz."

Venus Williams earned her first win in a U.S. Open women's doubles match since 2014 — and this time, her partner wasn't younger sister Serena but Leylah Fernandez. The 45-year-old Williams, who recently returned to the tour after a 16-month absence, and Fernandez eliminated the sixth-seeded pair of Lyudmyla Kichenok and Ellen Perez 7-6 (4), 6-3.

What else happened at the US Open on Thursday?

Wimbledon champions Swiatek and Jannik Sinner both won — his victory was much more straightforward than hers.

Swiatek had some trouble before getting past Suzan Lamens, a Dutch player ranked 66th who'd never appeared at a Grand Slam tournament until this year, by a 6-1, 4-6, 6-4 score. Sinner was just fine in a 6-3, 6-2, 6-2 win against Alexei Popyrin, who beat Novak Djokovic at the U.S. Open a year ago. In prime time, Coco Gauff fought through serving issues and wiped away tears on the way to beating Donna Vekic 7-6 (5), 6-2, and fellow American Amanda Anisimova defeated Maya Joint 7-6 (2), 6-2, while on the men's side and on the men's side No. 3 seed Alexander Zverev rolled past Jacob Fearnley 6-4, 6-4, 6-4 and 14th-seeded Tommy Paul needed nearly 4 1/2 hours to put away Nuno Borges 7-6 (6), 6-3, 5-7, 5-7, 7-5 early Friday morning after winning the first two sets and losing the next two. The match ended at 1:46 a.m. (AP)

F1 tension builds as Oscar Piastri and Lando Norris resume title fight at the Dutch GP

ZANDVOORT (NETHERLANDS), Aug 29: The Formula 1 title race is back and the tension is building.

Ahead of this weekend's Dutch Grand Prix, the first race in four weeks, Oscar Piastri is just nine points ahead of his McLaren teammate and title rival Lando Norris, who won three of the last four races before the mid-season break.

"The intensity will naturally increase as we get closer to the end of the year, and I'm ready for that," Piastri said Thursday.

The Australian has won praise for his ability to stay cool in his first season as a true title contender, but he acknowledged that the nerves are there, even if they're not always obvious.

"I don't believe anyone that says they don't get nervous because I don't think that's possible, and I think it would be a bit

weird if you weren't nervous," he said. "Ultimately the nerves can be good or bad and it's how you manage it that decides that. I think for me, being calm is part of who I am, but definitely I've learned through the years that is how I get the most out of myself as well."

A slow start actually ended up helping Norris win the last race in Hungary. He had to take a gamble on his strategy and hit the jackpot by stopping once, instead of twice, to get ahead on track and then hold off his teammate on old tires.

That prompted questions of how the situation fit McLaren's stated aim of letting its drivers race each other for the title. Typically, the driver in the lead would get the preference on strategy.

"Maybe it wasn't a perfect harmonic race between us as a



team because it didn't fall exactly into the place with what we normally go by," Norris said. "It's an example of what can happen in racing sometimes. I think we both want, as drivers, things not to be overly strict. We don't want to be told not to race." Piastri also favored keep-

ing things simple and not letting McLaren's "papaya rules" get too complicated.

"Ultimately there are race situations where being the second car from the team on track ... you've got a lot less to lose," Piastri said. "I think it would be unfair to neutralize that just be-

PSG gets tough slate of Champions League opponents; Real Madrid going to Liverpool and Almaty

MONACO, Aug 29: Paris Saint-Germain was handed a tough start to the defense of its Champions League title when the draw was made Thursday with no opponent from any of the lower-ranked nations. PSG was drawn against Bayern Munich and Barcelona from the pot of top-ranked teams, while Tottenham came from the pot of third-seeded teams in a repeat of their tight Super Cup game two weeks ago. And the French champion was paired with arguably the two toughest opponents from the lowest-ranked teams: Newcastle and Athletic Bilbao.

Bayer Leverkusen, Atalanta and Portuguese champion Sporting Lisbon complete the title holder's slate of eight games in the 36-team league phase. "It's always difficult," said PSG president Nasser Al-Khelaifi, whose team stumbled to 15th place in the single-standings league last season before surging to its first Champions League title. "We forgot last season, we



think about this season."

Real Madrid also got a challenging draw, including a long-haul trip to play Kairat Almaty of Kazakhstan — 6,420 kilometers (4,000 miles) from the Spanish capital, which is the furthest east the Champions League has ever gone.

Record 15-time champion Madrid got two English opponents from the pot of highest-ranked teams. Madrid will host Manches-

ter City, which it beat in the knockout playoffs last season, and return to Liverpool after losing 2-0 at Anfield in the league phase last year.

Madrid also will face Juventus in a repeat of its 2017 final win, and two French opponents, Marseille and Monaco — where superstar forward Kylian Mbappe started his career. Liverpool fans will welcome Trent Alexander-Arnold back to Anfield with

Madrid which he joined in June, and have away trips to the vibrant stadiums of Inter Milan, Eintracht Frankfurt, Marseille and Galatasaray.

"That is, I am sure, a fixture that the whole world will be looking at," Liverpool coach Arne Slot said about another Madrid challenge.

Bayern Munich will have rematches of two recent finals — at home to Chelsea where the German champion lost the 2012 title game on home turf, and away to PSG, which it beat in the 2020 final. Bayern also will go to Cyprus to face Pafos. Manchester City will travel north of the Arctic Circle to face Bodo/Glimt of Norway, and host former fan favorite Kevin De Bruyne with his new club Napoli.

Inter Milan, which lost two of the last three finals, will host the top two teams in the Premier League last season, Liverpool and Arsenal. Inter beat Arsenal at the San Siro last season. Kairat also

will host Club Brugge, Olympiakos and Pafos. The team also must travel four time zones west to play at Arsenal and Sporting Lisbon.

Bodo/Glimt also will host Juventus, Tottenham and Monaco. Qarabag in Azerbaijan is another long-haul trip east to Baku for Chelsea, Eintracht, Ajax and Copenhagen.

This is the second season of the league phase format with 36 teams playing eight different opponents on a weighted schedule through January, and ranked in a single-standings table. Four newcomers to the main stage of the Champions League are: Bodo/Glimt, Kairat Almaty, Russian-owned Pafos and Belgian champion Union Saint-Gilloise. Games in Bodo and Almaty shape to be the longest-ever trips for visiting teams, and their home games in January among the coldest in competition history. Bodo plays on a heated artificial turf field. (AP)

Tendulkar, Bindra pay tribute to athletes on National Sports Day



NEW DELHI, Aug 29: Sachin Tendulkar marvelled at India's rise in newer disciplines, while Abhinav Bindra paid tribute to all those who "silently carry the athletes forward" as the two icons offered their views on India's sporting growth on National Sports Day.

Praising the likes of chess world champion D Gukesh and 19-year-old women's World Cup winner Divya Deshmukh, among others, he said the growth of leagues was a big factor in more athletes rising through the ranks.

"Divya Deshmukh who just became the youngest-ever FIDE Women's World Cup chess champion, and D.Gukesh, who became the youngest among men; Rachana, the talented

wrestler, who won the gold medal at the U17 World Championship 2025; and Naisha Mehta, who at just 17 secured India's first-ever gold in Junior Girls Solo Dance at the Asian Roller Skating Championship 2025...

"We also congratulate athletes like Tulika Maan who excels in Judo, and Rupa Rani Tirkey, Lovely Choubey, Pinki, and Nayanmoni Saikia, whose team won the gold medal at the 2022 Commonwealth Games in Women's Fours Lawn Bowls, a sport that was previously almost unknown in India," said Tendulkar, enumerating the achievements.
