Prohibitory order imposed around Raj Bhavan

GUWAHATI, Sept 5: Prohibitory order under Section 163 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS) has been imposed within a 5 km radius of the Raj Bhavan in Guwahati, banning any activity that poses potential threat to the security and safety of the zone, an officer said.

Any person contravening the order will be liable to be punished as per provisions of the law, the order issued by Deputy Commissioner of Police (Central), Amitabh Basumatary on Wednesday said. "...it has been brought to my attention that certain activities in the vicinity of Raj Bhavan, Guwahati, pose potential threats to the safety, security and sanctity of this high-security zone," Basumatary said in the order.

It said the Raj Bhavan, being the official residence of the state's governor, requires heightened security and a tranquil environment to ensure the functioning of essential government duties.

As such, under section 163 of BNSS, all public gatherings, protests, rallies or demonstrations within a radius of 5 km of the Raj Bhavan have been prohibited.

BJP slams Oppn for 'distorting facts' about new order on foreigners

'Directive carries no adverse impact on Assam's demography'

GUWAHATI, Sept 5: BJP spokesperson Devajit Mahanta on Friday accused the opposition parties of deliberately misrepresenting the Immigrant Foreigners [Relief] 2025 Proclamation for electoral gains ahead of the 2026 Assembly polls.

Addressing a press conference at the State Office of Assam Pradesh BJP, he said that Congress, Rajgor Dal and Assam Jatiya Parishad (AJP) were attempting to rekindle unrest in the State by misleading people about the directive.

According to Mahanta, if the opposition tried to disturb the atmosphere of peace restored in Assam after years of agitation, they would have to answer before the people's court.

He recalled the anti-CAA movement, alleging that emotional manipulation by certain groups had led to loss of innocent lives, widespread unrest, and even damage to cultural landmarks such as Sri-



manta Sankardeva Kalakshetra.

He said that while opposition leaders had claimed during the CAA agitation that nearly two crore people from Bangladesh would enter Assam to claim citizenship, the ground reality was far removed.

"It has been five years and seven months since CAA was implemented. Against the exaggerated claims of crores, only 12 people applied for citizenship in Assam, out of which only three were granted

citizenship," Mahanta stated.

He added that the figures proved that the agitation was used merely as a political platform by certain individuals and organisations.

Citing historical precedents, Mahanta said that the Congress party itself had once endorsed citizenship for persecuted minorities from Bangladesh.

Death of minor in Ghy drain: 3 construction co people held

GUWAHATI, Sept 5: The tragic incident which has triggered widespread outrage, a three-year-old child died after falling into an open section of a footpath near an under-construction bridge in Kalapahar area of Guwahati, the police on Friday arrested three individuals linked to the project, including a director of the construction firm responsible for the site.

The arrested persons have been identified as Avinash Bhatia, Director of Bhartiya Infra Projects Ltd (BIPL), Safety Engineer Kaushik Gogoi, and Deputy Project Manager Prasannajit Pathak.

Deputy Commissioner of Police (West) in Guwahati, Padmanabh Baruah said the arrests followed an FIR lodged by the victim's father, who held BIPL directly responsible for negligence. The project is being executed under the supervision of the Public Works Department (PWD).

"The investigation began on the basis of the father's complaint. He blamed the construction company for the death of his child. The site was under the watch of the PWD," the DCP told reporters here.

According to officials, CCTV

footage captured the chilling moment when the toddler fell into the open drain, which had no protective cover. The footage soon went viral on social media, drawing anger and demands for strict action against those responsible.

Police also revealed that this was not the first instance of safety lapses at a BIPL site. Just a month earlier, a man died due to electrocution at another project site handled by the same company. An FIR was registered in that case as well.

"Even after a similar tragedy occurred recently, the company failed to learn any lessons. There was no sense of responsibility shown in ensuring public safety," Baruah said.

He added that investigations into both incidents are underway. While three people have been arrested, more arrests could follow. Several other employees of the company have already been detained and questioned.

The child's death has sparked sharp criticism of both the company and government authorities for ignoring basic safety norms. Locals have demanded accountability from the PWD for failing to monitor the site effectively.

49 candidates in fray under Kokrajhar sub-div BTR polls: Scrutiny of nominations completed

KOKRAJHAR, Sept 5: The scrutiny of nomination papers for the forthcoming BTC Elections 2025 in Kokrajhar district across all 12 constituencies was successfully completed on late Thursday.

In Kokrajhar Sadar sub-division, 49 candidates remain in the fray after scrutiny.

They include 17 candidates in 7-Fakiragram (Open), 7 in 8-Dotma (ST), 7 in 9-Banagaon (ST), 5 in 10-Debagao (ST), 8 in 11-Baukhungri (ST), and 5 in 12-Salakati (ST).

In Parbatjhora sub-division, scrutiny was conducted for the 1-Parbatjhora (ST) constituency, where 9 candidates remain in the contest.

In Gossaigaon sub-division, 57 candidates were found valid after scrutiny.

This includes 17 in 2-Guma (Open), 11 in 3-Srirampur (Open), 10 in 4-Jamdar (ST), 10 in 5-Sorabil (ST), and 9 in 6-Kachugaon (ST).

However, one nomination from the 2-Guma (Open) constituency was rejected due to defects in the electoral roll entries of the proposer. As neither the candidate nor his (CONTD. ON PAGE-2)

Centre to keep vigil to ensure GST benefits passed fully to consumers: Goyal

NEW DELHI, Sept 5: The Centre will keep vigil to ensure that the benefits of GST rationalisation are passed on fully to consumers, Union minister Piyush Goyal said on Friday, stating that the industry has given him assurance that the entire fall in taxes on various items will be reflected in their prices.

The GST Council's decision to bring all products, except sin goods, under 5 per cent and 18 per cent slabs, while reducing it to zero on a host of essential items, will kick in from September 22, the first day of Navratri.

Addressing a BJP press conference, Goyal also rejected the contention that the US decision to impose a 50 per cent tariff on India might have prompted the Modi government to turn to reforms, as he said that the decision was an outcome of nearly a year-long consultation among secretaries and finance ministers of states and the Centre.

"This decision (GST) has no link whatsoever with any decision of any country. Such a big change cannot happen overnight," the Minister of Commerce and Industry said, noting that the US decision was made only last month.

While the Centre will maintain vigil to ensure that consumers get the full benefits of reduced taxes, states should also monitor it, he said.

With the Congress and its allies taking swipes at the government for "delayed" rationalisation of the Goods and Services Tax regime, he hit back, saying they have exposed their own incompetence as they could not roll out the GST during their stint in power during 2004-14 and were only busy in "corruption".

He accused Congress governments in Karnataka and Telangana of trying to obstruct the GST Council, which is headed by Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman and includes finance ministers from all states, from approving these reforms on September 3 because it will "expose" their own party. The decision was finally taken with consensus.

Attacking Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, Goyal said he is like a rocket which could not take off despite numerous launch attempts. He himself does now know what he said on some issue earlier and what he is saying now, and people of the country are not affected by his comments.

No reduction in overall cargo shipments from India: Sonowal

TUTICORIN, Sept 5: Amid concerns over the impact of a 50 per cent US tariff on Indian products, Union Ports Shipping and Waterways Minister Sarbananda Sonowal on Friday claimed that there has been no reduction in overall cargo shipments from India.

Almost 90 per cent of India's foreign trade in terms of volume and 70 per cent of India's foreign trade by value is transported through sea routes.

"We have not seen a reduction in overall cargo shipments from India," Sonowal told PTI when asked to comment on the impact of a 50 per cent steep tariff imposed by Washington on Indian goods entering the US.

India and the US have been negotiating a bilateral trade agreement (BTA) since March. So far, five rounds of talks have been completed.

After a 50 per cent duty was imposed on August 27, the US team has deferred its visit to India for the next round of talks, which was scheduled from August 25.

No new dates have been finalised for the sixth round of negotiations.

Amid tensions between India and the US, Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent said that at the end of the day, the two great countries

will get this solved. Delhi's values are much closer to ours and to China's than to Russia's.

During April-July, the country's exports to the US increased 21.64 per cent to USD 33.53 billion, while imports rose 12.33 per cent to USD 17.41 billion, according to commerce ministry data.

The US was the largest trading partner of India in the April-July 2025-26 period (USD 12.56 billion bilateral trade). India's exports to America have been recording a positive growth since April this year.

India has described the US move to levy a 25 per cent additional tariff on Indian goods as "unfair, unjustified and unreasonable".

Sensex, Nifty close unchanged after 2-day rally; auto, oil shares shine

MUMBAI, Sept 5: Benchmark stock indices Sensex and Nifty closed unchanged after a volatile session on Friday as gains in oil & gas and auto shares were offset by losses in IT and FMCG shares.

After a volatile trade, the 30-share BSE Sensex closed lower by 7.25 points or 0.01 per cent at 80,710.76 with 14 of its components ending with gains and 16 with losses.

In a see-saw trade, the barometer opened higher but slipped into the red in late morning deals. It hit a low of 80,321.19 in the afternoon session before paring losses in the pre-close session. The index gyrated 715.37 points between the day's high and low.

The 50-share NSE Nifty eked out gains of 6.70 points or 0.03 per cent to close at 24,741.

Among Sensex firms, Mahindra & Mahindra climbed 2.34 per cent, followed by Maruti which climbed 1.70 per cent. Power Grid, Reliance Industries, Bharti Airtel and Eternal also were among the gainers.

However, ITC, HCL Tech, Tata Consultancy Services, Tech Mahindra and Infosys were among the laggards.

"Indian equities ended flat today, but sentiment stayed mildly positive as key indices rebounded



from intra-day lows on buying at support levels. The auto sector continued to extend gains on expectations of a demand revival.

"Global cues also lent support, with US and Asian markets trading higher ahead of the US jobs report, a key trigger for Fed rate cut expectations," Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Investments Limited, said.

BSE smallcap gauge went up by 0.09 per cent, while midcap index dipped 0.10 per cent.

BSE Focused IT dropped the most by 1.44 per cent, followed by IT (1.25 per cent), FMCG (1.22 per cent), realty (1.07 per cent), tech (0.70 per cent) and services

(0.60 per cent). Among BSE sectoral indices, auto jumped 1.30 per cent and telecommunication climbed 0.96 per cent. Metal (0.71 per cent), consumer discretionary (0.60 per cent) and energy (0.20 per cent) also advanced.

"Markets traded in a narrow range and ended nearly flat on Friday. After a positive start, the Nifty slipped in the first half, weighed down by weakness in IT majors; however, resilience in select heavyweights supported a recovery as the session progressed.

"Sector-wise, auto stocks outperformed, rising over 1 per cent on optimism following reduced

GST rates for vehicles," Ajit Mishra – SVP, Research, Religare Broking Ltd, said.

He further added that despite optimism around policy reforms and supportive domestic factors, markets appear to be entering a consolidation phase, given lingering tariff concerns and persistent foreign institutional outflows. On the weekly front, the BSE benchmark jumped 901.11 points or 1.12 per cent, and the Nifty climbed 314.15 points or 1.28 per cent.

In Asian markets, South Korea's Kospi, Japan's Nikkei 225 index, Shanghai's SSE Composite index and Hong Kong's Hang Seng settled in positive territory.

Markets in Europe were trading on firm note. US markets ended higher on Thursday.

Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) offloaded equities worth ₹ 106.34 crore on Thursday, while Domestic Institutional Investors (DII) bought stocks worth ₹ 2,233.09 crore, according to exchange data. Global oil benchmark Brent crude dipped 0.07 per cent to USD 66.93 a barrel.

On Thursday, the Sensex settled 150.30 points or 0.19 per cent higher at 80,718.01, and the Nifty ended marginally higher by 19.25 points or 0.08 per cent at 24,734.30. (PTI)

After SBI & BoI, Bank of Baroda declares RCom, Anil Ambani as fraud

NEW DELHI, Sept 5: After State Bank of India and Bank of India, another lender Bank of Baroda has classified the loan account of insolvent Reliance Communications as fraudulent and named its former director, tycoon Anil Ambani, citing alleged misutilisation of loans granted more than a decade back, according to a regulatory filing.

