BJP-led alliance crosses majority mark of 122 seats in 243-member Assembly

NDA tsunami destroys Mahagathbandhan in Bihar

PATNA, Nov 14: The NDA is set to sweep the Bihar assembly polls, surging ahead in over 200 of 243 seats on Friday with the BJP emerging as single largest party with about 90 per cent strike rate, reaffirming the popularity and campaign clout of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who was the face of the ruling alliance through the poll battle in the highly sensitive political state.

At the time of going to the press, the ruling NDA crossed the majority mark of 122 seats in the 243-member Bihar Assembly.

The NDA won 125 seats. The BJP emerged as the largest party, winning 64 seats and leading in 26 other constituencies.

Its ally JD(U) won 47 seats and was ahead in 37, while LJP(RV) bagged 11 and was ahead in eight.

The Rashtriya Lok Morcha won one seat and was leading in three, according to the latest results

available on the Election Commission website.

Deputy Chief Minister Samrat Choudhary, and state ministers Prem Kumar, Maheshwar Hazari and Sanjay Saraogi were among prominent winners from the NDA camp.

The Mahagathbandhan, which includes the RJD, the Congress and three Left parties, is facing a crushing defeat, notwithstanding surveys and opinion polls showing its chief ministerial candidate Tejashwi Yadav as the most preferred leader for the top post.

The Opposition alliance was barely poised to cross the 35-seat mark.

BJP's victory, a performance that would further cement its position as the numero uno political force in the country, will also offset whatever setback that might have been caused by last year's Lok Sabha polls when the party



had to rely on allies to remain in power in the Centre.

A high turnout of women, who outnumbered male voters by nearly 10 percentage points, seems to have clinched the deal in favour of the BJP-led coalition, as various studies have suggested that females, especially in Bihar, are

more inclined towards the NDA.

The NDA's tally in Bihar comes in the backdrop of the BJP's back-to-back stupendous performances in Delhi, Maharashtra and Haryana.

Firm backing to Chief Minister Nitish Kumar by Modi and his ministers also appeared to have

held in the next six months. Celebrations erupted at the offices of the BJP and JD(U) here, situated across the street from each other, with workers playing drums, bursting firecrackers and chanting slogans in praise of their respective leaders.

In front of the residence of the CM, the JD(U)'s 75-year-old national president, party workers posed for photographs holding aloft posters with the caption "Tiger Abhi Zinda Hai".

State BJP president Dilip Jaiswal remarked, good humouredly, "Of course, the stature of Nitish Kumar is higher than that of a tiger. And we are confident that these trends will be converted into results."

Prominent winners from the BJP included Deputy CM Samrat Choudhary (Tarapur), ministers Prem Kumar (Gaya Town), Sanjay Saraogi and Raju Kumar Singh

(Sahebganj). Notable JD(U) winners include minister Maheshwar Hazari (Kalyanpur) and jailed former MLA Anant Kumar Singh (Mokama).

The party has polled close to 21 per cent of the votes counted in 101 seats it contested.

Tejashwi Yadav, who, according to PM Modi, was declared as a chief ministerial candidate after the RJD put a "katta" on the head of its alliance partners, was precariously placed in Raghopur, the RJD stronghold, and was trailing initially, only to gain ground in the later rounds.

Hyderabad MP Asaduddin Owaisi's AIMIM, which has often been accused of being a "B-team" of the BJP, was ahead in six seats. The party had contested 32 seats.

The chief minister also took a potshot at the recent meeting of the opposition parties to make a united front to put up a strong fight against the BJP in the next election.

He said that the meeting of the opposition parties was convened

actually to discuss the marriage of an opposition leader—a barb aimed at the Assam Jatiya Parishad leader Lurinyoti Gogoi whose marriage is reportedly on the cards.

Sarma also aimed at Akhil Gogoi and asserted that the Sivasagar MLA is a master of disaster.

"We should not worry about the opposition parties here and more importantly, if Akhil Gogoi is present somewhere, a disaster is ought to happen," he added.

The chief minister also claimed that the opposition parties are not aware about the ground reality and they are cut off from the general public.

Adani Group to invest ₹ 63,000 cr in two major power projects in Assam

NEW DELHI, Nov 14: The Adani Group will invest about ₹ 63,000 crore in Assam to build major power projects, including the Northeast's largest private coal-fired plant, and new pumped-storage facilities.

In a statement, the conglomerate run by billionaire Gautam Adani said its energy companies have received Letters of Award from the state government for two large power projects in Assam.

Adani Power Ltd will put in roughly ₹ 48,000 crore to build a 3,200 MW greenfield ultra-super-critical thermal plant under the Design, Build, Finance, Own and Operate (DBFOO) model.

The company won the project with a tariff bid of ₹ 6.30 per kWh (per unit) and has secured coal linkage under the Centre's SHAKTI policy.

The plant will be commissioned in phases from December 2030 and is expected to generate



20,000–25,000 jobs during construction and about 3,500 in operations.

Adani Green Energy Ltd, the group's renewable energy company, will invest around ₹ 15,000 crore in two Pumped Storage Projects (PSPs) with a combined capacity of 2,700 MW. It has also received an LoA for 500 MW of storage capacity that will be served through these PSPs.

The group said total employment during the project phase across both investments would be about 30,000. It described the developments as the largest private-sector investment in the Northeast and aligned with chairman Gautam Adani's earlier pledge to invest ₹ 50,000 crore in the region.

Adani said the projects would boost Assam's energy security,

industrial growth and grid resilience. The thermal project has approvals from the Assam Electricity Regulatory Commission, and a power supply agreement with APDCL is expected to follow.

"Adani Power Ltd (APL), India's largest private sector power generator, will invest Rs 48,000 crore to set up a 3,200 MW greenfield ultra super critical power plant in Assam. Separately, Adani Green Energy, India's largest renewable energy company, intends to invest ₹ 15,000 crore, to set up two PSP in the state with a combined capacity of 2,700 MW," the statement said.

The 3,200 coal-fired plant, which will be commissioned in a phased manner from December 2030, will enhance Assam's energy infrastructure, supporting its growing industrial and household needs with reliable and efficient power. "This facility is designed to set (CONTD. ON PAGE 2)

India should take leadership role in WTO reform process: Ngozi

VISAKHAPATNAM, Nov 14: World Trade Organization Chief Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala on Friday said India should take the leadership role in reform process at the WTO amid growing uncertainties at global trade front.

She said that India's economy is growing at a healthy pace and it is a leader in areas such as technology.

She said that there is a need to look at areas in the WTO which are not working and discuss ways to correct that.

"...and here India can be a leader, India should be a leader in the reform process at the WTO India should be a leader in making sure that we do not stay in a system that becomes more power based instead of rules based," Director-General of the World Trade Organization (WTO) Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala said here at CII's partnership Summit 2025.

She added that India is a fast growing economy and has the scale and credibility to provide leadership not just in this region but globally.

Referring to high tariffs imposed by the US, she said the member nations should pay attention to the concerns flagged by America.

India too has flagged concerns on issues like public stockholding, she said, adding repeating past grievances will not help to build a strong global trading system.

She appealed to all the members of the WTO to work together to strengthen the global trading system.

The US has raised concerns over the way WTO arms are functioning and has called for reforms in the WTO including in its dispute redressal mechanism.

WTO is a 166-member Geneva-based multilateral body that deals with trade (CONTD. ON PAGE 2)

India negotiating trade pact with US, EU, others: Goyal

VISAKHAPATNAM, Nov 14: Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal on Friday said India is negotiating free trade agreements at present with countries, including the US, European Union, New Zealand, Oman, Peru and Chile.

He also said that the India Trade Promotion Organisation (ITPO) would be happy to join hands with the Andhra Pradesh government to develop a world class convention centre - Andhra Mandapam - here like Bharat Mandapam in New Delhi.

The minister added that lowering trade barriers globally will help promote free flow of goods, services and capital.

India has already implemented free trade agreements with countries such as the UAE, Australia and four-nation European bloc EFTA.

"We are currently negotiating with the EU, US, Oman, New



Zealand, Chile and Peru and many more wanting us to start negotiations," he said here at CII Partnership Summit 2025.

To promote ease of doing business, he said the Centre has removed as many as 42,000 compliance requirements and abolished 1,500 laws.

Later speaking at the event, Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu said that he will provide land for the construction of a world class convention centre.

Further, Goyal suggested steps to expand global cooperation. He suggested promoting two-

way investments by lowering trade barriers and creating an open transparent environment that enables a free flow of goods, services and capital.

The other suggestions include technology cooperation; and building a predictable policy framework to promote long term partnership.

These remarks are important in the wake of growing protectionism globally. Goyal added that India's trust-based diplomacy is reflected in its expanding network of Free Trade Agreements (FTAs).

Meanwhile he laid the foundation stone for Drone City and Space City in Andhra Pradesh through virtual mode on the sidelines of the event along with Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu.

He said that India should be self-reliant in production of high-quality drones and the upcoming Drone City in Kurnool will help in that direction. (PTI)

related issues. India has been a member since 1995. The WTO also said that a country may need bilateral trade agreements to push their growth but "you also need a multi-lateral system to move forward.

"That is why the WTO is important," she said, adding the world is witnessing huge disruptions in global trade at present.

"My message to you is that despite that, the global trading system remains resilient," Ngozi said, adding that 72 per cent of world trade is still happening under WTO rules, which proves stability and predictability.

She added that there is a need to work together on reforms, "and that work needs a great deal of reforms of the multilateral trading system and the WTO".

Further she said that the unilateral tariff rise by the US is dramatic, but "we must listen to what they say" about tariff barriers, non-tariff issues, lack of transparency in the system and unfair trading practices by certain countries.

"I think we need to pay attention to their complaints, (otherwise) we will miss the opportunity to take care of them," she said.

Besides the US, developing countries like India too have flagged concerns on the multilateral trading system, the WTO chief said.

She added that the current global uncertainties provide opportunities as well.

"I feel uneasy and concerned about it (the global disruptions)...but the global trading system is still working on WTO rules," she said, adding countries should diversify from their overdependence on the US or China.

She said, India is a big beneficiary in this diversification of global supply chains.

On e-commerce moratorium, she expressed hope that it can be further extended in the 14th ministerial conference, scheduled in March next year.

On free trade agreements, she said: "We don't have a problem with free trade agreements."

Even though it is between two members or two groups, the rules are very much WTO based, she said, adding, "we do not see them as a threat, and actually we are okay with them, because we think members need to diversify their trade." (PTI)

The 30-share BSE Sensex benchmark began the trade on a negative note by declining 449.35 points, or 0.53 per cent to 84,029.32. The NSE Nifty started the day off lower by 138.35 points or 0.53 per cent to 25,740.80.

However, both the barometers showed some recovery at the end before closing with gains for the fourth session in a row.

The BSE Sensex ended 84.11 points, or 0.10 per cent, higher at 84,562.78, while the NSE Nifty went up 30.90 points, or 0.12 per cent, to settle at 25,910.05.

From the Sensex pack, Eternal, Bharat Electronics Ltd, Trent, Axis Bank, State Bank of India, Bajaj Finance, Sun Pharmaceuticals, Asian Paints, Adani Ports, Hindustan Unilever, Reliance Industries, ITC, PowerGrid, Tata Motors Ltd's Commercial Vehicles business, and Bajaj Finserv were the gainers.

Infosys, Tata Motors Passenger Vehicles, Tata Steel, ICICI Bank, Tech Mahindra, Titan, UltraTech Cement, Maruti Suzuki India, and Larsen & Toubro were the laggards.

"...investors shifted focus to upcoming RBI MPC and US Fed FOMC meetings, adding to the wait-and-watch mood," Sudeep Shah, Head - Technical Research and Derivatives at SBI Securities, said.

The BSE Midcap gauge fell 0.03 per cent while smallcap went up

0.06 per cent.

Among the sectoral indices, Telecommunication climbed by 0.62 per cent, FMCG by 0.54 per cent, Consumer Durables by 0.36 per cent, Bankex by 0.31 per cent, Financial Services by 0.26 per cent, Healthcare by 0.22 per cent, Utilities by 0.21 per cent and Capital Goods by 0.16 per cent.

On the other hand, Focused IT, Teck, Commodities, IT, Auto, Metal, Oil & Gas closed lower.

"The market managed to close in the green, supported by banking and FMCG stocks, while the NDA victory in the Bihar state election added impetus to sentiment. A positive turnaround in Q2 FY26 results and benign inflation are making H2 FY26 earnings outlook brighter. Investors are looking for additional catalysts for a decisive move from current levels. The upcoming RBI policy meeting and any cues on US trade deal are expected to keep market sentiment bullish," said Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Investments Limited.

A total of 2,270 stocks declined while 1,900 advanced and 149 remain unchanged on the BSE.

"Nifty50 recovered more than 150 points from day's low in the last 30 minutes after the ruling National Democratic Alliance (NDA) received a massive mandate in the Bihar State Election 2025.

"Meanwhile, global weakness and fading hopes of a US Fed rate cut weighed on market sentiment. The US markets fell on Thursday amid a sharp sell-off in high-valuation tech and AI stocks," Siddhartha Khemka - Head of Research, Wealth Management, Motilal Oswal Financial Services Ltd, said.

WPI inflation falls to 27-month low of (-) 1.21 pc in Oct on GST cut, favourable base



NEW DELHI, Nov 14: Wholesale Price Inflation (WPI) fell to a 27-month low of (-) 1.21 per cent in October, led by a sharp deflation in food items like pulses and vegetables, and lower prices of fuel and manufactured items, government data showed on Friday.

WPI-based inflation was 0.13 per cent in September and 2.75 per cent in October last year. "The negative rate of inflation in October 2025 is primarily due to decrease in prices of food articles, crude petroleum & natural gas, electricity, mineral oils and manufacture of basic metals etc," the industry ministry said in a statement.

According to WPI data, deflation in food articles was 8.31 per cent in October, compared to 5.22 per cent in September, with onion, potato, vegetables and pulses seeing a decline in prices.

In vegetables, deflation was 34.97 per cent in October, against 24.41 per cent in September. In pulses, deflation was at 16.50 per cent in October, while in potato and onion it was 39.88 per cent and 65.43 per cent, respectively.

In the case of manufactured products, inflation eased to 1.54 per cent, from 2.33 per cent in September. Fuel and power witnessed a negative inflation or deflation of 2.55 per cent, against 2.58 per cent in September, thus recording a decline for seven consecutive months.

"Looking ahead, a favourable base effect in the rest of FY26 is expected to keep the

wholesale index into deflation. Consequently, Ind-Ra anticipates wholesale deflation in November 2025 to be under 1 per cent," said Paras Jasrai, Associate Director at India Ratings and Research.