RCom said it has received a letter from BoB dated September 2 conveying its decision to classify the loan account of the company and promoter Anil Ambani as "fraud".

Bank of Baroda had sanctioned ₹ 1,600 crore and another ₹ 862.50 crore in line of credit to the company. Of the total ₹ 2,462.50 crore, ₹ 1,656.07 crore remains outstanding as on August 28, according to the lenders' letter disclosed by RCom in the regulatory filing. "The account was classified as non-performing asset (NPA) with effect from June 5, 2017," the letter said.

While RCom is undergoing corporate insolvency resolution proceedings to find a suitor to take over the company and clear its liabilities, BoB in the letter said currently there is no active resolution plan that is approved by the NCLT. It went on to state that the declaration of fraud is based on findings/observations in forensic audit reports and "such classification is in line with the principles of natural justice". In a statement, a spokesperson of Ambani said the action of Bank of Baroda pertains to matters dating back more than 12 years.

"It is pertinent to note that Anil D Ambani served as a non-executive director on the board of RCom

from inception in 2006 until his resignation from the board in 2019, over six years ago," it said.

"He was never an executive director or a KMP of the company, and had no role whatsoever in the day-to-day operations or decision-making of the company," it said. Stating that RCom had a lender consortium comprising 14 banks, it said, "after an inordinate lapse of more than 10 years, select lenders have now chosen to initiate proceedings in a staggered and selective manner targeting Mr Ambani".

It went on to state that RCom is under the supervision of a committee of creditors led by SBI and overseen by a resolution professional.

"The committee of creditors led by SBI had unanimously approved the resolution plan of the successful resolution applicant in March 2020. The matter remains sub judice, pending before the NCLT and other judicial forms, including the Supreme Court, for the past six years and the lenders have not taken steps to complete the resolution process," it said.

Ambani, the statement said, "Categorically denies all allegations and charges and shall pursue remedies available to him in accordance with legal advice."

Previously, State Bank of India (SBI) and Bank of India (BoI) had given similar tags to RCom and Ambani. Under banking laws, once an account is declared fraudulent, it must be referred to enforcement agencies for criminal action, and the borrower is barred from accessing fresh finance from banks and regulated institutions for five years. Vedanta beats Adani Group with ₹17,000 cr bid to acquire JAL

NEW DELHI, Sept 5: Mining conglomerate Vedanta on Friday beat Gautam Adani's Group to make a winning bid for the acquisition of debt-ridden Jaiprakash Associates (JAL) for ₹ 17,000 crore,

according to sources. The bid value translates into Jaiprakash Associates' net present value of ₹12,505 crore.

JAL, which has interests in real estate, cement, power, hotels and

roads, has been dragged into insolvency proceedings after it defaulted on payment of loans.

Lenders of JAL conducted a challenge process for the sale of the company under the IBC.

Multiple bidders participated in the process, but in the end, firm bids were placed by only two entities, Adani and Vedanta Group.

Vedanta eventually made a winning bid of ₹ 17,000 crore, which translated into a NPV (net present value) of ₹ 12,505 crore, beating Adani Group, sources said.

The Committee of Creditors (CoC) meeting was held on September 5 to conduct the challenge process.

Financial creditors have claimed a staggering ₹ 57,185 crore in unpaid dues.

The National Asset Reconstruction Company Ltd (NARCL) leads the list of claimants after acquiring the stressed JAL loans from a consortium of lenders headed by the State Bank of India.

In April this year, as many as 25 companies showed interest in acquiring JAL. (PTI)

Modi made it clear that his government will compensate them not only for any loss but also for any shortfall from 14 per cent annual growth in their revenue collection from the GST for five years, the Commerce and Industry Minister said.

He added that the government continued to simplify the tax regime to the benefit of consumers and industry since its rollout in 2017 and accused opposition parties of misleading people by levelling baseless allegations over the issue.

The latest round of reforms will have a multiplier effect on the economy as it will boost demand and spur growth, making up for the revenue shortfall expected from the rate reduction, he said. (PTI)

Inmates' testimony prompts FIR on drug trafficking at Dhubri District Jail

DHUBRI, Sept 5: In a sensational revelation that has shaken the law enforcement and judicial circles of Dhubri, allegations of rampant drug trafficking inside Dhubri District Jail have surfaced in open court. The shocking disclosure prompted the filing of a formal First Information Report (FIR) by none other than Additional Public Prosecutor, Dinesh Choudhury.

A sensational revelation has come to light through an FIR filed on September 4, 2025, by Choudhury in connection with an ongoing trial at the court of the Hon'ble Special Judge (Addl.), Dhubri. According to the FIR, while proceedings in Special Case No. 337/2023 were being conducted, the accused prisoners—identified as Akkas Ali and Mohibul Ali—along with another accused, Shahjalal Sheikh (linked to Special Case No. 573/2024), made startling statements in open court.

The accused persons reportedly declared before the judge that regular drug trafficking activities are taking place inside the jail premises. Their claims, made in full view of the court, have sparked serious concerns over prison security and possible lapses in the monitoring of illegal activities within the correctional facility.

The revelation, coming directly from un-



dertrial prisoners during judicial proceedings, has raised questions on the functioning of jail administration and the alleged nexus between inmates and external handlers. Authorities are expected to initiate a detailed inquiry into the claims made, given the gravity of the allegations.

The matter has now put the spotlight on prison management in Dhubri, with calls likely to grow for an independent investigation to verify the claims and identify those

responsible if such trafficking is indeed taking place.

The accused further alleged that inmates are openly consuming drugs within the jail, and that during a recent sudden inspection, a large quantity of ganja and tablets was recovered. Startlingly, despite these recoveries, no action was reportedly taken against those responsible.

The FIR also records that empty vials and tablet strips were seized by police personnel

posted inside the jail, identified as Abdul Rauf and Nurul. However, questions have now been raised about why these serious recoveries were never followed up with proper criminal proceedings.

Even more disturbingly, the accused named in court suggested the direct involvement of alleged district jail officials in the drug supply network. Following the order dated 04/09/2025 passed by Special Judge (Addl.) Dhubri, Public Prosecutor Choudhury, in his complaint, has urged the Officer-in-Charge of Dhubri Sadar Police Station to register a case under appropriate sections of law against all those involved in the trafficking racket operating within the jail.

This development has cast a harsh spotlight on the alleged nexus between jail staff and drug peddlers, raising concerns over how narcotics could flow so freely within a high-security facility meant to reform, not corrupt, prisoners.

The FIR is expected to trigger a high-level probe and immediate action. As the revelations continue to unfold, Dhubri District Jail finds itself at the center of one of the gravest scandals in recent memory—an alleged drug trade thriving behind prison walls, under the very nose of the system sworn to uphold justice.

Thadou Inpi condemns killing of Nehkam Jomhao, demands CBI probe

DIPHU, Sept 5: The Thadou Inpi Assam (TIA), along with the Thadou Women's Association, Thadou Literature Society, and Thadou Students' Association in their joint press statement have, expresses their deepest anguish over the alleged killing of Nehkam Jomhao by cadres of Kuki Suspension of Operation (SoO) militant groups (KRA, UKDA, KLA) on the night of August 30 last at Manja in Karbi Anglong.

While the mortal remains of Jomhao have been recovered, the Thadou community has resolved to

withhold acceptance and final rites as a mark of peaceful protest until justice is delivered.

A memorandum with demands has been submitted to the Chief Minister of Assam Himanta Biswa Sarma; the Chief Executive Members of Karbi Anglong Autonomous Council and NC Hills Autonomous Council; the Union Home Secretary, Government of India; the Chief Secretary and Director General of Police, Government of Assam; the Advisor (NE), Ministry of Home Affairs; and the Deputy Commissioners and Senior Superintendents of Police of Karbi Anglong and

Dima Hasao. The organisations demand immediate transfer of the case to the National Investigation Agency to probe systematic persecution and militant links with Manipur violence; protection of Thadou Identity – Government must safeguard Thadou rights against forced "Kuki" identity and facilitate a Kuki-Thadou Memorandum of Understanding under Assam Govt. supervision and with GoI's knowledge; to end the SoO with KRA, UKDA, KLA by the government and flush out Manipur-based militants from Karbi Anglong soil and relocate militant camps outside sensitive areas.

Maratha agitation

Manoj Jarange Patil-led Maratha agitation demanding OBC status for the community has just reached Mumbai, which brings with it fresh political worries for the BJP led Mahayuti government in Maharashtra. Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation election is going to be held later in 2025, in which BJP has biggest stake, since Mumbai is the financial capital of India, and it can't afford to lose. Maratha community could play a big role in this election on account of their large population in the city. No wonder, BJP leader and Chief Minister of Maharashtra Devendra Fadnavis has said that Jarange's agitation is being exploited for political purposes. Fadnavis has made this remark after two MPs from Shiv Sena (UBT) – Sanjay Jadhav and Nagesh Patil Ashtikar – announced their participation in the protest. The Opposition has come out in support of the agitation. Not even that, Shiv Sena (UBT) leader Sanjay Raut has emphasized that Mumbai's identity is that of a Marathi stronghold. Another INDIA bloc constituent the Congress has also supported the agitation. Maharashtra Congress president Harshvardhan Sapkal has supported the agitation and said that government should be serious about the Maratha community's demand. As for the Mahayuti, one of its constituent Shiv Sena leader and Deputy Chief Minister Eknath Shinde has mysteriously said, "some matters should remain confidential." It was clear indication that Shiv Sena is not going with the BJP on this issue.

All these mean that the BJP will have to deal with the political situation arising out of the Maratha agitation on its own. CM Fadnavis has reiterated that the state government has already granted a separate 10 per cent quota for the Maratha community. He has also assured the OBC communities that their interest will be safeguarded. A huge rally was organized on August 29 in Azad Maidan in Mumbai, exactly two years after the Jarange Patil had launched his agitation on August 29, 2023. He has been demanding reservation benefits for the Maratha community from the OBC category. Though one day was allowed him to protest, he said he would not return. Maratha agitation has been continuing for the last two years and has finally reached Mumbai just before the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation election to be held soon, but the schedule of election is yet to be announced.

During the last two years of agitation, Jarange Patil has not been able to reach Mumbai. He had planned to reach Mumbai in January this year but has stopped at Vashi after the Maharashtra government had requested him to do so on assurance of considering his demand. He had undertaken over half a dozen hunger strikes in the last 15 years of his agitation demanding OBC status to Maratha communities. He demands that Marathas be given Kunbi caste certificate, because they are interlinked socially.

SCO 2025 and India's three-pillar strategy: Security, Connectivity and Opportunity

Assessing India's role and achievements of the Tianjin Declaration

The Shanghai Cooperation Organisation, which was established in 2001, originally came into being as a security-focused forum. For China, Russia and Central Asian countries, the organisation was a common platform for counter-terrorism and border stability. But over the past two decades, the organisation has gradually taken on a multi-dimensional form, with issues such as security as well as economic cooperation, connectivity, cultural exchanges and the establishment of a multipolar world order becoming prominent. India, which joined as an observer in 2005 and gained full membership in 2017, sees opportunities in the organisation on the one hand and challenges on the other. The Tianjin Summit in 2025, which also marked the organisation's 25th anniversary, was very important in this regard.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on this occasion described India's relationship in terms of three pillars – security, connectivity and opportunity. This was not just rhetoric but a clear and balanced strategy through which India articulated its security concerns, sought to balance the imbalances in the organisation and establish itself as a force shaping the future. These three pillars were clearly echoed in the Tianjin Declaration, where for the first time the India-proposed vision of "One Earth, One Family, One Future" was formally enshrined.

The first pillar, security, is India's main concern. Modi reiterated the principle of "zero tolerance" towards terrorism, rejecting double standards. This was a clear message to Pakistan, which presents itself as a counter-terrorism power despite providing sanctuary and support to terrorist organisations. India ensured that the Tianjin Declaration made clear reference to the recent major terrorist attacks in Pakistan and Afghanistan, including the Pul-

wama-Pahalgam attack in Kashmir. This was a diplomatic victory for India, as earlier declarations were often limited to general terms. India stressed the need for measures to strengthen the Regional Anti-Terrorism Structure (RATS), share intelligence, prevent terrorist financing and control digital extremism. India also warned that if Afghanistan is not addressed, the entire region will be vulnerable to insecurity.

The second pillar, connectivity, is strategically and economically important for India. Central Asia is an energy-rich and strategically important region, but India has limited direct geographical connectivity. Modi, citing projects like the Chabahar port and the International North-South Transport Corridor, said that India supports connectivity infrastructure that respects sovereignty and territorial integrity. This was an indirect criticism of China's Belt and Road Initiative, especially the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor, which passes through the Indian territory of Gilgit-Baltistan. India made it clear that no path for development can be created by compromising the sovereignty of any country.

The Tianjin Summit also saw partial talks on India-China relations. The brief meeting between Modi and Xi Jinping discussed border stability, visa restoration and the possibility of reopening pilgrimage sites like Kailash-Mansarovar. This shows that for India, connectivity is not limited to just physical infrastructure, but people-to-people ties, trade normalisation and cultural exchanges are equally important.

The third pillar, Opportunities, reflects India's visionary and creative approach. Modi said that the SCO should not be limited to security and geopolitics alone, but should become a platform for innovation, youth empowerment and sustainable development. India proposed strengthening the SCO Startup Forum, cooperation on inclusive digital governance and responsible use of artificial intelligence. It also advocated for environmental sustainability, green energy and joint efforts against climate change. Also, India suggested setting up a "cultural dialogue platform" in the SCO to highlight the shared cultural heritage of Asian countries. This pillar takes India beyond being a mere security-focused nation and gives it the role of a cul-

tural and moral leader.

These initiatives of India were clearly echoed in the Tianjin Declaration. For the first time, the Declaration adopted the Indian vision of "One Earth, One Family, One Future". This is the same idea that India had put forward during its G20 presidency. The Declaration explicitly condemned terrorist incidents and agreed to establish an SCO Development Bank, to which China pledged to provide an initial capital of \$1.4 billion. While this raises fears of China's economic dominance, it is a step towards making the SCO a solid economic platform. The Declaration supported multipolarity, UN reform and greater participation of developing countries. It also included a resolution to promote education, culture and dialogue of civilizations, which is in line with India's initiative.

Despite these achievements of India, challenges remain. Pakistan constantly tries to raise the Kashmir issue at international forums, although it does not get the desired success. China's Belt and Road project still attracts many countries, due to which India's dissenting position creates contradictions in the

organization. There is still no coherent collective strategy on the situation in Afghanistan. Also, India will have to balance with Western forums such as the Quad and the Indo-Pacific Initiatives while maintaining its strategic autonomy.

In the global context, the SCO's relevance is growing rapidly. The organization represents nearly half of the world's population and one-fifth of the economy. At a time when the Russia-Ukraine war, the US-China competition, and instability in West Asia dominate international politics, the SCO has emerged as a symbol of multipolarity. India's active role gives the organization a democratic and develop-

ment-oriented dimension. The way forward: India will have to ensure that counter-terrorism cooperation does not remain just on paper but is translated into concrete arrangements like intelligence sharing and financial monitoring. Alternative connectivity structures like Chabahar and the North-South Transport Corridor will have to be implemented soon. India's strength in the IT and startup sectors can make the SCO globally relevant. India can further strengthen its soft power through yoga, Ayurveda, education and cultural exchanges. The most important challenge will be to maintain balanced relations with China and Russia, so that India can play an independent role while protecting its sovereignty.

Finally, the Tianjin Summit was not just an anniversary of the SCO, but also a symbol of the maturity of India's diplomacy. Security, connectivity and opportunity – these three pillars connect India's national priorities and regional aspirations. The inclusion of India's vision in the Tianjin Declaration is a testament to this. Whatever the challenges, India is now not just a participant, but a key architect of the SCO's direction.

A new era of GST: Towards a taxation revolution

Impact of reducing GST on Indian economy

The introduction of the Goods and Services Tax (GST) was a historic and revolutionary milestone in India's taxation system. It sought not only to simplify the complex web of indirect taxes but also to curb corruption and bureaucratic high-handedness in governance and administration. Yet, despite its intent to provide relief and convenience, the system remained riddled with complexities and burdensome tax slabs that weighed heavily on the public. Prime Minister Narendra Modi's government had long recognized this, and during his Independence Day address from the Red Fort this year, he announced plans to make GST simpler and more people-friendly. Acting on this vision, the government has now streamlined GST into just two slabs, while significantly reducing the rates. This step, focused especially on middle- and lower-income households, ensures families will have more disposable income to spend on other goods and services. Increased consumption, in turn, will boost economic activity and accelerate growth. These bold reforms herald the dawn of a new taxation era—one that is simpler, more transparent, and better aligned with people's needs.

Following the 56th meeting of the GST Council, the government announced that the new GST rates will take effect from September 22. The existing 12% and 28% slabs have been replaced with just 5% and 18%. Additionally, a new 40% slab has been introduced for luxury items. While the opposition has dismissed this as a delayed move, the government has projected it as a major stride in economic reform. Some economists also view it as a protective measure in the backdrop of Trump's tariff wars, aimed at boosting domestic consumption and bridging the export deficit. Others see it as a festive-season gift from the government ahead of Navratri and Diwali. Multiple tax slabs had long been a source of confusion and burden for consumers. Frequent rate revisions created uncertainty within the business community. The new two-slab system will largely eliminate such ambiguities, offering consumers a fairer and more predictable tax regime. This will stabilize prices, encourage consumption, and ease business operations, giving industry renewed momentum.

It would not be wrong to say that under Prime Minister Modi's leadership, several effective measures have been taken to curb corruption. Digitization, direct benefit transfers, Aadhaar linkage, and transparent systems have built confidence in governance. GST has strengthened the concept of "One Nation, One Tax." Yet the reality is that the GST department has not entirely freed itself from the grip of corruption. Small traders and entrepreneurs still find themselves ensnared in notices, investigations, and complicated procedures. At times, corrupt practices exploit this to instill fear and extract undue benefits. This undermines the very spirit of GST reforms. If taxation is to be truly revolutionary, the GST system must be made completely corruption-free.

India's tax departments have long been regarded as hubs of corruption, sustained by complex laws and multiple tax categories. A transparent, simple structure minimizes unnecessary interaction between officials and businesses, building greater trust among citizens and small entrepreneurs. Going forward, the government must strengthen GST technologically and administratively. Artificial intelligence and digital tracking can help curb tax evasion while checking arbitrary practices and bribery. Protecting taxpayers' rights, ensuring a fear-free environment for honest businesses, and offering relief to consumers will be the real hallmarks of GST as a revolutionary reform. The new

phase of GST brings relief and signals positive change. The next step must be to rid the system of corruption entirely, thus winning the confidence of honest taxpayers. Only then can India claim to have decisively moved toward "One Nation, One Tax, and One Transparent System."

In a nation's economic journey, certain decisions are not just policy shifts but turning points in history. The latest reforms in GST are such a decisive step. Simplifying taxation and directly benefiting citizens reflect not just bureaucratic will but a vision of public welfare. Since independence, India's tax system has been mired in complexity, burdens, and corruption. Both small traders and ordinary consumers suffered in this maze of indirect levies. While the introduction of GST was already a transformative move, further reducing it to two slabs makes it truly revolutionary. This will ease the burden on consumers, enhance the ease of doing business, and energize the economy. The true engine of growth is the common citizen's wallet. When consumers save more, they spend more. Increased consumption drives industries, boosts production, and generates employment. This is the real impact of GST reform—it will give wings to economic activity and help propel India towards becoming the world's third-largest economy.

In any democracy, governance is judged by how far it prioritizes the interests of its citizens. Through GST reform, the Modi government has demonstrated that its policies are not merely about numbers but about easing everyday life. The reform offers not just financial relief but psychological reassurance. Challenges, however, remain—such as compensating states for revenue losses, integrating small businesses into the new system, and ensuring transparency in tax administration. If these issues are addressed, GST reform will firmly steer India towards a stronger, more transparent, and growth-oriented economy.

It would not be wrong to call this reform a "gift" for the people. It is more than just a change in taxation—it is an attempt to improve the standard of living. It signifies that government policies are designed not merely to run the machinery of state but to provide real relief to citizens and accelerate national progress. The crucial question now is whether the benefits will truly reach the common consumer. Much depends on whether industries pass on the tax cuts to customers and whether regulators enforce compliance effectively. The new era of GST has opened a window of hope. If carried forward with integrity, it could well transform India's taxation system into one of the most transparent and people-centric models in the world.

The Goods and Services Tax, better known as GST, was introduced in India in July 2017. It replaced many indirect taxes like excise duty, VAT, and service tax. GST was called the "One Nation, One Tax" system. The aim was to make the tax system simple, transparent, and fair.

But from the beginning, GST has been a topic of debate. One of the most discussed issues is about GST rates. Many industries and common people feel that GST rates are high. Whenever the government reduces GST, it immediately affects prices, demand, and the economy. So, the question is "Does reducing GST really impact the Indian economy?"

Let us understand this with examples, real-life cases, and simple explanations.

What Happens When GST is Reduced? When the government reduces GST on any product or service, the immediate result is a reduction in price. Lower prices make goods and services more affordable. This creates higher demand. For example, if GST on a restaurant meal comes down from 18% to 5%, the bill becomes smaller. More people may then prefer to eat out. This benefits both customers and restaurants.

Similarly, if GST on cars is reduced, more people may think of buying a new car. This supports the automobile industry, which in turn supports many other industries like steel, rubber, glass, and electronics.

But along with benefits, there are also challenges. A cut in GST means the government collects less revenue. Since this money is used for schools, hospitals, roads, and other welfare schemes, the government has to balance carefully.

Example 1: Restaurants and Food Industry: In the early days of GST, restaurant bills became a big complaint for customers. Earlier, restaurants charged VAT and service tax separately, but under GST, most restaurants were placed under the 18% slab. This made eating out more expensive. After public pressure, the GST Council reduced the rate in November 2017. The new rate became 5% GST for restaurants (without input tax credit).

Impact: Families once again started going out to eat. Small restaurants and dhabas reported better business. Food delivery apps like Swiggy and Zomato also grew rapidly as people found them affordable again. This shows how a simple tax reduction created a direct boost in consump-

tion and jobs.

Example 2: Automobiles Sector: The automobile industry is one of the largest job providers in India. It includes not only car makers but also parts manufacturers, dealerships, repair shops, and transport workers. When GST was first applied, cars were put in the 28% slab, and with cess, the total tax went up to 40-50% on luxury cars. This was too high for the middle class.

In 2018 and 2019, the government gave temporary relief by reducing cess and offering incentives. This helped the industry for a short time.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, industry leaders requested a cut in GST from 28% to 18% to revive demand. Though the government did not fully agree, some states reduced road tax.

Impact: Whenever tax relief is given, sales immediately increase. Example: After GST compensation cess was reduced on small cars and electric vehicles, sales of EVs jumped in India. More sales mean more employment and faster industrial growth. This proves that GST reduction in automobiles has a direct impact on demand and jobs.

Example 3: Real Estate and Housing: Owning a house is a dream for every Indian. But high taxes make flats and houses costly. Earlier, under GST, buyers had to pay 12% GST on under-construction houses. After much criticism, the GST Council reduced it to 5% for normal housing and 1% for affordable housing in 2019.

Impact: Middle-class families started booking flats again. Affordable housing projects saw good demand. Builders got relief because unsold flats were finally being sold. This change also supported the government's mission of Housing for All. It showed that tax cuts can make social schemes successful.

Positive Impacts of Reducing GST:

1. Boost in Demand: Lower taxes make products and services cheaper, which increases demand.
2. More Business Growth: Industries get more customers, which leads to better profits.
3. Employment Generation: Higher demand means more production, which creates more jobs.
4. Lower Inflation: Reduced GST on essentials like food, medicines, and housing helps control inflation.
5. Encourages Formal Economy: Lower rates reduce tax evasion and bring small traders into

the tax system.

Challenges of Reducing GST:

1. Revenue Loss: The government collects less money. This may affect spending on health, education, and infrastructure.

2. Risk of Fiscal Deficit: If the government earns less and spends more, it may have to borrow more, leading to a deficit.