The fall in WPI inflation is on expected lines after the rates of Goods and Services Tax (GST) were slashed effective September 22. GST rates on daily use mass consumption items were cut as part of the tax rate rationalisation under which the four-tier tax structure was brought down to just 2 slabs of 5 and 18 per cent.

The tax cuts which lowered prices of goods, plus a favourable inflation base of last year, has pulled down both wholesale and retail inflation.

Data released last week showed, retail inflation was at an all-time low of 0.25 per cent in October, driven down by GST rate cuts and a high base of last year. In September retail or consumer price index inflation was 1.44 per cent. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI), which takes into account retail inflation, had kept benchmark policy rates unchanged at 5.5 per cent last month.

The decline in both retail and WPI inflation would put pressure on the RBI to cut benchmark interest rates in the next monetary policy review meeting scheduled on December 3-5.

Jasrai, however, said based on the trend of India's economic growth, the rationale for monetary easing is not very strong. FY26 retail inflation is now expected to be going down to around 2.5 per cent.

"However, to prevent the economy going deep in sluggish and weak economic growth, the RBI may go for a 25-50 bp cut in repo rate in its December 2025 monetary policy," he added. PHDCCI, CEO & Secretary General, Ranjeet Mehta said the chamber expects WPI inflation to remain range-bound due to benign international crude oil prices, comfortable buffer stocks of food-grains and healthy kharif harvest. 'Pakshi Mitra' Bal Bahadur Chetri passes away

TEZPUR, Nov 14: Bal Bahadur Chetri, a noted bird lover and retired teacher from Tezpur has passed away in Bengaluru after a prolonged battle with cancer. Affectionately known as "Pakshi Mitra" (Friend of Birds), Chetri was widely admired for his lifelong dedication to the conservation of house sparrows and his deep commitment to environmental protection.

Chetri, a retired science teacher from Tezpur Gandhi Memorial ME School, gained widespread recognition for his efforts to nurture sparrows at a time when their population was dwindling. He created special nesting spaces for the birds at his home and cared for them like family. His passionate work in

avian conservation earned him local and regional acclaim, including honours from the Sonitpur district administration on Independence Day in 2015 and the title of "Pakshi Mitra" from Assam Agricultural University in 2018.

Throughout his career, Chetri was known for his gentle nature and scientific approach, both in his role as an educator and as a passionate environmentalist. He began his teaching career in 1982 and retired in 2016. Beyond his work with sparrows, Chetri was an avid reader and a long-time member of the Tezpur District Library. He was also active in publishing his poetry and participated in numerous interviews on wildlife conservation

aired by All India Radio.

In his later years, Chetri focused on planting trees in Tezpur, further demonstrating his love for nature. Even as he battled illness, he remained concerned about the well-being of the sparrows and saplings he had nurtured.

Born in 1954 in Nabil village, near the Gabharu river in Sonitpur, Chetri is survived by his wife, Shashikala Devi, son Shrawan Kumar Kaushik, daughter-in-law Aarti Devi, grandson Shreyan Kaushik and numerous relatives and admirers. His death has left a void in the community, with many remembering him for his compassion, dignity and unshakable commitment to preserving the natural world.

Indigenous families threatened by land grabbers

NAGAON, Nov 14: A grave situation has emerged at Dhing in Nagaon district, where indigenous Assamese families are facing threats and intimidation from alleged land grabbers. These families, who were forced to flee their homes during the Assam movement are now being denied their rightful claim to their ancestral land.

The land grabbers, identified as Esad Ali, Shahidul Islam, Miraj Akbar and Abdul Hamid, have reportedly been threatening the families with violence, including physical harm and even death, if they attempt to reclaim their land. Despite repeated complaints to local authorities, no concrete action has been taken to address the issue.

The indigenous families, who were displaced due to violence and intimidation during the Assam movement, now find themselves unable to secure their land from these alleged land grabbers, who are reportedly backed by local musclemen. The situation has created an atmosphere of fear with the families living in constant threat of further harm.

The affected families have appealed to the local authorities for immediate intervention and protection, seeking the restoration of their land rights. They have also called upon Chief Minister Dr Himanta Biswa Sarma to intervene, given his vocal stance on safeguarding the rights of indigenous people in the state.

This incident has raised serious concerns about the safety and security of indigenous families in the region, highlighting the urgent need for effective action to protect their rights and bring the perpetrators to justice. The authorities are under increasing pressure to address this issue and ensure that such intimidation does not go unpunished.

11 JNV students injured in ragging incident

MORIGAOON, Nov 14: A major ragging-related assault at Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya (JNV) Morigaon left 11 junior students seriously injured last week, prompting swift action from the district administration and school authorities.

According to reports, a group of senior students allegedly attacked the juniors after they refused to hand over essential commodities. The injured students were forced to undergo medical examinations following police intervention.

Taking serious note of the incident, the Morigaon district administration and the JNV authorities have initiated strict disciplinary measures. One teacher has been placed under suspension

and the senior students involved have been shifted to other JNV schools.

The assault, which took place on November 5, 2025, was described by the victims and parents as a case of ragging. Based on their complaint, Deputy Commissioner Anamika Tewari immediately constituted an inquiry committee comprising an executive magistrate, police officer and two representatives from the Shillong regional office.

The committee collected statements from the victims, teachers and parents before submitting a detailed report. Following this, the district administration forwarded the report to the Shillong regional office and pressed for strict disciplinary

action. Acting on the findings, JNV authorities relocated nine accused senior students to other Navodaya schools in Assam. Their parents were instructed to submit pledge letters stating that their children would not engage in any such misconduct in the future.

Chemistry teacher Biswajit Chaudhary was placed under suspension for alleged negligence of duty, while Vice Principal Dhruvajyoti Sarma was transferred to PM SHRI School JNV, Mukahseleng, Nagaland. All teachers have also been issued a warning to perform 'house master' duties responsibly, with a caution that departmental action will follow in case of further negligence.

Two arrested for sexual assault in Jorhat

JORHAT, Nov 14: Police in Jorhat arrested two men on charges of sexually assaulting a woman at an abandoned house near Naoholia under Rowrahia police outpost on Thursday. The accused, identified as Anwar Ali an auto rickshaw driver and Ratan Basfor, a Safai worker were remanded to judicial custody by a court on Friday.

According to police sources, the assault was witnessed by three youths who saw the duo abusing the woman. They immediately sought help from local residents and managed to apprehend the suspects before handing them over to the authorities. The woman was found in an unconscious state at the scene.

The accused have been booked under sections 64 and 3(5) of the BNS in case number 594/2025 at Jorhat Police Station.

This incident follows a recent case of a murdered college student in Titabor, a co-district of Jorhat. The student, reportedly seven months pregnant was found dead in a septic tank with Jagat Singh and three others arrested in connection with the case. The incident led to protests, prompting the intervention of Jorhat DC and SP. In response, the officer-in-charge of Titabor police station, Lakshman Kumar Das was removed from his post.

Assam leads regional effort to empower Panchayats for a TB-free India Northeast states attend workshop on TB Mukta Panchayat

GUWAHATI, Nov 14: In line with the Prime Minister's vision of a TB Mukta Bharat, a two-day Regional Workshop on TB Mukta Panchayat was held at Grand Bhabendra Aalay, Guwahati, on November 13-14. The workshop brought together representatives from the Health and Panchayat & Rural Development (P&RD) departments of Northeastern states, as well as Bihar, West Bengal and Odisha, aiming to strengthen inter-departmental coordination and empower local governance institutions to take active roles in community-level tuberculosis (TB) control.

The workshop was inaugurated by Dr Lakshmanan S. IAS, Mission Director, NHM Assam. Distinguished dignitaries in attendance included Dr Vinay Garg Deputy Commissioner (TB), Central TB Division, New Delhi, Prof (Dr) Achyut Baishya Principal-cum-Chief Superintendent, Gauhati Medical College & Hospital, Dr Umesh Phangcho Director of Health Services,



Assam, Dr Purabi Nath Deputy Director, SIRD, Assam, and Lakhimi Dutta ACS, Officer on Special Duty, NHM Assam.

During the inaugural session, the speakers emphasised the importance of close collaboration between the Health & Family Welfare and P&RD departments to ensure effective implementation of TB Mukta Pan-

chayat initiatives. They highlighted TB as a social disease requiring not only medical intervention but also coordinated efforts to address stigma, raise awareness and provide nutritional, psychosocial, vocational and livelihood support to affected individuals and their families.

The workshop featured interactive ses-

sions, experience-sharing and discussions on best practices from different states. Participants deliberated on strategies to integrate TB Mukta Panchayat activities into the Gram Panchayat Development Plan (GPDP), ensuring that TB control efforts are embedded within local governance and community development initiatives.

Assam has set an ambitious goal to certify at least 50% of its Gaon Panchayats as TB-free by 2025. The State TB Cell in collaboration with the P&RD Department is actively working to achieve this target through a combination of community engagement, awareness campaigns and capacity-building measures for local Panchayat representatives.

The workshop concluded with a renewed commitment from all participating states to strengthen interdepartmental cooperation, leverage local governance structures and mobilize communities in the fight against TB, marking a significant step towards a TB-free India.

Four shops gutted in fire

Trump's 'fair trade deal' with India

President Donald Trump has declared that a 'fair trade deal' with India is forthcoming, asserting that once concluded, India will once again 'love' America. He framed it as a departure from past arrangements that, in his view, had been 'pretty unfair,' and suggested both countries were 'pretty close' to a deal that is 'good for everybody.' The timing of Trump's statements matters because India's prior public posture has been muted while Washington has taken the lead in stating milestones. Trump's claim bears weight when viewed alongside India's increased oil imports from the United States and its simultaneous reduction in purchases from Russia—a combination that appears aligned with U.S. priorities. Data indicate India sourced about 36 per cent of its crude imports from Russia this year, and refiners are now actively seeking to reduce that share. India's biggest private refining group has signalled it will follow government guidelines in curtailing Russian-oil imports. The United States has interpreted this shift as removing a "sticking point" in trade discussions. Oil and energy flows are likely to form the backbone of the deal. India's oil import profile shows that Russian crude has accounted for a large chunk of its supply, at times exceeding one-third of its total purchases. Yet tracking data show a significant drop in Russian volumes as refiners prepare alternatives.

While Russia remains the top source, the upward movement of U.S. crude into the Indian market is evident: India's imports of American crude in October rose to about 540,000 barrels per day, the highest since 2022, underlining the attractiveness of U.S. grades amid favourable arbitrage conditions. For the United States, the bargaining logic is clear. Washington has levied steep tariffs on various Indian imports—total duties of around 50 per cent have been reported in the context of India's continuing purchases of Russian energy. Under the envisaged deal, the U.S. is prepared to reduce those tariffs at some point, contingent on India's energy procurement and trade behaviour. Trump explicitly linked the reduction of tariffs to India's cut in Russian imports, saying that as the Russian-oil purchases have dropped very substantially, the U.S. will bring the tariffs down.

From India's perspective the calculus is more intricate. While New Delhi has not formally repudiated Trump's narrative—it has not denied that a deal is underway and has acknowledged talks are progressing 'very well'—it must balance strategic autonomy, energy security and diplomatic priorities. India's decision to diversify away from Russia is as much about global oil market pressure and sanction regimes as it is about negotiating with the U.S. For example, new sanctions against Russian producers have compelled Indian refiners to review Russian supply contracts, presenting New Delhi with an opening to shift sources.

Awareness does not slow progress; it removes the friction that tires us. There is a visible shift happening within the 5AM Bliss community too. People who once woke up tired now greet the sunrise with gratitude. Those who struggled to focus now report deeper calm and clearer thinking. This collective awakening makes the 5AM Bliss journey so special. It is a quiet revolution of consciousness.

The real transformation, however, begins when we stop chasing external change and start observing our inner landscape. De-cluttering, for instance, is not only about cleaning a room; it is about clearing the mental space that holds unnecessary weight. Actually, every object, every file, and every memory carries energy. When we let go of what no longer serves us, we create space for what truly matters.

This process is not always easy, but it is always rewarding. It requires courage to let go of old habits, outdated identities, or even success patterns that have outlived their purpose. But just like the Phoenix, we rise clearer and brighter each time.

Transformation is not a one-time event. It is a rhythm - fall, reflect, rise, repeat. Each cycle makes us more aware, more refined, and more peaceful. The journey from ashes to awareness is the phase where we learn to look inward with honesty. The next phase, awareness to bliss, is where life begins to flow effortlessly. We stop reacting to the world and start responding from balance. When awareness deepens, even chaos begins to serve purpose. The same fire that once burned becomes the light that guides. That is the meaning of the motto: From Ashes to Awareness; From Awareness to Bliss. It is not just a line under a logo. It is a way of living.

Nitish Kumar's Two-decade Bihar dominance

In the labyrinthine landscape of Indian regional politics, where alliances shift like quicksand and chief ministerial tenures are frequently abbreviated by electoral volatility, one figure has demonstrated an almost preternatural capacity for political survival and reinvention. Nitish Kumar, born in 1951 in the Kalyan Bigha village of Nalanda district, has navigated Bihar's treacherous political terrain for over two decades, emerging not merely as a survivor but as the state's longest-serving chief minister since Independence. His journey from being Lalu Prasad Yadav's trusted "younger brother" to becoming his fiercest rival, and subsequently his coalition partner, before returning to the BJP fold, illustrates a pragmatic flexibility that has become his defining political characteristic. As counting trends in the 2025 Assembly elections indicate his return to power, Nitish's story offers profound insights into how political longevity is achieved through strategic caste mobilization, administrative reputation-building, and an almost chameleonic ability to forge and dissolve alliances based on power calculus rather than ideological consistency.

Nitish Kumar's political genesis traces back to the tumultuous anti-Congress fervor that swept India in 1977, a moment when the Janata Party wave provided entry points for a generation of non-Congress politicians. His family credentials established a foundation for political involvement; his father had participated in the Independence movement, exposing young Nitish to nationalist discourse and political engagement from an early age. The writings of socialist leaders, particularly Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia, shaped his ideological orientation during his formative years, even as he pursued an engineering degree that would later distinguish him from many contemporaries in Bihar's political class.

However, Nitish's entry into electoral politics was marked not by triumph but by repeated humiliation. His first two electoral attempts from the Harnaut constituency as a Janata Party candidate ended in defeat at the hands of independent candidates, failures that nearly extinguished his political ambitions entirely. He seriously contemplated abandoning politics altogether, a decision that would have dramatically altered Bihar's subsequent political trajectory. The breakthrough arrived in 1985 when, after consolidating adequate campaign resources, he finally won Harnaut on a Lok Dal ticket. This victory demonstrated an early lesson that would inform his entire career: in Bihar's competitive political marketplace, organizational capacity and resource mobilization matter as much as ideological positioning.