3. Short-Term Effect: Sometimes demand increases only for a short time and then falls again.

4. Unequal Benefits: If tax cuts are only in selected sectors, only those industries benefit while others remain under pressure.

Real-Life Lessons from GST Reduction

Cinema Tickets: Earlier taxed at 28%, later reduced to 12% and 18% in 2018. Result: ticket sales increased, especially in small towns.

Sanitary Napkins: GST was completely removed in 2018 after protests. Result: This helped women access hygiene products at lower prices.

Electric Vehicles (EVs): GST reduced from 12% to 5% in 2019. Result: EV sales surged, and India became one of the fastest-growing EV markets.

Each example shows that reducing GST can change people's behavior immediately.

Balancing Act: Growth vs. Revenue: For the Indian economy, the big question is "How to balance growth with revenue needs?"

If GST is too high, people avoid spending or look for ways to escape tax. If GST is too low, the government may not have enough money for welfare and infrastructure.

Therefore, the GST Council often studies each sector separately. Reductions are given only where they will boost demand and help the common people.

Conclusion: So, is reducing GST impacting the Indian economy? The answer is 'Yes'. In the short term, it increases demand, supports industries, and creates jobs. In the long term, the challenge is to make sure government revenue does not fall too much.

Real-life examples from restaurants, automobiles, housing, cinema, sanitary products, and electric vehicles prove that GST reduction changes consumer behavior and supports growth. At the same time, India must ensure that tax collections remain healthy for future development.

GST is like a balance scale — one side has consumer relief and growth, while the other has government revenue. Both must stay equal for India's economy to grow strongly.

Assam should be kept outside the purview of CAA

Sir/Ma'am

Through the columns of your esteemed daily, I would like to express my deep concern regarding the recent statement of the Hon'ble Chief Minister on the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA). The Chief Minister himself admitted that since the law came into force, only 12 persons have applied for citizenship in Assam through CAA. Ironically, this law has not been in force in Assam effectively since day one. Yet, during the anti-CAA movement, five young lives were lost, whose supreme sacrifice still pains the conscience of our state. At last, the Chief Minister too has acknowledged them as martyrs, which is a welcome gesture. But acknowledgment alone is not

enough—the families of these martyrs must be given due dignity, financial assistance, and employment opportunities.

Here arises a painful question: Why were the tears of five mothers shed, why were five young lives extinguished, only to give citizenship to just 12 persons? If the law serves no real purpose in Assam, then the government must take responsibility for this loss and respect the sacrifices by keeping Assam out of the ambit of CAA altogether.

It is pertinent to mention that Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, and Mizoram are exempted due to Inner Line Permit (ILP). Similarly, 98% of Meghalaya and 67% of Tripura fall under the Sixth Schedule, and large parts of Assam, such as the Bodoland Territorial Region and three hill districts, are also outside the scope of the Act.

If CAA is unsuitable for these regions, how can it suddenly become suitable for the remaining 27 districts of Assam? What crime have the people of these districts committed to be burdened with an irrelevant and divisive law? The Chief Minister must answer this basic question.

It is unjust to deny the sentiments of millions of indigenous people of Assam only to grant citizenship to a handful of illegal immigrants. If the government truly values the sacrifices made during the movement, it should ensure that Assam is kept completely outside the purview of CAA.

10 things you should not say to your boss

When you are interacting with the boss, the most trivial thinking-aloud moment can turn into a nightmare - who knows how your words would be interpreted. So it is absolutely necessary to ensure that your foot doesn't find a place in your mouth at the workplace, especially around the people you report to. Agreed, telling off your boss is a common fantasy and a temptation almost impossible to resist. But bear in mind, letting your guard down and telling the power-that-be exactly what you feel can have disastrous consequences.

It could be just an innocuous statement, but you may come across as lazy, careless and/or disrespectful to your boss. So, if there isn't a mental filter in place, or if the existing one has proved to be ineffective, here's a list of phrases that most employers would hate to hear. Make no mistake, this list is not exhaustive and is in no-particular order.

1) That's Not in My Job Description

Nowadays, companies hire those who can wear many hats. So, if a particular task doesn't come technically under your job description, try not complaining about it - unless it's completely off the track. "If your boss thinks you are unwilling or incapable of doing what you've been asked, you will be considered a weak player," says Vinay Grover, CEO of Symbiosis Management Consultants, a headhunting firm.

2) I Can't Do This Task

You maybe nose-deep in work but an instant refusal gives an impression that you just don't want



to carry out a particular task. "You should always give valid reasons first and then say no," says Sunil Goel, director, GlobalHunt, an executive search firm. If you happen to be one of those who find it difficult to say no, don't fall into the trap of saying an instant yes, only to go back on your word later.

3) I Just Never Got Around To It

It's quite simple: if your boss has entrusted you with something, you've just got to do it. "I was given an interesting assignment to work on while

I was on something else. Call it poor time-management, I was unable to work on the project. When my manager inquired, I decided to be honest," says Nishit Mishra, a marketing executive with a multinational banking giant. Mishra had to hand over the assignment to a colleague; never a pleasant thing to do, and you'd agree.

4) I Don't Know How To Do It

You may actually be clueless but you need not say it in as many words. Saying "I don't know"

shows a weakness and it also may be interpreted as an excuse that you just don't want to do it. "Tell your boss that you are prepared to do the task but that you may require assistance or guidance because you haven't done it before," says Grover of Symbiosis.

5) I Am Overqualified For This

The task at hand might appear 'lowly'. However, you are at work and instead of playing a big shot, you should just roll up your sleeves and get to work. "This is what your boss expects of you and anything less will show that you are actually not qualified to get things done," says Ronesh Puri, managing director, Executive Access, a headhunting firm. Do it yourself or delegate it to someone else - come what may, but get it done!

6) Sorry, I Missed That Point

You might be nursing a hangover or missing your caffeine shot while sitting in a painful early morning meeting. No matter what, be clued in to what is being discussed. Don't dream of the sundae you plan to have post-lunch when the boss is talking to you.

"This phrase can do more harm than good. If you are coming up with such excuses then it leaves an impression that you are not attentive and are losing interest in your work," says Goel of Global-Hunt.

7) I Need to Talk to You, It's Important

Two simple rules that will justify the presence of this statement in this list.

Rule#1:

Your time is only half as precious (or even lesser) as your boss'.

Rule#2:

What is important to you might not be all that important to your boss. Consider both of these unsaid rules and you will end up making some qualitative changes like saying "slightly urgent" or "somewhat important".

8) I Will Try

Your bosses don't want you to try doing a task, they want you to do it. Trying is not an option here. Saying "I will try" will tell your boss that they cannot depend on you. It will not give them the assurance that the task will be taken care of. You wouldn't want to hear what management trainee Swati Pillai was told when she muttered the unacceptable. "The company pays you for doing not trying." Ouch!

9) Don't Blame Me - It's Not My Fault

In the face of criticism or a reprimand, your defense mechanism will inevitably kick in. However, avoid dodging the responsibility or blaming someone else. Of course, you would want to clear the air, but there's a time, place and way to do it. Don't defend when the boss's voice is at a higher-than-comfortable pitch.

10) Why Do I Need To Do This?

This is Stupid!

You maybe on back-slapping terms with your boss, but at the end of the day, he's the senior. Anything that questions his authority and judgment is to be avoided at all costs. "If your bosses have asked you to do it, they must think it is important enough. By saying this you openly challenge their competency as a boss," warns Grover. Looks like we lost India, Russia to 'darkest' China: US President Trump

The US has also been targeting India for its energy ties with Russia

WASHINGTON, Sept 5: It looks like the US has lost India and Russia to "darkest" China, President Donald Trump said on Friday in his latest remarks as ties between New Delhi and Washington continue to reel under possibly the worst phase in over two decades.

Trump's latest post on social media came days after the bonhomie among Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Chinese President Xi Jinping and Russian President Vladimir Putin at a summit of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) in the Chinese city of Tianjin drew global attention.

"Looks like we have lost India and Russia to deepest, darkest China. May they have a long and prosperous future together!" the US president said on Truth Social.

The relations between New Delhi and Washington are on a downturn after Trump doubled tariffs on Indian goods to a whopping 50 per cent, including a 25 per cent additional duties for India's purchase of Russian crude oil. The additional tariff has already come into effect from August 27.

India described the US action as "unfair, unjustified and unreasonable" and even wondered why it has been singled out for the punitive action.

Surprisingly, the US has not im-



posed any punitive measures on China, the largest importer of Russian crude oil.

In the last few days, several Trump administration officials, including White House trade advisor Peter Navarro, have used offensive language to target India.

India's big oil lobby has turned the largest democracy in the world into a "massive refining hub and oil money laundromat for the Kremlin", Navarro said last week.

Though the focus of the SCO summit on Monday was to ensure deeper security and economic complementarities among its member nations, what drew larger attention was the public display of bonhomie among Modi, Putin and Xi, signalling a broader conver-

gence among the leading three powers.

A video of Modi and Putin holding hands and walking towards Xi, and then all three forming a close circle as good friends went viral on social media.

In his address at the summit, Xi elaborated on his vision for a new global security and economic order that prioritises the Global South.

As China hosted several world leaders at the Victory Day parade in Beijing on Wednesday, Trump accused the Chinese president of conspiring against the US along with Putin and North Korea's Kim Jong Un.

"May President Xi and the wonderful people of China have a great and lasting day of celebration,"

Trump wrote on Truth Social.

"Please give my warmest regards to Vladimir Putin, and Kim Jong Un, as you conspire against the United States of America."

Over the last few days, India-US ties have witnessed a major downturn after over two decades of close cooperation. The tension began after the collapse of the negotiations for a trade deal, as well as Trump's repeated claims that he resolved the military conflict between India and Pakistan in May.

India has been maintaining that it ended following direct talks between the two sides.

Over the last few months, India and the US held several rounds of negotiations for a bilateral trade deal, but it could not be sealed in view of sharp divergences in certain critical areas, including agriculture and dairy.

The bilateral trade between India and the US was around USD 130 billion last year and there was a projection of upward mobility in the volume.

The US has also been targeting India for its energy ties with Russia.

Defending its purchase of Russian crude oil, India has been maintaining that its energy procurement is driven by national interest and market dynamics.(PTI)

Putin says foreign troops deployed to Ukraine before any peace deal would be 'legitimate targets'



KYIV, Sept 5: Russian President Vladimir Putin said Friday that any foreign troops deployed to Ukraine before a peace agreement has been signed would be considered "legitimate targets" by Moscow's forces.

Putin's comments came hours after European leaders repledged their commitment to a potential peacekeeping force, a prospect that Moscow has repeatedly described as "unacceptable."

"If any troops appear there, especially now while fighting is ongoing, we assume that they will be legitimate targets," he said during a panel at the Eastern Economic Forum in the far eastern Russian city of Vladivostok.

Putin also dismissed the idea of peacekeeping forces in Ukraine after a final peace deal, saying "no one should doubt" that Moscow would comply with a treaty to halt its 3½-year full-scale invasion of its neighbour.

He said that security guarantees would be needed for both Russia and Ukraine.

Kremlin spokesperson Dmitry Peskov later said that Moscow would need "legally binding documents" to outline such agreements.

"Of course, you can't just take anybody's word for something," he told Russian news outlet Argumenty i Fakty.

Putin's comments follow remarks from French President Emmanuel Macron on Thursday that 26 of Ukraine's allies have pledged to deploy troops as a "reassurance force" for Ukraine once fighting ends.

Macron spoke after a meeting in Paris of the so-called coalition of the willing, a group of 35 countries that support Ukraine. He said that 26 of the countries had committed to deploying troops to Ukraine — or to maintaining a presence on land, at sea or in the air — to help guarantee the country's security the day after any ceasefire or peace is achieved.

Addressing the participants of the international economic conference the Ambrosetti Forum on Friday, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said it was important that security guarantees "start working now, during the war, and not only after it ends."

He said he could not disclose more details as they are "sensitive and relate to the military sphere."

Drone strikes continue

Russian troops attacked Ukraine overnight with 157 strike and decoy drones, as well as seven missiles of various types, Ukraine's air force reported Friday. Air defences shot down or jammed 121 of the drones, it said.

One attack damaged multiple residential buildings in Dnipro in central Ukraine, regional administration head Serhii Lysak wrote on social media. The regional administration also said that an unspecified "facility" had been set alight in the strike, but did not give further details.

Lysak shared photos of residential buildings with damaged roofs, glass shards lying on the ground and people carrying wooden boards to cover broken windows. "Private homes were damaged. Windows in apartment buildings were shattered," he wrote.

Meanwhile, in Ukraine's Chernihiv region north of Kyiv, Russian drones attacked infrastructure in the Novhorod-Siversk district, leaving at least 15 settlements without electricity, local authorities reported.

Elsewhere, Russian troops destroyed 92 Ukrainian drones overnight, Russia's Defence Ministry said Friday. Local social media channels in the city of Ryazan, approximately 200 kilometres southeast of Moscow, reported that the city's Rosneft oil refinery had been targeted. They shared videos that appeared to show a fire against the night sky.

Local Gov Pavel Malkov said that drone debris had fallen on an "industrial enterprise" but did not give further details, instead warning residents not to post images of air defences on social media. (AP)

BANGKOK, Sept 5: Veteran Thai politician Anutin Charnvirakul won a vote in Parliament on Friday to become the country's next prime minister, according to an unofficial running tally broadcast live on television.

Anutin, leader of the Bhumjaithai party, won more than 247 votes — the required majority — from the House of Representatives' 492 active members. His total must be certified after voting is completed. He and his government are expected to take office in a few days after obtaining a formal appointment from King Maha Vajiralongkorn.

Anutin succeeds Paetongtarn Shinawatra, who was dismissed by court order as prime minister last week after being found guilty of ethics violations over a politically compromising phone call with neighbouring Cambodia's Senate President Hun Sen.

The dispute erupted into a



deadly five-day armed conflict in July.

Anutin had served in Paetongtarn's Cabinet, but he resigned his position and withdrew his party from her coalition government after news of the leaked phone call caused a public uproar.

Only five candidates, nominated during the last general election in 2023, were eligible under Thailand's constitutional rules.

Pheu Thai, currently leading a caretaker government, attempted to dissolve Parliament on Tuesday, but the acting prime minister said their request was rejected by the king's Privy Council.

The 58-year-old Anutin had served in the Pheu Thai-led coalition government that took power in 2023 and before that in the military-backed but elected government under former Prime Minister Prayuth Chan-ocha.

Anutin is best known for successfully lobbying for the decriminalization of cannabis, a policy that is now being more strictly regulated for medical purposes. He also played a high-profile role as health minister during the COVID-19 pandemic, when he was accused of tardiness in obtaining adequate vaccine supplies to fight the virus.

His party has promised to dissolve Parliament within four months in exchange for support from the People's Party. That party's leader, Natthaphong Ruengpanyawut, said it would remain in the opposition, leaving the new government potentially a minority one.(AP)

Israel strikes Gaza City high-rise building

DEIR AL-BALAH (GAZA STRIP), Sept 5: Israel struck a high-rise building on Friday as the army ramped up an offensive in preparations to take over Gaza City. Defence Minister Israel Katz said the strike on the building was just the beginning, warning "when the door opens it will not close" and the army's activity will increase.

His comments come days after Israel began mobilising tens of thousands of reservists and repeating evacuation warnings as part of its plan to widen its offensive in Gaza City and other Hamas strongholds, which has sparked opposition domestically and condemnation abroad. Palestinians said Israel's strike Friday targeted the Mushtaha tower in Gaza City, located in the southern area of the once-upscale Rimal neighbourhood. The tower already had come under Israeli attacks and photos of the building taken before the strike showed its roof was heavily damaged.

Israel said it struck the building because it was used for Hamas surveillance. Israel has declared Gaza City, in the north of the territory, to be a combat zone. Parts of the city are already considered "red zones" where Palestinians have been ordered to evacuate ahead of expected heavy fighting. That has left residents on edge, including many who returned after fleeing the city in the initial stages of the Israel-Hamas war. Moving costs thousands of dollars and finding space in the overcrowded south to pitch a tent feels impossible. But staying behind, they say, could be deadly. (AP)

Angela Rayner resigns as UK Deputy PM after tax row, unleashes Cabinet reshuffle



LONDON, Sept 5: Angela Rayner on Friday resigned as UK's Deputy Prime Minister and Housing Secretary after a speed-up independent ethics inquiry concluded that she had underpaid tax on a recently bought home.

Rayner, 45, a powerful leader within the Labour Party, handed in her resignation after the inquiry concluded that she had breached the Ministerial Code of Conduct by failing to seek out specialist tax advice to ensure she paid the correct stamp duty on the property on the south coast of England.

British Prime Minister Keir Starmer, who is now formalising a forced Cabinet reshuffle of his top team, expressed his regret at losing his senior-most minister.

"You were right to refer yourself to the Independent Adviser on Ministerial Adviser and right to act on his conclusions," Starmer said, in a rare hand-written letter in response to Rayner's resignation.

"On a personal note, I am very sad to be losing you from the Government. You have been a trusted colleague and a true friend for many years. I have nothing but admiration for you and huge respect for your

achievements in politics," he said, adding that she will remain a "major figure" in the Labour Party as she moves to the backbenches.

Sir Laurie Magnus, Starmer's Independent Adviser on Ministerial Standards, informed him that his deputy cannot be considered to have met the "highest possible standards of proper conduct" and therefore was in breach of the Ministerial Code of Conduct.

Rayner, Labour's member of Parliament for Ashton-under-Lyne in northern England who also held the influential post of Secretary of State of the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government, said she deeply regretted her decision to "not seek additional specialist tax advice." "I would like to take this opportunity to repeat that it was never my intention to do anything other than pay the right amount. I must also consider the significant toll that the ongoing pressure of the media is taking on my family," she said in her resignation letter to the PM. The letters were released by 10 Downing Street along with the letter to Starmer from Laurie Magnus, who described his conclusion as "highly unfortunate." "She [Rayner] believed that she relied on the legal advice she had received, but unfortunately did not heed the caution contained within it, which acknowledged that it did not constitute expert tax advice and which suggested that expert advice be sought," he wrote. He added: "I believe Ms Rayner has acted with integrity and with a dedicated and exemplary commitment to public service. I consider, however, that her unfortunate failure to settle her SDLT [stamp duty] liability at the correct level, coupled with the fact that this was established only following intensive public scrutiny, leads me to advise you that, in relation to this matter, she cannot be considered to have met the 'highest possible standards of proper conduct' as envisaged by the Code.(PTI)

Most of those killed in Lisbon streetcar derailment were foreigners, police say



LISBON, Sept 5: Police in Portugal said Friday that 11 of the 16 people killed when a streetcar derailed were foreigners, as an initial investigative report examining what caused the popular Lisbon tourist attraction to crash was expected to be released.

The dead included five Portuguese nationals, three British citizens, two Canadians, two South Koreans, one American, one French, one Swiss and one Ukrainian, police said in a statement.

A German man also thought to have died in Wednesday's crash was found to be in a Lisbon hospital, police said.

It didn't provide an explanation for the error.

The list of nationalities was published following forensic identification.

The distinctive yellow-and-white Elevador da Gloria, which is classified as a national monument, was packed with locals and international tourists Wednesday evening when it came off its rails.

Sixteen people were killed and 21 others were injured.

Multiple agencies are investigating what Prime Minister Luis Montenegro has described as "one of the biggest tragedies of our recent past."

The government's Office for Air

and Rail Accident Investigations said that it has concluded its analysis of the wreckage and would issue a preliminary technical report Friday. It wasn't clear how revealing the report would be.

Chief police investigator Nelson Oliveira said that a preliminary police report, which has a broader scope, is expected within 45 days. The streetcar's wreckage was removed from the scene overnight and placed in police custody.

A tragedy beyond Portugal's borders

A woman who was a French-Canadian dual citizen is among the dead, the French Foreign Ministry said Friday.

The transport workers' trade union SITRA said the streetcar's brakeman, Andre Marques, was among the dead. A national Portuguese charitable organisation, Santa Casa da Misericordia, whose main Lisbon headquarters are at the top of the hill where the streetcar runs, said four of its staff were killed.

Spaniards, Israelis, Portuguese, Brazilians, Italians and French people were injured, the executive director of Portugal's National Health Service, Alvaro Santos, said.

"This tragedy ... goes beyond our borders," Montenegro said in a

televised address from his official residence.

Lisbon hosted around 8.5 million tourists last year, and long lines of people typically form for the streetcar's short and picturesque trip a few hundred metres up and down a city street. Thursday was a national day of mourning.

Hundreds of people attended a sombre Mass Thursday evening at Lisbon's majestic Church of Saint Dominic.

Montenegro, President Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa and Lisbon Mayor Carlos Moedas were among the attendees, some dressed in black, in the candlelit sanctuary.

Daily inspections

The electric streetcar, also known as a funicular, is harnessed by steel cables and can carry more than 40 people. Officials declined to comment on whether a faulty brake or a snapped cable may have prompted the descending streetcar to careen into a building where the steep downtown road bends.

"The city needs answers," the mayor said, adding that talk of possible causes is "mere speculation." Aside from investigations by police, public prosecutors and government transport experts, the company that operates Lisbon's streetcars and buses, Carris, said it has opened its own investigation.

The streetcar, which has been in service since 1914, underwent a scheduled full maintenance programme last year and the company conducted a 30-minute visual inspection of it every day, Carris CEO Pedro de Brito Bogas said Thursday.

The streetcar was last inspected nine hours before the derailment, he said during a news conference, but he didn't detail the visual inspection or specify when questioned whether all the cables were tested.(AP)



WASHINGTON, Sept 5: US employers added just 22,000 jobs last month as the labour market continued to cool under uncertainty over President Donald Trump's economic policies.

The Labour Department said Friday that hiring decelerated from 79,000 in July. The unemployment rate ticked up to 4.3 per cent, also worse than expected and the highest level since 2021, the Labour Department said.

When the department put out a disappointing jobs report a month ago, an enraged President Donald Trump responded by firing the economist in charge of compiling the numbers and nominating a loyalist to replace her.

Talking to reporters Thursday night at a dinner with wealthy tech executives, Trump had

seemed to shrug off whatever hiring numbers would come out Friday. "The real numbers that I'm talking about are going to be whatever it is, but will be in a year from now," the president said.

The US job market has lost momentum this year, partly because of the lingering effects of 11 interest rate hikes by the inflation fighters at the Federal Reserve in 2022 and 2023 and partly because President Donald Trump's policies, including his trade wars, have created uncertainty that leaves managers reluctant to make hiring decisions.

So far in 2025, the economy has generated 85,000 new jobs a month, down from 1,68,000 last year and an average 4,00,000 a month during the hiring boom of 2021-2023 as the United States roared back from COVID-19 lockdowns.

"The labour market is showing signs of cracking," said Heather Long, chief economist at Navy Federal Credit Union. "It's not a red siren alarm yet, but the signs keep growing that businesses are starting to cut workers."

The Labour Department re-

ported Thursday that the number of Americans applying for unemployment benefits — a proxy for layoffs — rose last week to the highest level since June, though the number of claims remained within a healthy range.

The outplacement firm Challenger, Gray & Christmas said Wednesday that US-based employers have announced more than 8,92,000 jobs cuts this year through August, more than the 7,61,000 reported for all 12 months of 2024.

In a sign that US hiring gains are limited and fragile, nearly 80 per cent of new private sectors jobs this year have been created in just one industry: healthcare and social assistance, a Labour Department category that spans hospitals to daycare centres.

After seeing the weak July jobs numbers, Trump fired Erika McEntarfer, head of the Bureau of Labour Statistics, baselessly claiming the hiring report had been rigged to hurt him politically.

He has nominated a partisan ideologue, E J Antoni, to replace her. But for now, pending An-

toni's confirmation by the Senate, the jobs report is in the hands of the acting BLS commissioner, William Wiatrowski, a career Labour Department official.

Economists and others familiar with how the jobs numbers are collected have expressed confidence that Labour Department procedures will keep the data safe from political interference.