His elevation to national politics came swiftly thereafter. Elected to the Lok Sabha from Barh in 1989, Nitish served as Union Minister of State for Agriculture in the V.P. Singh government, gaining valuable administrative experience and national visibility. He retained Barh in 1991 on a Janata Dal ticket, but it was during this period that his relationship with Lalu Prasad Yadav, who had become Chief Minister in 1990, began its gradual deterioration. Lalu's seven-year



tenure represented something unprecedented in Bihar's political history: sustained rule by a backward caste leader whose government, whatever its shortcomings, demonstrated remarkable political stability. When corruption allegations in the fodder scam forced Lalu from office, his installation of his wife Rabri Devi as successor was widely perceived as a constitutional workaround designed to maintain family control over state power.

Both Nitish and Lalu had risen under the mentorship of Karpoori Thakur, the socialist icon who had implemented Other Backward

Classes reservations during the Janata Party government in the late 1970s. However, their political trajectories diverged fundamentally in their approach to OBC politics.

While Lalu consolidated his base primarily among Yadavs, establishing what critics termed a "MY" (Muslim-Yadav) coalition, Nitish quietly constructed an alternative OBC-EBC (Extremely Backward Castes) alliance centered on his own Kurmi community. This strategic differentiation would prove decisive in breaking Yadav dominance in Bihar's backward caste politics, a hegemony previously cemented by Chief Ministers B.P. Mandal and Daroga Prasad Rai before Lalu's ascendancy.

The Kurmi community that Nitish mobilized possesses distinctive characteristics crucial to understanding his political success. Described in K.S. Singh's authoritative People of India book series as "progressive farmers" who maximized developmental scheme benefits, Kurmis are a landowning farming community with varying social status across regions. They adopt diverse surnames including Patel, Verma, Sachan, Gangwar, Katiyar, Baiswar, Mahto, Prasad, Sinha, Singh, and Shinde, reflecting their geographical spread and social integration. Their political significance extends beyond Bihar to Uttar Pradesh, Odisha, Maharashtra, and Chhattisgarh. Historically, the pre-independence Triveni Sangh—a coalition uniting a Yadav (Jagdev Prasad Yadav), a Kurmi (Shiv Pujan Singh), and a Koeri (Yadunandan Prasad Mehta)—successfully contested the 1937 elections, demonstrating the community's longstanding political con-

sciousness.

Nitish's formal break with Lalu came in 1994 when he split the party to form the Samata Party alongside veteran socialist George Fernandes, later renamed Janata Dal (United) or JD(U). This organizational independence provided the platform for his eventual challenge to Lalu's dominance. His first chief ministerial stint in March 2000 lasted merely a week; he was sworn in but resigned due to lack of majority support, allowing Rabri Devi's continuation. This brief, abortive tenure foreshadowed the alliance arithmetic complexities that would characterize Bihar politics for the next quarter-century.

The watershed moment arrived with the twin elections of 2005, conducted after Jharkhand's November 2000 separation reduced Bihar's legislative strength to 243 seats. The February 2005 polls produced a hung assembly: Lalu's Rashtriya Janata Dal emerged largest with 75 seats, followed by Nitish's JD(U) with 55 and the BJP with 37. No coalition secured a majority, necessitating President's Rule. However, the October 2005 re-election proved catastrophic for the RJD. JD(U) surged to 88 seats, the BJP secured 55, while RJD plummeted to 23 seats. Nitish was sworn in as Chief Minister, immediately resigned from the Lok Sabha, entered the Bihar Legislative Council, and has remained there ever since—a strategic decision insulating him from the uncertainties of direct electoral contests.

What distinguished Nitish's governance from his predecessors was his cultivation of the "Sushashan Babu" (Good Governance Man) image, deliberately contrasted with allegations of "jungle raj" or anarchy under the RJD. His early governmental years earned genuine praise for addressing Bihar's infrastructural deficits: road construction accelerated, industrial promotion received attention, and girls' education became a priority focus in a state often characterized as India's most backward. These achievements, whether fully realized or partially rhetorical, created a governance narrative that transcended caste calculations, allowing Nitish to consolidate support beyond his core OBC-EBC base by attracting upper-caste voters through the BJP alliance, de-

spite his earlier opposition to Hindutva politics.

The 2010 elections validated this strategy spectacularly. JD(U)'s tally reached 115 seats while the BJP won 81 and the RJD collapsed to 22 seats. This overwhelming mandate represented Nitish's political zenith. However, his relationship with the BJP faced its severest test when Narendra Modi was declared head of the BJP's campaign committee in June 2013, widely presumed to be the prime ministerial candidate. Nitish, seeking to position himself as a Modi challenger, dramatically severed the alliance on June 16, 2013, a decision driven more by personal ambition and ideological discomf with Modi's Hindutva orientation than by coalition management considerations.

The political cost proved severe. His party won merely two Lok Sabha seats in the 2014 Modi wave. Taking responsibility, Nitish resigned as Chief Minister, installing Jitan Ram Manjhi as his successor—a move that proved temporary. He then executed a stunning reversal, realigning with his erstwhile rival Lalu to form the Mahagathbandhan or Grand Alliance. Their "Bihari DNA" campaign brilliantly tapped regional pride sentiments, producing a strong showing: RJD won 80 seats and JD(U) 71, relegating the BJP to 53. Nitish was sworn in on February 22, 2015, with Lalu's son Tejashwi Yadav, now the Opposition's chief ministerial face, serving as Deputy Chief Minister. This alliance too proved ephemeral. Nitish eventually returned to the BJP fold, demonstrating once again that his political calculations prioritize power retention over ideological consistency or alliance loyalty. His ability to justify these reversals to his core electorate while maintaining his governance reputation has been crucial to his sustained dominance. During his tenure under various coalition configurations, he has handled significant Union ministerial portfolios including railways, agriculture, and others under the Atal Bihari Vajpayee government, maintaining national visibility even while focusing primarily on state politics.

As the 2025 election counting trends indicate his likely return, extending his run as Bihar's longest-serving chief minister, Nitish Kumar's political biography offers instructive lessons about regional leadership in India's federal democracy. His success derives not from charismatic mass appeal or ideological rigidity but from shrewd caste coalition engineering, cultivated administrative reputation, strategic alliance flexibility, and an almost intuitive understanding of when to break partnerships and when to forge new ones. In Bihar's complex social mosaic, where caste identities intersect with developmental aspirations and governance expectations, Nitish has proven himself the supreme political architect—building, dismantling, and rebuilding coalition structures with a pragmatism that has kept him indispensable to Bihar's power equation for over two decades. Whether this endurance translates into transformative developmental legacy remains debatable, but his political craftsmanship in navigating Bihar's tumultuous waters is beyond dispute. Delhi Blast: Unity over terror

It was just another ordinary evening in Delhi on November 10, 2025, when suddenly the heart of the city was torn apart by a devastating explosion near the Red Fort. A car packed with explosives detonated near the Lal Quila Metro Station, ripping through the evening crowd and claiming 13 lives while leaving over 20 others wounded. The blast, which happened just before 7 pm, sent shockwaves through the heart of India's capital, shattering windows, igniting nearby vehicles, and filling the air with smoke and cries for help. Eyewitnesses described a deafening roar that echoed for blocks, followed by chaos as people ran in panic from the historic site, a place usually alive with tourists snapping photos and vendors hawking street food. Firefighters rushed in with seven tenders to douse the flames, while ambulances ferried the injured to hospitals like Lok Nayak, where doctors fought to save lives amid the grim reality of burns and shrapnel wounds.

This was no ordinary accident. Delhi Police quickly invoked the Unlawful Activities Prevention Act, or UAPA, along with the Explosives Act, signaling that they view this as a deliberate act of terror. The National Investigation Agency, or NIA, has taken the lead, combing the site for clues and tracing the vehicle's path through CCTV footage. The car, a Hyundai i20 with registration DL 10 CK 0458, had been spotted parking near the Sunehri Masjid hours earlier, only to move again moments before the explosion. Investigators believe it was loaded with ammonium nitrate, a common ingredient in improvised bombs, turning the vehicle into a deadly weapon. The suspect behind the wheel has been identified as Dr. Umar Mohammad, a 35-year-old doctor from Pulwama in Jammu and Kashmir. Tragically, he perished in the blast, his body charred beyond recognition, but not before unleashing devastation on innocent bystanders, including families out for an evening stroll and workers heading home.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, speaking from Bhutan where he was on a state visit, expressed his deep sorrow and vowed that the perpetrators would face the full force of justice. "This horrific incident has saddened us all," he said in a post on X, formerly Twitter, promising a thorough probe. Home Minister Amit Shah echoed those words, visiting the injured in hospital and assuring the nation that no stone would be left unturned. He emphasized that security agencies are working round the clock, with alerts issued across major cities like Mumbai, Chennai, and even airports in Hyderabad and Thiruvananthapuram. The opposition, led by figures from the Congress party, has demanded answers too, questioning how such a plot could unfold in the national capital despite heightened vigilance. They called for a white paper on security lapses, urging the government to explain why warnings from intelligence about possible strikes on sensitive dates, like the anniversary of the Babri Masjid demolition, were not acted upon more swiftly.

As details trickle out, a darker picture emerges. Sources close to the investigation suggest Dr. Umar was not acting alone. Raids in Faridabad, just outside Delhi, uncovered 350 kilograms of explosives, assault rifles, handguns, and timing devices hidden in a house rented by someone linked to the same hospital where Umar worked. Nine suspects have

been detained in Kanpur, and police are probing connections to a wider network plotting attacks across states. One angle points to a foiled chemical terror plot, with arrests yielding arms and hazardous materials that could have caused even greater harm. The timing feels eerily deliberate, coinciding with elections in Bihar and heightening fears of politically motivated violence. Yet, at this early stage, much remains shrouded in uncertainty. The NIA urges the public to avoid speculation, as rumors on social media have already sparked tensions, with some wrongly blaming entire communities.

India has endured its share of such scars. From the 2008 Mumbai attacks that killed 166 to the 2016 Pathankot airbase assault, terrorism has tested the nation's resolve time and again. But in recent years, major incidents in urban heartlands like Delhi have been rare, confined mostly to border areas in Kashmir or the northeast. This blast shatters that fragile calm, reminding us how one lapse can undo years of progress. The Red Fort, a symbol of Mughal grandeur and India's independence struggle, now stands as a grim backdrop to this tragedy. Tourists from abroad, like those from the US and Egypt whose embassies issued alerts, have been caught in the crossfire, prompting international condolences from leaders in Japan and Bangladesh. The US Embassy warned its citizens to steer clear of crowds, underscoring how such events ripple globally.

Counterterrorism in India often stirs heated debates, dividing opinions along political lines. Since the Bharatiya Janata Party came to power in 2014, the narrative of a "soft state" fostering terror has gained traction. Critics argue it justifies a hardline approach, but supporters point to results: fewer unnoticed strikes, thanks to beefed up laws and surveillance. The UAPA, once a colonial era relic, has been amended to make bail nearly impossible for the accused, empowering probes but raising human rights concerns. Coupled with operations by central forces like the NSG and state police, these measures have kept the peace, at least on the surface. A single car bomb, however, exposes the limits. Even the best intelligence cannot predict every move in a game where terrorists thrive on surprise.

Think about it from the ground level. For families of the victims, like Nazish Malik whose brother in law, an e-rickshaw driver named Mohsin, vanished in the smoke, this is not an abstract policy. It's a personal loss, a void that no investigation can fill. Mohsin was just trying to earn a living, ferrying passengers through Delhi's chaotic traffic, when the world exploded around him. Stories like his humanize the statistics, turning numbers into names and grief. The injured, many with life altering burns, face months of recovery, their dreams deferred by shrapnel and fire. In the aftermath, communities rally, with neighbors donating blood and strangers offering solace, but beneath it simmers fear. Will this spark reprisals? Will whispers of blame fracture the social fabric that holds India together?

Terrorism's true aim goes beyond body count. It sows chaos, erodes trust in institutions, and pits neighbor against neighbor. Groups behind such acts bank on division, hoping to radicalize the disillusioned and undermine the state's authority. In India, with its mosaic of religions, languages, and histories, this is especially potent. A blast near a site tied to Hindu Muslim tensions could ignite old wounds if not han-



dled with care. That's why promoting social harmony must sit at the core of any counterterrorism strategy. It's not just about catching culprits; it's about rebuilding bridges before they burn.

Policing is vital, no doubt. The swift arrests in this case, including the car's previous owner named Salman, show agencies are on the ball. But security alone is a band aid. A comprehensive approach demands political will to address root causes: poverty in places like Pulwama that breeds vulnerability, youth unemployment that extremists exploit, and narratives of alienation that turn professionals like Dr. Umar into unwitting pawns. Transparency in investigations builds faith; hiding details breeds suspicion. The government should share updates without compromising the probe, reassuring citizens that justice is blind, not biased.

The opposition has a role too, beyond finger pointing. By focusing on unity rather than scoring points, they can amplify calls for calm. Rahul Gandhi's plea for a united front against terror, echoing Modi's vows, sets the right tone. The media, often the megaphone in crises, must report facts, not fuel frenzy. Sensational headlines and unverified claims on WhatsApp groups can escalate tensions faster than any bomb. Instead, stories of resilience, like the Delhiites who queued to give blood despite their own fears, deserve the spotlight. Schools and community centers could host dialogues, reminding everyone that India's strength lies in its diversity, not despite it.

This incident calls for proactive steps. Enhance community policing in vulnerable areas, invest in deradicalization programs that offer hope over hate, and foster economic ties between regions to dilute grievances. International cooperation, already strong via forums like the Quad, can share intel on cross border threats. And let's not forget mental health support for survivors, a quiet casualty often overlooked.

Acts of evil like this Delhi blast test our humanity. They force us to choose: retreat into fear or rise in solidarity. India has done the latter before, emerging stronger from ashes. As the NIA peels back layers of this plot, let us commit to peace, not panic. For the 13 souls lost, and the wounded who endure, we owe that much. In a city that never sleeps, this wound will heal, but only if we nurture it with harmony. The Red Fort has witnessed empires rise and fall; it will stand witness to our resolve too. Together, we can ensure that one evening's darkness does not eclipse a nation's light.