What set Trump off a month ago wasn't the July hiring or unemployment figures. It was BLS revisions, which shaved a stunning 2,58,000 jobs off May and June payrolls and slashed average monthly hiring from May through July to a mere 35,000.

The revisions are standard practice, and necessary because many companies surveyed by the government submit their responses late or correct what they've already sent in.

Government economists are also contending with a big drop in the share of companies that respond to the surveys. A decade ago, about 60 per cent of companies surveyed responded. Now only about 40 per cent do.(AP)

According to an official statement, the Governor lauded the teaching community as "true nation-builders, shaping young minds and the very destiny of our society."

He cautioned against an overemphasis on rote learning, noting that cycles of examination preparation and memorisation could lead to performance anxiety instead of nurturing judgment, discipline, and creativity.

On examinations, he argued that assessments should test reasoning ability and creative thinking, not rely solely on single-day formats that impose artificial pressure.

"A nation cannot innovate and evolve if classrooms follow a sta-



tus quo mentality," he remarked, urging teachers to encourage inquisitiveness and teamwork among students.

In his address to the teaching community, the Governor advised them to update their knowledge beyond textbooks, to use practical examples in teaching, to encourage curiosity, and to provide care and guidance for weaker students.

He highlighted the importance of discipline, personal conduct, and value-based education, calling on teachers to instill virtues, good habits, and a spirit of cooperation in their pupils.

Lt Gen Parnaik also placed special emphasis on girls' education,

health and fitness for both students and teachers, career guidance, and instilling in youth a strong sense of duty.

He said education was the backbone of a progressive society, and stressed that digital learning, smart classrooms, and localized content could help take education to the remotest corners of the state.

'THE BENGAL FILES' DIRECTOR ANGUISHED AS FILM ON 1946 RIOTS NOT RELEASED IN BENGAL THEATRES



KOLKATA, Sept 5: Director Vivek Agnihotri on Friday expressed anguish that his latest film, 'The Bengal Files', was not being screened in theatres across West Bengal on the day of its release, alleging political pressure and intimidation behind what he called an "unofficial ban."

The film, concluding part of Agnihotri's Files Trilogy, revisits the August 1946 Calcutta killings, which were triggered by the Muslim League's call for Direct Action Day, leading to widespread communal violence, mass casualties, and eventually Mahatma Gandhi's peace fast at Belaghata.

Regretting that the film cannot be seen in theatres in city and state, Agnihotri in a post on X said, "I know that pain has touched their souls. It's your film now. #TheBengalFiles is in cinemas now. (except WEST BENGAL & Pakistan)". In another post, Agnihotri said, "There was a time when Tagore dreamt of a Bengal

without fear. In today's Bengal, the government has banned 'The Bengal Files', the boldest film ever made on Hindu genocide. Please watch 'The Bengal Files' in theatres as your protest. In cinemas tomorrow."

In an open letter addressed to President Droupadi Murmu on Friday, actor-producer Pallavi Joshi alleged that theatre owners have told the makers of the film that they were being intimidated, threatened, and are refusing to screen it fearing "violence by ruling party workers."

"The Bengal Files" unravels the long-suppressed truth of the Hindu genocide of Direct Action Day, the horrors of Noakhali, and the trauma of Partition," she said in the letter.

"There is no official ban yet an unofficial ban silences the film before people can see it," she added.

In the post accompanying the letter, Agnihotri

said that multiplex chains in the state have refused the film's release under "political pressure and threats by the ruling party."

A senior Eastern India Motion Picture Association official told PTI, "I cannot say why the film was not being slotted for screening in any theatres in West Bengal from today (September 5). It is the discretion of hall owners and multiplex owners."

Navin Chokhani, the owner of Navina in south Kolkata, told PTI that the theatre is already under an arrangement to screen 'Baaghi 4', while Bengali film 'Dhumketu' is also being shown. "For us, showing another film is not possible," he added.

A spokesperson of Menoka cinema said the theatre is screening 'The Conjuring: Last Rites' and the 2024 Bengali hit 'Bahurupi', and has no slot left for 'The Bengal Files'. (PTI)

ANURAG KASHYAP SAYS NEW MOVIE 'NISHAANCHI' IS NOT ANOTHER 'GANGS OF WASSEYPUR'



MUMBAI, Sept 5: Filmmaker Anurag Kashyap has said that his upcoming film "Nishaanchi" is different from his cult classic "Gangs of Wasseypur" movie as he stressed that while the 2012 crime saga was inspired by stories he heard, his latest draws directly from his own life and upbringing in Kanpur and Lucknow.

The trailer of "Nishaanchi" was unveiled earlier this week and since then, social media has been abuzz with comparisons to "Gangs of Wasseypur", which became popular for its gritty portrayal of gang rivalries spanning generations.

"Nishaanchi" follows the intertwined lives of twin brothers Babloo and Dabloo, set against the backdrop of the Hindi heartland. It stars debutant Aishwarya Thakur in a double role along with Vedika Pinto, Monika Panwar, Kumud Mishra, and Mohd. Zeeshan Ayyub.

Kashyap, however, dismissed the parallels.

"Back when I made Wasseypur, I was in the storytelling zone of Mehboob Khan and K Asif. Suddenly due to word of mouth,

'Wasseypur' became a cult. Everywhere I went, people were shouting, 'Wasseypur 3, Wasseypur 3!'

"But 'Wasseypur' is not the whole of North India, and 'Nishaanchi' is as different from 'Wasseypur' as Kanpur is 840 kms apart from Lucknow," the director said in a statement.

Kashyap, also known for movies such as "Black Friday", "Dev D", "Gulaal" and "Mukkabaaz", said the story of "Nishaanchi" came from "within me."

"... From the world I grew up in: Kanpur and Lucknow. Wasseypur, by contrast, is a story I heard through someone else. 'Nishaanchi' brings to life my own memories, humour, quirks, language, and music: all inbuilt in me. It's fictional, but it's driven by the joy of language, the joy of people, and the very attitude of that place," he added.

Backed by Jar Pictures in association with Flip Films, "Nishaanchi" is written by Kashyap, Prasoon Mishra and Ranjan Chandel.

Produced by Ajay Rai and Ranjan Singh, the movie is set for a nationwide release on September 19. (PTI)

I'm slightly frightened of him, was bit on edge: Jim Sarbh on working with Manoj Bajpayee in new film

MUMBAI, Sept 5: Actor Jim Sarbh says working alongside Manoj Bajpayee has been both intimidating and inspiring as he continues to remain in awe of the senior performer's ability to transform even the simplest of moments into something unforgettable.

The two actors share the screen space in the movie "Inspector Zende", which premieres on streaming service Netflix on Friday. It is directed by acclaimed Marathi actor-turned-filmmaker Chinmay Mandekar. The film features Bajpayee in the titular role of a sharp-witted cop locked in a tense game of cat and mouse with Sarbh's charming yet elusive Carl Bhojraj. India look for all-round show against China to seal final berth



RAJGIR (BIHAR), Sept 5: One step away from the final, the Indian men's hockey team will look to reach its optimal level of efficiency, when the Harmanpreet Singh-led side takes on tricky China in its last Super 4 stage match of the Asia Cup here on Saturday.

After the disappointing 2-2 draw against five-time champions South Korea, India bounced back strongly to outplay Malaysia 4-1 in their sec-

ond Super 4 match, and the latest result will give the home team a lot of confidence heading into the contest against China.

The convincing win enabled India to jump to the top of the standings with four points from two matches, while both China and Malaysia have three points each. Korea are languishing at the bottom with just one point.

The top two teams from the Super

4s will progress to the summit clash, and a draw would be enough for India to seal their place in Sunday's final. After a subdued outing against Korea, the Indians played with more intent and tenacity against Malaysia, although the start was far from rosy. The Indians were slow off the blocks and conceded an early goal before getting their act together to stage a remarkable comeback by ex-

celling in all departments of the game. Speaking after the win against Malaysia, chief coach Craig Fulton said the squad is "still not there" as far as reaching peak performance was concerned, and the Indian players know that the expectations from them are high.

The question is how do they live up to the expectations. The answer is simple: just raise their game a few notches by doing the small details correctly.

So far in the tournament, the midfield has been marshalled pretty well by the likes of veteran Manpreet Singh, Hardik Singh, Vivek Sagar Prasad and Rajinder Singh. Their co-ordination with the forwardline was a treat to watch against Malaysia.

Hardik, in particular, has been a livewire in the midfield with his fast dribbling skills and solo runs.

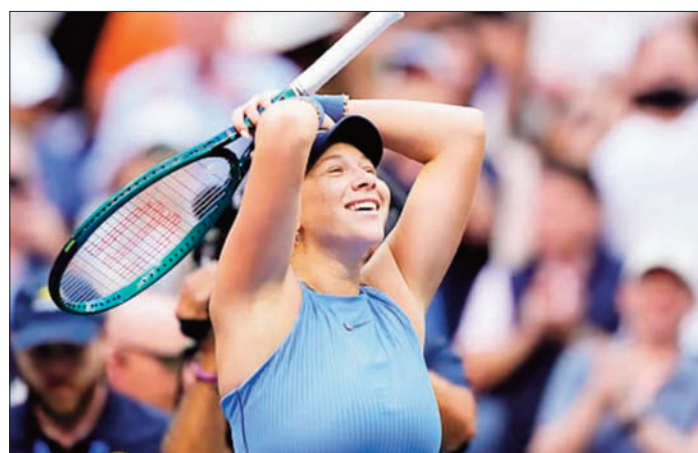
Manpreet has been a workhorse for Indian hockey for years now and his performance against Malaysia proved that he is still hungry for more. Not only did he create chances for the forwards, but he also assisted and scored a goal against Malaysia.

The trio of Abhishek, Sukhjeet Singh and Mandeep Singh has been mighty impressive upfront and would look to continue the fine show in the remainder of the tournament. Young Shilanand Lakra, who is trying to cement his place in the team after returning from a two-year injury layoff, too created as well as scored for his side.

India, however, will have to utilise their chances more once inside the opposition circle and for that, they will need to remain calm and composed.

One thing that might worry Fulton a bit is the rate of penalty corner conversion. After a fine start, skipper Harmanpreet looked to have run out of ideas from set pieces, while the likes of Jugraj Singh, Sanjay and Amit Rohidas too found the going tough. (PTI)

Amanda Anisimova defeats Naomi Osaka at the US Open to reach her 2nd Grand Slam final in a row



NEW YORK, Sept 5: Amanda Anisimova eliminated four-time Grand Slam champion Naomi Osaka 6-7 (4), 7-6 (3), 6-3 in a U.S. Open semifinal that ended at nearly 1 a.m. Friday and featured two of the most powerful first-strike hitters in women's tennis.

The No. 8-seeded Anisimova, a 24-year-old who was born in New Jersey and grew up in Florida, reached her second straight major final by coming through after 2 hours, 56 minutes.

"I wasn't sure I would make it past the finish line and I tried to dig deep," said Anisimova, who needed three match points to get the job done. "It was a huge fight out there today." When it was over, Anisimova yelled, "Let's go!" and enjoyed the moment by kneeling on the court and leaning forward.

She will face defending champion and current No. 1 Aryna Sabalenka on Saturday for the title. Sabalenka beat Jessica Pegula in three sets on Thursday. Sabalenka owns three major trophies, all on hard courts.

This is the fifth consecutive women's final at a Slam involving an American woman.

At Wimbledon in July, Anisimova had a Grand Slam breakthrough, upsetting Sabalenka in the semifinals — a result that increased the American's edge in their head-to-head series to 6-3 — and making it all the way to the title match before losing 6-0, 6-0 to Iga Swiatek. But Anisimova recovered from that quickly enough and well enough to get past Swiatek in two sets in the U.S. Open quarterfinals.

Now Anisimova is the first opponent to beat Osaka — a former No.

1 player who was seeded No. 23 in New York — this late in a Grand Slam tournament. Before this loss, Osaka had been a combined 14-0 over her career in major quarterfinals, semifinals and finals, with two trophies apiece from the U.S. Open and Australian Open.

"I mean, honestly I don't feel sad. It's really weird. Well, it's not weird, because I just feel like I did the best that I could," said Osaka, who took a series of mental-health breaks starting in 2021, then was away from the tour while having a daughter. "Honestly, it's kind of inspiring for me, because it makes me just want to train and try to get better, and hopefully, just give it my very best shot again and see what happens. But I think I can't be mad or upset at myself."

Anisimova first got to the final four at a major tournament at the 2019 French Open at age 17. In 2023, she took a break from the tour, saying she had been "struggling with my mental health and burnout" for nearly a year.

At this time last season, Anisimova was ranked 50th and still working her way back. She's most certainly back — and better than ever. Asked what allowed her to win against Osaka, Anisimova replied: "Oh, my God. I don't know. I mean, Naomi is playing amazing tennis. She's back where she belongs."

Well, Anisimova did it by forgetting about the opening set, and forgetting about a 6-5 deficit in the second. She also did it by not holding anything back down the stretch, going for — and delivering — big groundstrokes that usually landed deep in the court and right where she wanted them. (AP)

Inter Miami's Luis Suárez apologizes for on-field antics after Leagues Cup final loss to Seattle

FORT LAUDERDALE, USA, Sept 5: Inter Miami forward Luis Suárez apologized for his behavior following his team's defeat by the Seattle Sounders in the Leagues Cup final earlier this week, antics that became the latest entry on a long list of on-field transgressions over his lengthy career.

Suárez — a longtime teammate of Inter Miami star Lionel Messi — appeared to spit toward a member of the Sounders' staff, plus grabbed at least one Seattle player by the neck during a postgame melee Thursday. Major League Soccer and Leagues Cup officials are investigating, and

Suárez could face sanctions.

"First of all, I want to congratulate the Seattle Sounders on their Leagues Cup victory. But above all, I want to apologize for my behavior at the end of the match," Suárez wrote on Instagram in his native Spanish. "It was a very tense and frustrating moment. Things happened right after the match that shouldn't have happened, but that doesn't justify my reaction. I was wrong and I sincerely regret it."

"It's not the image I want to portray, neither to my family, who are suffering because of my mistakes, nor to my club, which doesn't de-

serve to be affected by something like this. I feel bad about what happened and didn't want to miss the opportunity to acknowledge it and apologize to everyone who felt bad about what I did."

Inter Miami issued a statement Thursday as well, without naming any players. The club said it is working with both MLS and Leagues Cup officials "to ensure the situation is addressed appropriately" and thanked fans for their continued support. "Inter Miami condemns the altercations that took place following the conclusion of the Leagues Cup Final," the club wrote.

"These actions do not reflect the values of our sport, and we remain committed to upholding the highest standards of sportsmanship both on and off the pitch."

Suárez's history is both highly colorful and highly successful.

With Suárez, Uruguay ended 20 years of World Cup underachievement by reaching the semifinals in 2010. He helped deliver Uruguay's first Copa America title in 16 years in 2011. He was instrumental in Atletico Madrid's first Spanish title in seven years in 2021.

He also is known for an infamous intentional handball in the 2010

World Cup quarterfinals to take a semifinal spot from Ghana and served bans on three occasions for biting opponents — the most recent of those in 2014, after he chomped down on the shoulder of Italy defender Giorgio Chiellini following a tussle in the penalty area during a World Cup match.

Suárez has been involved in 16 Inter Miami goals — scoring six and assisting on 10 others — during MLS play this season, second-most on the team behind only Messi. The eight-time Ballon d'Or winner has 19 goals and 10 assists in MLS matches this year. (AP)

Sabalenka beats Jessica Pegula in the US Open semifinals

NEW YORK, Sept 5: On Aryna Sabalenka's first chance to end her U.S. Open semifinal against Jessica Pegula for the chance to play for a second consecutive trophy, the defending champion dumped what should have been an easy overhead into the net, then stared at the ground.

On Sabalenka's second chance, she missed a clumsy volley — and maybe shouldn't have even ventured forward, because she went just 15 for 27 when up at the net. Uh, oh. So good at important moments in the high-stakes, high-tension final set, Sabalenka held it together there and held on, converting her third match point Thursday night to finish off a 4-6, 6-3, 6-4 victory over Pegula in a rematch of last year's final.

"I was super emotional. I was just like, Oh, my gosh, no way it's happening. Please, just close this match," Sabalenka explained afterward. "The whole match, I just keep telling myself: (Onto) the next one, just one step at a time, don't worry about the past. Just try better in the next point."

When it was over, Sabalenka rocked back on her heels, spread her arms and screamed.

On Saturday, when she faces No. 8 Amanda Anisimova or No. 23 Naomi Osaka, the No. 1-seeded Sabalenka will be trying to become the first woman to claim consecutive championships at Flushing Meadows since Serena Williams got three in a row from 2012 to 2014.

"I had to work really hard to get this win," Sabalenka said after improving to 8-2 against Pegula over their careers. "Hopefully I can go all the way again."

Thursday's first semifinal was quite close, far closer than the straight-set triumph for Sabalenka over Pegula 12 months ago that gave the 27-year-old from Belarus her third Grand Slam title, all on hard courts.

Since then, Sabalenka was the runner-up to Madison Keys at the

Australian Open in January and to Coco Gauff at the French Open in June, then was eliminated in the Wimbledon semifinals by Anisimova in July.

Arthur Ashe Stadium's retractable roof was shut before the semifinals began, which prevented disruption from the wind outside gusting at up to 30 mph and the rain that arrived during play. In the good, indoor conditions, No. 4 Pegula played about as cleanly as possible in the first set and the third, making just three unforced errors in each. But in the second, that count was nine. By the end, Sabalenka had accumulated more than twice as many winners as Pegula, 43-21.

"We were pushing each other," Pegula said, "every single game."

All evening, Pegula went after her returns, taking big cuts and not playing it safe, by any means. This, then, was the key: Sabalenka was able to save all four break points she faced in the last set. "It was really high-level. I don't really know what else to say," said Pegula, who was wearing a white New York Yankees jacket and enjoying a root beer lollipop at her news conference. "I don't know how I didn't break back in the third."

Asked how she managed to handle those moments, Sabalenka replied with a laugh: "Just praying inside and hoping for the best." Neither she nor Pegula had lost a set in the tournament before Thursday, although Sabalenka only needed to go through four matches, instead of five, to reach the semifinals, because her quarterfinal opponent, Marketa Vondrousova, withdrew with an injured knee.

That meant Sabalenka hadn't competed since Sunday.

Might she be rusty? Sure didn't look that way at the outset, and Sabalenka used a nifty drop-shot-volley-winner combination to help go up a break and grab a 4-2 lead. (AP)

Monza gearing up for Hamilton in Ferrari red at the Italian GP

MONZA, Sept 5: There's an added air of excitement among the passionate, red-clad tifosi at the Italian Grand Prix: Lewis Hamilton is preparing to make his Monza debut in a Ferrari.

It will be Hamilton's 19th race at the high-speed Italian track, but his first in red.

The seven-time world champion has stood on the iconic Monza podium eight times, five of those after winning the Italian Grand Prix.

But Hamilton — who hasn't finished higher than fourth in a difficult first year with the Italian Scuderia — is not thinking about what it would be like to do so clad in Ferrari red.

"I haven't (thought about it), simply because I've been on the podium plenty of times here, so I

know what it's like to be up there," Hamilton said. "I've seen how it's been for other Ferrari drivers, and anything I try to imagine will be far from what that feeling could be."

Hamilton will have to serve a five-place grid penalty at Sunday's race as Ferrari looks to rebound from a disastrous Dutch Grand Prix that saw both the British driver and teammate Charles Leclerc crash out in separate incidents.

"I'm still obviously in my first year with the team, and so every weekend is the first time driving this car at that track," Hamilton said. "I think Ferrari's journey has gone pretty well in the past years. Obviously, they won here last year with a great strategy and a great drive from Charles."

"I'm really keen to see how the car works here. We're definitely learning from weekend to weekend, loads of positives to take from the last, so I think we just have to keep building on that."

Title fight While the red of Ferrari will dominate the grandstands, two papaya-colored cars will take center stage in the title fight.

McLaren drivers Lando Norris and Oscar Piastri are battling each other for what would be a first Formula 1 title for either.

Norris saw his title chances diminish dramatically at last weekend's Dutch Grand Prix as his McLaren broke down while he was chasing Piastri, who went on to win the race and extend his lead in the drivers' championship to 34 points.

"I don't think much will change," Piastri said. "He's certainly not out of the fight. Yes, it's a bit more difficult now, but I don't expect much to change. I think we'll race each other the same way, I think the amount of risks we're taking will be the same."

"We're both trying to drive as fast as we can, it's not like we've been holding anything back from that side of things."

Radical changes F1 chief executive Stefano Domenicali recently suggested radical changes could be made to race weekends to attract younger audiences.

The most drastic of those could be the shortening of the actual races.

"I will be on the other side, I will be in front of the TV when

that happens," 44-year-old Fernando Alonso said. "I don't think it's a problem with the sport. Also, football matches are a little bit long ... and no one is talking about having 60-minute football matches or something like that."

"So it's a problem of society and the kids, but not the sport. So probably it's not needed, the change."

Domenicali said that packing the calendar with more sprint races could also be an option and claimed that most drivers are in favor with even four-time champion Max Verstappen, who has been among the most volubly critical of the sprint format, coming round to the idea.

However, Verstappen said on Thursday that his mindset hadn't really changed. (AP)

Deepika chases elusive medal, teen Gatha to lead India's next gen at World Championship

GWANGJU (SOUTH KOREA), Sept 5: In the twilight of her career, seasoned Deepika Kumari will yet again chase an elusive World Championship medal as India are set to showcase their next generation, led by 15-year-old Gatha Khadake, at the prestigious tournament beginning here Saturday.

Pune's Gatha has been the breakout star of Indian archery this year after shining in the national trials in June with a record 686 points — the highest recurve qualification score across genders — and sealed her place in the senior team. Her presence alongside the seasoned Deepika and Ankita Bhakat has set the stage for the past and future competing shoulder to shoulder.

Gatha and 16-year-old Sharvari Shende, who recently became the U-18 world champion, had impressed at the trials but only the top three earned berths for Gwangju.

Deepika, who topped the trials, was joined by Ankita and Gatha to



form India's three-member recurve women's squad.

For Sharvari, who had made her senior debut at the Madrid World Cup in July, the cut proved too steep, though she remains one of India's brightest prospects.

Gatha, too, debuted in Madrid in July, making the pre-quarterfinals after upsetting Chinese Taipei Olympian and World Cup medalist Chiu Yi-Ching.

Her last-16 finish was the best among Indian women in that event, even ahead of Deepika and Ankita.

Sharvari, meanwhile, claimed the Under-18 world title in Winnipeg, defeating two Koreans en route to gold, and joined Deepika and Komalika Bari as India's only junior world champions.

For 31-year-old Deepika, post motherhood, the World Championship offers another shot at the

one medal missing from her cabinet along with the Olympic prize.

Since her first appearance in 2011, the most decorated Indian archer has only managed team silvers (2011, 2015) but no individual medal.

This will be her sixth world outing — her first since 2019 — and she knows time is running out. Deepika and Gatha have already developed a budding rivalry in this short span.

At the National Games in Uttarakhanda earlier this year, a shoot-off semi-final clash between the two sparked some heated exchanges, with Deepika edging out the teenager 10-8 in shootoff.

Gatha later outscored her in the qualification round at the June trials before Deepika recovered to win in eliminations.

"Gatha has been playing well, and I wish her all the best for the future as we look forward to the World Championships," Deepika had said, brushing aside sugges-

tions of rivalry.

They teamed up in Madrid, though India exited in the second round. Individually, Gatha went further than her star India teammate showing signs of her rapid rise.

Ankita is the third member of the women's side and competed at the Berlin World Championships two years ago only to make first round exit.

The challenge for the Indians, however, will be enormous with their nemesis South Korea, led by Tokyo Olympic champion An San and reigning Olympic champion and world number one Lim Si-hyeon.