Russia's massive attack on Kyiv kills 4, injures 27

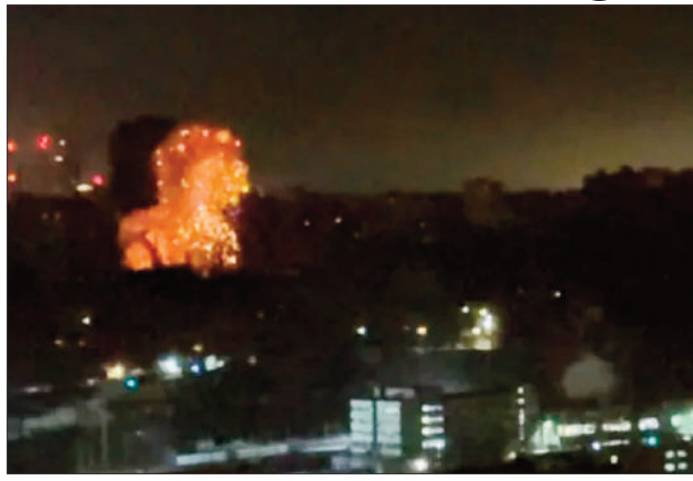
KYIV, Nov 14: Four people were killed after Russia unleashed a massive combined attack on Kyiv early Friday, sparking fires and scattering debris across many districts of the capital, Ukrainian authorities said.

At least 27 people were injured as emergency crews responded to multiple strikes, said Tymur Tkachenko, head of Kyiv's military administration. At least 430 drones and 18 missiles were used in the attack across the country, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said.

He said the attack, which struck other regions of the country, was targeting Kyiv. "A specially calculated attack to cause as much harm as possible to people and civilians," Zelenskyy said in a post on Telegram.

He added the Azerbaijan Embassy was damaged by fragments of an Iskander missile.

Fifteen people were hospitalised, including one man in critical condition and a pregnant woman, after a series of powerful explosions sounded in the city and



airs defences were activated. City authorities warned that power and water outages are possible.

In the Darnytskyi district, debris landed in the yard of a residential building and on the grounds of an educational facility. A car caught fire after being hit by falling fragments.

In the Dniprovskyi district, debris damaged three apartment

buildings, a private household and caused a fire in an open area.

In the Podilskyi district, five residential buildings and a nonresidential structure were damaged.

In the Shevchenkivskyi district, falling debris sparked a fire in an open area near a medical facility and inside a nonresidential building.

In the Holosiivskyi district, debris ignited a fire at a medical fa-

cility and damaged another nonresidential building.

In the Desnianskyi district, fires were recorded in two residential buildings.

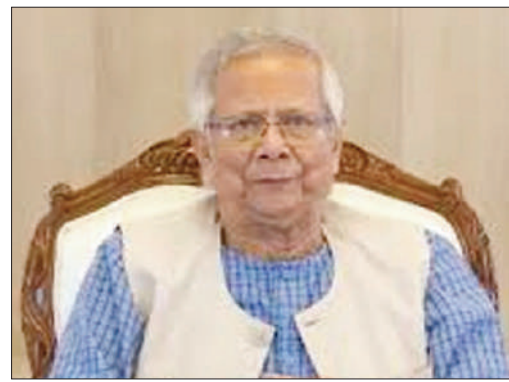
In the Solomianskyi district, a fire broke out on the roof of a residential building.

In the Sviatoshyivskyi district, debris caused a fire in a private home.

In the Kyiv region, Russian strikes damaged critical infrastructure and private homes, injuring at least one civilian, regional head Mykola Kalashnyk said. A 55-year-old man in Bila Tserkva suffered thermal burns and was hospitalised, he said. Fires broke out in private houses in the capital's suburbs.

The strike came as European Union officials warned this week that Ukraine must continue to crack down on corruption following a major graft scandal that has put top nuclear energy officials under scrutiny. But they also offered assurances that aid will continue to flow as Kyiv strains to hold back Russia's invasion. (AP)

Bangladeshi jurists call ordinance on referendum 'unconstitutional'



DHAKA, Nov 14: Bangladesh overnight issued an ordinance in line with interim government chief Professor Muhammad Yunus proposed referendum on a political charter, drawing immediate rebuttal from jurists who called it "unconstitutional".

President Muhammad Shahabuddin on late Thursday signed into ordinance the "July Charter Implementation Order" while the document was drafted by Yunus-headed National Consensus Commission after protracted consultations with several political parties excluding deposed prime minister Sheikh Hasina's now disbanded Awami League.

In a nationwide televised address Chief Adviser Yunus on Thursday said plebiscite would be staged simultaneously with the planned national election in February next year to elicit peoples mandate for the charter.

"Most of the decisions taken in the July Charter, including those in the gazette, are contrary to the current Constitution. Since the Constitution is still in force, the President cannot legally sign this gazette," leading constitutional expert and former law professor

Shahdeen Malik said in a newspaper interview.

Bangladesh Constitution kept no provision for referendum or plebiscite while its Article 93 of says no ordinance could be promulgated "for altering or repealing any provision of this Constitution".

The charter contained over 80 proposals including issues requiring amendments to the Constitution but Yunus said the proposals were synopsized in four issues while the voters would just need to say "yes" or "no" in a question covering the four issues.

Malik told Bangladesh's Business Standard newspaper that the referendum "would have been acceptable if the Constitution had been annulled or suspended under martial law (but) since neither has happened, everything should proceed according to the existing Constitution".

He feared the voters would be unable to make an informed decision on the referendum issues and will "leave their ballots blank" on the referendum and vote for their chosen MP candidates alone.

"The public first needs to understand the issues they are voting 'Yes' or 'No' on," he said.

The ordinance stipulated the next parliament must complete constitutional reform, as outlined in the charter and by the referendum's result, within 180 working days from the date of its first sitting.

Malik called the directive "absurd" adding "there is no benefit in fixing these dates if the Parliament does not take them seriously".

Senior Supreme Court (SC) lawyer Mohammad Ruhul Qudus questioned since the current Constitution contained no provision for referendums, "under what legal authority could one now be held".

Another SC lawyer Rashna Imam said, the issue of the July Charter ordinance to be followed by a referendum raised "serious constitutional and procedural concerns". (PTI)

Chinese astronauts stranded after debris hit spacecraft return to earth safely

BEIJING, Nov 14: Three Chinese astronauts, who aborted their departure home after their spacecraft was hit by debris, returned to earth safely on Friday.

The return capsule of the Shenzhou-21 spaceship, carrying the astronauts Chen Dong, Chen Zhongrui and Wang Jie, touched down at the Dongfeng landing site in north China's Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region, the China Manned Space Agency (CMSA) said.

They were scheduled to return on November 5, but their journey was postponed at the last minute after "small" space debris hit the station, according to CMSA.

Official media earlier reported that the crew was unable to return on their own spacecraft after tiny cracks were found in the porthole of the Shenzhou-20's return capsule - damage that was likely caused by the debris impact.

The incident, the first since the space station was launched in 2011, sparked concerns here as the station was built to accommodate three astronauts.

China rotates the crew at the station every six months.

The Shenzhou-21 spaceship undocked from the space station combination and the return capsule touched down at 4:40 p.m. Beijing time at the Dongfeng landing site in north China's Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region, CMSA said.

The astronauts are all in good health. They had spent 204 days in orbit, setting a new record for the longest in-orbit stay among Chinese astronauts, the CMSA added.

China built its space station after it was reportedly excluded from the International Space Station (ISS) over concerns that China's space programme is manned by its military, the People's Liberation Army (PLA). (PTI)

China's Xi, Thai King Vajiralongkorn pledge closer ties during landmark visit

BEIJING, Nov 14: China's leader Xi Jinping and Thai King Maha Vajiralongkorn pledged closer ties on Friday during the first-ever visit to China by a reigning Thai monarch.

Xi and his wife, Peng Liyuan, greeted Vajiralongkorn and his wife, Queen Suthida, at Beijing's vast Great Hall of the People. The visit was intended to mark the 50th anniversary of the countries establishing diplomatic ties.

Xi described China and Thailand as "truly good relatives, good friends and good partners," according to the state-run Xinhua news agency.

Beijing was looking forward to boosting agricultural imports from Thailand and advancing cooperation in fields such as railway development, artificial intelligence and aerospace, Xi said.

Vajiralongkorn described his country's relationship with China as "brotherly cooperation" and expressed his desire to deepen exchanges in various areas.

The Thai royals were scheduled to visit a Buddhist temple and an aerospace development hub in Beijing, as well as attend a state banquet. (AP)

Poland's new president nods to the far right in his first 100 days

WARSAW (POLAND), Nov 14: In his first 100 days in office, Poland's new President Karol Nawrocki has positioned himself as the defender of the Polish nation and someone whose office might be sympathetic to the country's growing far right. With his athletic physique and impeccable suit, Nawrocki projected an old-school image of a protector as he kissed the hands of retired older women during an event this month at a library in Sochaczew, one of the small towns he has made a point of visiting.

That appeal to Poland's more conservative voters helped the 42-year-old Nawrocki win the presidency in June. His fans say he stands for traditionalist values.

He has declared himself against LGBTQ+ "privileges" and "aggressive left-wing radicalism." He has pledged to resist NATO membership for neighbouring Ukraine and has not visited that country since taking office.

Now, experts say, he appears to be positioning himself to have more say in the daily running of Poland — putting him on a collision course with the centrist prime minister.

An underdog with a Trump endorsement

With a background as a historian, Nawrocki was hardly known to the public when the leader of Poland's largest opposition party, the conservative Law and Justice, chose him to be its presidential candidate. He was heading the Institute for National Remembrance, a state research body, at the time.

Up until the first round election results became clear, most pundits expected liberal Warsaw mayor Rafal Trzaskowski, running for the cen-



trist governing alliance led by Donald Tusk, to win by a comfortable margin.

But Nawrocki's underdog profile, despite media revelations that included alleged past links to criminal figures and his participation in a street brawl among football fans, helped to make him relatable to voters. He denied the criminal links but not the brawl, saying he had taken part in many "noble, masculine" combats in his life.

"Many people shrugged at his past in the end," said Helena Chmielewska-Szljaf, a sociologist from Warsaw's Kozminski University. "Maybe we don't love this, but this man is a bloke from the hood, he came from a modest background and yet made an impressive career against the odds."

Contributing to Nawrocki's success was understanding the popularity of right-leaning alternative media channels, which have been growing in Poland in opposition to mainstream media long thought of as liberal, said Michal Szuldrzynski, editor-in-chief of conservative daily Rzeczpospolita. Nawrocki gave hours-long interviews to YouTube channel Kanal Zero and to

the channel of Slawomir Mentzen, the leader of far-right party Confederation.

An endorsement from US President Donald Trump also helped Nawrocki in the election.

The relationship between the two presidents makes sense in the context of the "process of MAGA-ization of the Polish right," Szuldrzynski said.

Nawrocki has already visited the White House as Poland's president. As they sat side by side, Trump declared he does not intend to pull US troops out of Poland, another sign of support for the new president and his aims. "We'll put more there if they want," Trump said.

In late October, when the US announced it was reducing the number of its troops on NATO's eastern flank, which had been deployed in response to Russia's growing military aggression, the presence in Poland was left unaffected.

The early foreign policy success further cemented Nawrocki's reputation.

Rejecting liberal elite' proposals

In his first month in office, Nawrocki vetoed seven draft laws favoured by the Tusk government, quickly wielding one of the powers of his office against his political rival.

By comparison, previous president Andrzej Duda, an ally of the Law and Justice party that backed Nawrocki for president, vetoed eight such draft laws in 20 months, according to Szymon Holownia, the speaker of the lower house of parliament.

The draft laws Nawrocki vetoed included one on support for Ukrainian refugees and another allowing windmills to be built closer to homes. (AP)

US lawmaker to introduce bill to completely eliminate H-1B visa programme

NEW YORK/WASHINGTON, Nov 14: An American lawmaker will be introducing a bill to "completely eliminate" the H-1B visa programme and take away the pathway to citizenship that it offers, "forcing" individuals to "return home" when their visa expires.

"My dear fellow Americans, I'm introducing a bill to completely eliminate the H-1B visa programme, which has been riddled with fraud and abuse and has been displacing American workers for decades," Congresswoman from Georgia, Marjorie Taylor Greene said in a video posted on X on Thursday.

She said that there will only be one exemption in her bill, which will allow for a 10,000 per year cap on visas issued to medical profes-

sionals like doctors and nurses who provide life-saving care to Americans. Greene however noted that even this 10,000 per year cap will be "phased out" over 10 years to "allow us time to build our own pipeline of American doctors and physicians."

Greene added that her bill will also "take away the pathway to citizenship, forcing visa holders to return home when their visa expires."

She further said that the intention of her bill is to restore the "original intent" of the H-1B visa, which was "for it to be temporary."

"These visas were intended to fulfill a specialty occupational need at a given time. People should not be allowed to come and live here forever. We thank them for their expertise, but we also wish them well

so they may return to their home country," she said.

"Now this will completely end the H-1B visa programme and all other sectors in the job force and in the workforce. This is America first. It's time to put American citizens first instead of foreigners first, and this has been an abuse for far too long. Americans deserve a future. They deserve a chance. And I believe Americans are the most talented people in the world, the most creative, and I want them to have their own American dream," she said.

In order to build the country's pipeline of American doctors and medical professionals, Greene said that her bill will prohibit Medicare-funded residency programmes from admitting non-citizen medical students into their programmes. (PTI)

Landslides in Indonesia's Java island leaves 2 dead, 21 missing

JAKARTA (INDONESIA), Nov 14: Landslides triggered by torrential rains in Indonesia's Java island killed two people and left 21 others missing, officials said Friday. Rescuers are still searching for the 21 reported missing.

Several days of heavy rainfall in the region caused the landslides that hit dozens of houses in three villages in Indonesia's Central Java province on Thursday evening, officials said in a statement.

"The unstable ground conditions posed a challenge for the search and rescue team in searching for victims during the golden hour. Nevertheless, the joint team continued their search and rescue efforts on Friday morning," said National Disaster Management Agency spokesperson Abdul Muhari in the statement. (AP)

Republicans promised health care negotiations after shutdown, but Democrats are wary

WASHINGTON, Nov 14: Now that the government shutdown is over, House and Senate Republicans say they will negotiate with Democrats on whether to extend COVID-era tax credits that help tens of millions of Americans afford their health care premiums. But finding bipartisan agreement could be difficult, if not impossible, before the subsidies expire at the end of the year.

The shutdown ended this week after a small group of Democrats made a deal with Republican senators who promised a vote by mid-December on extending the Affordable Care Act subsidies. But there is no guaranteed outcome, and many Republicans have made clear they want the credits to expire.

House Speaker Mike Johnson, R-La., called the subsidies a "boondoggle" immediately after the House voted Wednesday to end the shutdown, and President Donald Trump said the Obama-era health overhaul was a "disaster" as he signed the reopening bill into law.

It is far from the outcome that Democrats had hoped for as they kept the government closed for 43 days, demanding that Republicans negotiate with them on an extension before premiums sharply increase. But they



say they will try again as the expiration date approaches.

"It remains to be seen if they are serious," said House Democratic leader Hakeem Jeffries of New York. But he said Democrats "are just getting started."

Republicans have been meeting privately to discuss the issue. Some want to extend the subsidies, with changes, to avoid the widespread increases in premiums. Others,

like Johnson and Trump, want to start a new conversation about overhauling "Obamacare" entirely — a redo after a similar effort in 2017 failed.

Democrats push for extension

Health care has long been one of the most difficult issues on Capitol Hill, marked by deep ideological and political divides. Partisan disagreement over the 2010 law has persisted for more than a decade,

and relationships are already strained from weeks of partisan tensions over the shutdown.

Connecticut Rep. Rosa DeLauro, the top Democrat on the House Appropriations Committee, said that while Republicans have promised negotiations and a Senate vote, Democrats are wary. She noted that Johnson has not committed to anything in the House.

"Do I trust any of them? Hell no," DeLauro said.

If the two sides cannot agree, as many as 24 million people who get their health care from the exchanges created by the law could see their premiums go up Jan. 1. New Hampshire Sen. Jeanne Shaheen, one of the Democrats who struck a deal with Senate Majority Leader John Thune, R-S.D., to reopen the government, said she thinks an agreement on the tax credits is possible.

During the talks that led to the shutdown's end, Shaheen said she and other moderate Democrats sat across from Thune and "looked him eye to eye" as he committed to a serious effort.

"We're going to have a chance to vote on a bill that we will write by mid-December, in a way that gives us a chance to build — hopefully build — bipartisan support to get

that through," Shaheen said.

While Democrats would like to see a permanent extension of the tax credits, most realize that is unlikely. Just before the shutdown ended, Senate Democratic leader Chuck Schumer of New York proposed a one-year extension and a bipartisan committee to address Republican demands for changes to the ACA. But Thune said that was a "nonstarter" as the government remained shut down.

In the House, Democrats have suggested a three-year extension.

What Republicans want

While Republicans have long sought to scrap Obamacare, they have had challenges over the years in figuring out what would replace it. That problem plagued the 2017 effort, when then-Sen. John McCain, R-Ariz., cast the deciding vote to kill a bill on the Senate floor that was short on detail.

Republican Sen. Bill Cassidy of Louisiana, chairman of the Senate Health Education Labor and Pensions Committee, and Sen. Rick Scott, R-Fla., have proposed overhauling the law to create accounts that would direct the money to individuals instead of insurance companies. Those are ideas that Trump echoed as he signed the funding bill Wednesday evening. (AP)

Bodies of 15 Palestinians returned by Israel, health officials in Gaza say

KHAN YOUNIS, Nov 14: Israel returned the bodies of 15 Palestinians to Gaza on Friday, officials at Nasser hospital in Khan Younis said, in the latest step to fulfilling the terms of the fragile US-brokered ceasefire agreement.

The bodies were returned after militants late Thursday handed over the body of one of the last four remaining Israeli hostages taken during the October 7, 2023, attack that launched the war in Gaza.

Israel identified the returned body as that of Meny Godard, who was abducted from Kibbutz Be'eri in southern Israel. His wife, Ayelet, was killed during the attack.

The armed wings of Hamas and the Palestinian Islamic Jihad said Godard's body was recovered in southern Gaza.

The remains of 25 hostages have been returned to Israel since the ceasefire between Israel and Hamas began on October 10. There are still three more in Gaza that need to be recovered and handed over. Hamas returned 20 living hostages to Israel on October 13.

For each hostage returned, Israel has released the remains of 15 Palestinians, an exchange central to the ceasefire's first phase. Overall, the number of bodies of Palestinians received so far is 330, of which only 95 have been formally identified, according to Gaza Health Ministry officials.

Health officials in Gaza have said identifying the remains handed over by Israel is complicated by a lack of DNA testing kits.

The exchanges have gone ahead even as Israel and Hamas have accused each other of violating other terms of the deal. Israel has accused Hamas handing over partial remains in some instances and staging the discovery of bodies in others, while Hamas has accused Israel of opening fire at civilians and restricting the flow of humanitarian aid into the territory.

The next parts of the 20-point plan call for creating an international stabilization force, forming a technocratic Palestinian government and dismantling Hamas.

The fragile agreement aims to wind down the war that was triggered by the Hamas-led attack on southern Israel that killed about 1,200 people and saw 251 taken hostage. (AP)

Syria reopens embassy in London after more than a decade

BEIRUT, Nov 14: Syria's foreign minister officially reopened the country's embassy in London on Thursday after more than a decade-long closure, the latest step in Syria's reintegration into the international community after the ouster of former President Bashar Assad.

The visit by Foreign Minister Asaad al-Shibani to the United Kingdom came after a historic visit to Washington by interim President Ahmad al-Sharaa, the first by a president from Syria since the country's independence in 1946.

Al-Shibani, speaking at an event held by the London-based Chatham House international affairs think tank, said that his meeting with his British counterpart, Foreign Secretary Yvette Cooper, was "successful."

"Relations between Syria and Britain are advanced relations and we are not talking about opening a new page — we are talking about deepening these relations," he said.

Following Assad's fall, while some countries were initially wary of al-Sharaa's past as an Islamist militant, he said that "the United Kingdom had a progressive position compared to other countries."

"It removed sanctions early and opened relations with the new Syrian government quickly," he said. "It supported us in the (U.N.) Security Council and also supported us in several thorny issues." (AP)

Parnaik calls for stronger Arunachal-Gujarat partnership

Guv highlights cultural bonds, development convergence at Bharat Parv

ITANAGAR, Nov 14: Governor Lt Gen K T Parnaik (Retd) has underscored the deep cultural ties, shared heritage and growing developmental convergence between Arunachal Pradesh and Gujarat, calling for stronger cooperation between the two states to advance national unity and collective progress.

Speaking at 'Bharat Parv' at the Statue of Unity at Ekta Nagar in Gujarat on Wednesday, the governor said the relationship rests on centuries-old cultural foundations and continues to inspire youth, civic initiatives and state-led development.

Parnaik highlighted that the bond between the two states is rooted in shared mythology, most notably the story of Lord Krishna and Rukmini, whose divine wedding is celebrated at the Madhavpur Fair in Gujarat, an official statement said here on Thursday. Stronger drug control and pharmacy regulation urged at NCORD meeting

YUPIA, Nov 14: The district-level NCORD meeting was held on Friday at the DC Conference Hall, Yupia, chaired by ADC Headquarters, Tama Yajum. The session focused on reviewing the progress of previous directives aimed at strengthening drug control and regulating pharmacies in the district.

Key points discussed included regular surprise inspections of pharmacies suspected of selling drugs like methadone and visiting rehabilitation centres across Papum Pare district. The meeting also called for increased awareness programs to help identify and destroy cannabis plants, particularly in areas like Sakyang-Pinta village under Sagalee Sub-Division. Additionally, there were calls for improving intelligence gathering, enhanced railway track patrols, regular vehicle checks at entry points and

monthly inspections of shops near school premises.

Deputy SP Hibu Obing provided an update on the implementation of these measures. He reported that 16 NDPS cases have been registered since the formation of the NCORD Committee with 188kgs of cannabis and 314 grams of heroin seized and 23 drug-related arrests made. He also highlighted ongoing challenges in identifying pharmacies illegally selling methadone and other controlled drugs. Several pharmacies continue to dispense psychotropic substances without valid prescriptions which complicates detoxification efforts at rehabilitation centres. Obing stressed the need for greater coordination between the Medical Department the Drug Controller and the Police to address this issue.

DMO Dr Reena Ronyia presented the findings of inspections conducted on 83

pharmacies in rural areas of Papum Pare. While no Schedule X drugs were found, she emphasised that all pharmacies must adhere to proper record-keeping and prescription regulations. She proposed that non-compliant pharmacies be prosecuted under relevant legal provisions and notices be issued to ensure mandatory prescription entries in pharmacy registers.

Representing ADC Sagalee, Assistant Commissioner Chukhu Taba provided a report on cannabis destruction activities in Sakyang and Pinte villages. While no large-scale cannabis cultivation was discovered, small patches of cannabis plants were found intercropped with cardamom fields and have been destroyed. The area under such cultivation is still being assessed and further reports will be provided once the analysis is complete.

APSCPCR probes student death at Sainik School, Niglok

EAST SIANG, Nov 14: The Arunachal Pradesh State Commission for Protection of Child Rights (APSCPCR) conducted an inquiry at Sainik School, Niglok Village, East Siang District, following the untimely death of Class VII student Late Tadu Haro on Thursday.

The inquiry team was led by Chairperson Ratan Anya, accompanied by members Niri Chongrowju, Honluk Lukham, Member Secretary Yakar Dave, Legal Advisor Bini Nyaruce and supporting staff. During the visit, the team interacted with school authorities, staff, students and other stakeholders, inspected the site of the incident and reviewed the school and hostel premises. Preliminary documents were examined and clarifications were sought regarding the circumstances surrounding the tragic incident. The case has been handed over to the State Investigation Team (SIT) for further action.

On the second day, the Commission, along with Member Secretary, DCPU East Siang cum DD ICDS TN Padung and LPO, visited the Juvenile Observation Home. They interacted with staff, caretakers and ju-

veniles, emphasising the need for a safe and child-friendly environment. The Commission expressed concern over the lack of adequate juvenile observation facilities in the state, noting that only the Pasighat home is operational, while the upcoming facility in Yupia is yet to function.

APSCPCR expressed deep sorrow over the demise of Tadu Haro and extended condolences to the bereaved family. The Commission reiterated its commitment to a transparent and thorough inquiry, with findings to be submitted to the competent authorities as per the Child Rights Act, 2005.

The Commission also urged all educational institutions to strictly follow child safety protocols, maintain a nurturing environment and respond promptly to situations compromising student safety. A directive has been issued to all DDSEs in the state for immediate and strict implementation of anti-bullying and anti-ragging guidelines issued by the Education Department.

The APSCPCR will continue close coordination with the family and investigating agencies to ensure justice and safety for children across the state.

Arunachal launches clean energy initiative with DHPD 2.0

Dy CM Mein unveils rebranded hydropower department to accelerate sustainable energy development

Zoramthanga attributes collective efforts, dedication of party workers for MNF victory in Dampa

AIZAWL, Nov 14: Mizoram's main opposition party Mizo National Front (MNF) president Zoramthanga on Friday attributed the collective efforts and dedication of party workers for the MNF winning the by-election to the Dampa assembly seat in Mamit district.

In the Dampa Assembly bypoll, MNF candidate Dr R Lalthangliana defeated his nearest rival, Vanlalsailova of the ruling Zoram People's Movement (ZPM), by a margin of 562 votes, according to the results announced by the Election Commission.

Lalthangliana, who lost his home turf, South Tuipui, to ZPM's debutante and footballer Jeje Lalpekhlua in the 2023 assembly polls, secured 6,981 votes, which is 40.23 per cent of the total votes against Vanlalsailova, who secured 6,419 votes (36.61%) of the total votes polled in the bypoll.

The MNF retained the Dampa seat, which fell vacant after the death of its incumbent legislator, Lalrintluanga Sailo on July 21.



"The Almighty blessed our collective efforts, dedication and robust coordination at a time when the ZPM's wave is still blowing. We are highly indebted to the people for choosing our senior vice president Dr R Lalthangliana to fill the vacuum left by our departed MLA," Zoramthanga said while

addressing the victory celebration at the MNF office here.

The former chief minister also exuded hope that his party will retain power in the next assembly to be held in 2028.

He claimed that the divine always guides the MNF and unseats it from power when it becomes too

proud, but reinstates the party to power whenever Mizoram faces serious challenges like the famine, fire incident, swine fever outbreak, Covid-19 pandemic and border dispute, among others.

Lalthangliana also attributed his victory to collective efforts by the party, his close association with the Dampa people, and his political experience and seniority.

"There was good coordination among us. I have travelled across the entire constituency at least 6 times during the campaign, which gave me an advantage in establishing close relations with the people. Moreover, people were familiar with me as I have been an MLA and a cabinet minister for several years. This political experience and seniority helped to win the heart of the people," the 69-year-old teacher turned politician told PTI.

Lalthangliana was first elected to the state assembly in 1989 on the MNF ticket, and this is going to be his seventh time as a legisla-

tor.

He is currently the senior vice president of the MNF and was a cabinet minister in the last MNF dispensation headed by Zoramthanga during 2018-2023, holding health, commerce and industries and higher and technical education portfolios.

A total of 83.07 per cent of 20,888 voters exercised their franchise in the Dampa bypoll held on Tuesday.

According to results announced by the Election Commission on Friday, Congress nominee John Rotluanglian secured third place with 2,39 votes, while BJP candidate Lalthangthanga bagged fourth place, securing 1,541 votes.

People's Conference party candidate K. Zahmingthanga secured 50 votes.

With the MNF winning the Dampa seat, its strength in the Mizoram Assembly again rose to 10, while the ruling ZPM has 27 MLAs, BJP two legislators and Congress has one member. (PTI)

Tripura PCC Chief accuses ruling forces of attempting to distort India's freedom history

AGARTALA, Nov 14: Tripura Congress President Asish Kumar Saha on Friday alleged that attempts are being made to distort India's freedom history and diminish the contributions of key figures who played vital roles in the country's independence movement.

The Tripura Pradesh Congress Committee, along with the rest of the nation, observed the 136th birth anniversary of Bharat Ratna Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru—India's first Prime Minister—with a commemorative programme at the Congress Bhavan in Agartala.

"Pandit Nehru had immense affection for children and worked relentlessly for their welfare, believing that they represent the nation's future. His contributions remain relevant and are increasingly recognized today," Saha said.

He described Nehru as the architect of modern India, noting that the introduction of the Five-Year Plans under his leadership laid the groundwork for large-scale development and established India's global presence.



Saha further added, "On this day, we must pledge to protect the country's history. There are clear indications that those in power are attempting to erase the contributions of our freedom fighters. Nehru himself was a freedom fighter who endured imprisonment during the independence struggle. Today, however, there is a deliberate attempt to undermine this legacy and even dilute the sanctity of the Constitution drafted by Dr. B.R. Ambedkar."

In a veiled reference to the RSS-BJP, Saha alleged that efforts are being made to rewrite or suppress the sacrifices of freedom fighters. "The Congress is working to unite ordinary people so they can raise their voices against any attempt to distort history. Our aim is to uphold the vision of our great leaders and counter efforts to create divisions in society," he said.

Tripura CM expresses joy as BJP leads in Bihar, predicts BJP's win in Bengal

Saha visits violence hit area during bandh, declares relief for affected traders

AGARTALA, Nov 14: Tripura Chief Minister Dr Manik Saha on Thursday visited the Shantirbazar Market in Dhalai district to assess the situation and meet traders affected by the recent violence that erupted during the state-wide bandh on October 23.