Koreans are overwhelming favourites in the women's recurve and it remains to be seen if the Indians overcome the Korean hurdle this time if they cross paths. In the men's recurve, Army man Dhiraj Bommadevara will spearhead India's charge alongside Neeraj Chaudhan and Rahul. (PTI)

India thrash Thailand 11-0 in women's Asia Cup hockey campaign-opener



HANGZHOU (CHINA), Sept 5 : Udit Duhan and Beauty Dung Dung scored a brace each as India began their campaign in the women's Asia Cup hockey tournament with a 11-0 thrashing of Thailand here on Friday.

Udit scored in the 30th and 52nd minutes from penalty corners while Dung Dung

struck in the 45th and 54th minutes.

India's other goal-scorers were Mumtaz Khan (7th minute), Sangita Kumari (10th), Navneet Kaur (16th), Lalremsiami (18th), Thoudam Suman Devi (49th), Sharmila Devi (57th) and Rutaja Dadaso Pisal (60th).

India, currently ranked ninth in the world, led 5-0 at half time in the Pool B match

against the 30th-ranked Thais.

India got a total of nine penalty corners, out of which they converted five, while Thailand did not earn any PC.

India asserted their dominance early on with two field goals from Mumtaz and Sangita in the first quarter. The second quarter saw India being more menacing in attacks

and the team added three more goals to extend its advantage.

Experienced forward Navneet and midfielder Lalremsiami scored a field goal each in quick succession, followed by a penalty corner conversion from Udit just before the half time break.

The second half followed a similar trend as India continued their constant attacks inside Thailand's circle.

India won four penalty corners in the third quarter, and Dung Dung converted one PC in the 45th minute.

India shifted gears in the final quarter, pumping in five more goals to seal a big win. Mumtaz, Udit and Sharmila scored through penalty corners while Dung Dung and Rutaja struck field goals.

The tournament features eight teams and the top two from each of the two pools will qualify for the Super 4s stage. The top two teams in Super 4s will play in the final scheduled for September 14.

India have come into the tournament without the injured duo of veteran goalkeeper Savita Punia and ace drag-flicker Deepika.

The Asia Cup winners will qualify for the 2026 Women's World Cup to be held in Belgium and the Netherlands. After Thailand, India will take on Japan on Saturday, followed by the final pool match against Singapore on September 8. (PTI)

South Africa clinches ODI series against England with exciting 5-run win at Lord's



LONDON, Sept 5: South Africa clinched the ODI series against England with a game to spare after a five-run win in the second match that was set up by a record-breaking 85 by Matt Breetzke at Lord's.

Brought in to the Proteas lineup to replace the ill Wiaan Mulder, Breetzke became the first player in ODI history to score at least a half-century in his first five matches, according to the ESPNcricinfo website.

The 26-year-old middle-order batter's 77-ball knock added to a 49 from opener Aiden Markram and 58 from Tristan Stubbs as South Africa, which was put into bat, made 330-8 from its 50 overs on Thursday.

"It was a more than competitive score. I definitely would have taken that when we were three wickets down," Proteas captain Temba Bavuma said.

England was skittled for 131 on the way to losing their first match by seven wickets at Headingley on Tuesday but competed much better two days later, despite losing Jamie Smith to the first over of the reply.

It went down to the last over, off which England needed 16 with one

wicket remaining, but some inspired hitting by tailender Jofra Archer (27 off 14 balls) couldn't prevent the hosts falling just short on 325-9.

Before that, Jacob Bethell illuminated the home of cricket with a 58-ball 40, including hitting four consecutive boundaries, and put on 77 runs for the third wicket with Joe Root (61 off 72 balls) to give England a chance.

Jos Buttler then smashed 61 off 51 balls before being deceived by a slower ball from Lungi Ngidi and getting bowled.

Will Jacks kept alive English hopes with two sixes but was one of two wickets to fall in the 47th over, bowled by Nandre Burger (3-63). Archer hit two fours and two sixes but ran out of balls as the South Africans — back at Lord's 2 1/2 months after beating Australia there to win the World Test Championship — prevailed again.

"They probably got 10, 15 too many, but to get within one blow of their score, I thought was a good effort," England captain Harry Brook said.

The third ODI is at Southampton on Sunday. (AP)

Lionel Messi scores twice in an emotional home farewell for Argentina

BUENOS AIRES, Sept 5 : Lionel Messi made sure he had good memories of playing a home qualifier with Argentina's national team for the last time in his illustrious career.

Messi scored twice Thursday in Argentina's 3-0 victory over Venezuela in front of a raucous sellout crowd that had gathered at estadio Monumental to bid him farewell.

"Being able to finish this way here is what I've always dreamed of," Messi said.

"I've experienced a lot of things on this pitch, both good and not so good, but it's always a joy to play in Argentina, in front of our fans."

Messi is yet to give any clues about when he will retire from the top level of the sport. But the qualifiers for the 2030 World Cup will begin in 2027, when he's 40.

The Argentina captain scored in the 39th and 80th minutes, and Lautaro Martinez added a goal in the 76th.

Messi now has 36 goals in South American World Cup qualifiers and remains as the all-time scoring leader. His Inter Miami teammate Luis Suarez has 29 goals in continental qualifying, but he has retired from Uruguay's national team. Bolivia's Marcelo Moreno Martins is third with 22.

Looking ahead, Messi clarified that he will only compete in next year's World Cup if he feels physically fit.

"I'm excited, eager. It's day by day, feeling the sensations. If I feel good, I enjoy it; if not, I'd rather not be there," he said, adding that the nine months until the tournament kicks off "is a long time." (AP)

Leg-spinner Ahmed baffles UAE and takes Pakistan to tri-series final

SHARJAH, UNITED ARAB EMIRATES, Sept 5 : Leg-spinner Abrar Ahmed mystified United Arab Emirates batters with a career-best return of 4-9 as Pakistan sealed its place in the final of the T20 tri-series with a 31-run victory.

Fakhar Zaman tuned up for next week's Asia Cup with an unbeaten 77 off 44 balls — the left-hander's first T20 half-century after 15 games — and propelled Pakistan to 171-5 against some sloppy UAE fielding after captain Salman Ali Agha won the toss and elected to field Thursday.

Ahmed, playing his first game of the series, then baffled UAE top-order batters with his carrom balls and googlies before restricting them to 140-7 and the trend of

teams successfully defending the totals continued for fifth successive game.

Afghanistan, which already has four points, will take on UAE in the last league game Friday before meeting Pakistan in the final Sunday.

UAE top-order batters couldn't decode Ahmed's mystery spin once he came onto bowl inside the batting powerplay. Captain Mohammad Waseem (19) failed to read the carrom ball and sliced an easy catch at point in Ahmed's second over.

Alishan Sharafu, who was scrappy in the field earlier on, and Ethan D'Souza struggled to set up the momentum before D'Souza holed out at deep square leg in the 11th over after scoring 9 off 14

balls.

Ahmed then returned for another two brilliant overs and picked up the wickets of Asif Khan and Rahul Chopra in space of three balls before wrapping up a brilliant spell with the wicket of Harshit Kaushik off his final ball as UAE slipped to 102-5 in 15 overs.

Opening batter Sharafu's countercharge came a bit too late for UAE as he made 68 off 51 balls before Agha grabbed a catch over his head at mid-off of Shaheen Shah Afridi's off-cutter.

Earlier, Zaman and Mohammad Nawaz (37 not out) revived Pakistan with its highest-ever sixth wicket stand in T20 international and added 91 runs off the final 51 balls.

But both batters survived

chances against an unlucky left-arm spinner Haider Ali (2-17) when they were dropped in the outfield off successive balls before cutting loose in the final two overs which fetched Pakistan 42 runs.

Nawaz smacked fast bowler Junaid Siddique (1-52) for three successive fours in the penultimate over before lofting the pacer for a six over cover boundary in a 20-run 19th over.

Zaman was dropped by Sharafu on 39 at mid-off before another misfield by him brought 50 for the batter. Zaman capped Pakistan's perfect recovery with five consecutive fours in Mohammad Jawadullah's last over that included two lap shots over the head of wicketkeeper and two edges flying to third boundary. Uruguay, Colombia and Paraguay qualify for the 2026 WC

MONTEVIDEO, Sept 5 : Uruguay, Colombia and Paraguay secured places at the 2026 World Cup in the next-to-last round of South American qualifiers.

The Uruguayans and Colombians had 3-0 wins Thursday, and the Paraguayans had a scoreless draw to advance to the global tournament along with already qualified Argentina, Brazil and Ecuador.

"It's a good way to qualify. The team's offensive play was strong, there were also many highlights in individual performances," Uruguay coach Marcelo Bielsa said.

Peru, which needed wins in the last two rounds to advance, is now out of contention following the loss to Uruguay.

"It hurts to lose, it hurts because of the effort the players put in, but today the opponent outclassed us," Peru coach Oscar Ibáñez said.

James Rodriguez opened the scoring for Colombia in the 31st minute while John Córdoba and Juan Fernando Quintero added second-half goals to secure the win over Bolivia.

The Colombians return to the World

Cup after missing the 2022 World Cup in Qatar.

It will be the Colombian team's seventh appearance in the World Cup. After a debut in Chile in 1962, Colombia made three consecutive appearances between 1990 and 1998, and repeated in 2014 and 2018.

"This jersey has given me so much. I'm grateful for everything I'm doing," said James, who is aiming to play in his third World Cup.

"I've always given everything and I'll keep the good things for myself."

World Cup champion Argentina defeated Venezuela 3-0 with two goals by Lionel Messi and remained well clear at the top of the South American standings.

Also on Thursday, Estêvão, Lucas Paquetá and Bruno Guimarães scored as Brazil got a 3-0 win over Chile to ascend to second place in the standings.

The 18-year old Estêvão, who plays for Chelsea, scored his first goal with the national team in the 38th. Paquetá followed with a strike in the 72nd and Guimarães added one on the 76th. (AP)

Molineux, Wareham return as Australia name 15-member squad for Women's World Cup

MELBOURNE, Sept 5 : Left-arm spinner Sophie Molineux returned after a long injury layoff as Australia Friday announced a 15-member squad for the upcoming ICC Women's World Cup in which Alyssa Healy will be leading the seven-time champions' title defence.

Australia won the last edition of the tournament and will look to extend their dominance in the upcoming event which will be held across India and Sri Lanka from September 30 to November 2.

Victorian spinner Molineux, who has been recovering from a knee injury since January, will, however, miss the preceding three-match ODI series against India from September 14 to 20, which will be the final tune-up for both teams.

Darcie Brown (quad) and Georgia Wareham (groin) also recovered from their recent injuries to bolster the squad which does not hold any surprises.

With the tournament being played in the Indian sub-continent, the spin duo of Molineux and leg-spinner Wareham will be vital to Australia's prospects as they look to defend the title won in New Zealand in 2022.

Skipper Healy, too, made a return to the Australia A side last month after a 2024-25 season disrupted by injuries.

"Sophie Molineux is progressing well in her return from a knee injury, and we anticipate she'll be available for the World Cup," Australia team physio Kate Beerworth was quoted as saying in Cricket Australia's official website.



"Alyssa Healy made a strong return in the recent 'A' series, and we're pleased with where she's at, with Georgia Wareham also back to full training following her adductor injury during the Hundred."

Molineux is among five Australians who will feature in a 50-over World Cup for the first time.

Ten of the 15 members named featured in the previous edition of the tournament in 2022, with skipper Healy taking charge of the squad in her third World Cup.

The line-up also features seasoned campaigners like Ellyse Perry, Beth Mooney, Annabel Sutherland, Tahlia McGrath and Ashleigh Gardner.

Star wicketkeeper-batter Healy has been leading the Australian team across the three formats since the retirement of Meg Lanning in 2023.

"A World Cup in India is one of cricket's biggest assignments, but we believe this group is up for the challenge," national selector Shawn Flegler said in a

statement issued by the country's cricket board.

"The valuable experience the squad has gained from several subcontinent tours in recent years, as well as exposure through the Women's Premier League will be beneficial in tackling the unique demands of Indian conditions."

"Across the winter we've seen some terrific performances right through the group — whether that be through the Australia A series, the Hundred or domestic cricket in England — with players personalising their preparations which looks to have put them in good stead."

Australia begin their campaign against New Zealand in Indore on October 1.