He said that people do not want unrest in the state and that both Jaati and Janajati communities wish to stay united.

After visiting Shantirbazar, Dr Saha said, "I have come here with several leaders and officials. On October 23, the Tripura Civil Society called for a strike, and an unfortunate incident occurred at Shantirbazar in Dhalai district. It was a conspiracy. Earlier, similar incidents had taken place at Gandatwisa and other parts as well. Common people never want such things. When the incident occurred, I monitored the situation throughout the night and sent police officials to the spot. On October 23, Section 163 BNS was imposed, and it was withdrawn on October 31. In Tripura, Jaati and Janajati must stay together. We must remain cautious. The government will not spare anyone involved in such incidents, whoever they may be."

He added that as many as seven persons had been arrested. "Law will take its own course of action. I have met those who were injured at the hospital, and all possible help has been extended through the government helpline. Many people have requested the establishment of police stations and outposts. I will speak with the DGP and other officials regarding this. A delegation of ministers arrived to collect the report, which has been submitted to me as well. This is a very unfortunate incident. Many shops were vandalized, and some people were also attacked. I have spoken with the District Magistrate and the Chief Secretary about how we can help the victims. We have also taken certain decisions. We must stay united—people do not want unrest. I believe such incidents will not be repeated," said Dr. Saha.

The Chief Minister directed the District Magistrate to take prompt measures for the rehabilitation of those who suffered losses in the incident. Announcing a relief package, Dr. Saha said the government would provide ₹ 3 lakh each for fully damaged houses and shops, ₹ 1.5 lakh for severely damaged ones, and ₹ 15,000 for properties that sustained partial damage.

He further assured that necessary financial and medical support would also be extended to individuals injured during the violence.

Meghalaya Cabinet clears land acquisition for New Shillong corridor, amends 'Group D' hiring rules

SHILLONG, Nov 14: The Meghalaya Cabinet on Friday approved a series of key measures, including the acquisition of additional land in the New Shillong Township, amendments to service rules governing Group D recruitment, and revision of the state's fiscal deficit limit.

Chief Minister Conrad K Sangma said the cabinet has cleared a proposal to acquire 35 acres of land at Tynring to create a corridor linking the Administrative City and the Knowledge City within the New Shillong Township. The land will also support the proposed relocation of the Central Jail from its current location.

"This is an important step as we continue to build and expand New Shillong. The additional land is required to ensure smooth connectivity between the Administrative and Knowledge City zones," Sangma said. The Cabinet also approved an amendment to Rule 6(D) of the Meghalaya Ministerial District Establishment Service Rules, 2017, to clarify recruitment norms for Group D posts.

For years, two conflicting office memorandums (OM) — one issued in 1996 and another in 2017 — had created uncertainty over whether 50 per cent of Group D vacancies should be filled through Regular Casual Workers (RCWs) or via direct recruitment.

"Today, the cabinet has resolved this long-pending ambiguity. We have decided to follow the 1996 OM. As a result, 50 per cent of Group D vacancies will now



be filled from among Regular Casual Workers," the chief minister said.

In another decision, the cabinet approved amendments to the Meghalaya Fiscal Responsibility and Budget Management (FRBM) Act, 2006. The revision raises the state's fiscal deficit ceiling from 3 per cent to 3.5 per cent of GSDP.

"This will give the state additional borrowing space and support developmental activities," Sangma said.

The cabinet further approved the reappointment of Justice Shivaji Pandey as President of the Meghalaya State Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission.

Additionally, the cabinet approved the Service Rules for the Commission, enabling it to establish its own recruitment board. (PTI)

4 held in Wokha for sexual assault of minor

on November 10. The four arrested have been identified as Chumlanthung Y Humtsoe (26), Zurenthung R Odyuo (19), Zuchanbemo Felix (29), and Khyothungo Yanthan (21).

The SP said during investigation, another person, Myinthungo Humtsoe, was identified as being involved in

the case, and he is currently absconding. He added that efforts are on to arrest him. As per the complaint, the incident occurred on Nov 4, when accused Zurenthung R Odyuo allegedly sexually assaulted the minor along with two of his accomplices.

"Is the MP sitting inside the vehicle? If the MP is there, it's a different case, but he is not. You are misusing the privilege. Has the entire family of the MP become MPs now?" Rathore remarked as officers removed the beacon.

The SSP said flasher lights are strictly meant for the officeholder and cannot be used by family members or associates.

Officials added that the action formed part of an ongoing crackdown on unauthorised use of flasher lights on vehicles in Meghalaya. (PTI)

'Neecha Nagar' to 'Laal Singh Chaddha': Yesteryear star Kamini Kaushal dies at 98

Actor Kamini Kaushal, one of Hindi cinema's earliest female stars who began her career with the classic "Neecha Nagar" in 1946 and went on to act in a host of films right till 2022, has died in her Mumbai home, a close family friend said. She was 98.

Amongst the industry's highest paid actress in the late 1940s and early 1950s, Kaushal starred opposite the triumvirate of Dilip Kumar, Dev Anand and Raj Kapoor before moving on to character roles in the 1960s. Her last screen appearance was in Amir Khan's 2022 film "Laal Singh Chaddha" at the age of 95, making for a remarkable 76 year in the movies.

"She died at her Mumbai home late on Thursday night. She would have turned 99 in February," Sajan Narain, a close friend of the family, told PTI.

Kaushal was born Uma Kashyap on February 24, 1927 in Lahore. Her father, Shiv Ram Kashyap, was widely regarded as the father of Indian botany and taught as a professor at the University of Punjab in pre-partition Lahore.

The youngest of two brothers and three sisters, Kaushal graduated with a degree in English literature from Government College in Lahore.

The movie career happened when family friend and filmmaker Chetan Anand approached her for his 1946 film "Neecha Nagar". The movie, where she acted opposite actor Rafiq Anwar and Anand's wife Uma, won the Grand Prix du Festival International du Film at the inaugural Cannes Film Festival in 1946.

The movie is considered a clas-



sic for its portrayal of the gulf between rich and poor. It also marked the debut of the late star Zohra Sehgal and music by renowned sitarist Ravi Shankar.

It was Chetan Anand who rechristened her Kamini Kaushal to avoid confusion between two Umans.

After the success of "Neecha Nagar", Kaushal worked extensively with the triumvirate of Hindi cinema -- Dilip Kumar, Dev Anand and Raj Kapoor -- in films such as "Jail Yatra", "Do Bhai", "Aag", "Shaheed", "Nadiya Ke

Par", "Ziddi", "Shabnam" and "Arzoo".

She played the lead role in filmmaker Bimal Roy's acclaimed 1954 movie "Biraj Bahu", which won a National Film Award and earned her a Filmfare award for best actress.

Kaushal also essayed the lead role in the movie adaptation of Premchand's famous novel "Godaan".

With Manoj Kumar's 1967 hit "Upkar", she transitioned to motherly parts on screen. She was just 40 at the time.

Kaushal went on to star in Kumar's other hit films such as "Purab Aur Paschim", "Sanyasi", "Shor", "Roti Kapda Aur Makaan", "Dus Numbari" and "Santosh", playing his mother in each of them.

Kaushal played mother to Ramesh Khanna as well in the 1974 film "Prem Nagar" and in "Maha Chor" in 1976.

She appeared as Aunt Shalini in "The Jewel in the Crown", a popular British television serial, in 1984.

Though selective in her film choices throughout her career, Kaushal worked right till the end. In the twilight of her life, she appeared in Shah Rukh Khan starrer "Chennai Express" and Shahid Kapoor's "Kabir Singh".

She was 95 when she made a cameo as an elderly woman traveling in a train in "Laal Singh Chaddha".

Besides movies, Kaushal also featured in several television shows, including "Chand Sitare" on Doordarshan, "Shanno Ki Shaadi" on StarPlus and "Waqt Ki Raftaar" on DD National.

Kaushal married brother-in-law B S Sood in 1948 after her sister's death in a car accident and became an adoptive mother to two daughters. The couple had three sons -- Rahul, Vidur and Shravan.

As the news of her death came in, many people took to social media to post tributes.

"We pay tribute to the versatile and multifaceted Kamini Kaushal ji whose captivating performances have enthralled millions in a career spanning over seven decades. Condolences to the family," the official X handle of Producers Guild of India. (PTI)

"Spread the word. Or this will just go on and on. And the space for anything else other than mindless 'infantilised cinema' will disappear," he added.

The film had its world premiere at the Directors' Fortnight, an independent section at the 2023 Cannes Film Festival, and went on to win multiple honours, including the Special Jury Award at the Jio MAMI Mumbai Film Festival, Best Indie Film and Best Actor at the Indian Film Festival



of Melbourne, and Best Film and Best Actor at the 2024 New York Indian Film Festival.

An Indo-French co-production between Saregama India Ltd, UFO Production and O28 Films, "Agra" is Behl's second feature after "Titli" (2015), which also premiered at Cannes. (PTI)

No ethics, no sense of responsibility: Amitabh Bachchan in new post

"No ethics or sense of responsibility... just an avenue of personal gain," read the latest post on megastar Amitabh Bachchan's official blog.

The megastar shared the cryptic post on Friday but didn't name anyone in particular.

"No ethics .. no sense of responsibility .. just an avenue of personal gain, without any consideration of the moment ... Disturbing and disgusting," the 83-year-old actor wrote.

In a separate post on X, he said, "No ethics... koi bhi achar- niti nahi."

Bachchan's post comes amid the relentless media coverage of his "Sholay" co-star Dharmendra's health struggles.

Dharmendra, who was admitted to the Breach Candy Hospital for tests last week, was discharged on Wednesday and moved home for continued treatment.

Over the past few days, media crews had camped outside both the hospital and the Deol residence, prompting pleas of privacy from the family.

On Thursday, Dharmendra's son, actor Sunny Deol, sharply reprimanded photographers gathered outside his Juhu home. His outburst followed the circulation of a leaked video purportedly showing the Deol family grieving at the bedside of an ailing Dharmendra.

On Tuesday, rumours swirled that the 89-year-old actor had died, leading to condolences from many people. At the time, daughter Esha Deol and wife Hema Malini had condemned "irresponsible" media behaviour and clarified that the actor was stable and responding to treatment. (PTI)

Gavin O'Connor to direct 'Running'

After seeing *The Accountant 2* gross over \$103M worldwide on its way to becoming Amazon MGM Studios' second most-watched film of all time on streaming, Gavin O'Connor has entered development on *Running*, a new film he'll direct for Apple Original Films, with Apple Studios, Makeready and Nike producing, sources tell Deadline.

Reps for Apple declined to comment. As it's very early days on this project, little is known about it, though it's described as following a running prodigy on the hunt for greatness who uses his gifts to outrun his past and forge his future. The script is by Bill Dubuque, O'Connor's collaborator on *The Accountant* films.

O'Connor directed both of those, including the sequel, which hit theatres in April after premiering at SXSW, where it won the Headliner

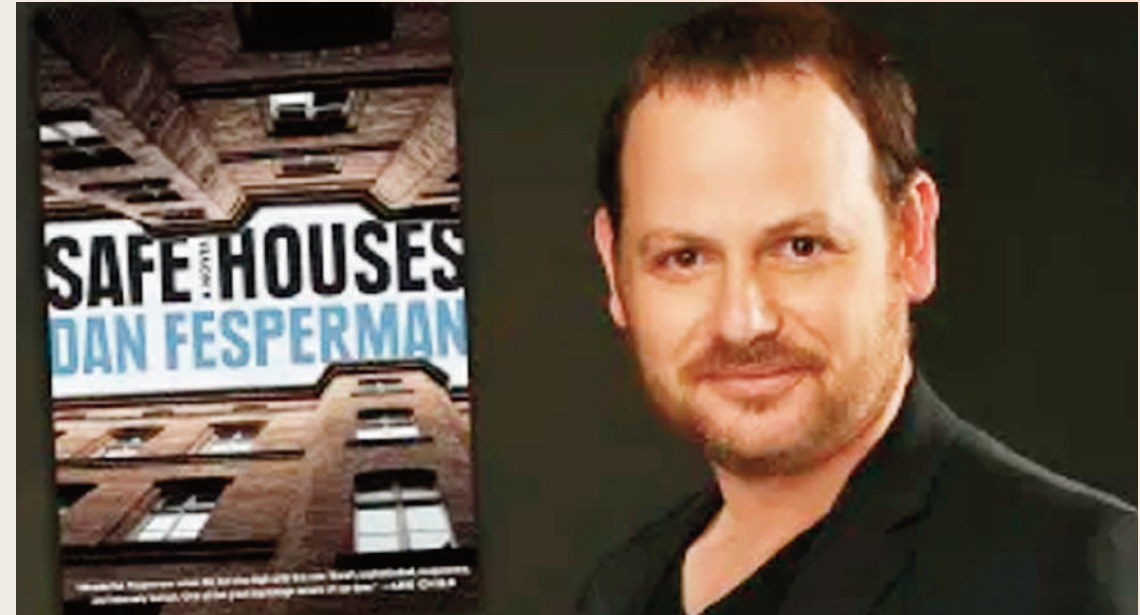
Audience Award. Rated 72% Certified Fresh by critics on Rotten Tomatoes and landing a 92% on the Popcorn Meter, *The Accountant 2* was met by an audience of nearly 80 million worldwide viewers in its first 28 days on Prime Video. It also nabbed the No. 1 spot on Nielsen's Movie chart in its debut week on streaming, with 1,384 million minutes viewed.

In the sequel — an action thriller following up 2016's *The Accountant* — Ben Affleck reprises his role as Christian Wolff, a CPA with autism and a talent for solving complex problems who leads a double life as a forensic accountant for criminal organizations. When an old acquaintance is murdered, leaving behind a cryptic message to "find the accountant," Wolff is compelled to solve the case. Realizing more extreme measures are necessary, Wolff recruits his estranged and highly lethal brother,

Brax (Jon Bernthal), to help. In partnership with U.S. Treasury Deputy Director Marybeth Medina (Cynthia Addai-Robinson), the pair uncover a deadly conspiracy, becoming targets of a ruthless network of killers determined to keep their secrets buried.

Released by Warner Bros. — which sold sequel rights to Affleck and Matt Damon's Artists Equity, leading to the recent Amazon MGM project — the first *Accountant* grossed \$155M worldwide in its 2016 theatrical release before going on to become the most-rented digital film of the subsequent year.

O'Connor also previously worked with Affleck on the inspirational sports drama *The Way Back*. Additionally, he was a director and EP on *The Americans* and worked on Netflix's *Seven Seconds*. He is repped by WME and Yorn, Levine, Barnes. (AP)



FRANCE QUALIFIES FOR 2026 WORLD CUP

Ronaldo sent off as Portugal loses to Ireland

DUBLIN, Nov 14: Kylian Mbappé and France are going to the 2026 World Cup. And Cristiano Ronaldo might be banned from Portugal's first game there if his team finally wins its European qualifying group.

Two goals from star striker Mbappé helped two-time champion France to qualify with a 4-0 home win against Ukraine on Thursday. But Ronaldo was ejected for the first time in his international career and Portugal will have to wait until Sunday to secure a qualifying spot for the seventh straight time after it was stunned 2-0 by Ireland in Dublin.

Midfielder Michael Olise and substitute forward Hugo Ekitiké added the other goals in a dominant second half from France, the World Cup runner-up in 2022.

Mbappé sent the penalty straight down the middle to break the deadlock in the 55th minute before Olise turned inside the penalty area to curl

home the second goal in the 76th at Parc des Princes in western Paris. Mbappé poked in France's third goal from close range in the 83rd following a goal-mouth scramble. Mbappé moved onto 55 goals and just two behind Olivier Giroud as France's all-time top scorer.

"The French national team will always be better with him in it," coach Didier Deschamps said about Mbappé. "He makes things easier for us. He performed his role perfectly this evening, as both a player and the captain of the national team."

Mbappé went close to a hat trick moments later but blazed over after going clean through. France has won Group D with 13 points, Ukraine and Iceland are tied on seven points and will play for second place when they meet on Sunday.

Ronaldo's 1st international red card/Portugal will host last-place Armenia in the final qualifying game on Sunday, when



Hungary hosts Ireland at the same time.

Portugal tops Group F with 10 points, two ahead of Hungary. Ireland is third with seven points.

Ronaldo was sent off for elbowing Ireland defender Dara O'Shea on the hour. The referee issued a yellow card but minutes later upgraded it to red after a video review.

Portugal coach Roberto Martinez said he thought the ejection was "a bit harsh," pointing out that Ronaldo "has never been sent off before in 226 games."

Ronaldo will serve a mandatory one-game ban imposed for any red card when Portugal plays Armenia. FIFA disciplinary rules require its judges to impose a ban of "at least two

matches for serious foul play."

Troy Parrott put the hosts ahead with a close-range header following a corner kick in the 17th minute against the run of play with Portugal dominant. Parrott added his second in the final minute before the break, beating Diogo Costa with a low shot from inside the area.

Haaland's double Erling Haaland scored twice as Norway moved closer to qualifying for the World Cup for the first time since 1998 by beating Estonia 4-1 in Oslo.

The win virtually secures a spot for the high-scoring Norwegians in next year's tournament in the United States, Canada and Mexico.

Italy had to rely on late goals from Gianluca Mancini and substitute Francesco Pio Esposito to win 2-0 at Moldova and is second in Group I, trailing leader Norway by three points.

Italy will likely have to settle for the playoffs where the four-time World Cup champion was eliminated in the past two edi-

tions. It hosts Norway on Sunday and would have to win by a nine-goal margin to directly qualify because of Norway's vastly superior goal difference.

Haaland has scored 14 of Norway's European-best 33 goals in seven group-stage games. The Manchester City striker was born two years after Norway last reached the World Cup.

Still perfect England Already-qualified England continued to cruise.

It beat Serbia 2-0 at Wembley Stadium to keep a perfect record in Group K and is yet to concede a goal.

Bukayo Saka fired England ahead on a rebound with a left-foot volley in the 28th after an initial shot by Nico O'Reilly was blocked. Substitute forward Eberechi Eze added the second in the 90th off a pass from another substitute, Phil Foden.

Albania beat Andorra 1-0 in the same group to secure the runner-up spot. (AP)

Players and fans remember victims of 2015 Paris terror attacks

PARIS, Nov 14: Soccer players from France and Ukraine joined supporters in a minute's silence before their match, ending a poignant day of commemorations across the city for victims of the Paris terror attacks 10 years ago.

The attacks on Nov. 13, 2015 began outside Stade de France, the national stadium, where France was playing Germany. They spread across the city in deadly assaults that killed 132 people and injured over 400.

Ten years on, France faced Ukraine in a World Cup qualifier held at Parc des Princes in western Paris.

After fans sang the national anthems — with part of France's "La Marseillaise" passionately sung a cappella — players walked to the center circle and stood by a banner reading "Football for Peace." They linked arms with their teammates and some stood with their heads bowed as the silence was impeccably observed.

Salim Toorabally, the security guard whose vigilance prevented a bomber entering the stadium 10 years ago, was invited to the match as a guest of the French Football Federation. François Hollande, who was French President in 2015, was also there. The stadium announcer at Parc des Princes also called for "solidarity with the Ukrainian people" over the Russian invasion of Ukraine. (AP)

Shami set to be traded to Lucknow Super Giants

NEW DELHI, Nov 14: Sunrisers Hyderabad are set to trade out-of-favour India pacer Mohammed Shami to Lucknow Super Giants ahead of the 2026 Indian Premier League (IPL).

SRH had acquired the services of the 35-year-old pacer for ₹10 crore at the auction last year.

"Both franchise have agreed to the trade," a source in the know of things told PTI

Shami endured an underwhelming season last year with SRH. In nine outings he managed just six wickets at an average of 56.16 with an economy rate of 11.23.

Once India's pace spearhead, Shami has also been unable to make the national team due to fitness concerns. He last played for the 'Men in Blue' in the final of the Champions Trophy in March this year.

The deadline to submit the list of players the franchisees want to release from their squad is November 15. (PTI)

FIDE World Cup: Arjun to take on Aronian; Harikrishna meets Jose Martinez

PANAJI (GOA), Nov 14: Grandmaster Arjun Erigaisi will take on an in-form Levon Aronian of Armenia, while P Harikrishna will have to tackle giant-killer Jose Eduardo Martinez Alcantara of Mexico in the pre-qualifiers of the World Cup here.

Drubbing Peter Leko of Hungary 2-0 in the first set of the tie-break games, Arjun has to meet Aronian, who has displayed great form coming into the round of 16 and it looks like an evenly-poised match on form even though Arjun enjoys a decent rating advantage.

For Harikrishna the biggest challenge so far awaits in form of Jose Martinez, who has played impeccably thus far packing off higher ranked players in tandem. Harikrishna conceded that he had never played the Mexican in a Classical game. "I think probably in some blitz games sometime but I don't think I have ever played him before, its time to take some rest and then come back for the next round."

With R Praggnanandhaa also eliminated by Daniil Dubai in the fourth round tiebreaker, it is now upto Harikrishna and Arjun to fight for the honours here.

There are three places reserved for the next Candidates from here for the top three finishers and besides Prag-

gnanandhaa, no other Indian has made it yet to the next Candidates. In the 2023 edition, that was won by reigning world champion Gukesh there were three Indians in all with Praggnanandhaa and Vidit Gujrathi joining Gukesh when the history was created.

With most of the big stars falling out of contention, Arjun and Wei Yi of China are the last two remaining 2750+ rated players left in the fray that gives a feeling that some more surprises might well be in store.

Carlos Alcaraz seals year-ending No 1 ranking with another win at the ATP Finals

TURIN, Nov 14: When it came down to it, Carlos Alcaraz needed less than 90 minutes to secure the year-ending No. 1 ranking in men's tennis. Alcaraz needed one more win at the ATP Finals to beat Jannik Sinner to the No. 1 spot and the Spaniard duly got that as he eased to a 6-4, 6-1 victory over Italian Lorenzo Musetti on Thursday to sweep his group at the season-ending event for the top eight players.

"It means the world to me to be honest," Alcaraz said in his on-court interview. "The year No. 1 is always a goal. To be honest at the beginning of the year I saw that the No. 1 (was) really, really far away, with Jannik there, winning almost every tournament he plays."

"From the middle of the season till now I put the goal for the No. 1 because I thought it was there ... and finally I got it. For me, it means everything, the work that we put every day during the whole season, up and down ... so I'm really proud about my team and myself."

It is the second time in his career that the 22-year-old Alcaraz has ended the year at the top of the rankings. The Spaniard became the youngest player to finish a year at No. 1 when he achieved the feat as a 19-year-old in 2022. Alcaraz had

to win three of his matches at the season-ending event for the top eight players to finish No. 1, while Sinner had to go undefeated to defend his title to be in with a chance.

Alcaraz — who admitted he was feeling nervous at the beginning of the match — didn't give him that chance as he swept aside Musetti despite a partisan home crowd, sealing the result on his third match point. That was his third win in the Jimmy Connors group and Alcaraz will face the winner of Friday's match between Alexander Zverev and Felix Auger-Aliassime in Saturday's semifinal.

De Minaur advances The victory also sent Alex de Minaur through to the semifinals after the Australian earlier claimed a first ATP Finals victory.

De Minaur beat Taylor Fritz 7-6 (3), 6-3 for his first victory in six matches at the tournament, following his debut last year. "I finally won here in Torino," said De Minaur, who needed a straight-set win to stay in contention for a semifinal spot. De Minaur never looked back after dominating the tiebreaker and had a chance to seal victory on Fritz's serve when he moved to match point, but the American held. De Minaur kept his nerve on serve to triumph. The seventh-seed will face Sinner in the final four. (AP)

PCB turns down invitation from B'desh Board to play tri-series

KARACHI, Nov 14: The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) has turned down an invitation from the Bangladesh board to take part in a triangular T20 series in December with Sri Lanka.

A PCB official informed that PCB wanted to host a tri-series with Pakistan and Sri Lanka as preparations for early next year's T20 World Cup but the PCB had to say as it wanted to manage the players workload.

"As it is, we have already allowed Babar Azam, Muhammad Rizwan, Shaheen Shah Afridi, Haris Rauf, Shadab Khan, NOCs for them to take part in the Big Bash league in Australia in December-January while some other players like Fakhar Zaman are appearing in the Emirates International League," he added. (PTI)

Suriname and Curacao move closer to historic WC qualification

PARAMARIBO (SURINAME), Nov 14: Richonell Margaret scored twice in two-minute span in the second half as Suriname defeated El Salvador 4-0 in CONCACAF qualifying to move closer to securing a spot in the World Cup for the first time.

Tjaronn Cherry opened the scoring with a penalty kick in the 44th minute and Richonell Margaret scored in the 74th and 76th minutes while Dhoraso Moreo Klass added a goal in the 83rd for Suriname. With the win, Suriname remains undefeated and reached nine points in Group A, three more than Panama that plays later against Guatemala.

Twelve teams, divided into three groups, are vying for three direct spots from regional qualifying for next year's World Cup. The United States, Canada and Mexico have qualified automatically as World Cup co-hosts. Suriname, one of CONCACAF's founding nations in 1961, is playing in the final round of qualifying for the first time since 1978.

El Salvador suffered its fourth straight loss and with three points is eliminated.

Curacao controls destiny Also on Thursday, Jordi Paulina scored twice, and Curacao beat Bermuda 7-0 and will play against Jamaica for a spot in the World Cup.

Paulina scored in the 48th and 63rd minutes, while Leandro Vacuna (7), Juninho Vacuna (32), Sontje Hansen (59), Ar Jany Martha (82), and Roshon van Eijma (90) added goals for Curacao, which is coached by Dick Advocata. Advocata was at the helm of the Netherlands national team for three stints and managed South Korea, Belgium and Russia before taking the job with Curacao, which has never qualified for a World Cup.

With the convincing win, Curacao has 11 points and leads Group B over Jamaica, which had a 1-1 draw against Trinidad and Tobago. Jamaica, which has only ever qualified for the 1998 World Cup in France, is coached by former England's national team mentor Steve McLaren. The Reggae Boys will host Curacao in Kingston's National Stadium next Tuesday.

Curacao needs a win or a draw to qualify while Jamaica requires a win. (AP)

Rohit to lead 18-member Indian junior men's team at World Cup

NEW DELHI, Nov 14: Dragflicker Rohit was named captain as Hockey India on Friday announced an 18-member Indian junior men's hockey team for the FIH World Cup to be held in Tamil Nadu from November 28 to December 10.

The Indian team, coached by the legendary PR Sreejesh, is grouped in Pool B along with Chile, Switzerland and Oman, who have come in as replacement for Pakistan.

"We have selected a tried-and-tested team with most of the players having a fair knowledge on what's required to play in a tournament of this magnitude," coach Sreejesh said in a release. "While their physical capabilities, skill and team-play was among the criteria for selection, one of the key aspects we have looked into is their mental ability to perform under pressure."

The India colts will be led by defender Rohit, who had a good show in the recent Sultan of Johor Cup in

Malaysia where the team won a silver medal, while Bikramjit Singh and Princedeep Singh are the goalkeepers picked in the squad.

India's defence will have captain Rohit, Amir Ali, who was part of the previous edition of the Junior World Cup, along with Anmol Ekka, Ravneet Singh, Talem Priyo Barta, Sunil Palakshappa Bannur and Shardanand Tiwari, who also comes with solid experience in the backline.

India's midfield will feature Ankit Pal, Rohit Kullu, Adrohit Ekka, Thounaojam Ingalemba Luwang, Manmeet Singh and Rosan Kujur, while the forwardline will see Sourabh Anand Kushwaha, Arshdeep Singh, Ajeet Yadav, Dilraj Singh and Gurjot - who made his senior India debut at the Asian Champions Trophy last year in China.

Unfortunately, India colts will miss the experience of Arajiet Singh Hundal, who is nursing a shoulder injury and will miss the Junior World Cup.

"While we have had good international match exposure in the build-up to the Junior World Cup, we have also played a lot of matches with the Senior India team as we are housed in the same camp here in SAI, Bengaluru," said Sreejesh.

"This was a big part of our preparations and when the players do well against their senior compatriots, they automatically gain confidence. Overall, we are an upbeat side and looking to a good outing in front of home crowd."

NEW DELHI, Nov 14: India's top-ranked male tennis player Sumit Nagal has finally received his visa to travel to China for the Australian Open Playoff, scheduled to begin on November 24 in Chengdu.

"A big thank you to @Media_SAI, @MEAIndia, @China_Amb_India and @ChinaSpox_India for their prompt help in helping me secure the visa in time," he posted on 'X' late on Thursday night.

The 27-year-old from Jhajar, Haryana had on Tuesday sought urgent intervention from the Chinese Embassy after his visa application was rejected without any explanation.

Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Lin Jian later said that China issues visas to athletes from all countries, including India, in accordance with laws and regulations.

He expressed hope that the "in-

dividual concerned" would submit all required documentation to the Chinese Embassy in a timely manner.

The Playoff event offers regional players a pathway into the main draw of the 2026 Australian Open.

Nagal, currently ranked 275 in the latest ATP standings, is India's highest-ranked singles player.

Having slipped out of the top 100, he can no longer gain direct entry into Grand Slam events and must rely on wild cards or qualifying rounds.

He played in the Australian Open main draw last year, losing in the opening round, and fell in the qualifiers at both Roland Garros and Wimbledon.

Nagal was also instrumental in India's Davis Cup win over Switzerland earlier this year, securing victories in both his singles matches against lower-ranked opponents. (PTI)

Heath, O'Reilly, Sanneh, Wondolowski, Seitz and Crow elected to US Soccer Hall of Fame

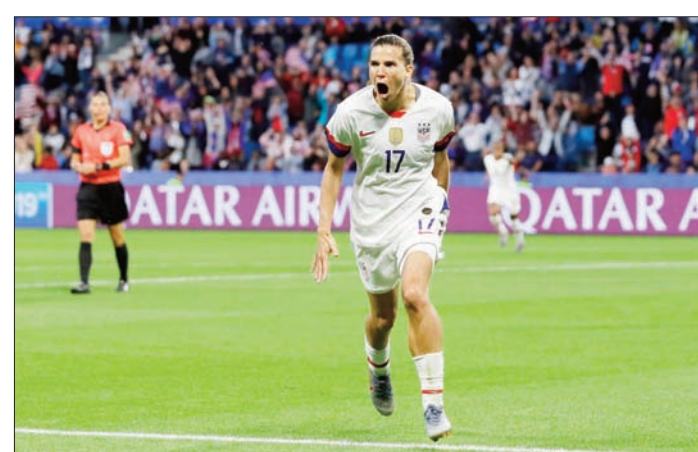
FRISCO (US), Nov 14: Women's World Cup champions and Olympic gold medalists Tobin Heath and Heather O'Reilly were elected to the U.S. National Soccer Hall of Fame along with men's players Tony Sanneh and Chris Wondolowski.

Referee Kari Seitz was also elected along with Kevin Crow, known primarily for his time in indoor soccer.

They will be inducted on May 1 at the hall in Frisco, Texas.

O'Reilly, 40, was a forward and winger who scored 47 goals in 231 international appearances, helping the U.S. win the 2015 World Cup and Olympic gold medals in 2004, 2008 and 2012. She won league titles with Sky Blue in 2009 in Women's Professional Soccer and with Kansas City in 2015 and North Carolina in 2019 in the National Women's Soccer League.

Heath, 37, was a midfielder and forward who had 36 goals in 181 appearances, winning World Cup titles with the U.S. in 2015 and 2019 and Olympic gold medals in



2008 and 2012.

Wondolowski, 42, is Major League Soccer's career scoring leader with 171 regular-season goals and two in the playoffs, playing for San Jose (2005, 2009-21) and Houston (2006-09). He scored 11 goals in 35 international appearances, playing in two games at the 2014 World Cup.

Sanneh, 54, was a defender who scored three goals in 43 interna-

tional appearances, starting all five games for the U.S. at the 2002 World Cup as the Americans reached the quarterfinals in their farthest advancement since 1930. He played for D.C. (1996-98), Columbus (2004), Chicago (2005-06), Colorado (2007) and the LA Galaxy (2009) along with stints at Hertha Berlin (1991-2001) and Nuremberg (2001-04) and won MLS titles in 1996 and 1997.

O'Reilly, Heath and Wondolowski were picked from the player ballot. The top two are elected if they each receive at least 50% and a third is elected if receiving at least 75%.

O'Reilly got 47 of 48 votes for 97.9%, followed by Heath (45, 93.8%), Wondolowski (37, 77.1%), Keith Johnson (33, 68.8%), Samantha Mewis (32, 66.7%), Dwayne DeRosario (29, 60.4%), Amy Rodriguez (28, 58.3%), Kyle Beckerman (27, 56.3%), Robbie Keane (20, 41.7%), Oguchi Onyewu (19, 39.6%), Jermaine Jones (17, 35.4%), Maurice Edu (16, 33.3%), Diego Valeri (13, 27.1%), Michael Archer (12, 25%), Stephanie Lopez Cox (12, 25%), Chad Marshall (11, 22.9%), Mike Lawson (10, 20.8%), Carlos Ruiz (7, 14.6%), Matt Besler (6, 12.5%) and Geoff Cameron (5, 10.4%).

Sanneh and Crow were chosen from the veteran ballot, in which the top vote-getter is elected if receiving at least 50% and a second if receiving at least 75%. Sanneh was on 21 of 24 ballots (87.5%)

and was followed by Crow (19, 79.2%), Tatu (17, 70.8%), Tiffany Roberts (16, 66.7%), David Beckham (11, 45.8%), Clint Mathis (10, 41.7%), Lorrie Fair (6, 25%), Chico Borja (5, 20.8%), Aly Wagner (5, 20.8%) and Francis Farberoff (1, 4.2%).

Seitz, 55, refereed refereed nine games at the Women's World Cup in 1999, 2003, 2007 and 2011 and six at the Olympics in 2004, 2008 and 2012. She became the U.S. Soccer Federation's vice president of referees in 2024.

Seitz was on the builder ballot, which this year included only referees. The top voter-getter is picked if receiving at least 50%.

For the Builder Ballot, the 2026 rotation considered candidates from the referee category only. Election procedures call for the Builder named to the most ballots (and on at least 50% of the ballots) to be elected. Seitz got 19 of 24 votes (79.2%) and was followed by Gino D'Ippolito (10, 41.7%), Brian Hall (6, 25%) and Mark Geiger (4, 16.7%). (AP)

Bumrah fifer blows away South Africa as India dominate day one

KOLKATA, Nov 14: Jasprit Bumrah turned a rare four-spinner gamble into his personal stage, producing a mesmerising exhibition of seam, swing and control as India skittled out South Africa for 159 on the opening day of the first Test, here Friday.

On a surface that drew pre-match scrutiny for its dry look, prompting India to field four spinners for the first time since 2012, it was India's pace star who made the ball talk the loudest, returning a superb 14-2-27-5, his 16 five-wicket hauls in 96 innings.

Bumrah produced a masterclass across little over two sessions, as South Africa crashed from a commanding 57 for no loss in 10 overs to lose all 10 wickets for just 102 runs in next 45 overs, with their innings lasting just four hours and 13 minutes after opting to bat.

It's South Africa's second-lowest total after a fifty-plus opening stand in men's Tests since their readmission. The lowest is 130 in their second innings in the 2018 Cape Town Test, also against India after a 52-run opening stand.

India ended the day at 37 for one in 20 overs, with a resolute KL Rahul (13 batting from 59 balls) and Washington Sundar (six batting; 38 balls) steady at the crease after Yashasvi Jaiswal (12) dragged Marco Jansen onto his stumps while playing close to his body.

The duo looked in no hurry on a pitch offering spice and variable bounce as they cut the deficit to 122 runs in front of a sizeable Eden crowd of 36,000-plus.

As light faded, South Africa crowded the



bat with close-in fielders, hoping for a late breakthrough and used five bowlers. But Rahul and Sundar stayed calm and assured, seeing out the final overs without further damage.

South Africa, missing their lead pacer Kagiso Rabada due to a rib injury, had looked primed for a big score after Aiden Markram (31 from 48 balls; 5x4, 1x6) and Ryan Rickelton's (23 off 22b; 4x4) brisk opening stand.

Markram, after 23 dot balls, opened up with a straight drive and a flowing cover drive, later twice punishing Axar Patel and unfurling a deft late cut past backward point.

He also launched Axar for a wristy six over midwicket as the run-rate surged above five

an over. At the other end, Rickelton's hit-and-miss 22 off 23 (4x4) added to India's frustration.

But just before the drinks break in the opening session, Bumrah from the Clubhouse end turned the morning on its head with two wickets in five balls across successive overs in his first spell that read 7-4-9-2.

A 140 kmph length ball straightened late to uproot Rickelton's off stump, and minutes later a short-of-length delivery leapt spitefully to take Markram's glove -- the contrast in bounce summing up the pitch's variable nature.

He returned after lunch to trap Tony de Zorzi (24) in front with one that skidded

through, before closing out the second session with reverse swing that split open the tail.

Simon Harmer's stumps were sent cartwheeling, and three balls later Keshav Maharaj was pinned plumb in front.

Siraj, Kuldeep tighten noose
Having leaked 34 runs from six overs in the first session, Mohammed Siraj (2/47) delivered a sharp twin strike in the second session, removing Kyle Verreynne and Marco Jansen in four balls in his 10th over.

Verreynne (16) burned South Africa's last review after being struck pad-then-bat, while Jansen was breached by a reversing length ball that darted in.

Kuldeep Yadav (2/29) chipped in with the key wicket of skipper Temba Bavuma, snared smartly at leg slip by Dhruv Jurel, and later removed a compact-looking Wiaan Mulder (24).

After the early losses of Bavuma and the openers, Mulder and Tony de Zorzi tried to steady the innings with circumspect batting.

Mulder applied himself for more than 50 balls, looked compact against India's four-pronged spin attack, but lost focus 15 minutes into the second session.

Attempting to break free with a reverse sweep against Kuldeep, he missed it completely and was trapped lbw, a key dismissal that opened the floodgates with Bumrah and then Siraj's twin strike adding to South Africa's woes.

Axar Patel (1/21) got rid of Corbin Bosch at tea as India maintained relentless pressure. (PTI)

Ghazanfar hopes to be retained by MI

Encouraged by captain Hardik after injury setback

NEW DELHI, Nov 13: Having made rapid strides in international cricket over the past 12 months, Afghanistan mystery spinner AM Ghazanfar is hoping to be retained by Mumbai Indians for the 2026 IPL and irrespective of what future holds for him with the storied franchise, words of encouragement from Hardik Pandya will stay with him for a long time.

Ghazanfar was supposed to make his IPL debut with the Mumbai Indians last season but a back injury ruled him out of the tournament. With the retention deadline on Saturday, he is keeping his fingers crossed.

"Despite the injury, Hardik bhai remained in touch with me and motivated me a lot. Even with Tilak I had long chats about the game. I hope this year too Hardik bhai is my captain," Ghazanfar, who would be representing Afghanistan in Rising Stars Asia Cup in Doha, told PTI.

Having made debut across formats in the last 18 months, the 19-year-old is featuring in the tournament for the second year in a row.

He rose to prominence with his mystery spin in the local T20 league back home and in no time found himself representing the country, an indication of the rich spin talent available in Afghanistan.

It is a busy year for Ghazanfar who literally lived out of a suitcase playing franchise cricket around the world. Last December, he got a call to make his Test debut against Zimbabwe, which also happened to be his maiden first class game.

His body could not take the load of Test cricket as he sent down more than 30 overs on a placid pitch.

"I played lot of a cricket back to back last season. It was one tournament to another and seven to eight tournaments in total. (PTI)

When the Test match came my body was not ready for the extra load. I have fully recovered now and a lot wiser."

As a mystery spinner, Ghazanfar relies a lot on backspin, googly and carrom ball for wickets. On purpose, he hardly bowls off-spin and he has his reasons for that.

"I don't look at myself as an off-spinner as I don't bowl off spin a lot. T20 is a batter's game now, spinners don't get a lot of help on pitches. Perfect example is IPL where you don't get a lot of spin tracks.

"Off break easily comes to bat. Leg break can be tricky and with mystery, the balls skids and you can vary your pace. Mystery is better," he said.

Any specific reason why Afghanistan keep unearthing mystery spinners?

"If you look, some countries have good fast bowlers, some have good batters, similarly we have a lot of spinners in domestic cricket. That is why we are strong at the international level," Ghazanfar reasoned.

Growing up, he learned a lot by watching videos of Sunil Narine and R Ashwin. He was fortunate to meet Ashwin during a stint with KKR in the IPL.

"He is a very experienced bowler. He shared his rich experience with me. Thankful him for that. IPL taught me to perform under extreme pressure even though I did not get to play."

Having made an accidental Test debut, Ghazanfar wants to play more red ball cricket but he doesn't hide his love for the shortest format.

"I like Tests but I want to play T20s more," he added.

B'desh beats Ireland by an innings and 47 runs in the first cricket Test

SYLHET (BANGLADESH), Nov 14: Opener Mahmudul Hasan Joy and captain Najmul Hossain Shanto scored centuries as Bangladesh defeated Ireland by an innings and 47 runs in the first cricket Test on Friday. Joy's career-best 171 and Shanto's 100 guided Bangladesh to 587-8 (declared) before Ireland was bowled out for 286 in its first innings.

Needing 301 runs to force Bangladesh to bat a second time, Ireland was dismissed for 254 in the second session on Day 4.

Electing to bat first in the opener of a two-test series, Ireland got half-centuries from Paul Strling and Cade Carmichael, who added 96 runs after the departure of captain Andy Balbirnie for a duck.

Strling survived twice before being dismissed by 60 runs and Carmichael added 59.

Off-spinner Mehidy Hasan Miraz, who claimed 3-50, ripped through the Irish middle order before Curtis Campher and Lorcan Tucker shared 53 runs to steady the innings.

Debutant Hasan Murad removed both of them to finished with 2-47 and effectively ruined Ireland's prospect to get past 300. (AP)

Asian Archery C'ship: Ankita, Dhiraj win gold in recurve events

DHAKA, Nov 14: Ankita Bhakat capped a sensational day, stunning Paris Olympics silver-medallist Nam Suhyeon of South Korea 7-3 while Dhiraj Bommadevara also won his final as India clinched gold medals in both men's and women's event at the Asian Archery Championship here on Friday.

Dhiraj defeated compatriot Rahul 6-2 in the final to make it a 1-2 for India.

Ankita had earlier knocked out her longtime senior teammate, former world No. 1 Deepika, in the semifinals. Locked at 5-5, both

archers shot a nine in the shoot-off, but Ankita's arrow was closer to the centre, sending her into the title clash.

Ankita began the final in commanding fashion, firing two 10s to take the opening set 29-27. The second set ended in a scrappy 27-27 draw as both archers faltered. Ankita slipped to an 8 while Nam dropped to a 7.

Nam levelled the match by claiming the third set 28-26, with Ankita unable to find a single 10. But the Indian hit back brilliantly in the fourth, nailing two 10s in a su-

perb 29-28 effort to lead 5-3.

Showing steely composure in the decider, Ankita once again delivered two 10s to clinch the gold, completing a breakthrough triumph against one of Asia's most consistent performers.

India also secured the women's recurve bronze after Sangeeta edged out veteran five-time Olympian Deepika Kumari 6-5 in a dramatic shoot-off.

Indian contingent ended its campaign with 10 medals --- six gold, three silver and one bronze medal to top the standings. (PTI)

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
